NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (1-3) VS. DETROIT LIONS (1-3)

Sunday, October 9, 2022 • Gillette Stadium (65,878) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots will return to the confines of Gillette Stadium to face their second straight game against an NFC North foe when they host the Detroit Lions and their top ranked offense. Last week, the Patriots lost in overtime at Green Bay, 27-24. Following a trip to Cleveland on Oct. 16, the Patriots will continue play against the NFC North when the Chicago Bears come to Foxborough for a Monday Night game on Oct. 24. The Patriots final contest against an NFC North team will be on Thanksgiving night when the team travels to Minnesota to face the Vikings.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by FOX and can be seen locally on WFXT-TV Channel 25. Kenny Albert will handle play-by-play duties with Jonathan Vilma as the color analyst. Shannon Spake will provide analysis from the sidelines. The game will be produced by Fran Morison and directed by Bryan Lilley.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 33 stations can be found in this press release on page 59. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by Marc Cappello.

THROWBACK GAME



The Patriots will wear throwback uniforms that are based on the ones worn from 1984-1992 and then sporadically from 1994-2012 as an alternate uniform. The Patriots will wear red jerseys with white pants and a white helmet featuring the 'Pat Patriot' logo with white facemasks. The Patriots are 9-3 in throwback uniforms. The team last wore the throwback uniform in a 29-26 overtime victory over the New York Jets on Oct. 21, 2012 at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots will wear the throwback uniforms for a second time this vear when they host the Buffalo Bills on Dec. 1.

- With a sack this week against the Lions, LB Matthew Judon will become the first Patriots
 player to start a season with a sack in each of the first five games. The last player in the
 NFL to accomplish a sack in the first five games of the season was LB Clay Matthews with
 the Los Angeles Rams in 2019 when he had a sack in each of he first six games of the
 season.
- Judon has registered a sack in each of the first four games to become just the second New England player to start a season with at least one sack in each of the first four games to start a season. Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett began the 1986 season with one sack in each of the first four games.
- Judon has four sacks through the first four games of the 2022 season. In his first season with the Patriots in 2021, Judon set a team record with 6 ½ sacks through the first five games. The previous record was 5 ½ sacks by Chandler Jones in 2015 and Andre Tippett in 1984. With a 2 ½ sack performance against Detroit this week, Judon can surpass his own record. The 2021 Paul Hornung Award winner as the nation's most versatile player will look to become the first NFL player with two 20-yard punt returns in consecutive games in a season since Devin Hester in November of 2011. JUDON IS SECOND PATRIOTS PLAYER WITH A SACK IN FIRST FOUR GAMES TO START A SEASON

LB Matthew Judon has registered a sack in each of the first four games after a 7-yard sack of QB Aaron Rodgers in the first quarter. He is just the second Patriots player to start a season with at least one sack in each of the first four games to start a season. Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett began the 1986 season with one sack in each of the first four games.

FOLK EXTENDS NFL RECORD FOR MOST CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS MADE UNDER 50 YARDS

K Nick Folk extended his NFL record for most consecutive field goals made under 50 yards to 58 straight with a 37-yard field goal in the first quarter. Folk's last miss from inside the 50-yard line was a 45-yard field goal attempt in the 2020 season-opener vs. Miami on Sept. 13.

ROOKIE CB JACK JONES MAKES NFL STARTING DEBUT. RE-CORDS A PICK SIX. FORCED FUMBLE AND FUMBLE RECOVERY

Patriots 2022 fourth-round pick Jack Jones was in the starting lineup at cornerback in place of the injured Jalen Mills. It was Jones's first NFL start. He forced and recovered a fumble on WR Romeo Doubs in the first quarter to give the Patriots a first down at the 50-yard line. Later in the second quarter he intercepted a QB Aaron Rodgers pass and returned it 40 yards for a touchdown. It was only the second time that Rodgers has had an interception returned for a touchdown at Lambeau Field (3,511 pass attempts). The Patriots returned three interceptions for touchdowns in 2022.

BRIAN HOYER MAKES SECOND START AS A PATRIOT

Brian Hoyer made his second start as a member of the Patriots. He has now played in 30 games as a member of the Patriots during his three stints with the team. Hoyer made his 40th NFL start overall. Hoyer joins Ryan Fitzpatrick (9 teams), Chris Chandler, Gus Frerotte as the only NFL quarterbacks to make at least one start for seven different teams. Hoyer has made at least one start for the Patriots, Cardinals, Browns, Texans, Bears, 49ers and Colts.

