GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (3-10) VS. KANSAS CITY CHIEFS (8-5) Sunday, December 17, 2023 • Gillette Stadium (64,628) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will begin a two-game stretch against the AFC West when they host Kansas City this week and then travel on Christmas Eve to face the Broncos in Denver. Bill Belichick's 301 career regular season wins currently ranks third among head coaches in NFL history. Andy Reid's 255 career regular season wins ranks fourth all-time. This week will be the first time that two head coaches in the top five in career regular season wins have faced each other since Week 4 in 1990 when Don Shula's Dolphins met Chuck Knoll's Steelers.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by **FOX** and can be seen locally on **WFXT-TV** Channel 25. **Joe Davis** will handle play-by-play duties with **Daryl Johnston** as the color analyst. **Pam Oliver** will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Pete Macheska** and directed by **Artie Kempner.**

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 33 stations can be found in this press release on page 60. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by **Marc Cappello**.

The New England Patriots and Kansas City Chiefs will meet for the first time since the 2020 season when the teams had a game that was moved from a Sunday game to a Monday game due to COVID-19 on Oct. 5, 2020, at Kansas City. The Chiefs took a 26-10 victory in that game.

Kansas City holds a 20-16-3 edge over New England overall, but the Chiefs are 8-11-2 in games played in New England, including 2-4 at Gillette Stadium (2-5 including playoffs).

New England is 2-0 against Kansas City in the postseason after a 27-20 win on Jan. 16, 2016, in a 2015 AFC Divisional Playoff Game and then a 37-31 overtime win in the AFC Championship Game on Jan. 20, 2019, at Kansas City.

The two teams played twice a year from 1960 until the 1970 AFL-NFL merger as two of the original American Football League teams.





- Baringer is leading the NFL with 31 punts inside the 20-yard line. Baringer
 is on pace to finish the year with 41 punts inside the 20-yard line. The
 Patriots record for most punts inside the 20-yard line in a season is 36 by
 Jake Bailey in 2019.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

- The Patriots have allowed 20 or fewer points in five straight games and will look to extend that mark to six this week against Kansas City. The team record for most consecutive games allowing 20 or few points is 11 from the last three games of the 2018 season through the first eight games of the 2019 season. The team record in a season is nine straight games in 1993.
- The Patriots enter the week's game with the 8th ranked defense in total yards. The team has finished in the top 10 for defense 10 times during Bill Belichick's reign as head coach of the Patriots.

STOPPING THE RUN

- The Patriots have held their opponents to under 3.0 yards per carry (ypc) five times in 2023, including in each of the last two games (1.2 ypc vs. the Los Angeles Chargers on Dec. 3 and 2.9 ypc at Pittsburgh on Dec.7). The team record for most games in a season holding the opponent under 3 yards per carry is eight in 1961 and 1968.
- The Patriots will look to extend their streak to three straight games holding their opponent under 3 yards per carry this week against Kansas City. The last time the Patriots held their opponent under 3 yards per rush in three straight games was the first three games of the 2019 season 2.5 ypc vs. Pittsburgh on Sept. 8, 2.8 ypc at Miami on Sept. 15 and 1.8 ypc vs. the New York Jets on Sept. 22. The team record for most consecutive games holding the opponent under 3 yards per carry is seven straight games in 1966.
- The Patriots enter this week allowing an NFL-best 3.2-yards per carry. If that pace holds, it will be the lowest by a team since the 2014 Detroit Lions when they allowed 3.17 yards per rush. Since the 1970 merger, only 23 teams have held their opponent to 3.2-yards per rush or less. If the Patriots hold, it will be the lowest in team history since the 1970 merger. The current best is 3.4 yards per carry by the 1974 team.

ZAPPE SETS CAREER HIGH WITH 3 TOUCHDOWN PASSES

QB Bailey Zappe set a career-high with three touchdown passes. His previous best was two touchdowns at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022. Zappe had an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Ezekiel Elliott in the first quarter and an 8-yard touchdown pass and a 24-yard touchdown pass to TE Hunter Henry in the second quarter. Bailey is the first Patriots player with three touchdowns in the first half since Tom Brady vs. the New York Jets on Dec. 30. 2018. Zappe finished 19-of-28 for 240 yards with the three touchdowns.

