NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (6-4) AT ATLANTA FALCONS (4-5) Thursday, November 18, 2021 • Mercedes-Benz Stadium (71,000) • 8:20 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots and the Atlanta Falcons will meet in a Thursday Night Football Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. It will be the third straight regular season game between the two teams in a primetime, nationally-televised game. The Patriots and Falcons met on Sunday Night Football in 2013 and 2017 in the last two regular season meetings. Overall, it is the third straight primetime game between the two, including Super Bowl LI. The Patriots enter this week with six straight wins against the Falcons.

Thursday's meeting will be the Patriots first visit to Mercedes-Benz Stadium to face the Falcons. The Patriots played in the stadium when they beat the L.A. Rams, 13-3, on Feb. 3, 2019 when Atlanta was the host city for Super Bowl LIII.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: *:* This week's game will be broadcast by **FOX** and can be seen locally on **WFXT Channel 25**. **Joe Buck** will handle play-by-play duties with **Troy Aikman** as the color analyst. **Erin Andrews** and **Kristina Pink** will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Richie Zyontz** and directed by **Rich Russo**. The game will also stream on Amazon with **Andrea Kremer** and **Hannah Storm** calling the game.

NATIONAL RADIO: Thursday's game will be broadcast to a national audience on **Westwood One**. Ian Eagle will call the with game with **Tony Boselli** providing analysis.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 35 stations can be found on page 64. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by **Marc Cappello**.

Bill Belichick won his 250th regular season game with the Patriots to tie Tom Landry (250) and become the fourth NFL coach with at least 250 career regular season wins with one team.

PATRIOTS AT ATLANTA FALCONS

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and the Atlanta Falcons will meet in a Thursday Night Football Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. It will be the third straight regular season game between the two teams in a primetime, nationally-televised game. The Patriots and Falcons met on Sunday Night Football in 2013 and 2017 in the last two regular season meetings.

The Patriots enter this week with a streak of six straight wins against the Falcons, including a come-from-behind 34-28 overtime win in Super Bowl LI against the Falcons. It will be the first regular season meeting since a 23-7 New England win at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 22, 2017 in a Sunday Night game.

Thursday's meeting will be the Patriots first visit to Mercedes-Benz Stadium to face the Falcons. The Patriots played in the stadium when they beat the L.A. Rams, 13-3, on Feb. 3, 2019 as Atlanta was the host city for Super Bowl LIII. The last time the Patriots played the Falcons in Atlanta was on Sept. 29, 2013 at the Georgia Dome in a Sunday Night game, a 30-23 New England win.

The Patriots beat the Falcons, 34-28, in overtime in Super Bowl LI after overcoming a 28-3 deficit on Feb. 5, 2017 in Houston, Texas.

The Patriots have won the last five times the teams have played in the regular season. Prior to those five wins, the Patriots had suffered four straight losses to the Falcons dating back to 1989.

The New England Patriots improved to 5-2 after their defense came to life in a 23-7 victory over the Atlanta Falcons in a Sunday Night Football game in foggy conditions at Gillette Stadium.

The Patriots defense stopped the Falcons on three drives inside the New England 20-yard line with a blocked 37-yard field goal attempt by DL Cassius Marsh in the first quarter, a missed 36-yard field goal in the third quarter that hit the upright and a stop on a fourth-and-goal in the fourth quarter by LB Kyle Van Noy.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Patriots scored 17 points in the second quarter on all three drives and jumped to a 23-0 lead in the fourth quarter before Atlanta finally got on the board with just over four minutes to play to avoid the shutout.

QB Tom Brady finished 21-of-29 for 249 yards with two touchdown passes. After the first quarter blocked field goal, Brady and the Patriots offense took over and moved to the Atlanta 11-yard line where Brady threw a shovel pass to WR Brandin Cooks, who then used his speed to get into the end zone for a 7-0 lead. After stopping the Falcons on three straight plays, Brady engineered a 14-play, 64-yard drive that was highlighted by two third-down conversions, including a 27-yard pass to TE Rob Gronkowski on third-and-8. The drive resulted in a 29-yard field goal and a 10-0 lead.

New England got the ball back with 1:55 to play in the first half and executed a perfect two-minute drill, moving to the Atlanta 2-yard line where Brady connected with RB James White on a touchdown and 17-0 halftime lead.

Atlanta took the second half kick and drove to the New England 17-yard line where K Matt Bryant's 36-yard field goal attempt hit the upright. The Patriots took advantage of the situation with a 71-yard drive to the three-yard line where Gostkowski connected on a 21-yard field goal for a 20-0 lead.

The Falcons had two plays from the New England 1-yard line in the fourth quarter. On third-and-1 QB Matt Ryan attempted a pass to WR Julio Jones in the end zone but the play was broken up by Cb Malcolm Butler. Atlanta elected to go for it on fourth down but Van Noy stopped Falcons WR Taylor Gabriel on a jet sweep to give the ball back to New England.

The ensuing drive ended in a 38-yard field goal by Gostkowski for a 23-0 lead.

