

PACKERS TRAVEL EAST TO FACE THE JETS

The Green Bay Packers will take on the New York Jets in their final road game of the season.

- It will be the third December game at the Jets in team history (1981, 2002)
- tory (1981, 2002).
 The Packers have won two straight over the Jets, including their last road game, a 9-0 victory in 2010. It was Green Bay's first victory at the Jets, having lost the previous four, and the last road shutout by the Packers.
- Three of the last four games at the Jets have been decided by single digits, including one game that went to overtime.
- This will be the fifth time Green Bay has played at MetLife Stadium and just the second time against the Jets. Overall, the Packers are 2-2 at the venue.
- The Packers last played at MetLife Stadium against the New York Giants in 2013.
- With QB Aaron Rodgers as the starter, Green Bay is 2-1 at MetLife Stadium.
- Dating back to 2008, Green Bay is 25-18 against AFC teams during the regular season, a .581 winning percentage that ranks No. 6 in the NFL and No. 3 among NFC teams over that span.
- Six of the Packers' eight losses this season have been by eight points or less, including three by three or fewer points.
- The Packers are ending the regular season with two road games in the final three weeks for the seventh straight year.
- In Week 17, Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Detroit Lions for the third straight year and the fourth time in the last five seasons.

AGAINST THE AFC EAST

- In the last seven contests against the AFC East, Green Bay is 5-2.
- The Packers are 2-1 against AFC East teams this season.
- Dating back to 2002, Green Bay is 11-8 against AFC East teams, a .579 winning percentage that ranks No. 7 in the NFL over that span.
- The Packers' 11 wins against the AFC East since 2002 are tied for the most among NFC teams (New Orleans and Philadelphia), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ► TE **Jimmy Graham** has totaled 10 receiving TDs in 11 games played against AFC East teams, including a TD in two of three games against the division this season. In four of the 11 contests, Graham has recorded two TDs.
- ► In three games against AFC East teams this season, WR **Davante** Adams has totaled 18 receptions for 178 yards (9.9 avg.) and three touchdowns.
- WR **Randall Cobb** has three receiving TDs in five games against AFC East teams and has registered five-plus receptions in each contest.
- LB **Clay Matthews** has played against AFC East teams 10 times and has totaled 7.5 sacks and a forced fumble.
- CB **Tramon Williams** has four interceptions and a forced fumble in 15 games played against AFC East teams, including two interceptions against the Jets.

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 16

STAT OF THE WEEK

►WR Davante Adams reached 100 receptions for the first time in his career. It currently ranks as the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history, trailing WRs Robert Brooks (102 in 1995) and Sterling Sharpe (108 in 1992 and 112 in 1993).

Adams has 1,315 receiving yards this season, currently the eighth most in a season in franchise history and 205 yards away from passing Jordy Nelson (1,519 in 2014) for the franchise record.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 25th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



- Play-by-play man Kenny Albert joins analyst Ronde Barber and sideline reporter Kristina Pink.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
 The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

ASCENDING ADAMS

After earning his first Pro Bowl appearance in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** has reached 100 receptions and 1,000 yards for the first time in his career in 2018.

Adams ranks in the top five of the NFL in receiving TDs, receptions and receiving yards this season:

- Adams recorded his career-high fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season last week, which is tied for the fifth most in the NFL in 2018.
- Adams matched his career high for receiving TDs set in 2016 (12) and joined Steelers WR Antonio Brown as the only players in the league to record two seasons with 12-plus receiving TDs since 2016.
- With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 12 in 2018), Adams joined Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.
- ►Adams is the only player in the NFL to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).
- Adams has registered the third-most receiving touchdowns (38) and the second-most receptions by a Green Bay player in their first five seasons (2014-18) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Dating back to 1961 when the NFL went to a 14-game regular-season schedule, Adams' 100 receptions this season are the most through 14 games by a Packer, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Dating back to 1961, Adams' 12 TD receptions this season are tied for the second most through 14 games by a Packer (trails the 14 that Sharpe had in 1994).
- Adams is tied for No. 1 in the NFL (Tyreek Hill and Julio Jones) with four games with 130-plus receiving yards this season, tied for the second most in franchise history (Hutson, five in 1942) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Adams recorded 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games (Weeks 5-6, 8), joining WR James Lofton (1984) as the only players in franchise history to do so, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Dating back to 2017 (Weeks 14-15, Weeks 1-6 and 8-9 in 2018), Adams recorded five-plus receptions in 10 consecutive games to rank No. 3 in team history, trailing Sharpe, who recorded 18 consecutive games in 1993-94 and 13 straight games in 1992-93, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Adams became the first player in franchise history to record fiveplus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season (2018).

- Adams was the first Packer since Greg Jennings (2010) with three straight games with 100-plus receiving yards (Weeks 5-6, 8). Adams finished one short of the franchise record held by Lofton (four in 1982-83) and Hutson (four in 1945).
- Adams finished with 10 receptions for 166 yards (16.6 avg.) in Week 11, his sixth career game with 10-plus catches, No. 3 in team history:

- In Week 5, Adams extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his 10th straight road game, and tied the longest streak in NFL history (Eagles WR Tommy McDonald, 10, 1959-61).
- Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in each of the first three contests, which extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to last season. He had six TD catches during the streak. It was the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It was also the longest streak by a Packer player since Cobb's streak of six games in 2014.
- Adams ranks at the top of the NFL in receiving touchdowns since 2016:

EFFECTIVE RUNNING GAME

- ► Green Bay is **tied for No. 6 in the NFL** this season in games with 95-plus rushing yards (10).
- ► Green Bay has six 100-yard rushing games this season as a team on 25 or fewer attempts, the **most in a season in team history**. The Packers recorded four straight 100-yard rushing games as a team on 25 or fewer carries (Week 6, Weeks 8-10), the **longest streak in franchise history** and in the league this season (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

► Green Bay ranks No. 3 in the NFL in average yards per rush this season:

- ►If the Packers maintain 4.98 yards per rush, it will be the second-highest single-season average for Green Bay dating back to 1940 (5.05 in 2003).
- The Packers rank No. 4 in the NFL in percentage of rushing plays that gain 10-plus yards (15.0) this season (Sportradar).
- ▶Green Bay posted a season-high 195 rushing yards on 25 carries (7.8 avg.) in Week 10, just the third time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers recorded 195-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer carries (at St. Louis Cardinals, Sept. 29, 1985; at Chicago, Dec. 18, 2016).
- ► The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3 at Washington, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).

JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

► RB Aaron Jones ranks No. 1 in the NFL in rushing average (min. 80 att.) this season:

- Among running backs with 150-plus career attempts, Jones ranks No. 3 in NFL history with an average of 5.50 yards per carry.
- ► Jones ranks No. 4 among NFL running backs in percentage of rushing attempts that gain 10-plus yards (min. 50 carries), according to Sportradar:

- Jones posted at least one rushing TD in five straight games for the first time in his career this season (Weeks 10-14). It was the longest streak by a Packer since RB Ahman Green's five-game streak in 2003-04 and tied for the longest streak in the league this season (Browns RB Nick Chubb).
- ►In Weeks 8-10, Jones became the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote in 1951 to have 75-plus rushing yards on 15 or fewer attempts in three straight games.
- ► Jones rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries (9.7 avg.) with a career-best two rushing TDs in Week 10 to become just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards in a game on 15 or fewer carries and the first to accomplish the feat since Green had 15 carries for 163 yards vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.
- ► Jones' 67-yard run late in the first quarter in Week 10 was the longest of his career and the longest by a Packer since WR Randall Cobb's 67-yarder vs. Detroit on Oct. 6, 2013.
- In Week 10, Jones rushed for 96 yards on four carries (24.0 avg.) in the first quarter, the most rushing yards by a Packer in a first quarter since Green had 122 rushing yards vs. Detroit in the opening quarter on Sept. 9, 2001. Jones had 101 rushing yards in the first half, the most by a Packer since RB Ty Montgomery posted 123 yards on the ground in the first half at Chicago on Dec. 18, 2016.
- ► Jones had a career-high six runs of 10-plus yards in Week 10, the most by a Packer since Green had six at Minnesota on Nov. 2, 2003.

Rodgers leads the NFL with nine pass completions of 50-plus yards this season (pro-football-reference.com). It is tied for the second most of his career behind the 10 he threw in 2009.

- Rodgers is tied for No. 5 in the NFL this season with three passing TDs of 50-plus yards.
- Seven different Packers have caught a pass of 50-plus yards this season, the most in team history and the most on a single NFL team since the Philadelphia Eagles had seven players in 2006, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

ODDS AND ENDS

- ▶For the first time since 2006 (five), the Packers have had four or more rookies start six-plus games (CB Jaire Alexander, 10; WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, nine; CB Josh Jackson, nine and Equanimeous St. Brown, six) according to the Elias Sports Bureau
- CB Bashaud Breeland posted his second career interception return for a TD in Week 14. He became the first Packer with an INT touchdown since CB Damarious Randall (21 yards) at Dallas on Oct. 8, 2017. Breeland also added a fumble recovery to become just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record an INT return for a TD and a fumble recovery in the same game (S Marques Anderson, at Detroit, Sept. 22, 2002; CB Charles Woodson, at Detroit, Nov. 26, 2009).
- Green Bay ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in rushing average (3.9) in the red zone this season (Sportradar).
- ► The Packers ranks No. 3 in the NFL in rushing average on first down (5.2) this season (Sportradar).
- The Packers did not allow a TD in Week 4 and Week 10. The last time Green Bay had two-plus games in a season with no TDs allowed was 2010 (three games).
- ►The Packers are No. 8 in the NFL in second-half points allowed (138) this season, according to pro-footballreference.com.
- QB Aaron Rodgers ranks No. 1 in the NFL in second-half passing yards this season (2,250).

TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

- Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs.
- It was the sixth 400-yard passing game for Rodgers, a franchise record. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- Rodgers tied Manning for the fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Dan Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season. It is the first time in his career that he has registered 20-plus touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions in the first 14 games of the season (23/2). Dating back to 1950, he is the **third player in the NFL** with 20-plus TDs and two or fewer INTs in his team's first 14 games of the season (Tom Brady, 22/2 in 2016 and Nick Foles, 23/2 in 2013), according to pro-football-reference.com.

- ► In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ►Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

JOE PHILBIN...Is the Packers' interim head coach.

- ► Is in his second stint with the Packers, having coached on Green Bay's staff from 2003-11, including five seasons (2007-11) as offensive coordinator.
- ► Helped the Packers offense rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards and total points each year from 2007-11.
- ► In 2011, led a Green Bay offense that set single-season franchise records for total points (560), touchdowns (70), total yards (6,482) and net passing yards (4,924).
- ►As head coach of the Miami Dolphins from 2012-15, helped Miami increase its win total in 2012 and 2013, one of only four teams in the NFL to improve its record in both of those seasons.
- Prior to joining the NFL ranks, coached on the collegiate level for 19 seasons.

TODD BOWLES...Is in his fourth year as the Jets' 18th head coach.

- ► Has led the Jets to a 24-38 (.387) record during his tenure (2015-18) as head coach, including a 10-6 mark in his first season at the helm.
- From 2015-17, New York ranked fourth in the league in yards allowed per carry (3.79).
- In 2015, led the Jets to a six-game turnaround from the previous season, matching the second-best win improvement in the first season by a new Jets head coach.
- Prior to coming to New York, served as the defensive coordinator of the Arizona Cardinals (2013-14), earning Assistant Coach of the Year recognition in 2014.
- Also has worked as an assistant in Cleveland (2001-04), Dallas (2005-07), Miami (2008-11) and Philadelphia (2012). Served as the Dolphins' interim head coach for three games in 2011, going 2-1.

