# CAROLINA PANTHERS (3-0) AT PITTSBURGH STEELERS (2-1)

## PANTHERS TRAVEL TO PITTSBURGH FOR FINAL PRESEASON GAME

### CAROLINA AT PITTSBURGH

Carolina travels to Pittsburgh for the fourth and final preseason game on Thursday. The Panthers have gone 3-0 in the preseason with wins over Buffalo, Miami and New England, while the Steelers have defeated Philadelphia and Tennessee while losing at Green Bay.

Last week against the Patriots, Carolina's defense held Tom Brady and the New England offense out of the end zone for the first half, while the Panthers were able to string together a number of long drives.

Newton finished at 11-of-17 for 141 yards while Christian McCaffrey had 12 carries and two receptions.

Carolina has started 3-0 in the preseason for the first time since 2006 and only the fourth time in franchise history.

The Panthers are playing the same preseason schedule that they played in 2015, a year that Carolina went 15-1 and advanced to Super Bowl 50. Carolina went 3-1 in the preseason that year.

Carolina enters 2018 after an 11-5 season and a playoff berth as a five seed in the NFC playoffs. The Panthers advanced to the postseason for the fourth time in five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span.

This season, the Panthers welcome a number of new weapons, especially on the offensive side of the ball. Carolina drafted DJ Moore, the first wide receiver taken in the 2018 NFL Draft. They also added veterans Torrey Smith and Jarius Wright to the receiver room. The Panthers also signed running back C.J. Anderson who is fresh off his first career 1,000-yard rushing season in Denver.

Defensively, the Panthers drafted cornerback Donte Jackson in the second and safety Rashaan Gaulden in the third round. They signed defensive tackle Dontari Poe to replace free agent departure Star Lotulelei and safety Da'Norris Searcy after the free agent departure of Kurt Coleman.

### THE SERIES

The Panthers conclude the preseason Thursday against the Pittsburgh Steelers, the Panthers' most common preseason opponent. The Panthers and Steelers are matching up for the 16th consecutive year in the finale and the 20th time in 24 seasons overall. The only preseasons in which the teams haven't played are 1995, 1996, 2001 and 2002. Pittsburgh leads the preseason series 11-8. The teams have met six times in the regular season with the Steelers holding a 5-1 edge. The teams last met in the regular season in 2014 in Carolina.

### Ron RIVERA

NFL: 22nd season Panthers: 8th season

**Regular Season:** 64-47-1 (.576)

**Postseason:** 3-4 (.429)

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In seven seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. The Panthers have advanced to the playoffs in four of the last five seasons, tied for the most in the NFC over that span. Rivera is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance since 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

With 64 career regular season wins, Rivera is 10 wins away from becoming the Panthers all-time winningest coach, surpassing John Fox.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children — Christopher and Courtney.

#### Mike TOMLIN

NFL: 18th season Steelers: 12th season

**Regular Season:** 116-60 (.659)

**Postseason:** 8-7 (.533)

Mike Tomlin was named the sixteenth head coach in Steelers history on January 22, 2007.

Tomlin became the youngest coach (36 years, 323 days) in NFL history to win a Super Bowl when the Steelers defeated the Arizona Cardinals, 27-23, in Super Bowl XLIII on February 1, 2009. Tomlin reached the playoffs four times in his first five seasons and he is the only coach in Steelers' history to win division titles in each of his first two seasons. In 2017, Tomlin guided the Steelers to the AFC North division title for the sixth time in his 11-year reign. Pittsburgh has reached the postseason eight times under Tomlin's leadership, including each of the past four seasons. In 2010, Tomlin's club won its third division title in in a four-year span. The 2008 season culminated with a Super Bowl triumph, making Tomlin one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach. In his first season, Tomlin guided the Steelers to a 10-6 record and their first AFC North title since 2004.

Tomlin was the Minnesota Vikings defensive coordinator in 2006 after spending the previous five seasons (2001-05) as defensive backs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In Super Bowl XXXVII, the secondary recorded four interceptions, returning two for touchdowns to help capture the franchise's first Super Bowl title.

