PACKERS OPEN PRESEASON AT THE 49ERS

The Packers will travel to California to take on the San Francisco 49ers in preseason game No. 1.



- ▶ It is the first time since 2016 that the Packers and 49ers having faced each other in the preseason, with Green Bay winning that road contest, 21-10.
- ▶ It is also the first time that the Packers have opened the preseason against the 49ers.
- ▶ It will mark the first time since 2015 (at New England) that Green Bay starts the preseason as the road team.
- ▶ It will be the third time in the last seven years (San Francisco in 2016 and at Oakland in 2018) that the Packers will play a preseason game in California.
- ▶ Including the preseason, regular season and playoffs, this will be the 10th time Green Bay and San Francisco have played over the last 10 years (2013-22).
- ▶ After the 49ers game, the Packers will welcome the New Orleans Saints to town for a couple of joint practices (Aug. 16-17) before facing them at Lambeau Field on Friday, Aug. 19, at 7 p.m.
- ▶ This is the second year that the NFL schedule will consist of three preseason games played in preparation for a 17-game regular season.

WITH THE CALL

Flagship by Milwaukee's WTMJ-TV and in conjunction with WGBA-TV in Green Bay, Packers preseason games are televised over a 20-station network throughout the state of Wisconsin, Upper Michigan and northeastern Minnesota, Peoria in Illinois, Cedar Rapids-Waterloo and Des Moines in Iowa, Omaha in Nebraska, St. Louis in Missouri, Bismarck, Fargo and Minot in North Dakota, Sioux Falls in South Dakota and Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau in Alaska.

▶ The top-notch broadcast team includes CBS's **Kevin Harlan** (play-by-play) alongside former Green Bay fullback **John Kuhn** (analyst) with **Lance Allan** of WTMJ-TV serving as the sideline reporter. Allan will also host an informative half-hour pregame show.

▶ In addition to flagship station WTMJ-TV and WGBA-TV, the games are televised over WQOW/ABC, Eau Claire, Wis.; WXOW/ABC, La Crosse, Wis.; WKOW/ABC, Madison, Wis.; WAOW/ABC, Wausau, Wis.; KQDS/FOX, Duluth, Minn./Superior, Wis.; WLUC-NBC/FOX UP, Escanaba/Marquette, Mich.; WMBD/CBS, Peoria/

- ▶ All Packers games can be heard on the Packers Radio Network, which is made up of 49 stations in Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota, Illinois and South Dakota. This year, the Packers transitioned to a new flagship station in Milwaukee, iHeartRadio Milwaukee's 97.3 The Game WRNW. For a full listing of radio affiliates, go to packers.com/video/radio-network. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 28th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 24th season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.

HEAD COACH MATT LAFLEUR

LAFLEUR LEADS THE PACK

Head Coach **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) has led the Packers to three straight NFC North titles, is the **first coach in franchise history** to post 10-plus wins in each of his first three seasons with the team and is the **first coach in NFL history** to win at least 12 games (13) in each of his first three seasons as an NFL head coach (Elias Sports Bureau).

▶ LaFleur (39-10, .796) passed George Seifert (38-10, .791, 1989-91) for the **most wins by an NFL head coach in his first three seasons in the league** (per the Elias Sports Bureau).

▶ LaFleur's 39 wins from 2019-21 are **tied for the second most** by a coach over any three-season span in league history behind only Mike Ditka's 40 wins with Chicago from 1985-87 (Elias).

▶ LaFleur is the **first head coach to in NFL history** to post 13-plus wins in three straight seasons (Elias).

▶ With LaFleur as the head coach, Green Bay has not lost back-to-back games in the regular season (9-0 following a loss). LaFleur is the **only head coach in NFL history** who did not have a two-game losing streak in his first 49 games, per Elias.

▶ LaFleur has guided the Packers to a 22-2 record (.917) in the regular season at Lambeau Field, the top home mark in the NFL from 2019-21.

▶ LaFleur has posted the **most wins by a coach at home** in his first three seasons.

▶ LaFleur recorded the **best home winning percentage by a Packers head coach in his first three seasons** since 1921 (22-2, .916 in 2019-21).

▶ 2019-21 was the first time Green Bay won seven-plus games in three straight seasons at Lambeau Field since doing it in three straight years from 2010-12.

▶ Dating back to 2019, the Packers have the **best regular-season record in the NFL**:

▶ The Packers are 14-1 (.933) in the regular season in December/January under LaFleur, ranking **No. 1 in the NFL** in Dec./Jan. since 2019. Green Bay's 14-game winning streak (Week 13 of 2019 - Week 17 of 2021) was the **second-longest winning streak** in regular-season games played in December/January in NFL history behind only the 2006-09 Chargers (19 games).

▶ LaFleur (33) **tied for the second-most wins** by a head coach in his first 40 regular-season games (Guy Chamberlin, 34; Paul Brown, 33).

▶ LaFleur reached 30 wins in his first 37 games as a head coach, **tied for the third fastest** in NFL history (Brown, 37) to reach the 30-win mark (Elias), trailing Seifert (36) and Chamberlin (35).

▶ LaFleur led Green Bay to a 20-5 record in his first 25 regular-season games, which **tied for No. 4 in NFL history** for the most wins by a head coach in his first 25 regular-season games (Elias).

▶ According to Elias, LaFleur was the **sixth head coach since 1970** to lead his team to the conference championship game in both of his first two seasons as a head coach, joining Jim Harbaugh (2011-12), Rex Ryan (2009-10), Barry Switzer (1994-95), Seifert (1989-90) and Don McCafferty (1970-71).

▶ LaFleur is just the **second NFL head coach** since the league went to a divisional format in 1967 to win 13-plus games and a division title in both of his first two seasons (2019-20), joining Seifert (1989-90).

▶ LaFleur (26) posted the **second-most wins in NFL history by a coach in his first two seasons** behind only Seifert (28 in 1989-90).

▶ LaFleur guided the Packers to 26 wins in 2019-20 after the Packers won 13 games in 2017-18. That was the **biggest two-season win improvement** by a head coach in franchise history from the two seasons prior to him taking over, eclipsing the previous mark held by Vince Lombardi (15 victories in 1959-60 after the Packers won four games in 1957-58).

▶ LaFleur led the biggest one-year win improvement in franchise history in 2019:

▶ LaFleur is 15-3 (.833) against the NFC North, giving him the best record in the NFC North/Central (min. 10 games) according to Elias:

▶ LaFleur's winning percentage of .917 (11-1) against division opponents in 2019-20 **tied for the second best** by a coach in his first two seasons as head coach, dating back to 1970 (Mike Tomlin, 11-1, .917 in 2007-08 / Mariucci, 15-1, .938 in 1997-98).