The Patriots rushed for a season-high of 162 yards.

The last time that a player has averaged 10-plus yards per return with at least 20 returns in consecutive seasons was Darren Sproles in 2014 and 2015. Ted Ginn accomplished the feat for six consecutive seasons, from 2010-15.
- Olszewski is looking to become the first Patriots player to lead the NFL in punt return average in two straight seasons and the first NFL player to do so since Devin Hester in 2010 and 2011.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR...

- Mac Jones has completed over 70 percent of his passes in six of his first ten NFL games. The rookie record is nine games by Dak Prescott. The NFL record is 13 games by Drew Brees in 2017.
- Mac Jones has passed for 2,333 yards during the first ten games and is on pace for 3,966 passing yards for the season. He leads all rookie quarterbacks in passing yards (2,333) completions (223), completion percentage (69.0) and touchdown passes (13). Only three rookie quarterbacks have ever passed for at least 4,000 yards.
- After ten games, Jones' completion percentage is 69.0. The best completion percentage for a season by a rookie quarterback is Dak Prescott at 67.7 percent in 2016.
- Jones had his first career three-touchdown performance last week against the Browns. It marked his fourth game in 2021 with at least two touchdowns. The NFL record for most games with at least two touchdown passes by a rookie quarterback is Justin Herbert of the Los Angeles Chargers with 10 games in 2020.



Jones has a 4-0 road record to start his NFL career. He is the first rookie QB to win his first four road games since Dak Prescott in 2016. The most consecutive road wins to start a season by a rookie QB is six by Roethlisberger (2004) and Prescott.

The Patriots have never had a wide receiver complete more than two passes in a single season. Julian Edelman completed two passes in 2018, 2019 and 2020, and Harold Jackson completed two passes in 1980. In addition to the Tampa Bay game, Meyers completed two passes, both for touchdowns, in 2020.

PATRIOTS SCORE ON A 99-YARD DRIVE IN SECOND QUAR-TER;THIRD DRIVE OF 99 YARDS SINCE 2000

The Patriots capped an 11-play 99-yard drive with a 23-yard touchdown pass from QB Mac Jones to WR Kendrick Bourne. It is the first 99-yard drive for New England since a 10-play, 99-yard drive that was culminated by a 10-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Rob Gronkowski vs. San Diego on Sept. 18, 2011. Since 2000, the Patriots have now had three drives of 99 yards. Brady completed a 99-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker at Miami on Sept. 12, 2011. Those are the only 99-yard drive for the Patriots since 1980.

SUNDAY DRIVES

PATRIOTS EXTEND NFL RECORD TO 96 STRAIGHT GAMES SCORING IN FIRST HALF

The Patriots also own the second-longest streak at 82 games with a first half score (2006-11). The Patriots rushed for a season-high of 184 yards against a Cleveland defense that entered the game ranked third in the NFL, allowing just 84.8 rushing yards per game.

THE PATRIOTS OFFENSE SCORES OVER 40 POINTS FOR THE SECOND TIME IN 2021

The Patriots scored 45 unanswered points in a 45-7 win after falling behind 7-0 in the first quarter. It is the second time in 2021 that the Patriots have scored over 40 points. The Patriots beat the New York Jets, 54-13 on Oct. 24, 2021.

THE PATRIOTS SCORED ON SEVEN OF THEIR NINE DRIVES

The Patriots scored on seven of their nine offensive drives, including all four drives in the first half. It is the second time in 2021 that the Patriots scored on every drive in the first half. HUNTER HENRY HAS SCORED IN SIX OF LAST SEVEN GAMES



Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09). Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (337), division titles (19), winning percentage (.688), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (21).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 27 seasons of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention



to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (23) and are tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest losing seasons (3) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 27 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 21 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons, and finished with a winning record 23 times.

A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the milestone. AI Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

A WINNING TRADITION II

Kraft's winning percentage with the Patriots (.688) since taking over the team in 1994 is the highest among all owners/ownership groups with at least 200 wins (regular and postseason) with one team. He is one of just four owners with at least 200 wins and a winning percentage over .600.

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 337 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 337-153 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 27 times in their 61-year history. Twenty-one of those playoff berths have come in the 27 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns, including 17 in the last 20 seasons and 19 of which have come since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994.

Since Kraft took ownership of the team in 1994, the Patriots have had just three head coaches - Bill Parcells (1994-96), Pete Carroll (1997-99) and current head coach Bill Belichick (2000-present). The only team with fewer head coaches since 1994 is the Pittsburgh Steelers, who have had two: Bill Cowher (1992-2006) and Mike Tomlin (2007-present).