PEPPERS TIES CAREER-HIGH WITH A 32-YD INT. RETURN

S Jabrill Peppers interacted Pittsburgh QB Mitch Trubisky in the second quarter and returned the pick 32 yards to the Pittsburgh 27-yard line. It ties for his longest career interception return. He had a 32-yard interception that he returned for a touchdown vs. Washington on Sept. 29, 2019 off QB Dwayne Haskins. The turnover helped set up QB Bailey Zappe's 8-yard touchdown pass to TE Hunter Henry.

HENRY TIES CAREER-HIGH WITH TWO TD PASSES

TE Hunter Henry tied career-high with two touchdown passes, an 8-yard and a 24-yard touchdown pass in the in the second quarter. He has had two touchdown passes four times in his career, including two other times with the Patriots – Nov. 14, 2021 vs Cleveland and Dec. 18, 2021 at Indianapolis.

HENRY SCORES TWO TOUCHDOWNS ON HIS BIRTHDAY

Hunter Henry celebrated his 29th birthday with a two-touchdown performance. He is the first Patriots player to score a touchdown on his birthday since RB Dion Lewis on Sept. 27, 2015 vs. Jacksonville when he turned 25.

Rookie P Bryce Baringer has at least one 50-yard punt in all 13 games after a 56-yard punt in the first quarter to set the team record for the longest single season streak in team history (at any point of the season). Baringer was tied with Zoltan Mesko. Mesko had a 12-game streak in 2011. Last season, Johnny Hekker (Carolina), Ryan Stonehouse (Tennessee) and Cameron Johnston (Houston) all had at least one 50-yard punt in all 17 games. Johnston also accomplished the feat in 2017. He added a 66-yard punt in the second quarter and now has 9 punts of 60-yards so far in 2023.

WILSON GETS FIRST SACK OF THE SEASON

LB Mack Wilson Sr. registered his first sack of the season when he dropped Pittsburgh QB Mitch Trubisky for a 1-yard loss in the first quarter on a third-down play to help hold the Steelers to a field goal.

Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (352), division titles (19), winning percentage (.667), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (22).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 30th season of ownership, he is credited with transforming one of the league's least successful clubs into one of the most valuable. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a champi-



onship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (24) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's first 29 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 22 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the mark. Al Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 28 times in their 63-year history. Twenty-two of those playoff berths have come in the 29 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns.

Since 1994, there have been 148 franchises that have fielded teams in the five major American sports leagues (NFL, MLB, NBA, NHL and MLS) and completed more than two full seasons of competition. On the women's side the Toronto Six (29-5-3) and the Boston Pride (90-29-10) of the PHF hold the two highest winning percentages of all women's professional sports teams.

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver and Pittsburgh have played in eight.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Dallas, Pittsburgh, Green Bay and San Francisco are second with 36 playoff wins all-time.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, behind San Francisco (18) and the Pittsburgh (16).
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds, trailing only San Francisco (9) and Denver (8) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since 1990. Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with nine byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 59 postseason games, tied with San Francisco for the fourth-most in NFL history behind Dallas (66), Pittsburgh (63) and Green Bay (61).
- The Patriots are second with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 14 seasons with 12 victories.
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 10
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- New England has 28 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Green Bay is second with 21 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 35 winning seasons since 1970, third all-time, behind Pittsburgh's 39 and Dallas' 36.



- The Patriots have 577 total victories, the fourth-most wins since their inception in 1960, behind the 596 wins by Dallas, 593 by Pittsburgh and the 581 by Green Bay.
- New England (1,038) played their 1,000th game in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021, and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- The Patriots ended a 10-year streak of finishing in the top 10 for fewest points allowed (2012-2021) after finishing 11th in 2022 with 20.4 points allowed. The Patriots and Tampa Bay (1996-2005) are the last two teams to reach 10 straight seasons in the top 10 for fewest points allowed.
- The Patriots have finished with a positive turnover ratio for 17 straight seasons (2006-22), the longest streak since the 1970 merger. Seattle is second with 12 straight seasons with a positive turnover ratio.
- The Patriots are ranked 8th in defense. The Patriots have finished in the top 10 in defense 10 times under Bill Belichick.

