**CAROLINA PANTHERS (3-1) AT WASHINGTON REDSKINS (2-2)**

**PANTHERS TRAVEL TO WASHINGTON IN WEEK 6**

### CAROLINA at WASHINGTON

- Carolina hits the road after spending four of the first five weeks of the season at home with three games and a bye week. The Panthers have started 3-1 for the seventh time in franchise history. Carolina made the playoffs in five of the previous six seasons after starting 3-1 or better with 2002 being the only outlier.
- The Panthers are 6-7 against the Redskins all-time but have won five consecutive games in the series, dating back to 2006. Carolina is 2-5 all-time at Washington, winning road games in 2016 and 2012.
- Carolina enters the game ranked first in the NFL in rushing at 154.0 yards per game. It marks the third straight week that Carolina has ranked first and seventh week since 2011 under head coach Ron Rivera that the Panthers ranked first in the NFL in rushing. The Panthers have finished in the top 10 in rushing in all but one season (2013) under Rivera.
- Christian McCaffrey ranks fourth in the NFL with 82.3 rushing yards per game, and is also second with 130.3 yards from scrimmage per game. McCaffrey has had 12 rushes for 10 yards or more, ranking third in the NFL.
- Quarterback Cam Newton leads the NFL with a quarterback passer rating of 127.1 in the red zone to go along with four passing touchdowns and three rushing touchdowns. In four career games against Washington, Newton has averaged 250.8 passing yards with nine touchdowns, no interceptions and a passer rating of 115.4.
- With the return of Thomas Davis, the Panthers could have seven Pro Bowlers in the defensive starting lineup against Washington (Peppers, Short, Poe, Davis, Kuechly, Reid, Adams).
- Kicker Graham Gano tied an NFL record for longest game-winning field goal at 63 yards in Week 5. He has now hit 24 consecutive field goals, breaking the Panthers franchise record for most consecutive field goals (John Kasay - 21). It also marks the longest active streak in the NFL. Gano has hit 36 straight field goals at home, a franchise record.

### THE SERIES

Carolina trails the all-time series with Washington, 6-7, with a 2-5 deficit on the road. However, Carolina has won five straight games in the series dating back to 2006. Both of Carolina's two wins at Washington have come under Ron Rivera, in 2012 and 2016 on Monday Night Football.

In Carolina's six wins, the Panthers average winning margin is 13.2 points, whereas the Redskins average winning margin is 4.6 in seven wins.

## THE HEAD COACHES



### Ron RIVERA

**NFL:** 22nd season

**Panthers HC:** 8th season

**Regular Season:** 67-48-1 (.579)

**Postseason:** 3-4 (.429)

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

With 64 career regular season wins, Rivera is 10 wins away from becoming the Panthers all-time winningest coach, surpassing John Fox.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-10), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-03). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-87) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-70).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children — Christopher and Courtney.

### Jay GRUDEN

**NFL:** 20th season

**Redskins HC:** 5th season

**Regular Season:** 30-39-1

Jay Gruden was named the 29th head coach in franchise history on January 9, 2014. He guided the Redskins to a 9-7 record and an NFC East title in 2015, becoming only the sixth coach in team history to lead the franchise to a playoff berth within the first two years of a coaching tenure. He oversaw a record-shattering offense in 2016 that posted team records in total net yards (6,545), net passing yards (4,758) and yards per play (6.40), ranking in the top three in the NFL in all three categories. Gruden joined the Redskins after spending three seasons as offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals, during which time the Bengals averaged 10 wins a season, making three consecutive playoff appearances and earning an AFC North championship in 2013. In three seasons together, Gruden helped quarterback and 2011 second-round pick Andy Dalton post a 30-18 regular season record (.625). He also spent seven seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as an offensive assistant (2002-08), helping the team to its first league championship in Super Bowl XXXVII. He is one of the most celebrated individuals in Arena Football League history, having won six combined league championships—four as a quarterback and two as a head coach. He was named the 1992 AFL Most Valuable Player and was honored with induction into the AFL Hall of Fame in 1999.