▶ Among head coaches who began their career since 1970, LaFleur was the **first one** to win their first seven road divisional games (Elias).

▶ LaFleur is **one of only two coaches in NFL history** to win his first six games against the Bears (Dennis Green, 1992-94), according to Elias.

▶ Dating back to 2019 (including playoffs), LaFleur has led the Packers to a 20-7 record (.741) in **games decided by single digits**.

▶ Under LaFleur, the Packers are 21-1 (.955) when posting two-plus takeaways in a game and have a plus-43 turnover margin (56/13) in those contests.

▶ The Packers are 30-0 under LaFleur when they win the takeaway battle. In those wins, Green Bay has turned the ball over a total of nine times and created 63 turnovers for a turnover differential of plus-54. The Packers have scored 913 points in those wins (30.4 ppg) while allowing 567 points (18.9 ppg), and have scored 30-plus points in 17 of those games.

▶ Green Bay's 30 games with a positive turnover differential **lead the NFL** since 2019 and are the **second most in team history over a three-season span** (31 in 2009-11).

▶ Under LaFleur, Green Bay is 34-1 when forcing at least one turnover, a .971 winning percentage that ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** since 2019.

▶ Green Bay is 10-0 under LaFleur when forcing three-plus turnovers. The Packers have won 12 straight games when posting three-plus take-aways.

▶ The 28 zero-giveaway games by GB from 2019-21 rank **No. 1 in NFL history** over a three-season span (NE, 25, 2010-12).

▶ LaFleur (13-3) finished with the **most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season**.

COACHING-STAFF CHANGES

Throughout the offseason, Head Coach **Matt LaFleur** saw some departures from the coaching staff and used a combination of promotions and new hires to fill those roles.

- ▶ **Rich Bisaccia** was hired as the special teams coordinator, bringing 38 years of coaching experience to the Packers, including 20 seasons in the NFL as a special teams coordinator with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders (2018-21), Dallas Cowboys (2013-17), San Diego Chargers (2011-12) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2002-10). Last season, Bisaccia was promoted to interim head coach for Las Vegas on Oct. 11 and led the Raiders to their first postseason appearance since 2017. Overall, he has held the title of associate head coach or assistant head coach for 11 years in the NFL, including each of the last seven seasons. In Bisaccia's five seasons with the Cowboys, he helped the special teams rank No. 5 in kickoff return average (24.2) after Dallas ranked No. 29 in 2012. He helped Tampa Bay win Super Bowl XXXVII in his first season as an NFL coach and guided three players to Pro Bowl honors (P Josh Bidwell, LS Dave Moore and KR Clifton Smith) in addition to 13 NFC Player of the Week awards and four NFC Player of the Month awards during his time with the Buccaneers.
- ▶ **Adam Stenavich** was promoted to offensive coordinator after working as the offensive line/run game coordinator in 2021. He served as the offensive line coach for the Packers from 2019-20. Last season, he helped an offense that saw RBs **Aaron Jones** (1,190) and **AJ Dillon** (1,116) become only the second RB duo in team history to both register 1,100-plus yards from scrimmage in the same season (2021), joining John Brockington (1,270) and MacArthur Lane (1,106) in 1972. Green Bay led the NFL in time of possession in each of the last two seasons (2020-21) and tied for No. 1 in the NFL (Minnesota, Seattle) in turnovers (13) in 2021, becoming the first team in NFL history to have 13 or fewer giveaways in three consecutive seasons (2019-21).
- ▶ **Jerry Montgomery** was promoted to defensive line/running game coordinator after coaching the defensive line for Green Bay for the past four seasons. He came to Green Bay in 2015 as the defensive front assistant, a position he held for three seasons. Montgomery joined the Packers after coaching at the collegiate level for 11 seasons, which included eight seasons coaching the defensive line at the University of Oklahoma (2013-14), the University of Michigan (2011-12), the University of Wyoming (2009-10) and the University of Northern Iowa (2007-08).
- ▶ **Jason Vrable** was promoted to wide receivers/passing game coordinator after coaching the wideouts for the Packers for the last two seasons. He joined Green Bay in 2019 as an offensive assistant after working in the same position for the New York Jets in 2017-18. Prior to his time with New York, Vrable spent four seasons with the Buffalo Bills, working as an offensive quality control coach from 2013-15 and then as an assistant quarterbacks coach in 2016.
- ▶ **Tom Clements** returns to Green Bay as quarterbacks coach. He brings 26 years of coaching experience, including 22 seasons in the NFL and 11 seasons with Green Bay as quarterbacks coach (2006-11), offensive coordinator (2012-14) and associate head coach/offense (2015-16). Clements most recently served as pass game coordinator/quarterbacks for the Arizona Cardinals in 2019-20.
- ▶ **Luke Butkus** is entering his fourth season with Green Bay and first as offensive line coach, having worked as the assistant offensive line coach from 2019-21. He came to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, Butkus was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15). He worked as a quality

control assistant for the Seattle Seahawks (2010-11) and as an offensive assistant/assistant offensive line coach for the Bears (2007-09).

