NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (4-11) AT BUFFALO BILLS (9-6) Sunday, December 31, 2023 • Highmark Stadium (71,621) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will travel to Buffalo for their final road trip of the season. Following the Bills game, the Patriots will close out the season at home against the New York Jets. The Patriots beat Buffalo, 29-25, at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 22 in the first meeting of the 2023 season and will be looking for a series sweep of the Bills for the first time since the 2019 season.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by **CBS** and can be seen locally on **WBZ-TV** Channel 4. **Kevin Harlan** will handle play-by-play duties with **Trent Green** as the color analyst. **Melanie Collins** will provide analysis from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Ken Mack** and directed by **Jim Cornell**.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 33 stations can be found in the press release on page 63. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by **Marc Cappello**.

RYLAND CONNECTS FROM 56

Rookie K Chad Ryland connected on a career-long 56-yard field goal with seven seconds to play to give the Patriots a 26-23 lead. His previous best was a 51-yard field goal at the New York Jets on Sept. 24. It is the fifth-longest field goal in team history.

SERIES HISTORY





New England and Buffalo will meet for the second of two contests in 2023 this week in Buffalo. The Patriots took the first meeting at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 22 with a 29-25 victory. The Patriots will be looking for their first season sweep of the annual series since the 2019 season and the 28th series sweep overall.

This week's game will be the 129th meeting between the two teams. New England holds a 78-49-1 edge in the series and has won 37 of the last 47 regular season games between the clubs, dating back to 2000.

The Patriots are 38-25-1 all-time in games played in Buffalo, including a 31-19 record at Highmark Stadium.

The series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. The Patriots 78 wins over the Bills are their highest victory total over any opponent, four higher than their next highest win total against the New York Jets (74).

After seven straight series sweeps and 15 consecutive Patriots wins from 2003-10, Buffalo ended the streak with a 34-31 victory at Ralph Wilson Stadium in the first meeting between the teams in 2011. The 15-game win streak is tied for the longest streak over a single opponent in team history with 15 straight wins over the New York Jets.

The teams have had many memorable matchups over the years, including a span from 1999 to 2001, where four-of-five contests were decided in overtime.

The Buffalo Bills snapped a streak of 13 straight road losses to the Patriots, including 12 straight wins by the Patriots at Gillette Stadium, with their 17-9 win in the 2014 regular season finale on Dec. 28, 2014.

Bill Belichick has a 104-42 (.712) all-time regular season record against the AFC East as head coach of the Patriots.

STREAKING SUCCESS

The Patriots won 15 straight games against the Buffalo Bills from 2003 through 2010, tied for the fifth-longest winning streak over a single opponent in NFL history.



STOPPING THE RUN

- The Patriots have held their opponents to under 3.0 yards per carry (ypc) six times in 2023. The team record for most games in a season holding the opponent under 3 yards per carry is eight in 1961 and 1968. The Patriots can match that total if they hold Buffalo and the Jets under 3 yards per carry in the final two games of the 2023 season.
- The Patriots enter this week leading the NFL, allowing just 3.2-yards per rush. If that pace holds, it will be the lowest by a team since the 2014 Detroit Lions when they allowed 3.17 yards per rush. Since the 1970 merger, only 23 teams have held their opponent to a 3.2-yards per rush or less. If the Patriots hold, it will be the lowest in team history since the 1970 merger. The current best is 3.4-yard per carry by the 1974 team.
- The Patriots defense is second in the NFL in 2023 to Chicago (80.7 yards per game), allowing 84.8 yards rushing per game. If that holds it will be the third time in team history since the 1970 merger that the Patriots have finished a season allowing under 90 yards rushing per game. The 84.9 yards rushing per game if it holds will be the lowest in team history since the merger. The Patriots allowed a team-best 88.6 yards rushing per game in 2016 and 89.6 yards rushing per game in 2003.

Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (353), division titles (19), winning percentage (.666), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (22).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 30th season of ownership, he is credited with transforming one of the league's least successful clubs into one of the most valuable. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a champi-



onship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (24) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's first 29 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 22 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the mark. KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 353 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 353-177 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver and Pittsburgh have played in eight.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Dallas, Pittsburgh, Green Bay and San Francisco are second with 36 playoff wins all-time.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, behind San Francisco (18) and the Pittsburgh (16).
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds, trailing only San Francisco (9) and Denver (8) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since 1990. Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with nine byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 59 postseason games, tied with San Francisco for the fourth-most in NFL history behind Dallas (66), Pittsburgh (63) and Green Bay (61).
- The Patriots are second with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 14 seasons with 12 victories.
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 10
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- New England has 28 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Green Bay is second with 21 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 35 winning seasons since 1970, third all-time, behind Pittsburgh's 39 and Dallas' 36.



- The Patriots have 578 total victories, the fourth-most wins since their inception in 1960, behind the 596 wins by Dallas, 594 by Pittsburgh and the 582 by Green Bay.
- New England (1,040) played their 1,000th game in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021, and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- The Patriots ended a 10-year streak of finishing in the top 10 for fewest points allowed (2012-2021) after finishing 11th in 2022 with 20.4 points allowed. The Patriots and Tampa Bay (1996-2005) are the last two teams to reach 10 straight seasons in the top 10 for fewest points allowed.
- The Patriots have finished with a positive turnover ratio for 17 straight seasons (2006-22), the longest streak since the 1970 merger. Seattle is second with 12 straight seasons with a positive turnover ratio.
- The Patriots are ranked 8th in defense. The Patriots have finished in the top 10 in defense 10 times under Bill Belichick.



Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win six Super Bowl titles. He won more games overall (141) during a 10-year stretch (2010-19) than any other coach in NFL history. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the only one since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 49 consecutive years as an NFL coach are most in NFL history. The only other NFL coaches with at least 40 consecutive NFL coaching seasons are Dick LeBeau (45) and Tom Moore (41).

JONES SETS CAREER-HIGH WITH 382 YARDS PASSING

Jones set a career-high with 382 yards passing at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022, for his second 300-yard game of the 2022 season. Jones' previous best was 321 yards vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. Jones finished 28-of-39 (.718) for 382 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 119.8 against the Vikings.

JuJu Smith-Schuster wears No. 7 for more than just luck. "It kind of represents a lot of things, my mom's favorite number is seven," Smith-Schuster said. "She had seven kids, lucky No. 7, one of my favorite football players in soccer wears No. 7, Vinicius Jr., year seven [in the NFL]. So, it was kind of a number that I picked that represented a lot of things." The number has additional meaning in the 2023 season for the wide receiver with it being his seventh year in the league.





NOTES OF INTEREST

- RB Rhamondre Stevenson recorded his first 1,000-yard rushing season with a career-high 1,040 rushing yards in 2022. He can become the third New England player with back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons in 2023, joining Curtis Martin (1,487 in 1995, 1,152 in 1996 and 1,160 in 1997) and Jim Nance (1,458 in 1966 and 1,216 in 1967). He has 619 yards rushing in 2023 and needs 381 yards to reach 1,000 yards.
- Stevenson became the ninth New England running back to lead the team in receptions after finishing with 69 in 2022. He can become the first New England running back to lead the team in two consecutive seasons in 2023.

DEDICATION TO HIS GOALS

• While in high school, Stevenson started gaining attention for the impressive stats he posted as a junior. Unfortunately, due to his grades, Stevenson was academically ineligible to receive a football scholarship despite being recruited. Following his senior year of high school, Stevenson took a year off from football and worked part-time jobs at Wal-Mart and Jimmy John's. But after a year away, he decided to follow a group of his friends and enroll in Cerritos Community College. During his time at Cerritos, he shared a two-bedroom apartment with up to six other guys at times and rode his bicycle 20 minutes to and from practice every day. After putting up monster stats in his second season at Cerriots, he committed to Oklahoma. Oklahoma led him to the 2021 NFL Draft where in the fourth round on the third day the Patriots selected Stevenson. In addition, he worked on his academics and made the Dean's List while at Oklahoma.