PATRIOTS POINTS OF INTEREST IN 2021

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in the NFL with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver and Pittsburgh have played in eight.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, one behind the 16 by Pittsburgh and San Francisco.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Pittsburgh is second with 36 playoff wins all-time.
- The New England Patriots earned seven No. 1 seeds, behind Denver (8) and San Francisco (9) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since the current playoff format was instituted in 1990. Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with nine byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 58 postseason games, fourth-most in NFL history behind Dallas (63), Pittsburgh (62) and Green Bay (60).
 The Patriots need to play in two more postseason games in 2021
- to become the fourth NFL team to play in 60 postseason games.
- The Patriots are second with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 14 seasons with 12 victories
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 10.
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- New England has 27 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Indianapolis is second with 17 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 34 winning seasons since 1970, second all-time behind Pittsburgh's 37.



- The Patriots have 562 total victories, tied with Green Bay for the third-most wins since 1960, behind the 573 wins by Pittsburgh and the 568 wins by Dallas.
- New England has played in 1,000 games in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) They became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games vs. Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021.
- With rookie free agent K Quinn Nordin making the initial 53-man roster in 2021, the Patriots have now had a rookie free agent make the opening day roster for the 18th straight season, the third-longest streak in the NFL. The L.A. Chargers have had a rookie free agent make their opening day roster for 25 straight seasons and Indianapolis has had a rookie free agent make their opening day roster for 23 straight seasons.
- The Patriots have finished in the top 10 for fewest points allowed in each of the last nine seasons (2012-2020) and need to accomplish the feat in 2021 to tie Tampa Bay, who became the last team to reach 10 straight seasons (1996-2005) for the fewest points allowed. The 2021 Patriots are 2nd with 17.7 points allowed per game.

PATRIOTS DEFENSE PRODUCES FOUR INTERCEPTIONS; END FIRST TWO JETS DRIVES WITH INTERCEPTIONS

The Patriots had four interceptions against the Jets (9/19/21), the most picks in a single game since they had four at Cincinnati on Dec. 15, 2019. The Patriots had four games with four picks total in 2019, including their game on Oct. 21, at the New York Jets, the only other time the Patriots picked off four passes against the Jets. The Patriots ended the first two Jets drives with interceptions from CB J.C. Jackson and DB Adrian Phillips, leading to 10 points. Jackson added a second interception in the second quarter, and Devin McCourty had a pick in the third quarter. The Patriots finished tied for the NFL lead with Pittsburgh and New Orleans with 18 interceptions in 2020. The Patriots have 8 picks so far in 2021.

PATRIOTS SCORE 50

The Patriots finished with 54 points against the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021, the 14th time in team history that the team has scored at least 50 points. It is the 9th time scoring at least 50 points under Bill Belichick and the first since a 51-17 win vs Jacksonville on Sept. 27, 2015. The 54 points are the 7th most points scored in team history.

PATRIOTS SCORE 50 AGAINST THE JETS FOR THE THIRD TIME IN TEAM HISTORY

The 50-point output marks the third 50-point game the Patriots have produced against the Jets. The Patriots scored a 56-3 win vs. the Jets on Sept. 9, 1979 and a 55-21 victory vs. the Jets on Oct. 29, 1978.

PATRIOTS EXPLODE FOR 31 POINTS IN THE FIRST HALF

The Patriots scored 31 points in the first half against the Jets (10/24). It is the 12th time in team history that they have had a 30-point first half, the 10th time under Bill Belichick and the first since a 30-13 halftime lead in a 36-20 win at New Orleans on Sept. 17, 2017.

PATRIOTS TIE TEAM RECORD WITH FOUR RUSHING TDS

The Patriots tied a team record with four rushing touchdowns in the win against the Jets (10/24). The Patriots have had four rushing touchdowns in a game 10 times overall. They have accomplished the mark four times against the Jets – Sept. 8, 1963, Oct. 18, 1976, Oct. 29, 1978 and Oct. 24, 2021.

PATRIOTS OFFENSE PRODUCES 32 FIRST DOWNS

The Patriots offense produced 32 first downs in the win against the New York Jets (10/24), the 12th time in team history that they have had at least 32 first downs. It is the most since tying a team record with 35 first downs in the win vs. Jacksonville on Sept. 27, 2015.

Kendrick Bourne's 25-yard touchdown pass to Nelson Agholor against the Jets on Oct. 24 was the third pass completion by a Patriots wide receiver in 2021. Jakobi Meyers completed two passes vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3. The 2020 Patriots had four completions by wide receivers. The most passes completed by a New England team by non-quarterbacks was seven in 1981.

PATRIOTS TIED FOR 2ND WITH 14 INTERCEPTIONS

The Patriots are tied for second in the NFL with 14 interceptions in 2021. In 2020, the Patriots tied for the NFL lead with Miami, New Orleans and Pittsburgh with 18 interceptions. The 2019 New England team led the NFL with 25 interceptions. Two teams have led the NFL in interceptions in three or more straight seasons: Kansas City (5 straight – 1966-70) and the New York Giants (3 straight – 1937-39). Overall, the Patriots have led the NFL in interceptions four times (2003, 2010, 2019 and 2020).

LOCKDOWN DEFENSE

The 2021 Patriots defense is ranked 6th in the NFL. Under Bill Belichick, the Patriots have had a defense finish in the top 10 eight times, including the 2019 defense that finished first in the NFL.



Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win six Super Bowl titles. He won more games overall (141) during a 10-year stretch (2010-19) than any other coach in NFL history. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 47 consecutive years as an NFL coach are most in NFL history, passing the 45 by Dick LeBeau. The only other NFL coach with at least 40 consecutive NFL coaching seasons is Tom Moore with 41.

HIGH COMPLETION PCT.

• New England Patriots 2021 first-round draft pick Mac Jones made his first NFL start in the season-opener vs. Miami on Sept. 12 and completed 29-of-39 passes for 281 yards with one touchdown for a completion percentage of 74.4. That is the fourth-highest completion percentage by a rookie in Week 1 since 1970 (min. 10 attempts).

MAC JONES - FIRST NFL QB WITH 70-PLUS COMPLETION PERCENTAGE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

• Jones followed a 74.4 completion percentage in the opener against Miami by completing 73.3 percent of his passes (22-of-30 passes) for 186 yards at the NY Jets (9/19). He is the first quarterback with a 70plus completion percentage in each of his first two games (min. 10 attempts in each game). He has now completed over 70 percent of his passes in five of his first nine NFL games.

JONES COMPLETES 19 CONSECUTIVE PASSES TO TIE TEAM MARK

Jones completed 19 straight passes during a stretch from the second quarter to the fourth quarter vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3, tied for the longest streak in team history. Tom Brady had a streak of 19 consecutive passes in Week 1 of the 2015 season vs. Pittsburgh on Sept. 10, 2015. The streak of 19 consecutive completions is the most by a rookie in at least the last 40 years.

MAC JONES TIES RECORD FOR MOST COMPLETIONS BY A ROOKIE IN FIRST FIVE STARTS

Mac Jones tied Joe Burrow (135 completions in 2020) for the most completions by a rookie quarterback in his first five starts in NFL history.

A SPECIAL BIRTHDAY PERFOR-MANCE

• Meyers set career highs on his 24th birthday (11/09/20) with 12 receptions for 169 yards in a win over the New York Jets. The 12 receptions were the most by a Patriot since Julian Edelman caught 13 passes at Miami on Dec. 15, 2013.

• Meyers has the most receptions and receiving yards for any undrafted player who signed with the Patriots as an undrafted free agent.

MEYERS USING HIS ARM

• Meyers threw two touchdown passes in 2020. He completed a 24yard touchdown pass to RB Rex Burkhead vs. Baltimore (11/15) and a 19-yard touchdown pass to QB Cam Newton vs. N.Y. Jets (1/3). Overall, Patriots wide receivers completed four passes in 2020. WR Julian Edelman also completed two passes. The four pass completions by wide receivers are the most in team history. They have three so far in 2021.

MULTIPLE TDS FROM JAKOBI

• Meyers (two touchdown passes) became the third Patriots wide receiver to throw a touchdown pass under head coach Bill Belichick. David Patten threw a 60-yard touchdown pass on Oct. 21, 2001, at Indianapolis and WR Julian Edelman threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to WR Phillip Dorsett at Philadelphia on Nov. 17, 2019. Kendrick Bourne became the fourth to do so with a 25-yard touchdown to WR Nelson Agholor vs. N.Y. Jets on Oct. 24, 2021.

JAKOBI JOINS ELITE CLUB

• Meyers, who threw touchdown passes in Weeks 10 and 17 in 2020, became the fourth wide receiver with two touchdown passes in a single season in the Super Bowl era, joining Rod Gardner (2003), Antwaan Randle El (2010) and Odell Beckham Jr. (2018).

JAKOBI MEYERS COMPLETES TWO PASSES IN ONE GAME

• Meyers completed two passes vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3, 2021. He caught a backwards pass from QB Mac Jones and then threw across the field to RB Brandon Bolden, who managed a 15-yard gain in the second quarter. He completed a 30-yard pass to WR Nelson Agholor in the fourth quarter on a flea flicker. The only other wide receiver to complete two passes in single game for New England was Julian Edelman vs. Denver on Oct. 18, 2020. The only other non-quarterbacks to complete two passes in a game for New England were running backs – Dick Christy on Nov. 18, 1960 vs. Dallas Texans and Andy Johnson on Sept. 6, 1981 vs. Baltimore Colts.

"When I was younger in high school, I made [Newton's] 7-on-7 team – his all-star team – and we traveled to Florida to play in a league," Meyers said. "We ended up losing, but it was still a great experience. It was a good experience to meet Cam when I was very young. A lot of guys where I come from look up to him, so that was definitely a once-in-a lifetime opportunity for me."

A FAMOUS NAMESAKE

• A noted sports fan and basketball enthusiast, Shaq's mother, Alicia McGuire, named her son Shaquille Olajuwon Mason in 1993 after her two favorite NBA stars at the time, Shaquille O'Neal and Hakeem Olajuwon. The Tennessee native had the opportunity to meet one of his namesakes at a Memphis Grizzlies game while O'Neal was a member of the Miami Heat, receiving a special meet-and-greet and having his jersey signed.

