GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (0-0) VS. PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (0-0)

Sunday, September 10, 2023 • Gillette Stadium (64,628) • 4:25 p.m. ET



The New England Patriots will open the 2023 season at home and against the defending NFC Champion Philadelphia Eagles. The Patriots have opened the season against the defending conference champions four times: Miami Dolphins (1974), Pittsburgh Steelers (1979), Buffalo Bills (1993) and Denver Broncos (1998). All four were AFC Champions. The Dolphins, Steelers and Broncos were each Super Bowl Champions. The Patriots are 1-3 in those games. Philadelphia will be the first defending NFC Champion they have faced on opening day.

In addition, the Patriots will open the year against an NFC opponent for the sixth time in team history and for the first time since the 2016 season when they opened with a 23-21 win at Arizona on Sept. 11. The Patriots are 2-3 in those games.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by **CBS** and can be seen locally on **WBZ-TV Channel 4. Jim Nantz** will handle play-by-play duties with **Tony Romo** as the color analyst. **Tracy Wolfson** will report from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Jim Rikhoff** and directed by **Mike Arnold**.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by **ESPN Radio**. Steve Levy will call the game with **Sal Paolantonio** providing analysis.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 33 stations can be found in this press release on page 59. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by **Marc Cappello**.

PATRIOTS TO HONOR TOM BRADY

For two decades, Patriots fans were privileged to watch Tom Brady break every passing record in franchise history and deliver 16 division titles, nine conference championships and six Super Bowl victories to New England. After Brady announced his retirement on February 1, Patriots chairman and CEO Robert Kraft invited him to return to Gillette Stadium for the 2023 season opener to give Patriots fans an opportunity to more appropriately thank him for his many accomplishments during his career. Fans will have that opportunity when Brady addresses the crowd during a halftime ceremony at Sunday's season opener against the Philadelphia Eagles.

THE PATRIOTS ARE HEADING TO GERMANY

The New England Patriots will travel to Frankfurt, Germany on Nov. 12, 2023 to corral the Indianapolis Colts. The game will be the Patriots' first in Germany as part of the 2023 National Football League's International Games. The internationally-televised game will be played at 3:30 p.m. in Frankfurt (9:30 a.m. Eastern Standard Time).

The Patriots visit to Germany will mark their first time hosting an international home game since the launch of the International Series in 2007. The Patriots have played three international games to date, including two in London and one in Mexico City. In 2009, the Patriots defeated the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 35-7, at Wembley Stadium. The Patriots returned to London in 2012 and won their game against the St. Louis Rams, 45-7. In 2017, the Patriots made their first appearance in Mexico City, defeating the Oakland Raiders, 33-8, at Estadio Azteca.



PATRIOTS DEFENSE ON OPENING DAY



The Patriots have had three players with two interceptions on opening day with the last being CB Terrell Buckley with two picks on Sept. 9, 2002 vs. Pittsburgh. The others were DB Ronnie Lippett on Sept. 9, 1990 vs. Miami and DB Dick Felt on Sept. 8, 1963 vs. the New York Jets.

- The Patriots have had a player register 3 sacks in an opening day game three times, including one game with two players reaching 3 sacks. LB Don Blackmon recorded 3 sacks vs. Indianapolis on Sept. 7, 1986. Blackmon and LB Andre Tippett both recorded 3 sacks on opening day in 1985 vs. Green Bay on Sept. 8.
- Since 1998, the Patriots' defense has collected 3 interceptions three times on opening day. The last time they were able to achieve this was in 2020 vs. Miami on Sept. 13 when Adrian Phillips, Stephon Gilmore and J.C. Jackson all had an interception in a 21-11 Patriots win.

The Patriots, who have had a 300-yard passer on opening day nine times, will be looking to have a 300-yard passer on opening day for the first time since 2019 (Tom Brady, 24-of-36 for 341 yards vs. Pitt.)



The Patriots, who have had a player reach 100-yards rushing on opening day seven times, will be looking to have a 100-yard rusher on opening day for the first time since 2021 when RB Damien Harris finished with 100 yards on 23 carries vs. Miami on Sept. 12, 2021.



The Patriots have had a 100-yard receiver on opening day 21 times, including two games with two 100-yard receivers (2011 and 1986). The last time the Patriots had a 100-yard receiver on opening day was TE Rob Gronkowski when he caught 7 passes for 123 yards vs. Houston on Sept. 9, 2018.



Since 1998, the Patriots have had one defensive touchdown on opening day. The one time they accomplished this feat came in 2010 when LB Gary Guyton intercepted Carson Palmer and returned it 59 yards for a touchdown and paved the way to a 38-24 Patriots win vs. Cincinnati on Sept. 12.