STEVENSON RECORDS FIRST RECEIVING TOUCHDOWN

 Stevenson had his first career touchdown reception on a 3-yard pass from QB Mac Jones in the second quarter vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6 2022.

CAREER HIGHS IN RECEPTIONS AND RECEIVING YARDS

Stevenson set career highs in receptions and receiving yards after finishing with nine receptions for 76 yards at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022. His previous high in receptions was eight vs. Chicago on Oct. 24, 2022, and his previous high in receiving yards was 72 yards on Oct. 30, 2022, at the New York Jets.

STEVENSON HAS CAREER LONG RUN

• Stevenson had a career-long 64-yard touchdown run in the second quarter vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023. His previous long was a 49-yard run vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022, and his previous longest touchdown run was a 34-yard touchdown run at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It is the longest touchdown run for a Patriots player since RB Damien Harris had a 64-yard touchdown run at Buffalo on Dec. 6, 2022. STEVENSON HAS FOURTH CAREER 100-YARD GAME

FROM HOUSTON BAPTIST, TO WESTERN KENTUCKY, TO NEW ENGLAND

 QB Bailey Zappe played his first four college seasons at Houston Baptist before playing at Western Kentucky in 2021. While at Western Kentucky, Zappe set new all-time single season FBS records with 5,987 yards and 62 touchdown passes, breaking the record held by Texas Tech's B.J. Symons (5,833 in 2013) and Joe Burrow (60 touchdown passes in 2019).

BAILEY ZAPPE THROWS FOR OVER 300 YARDS

• Zappe made his second straight start of the season at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022, and finished 24-of-34 for 309 yards with two touchdown passes en route to a 38-15 victory. He became the first Patriots rookie quarterback to win in his first home and first road game after starting in the 29-0 victory at home against Detroit on Oct. 9. Zappe had a passer rating of 118.4 against the Browns. He is the first rookie quarterback to win and record a 100-plus passer rating in his first two starts since Sonny Jurgensen in 1957. Zappe had a passer rating of 100 in his first start against the Lions.





PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER RICHARD SEYMOUR SEES GREATNESS AHEAD FOR CHRISTIAN BARMORE

- For a defensive lineman, if Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Richard Seymour is in your corner, there are few better compliments or endorsements
- "I think he has a ton of ability, natural ability, and he plays hard," Seymour told the Boston Herald. "I think he's going to be a problem for (opposing teams) for a long time to come. Hopefully he stays healthy and continues on the path he's on. I think he has a really bright future."

SECOND-MOST QUARTERBACK PRESSURES

 Barmore posted the second-most quarterback pressures for a first-year defensive tackle since 2006, according to Pro Football Focus. His 48 pressures in 2021 were two more than Aaron Donald had during his rookie season.

Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on couches and floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

DB Kyle Dugger scored three touchdowns in 2022 with two interceptions and a fumble returned for touchdowns. He needs one more defensive touchdown to tie Willie McGinest and Tedy Bruschi for the second-most defensive touchdowns in team history with four. Ty Law has the most defensive touchdowns with six.

DUGGER PLAYS ROLE IN FOUR OF THE 7 DEFENSIVE TDS

 Dugger played a major role in four of the NFL-best seven defensive touchdowns in 2022. In addition to his pick-6 against Miami, he returned an interception 16 yards for a touchdown at Las Vegas, returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit and forced a fumble that LB Raekwon McMillan returned 23 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter at Arizona (12/12).

DUGGER EARNS HIS DEGREE

- LB Matthew Judon led the team with a career-high 15½ sacks in 2022 following a team-leading 12½ sacks in 2021. He can join Tony McGee (12 in 1977, 11½ in 1978 and 10½ in 1979) as the only Patriots player with three straight double-digit sack seasons.
- Judon registered 28 total sacks in the last two seasons (15½ in 2022 and 12½ in 2021).