- ▶ **Ryan Downard** is entering his fifth season in Green Bay and first as safeties coach after serving as assistant defensive backs coach from 2019-21 and defensive quality control coach in 2018. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016. From 2014-15, Downard was a defensive coaching assistant with the Cleveland Browns, assisting with the defensive line in 2014 and the defensive backs in 2015.
- ▶ **John Dunn** was promoted to tight ends coach after one year as a senior analyst for the Packers. He is entering his sixth season in the NFL and second in Green Bay. He previously coached tight ends for the New York Jets (2019-20) and was a football assistant (2016) and offensive assistant with the Chicago Bears (2017), working with the wide receivers and quarterbacks as well as helping to install the offensive-line protections.
- ▶ **Jason Rebrovich** was hired to coach the outside linebackers, bringing 20 years of coaching experience to the Packers, including eight seasons in the NFL with the Buffalo Bills (2013-16) and the Jacksonville Jaguars (2017-20). He most recently served as Jacksonville's defensive line coach in 2019-20. Rebrovich held multiple positions with the Bills, serving as the defensive line coach in 2016, the outside linebackers coach in 2015, the assistant defensive line coach in 2014 and as a defensive quality control coach in 2013.
- ▶ **Connor Lewis** was promoted to assistant quarterbacks coach. He is entering his seventh season with the Packers and worked last year as special teams assistant/game management specialist. In 2020, he served as an offensive quality control coach. Lewis originally joined the Packers in 2016 as a football technology analyst intern before being promoted to football technology analyst in 2017. From 2016-19, he helped the offensive coaching staff in data analysis, playing rules and game management. Prior to joining the Packers, Lewis was an independent consultant for the Oakland Raiders (2015) and worked in the football analytics and information department for the New York Giants (2014).
- ▶ **Ryan Mahaffey** will be the assistant offensive line coach after joining the Packers last year as an offensive quality control coach. He came to Green Bay after coaching in college from 2013-20. The former tight end/fullback at Northern Iowa (2007-10) spent the 2019-20 seasons at his alma mater as the offensive coordinator. Mahaffey also worked as the recruiting coordinator/tight ends (2013) and co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers (2016) at UNI.
- ▶ **Byron Storer** was hired as assistant special teams coach, joining Green Bay after four seasons working in the same role with the Raiders (2018-21). He spent two years with the San Diego Chargers, first as a special teams assistant (2012) and then as an assistant linebackers coach (2013). He began his coaching career as an assistant special teams coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2010-11).
- ▶ **John Donovan** joins the Packers as a senior analyst, coming to Green Bay from the University of Washington, where he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the last two years (2020-21). Prior to his time with the Huskies, Donovan was an offensive assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars from 2016-19, working with the tight ends in 2016, the quarterbacks in 2017-18 and the running backs in 2019.
- ▶ Green Bay hired **Ramsen Golpashin** as an offensive quality control coach, **Quinshon Odom** as a coaching assistant (minority fellowship) and **Micheal Spurlock** as a special teams quality control coach.

OFFSEASON MOVES

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff have made numerous moves that have helped Green Bay to a 39-10 record over the last three seasons, three straight division titles and appearances in two NFC title games. This offseason, Gutekunst and his staff worked to retain that roster.

► **QB Aaron Rodgers** signed a contract extension. He led the league for the fourth time in his career with a passer rating of 111.9 in 2021, joining Steve Young (six times), Roger Staubach (four) and Ken Anderson (four) as the only players to lead the NFL in rating at least four times since 1970. Rodgers was named NFL Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* and by the Pro Football Writers of America last season. He became the fifth player in NFL history to win consecutive MVPs and ranks No. 2 with four AP MVP awards (2011, 2014, 2020, 2021), trailing only Peyton Manning's five.

► **CB Jaire Alexander** and **LB Preston Smith** also both signed contract extensions. Alexander missed most of 2021 due to injury, but in 2020 he earned second-team All-Pro honors from AP, becoming the first Green Bay cornerback to earn All-Pro recognition since Charles Woodson in 2011. He was also named to his first Pro Bowl in 2020, joining Herb Adderley (1963) and Willie Buchanon (1973) as the only CBs in team history to make the Pro Bowl within their first three seasons in the league. Smith was the only player in the NFL with 25-plus sacks (49.5), five-plus INTs (five) and four-plus forced fumbles (seven) from 2015-21. Last season, he (nine) teamed with Rashan Gary (9.5) to become just the second linebacker duo in team history (since 1982) to both register nine-plus sacks in the same season.

► **LB De'Vondre Campbell** and **CB Rasul Douglas** both re-signed. In his first season with Green Bay, Campbell was named first-team All-Pro by AP after leading the team with a career-high 145 tackles (101 solo). Douglas played in 12 games with nine starts for the Packers in 2021, registering a career-best five INTs, two of which he returned for TDs to tie for the fourth most in a single season in team history.

► **TE Robert Tonyan**, who missed half of last season with a knee injury, re-signed. In 2021, he tied the single-season franchise record (Paul Coffman, 1984) for the most TD receptions by a tight end with 11, which was also tied with Chiefs TE Travis Kelce for the league lead among TEs.

► The Packers retained restricted free agent WR **Allen Lazard**, who was one of only five players in the NFL (WRs A.J. Brown, Mike Evans, Terry McClaurin and DK Metcalf) to post 30-plus catches, 450-plus receiving yards and three-plus receiving TDs and average 12.5-plus yards per catch each of the last three seasons (2019-21).

► Green Bay also added P **Pat O'Donnell**, DL **Jarran Reed** and WR **Sammy Watkins**. O'Donnell came up from Chicago, where he played in 128 regular-season games, punting 564 times for a 45.1-yard gross average and a 39.3-yard net average, which ranks No. 1 in Bears history. Overall, Reed has played in 89 games with 80 starts over five seasons with the Seattle Seahawks (2016-20) and Kansas City Chiefs (2021). Watkins, originally the No. 4 overall pick by the Buffalo Bills in 2014, has played in 99 career regular-season games with 91 starts for the Bills (2014-16), Los Angeles Rams (2017), Kansas City Chiefs (2018-20) and Baltimore Ravens (2021). He is one of five wide receivers in the league with 300-plus receptions (348), 5,000-plus receiving yards (5,059), 30-plus receiving TDs (34) and an average of 14.5-plus yards per catch (14.5 avg.) since 2014.

MEET THE DRAFT PICKS

Training-camp storylines always hover around new players and just how they figure into the depth chart. The Packers added to an already talented roster with an 11-man draft class.

► **LB Quay Walker** (No. 22 overall) and **DL Devonte Wyatt** (No. 28 overall) out of the University of Georgia were both selected by the Packers in round one to mark the first time the Packers drafted two players in the first round from the same school. They were part of a Bulldog defense that ranked No. 1 in the country in 2021 in points allowed (10.2 ppg), the top mark posted since Alabama (8.2 ppg) in 2011, and helped Georgia win its first national championship since 1980.

► **Green Bay** traded up in the second round to draft WR **Christian Watson** (No. 34 overall) out of North Dakota State. He finished his career at NDSU ranked No. 2 in school history (min. 50 rec.) in yards per reception (20.4 avg.) and yards per kickoff return (26.4 avg.), No. 8 in receiving yards (2,140) and No. 10 in receptions (105).

► **T/G Sean Rhyan** was drafted by the Packers in the third round (No. 92 overall) out of UCLA. He earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors as a junior in 2021 from the league's coaches and *Phil Steele's College Football* and second-team recognition from AP and Pro Football Focus.

► In the fourth round, the Packers selected WR **Romeo Doubs** (No. 132 overall) out of the University of Nevada and OL **Zach Tom** (No. 140 overall) from Wake Forest. Doubs finished his career ranked No. 4 in school history in receiving yards (3,322) and tied for No. 5 in TD catches (26). In 2021, Tom earned second-team All-America honors from *Phil Steele's College Football*, The Athletic and the Football Writers Association of America and earned first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors from the coaches and media.