Gruden played quarterback at Louisville (1985-88), twice being named team MVP. He played quarterback for the Barcelona Dragons and Sacramento Surge (WLAF, 1990), Tampa Bay Storm (AFL, 1991-96) and Orlando Predators (AFL, 2002-03). He coached in various capacities for Louisville (1989-1991), Nashville Kats (AFL, 1997), Orlando Predators (AFL, 1998-2001, 2004-08), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2002-08), Florida Tuskers (2009-2010) and Cincinnati Bengals (2011-13).

Born on March 4, 1967 in Tiffin, Ohio, he and his wife, Sherry, have three sons — J.J., Joey and Jack—and one grandson, Trey.

## CAROLINA 26, WASHINGTON 15

Carolina never trailed Washington on the way to a 26-15 victory at FedExField on Monday Night Football to improve to 6-8 on the year. After the teams exchanged field goals, the Panthers took a 10-3 lead when quarterback Cam Newton connected with wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. for a 30-yard touchdown. Ginn ran down the seam between safety Donte Whitner and cornerback Josh Norman and found himself wide open in the end zone for the easy score. Coleman intercepted Washington quarterback Kirk Cousins on the last play of the first quarter, setting up a 23-yard Graham Gano field goal to extend the lead. The Redskins cut the halftime deficit to four after running back Rob Kelley rushed for a 5-yard touchdown (the point after attempt was missed). That proved to be Kelley's longest run of the night. The Redskins finished with 29 rushing yards, and there were no explosive plays to be had for the league's second-ranked offense. On the first snap of the second half, defensive end Wes Horton made the biggest play of the game. Horton overpowered tight end Vernon Davis, pushing him into Cousins as he got ready to throw. The ball came loose, and Horton recovered it at the 1-yard line. Newton tossed a play-action pass to fullback Mike Tolbert for the 1-yard touchdown, and just like that Carolina had a 20-9 lead. Newton had one of his best games of the season, throwing for 300 yards and completing 21-of-37 attempts. Gano added a 23-yard field goal later in the third quarter, and frustration began to set in for Washington. Redskins tight end Jordan Reed was disqualified for throwing a punch at Coleman — a penalty that helped force Washington settle for a short field goal early in the fourth quarter. A third Dustin Hopkins field goal cut the Carolina lead to eight with 3:44 remaining in the game. But running back Jonathan Stewart, who totaled a season-high 132 rushing yards, responded with his longest run — a 34-yard scamper which ultimately led to a 41-yard field goal from Gano to seal it.

## #CAREOLINAS SHIRTS UNVEILED

In the days after Hurricane Florence reached the Carolina coasts, head coach Ron Rivera addressed the media with a new #CAREOLINAS t-shirt featuring the hashtag and the states of North Carolina and South Carolina with the title "we share more than a state line" along the border.

The shirts were sold online through a link on Panthers.com and in stadium in Week 3, and the proceeds are going directly to the official recovery efforts of both states. Since the web campaign launched, over 10,000 shirts were purchased online.



## PANTHERS PACK FOOD BOXES

Carolina Panthers players, staff and families went to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina during the team's bye week to pack food donation boxes for shipment to areas of the Carolinas affected by the hurricane.

The Panthers packed over 5,000 boxes over three days at the food bank. Panthers owner David Tepper was a hands-on part of the effort as he packed boxes last Monday alongside the players. Continuing over the next few weeks, an additional 23,500 boxes funded by Tepper and his foundation will be shipped to affected areas of the Carolinas.

Prior to Carolina's game against Cincinnati, the David Tepper Charitable Foundation, Inc. and Carolina Panthers Charities announced an initial aid package of \$1.7 million with \$1 million going to the American Red Cross, \$450,000 going to regional food banks and \$250,000 to high school athletic programs affected by storm damage. Bank of America has pledged an additional \$100,000 to the high school relief fund, increasing the total to \$350,000 for regional high schools.