LB JA'WHAUN BENTLEY

2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- LB Ja'Whaun Bentley set single-season career-highs with 91 tackles and $1\!\!\!/_2$ sacks in 2020.



Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on couches and floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.

LB JAMIE COLLINS SR.

PATH TO THE NFL

- The road to the NFL was anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins Sr. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Quentin, Miss., Collins Sr. lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters. Collins Sr. turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times.
- "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins Sr. told the Boston Herald. "It kept me on track." Collins Sr.'s resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native and former Patriots teammate Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend.
- "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the Herald in 2013. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and still finds a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and done a pretty good job as a rookie."

SACKS AND PICKS

• Since entering the NFL in 2013, Collins is the player in the NFL with at least 25 sacks and 10 interceptions. Collins has accumulated 26 ½ sacks and 12 picks during his career. He is the first player to accomplish the feat within his first 100 career games.

LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER

WINNER ON MULTIPLE LEVELS

 Dont'a Hightower (three Super Bowl championships and two national titles at Alabama) and Russell Maryland (two national championships at Miami and three Super Bowl Championships with Dallas) are the only two players in NFL history with at least two national championships and two Super Bowl wins.

MR. FEBRUARY

- Hightower has made two Super-Bowl altering plays during his career and was part of a record-setting performance in another. Head coach Bill Belichick referred to Hightower as "Mr. February" at the team's Super Bowl LIII ring ceremony.
- In Super Bowl XLIX vs. Seattle, Hightower made a crucial tackle on Seahawks RB Marshawn Lynch at the 1-yard line the play before CB Malcolm Butler intercepted Seattle QB Russell Wilson to seal the victory in the waning moments.
- New England trailed the Atlanta Falcons, 28-12, midway through the fourth quarter when Hightower strip-sacked Falcons QB Matt Ryan at the Atlanta 25-yard line. The fumble was recovered by the Patriots and the turnover led to a touchdown that helped spark the record comeback in Super Bowl LI.
- Led a defensive unit in the Super Bowl LIII win over the L.A. Rams (2/3/19). Hightower recorded two sacks and a pass defensed as part of a stifling defense that became the second team in Super Bowl history to hold its opponent to just three points.

DB J.C. JACKSON

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

- J.C. Jackson led the Patriots with nine interceptions in 2020. Asante Samuel set the team record for most interceptions in consecutive seasons with 16. Samuel picked off 10 passes in 2006 and six in 2007.
- Jackson has 22 interceptions since 2018, the most in the NFL over that span.
- Jackson led the NFL with 11 takeaways in 2020. From 2019-20, Jackson had a total of 16 takeaways, tied with Ron Hall (1963-64) and Asante Samuel (2006-07) for the best

two-year total in New England. The Patriots record for most takeaways in a three-year span is 22 by Ron Hall (1964-66 - (20 interceptions and two fumble recoveries). Jackson now has 21 total takeaways since 2019 (19 interceptions and two fumble recoveries).

EXCLUSIVE INT CLUB

• Jackson became the fifth Patriot and first since Asante Samuel (2006-07) to net at least five interceptions in consecutive seasons. Jackson has five picks so far in 2021 and is the third Patriots player with at least five interceptions in three straight seasons. He is the only NFL player to have at least five picks in the last three seasons.

J.C. JACKSON HAS A PICK AGAINST JETS FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT GAME

J.C. Jackson registered his first interception of the 2021 season when he intercepted a Zach Wilson pass in the first quarter to give the Patriots a first down at the Jets 35-yard line at the NY Jets (9/19). It was his third straight pick against the Jets after intercepting a pass in both Jets games in 2020. He also picked off a pass in the second Jets game (10/24) in 2021 for his fourth straight game against the Jets with a pick to join Baltimore's Eric Waddle, who had four interceptions against Cleveland (2016-17) as the last player to accomplish the feat.

JACKSON HAD TWO PICKS IN A GAME FOR FOURTH TIME IN HIS CAREER

Jackson had two interceptions at Carolina on Nov. 7, 2021, his fourth time recording two interceptions in a game and the second time in 2021. He had two picks at the N.Y. Jets (9/19). He also had two picks at Buffalo on Sept. 29, 2019 and two picks at Cincinnati on Dec. 15, 2019.

JACKSON HAD FIRST PICK SIX

Jackson returned an interception 88 yards for a touchdown int he win at Carolina on Nov. 7, 2021. It is the sixth-longest interception return in team history.

JACKSON TIED FOR FIRST IN THE NFL IN PASSES DEFENSED

Jackson is tied for first in the NFL with Dallas Trevon Diggs with 12 passes defensed. Jackson had a career-high of 14 passes defensed in 2020.



J.C. JACKSON RETURNS PICK 88 YARDS FOR A TOUCHDOWN

CB J.C. Jackson returned a third quarter interception 88 yards for a touchdown for his first career score. It is the second straight week that the Patriots have scored on an interception return following Adrian Phillips' pick six at the LA Chargers. It is also the sixth-longest return in team history. Jackson's previous longest return was 30 yards vs. Denver on Oct. 18, 2020.

