PACKERS RETURN HOME TO HOST THE BILLS

The Green Bay Packers will face the Buffalo Bills on Sunday at Lambeau Field.

- ▶ Green Bay is 4-2 all-time at home against Buffalo, including wins in each of the last three contests.
- ▶ All six games between the two clubs in Wisconsin have been decided by 10-plus points.
- ▶ The Bills' last trip to Lambeau Field came in 2010, a 34-7 win by the Packers.
- ▶ Regardless of location, it is only the third time the two teams have played in the month of September, with Buffalo winning at home in 2000 and Green Bay winning at home in 2010.
- ▶ While it is the second consecutive season the Packers have opened with three of the first four games at home, it marks just the eighth time since 1990 (2012, 1999, 1997, 1994, 1992, 1990).
- ▶ This is the fourth time in franchise history that the Packers have opened the season with a win, loss and tie in the first three games they have played (1987, 1973, 1923).
- ▶ This is the latest in the regular season the Packers have faced their first opponent from the AFC since 2012, when they played the Indianapolis Colts in Week 5.
- ▶ It is the fourth consecutive season that Green Bay has a loss or less through the first three games (2-1 in 2016-17 and 3-0 in 2015).
- ▶ Each of the last 10 times the Packers have suffered a loss in the month of September, they have bounced back to win the next week.
- ▶ Sunday, the Packers will wear a re-creation of the team's uniform from 1937-48 for the fourth time (San Diego, Week 5 in 2015 / Dallas, Week 6 in 2016 / Baltimore, Week 11 in 2017). It is navy blue and gold, and includes a gold yoke across the shoulders with faded gold pants and high navy socks. Green Bay is 8-5 when wearing a third jersey, including wins in seven of the last 10.
- ▶ Green Bay will return to the road as it travels to play division foe Detroit on Sunday, October 7, at 12 p.m. CDT.



AGAINST THE AFC EAST

- ▶ Since 2006, the Packers are 6-6 against AFC East teams, but have won three of the last four contests and are 5-3 in the last eight games.
- ▶ Dating back to 2010, Green Bay is 3-1 at Lambeau Field against teams from the AFC East.
- ▶ Each of the last seven games Green Bay has played against AFC East teams have been decided by nine points or less.
- ▶ The Packers have scored 26-plus points in four of the last five games against teams from the AFC East.
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started seven games against the AFC East, totaling 11 passing touchdowns and three interceptions.
- ▶ At home, Rodgers has recorded passer ratings of 109-plus in three of four games (112.6, 109.8, 116.3) he has started against the AFC East.

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 4

WITH THE CALL

CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with play-by-play man **Ian Eagle** and analyst **Dan Fouts** handling the call from the broadcast booth and **Evan Washburn** reporting from the sidelines.



- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
- ▶ Sports USA Radio will air the game on radio across the country. **Josh Appel** (play-by-play) and **Doug Plank** (analyst) will call the action.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 706.

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field.

- ▶ With the win over the Chicago Bears in Week 1, Green Bay has won six straight home openers (2013-18).
- ▶ Since the start of 2014, Green Bay is **No. 6 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home during the regular season:

- ▶ Under McCarthy, Green Bay is 70-26-2 at home during the regular season. The Packers' .724 winning percentage ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** over that span:

- ▶ Green Bay started 3-0 at home in 2017, marking the fifth time since 2011 that the Packers began the season 3-0 or better at home.
- ▶ The Packers rank **No. 6 in the NFL** in point differential at home since the start of the 2014 season (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- ▶ Green Bay has 222 victories at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ▶ The Packers have won 11 of their last 12 home games (one tie) in September at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home during the regular season 40 times, winning 38 of those contests. The Packers rank **No. 3 in the league** in home games with 30-plus points since 2006:

- ▶ In two home games this season, Adams has registered 13 receptions for 152 yards (11.7 avg.) and two touchdowns. He is **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** this season in receiving touchdowns at home.
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has completed 50 of 72 passes (69.4 pct.) for 567 yards (283.5 per game), four touchdowns, zero interceptions and ranks **No. 7 in the NFL** with a passer rating of 111.3 at home this season (min. 20 pass att.).
- ▶ WR **Randall Cobb** is **tied for No. 9** in franchise history in TD receptions at home:

SEPTEMBER STARTS

Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay has been one of the most successful teams in the league early in the season.

- ▶ The Packers are 11-0-1 in their last 12 games at Lambeau Field in the month of September. In those 12 games, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has recorded a 100-plus passer rating nine times while throwing for three-plus touchdowns eight times.
- ▶ Overall, Green Bay has a 9-3-1 record in its last 13 games in the month of September.
- ▶ The Packers opened the 2016 season with a 27-23 victory at Jacksonville. It was Green Bay's 55th win in a road opener, further extending the top mark in NFL history. Green Bay concluded its 2016 September schedule with a 2-1 record. Last season, the Packers went 3-1 in the season's opening month.
- ▶ In 2015, Green Bay went 3-0 in September, marking the third time under McCarthy that the Packers finished the month undefeated (4-0 in 2007 and 3-0 in 2011).
- ▶ Since McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers rank in the **top five of the NFL** in both wins and winning percentage in the month of September:

▶ In 2015, Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 135.4 in the month of September. Dating back to 1970, it ranks **No. 5 among NFL quarterbacks** in the month of September (min. 65 pass attempts), according to SportRadar.

