CAROLINA PANTHERS (6-2) AT PITTSBURGH STEELERS (5-2-1) PANTHERS FACE STEELERS ON THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

CAROLINA at PITTSBURGH

- Carolina improved to 6-2 after a win over Tampa Bay at home on Sunday. It marked
 the fifth time in franchise history that Carolina has started 6-2 or better over the first
 half of a season. The Panthers have won 10 games in a row at home, tying for the
 second-longest home winning streak in franchise history, including playoff games.
- The Panthers will be looking for their first-ever road win at Pittsburgh and first win over the Steelers since the 1996 season finale. Carolina is 1-5 all-time against Pittsburgh and 0-3 on the road.
- The Panthers scored a franchise-record 35 points in the first half against Tampa Bay en
 route to a 42-28 win last Sunday. Cam Newton tied the franchise record with seventhstraight games with at least two passing touchdowns. He has gone 105 pass attempts
 since his last interception. Newton leads the NFL with a passer rating of 124.7 in the
 red zone.
- Over the last nine quarters, since the fourth quarter comeback at Philadelphia, the Panthers lead the NFL with 99 points, including 4.1 points per drive.
- DJ Moore set a franchise record for rushing yards by a wide receiver after his 32-yard run
 against the Buccaneers. Moore has 117 rushing yards with an average of 16.71 per rush.
 Moore has 8.86 yards after per contact per rush, the most in the NFL (min. 5 rushes).
- Donte Jackson recorded his fourth interception of the season against the Buccaneers, tying for the most in the NFL. According to Pro Football Focus, his 68.1 passer rating against ranks second among all rookie cornerbacks.

THE SERIES

Carolina and Pittsburgh have met six times in the regular season with the Steelers holding a 5-1 edge, including a 3-0 advantage at Pittsburgh. The Panthers won the first game in the series in 1996, but Pittsburgh has won each of the last five games. Pittsburgh is one of three teams (Denver, Cincinnati) that Carolina has yet to beat on the road in team history. This marks the third consecutive meeting of the series in primetime after playing on Sunday night in 2014 and on Thursday night in 2010.

Ron RIVERA

NFL: 22nd season Panthers HC: 8th season

Regular Season: 70-49-1 (.573)

Postseason: 3-4 (.429)

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

With 64 career regular season wins, Rivera is 10 wins away from becoming the Panthers all-time winningest coach, surpassing John Fox.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-10), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-03). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-87) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-70).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

Mike TOMLIN

NFL: 18th season Steelers: 12th season

Regular Season: 120-62-1 (.659)

Mike Tomlin was named the 16th head coach in Steelers history on January 22, 2007.

Tomlin became the youngest coach (36 years, 323 days) in NFL history to win a Super Bowl when the Steelers defeated the Arizona Cardinals, 27-23, in Super Bowl XLIII on February 1, 2009. Tomlin reached the playoffs four times in his first five seasons and he is the only coach in Steelers' history to win division titles in each of his first two seasons. In 2017, Tomlin guided the Steelers to the AFC North division title for the sixth time in his 11-year reign. Pittsburgh has reached the postseason eight times under Tomlin's leadership, including each of the past four seasons. In 2010, Tomlin's club won its third division title in in a four-year span. The 2008 season culminated with a Super Bowl triumph, making Tomlin one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach. In his first season, Tomlin guided the Steelers to a 10-6 record and their first AFC North title since 2004.

Tomlin was the Minnesota Vikings defensive coordinator in 2006 after spending the previous five seasons (2001-05) as defensive backs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In Super Bowl XXX-VII, the secondary recorded four interceptions, returning two for touchdowns to help capture the franchise's first Super Bowl title.

Tomlin served two seasons as the defensive backs coach at the University of Cincinnati (1999-2000) before going to Tampa Bay. Prior to joining the Cincinnati staff, Tomlin had a short stint on the coaching staff at Tennessee-Martin and then spent two seasons at Arkansas State. He spent the 1996 season as a graduate assistant at Memphis. Tomlin began his coaching career in 1995 as wide receivers coach at Virginia Military Institute.

