CAROLINA PANTHERS (3-2) AT PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (3-3)

PANTHERS WRAP UP NFC EAST PLAY IN PHILADELPHIA

CAROLINA at PHILADELPHIA

- Carolina travels to Philadelphia on the heels of a six-point loss at Washington in Week 5. The Panthers have not lost consecutive games since Oct. 22, 2017 when they lost to Philadelphia and Chicago in Weeks 6 and 7.
- Carolina trails the all-time series with Philadelphia, 4-7. The teams have alternated victories in the last four matchups, all of which came in primetime. Carolina is 2-4 all-time at Philadelphia, including a 14-3 win in the 2003 NFC Championship game.
- Sunday marks the third consecutive season that Carolina has played a road game at the Super Bowl champion and the 16th time facing the reigning Super Bowl champion in the regular season or playoffs in franchise history. Carolina has faced the NFC champion in every season since 2008. The Panthers won at New England last season.
- The Panthers have only allowed eight sacks over the season's first five games, ranking second in the NFL. That mark ties for the fewest sacks allowed over a season's first five games in franchise history.
- Despite rushing for 81 yards at Washington, Carolina still ranks fourth in the NFL in rushing at 139.4 yards per game. The Panthers led the league in rushing over the past three weeks.
- Quarterback Cam Newton leads the NFL with a quarterback passer rating of 115.7 in the red zone to go along with five passing touchdowns and three rushing touchdowns. Newton's nine passing touchdowns tie for his career high through five games, while 65.9 completion percentage is second-best among his eight seasons through five games.
- With the return of Thomas Davis, the Panthers had Pro Bowlers in the defensive starting lineup against Washington (Peppers, Short, Poe, Davis, Kuechly, Reid, Adams).
- Devin Funchess recorded his 19th career touchdown reception for Carolina, tying him with Ted Ginn, Jr. for fifth-most all-time. His 116 career points rank 11th in franchise history among all players.

THE SERIES

- Eagles running backs coach Duce Staley played collegiately at South Carolina in 1995-96 and was elected to South Carolina's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.
- Eagles defensive coordinator Jim Schwartz was the secondary coach at North Carolina Central University in 1991.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

NFL: 22nd season

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

With 64 career regular season wins, Rivera is 10 wins away from becoming the Panthers all-time winningest coach, surpassing John Fox.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-10), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-03). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-87) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-70).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

Doug Pederson was named head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles on January 18, 2016, after having served as the Kansas City Chiefs offensive coordinator (2013-15). In just his second season as an NFL head coach, Pederson led the Eagles to a 13-3 regular-season record, an NFC East title, the No. 1 seed in the NFC playoffs and to victory in Super Bowl LII against the New England Patriots. As a first-year head coach with the Eagles in 2016, Pederson helped develop rookie quarterback Carson Wentz, who set a team and all-time NFL rookie record with 379 completions. Under Pederson's direction, Wentz also posted franchise rookie records in pass attempts, passing yards and passing touchdowns. Pederson, who enjoyed a 12-year playing career in the NFL, began his pro coaching career in Philadelphia where he served under Andy Reid as an offensive quality control coach (2009-2010) and quarterbacks coach (2011-12).

Pederson attended Northeast Louisiana, where he was a three-year starter at quarterback and graduated with a B.B.A. in business management. A 12-year NFL veteran, he played quarterback for the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins, Eagles and Cleveland Browns. Pederson served as a backup quarterback for the Packers when the team won Super Bowl XXXI. He began coaching as head coach at Calvary Baptist Academy (Shreveport, LA).

Born January 31, 1968 in Bellingham, Wash., he and his wife, Jeannie, have three sons: Drew, Josh and Joel.