ROOKIE QB BAILEY ZAPPE SEES FIRST NFL ACTION AND THROWS FIRST TD PASS IN THIRD QUARTER

2022 fourth-round draft pick QB Bailey Zappe entered the game in the first quarter after Brian Hoyer left with an injury. His first completion was a 9-yard pass to WR Lil'Jordan Humphrey in the second quarter. Bailey was active for the first time in 2022. He registered his first touchdown pass on a 25-yard strike to WR DeVante Parker in the third quarter. That was the first touchdown pass IB BAILEY ZADDE by a rookie quarterback in



2022. Week 4 is the latest a touchdown pass has been thrown by a rookie since the 2007 season when Buffalo's Trent Edwards threw a touchdown in Week 4. Bailey finished 10-of-15 for 99 yards with one touchdown.

Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (342), division titles (19), winning percentage (.681), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (22).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 28 seasons of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention



to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (24) and are tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest losing seasons (3) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 28 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 22 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons, and finished with a winning record 24 times.

Of all the great teams throughout the Super Bowl era, the New England Patriots and the San Francisco 49ers have set a standard of extended excellence above all of the others.

A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the milestone. Al Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

A WINNING TRADITION II

Kraft's winning percentage with the Patriots (.681) since taking over the team in 1994 is the highest among all owners/ownership groups with at least 200 wins (regular and postseason) with one team. He is one of just four owners with at least 200 wins and a winning percentage over .600.

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 342 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 342-160 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 28 times in their 62-year history. Twenty-two of those playoff berths have come in the 28 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns.

PATRIOTS

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in the NFL with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver and Pittsburgh have played in eight.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, one behind the 16 by Pittsburgh and San Francisco
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Pittsburgh and Green Bay are second with 36 playoff wins all-time.
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds, behind San Francisco (9) and Denver (8) since playoff seeding began in 1975
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since 1990. Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with nine byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 59 postseason games, fourth-most in NFL history behind Dallas (64), Pittsburgh (63) and Green Bay (61).
 The Patriots need to play in one more postseason game in 2022 to become the fourth NFL team to play in 60 postseason games.
- The Patriots are second with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 14 seasons with 12 victories
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 10
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- New England has 28 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Green Bay is second with 20 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 35 winning seasons since 1970, second all-time behind Pittsburgh's 38



- The Patriots have 567 total victories, the fourth-most wins since 1960, behind the 578 wins by Pittsburgh, the 576 wins by Dallas and the 570 wins by Green Bay.
- New England (1,012) played their 1,000th game in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021 and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- With rookie free agents DL DaMarcus Mitchell and DB Brenden Schooler making the initial 53-man roster in 2022, the Patriots have now had a rookie free agent make the opening day roster for 19 straight seasons, tied with Denver for the longest streak in the NFL
- The Patriots have finished in the top 10 for fewest points allowed in each of the last 10 seasons (2012-2021) to tie Tampa Bay, who became the last team to reach 10 straight seasons (1996-2005) for the fewest points allowed. The 2021 Patriots finished second in the NFL with 17.8 points allowed per game. Buffalo finished first with 17.0 points allowed per game.





The Patriots announced the return of the red throwback uniforms late in the spring. The team will wear the uniform vs. Detroit on Oct. 9 and vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1. The uniform's design, a red jersey with timeless blue and white stripes across the sleeves and white numbers outlined in blue, is based on the uniform worn from 1984-1992 and sporadically worn from 1994-2012 as an alternate uniform. In 2013, the NFL announced a rule mandating every club stick to one helmet all season. Unfortunately for the Patriots, this meant sidelining the throwback uniforms as the silver helmet with the modern-day logo did not feel right to blend with the classic throwback threads. In June of 2021, a memo was sent to teams announcing the approval of a second helmet for the following season. The rule change allowed the Patriots to complete the throwback uniforms with a white helmet, white face mask and the Pat the Patriot logo to officially revive the red throwback uniforms for the upcoming season. The announcement of the long-awaited revival included the original Delorean from the Back to the Future movie franchise and players repping the throwback threads. The social media posts instantly generated national attention as fans and media alike welcomed back the beloved red jerseys.

500TH GAME FOR KRAFT

The game at Pittsburgh (9/18) was the 500th game of the Robert Kraft era. Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of Super Bowl wins (6), overall wins (342), division titles (19), winning percentage (.681), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (22).