KEION WHITE - Played tight end as a redshirt at Old Dominion in 2018 before moving to defensive end in 2019.

GONE AND BACK

29 players have had at least two stints with New England since 2000 (on the active roster with the Patriots for at least one game in each stint; on the active roster with another team for at least one game in between). The Patriots current roster has two such players returning for at least a second stint on the 53-man roster: OL Trent Brown and CB J.C. Jackson. LB Calvin Munson is on the practice squad but was elevated to the active roster for three games in 2023. In addition, the Patriots have one current player that originally signed with New England but went to other teams before playing in their first game. OL Calvin Anderson signed with the Patriots as a rookie agent in 2019 but did not go to camp with the Patriots that summer. OL Conor McDermott was originally drafted by New England but was released at the end of training camp and spent time with the Jets and Bills before returning last season.

THIRD GO-AHEAD TD IN FINAL 15 SECONDS

TE Mike Gesicki's go-ahead touchdown from QB Mac Jones against the Buffalo Bills on Oct. 22, 2023 with 12 seconds to play was the Patriots third go-ahead touchdown in the final 15 seconds in the last 30 seasons. The others were Tom Brady to Kenbrell Thompkins with five seconds to play in a 30-27 win vs. New Orleans on Oct. 13, 2013, and Drew Bledsoe's 1-yard touchdown pass to TE Ben Coates as time expired in a 25-21 win vs. Buffalo on Nov. 29, 1998.

ROOKIE KICKER AND ROOKIE PUNTER

The Patriots have a rookie kicker and a rookie punter in 2023 after drafting K Chad Ryland in the fourth round and P Bryce Baringer in the sixth round. Since 2000, eight other NFL teams have had a rookie kicker and a rookie punter on the active roster for the season opening game: 2019 – Cleveland Browns, 2015 – Miami Dolphins, 2012 – St. Louis Rams, 2011 – Philadelphia Eagles, 2005 – New York Jets, 2002 – Baltimore Ravens, 2000 – Dallas Cowboys and 2000 – Oakland Raiders. The Patriots are the first team since the 2000 Oakland Raiders to begin the year with a rookie kicker and punter that were selected in the same draft.



Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win six Super Bowl titles. He won more games overall (141) during a 10-year stretch (2010-19) than any other coach in NFL history. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the only one since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 49 consecutive years as an NFL coach are most in NFL history. The only other NFL coaches with at least 40 consecutive NFL coaching seasons are Dick LeBeau (45) and Tom Moore (41).

Douglas' granddad passed away on his first birthday. The wide receiver was commonly referred to as 'Poppa' from his granddad — a nickname that was quickly shortened to just 'Pop'.

The three-time Pro Bowler (2016, 2018 and 2019) has four 1,000-yard seasons, including a career-high and NFL-leading 1,631 rushing yards as a rookie in 2016. • The Penn State record holder for most receptions by a tight end in the school's history, believe it or not, did not receive his first recruiting letter from the Penn State football staff, but instead from the men's volleyball head coach Mark Pavlik. - QB Mac Jones is in seventh place on New England's all-time passing list with 8,918 career passing yards and needs 1,014 passing yards to move past Jim Plunkett (9,932) for sixth place on the list.
- Jones has the highest completion percentage in team history at 66.1.
- In 2022, Jones finished with a 65.2 completion percentage for his second season with a completion percentage of at least 65%. He finished his rookie season with a 67.6 completion percentage. Jones joins Justin Herbert and Joe Burrow as the only quarterbacks to have completed at least 65% of their passes in their first two seasons. Herbert and Burrow are the only quarterbacks to accomplish this feat in their first three seasons. He has completed 64.9 of his passes so far in 2023.

Jones set a career-high with 382 yards passing at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022, for his second 300-yard game of the 2022 season. Jones' previous best was 321 yards vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. Jones finished 28-of-39 (.718) for 382 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 119.8 against the Vikings.