▶ Since 2008, Rodgers is one of three active quarterbacks in the NFL with a passer rating of 100-plus in the month of September (min. 300 att.).

▶ So far this September, Rodgers ranks **No. 8 in the NFL** in passer rating and is one of three quarterbacks (Drew Brees, Patrick Mahomes) to not throw an interception this season (min. 30 pass att.).

▶ Dating back to 2016, WR **Davante Adams** has seven receiving TDs in the month of September, **tied for No. 3 in the league** over that time span.

FACING THE AFC

The Green Bay Packers have played well against AFC teams. Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 29-20 during the regular and postseason against teams from the AFC.

- ▶ The Packers have finished with a .500 record or better against the AFC in 10 of the first 12 seasons under McCarthy.
- ▶ Green Bay finished 2-2 against AFC teams last season, with two games going to overtime and three games being decided by six points or less.
- ▶ Green Bay's 29 wins in the regular and postseason versus the AFC are tied for the second most among NFC teams since 2006:

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 26 offensive players, 24 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 31 of them (58.5 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has nine players that were drafted in the first round, including seven that were selected by the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 39 players on the roster that were draft picks (73.6 percent), including 22 players that were selected in the first three rounds (41.5 percent).
- ▶ Over a third of the players (18 of 53, 34.0 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 41 of them (77.4 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Sept. 30) and 27 players (50.9 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- ▶ The Packers have 11 players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with seven of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Randall Cobb, Mike Daniels, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 40 began their pro careers with the Packers (75.5 percent).
- ▶ Over half the roster consists of players with experience ranging from rookie to three years (32 of 53, 60.4 percent).

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 12 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

► McCarthy's 121 regular-season wins in his first 12 years as a head coach (2006-17) are **No. 4 in NFL history** (according to the Elias Sports Bureau):

► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his first 12 seasons, he won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.

► With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

► The 132 overall wins are the most in the NFC and tied for the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 167 / Pittsburgh, 132).

► In Week 6 of the 2017 season, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason). Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the **sixth-most wins by a head coach** through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.

► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).

► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.

► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.

► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (17) and Andy Reid (12) have more 10-plus-win seasons.

► McCarthy is the **only coach in franchise history** to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).

► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowl-winning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.

► Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 132-79-2 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .624 winning percentage that ranks **No. 3 among current NFL head coaches** (minimum 100 games):

► McCarthy has coached in 213 games (including playoffs), **No. 2 in team history** behind Lambeau (339 from 1921-49).

► In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the **seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach** to reach the 100-win plateau:

WINNING WAYS

► The Packers were the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each season from 2009-16. Those eight appearances were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroit-three / Chicago-one).

► McCarthy became just the **fourth head coach in NFL history** to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:

► There are five teams in the NFL with six-plus playoff appearances from 2009-17, with only two in the NFC (New England, nine / **Green Bay, eight** / Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, Seattle, six).

► With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy has led the Packers to 10 wins in the postseason, passing Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the **most in team history**:

MIKE MCCARTHY...Is in his 13th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led Green Bay to its eighth consecutive playoff appearance in 2016, tied for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history. Has led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 11 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ▶ Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ▶ Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that span; Packers led the league in scoring in 2014.
- ▶ Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

SEAN McDERMOTT...Is in his second year as the Bills' 20th head coach.

- ▶ In his first year in Buffalo, led the Bills to their first playoff berth since 1999 with a 9-7 record, becoming the third coach in team history to earn a playoff berth in his first season at the helm.
- ▶ Developed a top-10 defense in four of his six seasons as the defensive coordinator of the Carolina Panthers.
- ▶ During his tenure in Carolina, the Panthers defense ranked second in the league in sacks (261) and third in turnovers forced (169).
- ▶ Also helped Carolina to three division titles and a trip to Super Bowl 50.
- ▶ Prior to his time with the Panthers, spent 12 seasons in Philadelphia, including two years as the Eagles' defensive coordinator.

THE PACKERS-BILLS SERIES

- ▶ The two teams have met only 12 times, the first game coming in 1974, a 27-7 Bills victory at Lambeau Field. In that contest, the Packers actually held RB O.J. Simpson to 62 yards on 16 carries, but Bills QB Joe Ferguson gave the team a lead it would not relinquish with a first-quarter TD pass to WR Ahmad Rashad, and RB Jim Braxton punched in three TD runs.
- ▶ Buffalo won five of the first six meetings. The teams have split the past six contests with the home team winning each game.
- ▶ Each team has recorded one shutout in the series, the Bills in 1988 at Buffalo (28-0) and the Packers at Lambeau Field in 2002 (10-0).
- ▶ Seven points is the closest margin of victory in any of the 12 meetings, a 19-12 Buffalo victory in 1979.

TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

▶ Rodgers registered the sixth 4,000-yard passing season of his career in 2016, setting the **franchise record** as he surpassed Favre's mark of five 4,000-yard seasons.

▶ Three times Rodgers has had 10-plus zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) in a season (11 in 2016, 13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Bart Starr (10) in 1964.

▶ In 2016, Rodgers set the **single-season franchise record for completions** with 401, surpassing Favre's mark of 372 in 2005.

▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Rodgers reached the 35,000-yard passing mark on his 4,446th attempt (2016), the **second-fewest attempts needed in NFL history** behind QB Johnny Unitas (4,388 attempts).

▶ Rodgers, who has 39,334 passing yards and 319 passing TDs in 152 career games, is looking to become the **first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games**, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season. It is the second time in his career that he has recorded six-plus passing TDs and zero interceptions through the team's first three games (2015, 10 TDs).

- ▶ In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ▶ With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ▶ Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

ASCENDING ADAMS

Despite playing in just 14 games in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** led the Packers in all three major receiving categories with 74 receptions (one shy of career-best 75 from 2016) for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 touchdowns (**tied for No. 2 in the NFL**), resulting in his first appearance in the Pro Bowl.

- ▶ Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in all three contests, which extends his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to last season. He has six TD catches during the current streak. It is the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It is also the longest streak by a Packer player since WR Randall Cobb's streak of six games in 2014.
- ▶ Adams is one of four players in the league with a receiving TD in all three games this season.
- ▶ Adams is the third Packer in the last four seasons (James Jones, 2015; Jordy Nelson, 2016) to catch a TD pass in each of the first three games of the season.

THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF COBB

Packers WR **Randall Cobb** has been a versatile weapon for the team over his career. While he has contributed as a kick and punt returner and out of the backfield, most of his production has come as a wide receiver.

- ▶ In Week 1, he led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- ▶ On third down in Week 1, Cobb finished with a career-high 110 yards on four receptions (27.5 avg.), the most by a Packer since WR Antonio Freeman posted 124 yards on five third-down receptions (24.8 avg.) vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 10, 1999.
- ▶ Cobb's receiving-yardage total in Week 1 was the most by a Packer in a season opener since WR James Lofton recorded 154 yards receiving at Houston on Sept. 4, 1983.
- ▶ Since 2014, Cobb ranks **No. 2 among NFL wide receivers** (min. 150 receptions) in average yards after the catch (according to SportRadar):

- ▶ Cobb is one of just seven wide receivers in the NFL to register 60-plus receptions, 600-plus receiving yards and four-plus receiving touchdowns in each season from 2014-17, joining PIT Antonio Brown, CIN A.J. Green, HOU DeAndre Hopkins, MIA Jarvis Landry, DET Golden Tate and DEN Demaryius Thomas.
- ▶ Cobb ranks No. 7 in franchise history in receptions (449), No. 12 in receiving yards (5,336) and is tied for No. 11 in touchdown catches (40).
- ▶ Cobb was one of just six wide receivers to register four-plus touchdowns in each season from 2012-17 (Brown, Green, IND T.Y. Hilton, Tate, Thomas).

EXTRA TIME NEEDED

▶ After only playing in seven overtime games from 2006-16, the Packers have played in four OT games since the start of the 2017 season, the most in the NFL over that span (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- ▶ Green Bay has a 3-0-1 mark in its last four OT games.
- ▶ The Week 2 game between the Packers and Vikings ended in a 29-29 tie, Green Bay's first tie game since Nov. 24, 2013, which was also against Minnesota at Lambeau Field (26-26).
- ▶ It marked just the third tie game between the two teams in the 58-year history of the series (1961-2018).
- ▶ The tie between the Packers and Vikings marked the second consecutive week with a tie (Cleveland-Pittsburgh in Week 1). This is the first season to feature a tie in each of the first two weeks since 1971, which saw Miami and Denver tie 10-10 in Week 1 and Atlanta and the Los Angeles Rams tie 20-20 in Week 2.
- ▶ Green Bay won three games in overtime (Weeks 3, 13 and 14) during the 2017 season, the most by the Packers in a single season in franchise history. Green Bay's three overtime wins last season were tied for the second most in a season since the NFL added an OT period in 1974, trailing only the 2011 Arizona Cardinals (four wins).
- ▶ In 2017, the Packers registered overtime wins in back-to-back games (Weeks 13-14) for the first time in team history.
- ▶ The Packers are 4-4-2 in regular season OT games since 2006.

ODDS AND ENDS

- ▶ The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).
- ▶ WR **Geronimo Allison** has two TD catches this season of 39-plus yards, tied for the most in the NFL:

- ▶ Allison's blocked punt in the first quarter of Week 2 was recovered in the end zone by CB **Josh Jackson**. It was the first blocked punt for a TD by Green Bay since Oct. 28, 2012, vs. Jacksonville (blocked by CB Davon House and recovered in the end zone by LB Dezman Moses).
- ▶ TE **Jimmy Graham** is tied for **No. 5 in the NFL among tight ends** with 13 receptions this season. His 148 receiving yards rank **No. 10 in the NFL** among tight ends.
- ▶ Graham led the team with 95 yards on six receptions (15.8 avg.) in Week 2, his best single-game yardage total since Nov. 7, 2016, (103 yards on eight receptions vs. Buffalo) when he was with Seattle.

- ▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, **JK Scott** is the first punter in Packers history with a 58-plus yard punt in each of his first three NFL games. The last NFL player to do it was Washington P Tress Way in 2014.
- ▶ Scott's 63-yard punt in the second quarter of Week 2 was the longest by a Packer since P Jacob Schum's 65-yarder vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2016. Scott finished the game with a 51.8-yard gross average and a net average of 45.2 yards on five punts.
- ▶ Scott currently ranks **No. 7 in the NFL** with an average of 48.8 yards per punt and **No. 9 in the league** with a net average of 42.6 yards per punt. He is one of five players in the league to rank in the top 10 in both categories.
- ▶ According to SportRadar, Green Bay has had six drives of five-plus minutes this season, **tied for the fourth most in the NFL**. The Packers have scored on all six drives to **tie for the fourth-most** scores on drives of five-plus minutes in the league this season:

- ▶ According to SportRadar, the Packers have finished in the top 10 of the NFL in two-minute offense (points scored on drives started in the last two minutes of the second quarter or fourth quarter) in four of the previous seven seasons (No. 2 in 2016, t-10 in 2013 and 2012, No. 1 in 2011). In 2018, Green Bay is **tied for No. 9 in the NFL** in two-minute offense this season with 10 points on eight drives.
- ▶ **K Mason Crosby** tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- ▶ The Packers posted the second-largest comeback win in team history at Lambeau Field (21 vs. New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989), coming back from a 20-point deficit to top the Chicago Bears, 24-23, in Week 1. It was just the fifth time in franchise history that Green Bay posted a comeback win of 20-plus points.
- ▶ Week 1 marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter (per the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** recorded a passer rating of 130-plus for the third time in a Week 1 game, the most in the NFL since 2008 (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ In the fourth quarter of Week 1, Rodgers completed 9 of 12 passes (75.0 pct.) for 212 yards with three touchdowns and a passer rating of 156.3. According to SportRadar, it marked the 18th time in his career that he recorded a passer rating of 150.0-plus in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ In Week 1, WRs **Randall Cobb** (nine rec. for 142 yds. and a TD), **Davante Adams** (five rec. for 88 yds. and a TD) and Allison (five rec. for 69 yds. and a TD) became the first trio of Packers with five-plus receptions, 65-plus yards and a TD in the same game (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL

LB **Clay Matthews** continues to make an impact on opposing offenses. He is tied with LB **Reggie Gilbert** for the team lead with five QB pressures this season.

- ▶ In 2017, Matthews recorded a sack in three consecutive games that he appeared in (Weeks 11, 13-14), marking the eighth time he has recorded a sack in at least three straight games that he has played in during the same regular season.
- ▶ For the seventh time in his career, Matthews registered at least six sacks (team-high 7.5) and forced a fumble in 2017, which **tied for the second-most seasons** with six-plus sacks and one or more forced fumbles since 2009 (Julius Peppers, nine).
- ▶ In Week 4 of 2017, Matthews registered a sack/forced fumble of Bears QB Mike Glennon to move past DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila to set the team record:

PERRY ON THE RUSH

Packers LB **Nick Perry** is a big part of a pass rush that has recorded a sack in 17 of the last 19 games.

- ▶ He sealed the Week 1 victory over the Bears with a sack/forced fumble of QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-down-and-10 with 1:06 on the clock and the ball at the Chicago 46-yard line. The fumble was recovered by DL **Kenny Clark**.
- ▶ Perry has registered at least one sack in each of the last three season openers, totalling 3.5 sacks in those games.
- ▶ Perry leads the Packers in sacks and games with at least one sack since 2016:

- ▶ Perry has recorded at least one two-sack game in each season from 2013-17, the lone Packer to accomplish that feat over that span.
- ▶ Despite missing two games, Perry registered a team-high 11 sacks, **tied for No. 8 in the NFL**, in 2016. He became the 11th player in team history (since 1982) to register a double-digit sack total in a season.

ON THE RISE

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl and second-team All-Pro recognition from *The Associated Press* in 2016.

- ▶ After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ▶ Clinton-Dix has two interceptions this season (**tied for No. 4 in the NFL**), was **tied for No. 2 on the team** with three INTs in 2017 and is **tied for No. 1 among safeties** since 2016 during the regular season:

- ▶ His three career postseason interceptions rank **No. 1 among safeties** since he entered the league in 2014, according to STATS.
- ▶ His career-best five interceptions were **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** in 2016 and **tied for No. 2 among safeties**. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ▶ In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 15, becoming the first Packer to have multiple two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶ In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark started all 18 games he has played in since the start of the 2017 season.