NEW FACES ON SPECIAL TEAMS

The Patriots will have a rookie kicker and a rookie punter in 2023 after drafting K Chad Ryland in the fourth round and P Bryce Baringer in the sixth round. The Patriots are the first team since the 2000 Oakland Raiders to begin the year with a rookie kicker and punter that were selected in the same draft. Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (349), division titles (19), winning percentage (.678), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (22).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 29 seasons of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention



to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (24) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 29 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 22 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the mark. Al Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 349 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 349-166 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 28 times in their 63-year history. Twenty-two of those playoff berths have come in the 29 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. PATRIOTS

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver and Pittsburgh have played in eight.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Dallas, Pittsburgh, Green Bay and San Francisco are second with 36 playoff wins all-time.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, behind San Francisco (18) and the Pittsburgh (16).
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds, trailing only San Francisco (9) and Denver (8) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since 1990. Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with nine byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 59 postseason games, tied with San Francisco for the fourth-most in NFL history behind Dallas (66), Pittsburgh (63) and Green Bay (61).
- The Patriots are second with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 14 seasons with 12 victories.
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 10
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- New England has 28 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Green Bay is second with 21 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 35 winning seasons since 1970, second all-time behind Pittsburgh's 39.



- The Patriots have 574 total victories, the fourth-most wins since their inception in 1960, behind the 586 wins by Pittsburgh and Dallas and the 575 by Green Bay.
- New England (1,025) played their 1,000th game in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021, and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- With rookie free agents DL DaMarcus Mitchell and DB Brenden Schooler making the initial 53-man roster in 2022, the Patriots had a rookie free agent make the opening day roster for 19 straight seasons.
- The Patriots ended a 10-year streak of finishing in the top 10 for fewest points allowed (2012-2021) after finishing 11th in 2022 with 20.4 points allowed. The Patriots and Tampa Bay (1996-2005) are the last two teams to reach 10 straight seasons in the top 10 for fewest points allowed.

McCourty and Slater were chosen as captains for the 12th consecutive season. Andrews was a captain for the sixth straight year. Bentley was a captain for the second time after also serving as a captain in 2020. Jones and Wise were first time captains.

DIFFERENT POSITIONS

The Patriots have nine players on the roster that have played different positions in during their career.

CHRIS BOARD - Began his college career as a safety before moving to linebacker as a junior.

MARCUS JONES - Played defensive back and wide receiver in college.

MIKE ONWENU – Began his collegiate career as a defensive lineman before switching to offensive line following his freshman season.

ATONIO MAFI - Played defensive tackle in college before moving to the offensive line during his junior year.

MARTE MAPU - Played both linebacker and safety in college.

JABRILL PEPPERS – Played wide receiver, running back and defensive back in college.

BRENDEN SCHOOLER - Played defensive back and wide receiver in college.

TYRONE WHEATLEY JR. - Played tight end during his collegiate years and did not switch to the offensive line until the spring of 2021 during his stint in the Spring League.

KEION WHITE • Played tight end as a redshirt at Old Dominion in 2018 before moving to defensive end in 2019.

GONE AND BACK

28 players have had at least two stints with New England since 2000 (on the active roster with the Patriots for at least one game in each stint; on the active roster with another team for at least one game in between). The Patriots current roster has one such player returning for at least a second stint on the 53-man roster: Trent Brown. Trey Flowers is currently on the PUP List, but if he gets activated he will become the 29th player. In addition, the Patriots have two current players that originally were drafted or signed with New England but went to other teams before playing in their first game. OL Conor McDermott (IR) was drafted by New England in 2017 but was released before returning to the team in 2022, and OL Calvin Anderson signed with the Patriots as a rookie agent in 2019 but did not go to camp with the Patriots that summer

The Patriots gained a season-high 206 yards rushing at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It was the 18th time under Bill Belichick that the team has rushed for at least 200 yards, and the first time since gaining 222 yards rushing at Buffalo on Dec. 6, 2021.

TWO ROOKIES SCORE IN A GAME FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2006

RB Kevin Harris scored on a 14-yard touchdown and RB Pierre Strong Jr. scored on 3-yard run in the win at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. It is the first time New England had two rookies score in the same game since RB Laurence Maroney and TE David Thomas scored at Jacksonville on Dec. 24, 2006.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

The Patriots defense recorded six sacks, two takeaways, a touchdown and four fourth-down stops in the win vs. Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022.