JONES HAD TWO TOUCHDOWNS OF 30 YARDS OR MORE



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

- RB Rhamondre Stevenson recorded his first 1,000-yard rushing season with a career-high 1,040 rushing yards in 2022. He can become the third New England player with back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons in 2023, joining Curtis Martin (1,487 in 1995, 1,152 in 1996 and 1,160 in 1997) and Jim Nance (1,458 in 1966 and 1,216 in 1967). He has 619 yards rushing in 2023 and needs 381 yards to reach 1,000 yards.
- Stevenson became the ninth New England running back to lead the team in receptions after finishing with 69 in 2022. He can become the first New England running back to lead the team in two consecutive seasons in 2023.

RHAMONDRE REACHES 1,000 YARDS RUSHING

 Stevenson finished the 2022 season with 1,040 rushing yards, his first career 1,000-yard season and the 17th 1,000-yard season in New England history.

DEDICATION TO HIS GOALS

While in high school, Stevenson started gaining attention for the impressive stats he posted as a junior. Unfortunately, due to his grades, Stevenson was academically ineligible to receive a football scholarship despite being recruited. Following his senior year of high school, Stevenson took a year off from football and worked part-time jobs at Wal-Mart and Jimmy John's. But after a year away, he decided to follow a group of his friends and enroll in Cerritos Community College. During his time at Cerritos, he shared a two-bedroom apartment with up to six other guys at times and rode his bicycle 20 minutes to and from practice every day. After putting up monster stats in his second season at Cerriots, he committed to Oklahoma. Oklahoma led him to the 2021 NFL Draft where in the fourth round on the third day the Patriots selected Stevenson. In addition, he worked on his academics and made the Dean's List while at Oklahoma.

STEVENSON RECORDS FIRST RECEIVING TOUCHDOWN

 Stevenson had his first career touchdown reception on a 3-yard pass from QB Mac Jones in the second quarter vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6 2022.

CAREER HIGHS IN RECEPTIONS AND RECEIVING YARDS

 Stevenson set career highs in receptions and receiving yards after finishing with nine receptions for 76 yards at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022. His previous high in receptions was eight vs. Chicago on Oct. 24, 2022, and his previous high in receiving yards was 72 yards on Oct. 30, 2022, at the New York Jets.

STEVENSON HAS CAREER LONG RUN

• Stevenson had a career-long 64-yard touchdown run in the second quarter vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023. His previous long was a 49-yard run vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022 and his previous longest touchdown run was a 34-yard touchdown run at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It is the longest touchdown run for a Patriots player since RB Damien Harris had a 64-yard touchdown run at Buffalo on Dec. 6, 2022. It is tied with Harris for the longest touchdown run by a Patriot player in the regular seasons since a 70-yard run by Curtis Martin on Sept. 21, 1997 vs. Chicago.

STEVENSON HAS FOURTH CAREER 100-YARD GAME

Stevenson had a career-high 172 yards rushing at Las Vegas on Dec.
 18, 2022. It was his second 100-yard game of the year and fourth overall. He had 161 yards rushing vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022. It is the 14th time in franchise history that a Patriots player has rushed for 160 yards or more.

STEVENSON HAS THIRD GAME WITH 9.0 AVERAGE

 Stevenson finished 9 carries for 87 yards for a 9.7-yard average vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023, the highest average of his career and the third time he had at least a 9.0-yard average. He had a 9.1-yard average at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022 and a 9.0-yard average at Buffalo on Jan. 8, 2023.

STRANGE FACEMASK

2022 first-round draft pick OL Cole Strange started wearing the vertical bar facemask his senior season at Chattanooga. The idea started when the veteran offensive line group, who had been together for four years, wanted to do something different to finish out their final season playing alongside each other. They decided to all wear the same facemask and landed on the vertical bar. Strange brought the bar with him to the NFL and is one of only three NFL regulars to sport the vertical bar in their facemask.

FROM HOUSTON BAPTIST, TO WESTERN KENTUCKY, TO NEW ENGLAND

 QB Bailey Zappe played his first four college seasons at Houston Baptist before playing at Western Kentucky in 2021. While at Western Kentucky, Zappe set new all-time single season FBS records with 5,987 yards and 62 touchdown passes, breaking the record held by Texas Tech's B.J. Symons (5,833 in 2013) and Joe Burrow (60 touchdown passes in 2019).