► **LB Kingsley Enagbare** out of the University of South Carolina was selected by the Packers in the fifth round (No. 179 overall). He earned first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors and third-team All-America recognition from Pro Football Focus as a senior after leading the team in tackles for a loss (seven), sacks (4½) and QB hurries (11).

► **Green Bay** drafted four players in the seventh round: S **Tarig Carpenter** (No. 228 overall) out of Georgia Tech, DL **Jonathan Ford** (No. 234 overall) out of the University of Miami (Fla.), OL **Rasheed Walker** (No. 249 overall) from Penn State and WR **Samari Toure** (No. 258 overall) from Nebraska. Carpenter played in 52 games with 50 starts in five seasons at GT. Ford appeared in 50 games with 30 starts in five seasons with the Hurricanes. Walker played in 36 games over four seasons with the Nittany Lions, starting the final 32 contests at left tackle. Toure played for three seasons at the University of Montana before transferring to the Cornhuskers for 2021 and leading the Big Ten in yards per reception (19.5 avg.).

PERSONNEL-STAFF PROMOTIONS

General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** promoted a few people on his staff as well in the offseason.

► **Jon-Eric Sullivan**, who is entering his 19th season with the club, was promoted to vice president of player personnel after serving as the co-director of player personnel since 2018. He spent 2016-17 as the director of college scouting after working as a college scout for 12 years.

► **Chris Gaines** has worked as a scouting assistant for Green Bay since 2019 and has been promoted to college scout. He originally joined the Packers in 2016 as a football technology assistant.

► **Sean Linton** was promoted to college scout after working as a scouting assistant over the last couple years. He originally joined the Packers in 2019 as a training-camp scouting intern and returned to Green Bay as a full-season scouting intern in 2020 before being promoted to scouting assistant mid-season.

MATT LAFLEUR...In his fourth season as the Packers' 15th head coach.

- In his 14th season in the NFL, having previously served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Football Team, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16), and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- In his first three seasons leading the Packers, has authored one of the greatest starts to a head-coaching career in NFL history. With a 13-4 record in 2021, he led the Packers to a third straight NFC North crown while also earning the No. 1 seed in the NFC for the second consecutive season.
- Became the first coach in NFL history to post 13-plus wins in three straight seasons and his 39 wins from 2019-21 passed George Seifert (38) for the most wins by an NFL head coach in his first three seasons in the league (Elias Sports Bureau). His 39 wins are also tied for the second most by a coach over any three-season span in league history, trailing only Mike Ditka's 40 wins with the Chicago Bears from 1985-87 (Elias).
- Has guided the Packers to a 22-2 record (.917) in the regular season at Lambeau Field, the top home mark in the NFL from 2019-21 and the best home winning percentage by a Packers head coach in his first three seasons. His 22 wins at home are also the most in NFL history by a coach in his first three seasons.
- In his first season leading the Packers in 2019, became the first coach in club history to lead the team to the playoffs in his debut season. Also led the largest one-year win improvement in team history (plus-seven wins).

KYLE SHANAHAN...In his sixth year as the 49ers' 20th head coach.

- Named Coach of the Year by *Sporting News* in 2019 after leading the 49ers to a 13-3 regular-season record, the NFC West division title and an appearance in Super Bowl LIV.
- His 2019 offense led the NFL in rushing touchdowns (23), ranked second (29.9 ppg) and rushing (144.1 ypg) and fourth in total offense (381.1 yards per game).
- Possesses 17 seasons of coaching experience at the NFL level, including nine as an offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2015-16), Cleveland Browns (2014), Washington Redskins (2010-13) and Houston Texans (2008-09).
- In 2016, helped the Falcons reach Super Bowl LI and guided the Atlanta offense to franchise records in yards per game (415.8), points scored (540), net passing yards per game (295.3) and yards per play (6.7).
- Was named Assistant Coach of the Year in 2016 by both *The Associated Press* and the Pro Football Writers of America.

THE PACKERS-49ERS SERIES

- Originally dating back to 1950, the series featured two games per season from 1953-66 with the teams trading dominant stretches.
- San Francisco won 13 times in a span of 15 games between 1950-58, while the Packers won 10 of 11 games between 1959-64 and then also nine in a row between 1996-2010.

- The series has been noted for its postseason clashes, including several defining moments in Packers history. Green Bay's 27-17 triumph in the 1995 NFC Divisional playoff was considered the breakthrough victory that established the Packers as an elite team for the next several years. The Packers also won the next two postseason meetings, a 35-14 home victory in the 1996 NFC Divisional playoff en route to the Super Bowl XXXI title, and a 23-10 win at San Francisco in the 1997 NFC Championship game.
- The two teams met in the playoffs for a fourth straight season in 1998, with the 49ers winning, 30-27, on QB Steve Young's last-second TD pass to WR Terrell Owens.
- Most recently in the postseason, San Francisco defeated Green Bay, 13-10. In the 2021 NFC Divisional round at Lambeau Field.
- The clubs also faced off in the playoffs in back-to-back seasons (2012-13), with San Francisco coming away with wins in both.

- Green Bay's defense sacked San Francisco QB Jimmy Garoppolo four times and forced two turnovers to outlast the 49ers.
- After two long completions by Rodgers in the final minute, K Mason Crosby connected from 51 yards out to win the game on the last play.

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 2022 NFL schedule will feature 17 regular-season games and three preseason games. It is highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) on the original schedule for the ninth straight year (2014-22), seven games against 2021 playoff teams and five contests versus division winners from last year.

▶ With the three-game preseason schedule implemented last season, the Packers will alternate between hosting one and two preseason games each year. This year, with the Packers hosting only one preseason game, the matchup is designated as the Packers Give Back Game, with a benefiting charity to be highlighted through the game and surrounding activities.

▶ The Packers will open the season at the Minnesota Vikings, marking the fourth straight year and the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that Green Bay has started the season on the road. It is also just the second time ever that Green Bay has played at Minnesota in Week 1 (2020).

▶ Week 2 brings a division opponent at home for the fifth consecutive season when the Packers and Chicago Bears face off. The game will be played on Sunday night, marking the second straight year the home opener is in prime time and the 17th consecutive regular season that the Packers and Bears have squared off in a prime-time game.

▶ It is the third time in the last four seasons that Green Bay has opened up with two division opponents (2019-20).