A three-year starter at wide receiver at William & Mary (1990-94), Tomlin finished his career with a school-record 20 touch-down receptions. Tomlin graduated in 1994 with a degree in sociology.

Born in Hampton, Va., on March 15, 1972, Tomlin and his wife, Kiya, have two sons, Dino and Mason, and a daughter Harlyn

GAME SUMMARY

PITTSBURGH 37, CAROLINA 19 Sept. 21, 2014 • Bank of America Stadium • Charlotte, NC

Pittsburgh running back Le'Veon Bell rushed for 147 yards and quarterback Ben Roethlisberger passed for 196 yards and two scores leading Pittsburgh to a 37-19 victory over Carolina. The Panthers got on the scoreboard first after a nine play, 55-yard drive ended with a 40-yard field goal from Graham Gano. After three consecutive Shaun Suisham gave the Steelers a 9-3 lead at halftime, the game unraveled. On the opening possession of the second half, Pittsburgh linebacker Jarvis Jones sacked quarterback Cam Newton as he reared back to throw, forcing a fumble that was recovered by linebacker Jason Worilds at the Carolina 17-yard line. Carolina then forced a much-needed three-and-out. Or so they thought. When Pittsburgh lined up to attempt a 29-yard field goal on fourth-and-four, defensive end Wes Horton was flagged for encroachment. That blunder gave the Steelers a first down, and on the next play, quarterback Ben Roethlisberger tossed a 7-yard touchdown to wide receiver Antonio Brown in the corner of the end zone to give Pittsburgh a 16-3 lead. Following a 40-yard field goal by Graham Gano, the Panthers had the Steelers pinned back at their own 8-yard line for second-and-22. But running back Le'Veon Bell, who finished with 147 yards, found a big hole up the middle and burst through the secondary for an 81-yard gain. Roethlisberger later found Brown cutting across the end zone for another 7-yard touchdown. Carolina appeared ready to mount a comeback when tight end Greg Olsen broke free down the sideline for a 37-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter. That cut the deficit to 10, and the Panthers defense forced another timely three-and-out. But disaster struck when wide receiver Philly tried to field Brad Wing's punt at his own 12-yard line. The ball initially slipped through Brown's hands, and after re-gathering it, Shamarko Thomas jarred it loose. The ball bounced into the end zone, and Robert Golden recovered for a back-breaking touchdown. Steelers running back LeGarrette Blount, who finished with 118 yards, extended the lead to 37-13 by powering his way into the end zone for an 8-yard score with 5:38 to go. Quarterback Derek Anderson finished the rest of the game for Newton, who was sacked three times and hit repeatedly. A terrific throw by Anderson and an even better catch by wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin produced a 35-yard touchdown in the closing moments as Carolina suffered its first loss of the season.

In the days after Hurricane Florence reached the Carolina coasts, head coach Ron Rivera addressed the media with a new #CAREolinas t-shirt featuring the hashtag and the states of North Carolina and South Carolina with the title "we share more than a state line" along the border.

The shirts were sold online through a link on Panthers.com and in stadium in Week 3, and the proceeds are going directly to the official recovery efforts of both states. Since the web campaign launched, over 10,000 shirts were purchased online.



PANTHERS PACK FOOD BOXES

Carolina Panthers players, staff and families went to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina during the team's bye week to pack food donation boxes for shipment to areas of the Carolinas affected by the hurricane.

The Panthers packed over 5,000 boxes over three days at the food bank. Panthers owner David Tepper was a hands-on part of the effort as he packed boxes last Monday alongside the players. Continuing over the next few weeks, an additional 23,500 boxes funded by Tepper and his foundation will be shipped to affected areas of the Carolinas.

Prior to Carolina's game against Cincinnati, the David Tepper Charitable Foundation, Inc. and Carolina Panthers Charities announced an initial aid package with \$1 million going to the American Red Cross, \$450,000 going to regional food banks and \$250,000 to high school athletic programs affected by storm damage. Bank of America has pledged an additional \$100,000 to the high school relief fund, increasing the total to \$350,000 for regional high schools.