BAILEY ZAPPE THROWS FOR OVER 300 YARDS

• Zappe made his second straight start of the season at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022, and finished 24-of-34 for 309 yards with two touchdown passes en route to a 38-15 victory. He became the first Patriots rookie quarterback to win in his first home and first road game after starting in the 29-0 victory at home against Detroit on Oct. 9. Zappe had a passer rating of 118.4 against the Browns. He is the first rookie quarterback to win and record a 100-plus passer rating in his first two starts since Sonny Jurgensen in 1957. Zappe had a passer rating of 100 in his first start against the Lions.





PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER RICHARD SEYMOUR SEES GREATNESS AHEAD FOR CHRISTIAN BARMORE

- For a defensive lineman, if Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Richard Seymour is in your corner, there are few better compliments or endorsements.
- "I think he has a ton of ability, natural ability, and he plays hard," Seymour told the Boston Herald. "I think he's going to be a problem for (opposing teams) for a long time to come. Hopefully he stays healthy and continues on the path he's on. I think he has a really bright future."

SECOND-MOST QUARTERBACK PRESSURES

 Barmore posted the second-most quarterback pressures for a first-year defensive tackle since 2006, according to Pro Football Focus. His 48 pressures in 2021 were two more than Aaron Donald had during his rookie season.



2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

LB Ja'Whaun Bentley set a single-season career-high with 122 tackles in 2022. He surpassed his previous best of 108 total tackles in 2021. He became the 13th New England player to reach at least 120 total tackles in a season and the first Patriots player to do so since Jerod Mayo had 147 total tackles in 2012.



Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on couches and floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

DB Kyle Dugger scored three touchdowns in 2022 with two interceptions and a fumble returned for touchdowns. He needs one more defensive touchdown to tie Willie McGinest and Tedy Bruschi for the second-most defensive touchdowns in team history with four. Ty Law has the most defensive touchdowns with six.

 Dugger played a major role in four of the NFL-best seven defensive touchdowns in 2022. In addition to his pick-6 against Miami, he returned an interception 16 yards for a touchdown at Las Vegas, returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit and forced a fumble that LB Raekwon McMillan returned 23 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter at Arizona (12/12).

DUGGER EARNS HIS DEGREE

- LB Matthew Judon led the team with a career-high 15½ sacks in 2022 following a team-leading 12½ sacks in 2021. He can join Tony McGee (12 in 1977, 11½ in 1978 and 10½ in 1979) as the only Patriots player with three straight double-digit sack seasons.
- Judon registered 28 total sacks in the last two seasons (15½ in 2022 and 12½ in 2021).

2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Judon was selected to represent the New England Patriots in the 2023 NFL Pro Bowl. Judon has earned four consecutive Pro Bowl berths, including two straight with the Patriots.

THE RISE OF THE GREEN GOBLIN

- DB Jalen Mills has embraced his nickname "The Green Goblin." The
 origins of the nickname started out as a joke during his rookie season
 with Philadelphia when he dyed his hair green. Mills is not sure whether it was a coach or the media, but the spiderman villain nickname
 stuck.
- Said Mills, "It just kind of came from my rookie year and then just throughout my years playing for the Eagles, my style of play. That's what I get it from. It's kind of something that I stuck with."

A NUMBER CHANGE WITH A STORY

Late in the Eagles' eventual Super Bowl-winning season, Jalen's Uncle Uhkoto lost his battle with cancer. The once-close relatives had long since drifted apart and fallen out of touch. As a result, only in the wake of Uhkoto's death did Jalen learn that his uncle — a man who otherwise shunned sports — could quote his nephew's NFL statistics chapter and verse: every pass breakup, every interception, every tackle, every game, Uhkoto was keeping track of Jalen. The discovery left him with a heavy heart.

.; "It kind of broke me down," Jalen revealed, "because we had grown apart. We were close at one point in time. It took that moment for me to realize, this is a man I looked up to as a younger kid, and now he was looking up to me, keeping up with sports that he didn't even care about. So, I wanted to honor him in my own quiet way."