Despite giving the ball away three times and totaling one rushing yard between running backs Jonathan Stewart, Christian McCaffrey and Fozzy Whitaker, the Carolina Panthers had a shot at a game-winning drive late. Down by five points with two minutes remaining and zero timeouts, Carolina began its final drive at its own 31-yard line. A 12-yard dart to wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin and a 9-yard completion to wide receiver Russell Shepard put the Panthers in Eagles territory, but two incomplete passes on third and fourth down sealed Carolina's fate. The Panthers' offense was completing drives earlier. McCaffrey's 25-yard punt return, the longest of his NFL career, sparked the offense in the second quarter to a 57-yard scoring drive in just four plays. Newton found a wide-open Dickson for 13 yards and a diving Benjamin for 14 yards before scampering 16 yards into the end zone. The score put Carolina up 10-3, but nearing the end of the second quarter cornerback Rasul Douglas intercepted Newton inside Carolina's 20. The pocket collapsed on the quarterback, who was hit while throwing. It took the Eagles seven plays to move 12 yards, but quarterback Carson Wentz ultimately capped off the drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to tight end Zach Ertz. Misfortune struck once more for the Panthers at the start of the third quarter. Newton tossed a routine screen pass to Stewart, but the ball slipped from his fingertips and into the hands of cornerback Patrick Robinson. Wentz once more topped of the short drive with a 17-yard touchdown pass to Ertz. Carolina clawed back within five in the fourth quarter following a 1-yard touchdown pass to McCaffrey, but failed to capitalize on the late momentum shift. The loss drops the Panthers to 4-2 on the season and into second place in the NFC South behind the Atlanta Falcons.

#CAREOLINAS SHIRTS UNVEILED

In the days after Hurricane Florence reached the Carolina coasts, head coach Ron Rivera addressed the media with a new #CAREolinas t-shirt featuring the hashtag and the states of North Carolina and South Carolina with the title "we share more than a state line" along the border.

The shirts were sold online through a link on Panthers.com and in stadium in Week 3, and the proceeds are going directly to the official recovery efforts of both states. Since the web campaign launched, over 10,000 shirts were purchased online.



PANTHERS PACK FOOD BOXES

Carolina Panthers players, staff and families went to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina during the team's bye week to pack food donation boxes for shipment to areas of the Carolinas affected by the hurricane.

The Panthers packed over 5,000 boxes over three days at the food bank. Panthers owner David Tepper was a hands-on part of the effort as he packed boxes last Monday alongside the players. Continuing over the next few weeks, an additional 23,500 boxes funded by Tepper and his foundation will be shipped to affected areas of the Carolinas.

Prior to Carolina's game against Cincinnati, the David Tepper Charitable Foundation, Inc. and Carolina Panthers Charities announced an initial aid package of \$1.7 million with \$1 million going to the American Red Cross, \$450,000 going to regional food banks and \$250,000 to high school athletic programs affected by storm damage. Bank of America has pledged an additional \$100,000 to the high school relief fund, increasing the total to \$350,000 for regional high schools.



PEPPERS LAUNCHES CAMPAIGN

On Friday, Aug. 21st, Julius Peppers announced a donation and the launch of the Julius Peppers Hurricane Relief Fund through the *Foundation For The Carolinas*. Peppers gave \$100,000 to the fund to aid in relief efforts, and he encouraged teammates, fans and the wider community to donate as well. Quarterback Cam Newton then publicly tweeted that he would match Peppers' \$100,000 gift to the campaign.

On Tuesday, Oct. 9, Peppers went to Robeson County, N.C., where he worked with the United Way to assist hurricane victims/

ONE CAROLINA STICKERS

Against the Bengals and Giants, the Panthers wore "One Carolina" helmet stickers to show solidarity with hurricane recovery efforts in North and South Carolina.

Along with the Panthers, 44 colleges and universities from Division I to Division II, Division III, NAIA and even junior colleges wore the same stickers in games in and out of the states to increase awareness and promote the same solidarity.





FUNCHESS TIES FOR FIFTH IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

Devin Funchess hauled in a 23-yard touchdown pass from Cam Newton in the second quarter. It marked Funchess' 19th career touchdown, tying him with Ted Ginn, Jr., for fifth-most in franchise history.