- ▶ In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ▶ Against Minnesota in Week 2, he sacked QB Kirk Cousins. He has 5.5 sacks since Week 13 of 2017, tied for the **No. 2 among defensive tackles over that span**, according to SportRadar.
- ▶ In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- ▶ According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the **most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December** in a single season (since 1982).
- ▶ With two sacks vs. Minnesota in Week 16, Clark became the first Packers defensive tackle to register two sacks in a single regular-season game since **Mike Daniels** recorded two Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (according to STATS).

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DL **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- ▶ After being selected as an alternate each of the past three seasons (2015-17), he was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ▶ He finished **No. 4 on the team** with five sacks in 2017, the third-most sacks of his career (6.5 in 2013, 5.5 in 2014), and recorded a career best 72 tackles.
- ▶ Daniels has recorded at least four sacks in each season since 2013, which is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles** (according to pro-football-reference.com):

RACKING UP POINTS

K **Mason Crosby** is moving his way up the record books.

- ▶ Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- ▶ Crosby has played in 179 straight games for the Packers, the **third most all-time** behind only QB Brett Favre (255) and T Forrest Gregg (187).
- ▶ Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ▶ Crosby's 1,345 points from 2007-17 were the **second most by an NFL player in his first 11 seasons** (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 1,457 from 2006-16), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Crosby (1,510) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ▶ Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and **extending his franchise record**. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are **tied for the most in the NFL since 2007** (Gostkowski). The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶ The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ▶ Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only eight of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records at or above .500.

336 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Minnesota Vikings in Week 2 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 336 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶ The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ▶ Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ▶ Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 70-26-2 (.724) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 3 in the NFL**.
- ▶ Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 98th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 19 by the National Football League.

- ▶ For the second consecutive season, the Packers opened the season at home and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 1, Green Bay hosted Chicago on Sunday night, marking the 13th consecutive regular season that the Packers and Bears have squared off in primetime.
- ▶ It was the first time Green Bay opened the season at home against the Bears since playing them on Sunday night in Week 1 of the 2009 season, a 21-15 win for the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay hosted Minnesota in Week 2, marking the first time since 2012 that the Packers played two home games to open the season. It also marked just the third time (2003, 2008) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ▶ The Packers' first road contest was at the Redskins, marking Green Bay's first September visit to Washington.
- ▶ The Packers return home for two of three games before the bye, first taking on the Buffalo Bills in Week 4 and then traveling to Detroit to play the Lions.
- ▶ In Week 6, Green Bay hosts the San Francisco 49ers on *Monday Night Football*, marking the fourth time the two teams have met on *MNF* and the first since 1999. It is the fifth time in the last six seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on *MNF*.
- ▶ After the second Week 7 bye for Green Bay in the last four seasons (2015), the Packers will play four of five games on the road.
- ▶ Green Bay makes its first trip to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 1978 to play the Rams.
- ▶ In Week 9, the Packers travel to the other side of the country to play the Patriots on Sunday night.
- ▶ It is the second consecutive time the Packers and Patriots will face off on a Sunday night in New England (2010).
- ▶ Green Bay returns home to take on the Miami Dolphins before a quick turnaround to play the Seahawks, marking the Packers' second Thursday night game at Seattle (Week 1 in 2014). Including the postseason, it will be the seventh time Green Bay and Seattle have played since 2012.
- ▶ November finishes with a trip to play the Vikings on Sunday night, marking the sixth straight season that the teams have met in a prime-time game.
- ▶ Green Bay opens the final month of the regular season against Arizona, only the second time the Cardinals have played at Lambeau Field in December (Dec. 21, 1969).
- ▶ The Packers will play back-to-back home games for only the second time in 2018 when they host the Atlanta Falcons in Week 14. It will be the fourth matchup (including postseason) between Green Bay and Atlanta in the last three seasons.
- ▶ The Packers end the season with two road games in the final three weeks for the seventh straight year.
- ▶ In Week 15, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place it has won in the regular season each of the last seven years. The Packers have scored 30-plus points at Chicago in four of the last five matchups (33, 38, 31, 30, 23).
- ▶ The Packers' road slate will finish up with a game at the New York Jets, the third December game at the Jets in team history (1981, 2002). Three of the last four games at New York have been decided by single digits, including one game that went to overtime.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the third straight year and the fourth time in the last five seasons. Green Bay has an 18-6 overall mark (.750) and a 10-2 home record (.833) against Detroit under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE

WR Randall Cobb, 7th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ In Week 1, led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards (13th 100-yard receiving game of his career) on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- ▶ Despite missing a game, was No. 2 on the team with 66 receptions in 2017. It was the fourth consecutive season he registered 60-plus receptions.
- ▶ Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- ▶ Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ▶ Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team history.
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

LT David Bakhtiari, 6th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ▶ Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2016 and 2017, joining Forrest Gregg (1959-60, 1962-67) as the only Green Bay tackles to be named to an AP All-Pro team in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- ▶ Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ▶ Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ▶ Has played in 65 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but three of his 36 starts (LT in Week 4-5 of 2017, RG in Week 13 of 2015) taking place at LG.
- ▶ Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ▶ A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C Corey Linsley, 5th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ▶ Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was the only Packers offensive lineman to start every game during the 2017 season.
- ▶ Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games of the 2016 season.
- ▶ Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.
- ▶ Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Justin McCray, 2nd Year, Central Florida, FA-17

