GAME SUMMARY

NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (10-5) vs. NEW YORK JETS (4-11) Sunday, Dec. 30, 2018 • Gillette Stadium (65,878) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will close out the regular season at home against the New York Jets. Last week, the Patriots clinched the AFC East for the 10th straight season with a 24-12 win over the Buffalo Bills. A win over the Jets will give the Patriots their 13th playoff bye since the 2001.

The Patriots are the only team in the NFL that is undefeated at home. A win over the Jets will give the Patriots their seventh undefeated season at home. (2003-04, 07, 09-10 and 13).

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by **CBS** and can be seen locally on **WBZ-TV Channel 4. Ian Eagle** will handle play-by-play duties with **Dan Fouts** as the color analyst. **Evan Washburn** will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Mark Wolff** and directed by **Bob Fishman**.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 41 stations can be found in this press release. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback **Scott Zolak**, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by **Marc Cappello**.

BYE-ING IN

With a win over the Jets on Sunday, the Patriots can secure a first-round playoff bye in 2018 for the 13th time since 2001, a feat unmatched by any team in the last 18 years. New England can also secure a first-round bye for the ninth consecutive season to extend an NFL record. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995 and Denver had four straight from 2012 through 2015.

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and New York Jets will meet for the second time in 2018 with the Patriots looking for their 19th series sweep, the third straight, 12th since Robert Kraft purchased the team and 10th of the Bill Belichick era. The Patriots beat the Jets, 27-13, on Nov. 25, at MetLife Stadium.

New England will close out the regular season by hosting the Jets for the second straight season. Last year, the Patriots ran away with a 26-6 victory over the Jets in the regular-season finale at Gillette Stadium.

New England leads the series 64-54-1 overall. The Patriots are 34-25-1 all-time against the Jets at home, including 13-3 at Gillette Stadium in the regular season and 1-1 at home in the playoffs.

The teams have played in the postseason three times – a 1985 Wild Card game, a 2006 Wild Card game and an AFC Divisional game in 2010. New England beat the Jets, 26-14, in 1985 at the Meadowlands en route to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium and the Jets beat the Patriots, 28-21, in a 2010 Divisional Playoff game in Foxborough.

New England is 35-16 against the Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994.

New England's 64 overall victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second most over any single opponent, trailing only the 73 (4) all-time wins over Buffalo.

The New England Patriots improved to 8-3 after a 27-13 victory over the New York Jets at MetLife Stadium. The win clinched the Patriots an 18th straight season with a .500 record or better. That ranks second in NFL history to only the Dallas Cowboys, who had 21 in a row from 1965-85.

QB Tom Brady threw two touchdown passes and became the NFL's career leader in total yards passing in the regular season and playoffs combined. Brady also reached 3,000 yards passing for the 16th season, tying Peyton Manning and Drew Brees for second all-time behind the 18 by Brett Favre.

Rookie RB Sony Michel ran for a career-high 133 yards and the team finished with 215 yards rushing for 6.0 yard average. RB James White had a career-best 74 yards rushing, including a 24-yard run in the fourth quarter from the New England 7-yard line with 1:48 left to play, allowing the Patriots to run out the clock and secure the win.

The score was tied at 13 late in the third quarter when a 27-yard pass from Brady to WR Chris Hogan followed by a 27- yard run by White helped the offense get in position for a 21-yard touchdown pass from Brady to WR Julian Edelman. With that score, the Patriots took the lead for good.

A 33-yard run by Michel early in the fourth quarter aided a New England drive that reached the Jets 1-yard line before Michel scored on a 1-yard run to make the final score 27-13.

- With two points against the Jets, the Patriots will extend their NFL record to 12 straight seasons with at least 400 total points (2007-18). The Chargers previously held the record by scoring at least 400 points in eight straight seasons from 2004-11. The 2018 Patriots are currently eighth in the NFL with 398 points.
- Through 15 games, the Patriots are averaging 27.0 yards per kickoff return, which is third-best in the league. The special teams unit is on pace to finish the season with the best kickoff return average in the Bill Belichick era. The current best mark under Belichick is 26.8 yards per kickoff return in 2006.

The New England Patriots clinched their 10th straight AFC East title behind 273 yards rushing in a 24-12 win over the visiting Buffalo Bills to improve to10-5. The win also marked New England's NFL-record 10th straight playoff season. They were tied with Dallas and Indianapolis at nine straight postseason appearances. The Patriots also tied San Francisco with their 16th straight 10-win season. The Patriots also improved to 7-0 at home, the only NFL team in 2018 that is undefeated at home.