DOUBLE-DIGIT SACK ATTACK

With LB Matthew Judon finishing with a career-high 15½ sacks and LB Josh Uche reaching a career-high 11½ sacks in 2022, the Patriots had two players reach double-digit sacks for the fourth time in team history (1977, 1985, 2011 and 2022). Tony McGee (12.0) and Ray Hamilton (10.0) finished with double digit sacks in 1977, Andre Tippett (16½) and Garin Veris (10.0) reached at least 10 sacks in 1985 and then in 2011 Andre Carter (10.0) and Mark Anderson (10.0) both reached double-digit sacks.

54 SACKS TIED FOR THIRD

The Patriots finished tied with Dallas for third in the NFL in 2022 with 54 sacks, behind Philadelphia (70) and Kansas City (55). The 54 sacks are the most under Bill Belichick, besting the 49 sacks by the 2015 team. It is the fifth-most sacks in a season in team history.

The Patriots limited the Jets to just 2 yards on seven offensive possessions in the second half on Nov. 20. It is the fewest yards allowed by the team in a half in franchise history. The previous low was 25 yards by the Los Angeles Rams in the first half on Dec. 4, 2016.

The Patriots held the Jets to just six first downs on Nov. 20, the fewest since allowing just five in a game at Green Bay on Nov. 19, 2006. The Patriots last held the Jets to just six first downs on Sept. 22, 2019.

The Patriots 10-3 victory over the Jets on Nov. 20 was the team's first win without an offensive touchdown since a 12-0 win vs. Miami on Dec. 7, 2003, when the team scored on a field goal, a 5-yard interception return by LB Tedy Bruschi and a safety. The Patriots win was the first game in at least 40 seasons in which the first touchdown was a defensive or special teams touchdown in the final minute of the game.

DEFENSIVE STAND

The Patriots did not allow a touchdown in two consecutive games in 2022, following a 26-3 win vs Indianapolis (11/6) and a 10-3 win against the Jets (11/20). The last time the Patriots didn't allow a touchdown in consecutive games was in 2019, when they prevented an offensive touchdown in each of their first three games of the season.

WARM NOVEMBER GAME

The game time temperature vs. Indianapolis (11/6) at kickoff was 75 degrees, the warmest game in November in the Bill Belichick era. The Patriots have had three other home games in November or later in the 60s - Nov. 25, 2002 vs. New Orleans (62 degrees), Nov. 8, 2009 vs. Miami (65 degrees) and Nov. 11, 2012 vs. Buffalo (60 degrees).

SHUTOUT ON THIRD

The Patriots defense forced Indianapolis (11/6) to go 0-for-14 on third down. Since 1991, the Patriots are the third team to hold an opponent to 0-for-14 or more on third down in a game. The New York Jets held the Arizona Cardinals to 0-for-15 on third down on Dec. 2, 2012, and the Jets held the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to 0-for-14 on third down on Dec. 13, 2009. Since 1991, the Patriots twice held a team to 0-for-12 on third down – Dec. 31, 2017, vs. the New York Jets and Sept. 22, 2019 vs. the New York Jets.



PATRIOTS CORRAL COLTS WITH 9 SACKS

LB Matthew Judon and LB Josh Uche each recorded three sacks vs. Indianapolis (11/6). It is the second time in team history that the Patriots had two players reach three sacks in a game. Don Blackmon and Andre Tippett each had a three-sack game on Sept. 9, 1985 vs. Green Bay. PATRIOTS TAME LIONS

The Patriots earned their 31st shutout in franchise history and the 14th under Bill Belichick with the 29-0 victory vs. Detroit (10/9). It was the team's first shutout since a 25-0 win at Atlanta on Nov. 18, 2021. It was the first shutout at Gillette Stadium since a 27-0 win vs. Houston on Sept. 22, 2016.

SECOND STRAIGHT VISIT BY DETROIT WITH A TOP RANKED UNIT

Detroit (10/9) entered the game with the top ranked offense averaging an NFL-high 35 points per game and 437 yards per game and were held to 0 points and 312 total yards. It was the second straight time the Lions traveled to New England with a top ranked unit. When the Lions last played at Gillette Stadium on Nov. 23, 2014, the Patriots rolled to a 34-9 win against the Lions' top ranked defense. Detroit scored at least 24 points in each of their first four games this season.

100-YARD RUSHER AND A 100-YARD RECEIVER IN THE SAME GAME

RB Rhamondre Stevenson had 161 yards rushing and WR Jakobi Meyers had 111 receiving yards vs. Detroit (10/9). It is the first time the Patriots had a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game since Oct. 5, 2014, when RB Stevan Ridley had 113 yards rushing and TE Rob Gronkowski had 100 yards receiving.

