# PANTHERS HOST BENGALS IN WEEK 3

# CAROLINA vs. CINCINNATI

- Carolina returns home and looks to bounce back after a seven-point loss at Atlanta, while the Bengals hit the road after a 34-23 home win against Baltimore.
- Sunday marks just the sixth time that the teams have played. The
  all-time series stands at 2-2-1. The Bengals are the only team that
  Carolina has ever tied in a game, which came in the last meeting in
  2014. Carolina is 2-1 all-time against the Bengals at home.
- The Panthers set a number of offensive statistical milestones on Sunday. The team tied a franchise record with 20 passing first downs, while Christian McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record with 14 receptions.
- Cam Newton set a career high with 32 completions as he went 32-of-45 for 335 yards and three passing touchdowns. It marked his careerbest completion percentage (71.1) when he had more than 35 passing attempts. It also marked Newton's 17th 300-yard passing game and 18th three-touchdown passing game.
- This week, Luke Kuechly will look to move into sole possession of second place in franchise history with 954 tackles (coaches stats). He is currently tied with Mike Minter. Thomas Davis is the franchise leader in tackles with 1,174.

# Ron RIVERA

NFL: 22nd season

Panthers HC: 8th season

**Regular Season:** 65-48-1 (.575)

**Postseason:** 3-4 (.429)

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

With 64 career regular season wins, Rivera is 10 wins away from becoming the Panthers all-time winningest coach, surpassing John Fox.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

### Marvin LEWIS

NFL: 27th season

Bengals HC: 16th season

**Regular Season:** 127-124-3 (.515)

**Postseason:** 0-7 (.000)

Marvin Lewis was named the ninth head coach in Bengals history on January 14, 2003. In 2018, he extends his Bengals-record head coaching tenure to 16 seasons. He has led the team to the postseason in six of the last nine years. The Bengals were one of only four NFL teams to have made the playoffs each year from 2011-15. In total, Lewis has coached seven Bengals playoff teams, a franchise record.

Lewis opened 2018 with 125 career victories, 61 more than any other Bengals coach (Sam Wyche 64). In 2015, the Bengals won the AFC North title for the second time in three years (2013), equaling the franchise record with 12 victories. Lewis' 2012 Bengals achieved a rare NFL feat, becoming only the ninth of 131 teams from 1990-2012 to rise from a 3-5 start to the playoffs. Lewis was the consensus choice as NFL Coach of the Year in 2009, when the Bengals won the AFC North title while sweeping all six division games. They also won the AFC North under Lewis in 2005.

Lewis was the Washington Redskins defensive coordinator and assistant head coach in 2002. He spent six seasons (1996-2001) as defensive coordinator with the Baltimore Ravens, which included a Super Bowl victory in the 2000 season. Lewis spent four seasons (1992-95) as Pittsburgh Steelers linebackers coach.

He earned All-Big Sky Conference honors as a linebacker at Idaho State (1978-1980), and played quarterback/free safety. Received his bachelor's degree in physical education and Master's degree in athletic administration. Inducted into Idaho State's Hall of Fame in 2001. Began his coaching career at Idaho State (1981-84), winning an NCAA Division I-AA championship in 1981. Was also the linebackers coach at Long Beach State (1985-86), New Mexico (1987-89), and Pittsburgh (1990-91).

He was born September 23, 1958, in McDonald, Pa. Lewis and his wife, Peggy, have two children—Whitney and Marcus.