JACKSON NOW HAS 22 INTERCEPTIONS THROUGH FIRST FOUR SEASONS

Jackson now has 22 interceptions through his first four NFL seasons, tying Mike Haynes for the most through a player's first four seasons with the Patriots.

LB MATTHEW JUDON

REPRESENTING FAMILY

• Matthew Judon wore jersey #99 during his five seasons with the Baltimore Ravens but chose jersey #9 upon joining New England in 2021.

• Said Judon, "I'm one of 10 children, so I got nine siblings. Every time I go out there, I represent them. I like nine. That's one of the reasons I rock it. Ninety-nine was taken, so I chose to use the new rule and getting on it."



LB MATT JUDON HAS EIGHTH TWO-SACK GAME; SECOND OF THE 2021 SEASON

• LB Matt Judon had two sacks in a three-play sequence in the second quarter at Houston (10/10/21). It is the 8th time in his career that he has had a multi-sack game and second time in 2021. He had 2 ½ sacks vs. New Orleans on Sept. 26. His career-best is 3 sacks vs. Oakland on Nov. 25, 2018, when he played for Baltimore. His best season total is 9 ½ sacks in 2019. In 2020, DL Chase Winovich led the team with 5 ½ sacks. Judon is tied for second in 2021 with 9 sacks.


Devin McCourty is sixth all-time in New England history with 35 total takeaways. He needs five total takeaways to join Raymond Clayborn (44), Fred Marion (42) and Ty Law (40) as the only players in team history with 40 total takeaways.



- McCourty enters 2021 tied with Ty Law for second-most Pro Bowl invitations as a Patriots defensive back with four. Only CB Mike Haynes (6) had more Pro Bowl nods as a Patriots defensive back.
- McCourty tied for fourth in the NFL with five interceptions in 2019, his third career season with five-plus interceptions. That mark tied Marcus Peters and Earl Thomas for most seasons with five-plus interception seasons since 2010. Additionally, McCourty's 29 regular season interceptions since he entered the league in 2010 are tied for the fifth-most in the NFL over that span.
- McCourty has played in 181 career regular season games. If he plays in all 16 games in 2021 he will have played in the 10th-most games in New England history.

2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- McCourty had his first pick of the season at the NY Jets (9/19) and moved into a tie for third place on the Patriots all-time interception list with Ron Hall, Roland James and Fred Marion with 29, behind Ty Law (36) and Raymond Clayborn (36).
- McCourty now has 515 interception return yards in his regular season career and became the third Patriot with 500 return yards at the NY Jets (9/19).

THE MOST IMPORTANT ABILITY IS AVAILABILITY

• McCourty has played the most defensive snaps since he entered the NFL in 2010 with 11,042 defensive snaps. Malcolm Jenkins (New Orleans and Philadelphia) is second with 10,961 defensive snaps.

McCOUR-TD

• McCourty has four career touchdowns following return of a blocked field goal for a touchdown at L.A. Chargers (12/6/20) and his 43-yard interception return for a touchdown at Seattle (9/20/20). McCourty also had an 84-yard interception return for a touchdown at Buffalo in 2018 and a 104-yard kickoff return vs. N.Y. Jets in 2012.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

• After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots in 2018 (now with Miami). The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. In the 2018 season opener, Devin and Jason became the first set of twins to play together on the same NFL team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louisville Colonels.

• Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

IN GOOD COMPANY

• Devin McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

BROTHERS IN ARMS

• Devin and Jason McCourty have seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. It is the Patriots first interception returned for a touchdown since DB Devin McCourty returned a pick 43 yards for a touchdown at Seattle on Sept. 20, 2020. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.

BAILEY SETS TEAM RECORD

Jake Bailey finished first in the NFL with 45.6 net yards per punt in 2020, a new single-season team record. The previous record was 41.5 by Zoltan Mesko in 2011. His gross punt average of 48.7 is also a team record, besting the 46.5 gross average by Mesko in 2011. His 45.6 net yards per punt is second all-time in NFL history in a single season to the 46.0 net average by Johnny Hekker in 2016 with the Rams.

DIMINISHING [PUNT] RETURNS

Bailey's punting in 2020 allowed a total of just 71 punt return yards on 12 returns. It is the fewest punt return yards allowed by the Patriots in team history and the sixth-fewest punt return yards allowed in a season in NFL history. The 12 punt returns allowed are second in NFL history and team history to the 11 by New England in 2008.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

Justin Bethel has reached double-digit special teams tackles in each of his nine NFL seasons, and will try to reach 10 straight in 2021. Bethel led the team with 14 special teams tackles in 2020.

WR GUNNER OLSZEWSKI

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

Gunner Olszewski will attempt to become the first New England player to lead the NFL in two straight years in punt return average and the first NFL player to do so since Devin Hester led the NFL in 2010 and 2011.