2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

THE RISE OF THE GREEN GOBLIN

- DB Jalen Mills has embraced his nickname "The Green Goblin." The
 origins of the nickname started out as a joke during his rookie season
 with Philadelphia when he dyed his hair green. Mills is not sure whether it was a coach or the media, but the spiderman villain nickname
 stuck.
- Said Mills, "It just kind of came from my rookie year and then just throughout my years playing for the Eagles, my style of play. That's what I get it from. It's kind of something that I stuck with."

A NUMBER CHANGE WITH A STORY

Late in the Eagles' eventual Super Bowl-winning season, Jalen's Uncle Uhkoto lost his battle with cancer. The once-close relatives had long since drifted apart and fallen out of touch. As a result, only in the wake of Uhkoto's death did Jalen learn that his uncle – a man who otherwise shunned sports – could quote his nephew's NFL statistics chapter and verse: every pass breakup, every interception, every tackle, every game, Uhkoto was keeping track of Jalen. The discovery left him with a heavy heart.

.; "It kind of broke me down," Jalen revealed, "because we had grown apart. We were close at one point in time. It took that moment for me to realize, this is a man I looked up to as a younger kid, and now he was looking up to me, keeping up with sports that he didn't even care about. So, I wanted to honor him in my own quiet way."

In 2021, Mills got that opportunity. After signing his free-agent contract with New England, Jalen learned that the NFL would relax its jersey number restrictions, allowing certain positions beyond kickers, punters and quarterbacks to wear single-digits on their uniforms.

Mills, who wore 31 and 21 at times as an Eagle, chose No. 2 in New England. Almost no one ever called Uhkoto – pronounced uh-COO-too – by his full name. They preferred his shortened nickname: Two.



VERSATILITY

- "I'm one of the guys that when you ask me what position I play, I say 'defense.' I want to be able to line up everywhere, and most importantly, I want to be able to produce everywhere."
- Began his career in 2014 in San Diego focusing on special teams and was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2018 as a special teamer. His 2018 Pro Bowl berth was the only one that Matthew Slater did not get voted to from 2011-2021.
- Started all 16 games at safety in 2020 for the Patriots and led the team in tackles with a career-high 107.



ASK AND JAHLANI RECEIVED

LB Jahlani Tavai starred in high school as a nose guard. He was undersized and did not attract the attention of many colleges. But after finding out one of the English teachers at his high school was the son of then-Hawaii coach Norm Chow, he reached out to the teacher, Cameron Chow, and asked if Cameron could tell his dad to scout his tape. Cameron followed up and passed along Jahlani's tape to his dad, and the very next day Jahlani had a scholarship offer. According to Jahlani, his football career would have been over after high school if it wasn't for this connection.

CAREER-HIGH THREE SACKS

Uche registered a career-high three sacks after dropping Indianapolis QB Sam Ehlinger (11/6/22) for a 2-yard loss and an 8-yard loss in the second quarter and a 1-yard sack in the third quarter. He has three career games with at least two sacks. He had his first two-sack game after registering two fourth quarter sacks at the New York Jets on Sept. 19, 2021, and also had two sacks vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022.

UCHE HAD TWO 3-SACK GAMES IN 2022

 Uche had his second 3-sack game of the 2022 season at Arizona on Dec. 12. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts. Uche also had three sacks at the New York Jets on Oct. 30.  Deatrich Wise Jr. has been named a team captain for the last two seasons.

