GREEN BAY ENTERS DRAFT WITH 11 SELECTIONS

Later this week, the Green Bay Packers will welcome another rookie class to their roster through the NFL Draft, which will be held April 28-30 in Las Vegas.

Armed with 11 selections, marking the fourth straight year the Packers enter the draft with 10-plus picks, Green Bay will have plenty of opportunities to add more talent and depth to their roster. All picks are eligible to be traded.

Green Bay enters the draft with a pick in six of the seven rounds (no picks in the sixth), including two selections in Rounds 1-2 and 4 and three picks in Round 7. The Packers have four of the top-60 picks in the draft.

▶ If the Packers draft 11 players, it will mark the third draft in the last six years that Green Bay selected 10-plus players (11 in 2018 and 10 in 2017). From 2000-21, the Packers selected 10-plus players in a single draft eight times (2013, 11; 2011, 10; 2007, 11; 2006, 12; 2005, 11; 2000, 13) according to pro-football-reference.com.

► The event will begin in prime time on Thursday night, with Round 1 on April 28 beginning at 7 p.m. CT.

▶ Rounds 2-3 also will be held in prime time, beginning on Friday, April 29, at 6 p.m. CT. Rounds 4-7 will complete the draft on Saturday, April 30, starting at 11 a.m. CT.

▶ Teams will have 10 minutes in between selections in the first round and seven minutes between each choice for Round 2. Rounds 3-6, including compensatory picks, will allow up to five minutes in between picks and Round 7, including compensatory picks, will allow four minutes. GUTEKUNST LEADS PACKERS IN FIFTH DRAFT AS GM

GM Brian Gutekunst enters his 24th draft with the Packers and his fifth as the general manager.

Last year, all nine of the players drafted by Green Bay appeared in a game with six playing in at least 13 (G Royce Newman, 17 / DL T.J. Slaton, 17 / WR Amari Rodgers, 16 / CB Eric Stokes, 16 / CB Shemar Jean-Charles, 14 / LB Isaiah McDuffie, 13). Seven players also played in the postseason for Green Bay last year with Stokes and C Josh Myers starting (Jean-Charles, McDuffie, Newman, Rodgers, Slaton).

In 2021, Gutekunst drafted nine players overall with four players seeing action in 10-plus regular-season games as rookies (G Jon Runyan, 16 / S Vernon Scott, 15 / RB AJ Dillon, 11 / LB Kamal Martin, 10).

In the 2019 draft, Gutekunst selected eight players overall, including LB Rashan Gary (No. 12), S Darnell Savage (No. 21), G Elgton Jenkins (No. 44) and LB Ty Summers (No. 226). All four players have played in 40-plus games for a team that has gone 39-10 in their

first three seasons. Jenkins was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2020, becoming just the third offensive lineman in team history to be named to the Pro Bowl within his first two seasons in the NFL (Derel Teteak, 1952; Charley Brock, 1940). Among NFL linebackers, Gary ranks No. 3 in QB hits (39), No. 6 in pressures (84) and No. 8 in sacks (14½) over the last two seasons (2020-21), according to TruMedia.

▶ In his first draft as general manager in 2018, Gutekunst made a couple of trades involving first-round picks that resulted in the Packers selecting CB **Jaire Alexander** at No. 18 and gaining the No. 30 pick in the 2019 draft. Alexander earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2020. He was also selected to the Pro Bowl in 2020, making him one of three CBs in franchise history to make the Pro Bowl in his first three seasons (Herb Adderley, 1963, third season; Willie Buchanon, 1973, second season).

► Green Bay selected 11 players in Gutekunst's first draft as GM. The Packers had rookies play in a league-high 171 games in 2018 and account for 50 starts, the most for Green Bay since 2006 (66 starts).

► Gutekunst spent his first 13 seasons with Green Bay as a college scout, serving as an East Coast regional scout for two years (1999-2000) before switching to the Southeast region (2001-11).

▶ During his first 13 drafts with the Packers, Gutekunst was part of a personnel department that drafted several Pro Bowlers, including WR Donald Driver (seventh round, 1999), who is the team's all-time leading receiver, QB Aaron Rodgers (first round, 2005), LB A.J. Hawk (first round, 2006), who is the leading tackler in franchise history, WR Jordy Nelson (second round, 2008), and LB Clay Matthews (first round, 2009), who is the franchise leader in sacks.

▶ Gutekunst was promoted to director of college scouting in 2012, a position he served in through 2015. Over that time period, Green Bay selected T David Bakhtiari (fourth round, 2013), who became the first Green Bay rookie to start every game at LT since 1978 and has been honored five times as an All-Pro by AP, Pro Bowl RB Eddie Lacy (second round, 2012), and WR Davante Adams (second round, 2014), who was selected to five straight Pro Bowls (2017-21) and was named first-team All-Pro by AP in 2020-21.

In 2016-17, Gutekunst served as director of player personnel and those two drafts were highlighted by the addition of DL **Kenny Clark** (first round, 2016), who has made two trips to the Pro Bowl (2019 and 2021), and RB **Aaron Jones** (fifth round, 2017), who is one of only three players in NFL history to post 4,000-plus rushing yards (4,163) and 40-plus rushing TDs (41) with an average of 5.00-plus yards per carry (5.06) in their first five seasons, joining RB Jim Brown (1957-61) and FB Jim Taylor (1958-62).

