NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (9-4) AT INDIANAPOLIS COLTS (7-6)

Saturday, December 18, 2021 · Lucas Oil Stadium (63,000) · 8:20 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots return from the Bye Week with a nationally-televised Saturday night football game against the Indianapolis Colts from Lucas Oil Stadium. It will be the Patriots first Saturday game since beating Buffalo, 24-17, on Dec. 21, 2019. The Patriots are 8-0 in Saturday games since 2000.

The Patriots return to the field on a seven-game winning streak and own an AFC-leading 9-4 record after overcoming a 2-4 start to the season to secure their 35th winning season overall, their 24th winning season in the 28 years of ownership under Robert Kraft and the 20th winning season in the 22 seasons under head coach Bill Belichick.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by The NFL Network and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4. Kevin Burkhardt will handle play-by-play duties with Greg Olsen as the color analysts. Pam Oliver and Kristina Pink will work from the sidelines. The game will be produced by Pete Macheska and directed by Artie Kempner.

NATIONAL RADIO: Saturday's game will be broadcast to a national audience on Westwood One. Bill Rosinski will call the game with Mike Golic providing analysis.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 The Sports Hub is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 35 stations can be found on page 69. Play-by-play broadcaster **Bob Socci** will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. The games are produced by Marc Cappello.

PATRIOTS AIMING FOR 10-WIN SEASON FOR **27TH TIME IN TEAM HISTORY**

The Patriots enter this week's game with a 9-4 record and will be aiming for their 27th 10-win season. Since the 1970 merger, the Patriots, Steelers and Cowboys are tied with 26 10-win seasons.

PATRIOTS LOOK TO SCORE 30 OR MORE POINTS TO BREAK NFL RECORD

The Patriots have scored at least 30 points in nine straight games against the Colts, including the postseason, to tie an NFL record for the most consecutive games scoring 30 points against an opponent. Kansas City also accomplished the feat in nine straight games from 1964 through 1968 against the Denver Broncos.

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and Indianapolis Colts will meet for the first time since Oct. 4, 2018, when New England captured a 38-24 victory at Gillette Stadium in a Thursday Night Football game. The Patriots have won the last eight games against the Colts, including six regular season games and two postseason games.

Both teams are coming off their Bye Weeks. It is the third matchup of the 2021 season with both teams coming off a Bye. Washington and Tampa Bay met in Week 10 and Minnesota and Dallas met in Week 8 coming off Byes.

The two teams share a long rivalry, as the Patriots and the Baltimore/ Indianapolis Colts played twice each year from 1970 to 2001 as members of the AFC East, with the exception of the 1982 strike season.

Since realignment in 2002 when the Colts moved to the AFC South, the teams played in the regular season in every year for 10 straight seasons from 2003 through 2012 with New England holding 6-4 edge in those games. While they did not play in the 2013 regular season, they did face each other in the postseason with the Patriots claiming a 43-22 Divisional Playoff win at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 11, 2014. The rivalry was rekindled with two meetings in 2014, a regular season game at Indianapolis and the AFC Championship Game at Gillette Stadium, both of which were won by New England. Then the clubs met again in 2015 with New England taking a Sunday Night Football victory at Indianapolis.

Overall, this week's game will be the 82nd meeting between the two teams. The Patriots lead the series with a 48-28 record in the regular season and a 4-1 record in the postseason.

New England holds an overall record of 22-16 when playing on the road against the Colts, including a 2-2 record at Lucas Oil Stadium.

The Patriots own a 4-1 record overall against Indianapolis in the postseason, including a 4-0 record in playoff games played in New England. Three of the five postseason contests were in the AFC Championship Game. The Patriots are 2-1 in those contests.

The clubs have clashed in the playoffs following the 2003, 04, 06, 13 and 14 seasons. The Patriots beat the Colts in the 2003 AFC Championship Game, 24-14, at Gillette Stadium, won 20-3 at Gillette Stadium in a 2004 AFC Divisional Playoff, lost in the 2006 AFC Championship Game, 38-34, at Indianapolis, won in the AFC Divisional meeting 43-22 at Gillette Stadium and took a 45-7 decision in the 2014 AFC Championship Game.