THE PACKERS-JETS SERIES

- ► The teams first met in 1973, in Milwaukee, a 23-7 Green Bay victory. Since then, the Jets have won eight of 11 matchups.
- ► The only shutout in the series came the last time the teams met in New York, with Green Bay winning 9-0. It is the only time the Packers have beaten the Jets on the road.
- ► There has been one overtime game in the series, a 19-16 Jets victory in New York in 1991. In all, six of the 12 meetings have been decided by seven points or less.
- ► The Packers and Jets combined to win the first three Super Bowls in NFL history, with Green Bay winning the first two and the Jets winning Super Bowl III.

- Packers QB Aaron Rodgers threw an 80-yard game-winning TD to WR Jordy Nelson late in the third quarter. Nelson finished with a career-high 209 yards receiving, the most by a Packer since WR Don Beebe registered 220 yards receiving vs. San Francisco in 1996.
- Green Bay WR Randall Cobb tallied two receiving TDs, totaling five receptions for 39 yards.

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started 25 games since the start of the 2017 season.

- Clark ranks No. 3 on the team in QB hits (seven) this season.
- ►After recording 4.5 sacks last seaosn, Clark is second on the team with six sacks this season.
- ► Clark is **tied for No. 4 in the NFL** with two defensive fumble recoveries this season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ► In Week 8, Clark tied his career high with two sacks against the Rams. Dating back to 2016, he is tied for No. 2 on the Packers in multisack games (Perry, three), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ► In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ► The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December in a single season (since 1982).

- Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the singlegame franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- Crosby passed Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Atlanta Falcons in Week 14 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 341 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paidattendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Green Bay is 5-1-1 at home this season with a .786 winning percentage that ranks No. 10 in the NFL.
- Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

- Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- Appeared in 44 career games with 26 starts at Duke, closing out his career with 21 consecutive starts at left guard.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► Has played in 97 career regular-season games with 93 starts at right tackle.
- Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season.
 ► Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury
- vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- Named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18

WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- ► Is the only player in the NFL to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).
- Became the first player in franchise history to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season.
- With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (12) in 2016 and 2018, and 10 in 2017), he joined Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.
- Registered the third-most receptions (314) and tied for the third most receiving touchdowns (36) by a Green Bay player in their first five sea-sons (2014-18) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).

WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, Rookie, South Florida, D5c-18

- Leads the team with 15.4 yards per reception (min. 15 receptions).
 In Week 8 at New England, totaled 101 yards on three receptions (33.7
- avg.), becoming the first Packer since Max McGee (1959) to have two 100-yard receiving games in a season on three or fewer receptions.
- Posted an average of 17.3 yards per catch on his 75 receptions at USF, the top mark in school history (min. 70 receptions)
- Played first two seasons at North Carolina State (2013-14), posting 44 receptions for 538 yards (12.2 avg.) and a TD before transfering to USF, where he played two seasons (2016-17).

<u>QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05</u>

- His career passer rating of 103.1 ranks No. 1 in NFL history
- ▶ In 156 regular-season starts (99-56-1 record), has posted 55 games with 300-plus passing yards, 96 without an interception and 86 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38)
- Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percent-age (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from The Associated Press.

RB Jamaal Williams, Rookie, Brigham Young, D4b-17

- Recorded a season-high 97 scrimmage yards on 16 touches (6.1) with a touchdown in Week 15 at Chicago.
- Has played in 14 games with six starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 365 rushing yards this season.
- After playing as a reserve in the first nine games of the 2017 season, started the last seven and finished the season with a team-high 556 yards rushing and six total touchdowns (four rushing, two receiving)
- Finished No. 6 among rookie running backs in rushing yards in 2017.
- Became the first Green Bay rookie to have three consecutive games with 115-plus yards from scrimmage (Weeks 12-14) since Billy Howton in 1952.

- ▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13 vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.

NT Tyler Lancaster, Rookie, Northwestern, FA-18

- ► Was a team captain as a senior, earning honorable mention All-Big Ten for a defense that ranked No. 9 in the NCAA in rushing defense.
- ▶ Played in 40 games with 39 starts over four seasons for Northwestern, racking up 101 tackles (46 solo), 18.5 tackles for a loss, 3.5 sacks and two forced fumbles.

- DE Kenny Clark, 3rd Year, UCLA, D1-16 ▶Ranks No. 2 on the team with a career-best six sacks this season.
- ▶ Is No. 3 on the team in QB hits (seven) this season.
- Despite missing Week 12 due to injury, set career highs in tackles (78, No. 4 on the team) and sacks (4.5, No. 4 on the team) in 2017.
- Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).
- Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- Earned third-team All-America honors from The Associated Press and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

OLB Clay Matthews, 10th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- Leads the team in QB pressures (16) and is tied for No. 1 on the team in QB hits (eight) this season.
- ▶ With 83.5 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history. Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2017 despite missing two games.
 Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six
- others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016). Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015
- after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the
- team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team). With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Blake Martinez, 3rd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

- Leads the Packers in total tackles (128) and solo tackles (88) this season.
- Ranked No. 1 on the Packers with 158 total tackles (107 solo) during the 2017 season. Dating back to 1975, it was the 14th time and first time since A.J. Hawk (153) in 2013 that a Green Bay player reached 150 tackles in a season.
- Registered 10-plus tackles in seven games in 2017 (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit, 17 at Pittsburgh, 10 vs. Tampa bay)
- Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

ILB Antonio Morrison, 3rd Year, Florida, FA-18

- Has played in all 14 games with seven starts this season.
 Acquired by the Packers in a trade with the Indianapolis Colts on Aug. 26, 2018, in exchange for CB Lenzy Pipkins. 15

Originally selected by the Colts in the fourth round (No. 125 overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft out of the University of Florida.