PATRIOTS RUN OFF FINAL 6:33 TO SECURE THE VICTORY

The Patriots offense was holding a 17-14 lead when Pittsburgh punted the ball to the Patriots with 6:33 left in the game at Pittsburgh (9/18). Despite the Steelers still having all three timeouts, the Patriots were able to run out the clock on a 13-play, 56-yard drive.

COLLEGE TEAMMATES REUNITING

The Patriots drafted two players from Alabama (QB Mac Jones and DL Christian Barmore) with their first two picks and drafted two players from Oklahoma with their next two picks (LB Ronnie Perkins and RB Rhamondre Stevenson) in the 2021 NFL Draft. Since 1970, the only other team to have two picks from one school followed by their next two picks from one school was the 1992 Los Angeles Rams who drafted DE Sean Gilbert (Pittsburgh) in the first round followed by DB Steve Israel (Pittsburgh) in the second round and then used two third-round picks for DL Marc Boutte (LSU) and WR Todd Kinchen (LSU).

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES'

The Patriots have four players with the last name Jones with QB Mac Jones, DB Jonathan Jones, DB Jack Jones and DB Marcus Jones.

It is the second time in team history that the team has had four players with the same last name. In 2000, the Patriots had four players with the last name Johnson with LB Ted Johnson, LB Olrick Johnson, P Lee Johnson and NT Garrett Johnson.

25TH ROOKIE

2022 first-round draft pick, OL Cole Strange, started at left guard in the season-opener at Miami (9/11) and became the 25th Patriots rookie under Bill Belichick to start on opening day. Strange joins five other current Patriots to start as a rookie on opening day, joining Mac Jones (2021), Mike Onwenu (2020), Ja'Whaun Bentley (2018), David Andrews (2015) and Devin McCourty (2010).

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win six Super Bowl titles. He won more games overall (141) during a 10-year stretch (2010-19) than any other coach in NFL history. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. - RB Damien Harris has 1,878 career rushing yards and needs 939 rushing yards to move into the all-time Top-10 in team history.
- Harris had a team-leading 15 rushing touchdowns in 2021 and looks to become the fourth Patriots player to have consecutive seasons with 10 or more touchdowns, joining Curtis Martin (14 in 1995 and 14 in 1996), Corey Dillon (12 in 2004, 12 in 2005 and 13 in 2006) and BenJarvus Green-Ellis (13 in 2010 and 11 in 2011)



- Harris had 15 rushing touchdowns in 2022 and will look to set the team record for most rushing touchdowns in consecutive seasons set by Curtis Martin with 28 (14-1995 and 14-1996).
- Harris enters the 2022 season with eight career 100-yard rushing games and needs two more to become the fifth New England running back to reach at least 10 career 100-yard rushing games, joining Jim Nance (17), Curtis Martin (14), Corey Dillon (11) and Sam Cunningham (11).

JONES - FIRST NFL QB WITH 70-PLUS COMPLETION PER-CENTAGE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

Jones followed a 74.4 completion percentage in the opener against Miami by completing 73.3 percent of his passes (22-of-30 passes) for 186 yards at the N.Y. Jets (9/19). He is the first quarterback with a 70-plus completion percentage in each of his first two games (min. 10 attempts in each game). He has now completed over 70 percent of his passes in nine of his first 16 NFL games. He tied Dak Prescott for the most such games by a rookie quarterback in a season.

JONES COMPLETES 19 CONSECUTIVE PASSES TO TIE TEAM MARK

 Jones completed 19 straight passes during a stretch from the second quarter to the fourth quarter vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3, tied for the longest streak in team history. Tom Brady had a streak of 19 consecutive completions in Week 1 of the 2015 season vs. Pittsburgh. The streak of 19 consecutive completions is the most by a rookie in at least the last 40 years.

JONES BECOMES 13TH ROOKIE QUARTERBACK TO REACH 300 COMPLETIONS

 Jones became the 13th rookie quarterback to reach 300 completions in a season and finished with 352 completions

JONES TIES RECORD FOR MOST COMPLETIONS BY A ROOK-IE IN FIRST FIVE STARTS

Jones tied Joe Burrow (135 completions in 2020) for the most completions by a rookie quarterback in his first five starts in NFL history.

JONES FINISHES WITH AN 80 PERCENT PASS COMPLETION FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK

Jones completed 22-of-26 passes for an .846 pass completion percentage at Atlanta (11/18/21). It is tied for the fourth-best in team history. Jones was 19-of-23 for an .826 completion percentage vs. Cleveland on Nov. 14, the sixth-highest in team history. Jones is the first rookie quarterback in NFL history and the first New England player to ever complete at least 80 percent of his passes in back-to-back games (min. 20 attempts). The NFL record for most 80 percent completion games (min. 20 attempts) in a season is four by Drew Brees in 2018 and Kirk Cousins in 2019.