DEATRICH WISE JR. RECORDS THREE SACKS VS. BALTIMORE

- Wise had his first career three-sack game after a 3-yard sack in the first quarter, an 8-yard sack and a 1-yard sack in the second quarter vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. His previous best was 1½ sacks, which he accomplished three times vs. Buffalo (12/24/17), vs. Houston (9/9/18) and vs. Cleveland (11/14/21).
- Wise is the fifth Patriots player to register three sacks in a half. DL Henry Thomas had three sacks in the first half at St. Louis on Dec. 13, 1998. LB Tully Banta-Cain had three sacks in the second half at Buffalo on Dec. 20, 2009, DL Jarvis Green had three sacks in the second half at Cincinnati on Oct. 1, 2006, and Josh Uche at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022.

• Wise was honored with the 2022 Ron Burton Community Service Award at the Patriots Premiere last September for his dedication to serving his community. After receiving the award, Wise said, "You don't go out in the community for the gratification. You just do it because it's in your heart to do. It's an honor to win an award of this prestige and to be in the same group as everybody who's won that before and have my name with the Burton family."







FROM WALK-ON TO ALL-AMERICAN

Bryce Baringer had an unconventional path to the NFL. He began his collegiate career by earning a walk-on spot at Illinois in 2018 as a true freshman, but due to being buried on the depth chart and the cost of out-of-state tuition, he transferred home to Michigan State as a regular student. Outside of a four-game stint on the Michigan State team due to injuries on the roster, Baringer did not have a walk-on spot available to him in 2019. After a year serving as the team's photographer to maintain access to the facilities to train, Baringer attended an open tryout with a new coaching staff at the Spartans and made the team, establishing himself as the Spartans top punter in 2020 and going on to have record-breaking seasons in 2021 and 2022. In 2022, he was named the Big 10 Punter of the Year and a consensus All-American by all five major associations.

BARINGER SETS TEAM MARK

 Baringer has at least one 50-yard punt in all 15 games to set the team record for the longest single season streak in team history (at any point of the season). Zoltan Mesko had a 12-game streak in 2011. Last season, Johnny Hekker (Carolina), Ryan Stonehouse (Tennessee) and Cameron Johnston (Houston) all had at least one 50-yard punt in all 17 games. Johnston also accomplished the feat in 2017.



NOTES OF INTEREST

- DB Marcus Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense again, he will join LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than one touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season.

JONES NAMED FIRST-TEAM ALL-PRO

 Jones, who won the 2021 Paul Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player after returning two punts and two kickoff returns for a touchdown in college in 2021, finished second in the NFL with a 12.5yard punt return average, second in total return yards with 1,007 and seventh in kickoff return average with a 23.9 average. He was named to the Associated Press All-Pro First Team as a punt returner, the first Patriots rookie to be named All-Pro First Team.

• Jones returned a third quarter interception 69 yards for a touchdown vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022. He scored on a punt return for a touchdown, a touchdown reception and an interception returned for a touchdown to become the fourth player in NFL history to do so in a season, joining Frank Bacon (1920), Bill Dudley (1947) and Tommy Harmon (1947). Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20 and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1 in addition to the pick-6 against the Bengals. The only other player in the Super Bowl era to score a 40-plus touchdown in each of those ways in their entire career is Deion Sandon.



FIRST DB TO CATCH A TD ON OFFENSE SINCE 2000

Jones, who made his first career start on defense vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022, also lined up on offense and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass from QB Mac Jones on his first play from scrimmage in the first quarter. Jones became the first defensive back to record a touchdown reception on offense since 2000 when S Marcus Coleman of the New York Jets caught a 45-yard touchdown pass from QB Vinny Testaverde against Buffalo on Sept. 17, 2000. Jones caught 15 passes for 137 yards with one receiving touchdown during his college career. He scored on a 47-yard touchdown pass vs. Navy on Sept. 25, 2021. Jones joins LB Mike Vrabel (six 1-yard touchdowns and four 2-yard touchdowns from Tom Brady), LB Elandon Roberts (38-yard touchdown pass from Brady vs. Miami on Dec. 29, 2019) and LB/DE John Tanner (2-yard as the only pass from QB Jim Plunkett on Nov. 24, 1974 at Baltimore) as the only New England defensive players to catch touchdowns.

