- Against Atlanta, Christian McCaffrey finished with 12 receptions for a team-high 77 yards receiving, his fourth career game with at least 10 receptions. The performance gave McCaffrey 106 receptions for the season, breaking the NFL record for receptions by a running back in a single season (Matt Forte, 102, 2014). McCaffrey also broke Steve Smith's single-season franchise record (103 – 2005) for most receptions by a Panthers player, regardless of position.
- Christian McCaffrey rushed for 101 yards on 21 carries, his fourth career 100-yard rushing game. He has 1,080 rushing yards this season, as he recorded the sixth 1,000-yard rushing season and became the fifth different player with 1,000 rushing yards in franchise history. McCaffrey became the third player in NFL history, joining LaDainian Tomlinson and Matt Forte, to record at least 100 receptions and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season.
- McCaffrey needs four receiving yards to join Alvin Kamara as the only two players in NFL history with 1,500 career rushing yards and 1,500 career receiving yards in their first two seasons.
- Julius Peppers recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter, marking his 21st career fumble recovery and 10th as a Panthers player. Peppers has the most fumble recoveries of any player in the NFL since 2002, the year he was drafted by Carolina.
- In his first career start last week, Taylor Heinicke finished with 274 passing yards on 33-of-53 passing for one touchdown and three interceptions. Heinicke's 33 completions and 53 attempts each ranked third in single-game franchise history. Heinicke and backup quarterback Kyle Allen combined for 37 completions, the most team completions in a single game in franchise history.

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-10), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-03). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-87) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-70).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

Sean PAYTON

Sean Payton was named the 14th head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 and has led the team to six playoff appearances, four NFC South titles, two NFC Championship berths and the Super Bowl XLIV title.

Payton earned unanimous NFL Coach of the Year honors in his first season in 2006 and received the same honors from several outlets in 2009. Considered one of the NFL's brightest offensive minds, Payton has helped the Saints rank among the league's top 10 offenses each season since his arrival, including finishing first in the NFL six times including 2016 and putting up an NFL-record 7,474 net yards in 2011. Defensively, Saints ranked fourth in the league in 2010 and 2013.

Payton previously coached with the Dallas Cowboys (2003-05), New York Giants (1999-2002), and Philadelphia Eagles (1997-98).

Payton earned a degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where he departed with a school-record 10,665 passing yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. A three-time All-American, Payton had brief playing stops with Chicago of the Arena League, the CFL's Ottawa Rough Riders and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton coached collegiately at San Diego State (1988-89, 1992-93), Indiana State (1990-91), Miami (Ohio) (1994-95) and Illinois (1996).

Born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill. He has a daughter, Meghan, and a son, Connor.

NEW ORLEANS 12 - CAROLINA 9

DEC. 17, 2018 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, NC

CHARLOTTE -- Despite holding leading the game through three quarters, the Panthers lost their sixth straight game, falling to the Saints 12-9 at Bank of America Stadium on Monday Night Football. With Carolina clinging to a 7-6 lead since halftime, the Saints seized control early in the fourth with a 16-yard rush from running back Alvin Kamara into the endzone. The Saints elected to go for two, but rookie cornerback Donte Jackson picked off quarterback Drew Brees and exploded into the Panthers endzone, cutting the score to 12-9. An offensive holding call and a sack on quarterback Cam Newton - New Orleans' fourth of the night - spoiled Carolina's drive, giving Brees and the Saints the ball back with 8:51 remaining. With 1:51 left, cornerback James Bradberry forced a fumble by Saints wide receiver Tommy Lee Lewis after his attempt to score on a four-yard rush. Carolina's offense gained possession with no timeouts, but couldn't score as time ran out. Following a low scoring first half, neither team could find their footing in the third quarter. A roughing the kicker penalty kept New Orleans' second drive alive, but the Panthers defense forced a three-and-out. The offense began chipping away from their own 15, gaining 35 yards, until DJ Moore fumbled after a 22-yard rush. New Orleans offense would take over on its 16 and, following a Carolina sack, benefitted from a defensive pass interference on second-and-18 to build steam near the end of the quarter to set up the finish. After uneventful drives for each team to start the game, the Panthers brought the heat on their second series. On third-and-10, a 17-yard Newton completion to wideout Curtis Samuel netted an extra 15 yards after Saints defensive end Marcus Davenport was called for roughing the passer. Three plays later, on fourth-and-2 from midfield, McCaffrey surprised the Saints - and Panthers fans - with a fake run before lofting a pass to tight end Chris Manhertz for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead. Manhertz was wide open at the Saints 37 and coasted in for his first career touchdown on McCaffrey's first pass as a pro. New Orleans quickly drove into Carolina territory following a 50-yard kickoff return by Kamara and a 22-yard Mark Ingram rush. The drive ended with points after kicker Wil Lutz nailed a 46-yarder near the end of the first quarter. A crucial tackle by linebacker Thomas Davis on third-and-6 would hold the marching Saints to another Lutz field goal to begin the second quarter. The teams traded empty possessions for much of the quarter before an eventful final two minutes. Brees looked to strike on a deep pass to tight end Dan Arnold, but a Davis deflection allowed Bradberry to earn his first interception of the season. With 18 seconds remaining, the Panthers found themselves on the New Orleans 13, but cornerback Eli Apple snatched a Newton pass intended for wideout Devin Funchess out of the air to give the Saints momentum heading into halftime.