PATRIOTS STOP DETROIT ON ALL 6 FOURTH DOWN ATTEMPTS

The Patriots defense forced six unsuccessful fourth down attempts vs. Detroit (10/9). It is the most since New England was held to 0-for-5 on fourth down attempts on Oct. 8, 1995, vs. Denver. The previous best for the Patriots defense was stopping an opponent on all four attempts, which they had done twice before: vs. Denver (11/2/14) and vs. Tampa Bay (9/22/13).

EXTENDED FOURTH DOWN STOPS

The Patriots stopped Cleveland (10/16) on a 4th-and-1 situation in the second quarter for their seventh straight hold on fourth down. The Patriots stopped Detroit on six fourth-down attempts the week before. The last team with at least seven straight fourth-down stops was Denver with eight straight in 2021. Cleveland converted on fourth down late in the fourth quarter to end the streak.

PATRIOTS AVERAGE 5-YARDS PER CARRY FOR THIRD STRAIGHT GAME

The Patriots gained 176 yards rushing on 35 attempts for a 5.0-yards per carry vs Detroit (10/9). It was the third straight week that they averaged at least 5 yards per carry. They averaged 5.2-yards per carry vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25 and 5.1-yard per carry at Green Bay on Oct. 2. The Patriots have had three 3-game stretches averaging 5-yards per carry in a game (1977, 2020 and 2022).

PATRIOTS HAVE FIRST ROOKIE-TO-ROOKIE TD CONNECTION SINCE 1993

QB Bailey Zappe's 2-yard touchdown pass to WR Tyquan Thornton in the third quarter at Cleveland (10/16) marked the first time the Patriots had a rookie-to-rookie touchdown connection since the season finale of the 1993 season when QB Drew Bledsoe threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to WR Vincent Brisby in the third quarter vs. Miami on Jan. 2, 1994.

PATRIOTS DEFENSE WAS FIRST TO HOLD CLEVELAND UNDER 170 RUSHING YARDS

Cleveland (10/16) entered the game with the top-ranked rushing attack, posting five consecutive games of 170 rushing yards and was averaging 192.4-yards per game. Nick Chubb had rushed for 100 yards in four of the first five games and had 100 scrimmage yards in all five games. Cleveland rushed for 70 yards and Chubb was limited to 70 yards from scrimmage (56 rushing yards and 14 receiving yards).

STRONG BACK-TO-BACK GAMES

The Patriots had two strong weeks going against two top ranked teams. Detroit (10/9) entered the game with the top ranked offense and was averaging 35 points a game in a 29-0 shutout and Cleveland (10/16) entered with the top-ranked rushing attack (192.4) and were held to 70 yards.



Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win six Super Bowl titles. He won more games overall (141) during a 10-year stretch (2010-19) than any other coach in NFL history. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the only one since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 49 consecutive years as an NFL coach are most in NFL history. The only other NFL coaches with at least 40 consecutive NFL coaching seasons are Dick LeBeau (45) and Tom Moore (41).



- Bill Belichick has an NFL-best six Super Bowl championships as a head coach, joining George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only NFL coaches with six championships since the league began postseason play in 1933.
- Belichick has 329 total victories (regular season and playoffs combined), second all-time behind Don Shula (347).

• While in high school, Stevenson started gaining attention for the impressive stats he posted as a junior. Unfortunately, due to his grades, Stevenson was academically ineligible to receive a football scholarship despite being recruited. Following his senior year of high school, Stevenson took a year off from football and worked part-time jobs at Wal-Mart and Jimmy John's. But after a year away, he decided to follow a group of his friends and enroll in Cerritos Community College. During his time at Cerritos, he shared a two-bedroom apartment with up to six other guys at times and rode his bicycle 20 minutes to and from practice every day. After putting up monster stats in his second season at Cerriots, he committed to Oklahoma. Oklahoma led him to the 2021 NFL Draft where in the fourth round on the third day the Patriots selected Stevenson. In addition, he worked on his academics and made the Dean's List while at Oklahoma.

Stevenson set career highs in receptions and receiving yards after finishing with 9 receptions for 76 yards at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022. His previous high in receptions was 8 vs. Chicago on Oct. 24, 2022 and his previous high in receiving yards was 72 yards on Oct. 30, 2022 at the New York Jets.

STEVENSON HAS CAREER LONG RUNS

 Stevenson had a career-long 49-yard run in the first quarter vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022. His previous long was a 21-yard run on Nov. 18, 2021 at Atlanta. It is the longest run by a Patriots running back since RB Damien Harris scored on a 64-yard run at Buffalo on Dec. 6, 2021. Stevenson broke free for a 31-yard touchdown run at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022 and a 35-yard run at the New York Jets on Oct. 30, 2022.