FIRST PAT TO CATCH A TD ON FIRST RECEPTION SINCE 2019

Jones is the first Patriots player to catch a touchdown on his first reception since LB Elandon Roberts caught a 38-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter vs Miami on Dec. 29, 2019. Jones's 48-yard touchdown on his first offensive play is the longest by a Patriots player on his first play since WR Stephen Starring caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from Steve Grogan on his first offensive play vs. Baltimore on Sept. 4, 1983.

9TH PATRIOT TO SCORE ON FIRST CAREER RECEPTION

Jones returned a fourth quarter punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022 with five seconds to play. Jones was the first player with a punt return for a touchdown in 2022. Jones' punt return for a touchdown is the first for the Patriots since Gunner Olszewski's 70-yard return at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020.

LAST MINUTE GAME WINNER

Jones is the sixth player in the NFL to record a game-winning punt-return for a touchdown in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime since 1970, joining Patrick Peterson (Nov. 6, 2011), DeSean Jackson (Dec. 19, 2010), Brian Westbrook (Oct. 19, 2003), Tamarick Vanover (Oct 9, 1995) and Walter Stanley (Nov. 27, 1986).

 Jones' punt return for a touchdown with five seconds remaining vs. the New York Jets (11/20) marked the second-latest game-winning punt return for a touchdown in regulation since 1970, trailing only DeSean Jackson (no time remaining on Dec. 19, 2010) who returned a punt 65-yards for a touchdown in Philadelphia's win at the New York Giants.

JONES' 84-YARD PUNT RETURN IS SECOND LONGEST GO-AHEAD TD IN 4TH QUARTER IN TEAM HISTORY

Jones' 84-yard punt return for a touchdown is the second longest goahead 4th quarter touchdown in team history. The only longer return was the 91-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown by Ron Burton at Denver on Nov. 11. 1962.

WEEK 11 AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jones was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots 10-3 victory over the New York Jets in Week 11.

JONES JOINS DEION SANDERS AS TRIPLE-THREAT

 Jones registered his first career interception in the third quarter at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. He had a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo (12/1/22) and returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets (11/20/22). The only other NFL player with a receiving touchdown, a punt or kick returned for a touchdown and an interception in the same season is Deion Sanders in 1992.



SCHOOLER - SPECIAL TEAMS ACE

 Brenden Schooler recovered his second fumble on the punt return team when he recovered a muffed punt return by WR Chester Rogers in the fourth quarter at Cleveland (10/16/22). Schooler also recovered a muffed punt at Pittsburgh (9/18/22). Schooler had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles in 2022, including 11 solo special teams tackles.

SCHOOLER RECORDS 1ST CAREER BLOCKED FIELD GOAL

 Schooler blocked a 49-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter vs. Miami on Sept. 17, 2023 for his first career field goal block. It was the Patriots first blocked field goal attempt since DB Cody Davis blocked a 58-yard attempt at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020 that was returned 44 yards for a touchdown by S Devin McCourty. In 2022, the Patriots had one blocked kick when DB Jonathan Jones blocked a punt vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2022.

TIED SECOND WITH 12 SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES IN 2023

Schooler added three special teams tackles vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023 to reach double-digit totals It is the second straight year he has reached double-digit special teams tackles. As a rookie in 2022, he had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles. He is the first NFL player to begin his career with two straight 10-plus special teams tackles eseasons since LB Grant Stuard with 11 special teams tackles in 2021 when he played with Tampa Bay and 11 special teams tackles in 2022 when he played for Indianapolis. Schooler is tied for second in the NFL with 12 special teams tackles entering this week.

COMEBACKS FOR THE AGES

The Patriots have staged two historic come-from-behind victories over the past several seasons:

Bill Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games in which a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 had recorded 2,647 wins, seven losses and two ties, a winning percentage of .997.

New England came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).