In 2021, Mills got that opportunity. After signing his free-agent contract with New England, Jalen learned that the NFL would relax its jersey number restrictions, allowing certain positions beyond kickers, punters and quarterbacks to wear single-digits on their uniforms.

Mills, who wore 31 and 21 at times as an Eagle, chose No. 2 in New England. Almost no one ever called Uhkoto – pronounced uh-COO-too – by his full name. They preferred his shortened nickname: Two.



VERSATILITY

- "I'm one of the guys that when you ask me what position I play, I say 'defense.' I want to be able to line up everywhere, and most importantly, I want to be able to produce everywhere."
- Began his career in 2014 in San Diego focusing on special teams and was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2018 as a special teamer. His 2018 Pro Bowl berth was the only one that Matthew Slater did not get voted to from 2011-2021.
- Started all 16 games at safety in 2020 for the Patriots and led the team in tackles with a career-high 107.



ASK AND JAHLANI RECEIVED

LB Jahlani Tavai starred in high school as a nose guard. He was undersized and did not attract the attention of many colleges. But after finding out one of the English teachers at his high school was the son of then-Hawaii coach Norm Chow, he reached out to the teacher, Cameron Chow, and asked if Cameron could tell his dad to scout his tape. Cameron followed up and passed along Jahlani's tape to his dad, and the very next day Jahlani had a scholarship offer. According to Jahlani, his football career would have been over after high school if it wasn't for this connection.

CAREER-HIGH THREE SACKS

Uche registered a career-high three sacks after dropping Indianapolis QB Sam Ehlinger (11/6/22) for a 2-yard loss and an 8-yard loss in the second quarter and a 1-yard sack in the third quarter. He has three career games with at least two sacks. He had his first two-sack game after registering two fourth quarter sacks at the New York Jets on Sept. 19, 2021, and also had two sacks vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022.

UCHE HAD TWO 3-SACK GAMES IN 2022

He is the first Patriots player since Trey Flowers in 2016 to have back-to-back games with at least two sacks. Flowers had two sacks at Buffalo (10/30) followed by two sacks vs. Seattle (11/13).



SECOND TIME TEAM CAPTAIN

 Deatrich Wise Jr. has been named a team captain for the last two seasons.

DEATRICH WISE JR. RECORDS THREE SACKS VS. BALTIMORE

- Wise had his first career three-sack game after a 3-yard sack in the first quarter, an 8-yard sack and a 1-yard sack in the second quarter vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. His previous best was 1½ sacks, which he accomplished three times vs. Buffalo (12/24/17), vs. Houston (9/9/18) and vs. Cleveland (11/14/21).
- Wise is the fifth Patriots player to register three sacks in a half. DL Henry Thomas had three sacks in the first half at St. Louis on Dec. 13, 1998. LB Tully Banta-Cain had three sacks in the second half at Buffalo on Dec. 20, 2009, DL Jarvis Green had three sacks in the second half at Cincinnati on Oct. 1, 2006, and Josh Uche at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022.

2022 RON BURTON COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD WINNER

• Wise was honored with the 2022 Ron Burton Community Service Award at the Patriots Premiere last September for his dedication to serving his community. After receiving the award, Wise said, "You don't go out in the community for the gratification. You just do it because it's in your heart to do. It's an honor to win an award of this prestige and to be in the same group as everybody who's won that before and have my name with the Burton family."







FROM WALK-ON TO ALL-AMERICAN

Bryce Baringer had an unconventional path to the NFL. He began his collegiate career by earning a walk-on spot at Illinois in 2018 as a true freshman, but due to being buried on the depth chart and the cost of out-of-state tuition, he transferred home to Michigan State as a regular student. Outside of a four-game stint on the Michigan State team due to injuries on the roster, Baringer did not have a walk-on spot available to him in 2019. After a year serving as the team's photographer to maintain access to the facilities to train, Baringer attended an open tryout with a new coaching staff at the Spartans and made the team, establishing himself as the Spartans top punter in 2020 and going on to have record-breaking seasons in 2021 and 2022. In 2022, he was named the Big 10 Punter of the Year and a consensus All-American by all five major associations.