3-TOUCHDOWN PERFORMANCE

Jones had his first career three-touchdown performance against Cleveland on Nov. 14 and also had three touchdowns vs. Jacksonville (01/02). He had seven games in 2021 with at least two touchdowns. The NFL record for most games with at least two touchdown passes by a rookie quarterback is Justin Herbert of the Los Angeles Chargers with 10 games in 2020.

JONES BECOMES 15TH ROOKIE QUARTERBACK TO REACH 3.000 PASSING YARDS AND 20 TDS

Jones is the 15th rookie quarterback to reach 3,000 passing yards and 20 touchdown passes and now has 3,801 passing yards with 22 touchdowns.

OFFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

Jones was named Offensive Rookie of the Month for November by the National Football League. Jones is the first Patriots rookie to receive a rookie of the month honor since DL Chandler Jones in September of the 2012 season. Jones led the Patriots to a perfect record in November, completing 76-of-99 passes for 854 yards and seven touchdown passes. He completed 76.8 percent of his passes and had a quarterback rating of 117.2.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2022

- WR Jakobi Meyers has scored on three two-point plays and needs one more two-point score to tie Julian Edelman and Gino Cappelletti with four for the most in team history.
- Meyers (181 receptions for 2,104 yards) has the most career receptions and receiving yards by any undrafted Patriots receiver that began his career with the team. His 59 receptions for 729 yards in 2020 were also the most in a single season by a rookie free agent that was originally signed by the team. He surpassed that number with 83 receptions and 866 receiving yards in 2021 for the best statistical receiving season for an undrafted Patriots receiver.

A SPECIAL BIRTHDAY PERFORMANCE

Meyers set career highs on his 24th birthday (11/09/20) with 12 receptions for 169 yards in a win over the New York Jets. The 12 receptions were the most by a Patriot since Julian Edelman caught 13 passes at Miami on Dec. 15, 2013.

MEYERS MAKES HIS MARK

Meyers has the most receptions and receiving yards of any undrafted player who signed with the Patriots as an undrafted free agent.

MEYERS JOINS ELITE CLUB

 Meyers, who threw touchdown passes in Weeks 10 and 17 in 2020, became the fourth wide receiver with two touchdown passes in a single season in the Super Bowl era, joining Rod Gardner (2003), Antwaan Randle El (2010) and Odell Beckham Jr. (2018).

MEYERS COMPLETES TWO PASSES IN ONE GAME

• Meyers completed two passes vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3, 2021. He caught a backwards pass from QB Mac Jones and then threw across the field to RB Brandon Bolden, who managed a 15-yard gain in the second quarter. He completed a 30-yard pass to WR Nelson Agholor in the fourth quarter on a flea flicker. The only other wide receiver to complete two passes in single game for New England was Julian Edelman vs. Denver on Oct. 18, 2020. The only other non-quarterbacks to complete two passes in a game for New England were running backs – Dick Christy on Nov. 18, 1960 vs. Dallas Texans and Andy Johnson on Sept. 6, 1981 vs. Baltimore Colts.

 Meyers has completed 4-of-4 passes for 88 yards with two touchdown passes for a perfect 158.3 passer rating in his career.

"When I was younger in high school, I made [Newton's] 7-on-7 team – his all-star team – and we traveled to Florida to play in a league," Meyers said. "We ended up losing, but it was still a great experience. It was a good experience to meet Cam when I was very young. A lot of guys where I come from look up to him, so that was definitely a once-in-a lifetime opportunity for me."

MEYERS SCORES FIRST NFL RECEIVING TOUCHDOWN

 Meyers has thrown for two touchdown passes but scored his first NFL receiving touchdown on an 11-yard pass from QB Brian Hoyer in the fourth guarter against Cleveland (11/14/21).

MEYERS USING HIS ARM

• Meyers threw two touchdown passes in 2020. He completed a 24-yard touchdown pass to RB Rex Burkhead vs. Baltimore (11/15) and a 19-yard touchdown pass to QB Cam Newton vs. N.Y. Jets (1/3). Overall, Patriots wide receivers completed four passes in 2020. WR Julian Edelman also completed two passes. The four pass completions by wide receivers are the most in team history. They had three in 2021.