- The Patriots will look to improve to a 7-0 road record. The Patriots have finished undefeated on the road twice in franchise history (2007 and 2016). The Patriots have the best road record since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994 with a 138-84 (.622) record.
- The Patriots will look to improve to an 8-1 record in the conference with a win against Indianapolis.
- The Patriots rushed for 222 yards against Buffalo in the last game and have a chance to record back-to-back 200-yard rushing games for the first time since 2012 when the team rushed for 247 and 251 yards in back-to-back weeks against the Bills (9/30) and the Broncos (10/7).
- The Patriots are second in the NFL to Dallas (20) with 19 interceptions in 2021. In 2020, the Patriots tied for the NFL lead with Miami, New Orleans and Pittsburgh with 18 interceptions. The 2019 Patriots led the NFL with 25 interceptions. Two teams have led the NFL in interceptions in three or more consecutive seasons: Kansas City (5 straight 1966-70) and the New York Giants (3 straight 1937-39). Overall, the Patriots have led the NFL in interceptions four times (2003, 2010, 2019 and 2020).
- The Patriots have returned three interceptions for a touchdown this season and need one more to match the four by Dallas, who leads the NFL. The Patriots have returned at least four picks for a touchdown in a season four times with four in 1997 and 2010, and five in 2003 and 2001.
- The Patriots defense enters this week allowing just 15.4 points per game, first in the NFL. Since 2001, the Patriots have recorded 13 seasons of 20.0 points allowed or fewer, tied for the second-most in the NFL during that span.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR...

- Nick Folk tied his career high with an NFL-leading 33 field goals in 2021 and needs one more to establish a new single-season career-high. Folk has never led the NFL in field goals. Since 1970, the Patriots have had a player finish first in the NFL in field goals five times – Tony Franklin in 1986, Adam Vinatieri in 2004 and Stephen Gostkowski in 2008, 2013 and 2014.
- Folk's 33 field goals are the sixth-most in a season by a Patriots kicker. Stephen Gostkowski is the only kicker that has kicked more than 33 field goals in a single-season.



- Folk has connected on four or more field goals in five games in 2021 and needs do get at least four field goals in this week's game to tie the NFL record.
 The NFL record for most games in a season with at least four field goals is six by David Akers in 2011 with San Francisco.
- Folk enters this week in 11th place on the Patriots all-time scoring list with 290 points and needs five points to move past Sam Cunningham (294) into 10th place on the team's all-time scoring list.

 touchdowns and a perfect 158.3 passer rating in his career. If he completes one more pass in 2021, he will be the
 first Patriots wide receiver to complete more than two passes in a single season. Julian Edelman completed two
 passes in 2018, 2019 and 2020, and Harold Jackson completed two passes in 1980. In addition to the Tampa Bay
 game, Meyers completed two passes, both for touchdowns, in 2020.
- The most passes thrown by a non quarterback in a single season for the Patriots were by RB Andy Johnson, who
 was 7-of-9 for 194 yards with four touchdowns in 1981 and RB Dick Christy, who was 6-of-11 for 94 yards with two
 touchdowns in 1960.
- Meyers has two 2-point conversions in 2021 after converting vs. Dallas on Oct. 17 and at LA Chargers on Oct. 31. Only 17 players have had three in one season. The NFL record for most in a season is four by Todd Heap of Baltimore in 2003.
- Meyers has three total 2-point conversions and needs one more to tie Julian Edelman and Gino Cappelletti for the team's all-time career high with four 2-point conversions.



- Jones has completed over 70 percent of his passes in eight of his first 13 NFL games. Jones can tie the rookie record this week against Indianapolis. Dak Prescott completed 70 percent of his passes in nine games as a rookie in 2016. The NFL record is 13 games by Drew Brees in 2017.
- Jones is leading all rookie quarterbacks with 2,869 passing yards and 16 touchdowns. He needs 131 passing yards and four touchdowns at Indianapolis this week to become the 15th rookie quarterback to reach 3,000 yards passing and 20 touchdowns.
- Through 13 games, Jones' completion percentage is 70.3. The best completion percentage for a season by a rookie quarterback is Dak Prescott at 67.7
 percent in 2016.
- Jones has helped lead the Patriots to seven straight wins. He is the fourth rookie quarterback in the Super Bowl era to lead his team to a seven-game winning streak.