THE DOPE SHEET

▶ In two seasons with Indianapolis, played in 31 games with 19 starts and registered 154 tackles (91 solo), six tackles for a loss and a pass defensed. Started all 15 games he played in at inside linebacker last season and led the team with a career-high 108 tackles (64 solo).

OLB Kyler Fackrell, 3rd Year, Utah State, D3-16

- After tying for No. 2 on the team with 20 QB pressures in 2017, he leads the Packers with 8.5 sacks this season.
- According to Sportradar, ranks No. 6 among NFL linebackers in sacks this season.
- Is tied for the fifth-most three-sack games (two) in franchise history (since 1982), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Became one of just 15 players in school history to earn first-team or second-team all-conference recognition three times during his career (2012-13, 2015).
- Entered college as a walk-on in 2011 before a scholarship opened up in the fall.

CB Jaire Alexander, Rookie, Louisville, D1-18

- Has played in 13 games with 10 starts this season, ranking No. 1 on the team with 15 passes defensed.
- Registered five passes defensed against the Los Angeles Rams in Week 8, the most by a Green Bay defender this season.
- Was just the third Louisville defensive back in school history to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.
- Played in 31 games with 19 starts during his three seasons with the Cardinals, earning second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016.

CB Josh Jackson, Rookie, Iowa, D2-18

- Has played in 14 games with nine starts.
- Ranks No. 2 on the team with 11 passes defensed this season.
- Set career highs as a junior at lowa in games started (13), passes defensed (26, No. 1 in the nation) and interceptions (eight, No. 1 in the nation and tied a school record).
- Named a permanent team captain on the Iowa defense in 2017 and was a consensus first-team All-American as well as first-team All-Big Ten by the league's coaches and media.

S Tramon Williams, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-18

- After starting the first seven games of the season at CB, started at S in each of the past seven games.
- Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- Is the only active player in the NFL with at least one INT in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17)

- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

S Kentrell Brice, 3rd Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-16

- Recorded his first career sack in Week 1 as part of a 12-tackle (nine solo) performance.
- Started a career-best three games in 2017 and set career highs in tackles (24), solo tackles (21), interceptions (one) and passes defensed (four) despite only playing in six contests before being placed on injured reserve with an ankle injury on Nov. 3.
- Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's Week 1 roster and joined S Marwin Evans as the only rookie free agents to play in all 16 regular-season games and three postseason contests for the Packers in 2016.
- Started 33 of 49 games played at Louisiana Tech, recording 210 tackles (154 solo), 10 tackles for a loss, five sacks, three interceptions, four forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and 13 pass breakups.

## 17 Davante Adams, WR, 5th Year, Fresno State

• Has 34 receiving touchdowns since 2016, tied for No. 1 in the league (Steelers WR Antonio Brown) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 27 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.

• Is the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.

• Is the lone player in the NFL to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons. Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.

• Leads the league with 25 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016, six more than any other player.

• Has posted 337 catches since entering the league in 2014, the second most in franchise history by a player in his first five NFL seasons behind only Sharpe (389). His 38 career receiving TDs are the third most in team annals by a player in his first five seasons in the league behind only WRs Antonio Freeman (42) and Greg Jennings (40).

• Led the team with 74 catches for a team-high 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 TDs in 2017. Was tied for No. 2 in the NFL in TD receptions and was named to his first career Pro Bowl (injury replacement for Falcons WR Julio Jones).

2018 SEASON: Has started all 14 games and leads the team with a career-high 100 receptions for a career-best 1,315 yards (13.2 avg.) and a team-high 12 TDs (tied for career best)...Is tied for No. 2 in the NFL in receiving TDs and ranks tied for No. 4 in receptions and No. 4 in receiving vards...Is one of just three players in team history to register 100-plus receptions in a season (Sharpe, 1992 and 1993; WR Robert Brooks, 1995)...Has registered a career-high five 100-yard receiving games...Leads the league with 11 TD catches in the red zone and is tied for No. 3 in the NFL in red-zone receiving yards (117)...Has posted a TD catch in a careerhigh 10 games this season (No. 2 in the NFL)...His 100 receptions are the most in team history through the first 14 games of the season, one ahead of Sharpe's 99 catches in 1993...Registered five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games this season, the first player in franchise history to acccomplish that feat...Leads the team with a career-high 18 receptions of 20-plus yards (17 in 2016)...Leads the league with 476 receiving yards on third down and is tied for No. 1 with 26 receptions on third down...Is tied for No. 1 in the NFL (Falcons WR Julio Jones and Chiefs WR Tyreek Hill) with four 130-yard receiving games this season, tied for the second most in a season in franchise history (Hutson, five in 1942)...Has averaged 103.0 receiving yards per game since Week 5, No. 1 in the league over that span.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played 59 of 60 snaps, hauling in five passes for 88 yards (17.6 avg.) and a TD...It marked his fourth straight game with a receiving TD against the Bears, giving him five TDs over that span...Early in the fourth quarter, created separation on a double move, beating CB Prince Amukamara as he hauled in QB Aaron Rodgers' pass near the Green Bay 40 before taking it down the middle of the field to the Chicago 24 for a 51-yard gain...Three plays later, caught a short pass from Rodgers just inside the 10 before beating Amukamara down the sideline as he got to the pylon for the 12-yard TD.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and played 75 of 77 snaps, leading the team with eight receptions for 64 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD...It marked his third straight game with a TD catch against the Vikings and his career-high fourth consecutive regular-season game overall with a TD reception...Early in the second quarter, caught a quick-out from Rodgers near the 2-yard line, eluding LB Anthony Barr and CB Xavier Rhodes on his way to the end zone for the score.

► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started and played 68 of 69 snaps, pacing the team with seven receptions for 52 yards (7.4 avg.) and a TD... Scored on a slant on Green Bay's opening drive of the second half, hauling in the pass from Rodgers and fighting through a tackle attempt by CB

Quinton Dunbar for the 2-yard score...Extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his ninth straight road game, tied for the second-longest streak in NFL history (Eagles WR Mike Quick, nine, 1983-84) behind only Eagles WR Tommy McDonald's streak of 10 straight games in 1959-61...Also extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to a career-high five straight, the longest by a Packer since WR Randall Cobb's streak of six games in 2014...Became the third Packer in the last four seasons (James Jones, 2015; Jordy Nelson, 2016) to catch a TD pass in each of the first three games of the season.

►Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Started and played all 76 snaps, pacing the team with eight receptions for 81 yards (10.1 avg.)...In the second quarter, made a move to elude CB Tre'Davious White and then caught a pass over the middle from Rodgers for a 25-yard pickup.

► At Detroit (Oct. 7): Started and played 71 of 81 snaps despite dealing with a calf injury that limited him during the week...Led the team with nine receptions for 140 yards (15.6 avg.) and a TD, the second-best receiving-yardage output in his career behind only his 156 yards at Tennessee in 2016...Early in the fourth quarter, made an inside move to create separation from CB Darius Slay on the 12-yard TD catch...The score gave him a TD catch in 10 consecutive road games, which tied McDonald for the longest streak in NFL history...Matched his career high with three receptions of 20-plus yards on the afternoon (at Tennessee in 2016), including two on a second-quarter drive, the first a 22-yard pickup on a pass over the middle and the second a 30-yard gain out of the slot as he got past Slay to make the catch down the sideline to the Detroit 9.

►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Started and played 63 of 71 snaps, leading the team with a season-high 10 receptions for 132 yards (13.2 avg.) and two TDs, the third time in his career that he posted 10-plus catches and two-plus receiving TDs in a game as he matches WR Don Hutson (three) for the most in team annals...Is the only player in the league to record 10-plus catches and two-plus receiving TDs in a game each of the past three seasons (2016-18)...Late in the first guarter, found an opening in the middle of the end zone in front of DB Adrian Colbert to haul in a 9-yard TD pass from Rodgers...With the Packers trailing, 30-23, with three minutes to go in the game, got behind LB Reuben Foster to make a 38-yard catch over the middle down to the San Francisco 20...Three plays later, made a leaping catch behind DB Greg Mabin for the 16-yard TD as the Packers tied the game with 1:55 remaining...On the Packers' gamewinning drive, helped set up K Mason Crosby's 29-yard FG by beating Mabin off the line and then hauling in a 19-yard pass from Rodgers down the sideline to the San Francisco 9...Posted four catches for 81 yards (20.2 avg.) in the final three minutes of the game.

►At L.A. ► At New England (Nov. 4): Led the team with six receptions for 40 yards (6.7 avg.) and a TD, his 10th straight game with five-plus catches, the third-longest streak in team history behind only Sharpe (18 games in 1993-94, 13 games in 1992-93)...With just under five minutes remaining in the first half, got in front of CB Jonathan Jones in the end zone on third-and-goal from the 2 to make the TD catch.

►Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Matched his career high (six previous times) with two TD catches as part of a four-catch, 57-yard (14.3 avg.) effort...On Green Bay's opening drive, beat CB Bobby McCain on a slant for a 7-yard TD...In the second quarter on a third-and-9, freed himself from CB Xavien Howard to make a 19-yard catch near the sideline...Midway through the third quarter, found an opening to make a catch near the Miami 5 before easily taking it in for a 25-yard TD.

Rams)...On Green Bay's second drive, beat CB Tre Flowers down the left sideline for a 41-yard catch to the Seattle 36...Early in the fourth quarter, beat CB Shaquill Griffin for a 57-yard catch to the Seattle 17, hauling in the pass with his right hand as Griffin held his left arm.

►At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Started and played all 53 snaps, leading the team with five receptions for 69 yards (13.8 avg.) and a TD as he went over the 1,000-yard receiving mark on the season for the first time in his career...On Green Bay's second series, beat CB Xavier Rhodes to make a back-shoulder catch at the Minnesota 5 before taking it in for the 15-yard TD...Late in the fourth quarter, beat Rhodes down the right sideline for a 36-yard reception to the Minnesota 29.

►Vs. first career Pro Bowl selection (injury replacement for WR Dez Bryant).

• Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

• With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, is the only player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.

Posted a career-best six runs of 10-plus yards, the most by a Green Bay player since Green had six at Minnesota on Nov. 2, 2003...Added three catches for 27 yards (9.0 avg.) for a career-best 172 yards from scrimmage, the most by a Packers RB since Eddie Lacy registered 182 yards at

New Orleans on Oct. 26, 2014...Accounted for 54 of the Packers' 70 yards on the opening series (27 rushing, 27 receiving).

Has posted six seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (four), Redskins QB Alex Smith (two) and nine QBs (one).
Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.

• Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), tied with Saints QB Drew Brees for the most in NFL history.

• Is one of only three QBs in NFL annals with 40,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).

• Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).

• In 156 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 55 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 5 in the NFL over that span), 94 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 85 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

• Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in six of the last nine seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16).

• In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and four of the top six for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016).

### 65 Lane Taylor, G, 6th Year, Oklahoma State

• Has started all 44 games he played in since 2016, the most by a Green Bay player over that span. Has opened games at three different spots on the offensive line (43 at LG, two at LT, one at RG) during his career.

• In his first two seasons as a starter (2016-17), helped the Packers rank No. 4 in the NFL over that span with an average of 4.51 yards per carry.

• Started all 15 games he appeared in last season, opening 13 at LG and two at LT, the first starts of his career at LT.