PEPPERS LAUNCHES CAMPAIGN

On Friday, Aug. 21st, Julius Peppers announced a donation and the launch of the <u>Julius Peppers Hurricane Relief Fund</u> through the *Foundation For The Carolinas*. Peppers gave \$100,000 to the fund to aid in relief efforts, and he encouraged teammates, fans and the wider community to donate as well. Quarterback Cam Newton then publicly tweeted that he would match Peppers' \$100,000 gift to the campaign.

On Tuesday, Oct. 9, Peppers went to Robeson County, N.C., where he worked with the United Way to assist hurricane victims. On Tuesday, Oct. 23, he traveled to Marlboro County, S.C., to assist with recovery efforts there.

Peppers is originally from Bailey, N.C., and went to college at North Carolina. Information on the campaign is on the front page of Panthers. com and at https://www.fftc.org/PeppersFund.



ONE CAROLINA STICKERS

The Panthers wore "One Carolina" helmet stickers to show solidarity with hurricane recovery efforts in North and South Carolina.

Along with the Panthers, 44 colleges and universities from Division I to Division II, Division III, NAIA and even junior colleges wore the same stickers in games in and out of the states to increase awareness and promote the same solidarity.

RECORD-BREAKING FIRST HALF

The Panthers scored a franchise-record 35 points in the first half, including touchdowns on five consecutive possessions. Carolina's 35 points tied for the second-most points scored in a first half in the NFL this season.

The first four touchdowns were all on the ground, before Newton found Greg Olsen on a third-down pass.

Carolina finished a perfect 5-of-5 in the red zone, lifting the season's red zone touchdown scoring percentage to 74.2, which ranks fifth in the NFL.



WIDE RECEIVERS RUNNING WILD

Rookie wide receiver DJ Moore ran for 32 yards on one rush, passing Ted Ginn (98) for the most rushing yards by a Panthers wide receiver in a single season.

Wide receiver Curtis Samuel ran for a 33-yard touchdown on his lone carry of the game. He added a 19-yard receiving touchdown for his first multi-touchdown game of his career.

On the season, Carolina has amassed 193 rushing yards by wide receivers, the most in the NFL and a franchise record.



NEWTON EFFICIENT ONCE AGAIN

Cam Newton put together an efficient passing line of 19-of-25 for 247 and two touchdowns with no interceptions for a passer rating of 133.2. It marked his fifth game with a passer rating over 100 as he improved his season rating to 100.8.

Newton has now gone three straight games without an interception and has seven straight games with at least two passing touchdowns, tying Steve Beuerlein's franchise record set in 1999.

Newton tallied 280 combined yards which give him 31,629 in his career. He passed Dan Marino for the third-most combined yards in a quarterback's first eight seasons.



ADDISON PASSES GREENE WITH THREE SACKS

Defensive end Mario Addison recorded a career-best three sacks and a forced fumble in the win.

This season, Addison has a team-high 7.5 sacks, tying for ninth in the NFL.

He has 44.0 career sacks as a Panther, passing Kevin Greene for fourth-place in franchise history. Since Nov. 6, 2016, Addison has recorded 26.5 sacks, the third-most in the NFL over that span.

Despite some reshuffling, the offensive line has performed admirably this season. Carolina has allowed just 12 sacks through eight games, tied for the second-fewest sacks allowed through the first eight games of a season in franchise history. It also ties for fifth in the NFL this season.

The Panthers rank third in the NFL in fewest pressures allowed with 55



According to Pro Football Focus, second-year tackle Taylor Moton ranks seventh among tackles with a pass-blocking efficiency of 98.1. He has only allowed 10 pressures and one sack this season, despite starting at both left and right guard this season.

That has continued this season as the Panthers have the secondfewest combined penalties from 2017 and 2018 at 132.

The Carolina Panthers sported a dominant and sometimes over-looked defensive line in the last six seasons under former defensive line coach Eric Washington. Washington was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2018, and he aims to work with his replacement, Brady Hoke, on maintaining that production.

Since 2012, no group of defensive linemen produced more sacks than Carolina's 233.0.