Tomlin served two seasons as the defensive backs coach at the University of Cincinnati (1999-2000) before going to Tampa Bay. Prior to joining the Cincinnati staff, Tomlin had a short stint on the coaching staff at Tennessee-Martin and then spent two seasons at Arkansas State. He spent the 1996 season as a graduate assistant at Memphis. Tomlin began his coaching career in 1995 as wide receivers coach at Virginia Military Institute.

A three-year starter at wide receiver at William & Mary (1990-94), Tomlin finished his career with a school-record 20 touchdown receptions. Tomlin graduated in 1994 with a degree in sociology.

Born in Hampton, Va., on March 15, 1972, Tomlin and his wife, Kiya, have two sons, Dino and Mason, and a daughter Harlyn Quinn.

In the final week of the preseason, Carolina travels to Pittsburgh, Atlanta hosts Miami, Tampa Bay hosts Jacksonville and New Orleans hosts the Rams.

Last season, the NFC South boasted three playoff teams for the first time in its history. It was just the sixth time since 2002 that a division sported three teams with more than 10 wins. The division's 37 combined wins were the most by any division in 2017.

### RUNNING HARD VS. MIAMI

The Panthers rushed for 226 yards against the Dolphins in the second week of the preseason. That number tied the output against Pittsburgh in 2015 for the most preseason rushing yards in a game since 2008. It also represents the most in a preseason game this season.

Christian McCaffrey ran for 92 yards on five carries, including a 71-yard touchdown run. It was the third-highest rushing game by an individual this preseason, and the 71-yard run was the longest in the preseason so far. Last season, McCaffrey's highest single-game rush total was 66 yards against Atlanta (11/5/17).

Offseason signees Kenjon Barner and C.J. Anderson ran for 72 yards and 39 yards respectively. Barner had two runs for over 20 yards, while Anderson had two runs over 10 yards.

#### **PUNCHING IT IN THE ENDZONE**

The Panthers offense has been effective in scoring touchdowns rather than field goals this preseason. Through three games, Carolina has scored 10 offensive touchdowns, the most in the NFL through three games.

The Panthers have converted touchdowns on six of eight chances in the red zone, despite missing two in the first half against New England. That mark ranks third in the NFL preseason.

### PANTHERS DEFENSE HOLDS STRONG

The Panthers defense stepped up when backed against the wall against the Dolphins. Miami had four red zone opportunities and only managed one touchdown which came in the final minute.

The trend continued against the Patriots as New England only scored one touchdown on two red zone trips.

Carolina's defense has allowed a 40 percent (4-of-10) red zone conversion rate, tying for sixth in the NFL. Carolina's five offensive touchdowns allowed ties for eighth in the league.

### **NEWTON COMPLETING MORE**

Cam Newton has posted a 68.4 completion rate through three games, going 26-for-38 with 315 yards passing, 1 TD, 1 INT and a 91.4 passer rating.

Through three games, Newton's completion rate ranks as his highest through eight preseasons (barring 2017 when he only attempted two passes in one game).

#### SAMUEL RETURNS

Curtis Samuel played in his first action back at Bank of America Stadium against the same team (Dolphins) against whom he suffered a season-ending ankle injury in November of his rookie season.

Samuel had a game-high 65 yards receiving on two catches, one for 39 yards and another for 26 yards. One catch got Carolina away from its own endzone and the other set up a touchdown in the red zone.

A week later against New England, Samuel again led the team with three catches for 58 yards receiving.

Through three games, Samuel is Carolina's leading receiver with 166 yards receiving on nine catches. His 18.4 yards per catch ranks sixth in the NFL this preseason.







### 2018 NFL DRAFT CHOICES

#### WR DJ Moore, Maryland

1st Round, 24th overall

Moore finished fifth in Maryland history in receptions (146), sixth in receiving yards (2,027) and fourth in touchdown receptions (17). In 2017, he earned Phil Steele All-America Second Team honors and was the Big Ten Receiver of the Year and All-Big Ten First Team selection. Moore set a Maryland record with 80 receptions last season while accumulating 1,033 receiving yards, good for third in Maryland history.