STEVENSON HAS FOURTH CAREER 100-YARD GAME

 Stevenson had a career-high 172 yards rushing at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It was his second 100-yard game of the year and fourth overall. He had 161 yards rushing vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022. It is the 14th time in franchise history that a Patriots player has rushed for 160 yards or more.

STEVENSON RECORDS FOURTH CAREER GAME WITH A 6.0-YARD AVERAGE PER CARRY

 Stevenson finished with 19 rushing attempts for 172 yards for a 9.1yard average at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It is the fourth time in his career and third time in 2022 he finished with a 6.0-yard average.

MOST TOUCHES

 Stevenson had 27 overall offensive touches with 25 rushing attempts and two receptions vs. Detroit (on Oct. 9, 2022). It is the most offensive touches since RB Dion Lewis had 32 offensive touches with 26 rushing attempts and 6 receptions on Dec. 31, 2017, vs. the New York Jets.





STRANGE FACEMASK

 2022 first-round draft pick OL Cole Strange started wearing the vertical bar facemask his senior season at Chattanooga. The idea started when the veteran offensive line group, who had been together for four years, wanted to do something different to finish out their final season playing alongside each other. They decided to all wear the same facemask and landed on the vertical bar. Strange brought the bar with him to the NFL and is one of only three NFL regulars to sport the vertical bar in their facemask.



THORNTON SCORES FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWN

 2022 second-round draft pick WR Tyquan Thornton scored his first NFL touchdown on a 2-yard pass from QB Bailey Zappe in the third quarter at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022.

THORNTON SCORES SECOND TOUCHDOWN OF THE DAY ON A 19-YARD RUN

• Thornton scored his second touchdown of the day on a 19-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter at Cleveland on Oct. 16. He is the sixth Patriots wide receiver to score on a touchdown run and first since Cordarrelle Patterson in 2018. Thornton is the first Patriots wide receiver with a rushing touchdown and a receiving touchdown in the same game since David Patten at Indianapolis on Oct. 21, 2001.

- For a defensive lineman, if Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Richard Seymour is in your corner, there are few better compliments or endorsements.
- "I think he has a ton of ability, natural ability, and he plays hard," Seymour told the Boston Herald. "I think he's going to be a problem for (opposing teams) for a long time to come. Hopefully he stays healthy and continues on the path he's on. I think he has a really bright future."



SECOND-MOST QUARTERBACK PRESSURES

 Barmore posted the second-most quarterback pressures for a first-year defensive tackle since 2006, according to Pro Football Focus. His 48 pressures in 2021 were two more than Aaron Donald had during his rookie season.



2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 LB Ja'Whaun Bentley set a single-season career-high with 122 tackles in 2022. He surpassed his previous best of 108 total tackles in 2021. He became the 13th New England player to reach at least 120 total tackles in a season and the first Patriots player to do so since Jerod Mayo had 147 total tackles in 2012.



Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on couches and floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

DB Kyle Dugger scored three touchdowns in 2022 with two interceptions returned for touchdowns and a fumble returned for a touchdown. He needs one more defensive touchdown to tie Willie McGinest and Tedy Bruschi for the second-most defensive touchdowns in team history with four. Ty Law has the most defensive touchdowns with six.

DUGGER PLAYS ROLE IN FOUR OF THE SEVEN DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

Dugger played a major role in four of the NFL-best seven defensive touchdowns in 2022. In addition to his pick-6 against Miami, he returned an interception 16 yards for a touchdown at Las Vegas, returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit and forced a fumble that LB Raekwon McMillan returned 23 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter at Arizona (12/12).

DUGGER EARNS HIS DEGREE

- Dugger helped put Lenoir-Rhyne University on the map, becoming the highest-drafted athlete in the Division II football program's history.
- Three years after being selected in the second round of the 2020 NFL Draft, a diligent Dugger has worked hard to finish his degree, earning a Bachelor's in psychology with the Class of 2023.

DUGGER SCORES ON A 59-YARD FUMBLE RETURN

 Dugger recovered a fumble vs. Detroit (10/9/22) that was forced on a 13-yard sack by LB Matthew Judon and returned the ball 59 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. It is the fourth-longest fumble return in team history. It was Dugger's first career touchdown.