Since 2013, a Panthers defensive lineman has earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors six times, which ranks second among every team's defensive position group since 2013. Hardy was recognized twice in 2013 (Week 3 and Week 17). Short and Lotulelei are the only defensive tackles in Panthers history to earn NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors as Short was recognized in Week 6 of 2015 and Lotulelei received recognition in Week 8 of 2016. Peppers won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 4 of 2017. Efe Obada won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 3 of 2018.

Short also has two NFC Defensive Player of the Month awards on his resume, earning the recognition in October and December of 2015. Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (173) and career rushing touchdowns (58). Newton is the first quarterback in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 39 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the most in NFL history. He also has three regular season games and one postseason game with at least two rushing touchdowns and two passing touchdowns. His three regular season games rank second in NFL history.

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004) and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals (2011-17), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first seven seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards AND 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

Newton has now rushed for at least 700 yards in three NFL seasons and joins Michael Vick (three) as the only quarterbacks with three 700-yard rushing seasons in a career.



ARMAH'S UNDERDOG STORY

Panthers fullback Alex Armah was not seen as a lock for a 53-man roster, not to mention a starting fullback spot when he was drafted in 2017 out of Division II West Georgia, one of six D-II players drafted in 2017. However, he has solidified his position as the Panthers fullback despite not playing the position since high school.

At West Georgia, he became the first player in Gulf South conference history to earn All-Conference honors on both offense and defense as he played defensive end and tight end.

Armah scored his first career touchdown against Dallas in Week 1 on his first career rush. Armah became the second player in franchise history to score on his first career rush, joining Richie Brockel who did it against the Texans (12/18/11). He scored another rushing touchdown against Tampa Bay.

McCAFFREY CATCHES

Last season, McCaffrey finished as the franchise record-holder for most receptions (80), receiving yards (651) and receiving touchdowns (5) by a running back in a single season in 2017. He also set franchise records for most receptions by a rookie, scrimmage yards by a rookie (1,086), yards after catch by a rookie (593) and first downs by a rookie (57).

In Week 2 of 2018 at Atlanta, McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game with 14. He also set a new career high with 102 yards receiving, the most by a running back in a game in franchise history. McCaffrey tied for the fourthmost receptions by a running back in a game in NFL history.

In his second season, McCaffrey just surpassed the 1,000 career receiving yards mark, the fastest running back to do it in franchise history.

His 880 scrimmage yards through the first eight games rank fifthbest in franchise history.

TIGHT ENDS FROM DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS

Carolina's reserve tight ends Chris Manhertz and Ian Thomas are both physically gifted but come from relatively limited big-time college football experience.

Thomas was drafted by the Panthers in the fourth round of the 2018 Draft, despite only starting in one season at Indiana with 375 receiving yards in 2017. He had transferred from Nassau Community College where he was recruited for basketball.

Thomas earned his first career start in Week 2 at Atlanta as Greg Olsen was inactive with a foot injury. Thomas has since made 11 catches for 87 yards this season.

Manhertz didn't play college football at all, signing as an undrafted free agent with the Bills after four seasons as a basketball player at Canisius, where he finished fourth in school history with 789 career rebounds.

Manhertz has played in 30 games with seven starts over the last three seasons with Carolina.

OLSEN AMONG ALL-TIME TE LEADERS

With 657 receptions, 7,774 receiving yards and 56 touchdown receptions in his career, tight end Greg Olsen ranks in the top 10 all-time among NFL tight ends in receptions and receiving yards and is tied for eighth in receiving touchdowns.

FUNCHESS MOVING UP CHARTS

Devin Funchess ranks eighth all-time in career receiving yards as a Panther in his fourth season, just recently passing Ted Ginn, Jr. He has 2,129 yards on 153 catches with 20 receiving touchdowns. He needs 257 receiving yards to pass Brandon LaFell for seventh place all-time in franchise history. Funchess now ranks 10th in receptions and fifth in receiving touchdowns.