#### CB Donte Jackson, LSU

2nd round, 55th overall

A two-sport athlete at LSU who posted top times in the SEC in the sprint events, Jackson was an All-America Second Team selection last season, making 51 tackles, a sack, an interception and 10 pass breakups. He ran a 4.32 in the 40 at the combine, tying for the fastest time last year.

#### S Rashaan Gaulden, Tennessee

3rd Round, 85th overall

Gaulden recorded 65 tackles and tied for fourth in the SEC with three forced fumbles in 2017. He finished his career with 140 total tackles, including 9.5 tackles for loss, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and one interception.

#### TE 🛮 Ian Thomas, Indiana

4th round, 101st overall

Thomas arrived at Indiana in 2016 after spending time at Nassau Community College on Long Island in New York. He was an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honoree, finishing second among Big Ten tight ends with 15.0 yards per reception (ranking 4th nationally) and tied for third among tight ends in the conference with five receiving touchdowns.

### DE Marquis Haynes, Ole Miss

Round 4, 136th overall

Marquis Haynes comes to Carolina after a decorated career at Ole Miss where he played four full seasons. He finished his career after becoming the modern-era career sacks leader with 32 career sacks. He also holds the modern-era career tackles for loss record with 47.5. In 2017, Haynes earned All-SEC Second Team accolades and participated in the Senior Bowl. On the season, he tallied 45 tackles, including 7.5 sacks which ranked fifth in the SEC.

#### LB Jermaine Carter, Jr., Maryland

Round 5, 161st overall

Carter compiled 337 career tackles with 9.5 sacks and one interception which he returned for a touchdown. Between 2015-17, he led the team in tackles over three consecutive seasons, becoming just the fifth Maryland player since 1969 to achieve the feat.

#### LB Andre Smith, North Carolina

Round 7, 234th overall

Smith tallied 187 tackles in his three seasons at North Carolina. He also notched two sacks and two interceptions with five pass breakups and two forced fumbles in his career. In 2017, he tallied 21 tackles and had a 73-yard interception return in the opening week against Cal, but then suffered a season-ending injury against in Week 2 against Louisville. In 2016, he tallied 113 tackles, which ranked second on the team and ranked seventh in the ACC in tackles per game.

#### DT Kendrick Norton, Miami

Round 7, 242nd overall

Norton compiled 84 tackles, 18.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks in his three seasons at Miami. In 2017, he earned All-ACC Honorable Mention accolades while finishing with 26 tackles and 6.5 tackles for loss with two sacks. In 2016, he was named All-ACC Third Team as he ranked seventh on the team and second among defensive linemen with 39 tackles.

### KEY PLAYER ACQUISITIONS

#### RB C.J. Anderson - Free Agent (Denver)

Anderson comes to Carolina fresh off the heels of a 1,000-yard rushing season in Denver last fall. Last season, he rushed for 1,007 yards, ranking ninth in the NFL. He tallied 3,051 rushing and 20 touchdowns in five season with Denver. He ran for 90 yards and a touchdown in a Super Bowl 50 win against Carolina. Anderson has only lost three fumbles in 693 career carries, tying for third in the NFL in fewest fumbles since 2013 (min. 600 carries).

#### DT Dontari Poe - Unrestricted Free Agent (Atlanta)

Carolina's front seven on defense has remained one of the team's greatest strengths in recent years. The Panthers looks to continue that trend in 2018 after signing defensive tackle Dontari Poe. A two-time Pro Bowler, Poe brings size, strength and a wealth of experience to the interior of the defensive line. Originally the 11th overall pick in the 2012 Draft, he has racked up 239 tackles, 15.5 sacks, 14 pass deflections and two forced fumbles in his career. Poe has also recorded three career touchdowns on offense, rushing for two scores and passing for one.