MULTIPLE TDS FROM JAKOBI

Meyers (two touchdown passes) became the third Patriots wide receiver to throw a touchdown pass under head coach Bill Belichick. David Patten threw a 60-yard touchdown pass on Oct. 21, 2001, at Indianapolis and WR Julian Edelman threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to WR Phillip Dorsett at Philadelphia on Nov. 17, 2019. Kendrick Bourne became the fourth to do so with a 25-yard touchdown pass to WR Nelson Agholor vs. N.Y. Jets on Oct. 24, 2021.



RHAMONDRE STEVENSON'S STORY

"I have a very special story, I feel like," Rhamondre Stevenson told the Boston Globe recently. "Thinking about it is kind of crazy, because of all the hardships I've been through. Some of it was just my fault, but it's crazy being where I am now compared to where I came from."

DEDICATION TO HIS GOALS

• While in high school, Stevenson started gaining attention for the impressive stats he posted as a junior. Unfortunately, due to his grades, Stevenson was academically ineligible to receive a football scholarship despite being recruited. Following his senior year of high school, Stevenson took a year off from football working part-time jobs at Wal-Mart and Jimmy John's. But after a year away, he decided to follow a group of his friends and enroll in Cerritos Community College. During his time at Cerritos, he shared a two-bedroom apartment with up to six other guys at times and rode his bicycle 20 minutes to and from practice every day. After putting up monster stats in his second season at Cerriots, he committed to Oklahoma. Oklahoma led him to the 2021 NFL Draft where in the fourth round on the third day the Patriots selected Stevenson. In addition he worked on his academics and made the Dean's List while at Oklahoma.







NEWLY ENSHRINED PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER RICHARD SEYMOUR SEES GREATNESS AHEAD FOR CHRISTIAN BARMORE

- For a defensive lineman, if Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Richard Seymour's is in your corner, there are few better compliments or endorsements.
- "I think he has a ton of ability, natural ability, and he plays hard," Seymour told the Herald recently. "I think he's going to be a problem for (opposing teams) for a long time to come. Hopefully he stays healthy and continues on the path he's on. I think he has a really bright future."

SECOND-MOST QUARTERBACK PRESSURES

Barmore posted the second-most quarterback pressures for a first-year defensive tackle since 2006, according to Pro Football Focus. His 48 pressures were two more than Aaron Donald had during his rookie season.



2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 LB Ja'Whaun Bentley set single-season career-highs with 91 tackles and 1½ sacks in 2020. He surpassed that total with 108 total tackles in 2021



Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on couches and floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2022

LB Matthew Judon led the team with a career-high 12 1/2 sacks in 2021 and can become the fourth Patriots player with back-to-back 10-plus sack totals, joining Garin Veris (10 in 1985 and 11 in 1986), Andre Tippett (18 1/2 in 1984 and 16 1/2 in 1985) and Tony McGee (12 in 1977, 11 1/2 in 1978 and 10 1/2 in 1979). Judon can join Tippett (3), McGee (3), Veris (2) and Jones (2) as the only Patriots to register more than one double-digit sack total.

2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Judon has registered a sack in each of the first four games of the 2022 season after a 7-yard sack of QB Aaron Rodgers in the first quarter at Green Bay (10/2). He is just the second New England player to start a season with at least one sack in each of the first four games to start a season. Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett began the 1986 season with one sack in each of the first four games.

JUDON BECOMES 10TH ACTIVE LINEBACKER WITH 50 CAREER SACKS

Judon's sack of Lamar Jackson vs. Baltimore (9/25/21) was his 50th career sack. He is the 10th active linebacker with 50 career sacks.

JUDON HAS EIGHTH TWO-SACK GAME; SECOND OF THE 2021 SEASON

 Judon had two sacks in a three-play sequence in the second quarter at Houston (10/10/21). It is the 8th time in his career that he has had a multi-sack game and second time in 2021. He had 2 ½ sacks vs. New Orleans on Sept. 26. His career-best is 3 sacks vs. Oakland on Nov. 25, 2018, when he played for Baltimore.

JUDON SETS TEAM RECORD FOR MOST SACKS IN FIRST FIVE GAMES

• Judon set a team record with 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ sacks through the first five games. The previous record was 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ sacks by Chandler Jones in 2015 and Andre Tippett in 1984.

JUDON SETS CAREER-HIGH BY REACHING DOUBLE-DIGIT SACKS

Judon reached double-digit sacks for the first time in his career after a 9-yard sack of QB Matt Ryan in the second quarter at Atlanta (11/18/21) pushed his season total to 10 ½ sacks. It is the 17th time that the Patriots have had a player reach 10 or more sacks in a season. Judon's previous best was 9 ½ in 2019 with Baltimore. He finished the year with 12 ½ sacks and is tied with Chandler Jones (2015) and Mike Vrabel (2007) for the most sacks in a season by a Patriots player under Bill Belichick.