BARINGER SETS TEAM MARK

Baringer has at least one 50-yard punt in all 13 games to set the team record for the longest single season streak in team history (at any point of the season). Zoltan Mesko had a 12-game streak in 2011. Last season, Johnny Hekker (Carolina), Ryan Stonehouse (Tennessee) and Cameron Johnston (Houston) all had at least one 50-yard punt in all 17 games. Johnston also accomplished the feat in 2017.



NOTES OF INTEREST

- DB Marcus Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense again, he will join LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than one touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season.
- Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022. If he returns a kickoff for a touchdown, he will become the first New England player to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown. He returned 27 kickoffs for 645 yards as a rookie.
- If Jones returns a another punt for a touchdown, he will join Julian Edelman (4), Troy Brown (3), Irving Fryar (3) and Mike Haynes (2) as the only Patriots players with more than one punt returned for a touch-
- Jones handled kickoff and punt return duties as a rookie in 2022. He will look to become the first Patriots player to ever return a kickoff for a touchdown and punt for a touchdown in the same season and the first NFL player to accomplish the feat since 2019 when Jamal Agnew did so for Detroit.

Jones scored on offense, defense and special teams in 2022. He is the only player to score in all three phases in a single season since 1970. He is one of ten players to score on offense, defense and special teams during their NFL career.

JONES SCORES ON OFFENSE, DEFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS

Jones returned a third quarter interception 69 yards for a touchdown vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022. He scored on a punt return for a touchdown, a touchdown reception and an interception returned for a touchdown to become the fourth player in NFL history to do so in a season, joining Frank Bacon (1920), Bill Dudley (1947) and Tommy Harmon (1947). Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20 and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1 in addition to the pick-6 against the Bengals. The only other player in the Super Bowl era to score a 40-plus touchdown in each of those ways in their entire career is Deion Sand-



FIRST DB TO CATCH A TD ON OFFENSE SINCE 2000

Jones, who made his first career start on defense vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022, also lined up on offense and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass from QB Mac Jones on his first play from scrimmage in the first quarter. Jones became the first defensive back to record a touchdown reception on offense since 2000 when S Marcus Coleman of the New York Jets caught a 45-yard touchdown pass from QB Vinny Testaverde against Buffalo on Sept. 17, 2000. Jones caught 15 passes for 137 yards with one receiving touchdown during his college career. He scored on a 47-yard touchdown pass vs. Navy on Sept. 25, 2021. Jones joins LB Mike Vrabel (six 1-yard touchdowns and four 2-yard touchdowns from Tom Brady), LB Elandon Roberts (38-yard touchdown pass from Brady vs. Miami on Dec. 29, 2019) and LB/DE John Tanner (2-yard as the only pass from QB Jim Plunkett on Nov. 24, 1974 at Baltimore) as the only New England defensive players to catch touchdowns.

FIRST PAT TO CATCH A TD ON FIRST RECEPTION SINCE 2019

Jones is the first Patriots player to catch a touchdown on his first reception since LB Elandon Roberts caught a 38-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter vs Miami on Dec. 29, 2019. Jones's 48-yard touchdown on his first offensive play is the longest by a Patriots player on his first play since WR Stephen Starring caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from Steve Grogan on his first offensive play vs. Baltimore on Sept. 4, 1983.

9TH PATRIOT TO SCORE ON FIRST CAREER RECEPTION

 Since 1990, DB Marcus Jones is the ninth Patriots player with a touchdown reception on his first NFL reception.

JONES MAKES FIRST NFL START

Jones made his first NFL start as a defensive back in a nickel defensive alignment vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. He finished the game with one pass defensed. He also had one special teams tackle.

JONES RETURNS PUNT 84 YARDS FOR A TOUCHDOWN

Jones returned a fourth quarter punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022 with five seconds to play. It is tied with Julian Edelman (84-yard touchdown return vs. Denver on Nov. 2, 2014) for the fifth-longest punt return in team history. Jones was the first player with a punt return for a touchdown in 2022. Jones' punt return for a touchdown is the first for the Patriots since Gunner Olszewski's 70-yard return at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020.