## PEPPERS LAUNCHES CAMPAIGN

On Friday, Aug. 21st, Julius Peppers announced a donation and the launch of the Julius Peppers Hurricane Relief Fund through the *Foundation For The Carolinas*. Peppers gave \$100,000 to the fund to aid in relief efforts, and he encouraged teammates, fans and the wider community to donate as well. Quarterback Cam Newton then publicly tweeted that he would match Peppers' \$100,000 gift to the campaign.

On Tuesday, Oct. 9, Peppers went to Robeson County, N.C., where he worked with the United Way to assist hurricane victims/

## ONE CAROLINA STICKERS

Against the Bengals and Giants, the Panthers wore "One Carolina" helmet stickers to show solidarity with hurricane recovery efforts in North and South Carolina.

Along with the Panthers, 44 colleges and universities from Division I to Division II, Division III, NAIA and even junior colleges wore the same stickers in games in and out of the states to increase awareness and promote the same solidarity.





**GANO MAKES HISTORY**

Graham Gano made NFL and franchise history with his 63-yard field goal to win the game in the waning seconds. The field goal tied for the longest game-winner in NFL history and tied for the second-longest field goal ever. It was a franchise record and personal best for Gano.

Gano hit four field goals in the game, bringing his streak to 24 straight field goals dating back to a miss at Detroit in 2017. He passed the franchise record for consecutive field goals made (21), originally set by John Kasay.

**SPECIAL TEAMS DAY**

The Panthers introduced the special teams out of the tunnel, rather than offensive or defensive starters, for the first time under head coach Ron Rivera.

The special teams players had a big day as captain Colin Jones recovered a muffed punt in the end zone for the first special teams touchdown of the season and first TD of Jones' career.

Punter Michael Palardy averaged 51.0 yards per punt with two of three pinning the Giants inside the 20. While kicker Graham Gano hit four field goals, including the game-winner from 63 yards out with just one second remaining in the game.

**ADAMS MAKES TWO INTERCEPTIONS**

Safety Mike Adams made two second-half interceptions, marking his fifth career multiple interception game. Since 2014, Adams has 16 interceptions, tied for the third-most interceptions over that span. In his career, Adams has 45 total takeaways (29 interceptions, 16 fumble recoveries), the most among all active players.

It marked the second consecutive game this season that a Panthers player has had two interceptions after Donte Jackson had two picks against the Bengals in Week 3. Carolina has had 14 consecutive wins when winning the turnover battle.

**NEWTON PASSES CUNNINGHAM**

Quarterback Cam Newton was 21-of-35 passing for 237 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Six of Newton's completions went for 20 yards or longer.

Newton ran for 29 yards on the ground, bringing him to 4,485 career rushing yards, the most ever by a quarterback with a single franchise, passing Randall Cunningham who had 4,482 with Philadelphia.

## MILESTONES IN REACH IN 2018

### Team

--The Panthers need five more wins to reach 200 wins in franchise history, including the postseason. Carolina is 195-193-1 all-time including the postseason.

--Carolina has won eight home games in a row dating back to last season. That streak is tied with the Patriots for the longest active home win streak in the NFL.

--The Panthers currently sport the NFL's longest consecutive game streak without overtime (45), dating back to Carolina's OT win over Indianapolis (11/12/15).

--Carolina can become the only NFL team to rank in the top 10 in sacks six times in the last seven seasons.

--Carolina can become one of just five teams to reach the playoffs in five of the last six seasons (if Seattle, Green Bay, Pittsburgh, and New England make the playoffs in 2018).

### Ron Rivera

--Rivera needs seven more regular-season wins to pass John Fox (73) for the most regular-season coaching wins in franchise history. In his eighth season with Carolina, Rivera has a 67-48-1 record.



### Cam Newton

--Newton needs three total touchdowns to pass Brett Favre (224) for third all-time through the first eight seasons of a career.