▶ The Packers go back on the road in Week 3 as they travel to face the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, marking the third straight year that Green Bay opens the season with two of the first three games on the road.

▶ Week 4 brings the Packers back to Lambeau Field for a matchup with the New England Patriots. They have split the last two matchups (2014, 2018), with both teams winning at home.

▶ For the first time in franchise history, Green Bay will travel to London, where it will face off against the New York Giants in Week 5.

▶ The Packers return to the states to host the New York Jets in Week 6, marking the first time since 2010 that Green Bay plays both New York teams in the same season.

▶ The Packers finish October and start November with three straight road games, marking just the third time this century (2012 and 2016) that Green Bay plays three straight contests on the road. The Packers travel to play the Washington Commanders in Week 7, the Buffalo Bills in Week 8 and the Detroit Lions in Week 9. The Week 8 matchup is the first prime-time game between the Packers and Bills.

▶ Green Bay will return to Lambeau for back-to-back home games in Weeks 10-11, first hosting the Dallas Cowboys and then playing on Thursday night against the Tennessee Titans. It is the first time Green Bay will play an AFC opponent in a Thursday night contest.

▶ Weeks 12 and 13 will be on the road to end a run of a five road trips in seven games.

▶ The Packers first go east to play the Philadelphia Eagles in the first Sunday night matchup between the two teams and then travel to Chicago to take on the Bears.

▶ For the first time since 2014, Green Bay enters its bye (Week 14) after a road game. It is the latest bye ever for Green Bay, and it is just the fifth time since 1990 that the Packers have had a bye in Week 10 or later (Week 13 in 2021, Week 11 in 2019, Week 10 in 2012 and 2010).

▶ Green Bay will end the regular season with three of its last four at home for the first time since 2011.

▶ In Week 15, the Packers host the Los Angeles Rams on *Monday Night Football*, marking the latest *MNF* contest ever at Lambeau Field.

▶ For the second straight year and for the fourth time in franchise history, the Packers will play on Christmas. It will be the first time Green Bay will play on the road on the holiday, as it travels to Florida to face the Miami Dolphins.

▶ The Packers will finish the regular season the same way they started it, against two division opponents. Green Bay will end the regular season with back-to-back NFC North games for the fifth time in the last seven seasons. It is the first time ever that Green Bay will play two regular-season home games in January.

▶ In Week 17, the Minnesota Vikings come to town and the regular season will end on either Saturday or Sunday with a visit from the Detroit Lions in Week 18.

The Packers have a 90-man roster that is composed of 44 offensive players, 41 defensive players and five specialists.

- ▶ Of the 90 players on Green Bay's roster, 39 of them (43.3 percent) were draft picks of the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 11 players that were drafted in the first round, including nine that were selected by the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 36 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents.
- ▶ 62.2 percent of the players (56 of 90) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.

- ▶ Of the 90 players on the roster, 79 of them (87.8 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Aug. 12) and 49 players (54.4 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- ▶ Of the 90 players on the roster, 71 of them (78.9 percent) played collegiately in the "Power Five" conferences (ACC, Big 10, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC).
- ▶ The conference most represented on the roster is the SEC with 20 players while the Big Ten is No. 2 with 16.

PACKERS EARN THIRD STRAIGHT DIVISION TITLE
The Green Bay Packers finished the 2021 regular season with a 13-4 (.765) record, tied for the best record in the NFL (Tampa Bay Buccaneers).

- ▶ Green Bay won the NFC North for the third straight season (2019-21).
- ▶ It was the **sixth time in franchise history** that the Packers have won at least three consecutive division titles (1960-62, 1965-67, 1995-97, 2002-04, 2011-14).
- ▶ Green Bay became the **first team in NFL history** to win 13-plus regular-season games in three straight seasons.
- ▶ It was the Packers' fourth season with 13-plus wins since 2011, the **most in the NFL** from 2011-21.
- ▶ The Packers' 39 wins since 2019 are the **most in franchise history over a three-season span**, passing the 37 from 1995-97 and 1996-98.
- ▶ This was the eighth time Green Bay won 13-plus regular-season games (2020, 2019, 2011, 2007, 1997, 1996, 1962).
- ▶ It was Green Bay's fifth season with 12-plus regular-season wins from 2011-21, **No. 2 in the NFL** over that span (New England, eight).
- ▶ It was Green Bay's 10th regular season with 10-plus wins since 2009, **No. 2 in the NFL** over that span behind only New England (11).

ANOTHER TRIP TO THE POSTSEASON

- ▶ For the fourth time since 1990, the Packers earned the No. 1 seed in the postseason in the NFC in 2021 (2019, 2011, 1996).
- ▶ Dating back to realignment (2002), Green Bay leads the NFC with 15 playoff appearances.
- ▶ It was the 35th playoff appearance for the Packers, the **most in NFL history** (Dallas, 34 / Pittsburgh, 33 / N.Y. Giants, 32).
- ▶ It was the franchise's 22nd playoff appearance in the last 29 seasons (1993-2021).
- ▶ The Packers were the **only team in the NFC and one of four teams in the league** to make the playoffs in each of the last three seasons (Buffalo, Kansas City, Tennessee).
- ▶ The run of three straight postseason appearances from 2019-21 for the Packers was the sixth time the franchise made the playoffs in at least three consecutive seasons (eight - 2009-16 / six, 1993-98 / four, 2001-04 / three, 1960-62 and 1965-67).
- ▶ Green Bay (36) is tied with Pittsburgh for the **second-most postseason wins in league history** behind New England (37).
- ▶ The Packers have a 36-25 all-time record in the post-season, a .590 winning percentage that ranks **No. 4 in the NFL** (New England, 37-22, .627 / San Francisco, 34-22, .607 / Baltimore Ravens, 16-11, .593 / Pittsburgh Steelers, 36-27, .571).
- ▶ Green Bay has scored 1,523 points in the postseason, the **most in NFL history** (Pittsburgh, 1,499).
- ▶ The Packers have played (61) the **third-most** postseason games in league history (Dallas, 64 / Pittsburgh, 63 / New England, 59).
- ▶ Green Bay has been the home team for 27 postseason games (20-7, .741), marking the fifth most in the NFL (Pittsburgh, 33 / Dallas and San Francisco, 31 / New England, 28).