# CAROLINA 37, CINCINNATI 37 OCTOBER 12, 2014 • PAUL BROWN STADIUM • CINCINNATI, OHIO

CINCINNATI - The back-and-forth game between the Panthers and Bengals at Paul Brown Stadium involved five full quarters, just one punt for each team, 944 total yards, windimpacted kicks, an 89-yard touchdown run, an 80-yard interception return and a 97-yard kickoff return that ended in a 37-37 tie. Cincinnati kicker Mike Nugent missed a 36-yard field goal as overtime expired, giving Carolina its first tie in franchise history. After trailing 17-10 at halftime, the Panthers stormed back in the third quarter. With Cincinnati threatening, linebacker Thomas Davis blitzed and got a piece of quarterback Andy Dalton's elbow as he threw, and cornerback Antoine Cason easily picked off the errant pass. He returned the interception 80 yards to the Bengals' 10-yard line. Two plays later, running back Fozzy Whitaker's first career rushing touchdown - a 4-yard run up the middle - tied the game. Carolina then forced Cincinnati to punt for the first and only time, and the Panthers moved 77 yards in six plays to take the 24-17 lead. Quarterback Cam Newton, who finished with 107 rushing yards on 17 carries, kept the ball on a zone-read option for a 12-vard touchdown, Safety Roman Harper intercepted an overthrown pass by Dalton on the ensuing possession. But instead of adding to the lead, the score remain unchanged. Graham Gano missed a 38-yard field goal attempt wide right. Cincinnati tied the game early in the fourth quarter when Dalton tossed a 34-yard touchdown to wide receiver Mohammed Sanu. Carolina took the lead right back with a 12-play, 80-yard drive. Newton rolled right and floated a pass on a backside screen to Olsen for a 13-yard touchdown. The Panthers were in good shape with a 31-24 lead and 4:50 remaining in the game. That all changed when Gano drove his kickoff into the wind, and Adam Jones returned it 97 yards. Colin Jones made the touchdown-saving tackle at the 3-yard line. But running back Jeremy Hill found the end zone on the first play to tie the game. Cincinnati got the ball back after safety Reggie Nelson intercepted Newton's overthrown pass for Benjamin and returned it to the Carolina 24-yard line with 3:22 remaining. The Bengals settled for a 38-yard Nugent field goal to take a 34-31 lead with 2:11 left. With two timeouts left. Newton engineered a 12-play, 54-yard drive to set up Gano for the game-tying 44-yard field goal as regulation ended. The Bengals received to begin overtime and a sack by defensive end Charles Johnson on third-and-seven forced Cincinnati to kick a 42-vard field goal. Carolina then had its chance to tie or win the game. The Panthers matriculated down the field, making their way into scoring position. On third-and-six, Benjamin hauled in a pass a yard short of the first down. Rivera thought about going for it on fourth-and-one but decided to tie the game with a 36-yard field goal by Gano with 2:19 left in overtime. A 24-yard pass to Bengals wide receiver James Wright, combined with a roughing the passer penalty on Johnson, put Cincinnati in position to win the game at the Carolina 16-yard line. But Nugent's 36-yard attempt sailed wide right and time expired with both teams deadlocked at 37. It's just the second time since the league adopted new overtime rules in 2012 that a game has ended in a tie when both teams scored in overtime.

# McCAFFREY TIES FRANCHISE MARK

Christian McCaffrey recorded 14 receptions for 102 yards against Atlanta. That tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game, a mark that Smith set in 2005 against Chicago.

McCaffrey's 14 catches tied for the fourth-most by a running back in NFL history.

McCaffrey's 102 yards of receiving bested his previous high of 101 that he set in 2017 against New Orleans in Week 3. He already owns franchise records for most receptions and receiving yards by a running back in a game.



# MOORE SCORES TD ON FIRST CATCH

Rookie wide receiver DJ Moore scored a 51-yard touchdown on his first career catch in the fourth quarter.

Moore became the fourth Panther in franchise history to score a touchdown on his first career reception, joining Casey Crawford (Nov. 5, 2000), Jeff King (Dec. 24, 2006) and Dante Rosario (Dec. 2, 2007). None of the previous three players to do it had a touchdown longer than 16 yards.

It marked the second straight game that a Panther scored his first career touchdown on a first carry or catch as last week Alex Armah scored on his first career rush.

The play was the longest receiving touchdown for the Panthers since 2016 when Ted Ginn hauled in an 88-yard touchdown reception against the Raiders (11/27/16).



# **NEWTON COMPLETES 32**

Cam Newton threw for 335 yards and three touchdowns with 32 completions on 45 attempts. Newton set a new career high for completions in a game.

It marked his career-best completion percentage (71.1) when he had more than 35 passing attempts. It also marked Newton's 17th 300-yard passing game and 18th three-touchdown passing game.

Newton's 32 completions were the third-most in a game in franchise history (Weinke; 36 - 2001). Carolina also tied a franchise record with 20 passing first downs.



