- The Panthers look to bounce back after a 52-21 loss at Pittsburgh on Thursday night, which snapped a three-game winning streak.
- Carolina is 6-2 all-time against Detroit, including 2-1 on the road. The Panthers won 27-24 last season at Detroit.
- Cam Newton has now thrown for at least two touchdown passes in eight consecutive games, setting a new franchise record. He has also tallied a passer rating over 100 in four straight games, a new personal best. Newton's completion percentage of 68.5 is on pace for a new career high and franchise record for a quarterback.
- Christian McCaffrey has scored seven touchdowns in the past three games (four rushing, three receiving). That marks the most touchdowns in a three-game stretch in the franchise since DeAngelo Williams had seven in three games in 2008. McCaffrey has scored 15 career touchdowns, third-most by a Panthers player through his first 25 career games.
- Greg Olsen (661) needs two receptions to pass Ozzie Smith (662) for fifth-place all-time in receptions among tight ends.
- Carolina ranks third in the NFL in rushing yards per game (138.4). The Panthers have finished in the top 10 in rushing in all but one season under head coach Ron Rivera.

Ron RIVERA

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

With 70 career regular season wins, Rivera is four wins away from becoming the Panthers all-time winningest coach, surpassing John Fox.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-10), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-03). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-87) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-70).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

Matt Patricia was named Lions' 27th head coach on February 5, 2018. Patricia is in his first season in Detroit after spending six seasons (2012-17) as defensive coordinator for the New England Patriots. He originally joined the Patriots as a coaching assistant in 2004 before serving as the assistant offensive line (2005), linebackers (2006-10) and safeties coach (2011).

He assisted in guiding New England to three Super Bowl Championships (XXXIX, XLIX, LI), six AFC Championships and 13 AFC East Division titles. In all 14 of his seasons with the Patriots, New England finished with 10 or more wins, including 11 seasons with 12 or more wins. During Patricia's six years as the team's defensive coordinator, the Patriots accumulated an NFL-best 75-21 (.781) record during that span and ranked second in points allowed (19.2). After moving over to coach the defensive side of the ball in 2006, Patricia helped New England finish among the top 10 in points allowed during 11 of his 12 seasons with the defense.

Patricia played center and guard at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He earned a bachelor's degree in aeronautical engineering from Syracuse before receiving a master's degree in education from Massachusetts.

He coached collegiately at Syracuse as a graduate assistant (2001-03) and Amherst College where he coached the defensive line (1999-2000). He began his coaching career at his alma mater, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, as a graduate assistant in 1996 before spending two years working as an aeronautical engineer.

Patricia was born September 13, 1974 in Sherrill, N.Y. He and his wife, Raina, have three children, including sons Dominic and Dante, as well as a daughter, Giamina.

GAME SUMMARY

CAROLINA 27, DETROIT 24

Cam Newton and the Carolina Panthers earned their second impressive road victory in as many weeks, scoring 24 consecutive points before holding on for a 27-24 victory over the Detroit Lions. One week after a last-second victory at New England, the Panthers fell behind 10-3 against a fellow 3-1 team before dominating the second and third quarters. The onslaught began early in the second quarter when running back Christian McCaffrey scampered into the end zone from six yards for his first career touchdown on a beautifully designed shovel pass. The drive could have ended early with a punt, but on third-and-1 at Carolina's 34, Newton moved the chains with a 57-yard pitch and catch to tight end Ed Dickson - his second long reception of the day. Dickson finished with five catches for 175 yards, setting an NFL record for most yards per catch for a tight end with five or more catches. Newton looked like his 2015 MVP self in the victory, tossing two more touchdowns after the one to McCaffrey. Newton completed 79 percent of his passes and finished with 141.8 passer rating. Newton capped off the first half with 10-yard touchdown strike to Funchess, who returned to Ford Field for the first time since the state championship game when he was junior in high school. The receiver led the Panthers in both targets (eight) and receptions (seven). The duo combined for 111 receiving yards and two touchdowns on 11 receptions. Benjamin's biggest contribution came in the third quarter when he raced past his defender on a seam route down the left sideline. Newton dropped a perfectly placed pass into the outstretched arms of Benjamin, who reeled in the 31-yard touchdown pass to build the lead to 24-10.

#CAREOLINA

In the days after Hurricane Florence reached the Carolina coasts, head coach Ron Rivera addressed the media with a new #CAREolinas t-shirt featuring the hashtag and the states of North Carolina and South Carolina with the title "we share more than a state line" along the border.

The shirts were sold online through a link on Panthers.com and in stadium in Week 3, and the proceeds are going directly to the official recovery efforts of both states. Since the web campaign launched, over 10,000 shirts were purchased online.