LAST MINUTE GAME WINNER

Jones is the sixth player in the NFL to record a game-winning punt-return for a touchdown in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime since 1970, joining Patrick Peterson (Nov. 6, 2011), DeSean Jackson (Dec. 19, 2010), Brian Westbrook (Oct. 19, 2003), Tamarick Vanover (Oct 9, 1995) and Walter Stanley (Nov. 27, 1986).

 Jones' punt return for a touchdown with five seconds remaining vs. the New York Jets (11/20) marked the second-latest game-winning punt return for a touchdown in regulation since 1970, trailing only DeSean Jackson (no time remaining on Dec. 19, 2010) who returned a punt 65-yards for a touchdown in Philadelphia's win at the New York Giants.

JONES' 84-YARD PUNT RETURN IS SECOND LONGEST GO-AHEAD TD IN 4TH QUARTER IN TEAM HISTORY

Jones' 84-yard punt return for a touchdown is the second longest goahead 4th quarter touchdown in team history. The only longer return was the 91-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown by Ron Burton at Denver on Nov. 11. 1962.

WEEK 11 AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

 Jones was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots 10-3 victory over the New York Jets in Week 11.

JONES JOINS DEION SANDERS AS TRIPLE-THREAT

 Jones registered his first career interception in the third quarter at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. He had a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo (12/1/22) and returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets (11/20/22). The only other NFL player with a receiving touchdown, a punt or kick returned for a touchdown and an interception in the same season is Deion Sanders in 1992.



SCHOOLER - SPECIAL TEAMS ACE

 Brenden Schooler recovered his second fumble on the punt return team when he recovered a muffed punt return by WR Chester Rogers in the fourth quarter at Cleveland (10/16/22). Schooler also recovered a muffed punt at Pittsburgh (9/18/22). Schooler had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles in 2022, including 11 solo special teams tackles.

SCHOOLER RECORDS 1ST CAREER BLOCKED FIELD GOAL

 Schooler blocked a 49-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter vs. Miami on Sept. 17, 2023 for his first career field goal block. It was the Patriots first blocked field goal attempt since DB Cody Davis blocked a 58-yard attempt at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020 that was returned 44 yards for a touchdown by S Devin McCourty. In 2022, the Patriots had one blocked kick when DB Jonathan Jones blocked a punt vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2022.

LEADER WITH 12 SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES

Schooler added three special teams tackles vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023 to reach double-digit totals It is the second straight year he has reached double-digit special teams tackles. As a rookie in 2022, he had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles. He is the first NFL player to begin his career with two straight 10-plus special teams tackle seasons since LB Grant Stuard with 11 special teams tackles in 2021 when he played with Tampa Bay and 11 special teams tackles in 2022 when he played for Indianapolis. Schooler has a NFL-leading 12 special teams tackles entering this week.

- Matthew Slater has earned an NFL record 10 special teams Pro Bowl invitations and will look to add to that in 2023. His 10 Pro Bowl berths with the Patriots are second to the 14 by Tom Brady.

- Slater has played in 236 regular season games, behind the 285 by Tom Brady.

- Slater has been named to 10 Pro Bowls for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the 13th straight season in 2023.
- He shared what it means to be a captain in a story published by The Boston Globe. "You have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

PRO BOWL RECORD

Slater has earned 10 Pro Bowl invitations (2011-17, 19-21) as a special teams player. Steve Tasker (1987, 90-95) has the second-most with seven Pro Bowl selections. Slater is also the only special teams player to earn seven consecutive Pro Bowls, which he did from 2011-17.



ALL-STAR COMBINATION

 Slater was voted to the Pro Bowl for seven straight seasons from 2011-17 and three more from 2019-21. Those 10 selections are three more than the seven that his father earned with the L.A. Rams. 

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014, turning a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

COMEBACKS FOR THE AGES

The Patriots have staged two historic come-from-behind victories over the past several seasons:

Bill Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games in which a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 had recorded 2,647 wins, seven losses and two ties, a winning percentage of .997.

New England came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).