- Devin McCourty enters the 2022 season tied with Ty Law for the second-most Pro Bowl invitations as a Patriots defensive back with four.
 Only CB Mike Haynes (6) had more Pro Bowl nods as a Patriots defensive back.
- McCourty (31) became the third Patriots player to reach 30 interceptions with his pick at Atlanta on Nov. 18, 2021. He is third on the all-time interception, behind Ty Law (36) and Raymond Clayborn (36).
- McCourty has played in 192 career regular season games, the 7thmost games in New England history. If he plays in all 17 games in 2022 he will have played in the 5th-most games in New England history with 205.



- McCourty has 515 interception return yards in his regular season career and became the third Patriot with 500 return yards at the NY Jets (9/19 behind Ty Law (583) and Raymond Clayborn (555).
- McCourty tied Brett Favre and Gene Upshaw for the fourth-most postseason starts in NFL history with 24 after starting in the 2022 Wild Card game at Buffalo.

THE RISE OF THE GREEN GOBLIN

- DB Jalen Mills has embraced his nickname "The Green Goblin." The
 origins of the nickname started out as a joke during his rookie season
 with Philadelphia when he dyed his hair green. Mills is not sure whether it was a coach or the media but the spiderman villain nickname was
 inspired and took off with the fans.
- Said Mills, "It just kind of came from my rookie year and then just throughout my years playing for the Eagles, my style of play. That's what I get it from. It's kind of something that I stuck with."

A NUMBER CHANGE WITH A STORY

Late in the Eagles' eventual Super Bowl-winning season, Jalen's Uncle Uhkoto lost his battle with cancer. The once-close relatives had long since drifted apart and fallen out of touch. As a result, only in the wake of Uhkoto's death did Jalen learn that his uncle – a man who otherwise shunned sports – could quote his nephew's NFL statistics chapter and verse: every pass breakup, every interception, every tackle, every game, Uhkoto was keeping track of Jalen. The discovery left him with a heavy heart.

"It kind of broke me down," Jalen revealed, "because we had grown apart. We were close at one point in time. It took that moment for me to realize, this is a man I looked up to as a younger kid, and now he was looking up to me, keeping up with sports that he didn't even care about. So, I wanted to honor him in my own quiet way."

In 2021, Mills would get that opportunity. After signing his free-agent contract with New England this past spring, Jalen learned that the NFL would relax its jersey number restrictions, allowing certain positions beyond kicker, punter, and quarterback to wear single-digits on their uniforms.

Mills, who wore 31 and 21 at times as an Eagle, chose No. 2 here in New England. You see, almost no one ever called Uhkoto – pronounced uh-COO-too– by his full name. They preferred his shortened nickname: Two.



VERSATILITY

- "I'm one of the guys that when you ask me what position I play, I say 'defense.' I want to be able to line up everywhere, and most importantly, I want to be able to produce everywhere."
- Began his career in 2014 in San Diego focusing on special teams and was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2018 as a special teamer. His 2018 Pro Bowl berth was the only one that Matthew Slater did not get voted to since 2011.
- Started all 16 games at safety in 2020 for the Patriots and led the team in tackles with a career-high 107.

ADRIAN PHILLIPS HAS FIRST CAREER PICK SIX

Phillips picked off a fourth quarter pass from QB Justin Herbert and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown at the L.A. Chargers on Oct. 31, 2021. It was Phillips' first career touchdown. It is the Patriots first interception returned for a touchdown since DB Devin McCourty returned a pick 43 yards for a touchdown at Seattle on Sept. 20, 2020. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.

PHILLIPS HAS FIRST CAREER TWO-INTERCEPTION GAME

Phillips finished with two interceptions against the Chargers. He also picked off Herbert in the second quarter. He earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his effort.



FIRST TIME TEAM CAPTAIN

 Deatrich Wise Jr. was named a team captain for the first time in his career.

DEATRICH WISE JR. RECORDS THREE SACKS IN THE FIRST HALF

DL Deatrich Wise Jr. had his first career three-sack game after a 3-yard sack in the first quarter and an 8-yard sack and a 1-yard sack in the second quarter vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. His previous best was 1½ sacks, which he accomplished three times – vs. Buffalo (12/24/17), vs. Houston (9/9/18) and vs. Cleveland (11/14/21). His gross punt average of 48.7 is also a team record, besting the 46.5 gross average by Mesko in 2011. His 45.6 net yards per punt is second all-time in NFL history in a single season to the 46.0 net average by Johnny Hekker in 2016 with the Rams.