PATRIOTS ADD TO BEST CONFERENCE RECORD AND FIRST TEAM IN AFC WITH A WINNING RECORD

The Patriots improved to a 7-1 record in the AFC and became the first AFC team to secure a winning record with a 9-4 mark.

PATRIOTS EXTEND NFL RECORD TO 99 STRAIGHT GAMES SCORING IN FIRST HALF

The Patriots have gone 99 straight games (regular season and postseason) scoring in the first half, to extend an NFL record, following Damien Harris' 64-yard touchdown run in the first quarter. The Patriots also own the second-longest streak at 82 games with a first half score (2006-11). The last time the Patriots failed to score in the first half was a 16-0 loss at home against Buffalo on Oct. 2, 2016.

PATRIOTS BEGIN THE GAME WITH 10 STRAIGHT RUNS

The Patriots began the game with 10 straight runs. That's their longest streak to start a game under Bill Belichick and the longest by any team since the 2018 Ravens in Lamar Jackson's first career start (Week 11 vs Bengals). Overall, the Patriots finished the game with 46 rushing attempts, the most since they had 47 rushing attempts on Dec. 23, 2018 vs. Buffalo.

PATRIOTS WIN SEVENTH GAME IN A ROW

New England won its seventh straight game. During the streak the Patriots have allowed just 73 points for an average of 10.4 points per game.

PATRIOTS COMPLETE JUST TWO PASSES

The Patriots completed just 2-of-3 passes for 19 yards. The 3 pass attempts are the fewest by a team since Buffalo in Week 3 of the 1974 season against the Jets with just 2 attempts. It is the third time that has happened for the Patriots. They also completed just two vs. Miami on Dec. 12, 192 and vs. Miami on Nov. 9. 1969.

Buffalo's third quarter field goal were the only points the Patriots have allowed in the second half in the last five games.

PATRIOTS ARE PERFECT ON THE ROAD IN 2021

Since the start of the 1994 season when Robert Kraft purchased the team, the Patriots have the best regular season road record in the NFL. Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (340), division titles (19), winning percentage (.690), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (21).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 28 seasons of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention



to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (24) and are tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest losing seasons (3) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 28 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 21 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons, and finished with a winning record 24 times.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

Robert Kraft has 33 career postseason wins as an owner, third most in NFL history behind the Rooney Family in Pittsburgh (36) and the Green Bay Packers (36). A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the milestone. Al Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

A WINNING TRADITION II

Kraft's winning percentage with the Patriots (.690) since taking over the team in 1994 is the highest among all owners/ownership groups with at least 200 wins (regular and postseason) with one team. He is one of just four owners with at least 200 wins and a winning percentage over .600.

KRAFT PASSES OTHER OWNERS

The Patriots have 340 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 340-153 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 27 times in their 61-year history. Twenty-one of those playoff berths have come in the 27 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns, including 17 in the last 20 seasons and 19 of which have come since Robert Kraft's purchase in 1994.

PATRIOTS

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in the NFL with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver and Pittsburgh have played in eight.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, one behind the 16 by Pittsburgh and San Francisco.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, the most in NFL history. Pittsburgh is second with 36 playoff wins all-time.
- The New England Patriots earned seven No. 1 seeds, behind Denver (8) and San Francisco (9) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since the current playoff format was instituted in 1990. Pittsburgh and San Francisco are second with nine byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 58 postseason games, fourth-most in NFL history behind Dallas (63), Pittsburgh (62) and Green Bay (60).
 The Patriots need to play in two more postseason games in 2021 to become the fourth NFL team to play in 60 postseason games.
- The Patriots are second with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 14 seasons with 12 victories
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco has more 13-win seasons with 10.
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- New England has 28 undefeated months since 2000, most in the NFL over that span. Green Bay is second with 19 undefeated months during that time.
- The Patriots have 35 winning seasons since 1970, second all-time behind Pittsburgh's 37.




- The Patriots have 565 total victories, the third-most wins since 1960, behind the 575 wins by Pittsburgh and the 570 wins by Dallas.
- New England (1,003) played in their 1,000 games in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021 and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- With rookie free agent K Quinn Nordin making the initial 53-man roster in 2021, the Patriots have now had a rookie free agent make the opening day roster for the 18th straight season, the third-longest streak in the NFL. The L.A. Chargers have had a rookie free agent make their opening day roster for 25 straight seasons and Indianapolis has had a rookie free agent make their opening day roster for 23 straight seasons.
- The Patriots have finished in the top 10 for fewest points allowed in each of the last nine seasons (2012-2020) and need to accomplish the feat in 2021 to tie Tampa Bay, who became the last team to reach 10 straight seasons (1996-2005) for the fewest points allowed. The 2021 Patriots are first with 15.4 points allowed per game.