QB Tom Brady passed for 126 yards and earned his 10th 4,000yard passing season to join Peyton Manning, Drew Brees and Philip Rivers as the only quarterbacks with at least 10 4,000-yard passing seasons. It was the New England ground game that made the difference. Rookie RB Sony Michel rushed for 116 yards for his fourth 100-yard game, and WR Cordarrelle Patterson gained 66 yards on the ground, the most by a New England wide receiver in a single game in team history. The previous mark was Patterson's 61 yards vs. Green Bay on Nov. 4.

Of Buffalo's 15 offensive drives, eight were held to three plays or fewer. The Patriots offense was able to overcome three turnovers, including two interceptions.

Michel helped set up the Patriots first drive with runs of 19 and 12 yards before he barreled his way in on a 4-yard touchdown run for a 7-0 first-quarter lead.

RB James White scored on a 27-yard touchdown run in the second quarter to extend the New England lead to 14-0 at the break.

New England took the second-half kickoff and on the first play from scrimmage a pass deflected off TE Rob Gronkowski and was intercepted by Buffalo at the New England 24-yard line. Buffalo converted the turnover into a field goal. After stopping New England on the next series, Buffalo put together a 5-play, 36-yard drive that ended with a 41-yard field goal to make the score 14-6.

The Patriots responded with a 10-play, 88-yard drive that ended with a 32-yard touchdown pass to WR Julian Edelman on fourth down to make it 21-6 heading into the fourth quarter. Edelman spun away from a would-be tackle to keep the play going.

K Stephen Gostkowski extended the New England lead in the fourth quarter with a 24-yard field goal to make the score 24-6. Buffalo scored its only touchdown with 1:17 left to play to for a 24-12 final.



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 25th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's



previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (18), conference crowns (9) and Super Bowl championships (5) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (22) and have the fewest losing seasons (2) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LII was the ninth Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 25 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 20 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2018, Kraft earned his 22nd winning season in 25 years of owning the franchise.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

- Since purchasing the team in 1994, Robert Kraft has 30 career postseason wins as an owner, third-most in NFL history behind the Rooney Family in Pittsburgh (36) and the Green Bay Packers (34). The Rooney Family founded the Steelers in 1933 while the Green Bay Packers were founded in 1919.
- Under Robert Kraft's guidance, the 2000-09 Patriots set the NFL record for most wins in a decade in NFL history with 126 overall wins overall. With 11 wins overall in 2018, the Patriots will tie that record for the current decade.

DYNASTY VS. DYNASTY

Of all of the great teams throughout the Super Bowl era, the New England Patriots and the San Francisco 49ers have set a standard of extended excellence above all of the others. The 49ers run of success spanned two decades, while New England's streak is still in progress.

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 308 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 308-135 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win five Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 26 times in their 59-year history. Twenty of those playoff berths have come in the 25 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 21 division crowns, including 16 in the last 18 seasons and 18 of which have come since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

- The Patriots are tied with Dallas (5) and San Francisco (5) with five Super Bowl wins and need one more to tie the Pittsburgh Steelers (6) for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history.
- The Patriots have played in the most Super Bowls in NFL history with 10 and look to add to that number in 2018.
- The Patriots will try to join Miami (3) and Buffalo (4) as the only teams to reach three consecutive Super Bowls.
- The Patriots extended their NFL record by reaching seven straight conference title games in 2017 (2011-17) and look to add to that total in 2018.
- The New England Patriots enter 2018 with 34 postseason wins and need two more postseason wins to tie Pittsburgh for the most postseason wins all-time.
- The Patriots have won 13 postseason games this decade and need one more playoff win to match the NFL record by New England (2000s), Dallas (1970s) and Pittsburgh (1970s) with 14.
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds and need one more to tie San Francisco (8) and Denver (8) for the most since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round bye an NFL-best 13 times since the current playoff format was instituted in 1990. Denver, Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with eight byes since 1990.
- The Patriots extended their NFL record to ten straight division titles (2009-18) with the win vs. Buffalo on Dec. 23, 2018.
- The 2017 New England Patriots set an NFL record by advancing in the postseason for the seventh straight season (2011-17) and will look to add to that number in 2018.
- The Patriots have made the playoffs for ten straight seasons (2009-18), an NFL record. Dallas (1975-83) and Indianapolis (2002-10) are second with nine straight postseason berths.
- With 10 wins, New England (2002-18) tied San Francisco (1983-98) for the most consecutive seasons with at least 10 wins with 16.
- The Patriots enter 2018 with an NFL-record eight consecutive seasons with at least 11 wins. Indianapolis is second with seven (2003-09).
- The Patriots have 125 wins (regular and postseason) in this decade and need three more victories overall to pass the 2000-09 Patriots for the most wins in a decade in NFL history (126).
- The Patriots have 112 regular-season wins this decade and need four more regular-season victories over the next two seasons to move past the Indianapolis Colts record of 115 wins from 2000-09 for the most regular season wins in a decade.
- New England has 25 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Indianapolis is second with 15 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have tallied six safeties since 2015, most in the NFL over that span. The LA Rams are second with five safeties since 2015.