--Newton needs 985 total yards to catch Dan Marino and 3,421 yards to catch Peyton Manning for most combined yards (passing and rushing) after a quarterback's first eight seasons.

--Newton needs 444 rushing yards to pass Randall Cunningham for second all-time in rushing yards by a quarterback.

--Newton needs eight rushing first downs to pass Michael Vick for most rushing first downs by a quarterback in NFL history.

--Newton can become the first QB in NFL history to rush for at least 700 yards in four seasons.

--Newton needs one rushing touchdown to tie Jonathan Stewart for second in total touchdowns in franchise history.

--Newton needs five game-winning drives to tie Jake Delhomme for most in franchise history.

### Devin Funchess

--Funchess needs 126 receiving yards to pass Ted Ginn, Jr., for eighth place all-time in franchise history.

### Christian McCaffrey

--McCaffrey needs one receiving touchdown to tie DeAngelo Williams and Jonathan Stewart (7) for the most receiving TDs by a running back in franchise history.

--Peppers needs four forced fumbles to pass Robert Mathis (52) for most forced fumbles since 2000.

--Peppers needs one game played to pass Charles Woodson (254) for seventh-most career games by a defensive player in NFL history.

### Luke Kuechly

--Kuechly needs four interceptions to become the third linebacker in NFL history with 20 interceptions in his first seven seasons played.

--Kuechly needs four takeaways for the most takeaways by an NFL linebacker in his first seven seasons.

--Kuechly needs 72 tackles (press box stats) to pass Patrick Willis (916) for the most tackles in an NFL player's first seven seasons.

**3RD AND SHORT DEFENSE**

The Panthers held the Giants to 0-of-7 on third down in Week 5, marking the first time since 2000 that Carolina has held a team without a third down conversion for a game.

This season, Carolina ranks first in the NFL on third and 1 or 2 yards to go, allowing conversions on just 25 percent of attempts (1-of-4).

The Panthers are tied for fifth in defensive third downs overall, allowing just 30.8 percent (12-39).

**EXPERIENCED AND STILL PRODUCTIVE**

Panthers defensive end Julius Peppers is the longest tenured defensive player currently active in the NFL. He is followed by teammate Mike Adams who is the third-longest on defense in terms of career games played.

With ages of 38 and 37, the two players rank first and second, respectively, as the oldest two defensive players still active.

## A RUNNING HISTORY

Since 2011, the year Carolina drafted Cam Newton, the Panthers rank third in the NFL in rushing yards with 15,372. Carolina also ranks second in rushing touchdowns since 2011 with 125, just three behind New England.

Carolina has boasted a top-10 rushing offense in six of the last seven seasons with Newton and head coach Ron Rivera.

## TOPS IN RUSHING IN THE NFL

For three straight weeks, the Panthers have been at the top of the NFL rushing charts with 154.0 yards per contest.

Since 2011, the Panthers have ranked number one in rushing in seven different weeks, and the team has finished in the top 10 in rushing in all but one season under Rivera.

This season, the Panthers rank:

1st in rushing yards per game (154.0)

3rd in rushing yards per carry (5.05)

t-8th in rushing TDs per game (1.0)

3rd in rushing first downs per game (8.0)

t-5th in rushes over 10 yards (21)

t-2nd in fumbles lost (1)

## OFFENSIVE LINE SHOWING OUT

In Weeks 2 and 3, the Panthers offensive line started was made up of only one originally projected starter in his original position, being center Ryan Kalil.

Taylor Moton started at right tackle for Daryl Williams after he had done work at left guard and then left tackle in the preseason. Greg Van Roten started at left guard after Amini Silatolu was hurt in the preseason and Moton moved to tackle. Tyler Larsen started at right guard after Trai Turner was inactive with a concussion. And Chris Clark was signed off the street prior to Week 2 to start for the injured Matt Kalil at left tackle.

Despite the changes, the offensive line has performed admirably. In the last three games, Carolina only allowed four sacks while averaging 156.3 yards on the ground, both of which rank second in the NFL over that stretch.