#### S Da'Norris Searcy - Unrestricted Free Agent (Tennessee)

The Panthers added the former North Carolina Tar Heel this offseason to shore up a defensive secondary. Searcy played safety for the Tennessee Titans for the last three seasons (2015-17) after spending his first four years in the league with the Buffalo Bills (2011-14). Since entering the NFL, he has recorded 330 tackles, 26 passes

defensed, 4.5 sacks and eight interceptions.

#### WR Torrey Smith - Traded from Philadelphia

Wide receiver Torrey Smith provides a new weapon for quarterback Cam Newton to utilize in the passing game. Since 2011, Smith ranks third in the NFL in yards per reception (min. 200 receptions), averaging 16.6 yards per catch. He has tallied 302 receptions for 4,951 yards and 39 touchdowns over his seven-year career. Originally a second round draft pick in 2011 by Baltimore, Smith has since spent time with San Francisco (2015-16) and Philadelphia (2017), earning two Super Bowl championships along the way.

#### WR Jarius Wright - Unrestricted Free Agent (Minnesota)

Jarius Wright comes to Carolina after spending the first six seasons of his career with Minnesota. The former Viking will reunite with Norv Turner, Carolina's new offensive coordinator, after spending three seasons (2014-16) with Turner in Minnesota. Wright has a knack for being a reliable third-down receiver with over 40 percent of his career receptions coming on third-down. Since entering the league in 2011, he has tallied 153 total catches for 2,039 yards and 10 touchdowns.

### **2018 SCHEDULE NOTES**

In addition to home and away games against NFC South foes Atlanta, New Orleans and Tampa Bay, Carolina will play all four teams from both the NFC East and the AFC North. The Panthers' remaining two intra-conference opponents were based on the 2017 standings. Carolina will host Seattle and play at Detroit after all three teams finished second in their respective divisions.

A few notes on Carolina's 2018 opponents:

- The Panthers will play six games against teams that qualified for the playoffs, including a road game at Super Bowl champion Philadelphia. It marks the third consecutive year that Carolina plays a road game at the Super Bowl champion. The Panthers have faced the NFC Champion in every season since 2008.
- The 2017 combined record of the opponents for Carolina's 16 games is 131-125, a .511 winning percentage.
- Since divisional realignment 2002, the Panthers are 15-17 against the NFC East and 6-9-1 against the AFC North.
- The NFC South featured three teams in the 2017 playoffs for the first time in its history. The division's 37 wins led all divisions in the NFL in 2017. It marked the sixth time since 2002 that a division sported three teams with 10 or more wins.
- Carolina is set to face off against Seattle for the ninth time since the 2010 season, with two of those meetings coming in the postseason. Carolina is 4-8 all-time against Seattle, but has won two of the last three.
- The Panthers are 5-1 against Washington since divisional realignment in 2002.
- Carolina will be looking for its first road victory in franchise history at Pittsburgh. The Panthers are 1-5 all-time against the Steelers with the only win coming at home in 1996.
- After playing six games on the West Coast in the last three seasons, Carolina will not travel west in the regular season in 2018. The Panthers will travel a total of 6,938 miles in 2018, the fewest in the NFL in 2018 and the fewest in franchise history.
- Carolina is 46-41 all-time at home and 37-49 all-time on the road.

### FRANCHISE RECORD WITH NO 100-YARD RUSHERS

Carolina was the only team in the NFL to not allow an individual 100-yard rusher in any game in 2017.

The Panthers set a franchise record by going 20 consecutive games without allowing a 100-yard individual rusher, the longest active streak in the NFL. The team's previous 17-game record was set over the course of the 2001 and 2002 seasons.

The Panthers have not given up 100 yards rushing to a single player since Dec. 4, 2016 (20 games) against Seattle when Thomas Rawls went for 106 yards.

The Panthers held a number of the League's top rushers under their season average in the regular season and one playoff game. Against team's top rushing threats, Carolina held individuals a cumulative 167.5 yards under their season averages, or 9.8 yards under per game.