A PICK-6 AND A FORCED FUMBLE IN NFL STARTING DEBUT

• Patriots 2022 fourth-round pick Jack Jones was in the starting lineup at cornerback at Green Bay on Oct. 2, 2021, in place of the injured Jalen Mills. It was Jones' first NFL start. He forced and recovered a fumble on WR Romeo Doubs in the first quarter to give the Patriots a first down at the 50-yard line. Later in the second quarter, he intercepted QB Aaron Rodgers pass and returned it 40 yards for a touchdown. It was only the second time that Rodgers has had an interception returned for a touchdown at Lambeau Field (3,511 pass attempts). Jones is the first rookie in NFL history with a forced fumble, a fumble recovered and an interception returned for a touchdown in a single game.

JACK JONES HAS SECOND STRAIGHT GAME WITH A PICK

Jones intercepted a QB Jared Goff pass at the New England 3-yard line
in the first quarter vs. Detroit (10/9/22) for his second straight game with a

CAREER-HIGH WITH FOURTH INTERCEPTION

 DB Jonathan Jones intercepted Miami QB Skylar Thompson (01/01/22) in the fourth quarter for his fourth interception of the season, a new single-season career-high. He had three interceptions in 2018.

JONES SCORES FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWN

 Jones picked off a pass from Indianapolis QB Sam Ehlinger (11/6/22) in the fourth quarter and returned it 17 yards for his first career touchdown.

JONES BLOCK PARTY

Jones returned an interception for a touchdown and blocked a punt vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2022. He is the fifth player to have a pick-6 and a blocked kick in the same game since 2000 and first to have a blocked punt and a pick-6 in the same game since Patrick Chung in 2010 with the Patriots at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

- LB Matthew Judon led the team with a career-high 15½ sacks in 2022 following a team-leading 12½ sacks in 2021. He can join Tony McGee (12 in 1977, 11½ in 1978 and 10½ in 1979) as the only Patriots player with three straight double-digit sack seasons.
- Judon has registered double-digit sack totals in each of his first two seasons in New England and can join Andre Tippett (3) and Tony Mc-Gee (3) as the only Patriots players with three double-digit sack totals.
- Judon has registered 28 total sacks in the last two seasons (15½ in 2022 and 12½ in 2021). He needs 16½ sacks in 2023 to match the best three-year total in New England history with 44½ sacks by Andre Tippett (18½ in 1984, 16½ in 1985 and 9½ in 1986).

2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 Judon was selected to represent the New England Patriots in the 2023 NFL Pro Bowl. Judon has earned four consecutive Pro Bowls and two straight with the Patriots



- Judon led the team with a career-high 12½ sacks in 2021 and reached a career-high and 15½ sacks in 2022 to become the fourth Patriots player with back-to-back 10-plus sack totals, joining Garin Veris (10 in 1985 and 11 in 1986), Andre Tippett (18½ in 1984 and 16½ in 1985) and Tony McGee (12 in 1977, 11½ in 1978 and 10½ in 1979). Judon also joined Tippett (3), McGee (3), Veris (2) and Chandler Jones (2) as the only Patriots to register more than one double-digit sack total.
- Judon registered a sack in each of the first five games of the 2022 season. He is the first New England player to start a season with at least one sack in each of the first five games to start a season. Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett began the 1986 season with one sack in each of the first four games.
- Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett is the only Patriots player to record more sacks in a season than Judon's 15½ in 2022 with Tippett recording 18½ in 1984 and 16½ in 1985.



WEEK 5 AFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Judon was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots 29-0 shutout victory over the Detroit Lions on Oct. 9, 2022. Detroit entered the game with the top ranked offense and was averaging 35 points per game. Judon had a 9-yard sack of QB Jared Goff in the second quarter and then forced a fumble on a 13-yard sack later in the second quarter that was returned for a 59-yard touchdown by DB Kyle Dugger.
- It is the second Player of the Week Award for Judon in his career. He earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors following a Week 11 performance in 2017 while with Baltimore.

THE RISE OF THE GREEN GOBLIN

- DB Jalen Mills has embraced his nickname "The Green Goblin." The origins of the nickname started out as a joke during his rookie season with Philadelphia when he dyed his hair green. Mills is not sure whether it was a coach or the media, but the spiderman villain nickname stuck.
- Said Mills, "It just kind of came from my rookie year and then just throughout my years playing for the Eagles, my style of play. That's what I get it from. It's kind of something that I stuck with."

A NUMBER CHANGE WITH A STORY

Late in the Eagles' eventual Super Bowl-winning season, Jalen's Uncle Uhkoto lost his battle with cancer. The once-close relatives had long since drifted apart and fallen out of touch. As a result, only in the wake of Uhkoto's death did Jalen learn that his uncle – a man who otherwise shunned sports – could quote his nephew's NFL statistics chapter and verse: every pass breakup, every interception, every tackle, every game, Uhkoto was keeping track of Jalen. The discovery left him with a heavy heart.