## SPREADING THE SCORING AROUND

Through four games, the Panthers have shown a number of different ways to score touchdowns.

Cam Newton has thrown seven passing touchdowns to seven different players (Funchess, Wright, Smith, Moore, Anderson, McCaffrey and Samuel), while Newton and Armah have both run for touchdowns. Colin Jones scored a special teams touchdown.

Ten different players have accounted for Carolina's 12 touchdowns, which ties for third-most in the NFL. Last season, 13 different players scored touchdowns for Carolina.

Of the 10 different players, Armah, Moore, Samuel and Jones each scored their first career touchdowns on their first touches of the season.

## WINNING CLOSE GAMES

Last season, Carolina went 7-1 in games decided by seven points or fewer. The Panthers are 1-1 in those games this season.

Carolina's eight wins in games decided by seven or fewer points ranks third in the NFL in 2017-18.

Since 2013, the Panthers are 25-13 for a .654 winning percentage in games decided by seven or fewer points. Over that span, Carolina has both the most wins and highest winning percentage in the NFC for close games.

Since 2013, the Panthers are 13-8 in games decided by three points or fewer and have won five such games in a row dating back to Week 17 of the 2016 season.

The Panthers have had seven seasons where they've had a winning record and at least four wins in games decided by seven points or less. They went to the playoffs in each of those seasons.







## TEAM NOTES

### DEFENSIVE LINE HAS BEEN DOMINANT

The Carolina Panthers sported a dominant and sometimes overlooked defensive line in the last six seasons under former defensive line coach Eric Washington. Washington was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2018, and he aims to work with his replacement, Brady Hoke, on maintaining that production.

Since 2012, no group of defensive linemen produced more sacks than Carolina's 226.0.

The 60 sacks in 2013 tied the Panthers franchise record set in 1996 and were the most by a team in a single season since San Diego had 61 in 2006.

The defensive line has not only been productive in getting to the quarterback, but also at stopping the run. Carolina's run defense has ranked in the top six in the NFL in four of the past seven years.

Since 2013, a Panthers defensive lineman has earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors six times, which ranks second among every team's defensive position group since 2013. Hardy was recognized twice in 2013 (Week 3 and Week 17). Short and Lotulelei are the only defensive tackles in Panthers history to earn NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors as Short was recognized in Week 6 of 2015 and Lotulelei received recognition in Week 8 of 2016. Peppers won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 4 of 2017. Efe Obada won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 3 of 2018.

Short also has two NFC Defensive Player of the Month awards on his resume, earning the recognition in October and December of 2015. Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (165) and career rushing touchdowns (57). Newton is the first quarterback in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 38 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the most in NFL history. He also has three regular season games and one postseason game with at least two rushing touchdowns and two passing touchdowns. His three regular season games rank second in NFL history.

Newton needs 713 total yards to catch Matthew Stafford for fourth-most combined yards after a quarterback's first eight seasons.

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004) and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals (2011-17), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first seven seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards AND 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

Newton has now rushed for at least 700 yards in three NFL seasons and joins Michael Vick (three) as the only quarterbacks with three 700-yard rushing seasons in a career.

**ALL-TIME RUNNING QUARTERBACK**

Cam Newton has continued to move up the all-time ranks for total rushing yardage among all-time quarterbacks. Newton ranks third all-time in rush yards by a quarterback in NFL history.

Quarterback Cam Newton has been successful moving the chains with his legs since entering the NFL in 2011, with 336 of his 864 rushes going for first downs. The 38.9 rushing first down percentage is the top mark in the NFL during that time (min. 400 attempts).

He led the NFL in rushing first down percentage in each of his first five seasons with a career-high mark of 43.7 percent in 2014.

Newton's total 336 rushing first downs rank fifth in the NFL since 2011. He trails Michael Vick's 343 rushing first downs for most in NFL history by a quarterback.