Since 1970, the only other team to have two picks from one school followed by their next two picks from one school was the 1992 Los Angeles Rams who drafted DE Sean Gilbert (Pittsburgh) in the first round followed by DB Steve Israel (Pittsburgh) in the second round and then used two third-round picks for DL Marc Boutte (LSU) and WR Todd Kinchen (LSU).

PATRIOTS DEFENSE PRODUCES FOUR INTERCEPTIONS; END FIRST TWO JETS DRIVES WITH INTERCEPTIONS

The Patriots had four interceptions against the Jets (9/19/21), the most picks in a single game since they had four at Cincinnati on Dec. 15, 2019. The Patriots had four games with four picks total in 2019, including their game on Oct. 21, at the New York Jets, the only other time the Patriots picked off four passes against the Jets. The Patriots ended the first two Jets drives with interceptions from CB J.C. Jackson and DB Adrian Phillips, leading to 10 points. Jackson added a second interception in the second quarter, and Devin McCourty had a pick in the third quarter. The Patriots had their second game in 2021 with four picks in the 25-0 shutout win at Atlanta on Nov. 18.

PATRIOTS SCORE 50

The Patriots finished with 54 points against the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021, the 14th time in team history that the team has scored at least 50 points. It is the 9th time scoring at least 50 points under Bill Belichick and the first since a 51-17 win vs Jacksonville on Sept. 27, 2015. The 54 points are the 7th most points scored in team history.

PATRIOTS SCORE 50 AGAINST THE JETS FOR THE THIRD TIME IN TEAM HISTORY

The 50-point output marks the third 50-point game the Patriots have produced against the Jets. The Patriots scored a 56-3 win vs. the Jets on Sept. 9, 1979 and a 55-21 victory vs. the Jets on Oct. 29, 1978.

PATRIOTS EXPLODE FOR 31 POINTS IN THE FIRST HALF

The Patriots scored 31 points in the first half against the Jets (10/24). It is the 12th time in team history that they have had a 30-point first half, the 10th time under Bill Belichick and the first since a 30-13 halftime lead in a 36-20 win at New Orleans on Sept. 17, 2017.

PATRIOTS TIE TEAM RECORD WITH FOUR RUSHING TDS

The Patriots tied a team record with four rushing touchdowns in the win against the Jets (10/24). The Patriots have had four rushing touchdowns in a game 10 times overall. They have accomplished the mark four times against the Jets – Sept. 8, 1963, Oct. 18, 1976, Oct. 29, 1978 and Oct. 24, 2021.

PATRIOTS OFFENSE PRODUCES 32 FIRST DOWNS

The Patriots offense produced 32 first downs in the win against the New York Jets (10/24), the 12th time in team history that they have had at least 32 first downs. It is the most since tying a team record with 35 first downs in the win vs. Jacksonville on Sept. 27, 2015.

PATRIOTS OFFENSE GAINS 551 TOTAL YARDS

The Patriots offense generated 551 total yards against the New York Jets (10/24), the 7th highest total in team history and the most since 555 total yards at New Orleans on Sept. 17, 2017.

RECEIVERS HAVE NOW COMPLETED THREE PASSES IN 2021

Kendrick Bourne's 25-yard touchdown pass to Nelson Agholor against the Jets on Oct. 24 was the third pass completion by a Patriots wide receiver in 2021. Jakobi Meyers completed two passes vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3. The 2020 Patriots had four completions by wide receivers. The most passes completed by a New England team by non-quarterbacks was seven in 1981.

PATRIOTS TIED FOR 1ST IN THE NFL WITH 19 INTERCEPTIONS

The Patriots are tied with Dallas for first in the NFL with 19 interceptions in 2021. In 2020, the Patriots tied for the NFL lead with Miami, New Orleans and Pittsburgh with 18 interceptions. The 2019 New England team led the NFL with 25 interceptions. Two teams have led the NFL in interceptions in three or more straight seasons: Kansas City (5 straight – 1966-70) and the New York Giants (3 straight – 1937-39). Overall, the Patriots have led the NFL in interceptions four times (2003, 2010, 2019 and 2020).