Olszewski will look to become the first NFL player to average 17.0-yards per punt return or more in back-to-back seasons. Devin Hester owns the best mark with a 17.1-yard average in 2010 followed by 16.2yard average in 2011. He is currently second in the NFL with an 13.8-yard punt return average so far in 2021.



PUNT RETURN RECORD

WR Gunner Olszewski finished first in the NFL with a 17.3-yard punt return average (20 returns for 346 yards and one touchdown) in 2020. It is the highest return average in Patriots history and the second-highest in the NFL since 1970. Julian Edelman had the highest average in a season at 15.5 in 2012. Olszewski is the fourth Patriots player to lead the league in punt return average. Danny Amendola led the NFL with a 12.0-yard average in 2015, Troy Brown led in 2001 with a 14.2-yard average and Irving Fryar tied for the NFL lead with a 14.1-yard average in 1985.

OLSZEWSKI SCORES FIRST NFL TD ON A PUNT RETURN

WR Gunner Olszewski scored his first NFL touchdown on a 70-yard punt return at the L.A. Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020. It was the first punt return for a touchdown for New England since WR Julian Edelman returned a punt 84 yards vs. Denver on Nov. 2, 2014. Olszewski's return came on the heels of an 82-yard punt return for a touchdown that was called back due to a penalty in the previous game.

NO. 2 ON SINGLE GAME LIST

Olszewski finished with 145 punt return yards in the win at the L.A. Chargers (12/6/20), the second-most ever by a Patriot in a single game.

GUNNER GOES LONG TWICE

Olszewski scored on a 70-yard punt return touchdown and had a 61yard return in the Patriots win at the L.A. Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020. He is the first player in Patriots history with two punt returns of at least 60 yards in a single game and the first NFL player to do so since Indianapolis RB Nyheim Hines had 84 and 71-yard punt return touchdowns vs. Carolina on Dec. 22, 2019. Before Olszewski, the two longest punt returns in a single game for the Patriots was Julian Edelman on Nov. 18, 2012, vs. Indianapolis with a 68-yard punt returned for a touchdown and a 49-yard return.

GAME BALL TO GUNNER

Olszewski scored his first touchdown reception on a career-long 38yard pass in the win at the L.A. Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020. Olszewski joined Julian Edelman (vs. Denver in 2014 and vs. Indianapolis in 2012), Stanley Morgan (vs. Baltimore in 1979) and Irving Fryar (vs. Indianapolis in 1985) as the only Patriots with a punt returned touchdown and a touchdown reception in the same game.

GUNNER OLSZEWSKI GOES LONG THREE TIMES

Gunner Olszewski had three 20-yard punt returns at the L.A. Chargers on Oct. 31, 2021 with a 20-yard return, a 21-yard return and a 27-yard return. The last NFL player with three punt returns of 20 or more yards in a single game was Nyheim Hines of Indianapolis on Dec. 22, 2019 vs. Tennessee. The last New England player to do so was Troy Brown on Sept. 11, 2000 at the New York Jets (31, 21 and 38-yard returns).

OLSZEWSKI MOVING UP TO HISTORIC RECORD

Olszewski has returned 58 punts for 773 yards for a 13.3-yard punt return average. The NFL uses 75 punt returns to qualify for the NFL record, which is 12.8 yards per return by George McAfee.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

• Matthew Slater has earned an NFL record nine special teams Pro Bowl invitations and will look to add to that in 2021.

• Slater entered his 14th season with the Patriots in 2021, tied with Stephen Gostkowski, Bruce Armstrong and Steve Nelson for the fourth-most in team history, behind the 15 by Troy Brown and Julius Adams, the 16 by Steve Grogan and the 20 by Tom Brady.

• Slater has played in 199 regular season games. If he plays in all 16 games in 2021 he will reach 205, the fourth-most in team history and will be one of five players to play in 200 regular season games for the Patriots.

2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Slater earned his ninth Pro Bowl invitation in 2020, extending his NFL record for most Pro Bowl selections as a special teamer. Slater is now tied with John Hannah (1976, 78-85) for second-most Pro Bowl selections as a Patriot with nine. Tom Brady holds the franchise record with 14.

LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

Slater is one of 10 sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

• Slater was voted to the Pro Bowl for seven straight seasons from 2011-17 and two more from 2019-20. Those nine selections are two more than the seven that his father earned with the L.A. Rams. The Slater family's 16 combined Pro Bowls are the second-most among father-son contingents to have been voted to at least one Pro Bowl each.

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

• Slater has been named to nine Pro Bowls (2011-17, 19-20) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the 11th straight season in 2021.

• The special teams ace shared what it means to be a captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "You have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

• Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

SLATER'S SCORE

• During a 2007 game against Arizona State, UCLA's Matthew Slater returned a kickoff 89 yards for the final touchdown of his collegiate career. In the Patriots 16-10 win over Buffalo on Sept. 29, 2019, DB J.C. Jackson blocked a punt, which Slater returned 11 yards for his first NFL touchdown, 12 seasons after his last touchdown.