Funchess finished the game with five catches for 74 yards and one touchdown.



NEWTON TIES FAVRE

Cam Newton threw for two touchdowns in the game, bringing him to 224 total touchdowns in his career.

Newton tied Brett Favre for third-most total touchdowns by a quarterback through his first eight seasons. Dan Marino had 246 and Peyton Manning had 253.

Newton finished 27-for-40 for 275 yards passing with two touchdowns and one interception. He also ran for a team-high 43 yards on nine carries.



PEPPERS GETS FIRST SACK

Julius Peppers recorded his first sack of the season in the fourth quarter as he got to quarterback Alex Smith and knocked the ball loose.

Peppers now has 155.5 career sacks and 50 forced fumbles.

He needs 5 sacks to pass Kevin Greene for fourth all-time and 3 forced fumbles to pass Robert Mathis for most forced fumbles since 2000.



GANO PUSHES STREAK TO 25

Graham Gano hit a 32-yard field goal in the third quarter, extending his franchise-best streak to 25 straight field goals made.

Gano's streak is the longest active field goal streak in the NFL.

THIRD IN RUSHING IN THE NFL

For three straight weeks, the Panthers were at the top of the NFL rushing charts and currently rank fourth at 139.4 yards per game.

Since 2011, the Panthers have ranked number one in rushing in seven different weeks, and the team has finished in the top 10 in rushing in all but one season under Rivera.

Cam Newton has thrown seven passing touchdowns to seven different players (Funchess, Wright, Smith, Moore, Anderson, McCaffrey and Samuel), while Newton and Armah have both run for touchdowns. Colin Jones scored a special teams touchdown.

Ten different players have accounted for Carolina's 12 touchdowns, which ties for third-most in the NFL. Last season, 13 different players scored touchdowns for Carolina.

Of the 10 different players, Armah, Moore, Samuel and Jones each scored their first career touchdowns on their first touches of the season.

FEWEST SACKS ALLOWED THROUGH FIVE

In Weeks 2 and 3, the Panthers offensive line started was made up of only one originally projected starter in his original position, being center Ryan Kalil. Carolina signed left tackle Chris Clark and moved Taylor Moton to right tackle with starters Ryan Kalil and Daryl Williams on injured reserve.

Despite some reshuffling, the offensive line has performed admirably this season. Carolina has allowed just eight sacks through five games, tied for the fewest sacks allowed through the first five games of a season in franchise history. It also ranks second in the NFL this season.

According to Pro Football Focus, Carolina ranks third in the NFL in fewest pressures allowed with 40.

Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (167) and career rushing touchdowns (57). Newton is the first quarterback in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 38 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the most in NFL history. He also has three regular season games and one postseason game with at least two rushing touchdowns and two passing touchdowns. His three regular season games rank second in NFL history.

Newton needs 395 total yards to catch Matthew Stafford for fourth-most combined yards after a quarterback's first eight seasons.

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004) and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals (2011-17), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first seven seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards AND 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

Newton has now rushed for at least 700 yards in three NFL seasons and joins Michael Vick (three) as the only quarterbacks with three 700-yard rushing seasons in a career.

ALL-TIME RUNNING QUARTERBACK

Cam Newton has continued to move up the all-time ranks for total rushing yardage among all-time quarterbacks. Newton ranks third all-time in rush yards by a quarterback in NFL history.

Newton had more rushing yards than Michael Vick (3,954) through Vick's first seven seasons of his career. Newton needs 401 rushing yards to pass Randall Cunningham for second all-time.

Quarterback Cam Newton has been successful moving the chains with his legs since entering the NFL in 2011, with 342 of his 873 rushes going for first downs. The 39.2 rushing first down percentage is the top mark in the NFL during that time (min. 400 attempts).

He led the NFL in rushing first down percentage in each of his first five seasons with a career-high mark of 43.7 percent in 2014.