LOCK DOWN DEFENSE

The 2021 Patriots defense is ranked 3rd in the NFL. Under Bill Belichick, the Patriots have had a defense finish in the top 10 eight times, including the 2019 defense that finished first in the NFL.

PATRIOTS PLAY 1,000 GAME

New England (1,003) played in their 1,000 game in franchise history against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021 to become the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.

THIRD HIGHEST COMPLETION PERCENTAGE

QB Mac Jones (19-of-23) and QB Brian Hoyer (3-for-3) combined to go 22-for-26 for an 84.6 completion percentage in the 45-7 win against the Cleveland Browns on Nov. 14. Jones was 22-of-26 in the Atlanta game for an 84.6 completions percentage to tie for the third-best completions percentages games in team history.

SCORING OUTPUT

The Patriots scored 54 points vs. the New York Jets (10/24) and then in their next home game scored 45 points against Cleveland (11/14) for a total of 99 points. It is the second highest output in back-to-back home games in team history to the 101 points following 59 points in the win vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 18, 2012 followed by 42 points in the win vs. Houston on Dec. 10, 2012.

PATRIOTS SCORE ON A 99-YARD DRIVE IN SECOND QUARTER; THIRD DRIVE OF 99 YARDS SINCE 2000

The Patriots capped an 11-play 99-yard drive with a 23-yard touch-down pass from QB Mac Jones to WR Kendrick Bourne against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021. It is the first 99-yard drive for New England since a 10-play, 99-yard drive that was culminated by a 10-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Rob Gronkowski vs. San Diego on Sept. 18, 2011. Since 2000, the Patriots have now had three drives of 99 yards. Brady completed a 99-yard touchdown pass to WR Wes Welker at Miami on Sept. 12, 2011. Those are the only 99-yard drive for the Patriots since 1980.

SUNDAY DRIVES

The Patriots offense had three 90-yard drives that resulted in touchdowns against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021. The Patriots had an 11-play, 99-yard drive in the second quarter that resulted in a touchdown, an 8-play, 92-yard scoring drive and a 6-play, 95-yard scoring drive. It is the only time in the Bill Belichick era that the team has had three 90-play drives in a game.

THE PATRIOTS SCORED ON SEVEN OF THEIR NINE DRIVES

The Patriots scored on seven of their nine offensive drives, including all four drives in the first half against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021. It is the second time in 2021 that the Patriots scored on every drive in the first half. The Patriots scored on all five of their first half drives in the win vs the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021. In that game, the Patriots scored on nine-of-11 offensive drives. The Patriots scored on eight of their first 10 drives (the 11th possession was a victory formation kneel down) in the win vs. Tennessee on Nov. 28.

THURSDAY NIGHT DOMINATION

PATRIOTS RETURN THIRD PICK FOR A TOUCHDOWN OF THE 2021 SEASON

LB Kyle Van Noy's 35-yard interception return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter at Atlanta on Thursday Night Football (11/18) is the third touchdown return off an interception in 2021. The Patriots had three picks returned for a touchdown in 2019.

PATRIOTS PICK OFF ALL THREE FALCONS QUARTERBACKS

The Patriots picked off all three Falcons quarterbacks (Matt Ryan, Josh Rosen and Feleipe Franks) vs. Atlanta (11/18). It was the first time three quarterbacks threw picks in the same game since Jim Harbaugh, Ryan Leaf and Moses Moreno did it for the Chargers in a 17-7 loss to the Dolphins on Nov. 12, 2000.

PATRIOTS INTERCEPT THREE DIFFERENT QBS IN THE SAME QUARTER

The Patriots intercepted three different Atlanta quarterbacks in the fourth quarter. They are the first team to intercept three different quarterbacks in the same quarter since Chicago picked off Tampa Bay's Craig Erickson, Steve DeBerg and Casey Weldon in the fourth quarter on Sept. 26, 1993.