# STREAK SNAPPED

The Panthers entered the game in Atlanta with the league's longest streak of 21 games without allowing a 100-yard rusher, dating back to Dec. 4, 2016 when Thomas Rawls ran for 106 yards for Seattle.

That franchise-best streak was snapped when Tevin Coleman accumulated 107 rushing yards on 16 attempts.

Throughout the streak, Carolina limited such rushers as Ezekiel Elliott, Mark Ingram, Kenyan Drake, Jordan Howard, Devonte Freeman and LeSean McCoy to less than 100 yards rushing.

# MILESTONES IN REACH IN 2018

#### Team

- --The Panthers need seven wins to reach 200 wins in franchise history, including the postseason. Carolina is 193-193-1 all-time including the postseason.
- --Carolina has won six home games in a row dating back to last season. That streak is tied with the Vikings and Patriots and one game ahead of the Jaguars for longest active home win streak in the NFL.
- --The Panthers currently sport the NFL's longest consecutive game streak without overtime (43), dating back to Carolina's OT win over Indianapolis (11/12/15).
- --Carolina can become the only NFL team to rank in the top 10 in sacks six times in the last seven seasons.
- --Carolina can become one of just five teams to reach the playoffs in five of the last six seasons (if Seattle, Green Bay, Pittsburgh, and New England make the playoffs in 2018).

#### Ron Rivera

--Rivera needs nine regular-season wins to pass John Fox (73) for the most regular-season coaching wins in franchise history. In his eighth season with Carolina, Rivera has a 65-48-1 record.



#### Cam Newton

- --Newton needs nine total touchdowns to pass Brett Favre for third all-time through the first eight seasons of a career.
- --Newton needs 31 total touchdowns to pass Dan Marino for second all-time through the first eight seasons.
- --Newton needs 1,437 total yards to catch Dan Marino and 3,864 yards to catch Peyton Manning for most combined yards (passing

and rushing) after a quarterback's first eight seasons.

--Newton needs 509 rushing yards to pass Randall Cunningham for second all-time in rushing yards by a quarterback. He needs 62 rushing yards to pass Cunningham's mark for the most with a single team.



- --Newton needs 14 rushing first downs to pass Michael Vick for most rushing first downs by a quarterback in NFL history.
- --Newton can become the first QB in NFL history to rush for at least 700 yards in four seasons.
- --Newton needs three rushing touchdowns to tie Jonathan Stewart for second in total touchdowns in franchise history.
- --Newton needs six game-winning drives to tie Jake Delhomme for most in franchise history.

#### **Devin Funchess**

--Funchess needs 53 receiving yards to pass Donald Hayes for ninth place all-time in franchise history.

#### Christian McCaffrey

- --McCaffrey needs three receptions to pass Anthony Johnson for sixthmost receptions by a Panthers running back all-time.
- --McCaffrey needs 202 receiving yards to become just the fourth running back in franchise history with



1,000 receiving yards. He would become the 22nd player with 1,000 receiving yards in franchise history.

### **Julius Peppers**

- --Peppers needs six sacks to pass Kevin Greene for the third-most sacks in NFL history since it became a statistic in 1982.
- --Peppers needs four forced fumbles to pass Robert Mathis (52) for most forced fumbles since 2000.

#### Luke Kuechly

- --Kuechly needs five interceptions to become just the third line-backer in NFL history with 20 interceptions in his first seven seasons played.
- --Kuechly needs five takeaways for the most takeaways by an NFL linebacker in his first seven seasons played.
- --Kuechly needs 80 tackles (press box stats) to pass Patrick Willis (916) for the most tackles in an NFL player's first seven seasons.
- --Kuechly needs one tackle (coaches stats) to pass Mike Minter for second all-time in franchise history, and he needs 47 tackles (coaches stats) to



become the second player in franchise history with 1,000 career tackles.

#### Mario Addison

--Addison needs 4.0 sacks to pass Kevin Greene (41.5) for fourth place in franchise history in sacks.

#### Kawann Short

--Short needs 3.0 sacks to pass Greg Hardy (34.0) for sixth all-time in franchise history.

### SINGLE DIGITS FOR THE OPPONENTS

Carolina held Dallas to just eight points in the season opener, marking the second-straight season that Carolina has held an opponent to single digits in Week 1.