"It kind of broke me down," Jalen revealed, "because we had grown apart. We were close at one point in time. It took that moment for me to realize, this is a man I looked up to as a younger kid, and now he was looking up to me, keeping up with sports that he didn't even care about. So, I wanted to honor him in my own quiet way."

In 2021, Mills got that opportunity. After signing his free-agent contract with New England, Jalen learned that the NFL would relax its jersey number restrictions, allowing certain positions beyond kickers, punters and quarterbacks to wear single-digits on their uniforms.

Mills, who wore 31 and 21 at times as an Eagle, chose No. 2 in New England. Almost no one ever called Uhkoto – pronounced uh-COO-too – by his full name. They preferred his shortened nickname: Two.



VERSATILITY

- "I'm one of the guys that when you ask me what position I play, I say 'defense.' I want to be able to line up everywhere, and most importantly, I want to be able to produce everywhere."
- Began his career in 2014 in San Diego focusing on special teams and was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2018 as a special teamer. His 2018 Pro Bowl berth was the only one that Matthew Slater did not get voted to from 2011-2021.
- Started all 16 games at safety in 2020 for the Patriots and led the team in tackles with a career-high 107.



ASK AND JAHLANI RECEIVED

LB Jahlani Tavai starred in high school as a nose guard. He was undersized and did not attract attention of many colleges. But after finding out one of the English teachers at his high school was the son of then-Hawaii coach Norm Chow, he reached out to the teacher, Cameron Chow, and asked if Cameron could tell his dad to scout his tape. Cameron followed up and passed along Jahlani's tape to his dad and the very next day Jahlani had a scholarship offer. According to Jahlani, his football career would have been over after high school if it wasn't for this connection.

CAREER-HIGH THREE SACKS

 Uche had two sacks vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1 and followed that game with three sacks against Arizona. He is the first Patriots player since Trey Flowers in 2016 to have back-to-back games with at least two sacks. Flowers had two sacks at Buffalo (10/30) followed by two sacks vs. Seattle (11/13).

 Deatrich Wise Jr. was named a team captain for the first time in his six-year career in 2022.


DEATRICH WISE JR. RECORDS THREE SACKS VS. BALTIMORE

• Wise was honored with the 2022 Ron Burton Community Service Award at the Patriots Premiere last September for his dedication to serving his community. After receiving the award, Wise said, "You don't go out in the community for the gratification. You just do it because it's in your heart to do. It's an honor to win an award of this prestige and to be in the same group as everybody who's won that before and have my name with the Burton family."









WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

- DB Marcus Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense in 2023, he will join LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than one touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season.
- Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022. If he returns a kickoff for a touchdown in 2023, he will become the first New England player to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown. He returned 27 kickoffs for 645 yards as a rookie.
- If Jones returns a punt for a touchdown in 2023, he will join Julian Edelman (4), Troy Brown (3), Irving Fryar (3) and Mike Haynes (2) as the only Patriots players with more than one punt returned for a touchdown.
- Jones handled kickoff and punt return duties as a rookie in 2022. He

JONES NAMED FIRST-TEAM ALL-PRO

 Jones, who won the 2021 Paul Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player after returning two punts and two kickoff returns for a touchdown in college in 2021, finished second in the NFL with a 12.5yard punt return average, second in total return yards with 1,007 and seventh in kickoff return average with a 23.9 average. He was named to the Associated Press All-Pro First Team as a punt returner, the first Patriots rookie to be named All-Pro First Team

JONES SCORES ON OFFENSE, DEFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS

• Jones returned a third quarter interception 69 yards for a touchdown vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022. He scored on a punt return for a touchdown, a touchdown reception and an interception returned for a touchdown to become the fourth player in NFL history to do so in a season, joining Frank Bacon (1920), Bill Dudley (1947) and Tommy Harmon (1947). Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20 and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1 in addition to the pick-6 against the Bengals. The only other player in the Super Bowl era to score a 40-plus touchdown in each of those ways in their entire career is Deion Sanders.

FIRST DB TO CATCH A TD ON OFFENSE SINCE 2000

Jones, who made his first career start on defense vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022, also lined up on offense and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass from QB Mac Jones on his first play from scrimmage in the first quarter. Jones became the first defensive back to record a touchdown reception on offense since 2000 when S Marcus Coleman of the New York Jets caught a 45-yard touchdown pass from QB Vinny Testaverde against Buffalo on Sept. 17, 2000. Jones caught 15 passes for 137 yards with one receiving touchdown during his college career. He scored on a 47-yard touchdown pass vs. Navy on Sept. 25, 2021. Jones joins LB Mike Vrabel (six 1-yard touchdowns and four 2-yard touchdowns from Tom Brady), LB Elandon Roberts (38-yard touchdown pass from Brady vs. Miami on Dec. 29, 2019) and LB/DE John Tanner (2-yard as the only pass from QB Jim Plunkett on Nov. 24, 1974 at Baltimore) as the only New England defensive players to catch touchdowns.