• Started a career-high 16 games at LG in 2016, one of three Green Bay linemen (David Bakhtiari, Bryan Bulaga) to open every game on the season.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started all 13 games he has appeared in at LG...Has helped the Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in yards per carry (4.98), No. 1 in rushing first-down percentage (28.7), No. 11 in total offense (370.7 ypg) and No. 9 in net passing yards (264.0 ypg)...Has helped block for an offense that has produced a single-season franchise-record six games with 100-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer attempts, tied with Miami for the most in the league this season...Was inactive (foot) for one game.

► Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started at LG and played all 60 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating...Part of a line that did not allow a sack in the second half.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started at LG and appeared on all 77 snaps, blocking for Rodgers as he completed 30 of 42 passes (71.4 percent) for 281 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 97.4 rating.

► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started at LG and played all 69 snaps, helping the Packers rush for 100 yards on just 17 carries (5.9 avg.), the fewest attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133)...Blocked for Rodgers as he posted his third straight game without an INT (27 of 44, 265 yards, two TDs, 93.5 rating).

► Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Started at LG and played all 76 snaps, helping the offense register a season-high 423 yards of offense, including a season-best 141 yards on 32 carries (4.4 avg.)...Helped the Packers convert 11 of 19 third downs (57.9 pct.), with the 11 conversions the most by the team since Oct. 27, 2013 (13 at Minnesota).

► At Detroit (Oct. 7): Started at LG and played all 81 snaps, helping the offense rack up 521 yards of offense, the most by the Packers since Sept. 15, 2013, vs. Washington (580 yards)...Protected Rodgers as he threw for 442 yards, the third most in a game in franchise history, and three TDs on 32-of-52 passing.

►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Started at LG and played all 71 snaps, blocking for Rodgers as he became the first QB in NFL history to record back-to-back 400-yard passing games with no INTs (425 yards and two TDs on 25-of-46 passing)...Helped the Packers rack up 521 yards of offense, just the second time in franchise history (also 1983) that the team registered back-to-back 500-yard games.

► At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Started at LG and played all 52 snaps, helping to protect Rodgers as he connected on 18 of 30 passes for 286 yards and one TD with no INTs, his third straight game without an INT...Helped Green Bay rush for 106 yards and two TDs on 19 carries (5.6 avg.), highlighted by 86 yards and a TD on 12 carries (7.2 avg.) from RB Aaron Jones.

►At New England (Nov. 4): Started at LG and played all 74 snaps, helping the offense rush for 117 yards on 25 carries (4.7 avg.)...Protected Rodgers as he posted his fourth straight zero-INT game (24 of 43, 259 yards, two TDs, 89.2 rating) and brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT to 200...Part of a line that allowed just one sack on the evening.

►Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Started at LG and played all 57 snaps, helping clear the way for the offense to rush for a season-high 195 yards and two TDs on just 25 carries (7.8 avg.)...It marked just the third time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers recorded 195-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer carries (at St. Louis Cardinals, Sept. 29, 1985; at Chicago, Dec. 18, 2016)...Helped the Packers post their franchise-record fourth straight outing with 100-plus rushing yards and 25 or fewer carries, just the third time since the merger that a team has accomplished that feat (Miami Dolphins, 2007; Dallas Cowboys, 2015-16)...Blocked for Jones as he racked up a career-high 145 yards and a career-best two rushing TDs on only 15 carries (9.7 avg.), just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards on 15 or fewer carries and the first since Ahman Green (15-163) vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.

►At Seattle (Nov. 15): Started and played all 49 snaps, protecting Rodgers as he threw for 332 yards and two TDs on 21-of-30 passing for a 128.8 rating, his sixth straight game with no interceptions, tied for the second-longest streak in team history behind only Rodgers' seven-game streak in 2016.

► At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Started at LG, but was limited to 32 snaps of action after departing the game in the third quarter due to a quad injury. ► Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Started at LG and played all 76 snaps, protecting Rodgers as he set a franchise record with his eighth straight zero-INT game (min. 15 att.) and brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT to 336, surpassing QB Bart Starr's mark (294 in 1964-65) for the longest streak in team annals and moving him into the No. 2 spot in league history behind only Tom Brady (358 in 2010-11)...Part of a line that allowed just one sack on the afternoon.

►Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Inactive (foot), just the second game of his career that he missed due to injury.

► At Chicago (Dec. 16): Started at LG and played all 68 snaps, blocking for Rodgers as he threw for 274 yards on 25-of-42 passing.

### 85 Robert Tonyan, TE, 1st Year, Indiana State

• Spent the final four weeks of the 2017 season on Green Bay's practice squad. Entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the Detroit Lions in 2017.

• Finished his four-year career at Indiana State as the program's leader in career touchdown receptions (20), single-season touchdown receptions (10, 2016) and most consecutive games with a reception (21, 2015-16). Also ranks No. 2 in school history with 2,047 receiving yards.

• Earned second-team All-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors as a senior WR in 2016 after leading the team in receptions (56), receiving yards (699) and receiving TDs (10).

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in all 14 games, seeing time on offense and special teams...Has two catches for 59 yards (29.5 avg.) and a TD...Has registered one tackle on special teams.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Appeared on 11 snaps on special teams in his NFL debut.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Played 16 snaps on special teams and posted a tackle.

At Washington (Sept. 23): Appeared on 15 plays on special teams.
 Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Played nine snaps on special teams.

► At Detroit (Oct. 7): Saw the first offensive action of his career, appearing on three plays...Also played 16 snaps on special teams.

►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Appeared on two plays on offense and 15 on special teams.

### 83 Marquez Valdes-Scantling, WR, Rookie, South Florida

• Posted an average of 17.3 yards per catch on his 75 receptions at South Florida, the top mark in school history (min. 70 receptions).

 $\bullet$  Set the school single-season record with 879 yards on a team-high 53 receptions (16.6 avg.) with six touchdowns for the Bulls as a senior in 2017.