WHO HAS BEEN THERE AT NO. 22 AND 28?

Green Bay will have the No. 22 and 28 selections in the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Dating back to 1936, the Packers have selected multiple players in the first round 14 times (1954, 1965, 1966, 1967, 1968, 1970, 1972, 1977, 1978, 1980, 1990, 1993, 2009, 2019).

- ► The last time Green Bay chose a player with the No. 22 pick was in 1982 when it selected G Ron Hallstrom out of the University of Iowa.

► While first-round choices certainly can be key players for a franchise, as the Packers have shown with Pro Bowl selections QB Aaron Rodgers (2005), DL Kenny Clark (2016), LB A.J. Hawk (2006), LB Clay Matthews (2009), DT B.J. Raji (2009), S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix (2014) and CB Jaire Alexander (2018), and key contributors CB Eric Stokes (2020), S Darnell Savage (2019) and LB Rashan

Gary (2019), second-round selections can prove to be just as valuable. WRs Jordy Nelson (2008) and Randall Cobb (2011) were both picked in the second round and became the first duo in NFL history to both have 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season (2014). Another second-round pick was WR Davante Adams (2014) who earned first-team All-Pro honors from The Associated Press in 2020 and 2021, the first Packers WR to receive first-team recognition since Antonio Freeman in 1998, and was selected to five straight Pro Bowls, joining James Lofton (six straight, 1980-85) as the only WRs in team history to be selected in five-plus consecutive seasons. Other second-round picks included G **Elgton Jenkins** (2019), who was only the second Packers guard to be selected to the PFWA All-Rookie team since 1974 (Daryn Colledge, 2006) and in 2020 became the first Green Bay offensive lineman to start a game at guard, center and tackle in the same season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, CB Casey Hayward (2012), who became the first CB in franchise history (since 1974) to be named to the All-Rookie Team by Pro Football Weekly/PFWA, and RB AJ Dillon (2020), who led the team in rushing last season (803) and teamed with RB Aaron Jones (1.190) to become just the second RB duo in franchise history to both eclipse 1,100 yards from scrimmage (1,116) in the same season (John Brockington/MacArthur Lane in 1972)

- ► Green Bay has two picks in the second round this year, No. 53 and 59. Dating back to 1936, the Packers have selected multiple players in the second round six times (1967, 2005, 2006, 2008, 2012, 2017).
- ► With 22 starters and a 53-man roster, selections in the third round often turn into significant contributors for a team. Examples are WR James Jones (2007), TE Jermichael Finley (2008), S Morgan Burnett (2010), LB Kyler Fackrell (2016) and TE Josiah Deguara (2020).
- The fourth and fifth rounds have also been a spot the Packers have found starters. Last year Green Bay drafted T/G Royce Newman, (fourth round), who played in every regular-season game (16 starts) and the postseason contest, and DL T.J. Slaton (fifth round) who was one of six rookie defensive lineman in the NFL to appear in all 17 regular-season games in 2021. It was where Green Bay got Pro Bowl RB Aaron Jones (2017/fifth round), who last season became the first player in team history with four-plus rushing TDs and six-plus receiving TDs in a season. LB **Blake Martinez** (2016/fourth round) led the team in tackles for three straight seasons (2017-19). The Packers have found numerous Pro Bowl lineman in the fourth or fifth round over the years: G Josh Sitton (2008/fourth round), G T.J. Lang (2009/fourth round), five-time All-Pro T David Bakhtiari (2013/fourth round) and C Corey **Linsley** (2014/fifth round). A mainstay on the Packers' defensive line from 2012-18, Pro Bowl DT Mike Daniels (2012) was also drafted in the fifth round. Green Bay has also found key contributors in all three phases in the fourth and fifth rounds: DB Micah Hyde (2013/fifth), LB Jake Ryan (2015/fourth), DL Dean Lowry (2016/fourth), P JK Scott (2018/fifth), WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling (2018/fifth) and CB Shemar Jean-Charles (2021/fifth).
- ▶ Green Bay has received contributions from several late-round picks over the years, including DT Johnny Jolly (2006/sixth round), LB Desmond Bishop (2007/sixth round), K Mason Crosby (2007/sixth), QB Matt Flynn (2008/seventh), LB Brad Jones (2009/seventh), RB James Starks (2010/sixth), DE C.J. Wilson (2010/seventh), LB Sam Barrington (2013/seventh). In each of the last four drafts, the Packers have selected a player in the sixth or seventh round that saw significant playing time. LS Hunter Bradley (2018/seventh) played in every game in his first three seasons, LB Ty Summers (2019/seventh) has appeared in 46 contests since being drafted, S Vernon Scott (2020/seventh) played in 15 regular-season games and a postseason contest as a rookie and LB Isaiah McDuffie (2021/sixth) saw action in 13 contests and the playoff game.

A LOOK INTO THE PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT

General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** heads up a talented and experienced player personnel staff.

- ▶ Members of the personnel staff have spent months, if not years with some prospects, studying for the 2022 NFL Draft. They visit schools throughout the season, attending practices, dozens of games and pro days in the spring. In each area, they have formed relationships with high school and college coaches, trying to get a better idea of who the person is, not just the football prospect.