FIRST PAT TO CATCH A TD ON FIRST RECEPTION SINCE 2019

Jones is the first Patriots player to catch a touchdown on his first reception since LB Elandon Roberts caught a 38-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter vs Miami on Dec. 29, 2019. Jones's 48-yard touchdown on his first offensive play is the longest by a Patriots player on his first play since WR Stephen Starring caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from Steve Grogan on his first offensive play vs. Baltimore on Sept. 4, 1983.

JONES MAKES FIRST NFL START

Jones made his first NFL start as a defensive back in a nickel defensive alignment vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. He finished the game with one pass defensed. He also had one special teams tackle.

JONES RETURNS PUNT 84 YARDS FOR A TOUCHDOWN

Jones returned a fourth quarter punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022 with five seconds to play. It is tied with Julian Edelman (84-yard touchdown return vs. Denver on Nov. 2, 2014) for the fifth-longest punt return in team history. Jones is the first player with a punt return for a touchdown in 2022. Jones' punt return for a touchdown is the first for the Patriots since Gunner Olszewski's 70-yard return at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020.

LAST MINUTE GAME WINNER

- Jones is the sixth player in the NFL to record a game-winning punt-return for a touchdown in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime since 1970, joining Patrick Peterson (Nov. 6, 2011), DeSean Jackson (Dec. 19, 2010), Brian Westbrook (Oct. 19, 2003), Tamarick Vanover (Oct. 9, 1995) and Walter Stanley (Nov. 27, 1986).
- Jones' punt return for a touchdown with five seconds remaining vs. the New York Jets (11/20) marked the second-latest game-winning punt return for a touchdown in regulation since 1970, trailing only DeSean Jackson (no time remaining on Dec. 19, 2010) who returned a punt 65-yards for a touchdown in Philadelphia's win at the New York Giants.

JONES' 84-YARD PUNT RETURN IS SECOND LONGEST GO-AHEAD TD IN 4TH QUARTER IN TEAM HISTORY

 Jones' 84-yard punt return for a touchdown is the second longest goahead 4th quarter touchdown in team history. The only longer return was the 91-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown by Ron Burton at Denver on Nov. 11, 1962.

WEEK 11 AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jones was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots 10-3 victory over the New York Jets in Week 11.

JONES JOINS DEION SANDERS AS TRIPLE-THREAT

 Jones registered his first career interception in the third quarter at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. He had a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo (12/1/22) and returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets (11/20/22). The only other NFL player with a receiving touchdown, a punt or kick returned for a touchdown and an interception in the same season is Deion Sanders in 1992.



SCHOOLER - SPECIAL TEAMS ACE

Rookie Brenden Schooler recovered his second fumble on the punt return team when he recovered a muffed punt return by WR Chester Rogers in the fourth quarter at Cleveland (10/16/22). Schooler also recovered a muffed punt at Pittsburgh (9/18). Schooler had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles, including 11 solo special teams tackles.

- Matthew Slater has earned an NFL record 10 special teams Pro Bowl invitations and will look to add to that in 2023. His 10 Pro Bowl berths with the Patriots are second to the 14 by Tom Brady.

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

- Slater has been named to 10 Pro Bowls for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the 12th straight season in 2022.
- He shared what it means to be a captain in a story published by The Boston Globe. "You have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

PRO BOWL RECORD

Slater has earned 10 Pro Bowl invitations (2011-17, 19-21) as a special teams player. Steve Tasker (1987, 90-95) has the second-most with seven Pro Bowl selections. Slater is also the only special teams player to earn seven consecutive Pro Bowls, which he did from 2011-17.

"Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

- In addition to the Foundation, Matthew and Shahrzad have over the years supported a range of non-profit organizations including; International Justice Mission, Compassion International, Ron Burton Training Village, World Vision, the ELISHA Project, Barnabas Fund, Voice of the Martyrs and Open Doors.

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014, turning a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

COMEBACKS FOR THE AGES

The Patriots have staged two historic come-from-behind victories over the past several seasons:

Bill Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games in which a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 had recorded 2,647 wins, seven losses and two ties, a winning percentage of .997.

New England came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).