Newton's total 342 rushing first downs rank fifth in the NFL since 2011. He trails Michael Vick's 343 rushing first downs for most in NFL history by a quarterback.

In 2018, McCaffrey has already shown an improvement in traditional running through the tackles. According to NFL's Next Gen stats, McCaffrey's efficiency (a metric tracking yards gained against total yards traveled, wherein a low number begets more "north-south" running) in 2018 is 3.38, ranking seventh in the league. Last year, it was 4.63 which ranked 42nd.



ANDERSON FRESH OFF 1,000

Running back C.J. Anderson comes to Carolina fresh off a 1,000-yard rushing season in Denver (1,007). He added 224 receiving yards to rank 12th in the NFL in yards from scrimmage by a running back (1,231).

Since entering the league as an undrafted free agent in 2013, Anderson has only lost three fumbles in 706 career carries, tying for third in the NFL in fewest fumbles since 2013 (min. 600 carries).

In four games with Carolina, Anderson has rushed for 84 yards on 16 carries, averaging 5.3 yards per carry. Adding in a 24-yard touchdown reception, Anderson has 108 yards on 17 touches, averaging 6.4 yards per touch.

McCAFFREY CATCHES

Last season, McCaffrey finished as the franchise record-holder for most receptions (80), receiving yards (651) and receiving touchdowns (5) by a running back in a single season in 2017. He also set franchise records for most receptions by a rookie, scrimmage yards by a rookie (1,086), yards after catch by a rookie (593) and first downs by a rookie (57).

McCaffrey finished third in receiving yards by rookie Panthers, regardless of position.

In Week 2 of 2018 at Atlanta, McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game with 14. He also set a new career high with 102 yards receiving, the most by a running back in a game in franchise history. McCaffrey tied for the fourth-most receptions by a running back in a game in NFL history.

Barely into his second season, McCaffrey only needs 111 receiving yards to become the fourth 1,000-yard receiving running back in franchise history. He needs 14 receiving first downs to pass DeAngelo Williams for the most by a running back in franchise history.

McCaffrey ranks ninth in the NFL with 117.4 scrimmage yards per game. His average scrimmage yards through the first five games ranks third-best in franchise history.

ARMAH'S UNDERDOG STORY

Panthers fullback Alex Armah was not seen as a lock for a 53-man roster, not to mention a starting fullback spot when he was drafted in 2017 out of Division II West Georgia, one of six D-II players drafted in 2017. However, he has solidified his position as the Panthers fullback despite not playing the position since high school.

At West Georgia, he became the first player in Gulf South conference history to earn All-Conference honors on both offense and defense as he played defensive end and tight end.

Armah scored his first career touchdown against Dallas in Week 1 on his first career rush. Armah became the second player in franchise history to score on his first career rush, joining Richie Brockel who did it against the Texans (12/18/11).

**OLSEN CLIMBING PANTHERS RANKS**

Olsen is the Panthers all-time receiving yards leader among tight ends and the Panthers all-time receptions leader among tight ends. He holds the team's tight end record with nine 100-yard receiving games. He is second among Panthers tight ends in career touchdowns (33) behind Wesley Walls (44).

TIGHT ENDS FROM DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS

Carolina's reserve tight ends Chris Manhertz and Ian Thomas are both physically gifted but come from relatively limited big-time college football experience.

Thomas was drafted by the Panthers in the fourth round of the 2018 Draft, despite only starting in one season at Indiana with 375 receiving yards in 2017. He had transferred from Nassau Community College where he was recruited for basketball.

Thomas earned his first career start in Week 2 at Atlanta as Greg Olsen was inactive with a foot injury. Thomas has since made 10 catches for 72 yards this season.

Manhertz didn't play college football at all, signing as an undrafted free agent with the Bills after four seasons as a basketball player at Canisius, where he finished fourth in school history with 789 career rebounds.

Manhertz has played in 28 games with seven starts over the last three seasons with Carolina.