DIMINISHING [PUNT] RETURNS

 Bailey's punting in 2020 allowed a total of just 71 punt return yards on 12 returns. It is the fewest punt return yards allowed by the Patriots in team history and the seventh-fewest punt return yards allowed in a season in NFL history. The 12 punt returns allowed are third in NFL history and second in team history to the 11 by New England in 2008.



DAVIS IN DOUBLE-DIGIT SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES

- Cody Davis had a single-season personal high with a team-leading 15 special teams tackles, tied for the third-most in 2021. It is the third time in his career that he has reached double-digit special teams tackles. Davis had 10 special teams tackles in 2015 with St. Louis and 10 special teams tackles in 2018 with Jacksonville.
- Davis launched a program in partnership with Boston Children's Hospital
 called Cody's Gamers. Once a month, Cody sends a Nintendo Switch to
 a young patient. He then sets up a Zoom call to talk to the patient while
 they play a video game together. After each gaming session, Cody sends a
 personalized gift basket to the patient with items based on what the patient
 likes or momentos from games played during their Zoom call. For this work,
 Cody was named the Week Three NFLPA Community MVP.





WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2022

- K Nick Folk is in eighth place on the New England all-time scoring list with 332 total points and needs 77 total points to move past Stanley Morgan (408) into seventh place. Folk is also in sixth place on the New England all-time field goal list with 80 field goals and needs 14 field goals to move past Tony Franklin (93) into fifth place.
- Folk finished tied for first in the NFL in 2021 with Daniel Carlson of the Raiders with 150 points, and tied for second in the NFL with Chris Boswell of Pittsburgh with 36 field goals, behind the 40 by Carlson.
- Folk is one of 12 NFL players to have at least four seasons with 30 field goals.



2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 Folk extended his NFL recordto 58 consecutive regular season field goals made under 50 yards. He moved past K Ryan Succop of Tennessee (56 straight - 2014-17). Folk's last miss from inside the 50-yard line was a 45-yard field goal in the 2020 season-opener vs. Miami on Sept. 13.

FOLK HERO

Folk kicked his second game-winning field goal as time expired in 2020, connecting on a 50-yard field goal against Arizona (11/29/20) to give the Patriots a 20-17 win. He had a 51-yard game-winning field goal as time expired at the New York Jets on Nov. 9, 2020 to give the Patriots a 30-27 victory. He is the first NFL kicker with two game-winning field goals as time expired in a single season. Overall, he has three game-winning field goals as time expired. He also kicked a 53-yard game-winning field goal as time expired at Buffalo on Oct. 8, 2007, when he was a rookie with the Dallas Cowboys.

FOLK DIGS THE LONG BALL

 Folk owns the record for the two longest field goals as time expired in franchise history with a 50-yard game-winning field goal vs. Arizona (11/29/20) and a 51-yarder he hit at N.Y. Jets (11/9). The previous long was 48 yards by Adam Vinatieri in Super Bowl XXXVI vs. the St. Louis Rams

FOLK SETS TEAM RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS

Folk set the team record with 33 consecutive field goals after connecting on field goals of 46, 49, 32 and 26 yards at the New York (9/19/21) and extended that mark to 36 straight field with a 27-yarder vs. Tampa Bay before missing a 56-yarder in the fourth quarter. He passed Stephen Gostkowski, who connected on 31 straight field goals. After missing his first two field goals of the 2020 season, he kicked 36 straight field goals. Folk's previous longest streak was 23 straight field goals in 2013 when he played for the New York Jets. The NFL record is 44 straight field goals by Adam Vinatieri.

FOLK DRILLS TWO 52-YARD FIELD GOALS LONGEST FIELD GOALS AS A MEMBER OF THE PATRIOTS

• Folk drilled a 52-yard field goal in the second quarter and 52-yard field goal in the third quarter at Houston (10/10/21), his longest field goals as a member of the Patriots. His longest to that point as a Patriots was a 51-yard field goal on Dec. 21, 2019 vs. Buffalo and a 51-yard field goal at the New York Jets on Nov. 9, 2020. His career-long is a 56-yard field goal on Oct. 17, 2010 at Denver when he played for the New York Jets.