• Ranks No. 10 in school history for career receiving yards (1,294) and No. 6 in TD catches (11) despite only playing two seasons for the Bulls.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in all 14 games with nine starts and has posted 30 catches for 463 yards (15.4 avg.) and two TDs...Of his 30 receptions, seven have been for 20-plus yards, tied for the second most on the team behind only WR Davante Adams (18)...Has three receptions of 40-plus yards, No. 2 on the team behind only Adams (five)...Is tied for No. 2 in franchise history among rookies with two 100-yard receiving games on the season, trailing only Billy Howton (six in 1952)...Has one kickoff return for 21 vards...Has added two tackles on special teams.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Played two snaps on offense and 11 on special teams in his NFL debut...Returned one kickoff for 21 yards.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Appeared on six plays on offense and seven on special teams...Posted his first NFL reception, hauling in a 3-yard pass near the sideline from QB Aaron Rodgers in the first guarter.

►At Washington (Sept. 23): Played 12 snaps on offense and 10 on special teams...Registered a career-high two tackles on special teams, bringing down CB Greg Stroman at the Washington 17 on a kickoff return in the third quarter and Stroman again in the fourth quarter on a punt return...Downed a 41-yard JK Scott punt at the Washington 2-yard line midway through the second quarter.

►Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Made his first career start, opening as the third WR with Randall Cobb (hamstring) sidelined...Played a career-high 54 snaps and posted a career-long 38-yard reception...With just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, beat CB Ryan Lewis down the right sideline to catch a deep pass from Rodgers to the Buffalo 28, helping to set up a 52-yard Mason Crosby field goal.

► At Detroit (Oct. 7): Started for the second straight week with Cobb (hamstring) and WR Geronimo Allison (concussion/hamstring) sidelined, appearing on 77 of 81 plays and posting a career-high seven receptions for 68 yards (9.7 avg.) and a TD...Early in the third quarter, posted his first TD catch as a pro, hauling in a 3-yard TD pass as he found himself wide open in the end zone with two defenders going to cover Adams.

►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Started his third straight game and appeared on 66 of 71 snaps...Posted a career-high 103 receiving yards on just three catches (34.3 avg.), becoming just the sixth Green Bay rookie since 1950 to register 100-plus receiving yards in a game on three or fewer catches (Howton, Max McGee, James Lofton, Greg Jennings, James Jones)...On the Packers' first play from scrimmage, found himself wide open down the left sideline, hauling in a pass from Rodgers near midfield and taking it down the sideline to the San Francisco 17...Early in the third quarter, made an out-and-up move and then came back on the ball to make a leaping 30-yard catch near the sideline with S Jaquiski Tartt covering him.

► At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Started his fourth consecutive game and played 31 snaps, catching two passes for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) and a TD... With the Packers trailing, 26-20, midway through the fourth quarter, got inside on CB Troy Hill and caught a deep pass from Rodgers for a 40-yard TD, outrunning S Lamarcus Joyner after making the catch on his way to the end zone.

►At New England (Nov. 4): Made his fifth straight start, appearing on 60 of 74 snaps and leading the team with 101 yards receiving on three catches (33.7 avg.), with all three grabs coming in the second half ...Became the first Packer since McGee in 1959 to register two 100-yard receiving games on three or fewer catches in a season and is only the third NFL player to accomplish that feat since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Rams WR Drew Hill, 1980; Patriots WR Stanley Morgan, 1978, 1980, 1984)...All three of his receptions were for 20-plus yards, bringing his streak to four straight catches of 20-plus yards...On the third play of the second half, beat CB Jason McCourty on a post for a 51-yard gain to the New England 21 on third-and-6...Late in the third quarter, made an out-and-up move before making a leaping 24-yard reception down the right sideline on third down over CB J.C. Jackson...On the New England 34.

►Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Started for the sixth straight game and led the

team with six receptions for 44 yards (7.3 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs...Made a pair of 11-yard receptions on back-to-back plays late in the first half.

► At Seattle (Nov. 15): Started and played 48 snaps, posting an 8-yard reception.

► At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Started and played 44 snaps, recording one catch for 3 yards.

► Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Started and appeared on 64 plays, posting two receptions for 19 yards (9.5 avg.).

• Spent time on the Buccaneers' practice squad in 2016 before being signed by the Cleveland Browns. Played in 24 games with nine starts for the Browns in 2016-17, recording seven receptions for 46 yards (6.6 avg.) and 13 tackles on special teams.

**2018 SEASON:** Has appeared in three games, seeing time on offense and special teams...Has posted a tackle on special teams...Was signed to Green Bay's practice squad on Oct. 22 and then was signed to the 53-man roster on Dec. 1.

►Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Played three snaps on offense and nine on special teams in his Green Bay debut.

►Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Played 16 snaps on special teams and two on offense...Registered a tackle on special teams.

► At Chicago (Dec. 16): Appeared on four plays on offense and 17 on special teams.

### 96 Muhammad Wilkerson, DL, 8th Year, Temple

• The former Pro Bowler (2015) and second-team All-Pro member (*The Associated Press* in 2013 and 2015) joins the Packers after spending the first seven seasons of his career with the N.Y. Jets, who selected him in the first round (No. 30 overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

• Registered three-plus sacks and at least one forced fumble in six different seasons, tied for the most among defensive linemen since 2011.

• From 2011-17, was part of a defense that ranked No. 4 in the league over that span in opponent rushing average (3.84). Helped the Jets rank No. 6 in the league (103.7 ypg) in run defense from 2011-17.

• Has registered 50-plus tackles in each of his seven seasons, including 90-plus tackles twice (90 in 2012 and 91 in 2013).

**2018 SEASON:** Started the first three games and posted six tackles (four solo), a tackle for a loss and two QB hits...Was placed on injured reserve (ankle) on Sept. 29.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played 43 snaps in his Green Bay debut, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss and a QB hit.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and played 49 snaps, posting a solo tackle and a QB hit...Part of a line that helped limit the Vikings to just 68 yards on 18 carries (3.8 avg.).

► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started and played 23 snaps, recording an assisted tackle, but was carted off the field after sustaining an ankle injury with just over two minutes remaining in the first half.

#### 30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 2nd Year, Brigham Young

• Rushed for a team-high 556 yards last season, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four TDs on 153 carries (3.6 avg.).

• Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie running back since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.

• Became the first rookie in team history to register a rushing TD/receiving TD in two games (Week 12 at Pittsburgh, Week 14 at Cleveland).

• After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in all 14 games with six starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 365 rushing yards and two TDs on 98 carries (3.7 avg.)...Also has 18 receptions for 133 yards (7.4 avg.) and four kickoff returns for 95 yards (23.8 avg.).

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and led the team with 47 rushing yards on 15 carries (3.1 avg.)...Had a key blitz pickup on QB Aaron Rodgers' 51-yard completion to WR Davante Adams in the fourth quarter, stuffing LB Danny Trevathan as he came up the middle to give Rodgers a clean look on the big gain.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and rushed for a team-high 59 yards on 16 carries (3.7 avg.), picking up a career-high six first downs... Also caught three passes for 12 yards (4.0 avg.).

► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started and rushed for 29 yards on five carries (5.8 avg.) with two receptions for 16 yards (8.0 avg.).

►Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Started and posted 27 rushing yards on 11 carries (2.5 avg.).

► At Detroit (Oct. 7): Started and rushed for 33 yards on six attempts (5.5 avg.) with two receptions for 19 yards (9.5 avg.)...Early in the third quarter, posted his first career two-point conversion, freeing himself from LB Jarrad Davis to haul in a pass from QB Aaron Rodgers in the end zone.

► Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Posted 29 rushing yards on six carries (4.8 avg.) along with a 10-yard reception.

► At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Carried the ball four times for 9 yards (2.3 avg.) and scored his first TD of the season on a 1-yard run in the first quarter.

► At New England (Nov. 4): Posted 34 rushing yards on seven carries (4.9 avg.) and added two receptions for 20 yards (10.0 avg.)...Made a 16-yard reception down the sideline from a scrambling Rodgers midway through the second quarter.

►Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Carried the ball three times for 3 yards (1.0 avg.).

At Seattle (Nov. 15): Had a 5-yard run in four snaps of action.

► At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Had one carry for 5 yards and also returned one kickoff for 23 yards.

►Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Rushed for 13 yards on seven carries (1.9 avg.) and caught four passes for 14 yards (3.5 avg.)...Also returned three kickoffs for 72 yards (24.0 avg.), including a career-long 30-yarder in the second quarter.

► Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Started and rushed for 17 yards on four carries (4.3 avg.).

►At Chicago (Dec. 16): Led the team with 55 yards and a TD on 12 carries (4.6 avg.), taking over as the primary RB after RB Aaron Jones sustained a knee injury in the first quarter and did not return...Posted a season-long 20-yard run late in the first half, taking it up the middle and then bouncing it out to the right to the Chicago 48...With just over four minutes remaining in the third quarter, took the handoff off the right end before making one cut to his left on the way to the end zone for the 10-yard TD...Added four receptions for 42 yards (10.5 avg.), including a 21-yarder late in the first quarter on a swing pass from QB Aaron Rodgers.

### 38 Tramon Williams, CB/S, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech

• Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players. Is the only active player in the NFL to have at least one interception in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).

• Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.

• Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

· Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six

in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

• Was the only undrafted free agent in the NFL to post four-plus INTs each season from 2008-11. Was tied for No. 4 in the NFL with 19 INTs over that span.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started all 14 games (seven at CB, seven at S) and has posted 60 tackles (44 solo), a fumble recovery and three passes defensed...Has returned 11 punts for 83 yards (7.5 avg.).

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played all 70 snaps, one of five Green Bay defenders to do so...Finished third on the team with seven tackles (five solo).

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and was one of four Green Bay defensive players to appear on all 73 snaps...Finished with six tackles (five solo).

► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started and played 59 of 61 snaps, posting two tackles (one solo).

►Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Played all 58 snaps, one of four players on Green Bay's defense to do so, and recorded four tackles (all solo) and a pass defensed...With WR Randall Cobb (hamstring) sidelined, handled punt-return duties, matching his career high with five returns for 20 yards (4.0 avg.).

► At Detroit (Oct. 7): Started and played 61 of 62 snaps, posting three tackles (all solo)...Had one punt return for 2 yards.

►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Started and played all 57 snaps, finishing with four tackles (three solo)...Also had one punt return for 6 yards.
 ►At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Started and played all 78 snaps, posting four tackles (one solo)...Returned one punt on the afternoon for 13 yards.
 ►At New England (Nov. 4): Made the third start of his career at safety (two starts with Cleveland in 2016) and was one of two defensive players to play all 71 snaps for Green Bay...Registered six tackles (five solo).

►Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Started at safety for the second straight game and posted a solo tackle...Added a 19-yard punt return.

► At Seattle (Nov. 15): Started at safety for the third straight game, appearing on 69 of 70 snaps and posting seven tackles (five solo) and a fumble recovery...On Seattle's first play from scrimmage, recovered a RB Chris Carson fumble that was forced by LB Clay Matthews, diving on the ball at the Seattle 29 to help set up a Green Bay TD.

► At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Started at safety for the fourth straight game, appearing on all 70 plays as he saw time at both S and CB... Registered five tackles (three solo) and returned two punts for 23 yards (11.5 avg.), including a season-long 23-yarder in the third quarter.

►Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Started at S and played all 62 snaps, one of three Green Bay defenders to do so, and registered five tackles (three solo) and a team-high two passes defensed...Broke up a pass from QB Josh Rosen intended for TE Ricky Seals-Jones in the first quarter.

►Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Started at S and played all 71 snaps, recording a solo tackle.

► At Chicago (Dec. 16): Started at S and appeared on all 60 snaps, finishing with five tackles (four solo).