REMARKABLE RODGERS

- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has 24 games with multiple TD passes/zero INTs since 2020, topping Tom Brady (19 in 2010-11) for the **most over a two-season span in NFL history**.
- ▶ Rodgers led the NFL with 50 zero-INT games from 2018-21, the **most zero-INT games in NFL history over a four-season span**.
- ▶ Rodgers set the NFL mark for the most games with multiple TD passes/zero INTs in a single season:

- ▶ Rodgers posted multiple TD passes and zero INTs in seven straight regular-season games, the **longest streak in franchise history and tied for the second-longest streak in NFL history** behind only Brady (nine in 2010).
- ▶ Rodgers has 449 career passing TDs, passing Brett Favre (442) in Week 16 for the **most in team history**. His 449 TD passes as a Packer are the third most in NFL history by a QB with a single franchise (Tom Brady, 541 with New England; Drew Brees, 491 with New Orleans) and the **fifth-most overall** in league history.
- ▶ It was Rodgers' eighth regular season with at least 30 touchdown passes (37), the **fifth most in NFL history** (Brady, Favre and Peyton Manning, nine / Brees, 10).
- ▶ Rodgers has won 10-plus starts in 10 seasons, tied with Favre for the **third-most all-time** (Manning, 14 / Brady, 19).
- ▶ Rodgers passed himself (2020) and Brees (2018) for the **most games in a single season** (eight) with multiple TD passes/zero INTs/completion percentage of 70-plus. Rodgers **leads the NFL since 2020** with 15 such games.
- ▶ Rodgers finished in the top five in the NFL for the 2021 regular season in passer rating and third-down passer rating:

- ▶ Rodgers (four times) joined Steve Young (six times) and Roger Staubach (four) as well as Ken Anderson (four) as the **only players to lead the league in passer rating at least four times** since 1970.
- ▶ Rodgers was also **tied for No. 4 in the league** in TD passes (37) and ranked **No. 5** in passes of 25-plus yards (40) in 2021.
- ▶ Rodgers is **one of two NFL quarterbacks** (Patrick Mahomes) with at least 4,000 passing yards and 25 touchdown passes in each of the past four seasons (2018-21).
- ▶ Rodgers had 25 games with a 100-plus passer rating from 2020-2021, the **most over a two-season span in NFL history**:

- ▶ Rodgers has 117 career regular-season games with a passer rating of 100-plus, **No. 3 in NFL history** (Brady, 152 / Brees, 141).
- ▶ Rodgers has 74 career games with at least three TD passes and a passer rating of 100-plus, becoming the **fourth QB in NFL history** with 70-plus career games with at least three touchdown passes and a passer rating of 100-plus, joining Brady (89 games), Brees (80) and Manning (76).
- ▶ Rodgers has 61 career games with at least 300 passing yards and two TD passes and joined Brees (97 games), Brady (88) and Manning (70) as the only players all-time with at least 60 career games.
- ▶ Rodgers has 14 career games with at least four TD passes and a 140-plus passer rating, tied with Brady (14) for the **second-most games all-time** (Brees, 15).
- ▶ Rodgers threw 68 career TD passes to WR **Davante Adams**, passing Rodgers and WR Jordy Nelson (65) for the **most productive TD combo in franchise history**.

ALL-PRO CAMPBELL

► **LB De'Vondre Campbell**, voted first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press*, finished the 2021 regular season **No. 7 in the NFL** in total tackles and as **one of five players in the league** with 100-plus solo tackles:

► Campbell was the **first player in the league** with 145-plus tackles (145), multiple INTs (two), multiple sacks (two) and multiple Ffs (two) in a season since Colts LB Darius Leonard in 2018.

► Campbell was **one of three NFL players** (LAC Derwin James and TB Antoine Winfield Jr.) with multiple INTs, sacks and forced fumbles during the 2021 regular season. Campbell was the first Packers LB to do it since Julius Peppers in 2014.

JONES AND DILLON

► RB **Aaron Jones** (1,190) posted his third straight campaign with 1,000-plus scrimmage yards. It is the longest streak by a Green Bay RB since Ahman Green (five, 2000-04).

► Jones (4,163) moved past Ryan Grant (4,143) for **No. 5 on the team's all-time rushing list**.

► Jones has 4,163 rushing yards, an average of 5.06 yards per carry and 41 rushing TDs (2017-21). He joined Jim Brown (1957-61) and Jim Taylor (1958-62) as the **only players in NFL history** to reach 4,000-plus rushing yards and 40-plus rushing TDs and average 5-plus yards per carry in their first five seasons.

► Jones is **one of two players in the NFL** (RB Derrick Henry) with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10-plus TDs in each of the past three seasons.

► In Week 17, Jones (8-76) became the first Packer with 75-plus rushing yards on eight or fewer carries since RB DeShawn Wynn (7-106) vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2008.

► Jones' six receiving TDs on the season were the most by a Green Bay RB since Johnny Blood McNally had 11 in 1931.

► In 2021, Jones became the **first player in team history** to record four-plus rushing TDs (four) and six-plus receiving TDs (six) in a single regular season.

► In the 2021 regular season, Jones (52) registered the most catches by a Green Bay RB since Green (57) in 2002.

► Jones reached 40 receptions for the third consecutive season (2019-21) to tie Edgar Bennett (1993-95) for the **second-most consecutive seasons** with 40-plus receptions by a running back in team history (Green, five, 2000-04).

► Jones (2019-21) became **one of only two RBs in team history** to post three straight seasons with 45-plus receptions and multiple receiving TDs (Green, 2000-03).

► Jones is **one of five players in NFL history** with 4,000-plus rushing yards/40-plus rushing TDs/150-plus receptions/12-plus receiving TDs in his first five seasons, joining Marcus Allen, Chuck Foreman, Todd Gurley and Alvin Kamara.

► Jones (1,190) and **AJ Dillon** (1,116) became only the **second RB duo in team history** to both register 1,100-plus yards from scrimmage in the same season (2021), joining John Brockington (1,270) and MacArthur Lane (1,106) in 1972.

► In 2021, Jones and Dillon were also just the **fourth running-back duo in team history** and the first since Eddie Lee Ivey/Gerry Ellis in 1980 to both post 1,000-plus yards from scrimmage in the same season.

► Jones and Dillon were the **only RB duo in the league** with 1,000-plus yards from scrimmage, 30-plus receptions and seven-plus TDs each during the 2021 regular season. They were the **first RB duo in team history** to hit those marks and the first in the NFL since Mark Ingram/Kamara did it in 2017.

MORE REGULAR-SEASON NOTES

► Green Bay finished the 2021 regular season in the top 10 in both total offensive yards per game (365.6, **No. 10**) and total defensive yards per game (328.2, **No. 9**) for the **eighth time since 1970** (2020, 2010, 2009, 1998, 1997, 1996, 1994).