FOLK HAS SECOND NFL GAME WITH TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS

Folk had his second NFL game with two 50-yard field goals at Houston (10/10/21). He had two 51-yard field goals on Nov. 18, 2012 at St. Louis as a member of the New York Jets.

FOLK BECOMES SECOND PATS PLAYER TO CONNECT ON TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS IN ONE GAME

Folk is the second Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in one game after he drilled two 52-yard field goals at Houston on Oct. 10, 2021.

K Stephen Gostkowski accomplished the feat three times, with the most recent happening against Oakland on Nov. 19, 2017 in Mexico City.

FOLK 4-FOR-4 ON FIELD GOALS IN FOUR 2021 ROAD GAME

Folk connected on all four field goals (52, 52, 32 and 21) at Houston on Oct. 10, 2021 and was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week. He connected on four field goals in four of the eight 2021 road games - at the N.Y. Jets (9/19), at LA Chargers (10/31) and at Atlanta (11/18). Overall he has had at least four field goals in a game 14 times and six times as a member of the Patriots. FOLK CONNECTS ON HIS 300TH CAREER FIELD GOAL

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2022

- Matthew Slater earned his 10th Pro Bowl invitation in 2021, extending
 his NFL record for most Pro Bowl selections as a special teamer. Slater has the second-most Pro Bowl selections as a Patriot with 10. Tom
 Brady holds the franchise record with 14. He is one of three active players to be selected to 10 Pro Bowls, joining Tom Brady (15) and Aaron
 Rodgers (10).
- Slater is in his 15th season with the Patriots in 2022, tied with Troy Brown and Julius Adams, behind only the 20 by Tom Brady and the 16 by Steve Grogan.
- Slater has played in 210 regular season games, behind the 285 by Tom Brady and the 212 by Bruce Armstrong. If he plays in all 17 games in 2022 he will move into second place with 223 games played in a Patriots uniform
- Slater has played in 103 games at Gillette Stadium, the second-most games played at Gillette as a member of the Patriots, behind Tom Brady (134).
- Slater enters the 2022 season having played in 25 postseason games, tied for the eighth-most postseason games played in NFL history.

ELECTED TEAM LEADER

 Slater has been named to 10 Pro Bowls for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the 12th straight season in 2022. He shared what it means to be a captain in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "You have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

PRO BOWL RECORD



Slater has earned 10 Pro Bowl invitations (2011-17, 19-21) as a special teams player. Steve Tasker (1987, 90-95) has the second-most with seven Pro Bowl selections. Slater is also the only special teams player to earn seven consecutive Pro Bowls, which he did from 2011-17.

• Slater was voted to the Pro Bowl for seven straight seasons from 2011-17 and three more from 2019-21. Those 10 selections are three more than the seven that his father earned with the L.A. Rams. SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

SLATER'S SCORE

 During a 2007 game against Arizona State, UCLA's Matthew Slater returned a kickoff 89 yards for the final touchdown of his collegiate career. In the Patriots 16-10 win over Buffalo on Sept. 29, 2019, DB J.C. Jackson blocked a punt, which Slater returned 11 yards for his first NFL touchdown, 12 seasons after his last touchdown.

From Sickle Cell to Education to Criminal Justice to Healthcare Equity, Devin's work is prolific. He has steered the New England Patriots' Players Social Justice Fund since it was established at the end of the 2018 season, and has served as a Players Coalition Task Force Member and Chair of its Education & Economic Advancement Committee since its founding in 2018. He has been involved with Big Brothers, Big Sisters and on a yearly basis, runs a Thanksgiving and Christmas drive to support those in the local Massachusetts community.

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 28 times in their 62-year history. Twenty-two of those playoff berths have come in the 28 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns - 19 since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994 and 17 in the last 21 seasons.

PLAYOFF BERTHS UNDER KRAFT

New England has qualified for the playoffs 28 times in the team's 62-year history. The Patriots have earned 22 of those playoff berths in the 28 seasons since Rob-

ert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won 22 division crowns overall (21 AFC East crowns) and has qualified as a Wild Card team on five occasions (1976, '85, '94, '98 and 2021). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.



ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT

The Patriots are also the only team to win more than half of their games in 19 straight seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, more than the 49ers (16 straight from 1983-98) and the Cowboys (16 straight from 1970-85).

The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 24 of the 28 seasons Robert Kraft has owned the team.

COMEBACKS FOR THE AGES

The Patriots have staged two historic come-from-behind victories over the past several seasons:

Bill Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games in which a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 had recorded 2,647 wins, seven losses and two ties, a winning percentage of .997.

New England came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).