Since the start of the 2013 season, the Panthers defense has held opponents to single digits 11 times, a mark that ranks sixth in the NFL over that time span.

# EXPERIENCED AND STILL PRODUCTIVE

Panthers defensive end Julius Peppers is the longest tenured defensive player currently active in the NFL. He is followed by teammate by Mike Adams who is the third-longest on defense in terms of career games played.

With ages of 38 and 37, the two players rank first and second, respectively, as the oldest two defensive players still active.

SECONDARY - Mike Adams has the most career fumble recoveries (15) of any active defensive back in the NFL.

# 4 OF TOP 8 SACK ARTISTS IN LOCKER ROOM

Julius Peppers, Mario Addison, Kawann Short and Thomas Davis all rank in the top eight of the Panthers all-time sack leaders. Those four players currently account for 21.1 percent of all 900 sacks ever recorded in Panthers history. Since Peppers was drafted in 2002, the Panthers rank third in the NFL with 651 sacks.

# A RUNNING HISTORY

Since 2011, the year Carolina drafted Cam Newton, the Panthers rank second in the NFL in rushing yards with 15,024. Carolina also ranks second in rushing touchdowns since 2011 with 123, just one behind New England.

Carolina has boasted a top-10 rushing offense in six of the last seven seasons with Newton and head coach Ron Rivera.

### **CLOSE FINISHES**

In 2017, the Panthers finished 7-1 in games decided by seven or fewer points and 4-0 in games decided by three or fewer points in the regular season.

Seven wins by seven or fewer points were the second-most in the NFL in 2017 behind Pittsburgh's eight wins. It also marked the second-most single-touchdown margins in franchise history behind the 2003 season which featured 10 wins.

This season, Carolina is 0-1 in games decided by seven or fewer points, although the team won in Week 1 with an eight-point victory.

# DEFENSIVE LINE HAS BEEN DOMINANT

The Carolina Panthers sported a dominant and sometimes over-looked defensive line in the last six seasons under former defensive line coach Eric Washington. Washington was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2018, and he aims to work with his replacement, Brady Hoke, on maintaining that production.

Since 2012, no group of defensive linemen produced more sacks than Carolina's 224.0.

The 60 sacks in 2013 tied the Panthers franchise record set in 1996 and were the most by a team in a single season since San Diego had 61 in 2006.

The defensive line has not only been productive in getting to the quarterback, but also at stopping the run. Carolina's run defense has ranked in the top six in the NFL in four of the past seven years.

Carolina has allowed just 96.9 rushing yards per game in the past seven seasons, third in the NFL.

The recent crop of defensive lineman have accumulated a number of honors.

Since 2013, a Panthers defensive lineman has earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors five times. Hardy was recognized twice in 2013 (Week Three and Week Seventeen). Short and Lotulelei are the only defensive tackles in Panthers history to earn NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors as Short was recognized in Week Six of 2015 and Lotulelei received recognition in Week Eight of 2016. Peppers won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week Four of 2017.

Short also has two NFC Defensive Player of the Month awards on his resume, earning the recognition in October and December of 2015. Short is the first player in franchise history to win multiple Player of the Month Awards in a single season and the first defensive tackle in the NFL to win multiple Player of the Month Awards in a single season.

Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (161) and career rushing touchdowns (55). Newton is the first quarterback in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 37 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the most in NFL history.

Newton needs 1,437 total yards to catch Dan Marino and 3,864 yards to catch Peyton Manning for most combined yards after a quarterback's first eight seasons.

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004) and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals (2011-17), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first seven seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards AND 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

Newton has now rushed for at least 700 yards in three NFL seasons and joins Michael Vick (three) as the only quarterbacks with three 700-yard rushing seasons in a career.

# ALL-TIME RUNNING QUARTERBACK

Cam Newton has continued to move up the all-time ranks for total rushing yardage among all-time quarterbacks. Newton ranks third all-time in rush yards by a quarterback in NFL history.

Newton had more rushing yards than Michael Vick (3,954) through Vick's first seven seasons of his career. Newton needs 508 rushing yards to pass Randall Cunningham for second all-time.