► The Packers **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** (Minnesota, Seattle) in turnovers (13) during the 2021 regular season, becoming the **first team in NFL history** to have 13 or fewer giveaways in three consecutive seasons (2019-21).

► Green Bay had 37 giveaways over the last three years (2019-21), **tied for the fewest giveaways over a three-season span in NFL history** (37 by New England from 2015-17 / 38 by the Patriots from 2014-16 and 39 by the Packers from 2018-20).

► The Packers' six fumbles lost during the 2021 regular season **tied for the fewest in team history** (six in 1943, 1995, 2011, 2020).

► Green Bay did not allow any sacks in back-to-back games (Weeks 16-17) for the first time since 2010 (Weeks 2-3). The Packers allowed one or fewer sacks in seven games during the 2021 regular season, **tied for No. 8 in the NFL**.

► Green Bay **tied for No. 5 in the league** with eight 30-plus point games during the 2021 regular season (Tampa Bay led the NFL with 10).

► The Packers scored 20-plus points in 14 of 17 regular-season games in 2021, **tied for No. 4 in the NFL** (three teams tied for the league lead with 15 games).

► Green Bay allowed 10 points or less in three games during the 2021 regular season, **tied for No. 7 in the NFL**. It was the most in one season for the Packers since 2015 (three).

► For the 2021 regular season, Green Bay's defense finished in the **top 10 in the NFL** in yards allowed per game (328.2, No. 9), passing yards allowed per game (219.1, No. 10), passing yards per play (6.18, No. 5), takeaways (26, t-No. 8), interceptions (18, t-No. 6) and interception rate (2.99 pct., No. 8).

► Green Bay allowed 26 points off of turnovers during the 2021 regular season, **No. 1 in the NFL**. It was the fewest points allowed off of turnovers by Green Bay in a season dating back to 2000 and the fewest allowed by an NFL team since the 2017 Kansas City Chiefs (22).

► The Packers **led the NFL** from 2019-21 with 98 points allowed off turnovers. Dating back to 2000, it was the fewest allowed by an NFL team over a three-season span.

► The Packers **led the NFL** in time of possession (32:43) for the second straight regular season (2020-21). It was the best mark posted by the Packers since 2009 (33:03), which was also the last time Green Bay led the league in the category prior to 2020.

► Green Bay had 69 penalties last season, the fewest by the Packers in a season with 16-plus games in team history. It was the first time Green Bay led the league in the category since tying for No. 1 in 2011 with 76, which was the previous record by the Packers in a season with 16-plus games.

► Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Weeks 17-18 (2021) marked the first time the Packers had one/zero penalties in back-to-back regular-season games since Nov. 15-22, 1959.

► The Packers' nine games with three or fewer penalties during the 2021 regular season were the most by an NFL team since the 2012 Atlanta Falcons (11).

► The 253 penalties from 2019-21 were the **fewest by Green Bay over a three-season span** since the NFL went to 16 games in 1978 (not including the 1982 strike-shortened year).

► In 2021, LBs **Preston Smith** (9.0) and **Rashan Gary** (9.5) became just the **second LB duo in team history** (since 1982) to both register nine-plus sacks in the same season (Preston Smith and Za'Darius Smith in 2019).

► According to Stathead.com, the Packers were one of two teams to have two LBs with nine-plus sacks during the 2021 regular season (Arizona Cardinals LBs Chandler Jones, 10.5; Markus Golden, 11.0).

► From Weeks 14-18 of 2021, WR **Allen Lazard** was tied for No. 2 in the NFL with five receiving TDs.

PRIME TIME

- ▶ The Packers were one of five teams to be undefeated in night games during the 2021 regular season (5-0) and the only one of those to have more than three wins.
- ▶ Green Bay went 6-0 in prime-time games during the 2020 regular season, the first time Green Bay has ever gone undefeated in a season that they played five-plus games in prime time (previous best was 4-2 in both 2016 and 2019).
- ▶ The Packers have won 12 consecutive prime-time games during the regular season, tied for the longest winning streak by an NFL team since 2000 with the 2004-07 Colts and the 2007-09 Steelers.
- ▶ Among teams to play at least five prime-time games, the Packers have the **best record in the NFL** since 2020 (11-0, 1.00).
- ▶ In the 2021 regular season, QB **Aaron Rodgers led the NFL** in passer rating (122.0) and pass TD/INT ratio (14/0) among players that played multiple prime-time games.
- ▶ Rodgers **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** with 14 TD passes in prime-time games in 2021 (Patrick Mahomes, 14 / Dak Prescott, 16).
- ▶ Over the 2020-21 seasons, Rodgers led the league with a passer rating of 128.5 in prime-time games (min. 50 pass att.) according to Stathead.com.
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown four TDs in six of the last 10 prime-time games he has played in. During the 2020-21 regular seasons, Rodgers threw 32 TDs and one INT in prime-time contests.
- ▶ In 2020-21, Rodgers registered a passer rating of 110-plus in nine of 11 prime-time contests (124.9, 147.5, 147.2, 132.3, 91.6, 128.1, 145.6, 113.3, 90.4, 141.1, 114.8).
- ▶ From 2000-21, Rodgers owns four of the top 10 single-season passer ratings in prime-time games (min. 50 pass att.) in the NFL (Stathead.com):

- ▶ In Week 2 (2021), RB **Aaron Jones** (three receiving, one rushing) became the first player to record four touchdowns on *Monday Night Football* since RB Marshall Faulk did it against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2000 (ESPN).
- ▶ Jones was **No. 2 in the NFL** with eight TDs (four rushing, four receiving) in prime-time games in 2021.

ALL-PRO

- Green Bay Packers WR **Davante Adams**, LB **De'Vondre Campbell** and QB **Aaron Rodgers** were named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press*.
- ▶ Adams was one of five unanimous first-team All-Pro selections, earning all 50 votes.
 - ▶ Adams was the first Green Bay receiver to be selected All-Pro in back-to-back seasons since Sterling Sharpe in 1992-93.
 - ▶ Campbell was selected All-Pro for the first time in his career and was the first Green Bay inside linebacker to earn AP first-team All-Pro honors since Pro Football Hall of Famer Ray Nitschke in 1966.
 - ▶ Rodgers earned All-Pro honors for the fifth time (first team in 2011, 2014 and 2020, second team in 2012).
 - ▶ Rodgers' four first-team All-Pro selections are the most for a QB in team history.