PEPPERS' CAMPAIGN

On Friday, Aug. 21st, Julius Peppers announced a donation and the launch of the Julius Peppers Hurricane Relief Fund through the *Foundation For The Carolinas*. Peppers gave \$100,000 to the fund to aid in relief efforts, and he encouraged teammates, fans and the wider community to donate as well. Quarterback Cam Newton then publicly tweeted that he would match Peppers' \$100,000 gift to the campaign.

On Tuesday, Oct. 9, Peppers went to Robeson County, N.C., where he worked with the United Way to assist hurricane victims. On Tuesday, Oct. 23, he traveled to Marlboro County, S.C., to assist with recovery efforts there.

Peppers is originally from Bailey, N.C., and went to college at North Carolina. Info on the campaign is on the front page of Panthers.com.



PACKING BOXES

Carolina Panthers players, staff and families went to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina during the team's bye week to pack food donation boxes for shipment to areas of the Carolinas affected by the hurricane.

The Panthers packed over 5,000 boxes over three days at the food bank. Panthers owner David Tepper was a hands-on part of the effort as he packed boxes last Monday alongside the players. Continuing over the next few weeks, an additional 23,500 boxes funded by Tepper and his foundation will be shipped to affected areas of the Carolinas.

Prior to Carolina's game against Cincinnati, the David Tepper Charitable Foundation, Inc. and Carolina Panthers Charities announced an initial aid package with \$1 million going to the American Red Cross, \$450,000 going to regional food banks and \$250,000 to high school athletic programs affected by storm damage. Bank of America has pledged an additional \$100,000 to the high school relief fund, increasing the total to \$350,000 for regional high schools.



ONE CAROLINA

The Panthers wore "One Carolina" helmet stickers to show solidarity with hurricane recovery efforts in North and South Carolina.

Along with the Panthers, 44 colleges and universities from Division I to Division II, Division III, NAIA and even junior colleges wore the same stickers in games in and out of the states to increase awareness and promote the same solidarity.

New England's last home loss came against the Panthers (10/1/17). The streak is also tied for the second-longest home win streak, including playoffs in franchise history.



Since 2013, a Panthers defensive lineman has earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors six times, which ranks second among every team's defensive position group since 2013. Hardy was recognized twice in 2013 (Week 3 and Week 17). Short and Lotulelei are the only defensive tackles in Panthers history to earn NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors as Short was recognized in Week 6 of 2015 and Lotulelei received recognition in Week 8 of 2016. Peppers won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 4 of 2017. Efe Obada won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week 3 of 2018.

Short also has two NFC Defensive Player of the Month awards on his resume, earning the recognition in October and December of 2015. 

Last season, McCaffrey finished as the franchise record-holder for most receptions (80), receiving yards (651) and receiving touchdowns (5) by a running back in a single season in 2017. He also set franchise records for most receptions by a rookie, scrimmage yards by a rookie (1,086), yards after catch by a rookie (593) and first downs by a rookie (57).

In Week 2 of 2018 at Atlanta, McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game with 14. He also set a new career high with 102 yards receiving, the most by a running back in a game in franchise history.

In his second season, McCaffrey just surpassed the 1,000 career receiving yards mark, the fastest running back to do it in franchise history. He became one of just seven players in NFL history to have both 1,000 receiving and 1,000 rushing yards in his first 25 career games.

McCaffrey is on pace to break his own receiving running back records that he set last season. With 439 receiving yards, he ranks fourth in the NFL among running backs in receiving.

Thomas earned his first career start in Week 2 at Atlanta as Greg Olsen was inactive with a foot injury. Thomas has since made 11 catches for 87 yards this season.

Manhertz didn't play college football at all, signing as an undrafted free agent with the Bills after four seasons as a basketball player at Canisius, where he finished fourth in school history with 789 career rebounds.

Obada earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after he registered an interception, a sack, two quarterback hurries and a pass deflection in just 19 total snaps. He was part of a defense that recorded four interceptions and limited the Bengals to just 66 rushing yards.

In August, Obada became the first player from the NFL International Pathway Program to make an active roster. Last Sunday, he was the first such player to see game action and record any statistics.

Obada came to America from London in 2015 when he signed to the Dallas Cowboys practice squad despite only playing organized American football for just five games previously with the London Warriors. He was assigned to the Panthers practice squad in 2017 as a practice squad exemption as part of the Pathway Program.

This season, Palardy has a net average of 40.8 with a gross of 45.4. He has landed 18 punts inside the 20-yard line with three touchbacks. Palardy ranks ninth in the NFL with an inside the 20 percentage of 48.65.