Newton is the only quarterback in NFL history to rank in the top three in a franchise in rushing yards. Randall Cunningham tallied 4,482 rushing yards with Philadelphia, meaning Newton needs 63 rush yards for the most by a quarterback with a single team.

# THROWING IT SHORT

One of the points of emphasis under new offensive coordinator Norv Turner has been attempting and completing shorter passes from Cam Newton to running backs and receivers in order to get the ball out quicker.

According to the NFL's Next Gen stats, Newton's average intended air yards so far in 2018 is 6.6 yards with a completion percentage of 69.0.

In 2017, his average intended air yards were 8.2 with a completion percentage of 59.1. In 2016, the average was 11.0 with a completion percentage of 52.9.

# **NEWTON MOVES THE CHAINS**

Quarterback Cam Newton has been successful moving the chains with his legs since entering the NFL in 2011, with 330 of his 846 rushes going for first downs. The 39.0 rushing first down percentage is the top mark in the NFL during that time (min. 400 attempts).

He led the NFL in rushing first down percentage in each of his first five seasons with a career-high mark of 43.7 percent in 2014.

Newton's total 330 rushing first downs rank fifth in the NFL since 2011. He trails Michael Vick's 343 rushing first downs for most in NFL history by a quarterback.

# **NEWTON'S GAME-WINNING DRIVES**

Quarterback Cam Newton has led 15 career game-winning drives (defined as a drive that puts the team ahead for good in the fourth quarter or overtime).

Newton's three game-winning drives in 2017 were the third-most in a season in his career and tied for seventh-most in the NFL in 2017.

Jake Delhomme owns the franchise record with 21 game-winning drives.

### McCAFFREY RUNS

Running back Christian McCaffrey finished his rookie season with 435 rushing yards on 117 carries. He averaged 3.7 yards on the ground with two rushing touchdowns.

McCaffrey set a franchise record for most scrimmage yards by a Panthers rookie. He accumulated 1,086 yards from scrimmage, 78 more yards than Kelvin Benjamin's 1,008 scrimmage yards in 2014.

Among all-time Carolina Panthers rookies, McCaffrey finished third in all-purpose yards, finishing 131 yards behind DeAngelo Williams.

In 2018, McCaffrey has already shown an improvement in traditional running through the tackles after gaining 50 yards on 10 carries in Week 1.

According to NFL's Next Gen stats, McCaffrey's efficiency (a metric tracking yards gained against total yards traveled, wherein a low number begets more "north-south" running) in 2018 is 3.42, ranking 10th in the league. Last year, it was 4.63 which ranked 42nd.

# ANDERSON FRESH OFF 1,000

Running back C.J. Anderson comes to Carolina fresh off a 1,000-yard rushing season in Denver (1,007). He added 224 receiving yards to rank 12th in the NFL in yards from scrimmage by a running back (1,231).

Since entering the league as an undrafted free agent in 2013, Anderson has only lost three fumbles in 700 career carries, tying for fourth in the NFL in fewest fumbles since 2013 (min. 600 carries).

In two games with Carolina, Anderson has rushed for 66 yards on 10 carries, averaging 6.6 yards per carry. His Next Gen efficiency rating is 2.64, ranking first in the NFL for north-south running.

#### McCAFFREY CATCHES

Last season, McCaffrey finished as the franchise record-holder for most receptions (80), receiving yards (651) and receiving touchdowns (5) by a running back in a single season in 2017. He also set franchise records for most receptions by a rookie, scrimmage yards by a rookie (1,086), yards after catch by a rookie (593) and first downs by a rookie (57).

McCaffrey finished third in receiving yards by rookie Panthers, regardless of position.

In Week 2 of 2018 at Atlanta, McCaffrey tied Steve Smith's franchise record for most receptions in a game with 14. He also set a new career high with 102 yards receiving, the most by a running back in a game in franchise history. McCaffrey tied for the fourthmost receptions by a running back in a game in NFL history.

Barely into his second season, McCaffrey only needs 202 receiving yards to become the fourth 1,000-yard receiving running back in franchise history.

He has 45 receiving first downs which ties Alvin Kamara for the most by running backs over the last two seasons. He needs 19 receiving first downs to pass DeAngelo Williams for the most by a running back in franchise history.