- ▶ Signed by Green Bay as a free agent during the 2017 offseason and has seen action in 16 games with 11 starts (five at RT, two at LG, four at RG).
- ▶ Played for the Orlando Predators of the Arena Football League in 2016.
- ▶ Spent the 2015 season out of football.
- ▶ Entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the Tennessee Titans in 2014 and spent that season on Tennessee's practice squad.
- ▶ Appeared in 45 games with 32 starts in four seasons at Central Florida (2010-13), with 23 of the starts coming at RG.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ▶ Has played in 88 career regular-season games with 84 starts at right tackle, the most games played and started among starting offensive linemen on Green Bay's current roster.
- ▶ Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season.
- ▶ Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ▶ Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18

- ▶ His 69 career touchdowns rank No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends.
- ▶ Last season, led NFL tight ends with 10 receiving TDs, which marked his fourth season with 10-plus touchdown receptions to tie Antonio Gates for the second most 10-touchdown catch seasons among tight ends (Rob Gronkowski, five).
- ▶ Has been selected to the Pro Bowl five times in his career (2011, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017) and was named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2013.
- ▶ Is the only tight end in NFL history to have two seasons with 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving TDs (2011, 2013).
- ▶ From 2015-17, he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a third-round pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- ▶ Is one of four players in the league with a receiving TD in all three games this season.
- ▶ Recorded the fourth-most receptions (237) and receiving touchdowns (26) by a Green Bay player in their first four seasons (2014-17) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).
- ▶ With 12 receiving touchdowns in 2016, joined Jordy Nelson (2014, 2016), Antonio Freeman (1997-98), Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Set franchise postseason single-game records for the most catches and receiving yards by a rookie when he posted seven grabs for 117 yards (16.7 avg.) and a TD in the 2014 NFC Divisional playoff victory over Dallas.

WR Geronimo Allison, 3rd Year, Illinois, FA-16

- ▶ Leads the team with 209 receiving yards this season.
- ▶ Recorded a TD reception of 39 yards in the fourth quarter of Week 1, blocked a punt that was recovered in the end zone by CB Josh Jackson for a TD in Week 2 and registered the longest TD catch of his career (64 yards) in Week 3.
- ▶ Of his 35 receptions in 2016-17, 21 picked up first downs, a 60.0 percentage that ranked No. 3 among Packers with 35-plus catches over that span.
- ▶ Recorded career-highs with 122 receiving yards and six receptions (20.3 avg.) in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati last season, highlighted by a career-long 72-yard reception in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's game-winning 27-yard field goal.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- ▶ His career passer rating of 103.8 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ In 145 regular-season starts (95-49-1 record), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards, 87 without an interception and 80 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Jamaal Williams, Rookie, Brigham Young, D4b-17

- ▶ After playing as a reserve in the first nine games of the 2017 season, started the last seven and finished the season with a team-high 556 yards rushing and six total touchdowns (four rushing, two receiving).
- ▶ Finished No. 6 among rookie running backs in rushing yards in 2017.
- ▶ Became the first Green Bay rookie to have three consecutive games with 115-plus yards from scrimmage (Weeks 12-14) since Billy Howton in 1952.



PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

DE Muhammad Wilkerson, 8th Year, Temple, FA-18

- ▶ Originally selected by the New York Jets in the first round (No. 30 overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft out of Temple.
- ▶ Over seven seasons in New York, played in 105 regular-season games, starting 101, and recorded 498 tackles (324 solo), 44.5 sacks, two interceptions, 26 passes defended, 10 forced fumbles and a fumble recovery that he returned for a touchdown.
- ▶ In 2015, earned a spot in the Pro Bowl after posting a career-best 12 sacks, tied for the sixth most in the NFL that season and the most by a Jets player since DL Shaun Ellis recorded 12.5 in 2003. It was the second time in his career he reached 10-plus sacks after posting 10.5 in the 2013, the same season he set career highs in tackles (91) and solo tackles (66).

NT Kenny Clark, 3rd Year, UCLA, D1-16

- ▶ Has 5.5 sacks since Week 13 of 2017, tied for the second-most sacks by a defensive tackle over that span (according to SportRadar).
- ▶ Despite missing Week 12 due to injury, set career highs in tackles (78, No. 4 on the team) and sacks (4.5, No. 4 on the team) in 2017.
- ▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).
- ▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ▶ Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

DE Mike Daniels, 7th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ▶ Leads Packers defensive linemen with 26.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ After being selected as an alternate each of the previous three seasons (2015-17), was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ▶ Ranked No. 4 on the team with five sacks in 2017 and set a career high with 72 tackles.
- ▶ Has recorded at least four sacks in each season since 2013, which is tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.
- ▶ Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

OLB Clay Matthews, 10th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ▶ With 80.0 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history. Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2017 despite missing two games.
- ▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- ▶ For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).
- ▶ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Blake Martinez, 3rd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