PRO BOWL

- Adams, DL **Kenny Clark** and Rodgers were named to the Pro Bowl roster.
- ▶ It was the eighth straight year and the 19th time in the last 20 years that Green Bay had multiple Pro Bowl selections.
 - ▶ It marked Adams' fifth straight selection (2017-21), making him only the second Packers WR to make five-plus consecutive Pro Bowls (James Lofton, six in a row from 1980-85). Adams' five career selections are tied for the second most by a WR in franchise history (Sharpe), trailing Lofton (seven).
 - ▶ It was the second Pro Bowl for Clark, after being an injury replacement in 2019 and being named an alternate in 2018.
 - ▶ Clark joined Henry Jordan (1960-61, 1963, 1966) and Dave Hanner (1953-54) as the only Packers defensive tackles to make multiple Pro Bowls.
 - ▶ For Rodgers, it marked the 10th Pro Bowl selection of his career (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018-21), passing QB Brett Favre and T Forrest Gregg for the most Pro Bowl selections by a Packer.
 - ▶ RB **Aaron Jones** was named first alternate. Other alternates included P **Corey Bojorquez**, CB **Rasul Douglas** and LB **Rashan Gary**.

ALL-NFL AND ALL-NFC

- Adams, Campbell and Rodgers were named to the 2021 All-NFL and All-NFC teams by the Pro Football Writers of America.
- ▶ The Packers' three selections to the PFWA All-NFL team tied for the most in the league for the 2021 season (Baltimore Ravens, Cleveland Browns, Dallas Cowboys and Los Angeles Rams).
 - ▶ Adams and Rodgers joined six other players as repeat selections from the 2020 All-NFL team (Joel Bitonio, Aaron Donald, Myles Garrett, Jalen Ramsey, Justin Tucker, T.J. Watt).

TRAINING-CAMP MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

TRAINING-CAMP PRACTICE ACCESS

▶ All public practices are open in their entirety to credentialed media. Photography (video and still) will be limited to certain periods and areas during training camp.

VIDEO/PHOTO POLICY

- ▶ The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons.
- ▶ During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography is NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The communications staff will alert the media of the permissible "shooting" periods before and during each practice.
- ▶ Video of practice and interviews by an individual or media outlet can be posted on social-media sites in compliance with the NFL online-content policy.
- ▶ No live-streaming or live broadcast of practice, interviews or press conferences is permitted by an individual or media outlet at any time on any platform.
- ▶ Tripods are not allowed to be used while filming from the sideline.

BLOGGING/TWITTER POLICY

- ▶ During training camp, "Twitter/blogging" is allowed during practices, but the Packers would ask that members of the media utilizing the technology adhere to a few simple guidelines. Please note that this policy is for training-camp practices only and does change during the regular season.
- ▶ NO entries about specific schemes, personnel groupings or anything that might be related in any way to game planning. If you have ANY questions about this, please ask a member of the Packers' communications staff before posting.
- ▶ NO entries regarding "football communications," including specific exchanges between coaches and players that might be overheard. Acknowledgement that the conversation occurred is acceptable, but we ask that the details of the conversation be withheld.
- ▶ NO detailed speculation as to the potential nature or severity of an injury until Head Coach Matt LaFleur has addressed it. Once again, acknowledging that an injury occurred and providing general details (i.e., 'Right leg...' or 'Left wrist...') is permitted, but anything beyond that would be purely speculative and possibly inaccurate.
- ▶ The team would like to continue to keep training-camp practices open to those wishing to utilize blogs and/or Twitter, but such a policy is contingent upon media adhering to the guidelines above. If there are ANY questions regarding what is or is not acceptable, please contact a member of the Packers' communications department.

PRIVATE TEAM COMMUNICATION

- ▶ The Packers ask all media, print and electronic, to refrain from reporting or recording any team communication meant solely for the team.
- ▶ This includes the post-practice team huddle, in which LaFleur addresses his players. It also includes mid-practice and/or post-practice communication between any coach and his players, especially conversations of a reprimanding, negative nature.
- ▶ In general, reporting that the conversation took place is acceptable, just not the details of those conversations. Details are not to be relayed to the public either directly (through firsthand hearing), or indirectly (through interviews, even if the subject answers the question).

▶ If media has any question as to whether communication should be kept private, please contact the communications department before writing or airing such conversations.

INJURY-FOOTAGE POLICY

- ▶ Again this season, the Packers respectfully ask all photographers (video and still) to follow guidelines related to shooting injured players.
- ▶ Photographers are asked to avoid filming, photographing, printing and/or airing any shots of any injury situation, while the injury occurs, while trainers attend to/treat the injured player, and while the player is leaving the field, either on his own or with aid. This includes minor injuries.
- ▶ The team will allow shots of players after they've been treated. For instance, cameras are allowed to shoot a player on the sideline with ice on his knee, after trainers have left.
- ▶ However, cameras are not allowed to film a player on crutches, either on the field or in the locker room.
- ▶ If outlets choose not to respect this policy — or any other policy — the team will have no choice but to consider limiting access to the field.

INJURY INFORMATION

▶ All injury information will be issued by Head Coach Matt LaFleur. Please do not address injury questions to another coach or staff member.

NFL ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY

▶ Accredited Organizations may supplement its traditional media distribution platform (e.g., newspaper, television, radio) with other new media distribution platforms that it controls (e.g., websites, official social media accounts, applications, podcasts), provided that, with respect to such new media distribution platforms: (i) any use of film or video or digital still images is limited to a reasonable amount or number (as applicable), and used only to illustrate or support news and editorial coverage of the Game or Event (as opposed to use in connection with or on commercial products (e.g., apparel, posters, commemorative programs, or other types of souvenir or other merchandise, or sponsored content) purposes; (ii) any use of film or video or digital still images is not used to create Simulated Video of game action; (iii) no video of game action is used (except that, if the Accredited Organization is a television broadcaster, Game or Event highlights may be shown as part of a single, non-archived, online "simulcast" of any regularly scheduled television news programming the Accredited Organization may broadcast, provided it adheres to the limits on such broadcasts set forth below); and (iv) use of non-game audio and video content obtained as a result of credentialed card access (e.g., press conferences, training camp, practice and/or interviews at NFL venues or events): (1) must be limited to 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds maximum -- 90 seconds per Member Club -- in two-Member Club markets), (2) may not be posted or streamed "live" or in real time in any form or medium and may not be archived (i.e., made available for on-demand public access for more than 24 hours after posting, etc.), (3) may appear only in an editorial context (i.e., no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content, including digital advertising, etc.), and (4) must be accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the applicable Member Club's web site.