PATRIOTS DEFENSE HOLDS ATLANTA TO 40 YARDS RUSHING

The Patriots defense held the Falcons to just 40 yards rushing. It is the lowest since holding the New York Jets to just 36 yards rushing on Sept. 22, 2019. Overall, it is 15th time under Bill Belichick that the Patriots held a team to 40 yards rushing or less.

PATRIOTS EARN 30TH SHUTOUT IN TEAM HISTORY, 13TH UNDER BELICHICK

The Patriots earned their 30th shutout in franchise history and 13th under Bill Belichick with the 25-0 victory over the Atlanta Falcons (11/18). It is the Patriots' first shutout since a 45-0 win at Los Angeles Chargers on Dec.6, 2020.

PATRIOTS HAVE 15 WINNING STREAK OF 6 OR MORE GAMES SINCE 2001

The Patriots won their seventh game in a row at Buffalo (12/6) and now have 15 winning streaks of six or more games in a season since 2001, the most in the NFL.



Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win six Super Bowl titles. He won more games overall (141) during a 10-year stretch (2010-19) than any other coach in NFL history. In 2007, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 47 consecutive years as an NFL coach are most in NFL history, passing the 45 by Dick LeBeau. The only other NFL coach with at least 40 consecutive NFL coaching seasons is Tom Moore with 41.



MEYERS USING HIS ARM

Meyers threw two touchdown passes in 2020. He completed a 24-yard touchdown pass to RB Rex Burkhead vs. Baltimore (11/15) and a 19-yard touchdown pass to QB Cam Newton vs. N.Y. Jets (1/3). Overall, Patriots wide receivers completed four passes in 2020. WR Julian Edelman also completed two passes. The four pass completions by wide receivers are the most in team history. They have three so far in 2021.

MULTIPLE TDS FROM JAKOBI

• Meyers (two touchdown passes) became the third Patriots wide receiver to throw a touchdown pass under head coach Bill Belichick. David Patten threw a 60-yard touchdown pass on Oct. 21, 2001, at Indianapolis and WR Julian Edelman threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to WR Phillip Dorsett at Philadelphia on Nov. 17, 2019. Kendrick Bourne became the fourth to do so with a 25-yard touchdown to WR Nelson Agholor vs. N.Y. Jets on Oct. 24, 2021.

JAKOBI JOINS ELITE CLUB

• Meyers, who threw touchdown passes in Weeks 10 and 17 in 2020, became the fourth wide receiver with two touchdown passes in a single season in the Super Bowl era, joining Rod Gardner (2003), Antwaan Randle El (2010) and Odell Beckham Jr. (2018).

JAKOBI MEYERS COMPLETES TWO PASSES IN ONE GAME

• Meyers completed two passes vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 3, 2021. He caught a backwards pass from QB Mac Jones and then threw across the field to RB Brandon Bolden, who managed a 15-yard gain in the second quarter. He completed a 30-yard pass to WR Nelson Agholor in the fourth quarter on a flea flicker. The only other wide receiver to complete two passes in single game for New England was Julian Edelman vs. Denver on Oct. 18, 2020. The only other non-quarterbacks to complete two passes in a game for New England were running backs – Dick Christy on Nov. 18, 1960 vs. Dallas Texans and Andy Johnson on Sept. 6, 1981 vs. Baltimore Colts.

• Meyers has completed 4-of-4 passes for 88 yards with two touchdown passes for a perfect 158.3 passer rating in his career.

• Jakobi Meyers and Cam Newton were teammates in 2020, but the wide receiver and former quarterback looked up to Newton and had a chance meeting with him while at an impressionable age. "When I was younger in high school, I made [Newton's] 7-on-7 team — his all-star team — and we traveled to Florida to play in a league," Meyers said. "We ended up losing, but it was still a great experience. It was a good experience to meet Cam when I was very young. A lot of guys where I come from look up to him, so that was definitely a once-in-a lifetime opportunity for me."

MEYERS SCORES FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWN

• WR Jakobi Meyers scored his first NFL touchdown on an 11-yard pass from QB Brian Hoyer in the fourth quarter against Cleveland (11/14/21). It was his 135th career reception. He has scored on three 2-points plays and thrown for two touchdown passes.