# ARMAH'S UNDERDOG STORY

Panthers fullback Alex Armah was not seen as a lock for a 53-man roster, not to mention a starting fullback spot when he was drafted in 2017 out of Division II West Georgia, one of six D-II players drafted in 2017. However, he has solidified his position as the Panthers fullback despite not playing the position since high school.

At West Georgia, he became the first player in Gulf South conference history to earn All-Conference honors on both offense and defense as he played defensive end and tight end.

Armah scored his first career touchdown against Dallas in Week 1 on his first career rush. Armah became the second player in franchise history to score on his first career rush, joining Richie Brockel who did it against the Texans (12/18/11).





# OLSEN CLIMBING PANTHERS RANKS

Olsen is the Panthers all-time receiving yards leader among tight ends and the Panthers all-time receptions leader among tight ends. He holds the team's tight end record with nine 100-yard receiving games. He is second among Panthers tight ends in career touchdowns (33) behind Wesley Walls (44).

### TIGHT ENDS FROM DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS

Carolina's reserve tight ends Chris Manhertz and Ian Thomas are both physically gifted but come from relatively limited big-time college football experience.

Thomas was drafted by the Panthers in the fourth round of the 2018 Draft, despite only starting in one season at Indiana with 375 receiving yards in 2017. He had transferred from Nassau Community College where he was recruited for basketball.

Thomas earned his first career start in Week 2 at Atlanta as Greg Olsen was inactive with a foot injury. Thomas made two receptions for 10 yards.

Manhertz didn't play college football at all, signing as an undrafted free agent with the Bills after four seasons as a basketball player at Canisius, where he finished fourth in school history with 789 career rebounds.

Manhertz has played in 25 games with six starts over the last three seasons with Carolina.

# **NEW FACES IN RECEIVERS ROOM**

Carolina takes the field with a new-look receiving corps in 2018. Of the six receivers on the current active roster, only Devin Funchess was active during Carolina's Wild Card playoff game last January in New Orleans.

Carolina traded for Torrey Smith from Philadelphia, signed Jarius Wright as a free agent from Minnesota, drafted DJ Moore in the first round and returned Damiere Byrd and Curtis Samuel from injury.

### FUNCHESS MOVING UP CHARTS

Devin Funchess ranks 10th all-time in career receiving yards as a Panther as he enters his fourth season. He has 1,802 yards on 127 catches with 17 receiving touchdowns. He is seventh in receiving touchdowns and sixth in receiving average with 14.2 yards per reception (min. 100 catches).

He needs 53 receiving yards to pass Donald Hayes for ninth place all-time in franchise history.

# SMITH STRETCHES THE FIELD

New Panthers wideout Torrey Smith was brought to Carolina to help stretch the field as a legitimate deep threat. Since 2011 when he came into the league, Smith ranks third in average yards per catch at 16.3 (min. 200 receptions).

82 of Smith's 306 career receptions have gone for more than 20 yards (26.8 percent). This season, Smith has a long catch for 26 yards, while averaging 12.0 yards per reception with one touchdown.

### WRIGHT CLUTCH ON THIRD DOWN

Jarius Wright has made a living as a third-down clutch receiver. Since entering the league in 2012, he has made 161 receptions for 2,124 yards. Of his 161 receptions, 65 have come on third down (40.3 percent), with 47 going for first downs or touchdowns.

This season, Wright has made three of his eight catches on third down, all of which converted first downs. His first touchdown came on a third and goal play from the five-yard line.

# MOORE GOES ALL THE WAY ON FIRST CATCH

DJ Moore made the most of his first reception as a Panther in Week 2 at Atlanta. He took a 17-yard pass and then went another 34 yards after the catch for a 51-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. Moore was known for his ability after the catch at Maryland when Carolina drafted him in the first round in 2018.

Moore became the fourth Panther in franchise history to score a touchdown on his first career reception, joining Casey Crawford (Nov. 5, 2000), Jeff King (Dec. 24, 2006) and Dante Rosario (Dec. 2, 2007). None of the previous three players to do it had a touchdown longer than 16 yards.