- ▶ Ranked No. 1 on the Packers with 158 total tackles (107 solo) during the 2017 season. Dating back to 1975, it was the 14th time and first time since A.J. Hawk (153) in 2013 that a Green Bay player reached 150 tackles in a season.
- ▶ Registered 10-plus tackles in seven games in 2017 (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit, 17 at Pittsburgh, 10 vs. Tampa Bay).
- ▶ Started nine of 13 games he played in 2016 during the regular season, missing Weeks 12-14 due to injury. Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ▶ Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

ILB Oren Burks, Rookie, Vanderbilt, D3-18

- ▶ Named to the Butkus Award watch list in 2017 and went on to post career highs in tackles (82), solo tackles (45) and tackles for a loss (seven) in his first season at inside linebacker.
- ▶ Appeared in all 13 games with 10 starts as a junior in 2016 at a linebacker/safety hybrid position, finishing with 59 tackles (40 solo), 6.5 tackles for a loss and a career-best 3.5 sacks.
- ▶ Was a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award in 2017, a finalist for the

Wooden Citizenship Cup in 2017 and a member of the Allstate-AFCA Good Works Team in 2016, which honored 12 Division I-A football players from across the country for their commitment to community service. Also served as president of the Vanderbilt Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in 2016-17.

OLB Nick Perry, 7th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- ▶ Sealed the Week 1 victory over the Bears with a sack/forced fumble of QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 1:06 on the clock and the ball at the Chicago 46-yard line. The fumble was recovered by DL Kenny Clark.
- ▶ Finished second on the team with seven sacks in 2017. Registered a career-high three sacks against the Chicago Bears in Week 10. It was the first time a Packers player had three-plus sacks in a game since LB A.J. Hawk (three) on Oct. 13, 2013, at Baltimore.
- ▶ Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.
- ▶ Registered multiple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ▶ Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, ranking No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

CB Tramon Williams, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-18

- ▶ Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- ▶ Is the only active player in the NFL with at least one INT in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).
- ▶ Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.
- ▶ Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

CB Kevin King, 2nd Year, Washington, D1-17

- ▶ Appeared in nine games with five starts as a rookie in 2017, registering 31 tackles (23 solo), a tackle for a loss and eight passes defended before being placed on injured reserve (shoulder) on Dec. 6.
- ▶ Despite being limited to nine games due to injury, his five starts were the third most among Packers rookies in 2017 (S Josh Jones and RB Jamaal Williams both had seven).
- ▶ Played in all 48 games with 35 starts in his four seasons at Washington and registered 165 tackles (107 solo), 8½ tackles for a loss, six interceptions, 28 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Earned honorable mention All-Pacific-12 recognition as a junior and senior.
- ▶ Was named first-team All-East Bay by the *Contra Costa Times* as a senior at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif., where he was coached by former NFL linebacker Hardy Nickerson.

S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 5th Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ▶ Is tied for No. 4 in the NFL with two INTs this season.
- ▶ Ranked No. 3 on the team with 86 tackles and No. 2 with three INTs in 2017.
- ▶ Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ▶ In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶ Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ▶ Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

S Kentrell Brice, 3rd Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-16

- ▶ Recorded his first career sack in Week 1 as part of a 12-tackle (nine solo) performance.
- ▶ Started a career-best three games in 2017 and set career highs in tackles (24), solo tackles (21), interceptions (one) and passes defended (four) despite only playing in six contests before being placed on injured reserve with an ankle injury on Nov. 3.
- ▶ Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's Week 1 roster and joined S Marwin Evans as the only rookie free agents to play in all 16 regular-season games and three postseason contests for the Packers in 2016.

GREEN BAY WIS. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers heard the applause after walking out of the stadium tunnel and back on to the field. The team doctor had checked out his left knee after the Green Bay Packers quarterback was carted off the field in the second quarter. Rodgers, it seemed, had avoided a major injury. He was good to go. The adrenaline kicked in.

The hobbling two-time NFL MVP threw three touchdown passes in the second half after returning from injury, and the Green Bay Packers overcame a 20-point deficit for a thrilling 24-23 win over the Chicago Bears on Sunday night.

Rodgers connected with receiver Randall Cobb for a catch-and-run through the secondary for a 75-yard touchdown and the go-ahead score with 2:13 left in the game.

Nick Perry sacked the Bears' Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 58 seconds to complete the comeback.

Against the archival Bears. To start the Packers' 100th season.

Sunday marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

The Packers posted the second-largest comeback in franchise history at Lambeau Field, behind only a rally from 21 points down to beat New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989.

For Rodgers, this was special. And especially because how awful the Packers played in the first half.

A Chicago defensive returner (nearly) acquired star linebacker Khalil Mack in the third quarter. Mack had a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown against backup quarterback Desmond Haizer in the second quarter.

Ajmyi Rodgers returned in the second half and finally figured out the Bears' Healy and found Davante Adams and Geroini Allison for touchdown passes. He finished 20 of 30 for 286 yards, including 17 of 23 for 273 yards in the second half.

It was Rodgers' first regular-season home game since Sept. 28 against the Bears. He was limited to seven games in 2017 because of a collarbone injury.

Mack nearly stole the show. Healy stripped the ball for a turnover in the red zone off Kizer in the second quarter. Mack made an immediate impact in his first game since the Bears acquired the premier pass rusher in a blockbuster deal with the Oakland Raiders.