NEW FACES IN RECEIVERS ROOM

Carolina takes the field with a new-look receiving corps in 2018. Of the six receivers on the current active roster, only Devin Funchess was active during Carolina's Wild Card playoff game last January in New Orleans.

Carolina traded for Torrey Smith from Philadelphia, signed Jarius Wright as a free agent from Minnesota, drafted DJ Moore in the first round and returned Damiere Byrd and Curtis Samuel from injury.

Smith, Wright, Funchess, Samuel and Moore have all scored receiving touchdowns this season.

FUNCHESS MOVING UP CHARTS

Devin Funchess ranks ninth all-time in career receiving yards as a Panther as he is in his fourth season. He has 1,996 yards on 140 catches with 19 receiving touchdowns. He needs 52 receiving yards to pass Ted Ginn, Jr. for eighth place all-time in franchise history.

Funchess is tied for fifth in franchise history in receiving touchdowns and sixth in receiving average with 14.3 yards per reception (min. 100 catches).



SAMUEL RETURNS WITH A BANG

2017 second-round draft pick Curtis Samuel saw his first action of 2018 in Week 5 against New York after he missed time with a medical illness.

On his first touch of the season, Samuel broke several tackles to go 25 yards for his first career touchdown.

Samuel led all Panthers receivers in yards in the preseason. He has 152 career yards on 17 catches over the last two seasons, despite missing 10 games with various injuries.

SMITH STRETCHES THE FIELD

Panthers wideout Torrey Smith was brought to Carolina to help stretch the field as a legitimate deep threat. Since 2011 when he came into the league, Smith ranks fourth in average yards per catch at 16.1 (min. 200 receptions).

82 of Smith's 314 career receptions have gone for more than 20 yards (26.5 percent). This season, Smith has a long catch for 26 yards, while averaging 9.2 yards per reception with two touchdowns.

WRIGHT CLUTCH ON THIRD DOWN

Jarius Wright has made a living as a third-down clutch receiver. Since entering the league in 2012, he has made 165 receptions for 2,156 yards. Of his 165 receptions, 67 have come on third down (40.6 percent), with 48 going for first downs or touchdowns.

This season, Wright has made five of his 12 catches on third down, including his first touchdown on a third-and-goal play from the five-yard line in Week 2.

In Week 5, he converted a fourth-and-short play with a 27-yard reception, his longest as a Panther.

MOORE GOES ALL THE WAY ON FIRST CATCH

DJ Moore made the most of his first reception as a Panther in Week 2 at Atlanta. He took a 17-yard pass and then went another 34 yards after the catch for a 51-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. Moore was known for his ability after the catch at Maryland when Carolina drafted him in the first round in 2018.

Moore became the fourth Panther in franchise history to score a touchdown on his first career reception, joining Casey Crawford (Nov. 5, 2000), Jeff King (Dec. 24, 2006) and Dante Rosario (Dec. 2, 2007). None of the previous three players to do it had a touchdown longer than 16 yards.

**KUECHLY LEADS ALL TACKLERS**

Since entering the NFL in 2012, press box crews have credited linebacker Luke Kuechly with 856 tackles, the most in the NFL over that stretch. Kuechly ranks fifth in career tackles among all currently active players in the NFL.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 977 career tackles, second-most in team history.

He is the only player in franchise history with more than 100 tackles in each of his first six seasons as a Panther, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012.

Kuechly needs 23 tackles for 1,000 in his career (coaches film).

According to press box stats, Davis has 1,004 tackles, ranking 25th all-time among all players in NFL history and third among active players. His 65 tackles for loss are tied for 18th among linebackers all-time. Davis has played in 166 career games, tying for 15th among all active NFL defensive players.

**PEPPERS MAKES HISTORY**

Julius Peppers currently ranks fourth all-time in NFL history with 155.5 career sacks. He is Carolina's all-time leader in sacks with 93.0 of his career sacks coming as a Panther.

Peppers has at least seven sacks in 15 of his 16 NFL seasons. In 2017, he tied for the team lead with 11 sacks.