G SHAO **MASON**

A FAMOUS NAMESAKE

• A noted sports fan and basketball enthusiast, Shaq's mother, Alicia McGuire, named her son Shaquille Olajuwon Mason in 1993 after her two favorite NBA stars at the time, Shaquille O'Neal and Hakeem Olajuwon. The Tennessee native had the opportunity to meet one of his namesakes at a Memphis Grizzlies game while O'Neal was a member of the Miami Heat, receiving a special meet-and-greet and having his jersey signed.





LB JA'WHAUN BENTLEY

2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

• LB Ja'Whaun Bentley set single-season career-highs with 91 tackles and 1½ sacks in 2020.



Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on couches and floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.

LB JAMIE **COLLINS SR**.

PATH TO THE NFL

- The road to the NFL was anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins Sr. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Quentin, Miss., Collins Sr. lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters. Collins Sr. turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times.
- "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins Sr. told the Boston Herald. "It kept me on track." Collins Sr.'s resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native and former Patriots teammate Stevan Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend.
- "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the Herald in 2013. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and still finds a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and done a pretty good job as a rookie."

SACKS AND PICKS

• Since entering the NFL in 2013, Collins is the player in the NFL with at least 25 sacks and 10 interceptions. Collins has accumulated $26 \, \frac{1}{2}$ sacks and 12 picks during his career. He is the first player to accomplish the feat within his first 100 career games.

LB DONT'A HIGHTOWER

WINNER ON MULTIPLE LEVELS

 Dont'a Hightower (three Super Bowl championships and two national titles at Alabama) and Russell Maryland (two national championships at Miami and three Super Bowl Championships with Dallas) are the only two players in NFL history with at least two national championships and two Super Bowl wins.

MR. FEBRUARY

- Hightower has made two Super-Bowl altering plays during his career and was part of a record-setting performance in another. Head coach Bill Belichick referred to Hightower as "Mr. February" at the team's Super Bowl LIII ring ceremony.
- In Super Bowl XLIX vs. Seattle, Hightower made a crucial tackle on Seahawks
 RB Marshawn Lynch at the
 1-yard line the play before
 CB Malcolm Butler intercepted Seattle QB Russell
 Wilson to seal the victory in
 the waning moments.
- New England trailed the Atlanta Falcons, 28-12, midway through the fourth quarter when Hightower strip-sacked Falcons QB Matt Ryan at the Atlanta 25-yard line. The fumble was recovered by the Patriots and the turnover led to a touchdown that helped spark the record comeback in Super Bowl LI.
- Led a defensive unit in the Super Bowl LIII win over the L.A. Rams (2/3/19). Hightower recorded two sacks and a pass defensed as part of a stifling defense that became the second team in Super Bowl history to hold its opponent to just three points





DB J.C. JACKSON

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

- J.C. Jackson led the Patriots with nine interceptions in 2020. Jackson has seven interceptions so far in 2021. Jackson is tied with Asante Samuel for the team record for most interceptions in consecutive seasons with 16. Samuel picked off 10 passes in 2006 and six in 2007.
- Jackson has 24 interceptions since 2018, the most in the NFL over that span.



2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Jackson led the NFL with 11 takeaways in 2020. Since 2019, he has 23 total takeaways (21 interceptions and two fumble recoveries) to move past Ron Hall (1964-66 - (20 interceptions in two fumble recoveries) for the most takeaways in a three-year span by a Patriots player.

• Jackson became the fifth Patriot and first since Asante Samuel (2006-07) to net at least five interceptions in consecutive seasons. J.C. JACKSON HAS A PICK AGAINST JETS FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT GAME

J.C. Jackson registered his first interception of the 2021 season when he intercepted a Zach Wilson pass in the first quarter to give the Patriots a first down at the Jets 35-yard line at the NY Jets (9/19). It was his third straight pick against the Jets after intercepting a pass in both Jets games in 2020. He also picked off a pass in the second Jets game (10/24) in 2021 for his fourth straight game against the Jets with a pick to join Baltimore's Eric Waddle, who had four interceptions against Cleveland (2016-17) as the last player to accomplish the feat.

JACKSON HAD TWO PICKS IN A GAME FOR FOURTH TIME IN HIS CAREER

Jackson had two interceptions at Carolina on Nov. 7, 2021, his fourth time recording two interceptions in a game and the second time in 2021. He had two picks at the N.Y. Jets (9/19). He also had two picks at Buffalo on Sept. 29, 2019 and two picks at Cincinnati on Dec. 15, 2019.