In 2018, McCaffrey has already shown an improvement in traditional running through the tackles. According to NFL's Next Gen stats, McCaffrey's efficiency (a metric tracking yards gained against total yards traveled, wherein a low number begets more "north-south" running) in 2018 is 3.19, ranking sixth in the league. Last year, it was 4.63 which ranked 42nd.



### ANDERSON FRESH OFF 1,000

Running back C.J. Anderson comes to Carolina fresh off a 1,000-yard rushing season in Denver (1,007). He added 224 receiving yards to rank 12th in the NFL in yards from scrimmage by a running back (1,231).

Since entering the league as an undrafted free agent in 2013, Anderson has only lost three fumbles in 706 career carries, tying for fourth in the NFL in fewest fumbles since 2013 (min. 600 carries).

In four games with Carolina, Anderson has rushed for 84 yards on 16 carries, averaging 5.3 yards per carry. Adding in a 24-yard touchdown reception, Anderson has 108 yards on 17 touches, averaging 6.4 yards per touch.

### McCAFFREY CATCHES

Last season, McCaffrey finished as the franchise record-holder for most receptions (80), receiving yards (651) and receiving touchdowns (5) by a running back in a single season in 2017. He also set franchise records for most receptions by a rookie, scrimmage yards by a rookie (1,086), yards after catch by a rookie (593) and first downs by a rookie (57).

McCaffrey finished third in receiving yards by rookie Panthers, regardless of position.

In Week 2 of 2018 at Atlanta, McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game with 14. He also set a new career high with 102 yards receiving, the most by a running back in a game in franchise history. McCaffrey tied for the fourth-most receptions by a running back in a game in NFL history.

Barely into his second season, McCaffrey only needs 157 receiving yards to become the fourth 1,000-yard receiving running back in franchise history. He needs 16 receiving first downs to pass DeAngelo Williams for the most by a running back in franchise history.

McCaffrey leads the NFL with his 130.3 yards from scrimmage per game, in front of Alvin Kamara and Todd Gurley.

### ARMAH'S UNDERDOG STORY

Panthers fullback Alex Armah was not seen as a lock for a 53-man roster, not to mention a starting fullback spot when he was drafted in 2017 out of Division II West Georgia, one of six D-II players drafted in 2017. However, he has solidified his position as the Panthers fullback despite not playing the position since high school.

At West Georgia, he became the first player in Gulf South conference history to earn All-Conference honors on both offense and defense as he played defensive end and tight end.

Armah scored his first career touchdown against Dallas in Week 1 on his first career rush. Armah became the second player in franchise history to score on his first career rush, joining Richie Brockel who did it against the Texans (12/18/11).



**OLSEN CLIMBING PANTHERS RANKS**

Olsen is the Panthers all-time receiving yards leader among tight ends and the Panthers all-time receptions leader among tight ends. He holds the team's tight end record with nine 100-yard receiving games. He is second among Panthers tight ends in career touchdowns (33) behind Wesley Walls (44).

**TIGHT ENDS FROM DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS**

Carolina's reserve tight ends Chris Manhertz and Ian Thomas are both physically gifted but come from relatively limited big-time college football experience.

Thomas was drafted by the Panthers in the fourth round of the 2018 Draft, despite only starting in one season at Indiana with 375 receiving yards in 2017. He had transferred from Nassau Community College where he was recruited for basketball.

Thomas earned his first career start in Week 2 at Atlanta as Greg Olsen was inactive with a foot injury. Thomas has since made 10 catches for 72 yards this season.

Manhertz didn't play college football at all, signing as an undrafted free agent with the Bills after four seasons as a basketball player at Canisius, where he finished fourth in school history with 789 career rebounds.

Manhertz has played in 27 games with seven starts over the last three seasons with Carolina.

### **NEW FACES IN RECEIVERS ROOM**

Carolina takes the field with a new-look receiving corps in 2018. Of the six receivers on the current active roster, only Devin Funchess was active during Carolina's Wild Card playoff game last January in New Orleans.