# **KUECHLY LEADS ALL TACKLERS**

Since entering the NFL in 2012, press box crews have credited linebacker Luke Kuechly with 831 tackles, the most in the NFL.

Kuechly led the NFL in tackles in 2012 and 2014. In 2012, he became the first rookie since San Francisco's Patrick Willis in 2007 to lead the NFL in tackles.

Kuechly has the most tackles (press box) in NFL history over any player's first six seasons in the league.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 953 career tackles, tied with Mike Minter for second-most in team history.

In 2017, Kuechly had a team-high 134 tackles despite missing one game. He is the only player in franchise history with more than 100 tackles in each of his first six seasons as a Panther, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012.

Kuechly needs 47 tackles for 1,000 in his career (coaches film).

In 2017, Luke Kuechly grabbed three interceptions leading all Panthers and tying for first in the NFL in picks among linebackers. Kuechly added two opponent fumble recoveries for five total takeaways, tying for the most among linebackers in the NFL in 2017. Since entering the league in 2012, Luke Kuechly has tallied 15 interceptions, the most among NFL linebackers during that time.

Teammate Thomas Davis ranks behind only Kuechly during that time with 10.

# THOMPSON READY FOR HIS TURN

Shaq Thompson will get a chance to start in place of Thomas Davis for the first four games as Davis serves a suspension. A 2015 draft pick, Thompson has performed well in somewhat limited playing time.

Last season, Thompson ranked fourth on the team with 75 tackles and two sacks.

This season, Thompson has 14 total tackles with one sack and two quarterback pressures.







# PEPPERS MAKES HISTORY

Julius Peppers currently ranks fourth all-time in NFL history with 154.5 career sacks. He is Carolina's all-time leader in sacks with 92.0 of his career sacks coming as a Panther.

Peppers has at least seven sacks in 15 of his 16 NFL seasons. In 2017, he tied for the team lead with 11 sacks.

He has the most sacks of any active NFL player, and he is the only player in NFL history with 150 sacks and 10 or more interceptions.

Three of the top four sack artists in NFL history played for the Panthers at some point.

### **LONGEVITY**

Julius Peppers is the longest tenured and oldest active defensive player in the NFL, tallying 252 career games played in the regular season and another 18 career playoff games. He has also played in 161 consecutive games, tied with Brandon Carr for the most by any active defensive player.

Peppers is moving up the all-time charts for career games played by a defensive player (regular season). He is currently ranked eighth and just three games behind Charles Woodson. Jim Marshall holds the record for most career games by a defensive end with 282.

Addison has recorded 20.5 sacks over his last 25 games, dating back to a 2016 game at the Los Angeles Rams (11/6/16). He is third in the NFL in sacks over that span.

# **WELCOME POE**

The Panthers signed defensive tackle Dontari Poe this offseason and he will be a welcome addition. Since 2012 when Poe was drafted by Kansas City, he ranks ninth in the NFL in tackles (230) and sixth in pass deflections (14) by a defensive tackle.

Poe has also scored two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in his career. He is the heaviest lineman to ever throw a passing touchdown in NFL history.

# SHORT STANDS TALL AMONG SACK LEADERS

Defensive tackle Kawann Short led all Panthers defensive linemen with 53 tackles in 2017, accumulating 7.5 sacks. He also registered 29 QB pressures, second on the team, and had two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Short tied for second in the NFL in forced fumbles among defensive tackles in 2017, and he was third among defensive tackles in sacks.



Since the start of 2015, Short has 26.5 sacks, third in the NFL by a defensive tackle over the past four seasons.

# JACKSON GETS PANTHERS FIRST PICK

Rookie cornerback and second-round draft pick Donte Jackson started in his first career NFL game against the Cowboys. Jackson recorded five tackles and a pass breakup in his debut.

The Panthers have now had at least one draft pick start in Week 1 in every season under Ron Rivera, dating back to 2011. Jackson's secondary partner James Bradberry started in Week 1 in his rookie debut against the Broncos in 2016.

Jackson recorded his first career interception and the Panthers first interception of the season in Week 2 at Atlanta. It ties for the fastest first career interception after James Bradberry and Chris Gamble each had one in Week 2 of their rookie seasons.







### GANO MOVES UP PANTHERS SCORING LIST