2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- The New England Patriots victory over Kansas City (10/14/18) was their 218th win since 2000. New England moved past the San Francisco 49ers (217 wins - 1980s-90s) for the most regular-season wins over two consecutive decades and now have 223 with 18 regular-season games remaining in the decade.
- The Patriots win at the N.Y. Jets (11/25/18) put the team at 8-3 and secured a record of. 500 or better for the 18th straight season, behind only Dallas, who had 21 straight seasons at .500 or better.
- The Patriots have now had a winning record for 18 straight seasons (2001-18) after a win vs. Minnesota (12/2/18) moved the team to 9-3, the most consecutive winning seasons since the 1970 merger.
- Two Patriots were selected to the AFC Pro Bowl squad. QB Tom Brady joins Tony Gonzalez (14), Peyton Manning (14), Bruce Matthews (14) and Merlin Olsen (14) as the only NFL players with at least 14 Pro Bowl berths. CB Stephon Gilmore is headed to his second career Pro Bowl and first with the Patriots.
- K Stephen Gostkowski was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October. Gostkowski converted 11-of-12 field goal attempts, 15-of-15 extra points and kicked 17 touchbacks during the month, while New England finished October with a perfect 4-0 record.



CAREER NOTES

Tom Brady has quarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 206 of his 266 career regular-season starts, compiling a .774 winning percentage and giving him the best record of any quarterback in the Super Bowl era (since 1966). Brady's 155 career wins in his first 200 starts are the most in NFL history. Peyton Manning is second with 136 wins in his first 200 career starts.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

- Brady is second in NFL history behind Adam Vinatieri for the most wins all-time by an NFL player. He has 233 wins, while Adam Vinatieri has 234.
- If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2018, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in eight seasons, joining Drew Brees (10), Brett Favre (9) and Peyton Manning (9).
- Brady has passed for 4,000 yards nine times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2018, he will be the third player to reach 10 seasons with 4,000 yards passing, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (12).
- Brady is tied with eight other NFL players with two games with six or more touchdowns and needs one six-TD game to tie Peyton Manning, who had three games with six or more touchdowns.
- Tom Brady has won 30 Player of the Week awards to set the NFL record for the most Player of the Week honors, and he has an NFL record 10 Player of the Month honors.
- Brady leads the NFL with 56 career games with three touchdown passes and no interceptions.

2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Brady has been selected to his 14th career Pro Bowl in 2018, joining Tony Gonzalez, Peyton Manning, Bruce Matthews and Merlin Olsen as the only NFL players with at least 14 Pro Bowl berths.
- Brady (513) became the third QB in NFL history to throw 500 career touchdown passes, joining Peyton Manning (539), Drew Brees (520) and Brett Favre (508). Brady reached the mark with three touchdowns passes vs. Indianapolis (10/04/18). He is the only player with 500 touchdowns with one team.
- Brady has 584 touchdown passes overall (513 in the regular season and 71 in the postseason), the most in NFL history. He moved past Peyton Manning to take the lead with three TD passes at Miami (12/09/18).
- Brady moved past Peyton Manning in the win over the Jets (11/25/18) and now has the most total passing yards in NFL history, including the postseason, and now has 80,490 total passing yards.
- Brady passed for 279 yards at Pittsburgh (12/16/18) to become the fourth quarterback in NFL history to reach 70,000 regular-season passing yards. He now has 70,264 passing yards entering this week's game.

Brady made his 266th regular-season games at quarterback vs. Buffalo (12/23) to move out of a tie with Peyton Manning and into second all-time behind the 298 starts by Brett Favre.

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State, where as a senior, he completed 56 percent of his passes (153-of-275 for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

FATHERLY ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told The Boston Herald. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

UNCONVENTIONAL JOURNEY

Despite a successful three-year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth (N.J.) football team, and at the end of the season joined some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Players Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried."

Chris did not get invited to compete in the Combine that year but turned heads during a Pro Day at Fordham University. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

G TED KARRAS

SCHOOL'S NOT OUT

Although he already owns a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's degree in recreation, sport and tourism from his time at the University of Illinois, Ted Karras hasn't completely given up his notebook for an NFL playbook. Along with teammate Joe Thuney, Karras is pursuing his MBA from Indiana University thanks to an NFLPA program that provides tuition assistance for players while navigating a busy NFL schedule.

"It just seems to be that everyone keeps wanting to pay for my school, so I'm not going to turn it down," Karras told the Boston Globe

Karras and Thuney began their MBA pursuit two weeks after the Patriots Super Bowl LI victory by taking online classes and Skyping with professors from Indiana University's Kelley School of Business up until training camp. They continued their classes in the 2018 offseason.