#### SECOND-MOST INTERCEPTIONS AND TAKEAWAYS

Since 2015, the Panthers defense has recorded 51 interceptions, the second-most in the NFL.

### OPPORTUNITY TO START FAST

Carolina will open the 2018 regular season at home against Dallas. It marks just the third time since 2006 that Carolina will play at home during Week 1.

This season, Carolina will play three of its first four games at home, marking the first time that has happened since 2005.

Fast starts have been key for the Panthers, especially in recent years. Carolina went 3-1 and 4-0 in the first four games in 2017 and 2015, both playoff seasons.

Since the 1995 inaugural season, the Panthers have a combined record of 22-10 (.688) in the first four games in playoff seasons and 17-43 (.283) in the first four games in non-playoff seasons.

Carolina has only made the playoffs once (2013) when starting 1-3 or worse, and only missed the playoffs once when starting 3-1 (2002) or better.

For the first time in franchise history, Carolina put together two fourth quarter drives that eclipsed 8 minutes in the same season. Carolina's 8:48 drive in Week One at San Francisco (9/10/17) was the longest drive to end a game in franchise history. Carolina then produced a 8:34 drive in the fourth quarter in Week Two vs. Buffalo (9/17/17).

Carolina posted four drives over six minutes in the game at Chicago, a season high. The Panthers led the NFL in drives lasting over six minutes with 19.

In 2017, the Panthers finished 7-1 in games decided by seven or fewer points and 4-0 in games decided by three or fewer points in the regular season.

### **DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK**

Quarterback Cam Newton had 28 total touchdowns (22 passing, six rushing) in 2017, pushing his career total to 212. The 212 touchdowns finished as the third-most total touchdowns in NFL history through a quarterback's first seven seasons.

As Newton enters his eighth season, he needs 13 total touchdowns to pass Brett Favre's total through his first eight seasons, which would rank third all-time.

Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (158) and career rushing touchdowns (54). Newton is the first quarterback in NFL history with at least 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 37 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the most in NFL history.

As he enters his eighth season, Newton needs 2,033 total yards to catch Dan Marino and 4,460 yards to catch Peyton Manning for most combined yards after a quarterback's first eight seasons.

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts (1998-2004) and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals (2011-17), to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first seven seasons.

He has recorded six seasons of at least 3,000 passing yards and 500 rushing yards, the most in NFL history.

Newton has now rushed for at least 700 yards in three NFL seasons and joins Michael Vick (three) as the only quarterbacks with three 700-yard rushing seasons in a career.

### RUNNING AND RUNNING AND RUNNING

In 2017, Cam Newton rushed for 754 yards on 139 attempts for a rushing average of 5.42 per carry. He set new career highs in rushing yards and rush attempts.

It marked the second time in his career that he led the team in rushing after posting a team-best 741 rushing yards in 2012.

Newton had two rushes over 60 yards in 2017: a 69-yarder against Miami (11/13) and a 62-yarder against Minnesota (12/10). He is the only quarterback in NFL history with two runs over 60 yards in the same season.

Newton tallied six rushing touchdowns, becoming the only player with at least five rushing touchdowns in all seven seasons since 2011, and the first player since Adrian Peterson (2007-13) with a seven-year streak of five rushing touchdowns each season.

Newton led all quarterbacks in terms of rushing yardage (754), longest rush (69), rushing attempts (139), rushing first downs (46) and tied for first in rushing touchdowns (6).



Julius Peppers currently ranks fourth all-time in NFL history with 154.5 career sacks. He is Carolina's all-time leader in sacks with 92.0 of his career sacks coming as a Panther.

Peppers has at least seven sacks in 15 of his 16 NFL seasons. In 2017, he tied for the team lead with 11 sacks.

He has the most sacks of any active NFL player, and he is the only player in NFL history with 150 sacks and 10 or more interceptions.

Three of the top four sack artists in NFL history played for the Panthers at some point.