K NICK FOLK

LOCAL LINEAGE

Nick Folk's mother is a direct descendant of William Bradford, a founder, settler and longtime governor of the Plymouth Colony settlement. Bradford was also a passenger on the *Mayflower*'s original voyage to America.

FOLK HERO

Folk kicked his second game-winning field goal as time expired in 2020, connecting on a 50-yard field goal against Arizona (11/29/20) to give the Patriots a 20-17 win.



He had a 51-yard game-winning field goal as time expired at the New York Jets on Nov. 9, 2020 to give the Patriots a 30-27 victory. He is the first NFL kicker with two game-winning field goals as time expired in a single season. Overall, he has three-game-winning field goals as time expired. He also kicked a 53-yard field game-winning field goal as time expired at Buffalo on Oct. 8, 2007, when he was a rookie with the Dallas Cowboys.

FOLK DIGS THE LONG BALL

Folk's 50-yard game-winning field goal vs. Arizona (11/29/20) was the second-longest game-winning field goal with no time left in Patriots history, behind the 51-yarder he hit at N.Y. Jets (11/9). The previous long was 48 yards by Adam Vinatieri in Super Bowl XXXVI vs. the St. Louis Rams.

NICK FOLK SETS TEAM RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS

K Nick Folk set the team record with 33 consecutive field goals after connecting on field goals of 46, 49, 32 and 26 yards at the New York (9/19/21) and extended that mark to 36 straight field with a 27-yarder vs. Tampa Bay before missing a 56-yarder in the fourth quarter. He passed Stephen Gostkowski, who connected on 31 straight field goals. After missing his first two field goals of the 2020 season, he kicked 36 straight field goals. Folk's previous longest streak was 23 straight field goals in 2013 when he played for the New York Jets. The NFL record is 44 straight field goals by Adam Vinatieri.

NICK FOLK DRILLS TWO 52-YARD FIELD GOALS LONGEST FIELD GOALS AS A MEMBER OF THE PATRIOTS

K Nick Folk drilled a 52-yard field goal in the second quarter and 52yard field goal in the third quarter at Houston (10/10/21), his longest field goals as a member of the Patriots. He had a 51-yard field goal on Dec. 21, 2019 vs. Buffalo and a 51-yard field goal at the New York Jets on Nov. 9, 2020. His career-long is a 56-yard field goal on Oct. 17, 2010 at Denver when he played for the New York Jets.

FOLK HAS SECOND NFL GAME WITH TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS

Folk had his second NFL game with two 50-yard field goals at Houston (10/10/21) He had two 51-yard field goals on Nov. 18, 2012 t St. Louis as a member of the New York Jets.

FOLK BECOMES SECOND PATS PLAYER TO CONNECT ON TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS IN ONE GAME

Folk is the second Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in one game after he drilled two 52-yard field goals at Houston on Oct. 10, 2021. K Stephen Gostkowski accomplished the feat three times with the most recent happening against Oakland on Nov. 19, 2017 in Mexico City.

FOLK 4-FOR-4 ON FIELD GOALS IN THREE 2021 ROAD GAMES


Folk connected on all four field goals (52, 52, 32 and 21) at Houston on Oct. 10, 201 and was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week. He connected on four field goal at the NY Jets (9/19) and at LA Chargers (10/31). Overall he has had at least four field goals in a game 12 times and four times as a member of the Patriots. He has connected on five field goals in a game twice.

NICK FOLK CONNECTS ON HIS 300TH CAREER FIELD GOAL

Nick Folk (307) became the 35th NFL player to reach 300 career field goals following his 39-yard field goal in the second quarter. at the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021. He became the fifth active kicker to reach 300 career field goals, joining Robbie Gould (404), Mason Crosby (359), Matt Prater (335) and Justin Tucker (308).

FOLK MAKES 3RD 50-YARD FIELD GOAL OF THE 2021 SEASON

Folk connected on a 50-yard field goal in the third quarter against the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021. He made two 52-yard field goals at Houston on Oct. 10 and now has three 50-yard field goals for the 2021 season. Stephen Gostkowski (5 in 2013), (4 in 2017) and (4 in 2015) is the only New England player with more than two 50-yard field goals in a single season.

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 27 times in their 60-year history. PLAYOFF BERTHS UNDER KRAFT

New England has qualified for the playoffs 27 times in the team's 61-year history. The Patriots have earned 21 of those playoff berths in the 27 seasons since Rob-

ert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 22 division crowns overall (21 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1976, '85, '94 and '98). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.



ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT

The Patriots are also the only team to win more than half of their games in 19 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, more than the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-98) and the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85).

SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014, turning a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. - Rob Gronkowski caught a 2-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady with 1:57 left in the first half to make the score 24-7 and cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive.
- After the Patriots defense forced a three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.
- On the Bears first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown that gave the Patriots a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

COMEBACKS FOR THE AGES

The Patriots have staged two historic come-from-behind victories over the past several seasons:

Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games in which a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 had recorded 2,647 wins, seven losses and two ties, a winning percentage of .997.

New England came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).