MOORE KEEPS GOING AFTER THE CATCH

DJ Moore made the most of his first reception as a Panther in Week 2 at Atlanta. He took a 17-yard pass and then went another 34 yards after the catch for a 51-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

According to NFL's Next Gen Stats, Moore ranks fifth among receivers and tight ends in the NFL in yards after the catch per reception with 8.9 (min. 15 receptions).

Moore's rushing yards have already set a new franchise record for rushing yards by a wide receiver in a season.

SMITH STRETCHES THE FIELD

Panthers wideout Torrey Smith was brought to Carolina to help stretch the field as a legitimate deep threat. Since 2011 when he came into the league, Smith ranks fifth in average yards per catch at 16.1 (min. 200 receptions).

83 of Smith's 318 career receptions have gone for more than 20 yards (26.5 percent). This season, Smith has a long catch for 35 yards, while averaging 10.7 yards per reception with two touchdowns.

WRIGHT CLUTCH ON THIRD DOWN

Jarius Wright has made a living as a third-down clutch receiver. Since entering the league in 2012, he has made 171 receptions for 2,209 yards. Of his 171 receptions, 68 have come on third down (39.2 percent), with 49 going for first downs or touchdowns.

This season, Wright has made six of his 18 catches on third down, including his first touchdown on a third-and-goal play from the five-yard line in Week 2.

In Week 5, he converted a fourth-and-short play with a 27-yard reception.

SAMUEL RETURNS WITH A BANG

2017 second-round draft pick Curtis Samuel saw his first action of 2018 in Week 5 against New York after he missed time with a medical illness.

On his first touch of the season, Samuel broke several tackles to go 25 yards for his first career touchdown.

In Carolina's fourth quarter comeback at Philadelphia, Samuel scored his first rushing touchdown on a 14-yard end around.

Samuel then scored a rushing and receiving touchdown against Tampa Bay in Week 9.

Samuel and fellow 2017 draft pick Christian McCaffrey are the only Panthers in franchise history with at least two rushing and two receiving touchdowns in their first 14 games.







KUECHLY LEADS ALL TACKLERS

Since entering the NFL in 2012, press box crews have credited linebacker Luke Kuechly with 871 tackles, the most in the NFL over that stretch.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 1,002 career tackles, second-most in team history. He recently joined Thomas Davis as the only two players in franchise history with 1,000 career tackles (coaches film).

He is the only player in franchise history with more than 100 tackles in each of his first six seasons as a Panther, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012.

PEPPERS MAKES HISTORY

Julius Peppers currently ranks fourth all-time in NFL history with 156.5 career sacks. He is Carolina's all-time leader in sacks with 94.0 of his career sacks coming as a Panther.

Peppers has at least seven sacks in 15 of his 16 NFL seasons. In 2017, he tied for the team lead with 11 sacks.

He has the most sacks of any active NFL player, and he is the only player in NFL history with 150 sacks and 10 or more interceptions.

For his career, Peppers has been credited with 65 career pass deflections.

Since that stat has been tracked since 2000, Peppers leads all defensive ends in pass deflections and ranks second among all defensive linemen, trailing Kevin Williams (73).

Peppers has 47 pass deflections as a Panther, which ranks sixth in franchise history among all positions.

OBADA MAKES MOST OF FIRST GAME

Defensive end Efe Obada made the most of his first career game in the NFL in Week 3 against Cincinnati. Obada earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after he registered an interception, a sack, two quarterback hurries and a pass deflection in just 19 total snaps. He was part of a defense that recorded four interceptions and limited the Bengals to just 66 rushing yards.

In August, Obada became the first player from the NFL International Pathway Program to make an active roster. Last Sunday, he was the first such player to see game action and record any statistics.

Obada came to America from London in 2015 when he signed to the Dallas Cowboys practice squad despite only playing organized American football for just five games previously with the London Warriors. He was assigned to the Panthers practice squad in 2017 as a practice squad exemption as part of the Pathway Program.





ADAMS KEEPS TAKING IT AWAY

Safety Mike Adams joined the Panthers as a free agent before the 2017 season and had two interceptions last year to go with two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and 75 total tackles.

Adams has 17 interceptions over the last five seasons, third-most in the NFL in that span, despite entering his 15th season in 2018.