Carolina traded for Torrey Smith from Philadelphia, signed Jarius Wright as a free agent from Minnesota, drafted DJ Moore in the first round and returned Damiere Byrd and Curtis Samuel from injury.

Smith, Wright, Funchess, Samuel and Moore have all scored receiving touchdowns this season.

### **FUNCHESS MOVING UP CHARTS**

Devin Funchess ranks ninth all-time in career receiving yards as a Panther as he is in his fourth season. He has 1,922 yards on 135 catches with 18 receiving touchdowns. He needs 126 receiving yards to pass Ted Ginn, Jr. for eighth place all-time in franchise history.

Funchess is tied for sixth in franchise history in receiving touchdowns and sixth in receiving average with 14.2 yards per reception (min. 100 catches).



### **SAMUEL RETURNS WITH A BANG**

2017 second-round draft pick Curtis Samuel saw his first action of 2018 in Week 5 against New York after he missed time with a medical illness.

On his first touch of the season, Samuel broke several tackles to go 25 yards for his first career touchdown.

Samuel led all Panthers receivers in yards in the preseason. He has 152 career yards on 17 catches over the last two seasons, despite missing 10 games with various injuries.

### **SMITH STRETCHES THE FIELD**

New Panthers wideout Torrey Smith was brought to Carolina to help stretch the field as a legitimate deep threat. Since 2011 when he came into the league, Smith ranks third in average yards per catch at 16.2 (min. 200 receptions).

82 of Smith's 309 career receptions have gone for more than 20 yards (26.5 percent). This season, Smith has a long catch for 26 yards, while averaging 9.6 yards per reception with one touchdown.

### **WRIGHT CLUTCH ON THIRD DOWN**

Jarius Wright has made a living as a third-down clutch receiver. Since entering the league in 2012, he has made 165 receptions for 2,156 yards. Of his 165 receptions, 67 have come on third down (40.6 percent), with 48 going for first downs or touchdowns.

This season, Wright has made five of his 12 catches on third down, including his first touchdown on a third-and-goal play from the five-yard line in Week 2.

In Week 5, he converted a fourth-and-short play with a 27-yard reception, his longest as a Panther.

### **MOORE GOES ALL THE WAY ON FIRST CATCH**

DJ Moore made the most of his first reception as a Panther in Week 2 at Atlanta. He took a 17-yard pass and then went another 34 yards after the catch for a 51-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. Moore was known for his ability after the catch at Maryland when Carolina drafted him in the first round in 2018.

Moore became the fourth Panther in franchise history to score a touchdown on his first career reception, joining Casey Crawford (Nov. 5, 2000), Jeff King (Dec. 24, 2006) and Dante Rosario (Dec. 2, 2007). None of the previous three players to do it had a touchdown longer than 16 yards.

**KUECHLY LEADS ALL TACKLERS**

Since entering the NFL in 2012, press box crews have credited linebacker Luke Kuechly with 847 tackles, the most in the NFL over that stretch. Kuechly ranks fifth in career tackles among all currently active players in the NFL.

Kuechly has the most tackles (press box) in NFL history over any player's first six seasons in the league.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 964 career tackles, second-most in team history.

He is the only player in franchise history with more than 100 tackles in each of his first six seasons as a Panther, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012.

Kuechly needs 36 tackles for 1,000 in his career (coaches film).

**THOMAS DAVIS RETURNS**

Thomas Davis is the Panthers all-time leading tackler with 1,174 stops according to coaches film.

According to press box stats, Davis has 998 tackles, ranking 25th all-time among all players in NFL history and third among active players. His 65 tackles for loss are tied for 18th among linebackers all-time. Davis has played in 165 career games, tying for 15th among all active NFL defensive players.

In 2017, Luke Kuechly grabbed three interceptions leading all Panthers and tying for first in the NFL in picks among linebackers.

Kuechly added two opponent fumble recoveries for five total takeaways, tying for the most among linebackers in the NFL in 2017.