He has the most sacks of any active NFL player, and he is the only player in NFL history with 150 sacks and 10 or more interceptions.

Three of the top four sack artists in NFL history played for the Panthers at some point.

OBADA MAKES MOST OF FIRST GAME

Defensive end Efe Obada made the most of his first career game in the NFL in Week 3 against Cincinnati. Obada earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after he registered an interception, a sack, two quarterback hurries and a pass deflection in just 19 total snaps. He was part of a defense that recorded four interceptions and limited the Bengals to just 66 rushing yards.

In August, Obada became the first player from the NFL International Pathway Program to make an active roster. Last Sunday, he was the first such player to see game action and record any statistics.

Obada came to America from London in 2015 when he signed to the Dallas Cowboys practice squad despite only playing organized American football for just five games previously with the London Warriors. He was assigned to the Panthers practice squad in 2017 as a practice squad exemption as part of the Pathway Program.



ADAMS KEEPS TAKING IT AWAY

Safety Mike Adams joined the Panthers as a free agent before the 2017 season and had two interceptions last year to go with two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and 75 total tackles.

Adams has 16 interceptions over the last five seasons, tied for fifth-most in the NFL in that span, despite entering his 15th season in 2018.

JACKSON PICKS THREE

Rookie cornerback Donte Jackson secured two interceptions against the Bengals, including one in the fourth quarter that helped seal the team's victory. Jackson also added eight tackles (coaches film) to his stat line.

His two interceptions came just one week after recording his first against Atlanta. Jackson became one of eight players in NFL history to record three interceptions in his first three career games.

Jackson is currently tied for first in the NFL with his three interceptions. He has allowed an opponent passer rating of 54, according to PFF, the best among all rookie defenders.





GANO MOVES UP PANTHERS SCORING LIST

Kicker Graham Gano had 121 points in 2017, his fifth consecutive season with at least 100 points scored. He converted 29-of-30 field goal attempts with his only miss coming from 55 yards.

Gano has 690 points in his Panthers career (2012-present), the second-most in franchise history. John Kasay (1,482 from 1995-2010) is the franchise's all-time leader.

Graham Gano set a new franchise record when he set another franchise record. His 63-yard game-winning field goal against New York was a new franchise long and tied the NFL record for longest game-winning field goal.

By the end of the game, Gano's four field goals gave him 24 consecutive makes, breaking John Kasay's previous franchise record of 21 straight. Gano has now made 25 consecutive field goals, the longest active streak in the NFL.

Gano has hit 36 straight field goals at home which is also a franchise record.

Gano ranks second in franchise history with an all-time field goal percentage of 85.8. His 2017 season of 96.7 percent (29-30) led the NFL and set the franchise single-season record.

Palardy uncorked a career-long 63-yard punt at the New York Jets (11/27/17).



This season, Palardy has a net average of 42.0 which ranks seventh in the NFL.

He has landed 10 punts inside the 20-yard line with two touchbacks.

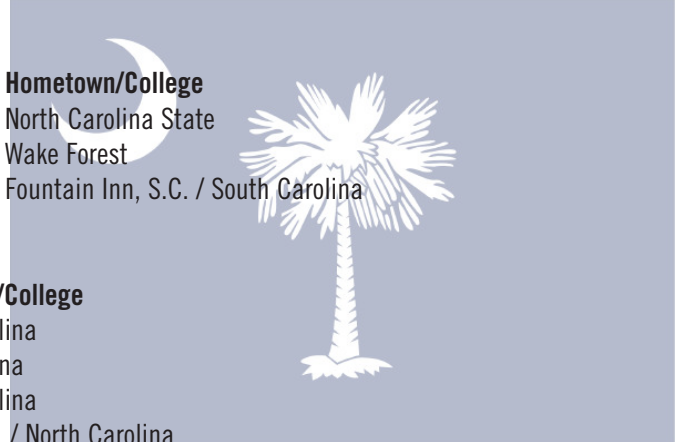