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater was named to seven straight Pro Bowls (2011-17) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the eighth straight season in 2018.

The special teams ace shared what it means to be a captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

OL JOE THUNEY

THUNEY DOES HAVE THE SIZE

An Ohio native, Joe Thuney was told he may not have the size to play offensive line in the Big Ten conference for his hometown Ohio State Buckeyes. Settling on North Carolina State, Thuney went on to become a mainstay on the offensive line while also earning his bachelor's degree in accounting in just three years and added an international studies degree and minoring in Spanish.

BACK TO SCHOOL

Along with teammate Ted Karras, Joe Thuney has taken advantage of an NFLPA program that assists its players in earning college degrees. After earning his degree in accounting while also studying international studies at N.C. State, Thuney is now pursuing his MBA through Indiana University's Kelley School of Business.

Then Commodore defensive coordinator Bob Shoop was in attendance and witnessed Butler's demeanor and was impressed with his competitive attitude. Shoop convinced then head coach James Franklin to ask Butler to transition to defense.

"Coach Franklin brought me into his office and he asked me what I wanted, and I wanted whatever was best for the team," Butler told The Tennessean. "Because we were so short on defensive linemen at that time, that's how it happened."

Hightower understands the importance of the number and hopes to live up to its legacy. "I definitely feel honored to be able to wear this number," Hightower said. "I've read that Tedy didn't want it to be retired and he hoped another linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

DB DEVIN McCOURTY

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

Devin McCourty enters 2018 tied with Ty Law for second-most Pro Bowls as a Patriots defensive back with four. Only CB Mike Haynes had more Pro Bowl invites as a Patriots DB with six.

McCOUR-TD

DB Devin McCourty's 84-yard interception return for a touchdown in the win at Buffalo on Oct. 29, 2018 was his first career interception returned for a touchdown and the ninth-longest in team history. The pick-six was McCourty's second career score. His first touchdown came on a 104-yard kickoff return vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 21, 2012.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots this past offseason for his 10th NFL season. The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. In the season opener, Devin and Jason became the first set of twins to play together on the same NFL team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louisville Colonels. Shaquill and Shaquem Griffin of the Seattle Seahawks also accomplished this unique occurrence on Kickoff Weekend. New England also had twins on the team last year, with TE Jacob Hollister on the roster and WR Cody Hollister on the practice squad. Jacob is on the roster again this year and Cody is on the non-football/injury list.

Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and was a year behind his brother in eligibility. Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

MCCOURTY GOES LONG

McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. McCourty was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

IN GOOD COMPANY

McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.



BROTHERS IN ARMS

Devin and twin brother Jason McCourty have seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. Devin's work with the local Boston Children's Hospital has helped advance research of the disease with doctors now as close as they've ever been to a cure.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2018

- In 2015, Gostkowski became the first NFL player with four seasons of 150 or more points. He added his fifth season of 150 or more points in 2017 and can add to that number in 2018.
- Gostkowski has led the NFL in field goals three times (2008, 13-2014), and if he leads the NFL in field goals in 2018, he will join Lou Groza (5), Jack Manders (4), Ward Cuff (4) and Mark Moseley (4) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in field goals in at least four seasons.



- Gostkowski made 92.5 percent (37-of-40) of his field goals in 2017. He tied Adam Vinatieri (2002, 04, 10, and 14-15) for the most seasons at 90 percent on field goals with five and needs one more season of 90 percent to set the NFL mark.
- Gostkowski (1,735) is in 13th on the NFL's all-time list for points.
- Gostkowski (180) is second all-time in postseason points, behind Adam Vinatieri (234) and will look to add to those numbers in 2018.
- Gostkowski is third on the NFL's all-time postseason list with 34 field goals behind Adam Vinatieri (56) and David Akers (39).

2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Gostkowski became the 19th kicker in NFL history to reach 350 career field goals with five field goals in the win vs. Kansas City (10/14/18).
- Gostkowski was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October. He converted 11-of-12 field goal attempts, 15-of-15 extra points and kicked 17 touchbacks during October, while New England finished the month with a perfect 4-0 record.

A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular-season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). PLAYOFF BERTHS UNDER KRAFT

New England has qualified for the playoffs 26 times in its 59-year history. The Patriots have earned 20 of those playoff berths in the 25 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 21 division crowns overall (20 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occa-



sions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.

ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT

The Patriots won more than half of their games for the 18th straight year in 2018. They are the first team to win more than half of their games in 18 straight seasons since free agency began in 1993.

The Patriots are also the first team to win more than half of their games in 18 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, moving past the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-98) and the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85).

The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 22 of the 25 seasons Robert Kraft has owned the team.