Since entering the league in 2012, Luke Kuechly has tallied 16 interceptions, the most among NFL linebackers during that time.

Teammate Thomas Davis ranks behind only Kuechly during that time with 10.

Shaq Thompson had the chance to start in place of Thomas Davis for the first four games as Davis served a suspension. A 2015 draft pick, Thompson has 26 total tackles with one sack and four quarterback pressures.





**PEPPERS MAKES HISTORY**

Julius Peppers currently ranks fourth all-time in NFL history with 154.5 career sacks. He is Carolina's all-time leader in sacks with 92.0 of his career sacks coming as a Panther.

Peppers has at least seven sacks in 15 of his 16 NFL seasons. In 2017, he tied for the team lead with 11 sacks.

He has the most sacks of any active NFL player, and he is the only player in NFL history with 150 sacks and 10 or more interceptions.

Three of the top four sack artists in NFL history played for the Panthers at some point.

**LONGEVITY**

Julius Peppers is the longest tenured and oldest active defensive player in the NFL, tallying 254 career games played in the regular season and another 18 career playoff games. He has also played in 164 consecutive games, one behind Brandon Carr for the most by any active defensive player.

## OBADA MAKES MOST OF FIRST GAME

Defensive end Efe Obada made the most of his first career game in the NFL in Week 3 against Cincinnati. Obada earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after he registered an interception, a sack, two quarterback hurries and a pass deflection in just 19 total snaps. He was part of a defense that recorded four interceptions and limited the Bengals to just 66 rushing yards.

In August, Obada became the first player from the NFL International Pathway Program to make an active roster. Last Sunday, he was the first such player to see game action and record any statistics.

Obada came to America from London in 2015 when he signed to the Dallas Cowboys practice squad despite only playing organized American football for just five games previously with the London Warriors. He was assigned to the Panthers practice squad in 2017 as a practice squad exemption as part of the Pathway Program.





### ADAMS KEEPS TAKING IT AWAY

Safety Mike Adams joined the Panthers as a free agent before the 2017 season and had two interceptions last year to go with two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and 75 total tackles.

Adams has 16 interceptions over the last five seasons, tied for fifth-most in the NFL in that span, despite entering his 15th season in 2018.

### JACKSON PICKS THREE

Rookie cornerback Donte Jackson secured two interceptions against the Bengals, including one in the fourth quarter that helped seal the team's victory. Jackson also added eight tackles (coaches film) to his stat line.

His two interceptions came just one week after recording his first against Atlanta. Jackson became one of eight players in NFL history to record three interceptions in his first three career games.

Jackson is currently tied for first in the NFL with his three interceptions. He has 26 tackles which leads all Panthers secondary players.





**GANO MOVES UP PANTHERS SCORING LIST**

**GANO SETS RECORD FOR STREAK**

Graham Gano set a new franchise record when he set another franchise record. His 63-yard game-winning field goal against New York was a new franchise long and tied the NFL record for longest game-winning field goal.

By the end of the game, Gano's four field goals gave him 24 consecutive makes, breaking John Kasay's previous franchise record of 21 straight. Gano's 24 straight makes are the longest active streak in the NFL.

Gano has hit 36 straight field goals at home which is also a franchise record.

Gano ranks second in franchise history with an all-time field goal percentage of 85.8. His 2017 season of 96.7 percent (29-30) led the NFL and set the franchise single-season record.

**PALARDY SETS PUNTING RECORD**

Punter Michael Palardy finished the 2017 season with a franchise record for net punting average at 42.4, a mark that ranked sixth in the league.

Palardy uncorked a career-long 63-yard punt at the New York Jets (11/27/17).



This season, Palardy has a net average of 43.3 which ranks fifth in the NFL.

He has landed 10 punts inside the 20-yard line with only one touchback. That 10-to-1 ratio ranks fifth in the NFL.

**PALARDY SETS PUNTING RECORD**

The Panthers special teams have held opponents to an average starting field position of 25.4, ranking fifth in the NFL.