HEINICKE/ALLEN

Backup quarterbacks Taylor Heinicke and Kyle Allen played in relief of Cam Newton against Atlanta as Newton was inactive with a shoulder injury.

Heinicke completed 33 passes for 274 yards and one touchdown in his first career start. His pass attempts (53) and completions (33), marked the third-most in a game in franchise history by one player.

Allen came in for nine snaps in his first career appearance as Heinicke briefly left the game with an elbow injury. Allen went 4-of-4 for 38 yards in relief of Heinicke.

In the 2018 preseason, Heinicke went 24-of-36 for 323 yards and 2 touchdowns. Allen was 25-of-38 for 250 yards and one touchdown. Both players were undrafted out of college with Heinicke playing at Old Dominion and Allen at Houston.

Quarterback Cam Newton has led 17 career game-winning drives (defined as a drive that puts the team ahead for good in the fourth quarter or overtime).

Newton's three game-winning drives in 2017 were the third-most in a season in his career and tied for seventh-most in the NFL in 2017.

McCaffrey ranks fourth in the NFL in rushing yards and ninth in rushing average (5.02 yards per carry).

He became just the third player in NFL history to record at least 1,000 rushing yards and 100 receptions. With 845 receiving yards, he has the sixth-most receiving yards for a 1,000-yard rusher in NFL history.

McCaffrey has put together one of the best receiving seasons by a running back in NFL history.

He currently leads all NFL running backs with 106 receptions for 845 receiving yards and six receiving touchdowns.

Last week, he broke the NFL single-season record for most receptions by a running back and the franchise record for most receptions by a Panthers player in one season regardless of position.

He also now owns the franchise record for most career receptions by a running back, tallying 186 receptions in just two seasons.

In Week 2 of 2018 at Atlanta, McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game with 14.

In Week 12 vs. Seattle, he became the first player in franchise history with 100+ rushing yards and 100+ receiving yards in the same game. In that game, he raised his single-game franchise record for receiving yards by a running back to 112. One week later, he became the first player in NFL history with five straight games of at least 50+ rushing yards and 50+ receiving yards.

Against New Orleans on Monday Night Football, McCaffrey threw a 50-yard touchdown pass while running for 53 yards and gaining 67 yards receiving. He became just the second player in the modern era with 50 yards passing, 50 rushing and 50 receiving in one game, joining Walter Payton from 1985.

McCaffrey now has a franchise record 1,925 scrimmage yards, ranking second in the NFL. He could become just the 10th player in NFL history with 2,000 scrimmage yards in his first or second season.

McCaffrey has 3,011 career scrimmage yards on 1,515 rushing yards and 1,496 receiving yards. He needs four receiving yards to join Alvin Kamara as the only two players in NFL history with at least 1,500 rushing and 1,500 receiving yards in the first two seasons.

McCaffrey's 3,011 career scrimmage yards are the most by any Panther in their first two seasons and ranked 23rd in the NFL among all first- and second-year players all-time.

2017 second-round draft pick Curtis Samuel saw his first action of 2018 in Week 5 against the Giants after he missed time with a medical illness. Samuel now has six total touchdowns with 381 receiving yards and 84 rushing yards.

On his first touch of the season, Samuel caught a screen and broke several tackles to go 25 yards for his first career touchdown.

In Carolina's fourth quarter comeback at Philadelphia, Samuel scored his first rushing touchdown on a 14-yard end around.

Samuel then scored a rushing and receiving touchdown against Tampa Bay in Week 9, becoming the first Panthers wide receiver to do both in the same game since Keyshawn Johnson in 2006.

Devin Funchess ranks eighth all-time in career receiving yards as a Panther in his fourth season, just recently passing Ted Ginn, Jr. He has 2,233 yards on 161 catches with 21 receiving touchdowns.

He needs 153 receiving yards to pass Brandon LaFell for seventh place all-time in franchise history.

Funchess now ranks 10th in receptions and fifth in receiving touchdowns.

DJ Moore made the most of his first reception as a Panther in Week 2 at Atlanta. He took a 17-yard pass and then went another 34 yards after the catch for a 51-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. At Detroit in Week 11, Moore had an 82-yard reception as part of a 157-yard receiving day, the most by a Panthers rookie wide receiver in franchise history.

Moore has the most scrimmage yards (879) and second-most receiving yards (707) by any rookie wide receiver in the NFL this season. He has the second-most scrimmage yards by any rookie wide receiver in franchise history (Kelvin Benjamin, 1,008 - 2014).

Moore also leads all wide receivers with 172 rushing yards and has 5.2 yards after contact per rush, the most of any player with 10 or more runs.

Jarius Wright has made 41 receptions for 427 yards and one touchdown for the Panthers in 2018. Of his 41 catches, 14 have come on third or fourth down which have converted 10 first downs.

Wright's 10 receiving first down conversions on 3rd/4th down are second only to McCaffrey on the Panthers.

After veteran tight end Greg Olsen reinjured his foot at Tampa Bay in Week 13, Ian Thomas replaced him to make an immediate impact. In three quarters, he tallied five catches for 46 yards.

One week later, Thomas made nine catches for 77 yards at Cleveland. It marked the most receiving yards for a Panthers rookie tight end in a game in franchise history. He was one reception shy of tying the franchise record for catches by a tight end at 10.

Thomas now has 31 receptions for 272 receiving yards and one touchdown in 2018, the most by any rookie tight end in franchise history.