The Bears led 20-0 at one point and their defense dominated until the second half. Then Rodgers returned, and the Packers' defense held the Bears in check.

Trubisky was 23 of 35 for 171 yards. He also ran for 32 yards on seven carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

GREEN BAY Ws. (AP) — Vikings kicker Daniel Carlson missed two field goals in overtime, including one from 35 yards as time expired, and Minnesota had to settle for a 29-29 tie with the Green Bay Packers after rallying from a late 13-point deficit on Sunday.

The rookie's final attempt went to the right of the uprights, just like his kick from 49 earlier in overtime. Carlson also missed from 48 in the second quarter.

Packers kicker Mason Crosby matched a career high with five field goals, but his potential game-winner from 52 went wide left as time expired in regulation.

The result at Lambeau Field overshadowed memorable performances from both quarterbacks.

Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers played with a brace on his injured left knee and threw for 287 yards and a 9-yard touchdown pass to Devante Adams. But he misfired on a 51-yard pass to tight end Adam Thielen in overtime cost the Packers a chance at another long field-goal attempt. Rodgers recovered the fumble on second-and-1 at the 37, and he was sacked on third down to push Green Bay back to the 47.

Minnesota's Kirk Cousins threw for 425 yards and four touchdowns, including three in the fourth quarter. He also threw an interception to HaHa Clinton-Dix after the ball bounced off the hands of Landon Treadwell with 2:13 left.

Everything seemed to go the Vikings' way in the fourth, when they sailed from a 20-7 deficit. Until that point, the Packers had put together the kind of complete performance needed to support Rodgers, who got hurt in Green Bay's opening victory against Chicago.

Facing double coverage, Adams Thielen still caught a 22-yard touchdown pass from Cousins with 31 seconds left on a drive that included a roughing-the-passer penalty on Clay Matthews. Stefon Diggs caught a 2-point conversion pass to tie it at 29.

The penalty negated an interception by Aare Alexander with 1:45 left that would have allowed the Packers to run out the clock. Referee Tony Corrente said the call was not related to the new helmet-to-helmet rule.

Rodgers, who finished 30-of-42, didn't have his typical mobility that allows him to buy time for receivers. But he was able to move around enough to scramble out of trouble on occasion. Operating out of shotgun or pistol formations also bought Rodgers more time.

The Packers (1-0-1), though, could have used more touchdowns from the offense. They did get one on special teams after Geronimo Allison blocked a punt that was recovered by Josh Jackson in the end zone for a touchdown.

Thielen had 12 catches for 131 yards for Minnesota (1-0-1), while Diggs had nine catches for 128 yards and two scores.

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — Things have not gone all that well for Aaron Rodgers and Co. so far, and as the Packers (1-1-1) fall to the Redskins (2-1) on a rainy afternoon.

That was certainly the case in a 31-17 loss at the Washington Redskins on Sunday, when Green Bay fell behind 14-0 and trailed 28-10 at halftime after giving up TD drives of 74, 75, 79 and 98 yards.

Among McCarthy's slams were his teams' 11 penalties for 115 yards - including three for pass interference on one drive - and the most-discussed among those flags was linebacker Clay Matthews' for roughing the passer after he sacked Alex Smith late in the third quarter.

A week after gaining 20 yards on 11 attempts, Adrian Peterson went for 19 yards on 19 runs with a pair of 2-yard TDs. Smith went 12 for 20 for 220 yards. He also had his streak of 156 consecutive passes without an interception, the longest active run in the league, ending in the second quarter. Safety Haha Clinton-Dix made the pick when Jordan Reed went one way and Smith threw another. Rodgers, who was 27 for 44 for 265 yards passing with two touchdowns - of 64 yards to Geromino Allison and 2 yards to Davante Adams - said he expects to start against Buffalo after again dealing with an injured left knee, which he hurt in Week 1. He wore a bulky brace on his left knee against Washington, and he came up hobbling a bit after some play where he moved around in the pocket or scrambled for a gain.

Green Bay's receivers had problems with drops, plus Randall Cobb was stripped of the ball by Fabian Moreau - Josh Norman recovered the fumble - after a completion with about 5½ minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Packers' ground game was limited to 15 carries for 87 yards by running backs.

• From 2011-17, was part of a defense that ranked No. 4 in the league over that span in opponent rushing average (3.84). Helped the Jets rank No. 6 in the league (103.7 ypg) in run defense from 2011-17.

• Has registered 50-plus tackles in each of his seven seasons, including 90-plus tackles twice (90 in 2012 and 91 in 2013).

2018 SEASON: Has started all three games and has posted six tackles (four solo), a tackle for a loss and two QB hits.

• Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

• Was the only undrafted free agent in the NFL to post four-plus INTs each season from 2008-11. Was tied for No. 4 in the NFL with 19 INTs over that span.

2018 SEASON: Has started all three games and has posted 15 tackles (11 solo).

►**Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started and played all 70 snaps, one of five Green Bay defenders to do so...Finished third on the team with seven tackles (five solo).