JACKSON HAD FIRST PICK SIX

Jackson returned an interception 88 yards for a touchdown in the win at Carolina on Nov. 7, 2021. It is the sixth-longest interception return in team history. *

J.C. JACKSON RETURNS PICK 88 YARDS FOR A TOUCH-DOWN

CB J.C. Jackson returned a third quarter interception 88 yards for a touchdown for his first career score at Carolina (11/7/21). It was the second straight week that the Patriots have scored on an interception return following Adrian Phillips' pick six at the LA Chargers (10/31). It is also the sixth-longest return in team history. Jackson's previous longest return was 30 yards vs. Denver on Oct. 18, 2020.

JACKSON NOW HAS 24 INTERCEPTIONS THROUGH FIRST FOUR SEASONS

J.C. Jackson now has 24 interceptions through his first four NFL seasons, passing Mike Haynes (22) for the most through a player's first four seasons with the Patriots.

JACKSON SETS CAREER HIGH WITH 17TH PASS DEFENSED

Jackson is first in the NFL with 17 passes defensed and surpassed his previous career high of 14 passes defensed set in 2020.

JACKSON MOVES INTO TOP TEN

Jackson secured his 24th interception and is now tied with Ronnie Lippett and Nick Buoniconti for 9th place on the Patriots all-time interception list.

JACKSON MOVES UP ON PATS INTERCEPTION LIST

Jackson's fourth quarter interception is his 24th career pick to move into 9th place on the Patriots all-time list with Nick Buoniconti and Ronnie Lippett. Maurice Hurst is in 8th place with 27 interceptions.

JACKSON HAS HIGHEST TWO-YEAR INTERCEPTION TOTAL IN TEAM HISTORY

With his fourth quarter interception, Jackson increased his two-year interception total to 16 (9 in 2020 and 7 in 2021) and is tied with Asante Samuel (16) - (10 in 2006 and 6 in 2007) for the most interceptions in consecutive seasons for the Patriots.

AFC PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Jackson was named AFC Defensive Player of the Month for November. It is the first NFL honor for Jackson and the first AFC Defensive Player of the Month honor for the Patriots since 2019 when Stephon Gilmore (October) and DB Devin McCourty (September) won the award. Jackson helped New England finish the month of November with a perfect 4-0 record behind a defense that allowed just 26 points (6.5 points per game), including all four games without allowing a point in the second half. Jackson had four interceptions in November, including an 88-yard interception return for a touchdown in the third quarter of the victory at Carolina on Nov. 7.

LB MATTHEW **JUDON**

REPRESENTING FAMILY

- Matthew Judon wore jersey #99 during his five seasons with the Baltimore Ravens but chose jersey #9 upon joining New England in 2021.
- Said Judon, "I'm one of 10 children, so I got nine siblings. Every time I go out there, I represent them. I like nine. That's one of the reasons I rock it. Ninety-nine was taken, so I chose to use the new rule and getting on it."



LB MATT JUDON HAS EIGHTH TWO-SACK GAME; SECOND OF THE 2021 SEASON

- LB Matt Judon had two sacks in a three-play sequence in the second quarter at Houston (10/10/21). It is the 8th time in his career that he has had a multi-sack game and second time in 2021. He had 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ sacks vs. New Orleans on Sept. 26. His career-best is 3 sacks vs. Oakland on Nov. 25, 2018, when he played for Baltimore.

JUDON SETS TEAM RECORD FOR MOST SACKS IN FIRST FIVE GAMES

- Judon set a team record with 6 1/2 sacks through the first five games. The previous record was 5 1/2 sacks by Chandler Jones in 2015 and Andre Tippett in 1984

MATTHEW JUDON SETS CAREER-HIGH BY REACHING DOUBLE-DIGIT SACKS

• Judon reached double-digit sacks for the first time in his career after a 9-yard sack of QB Matt Ryan in the second quarter at Atlanta (11/18/21) pushed his season total to 10 ½ sacks. It is the 17th time that the Patriots have had a player reach 10 or more sacks in a season. Judon's previous best was 9 ½ in 2019 with Baltimore. He now has 12 1/2 sacks and is tied with Chandler Jones (2015) and Mike Vrabel (2007) for the most sacks in a season by a Patriots player under Bill Belichick.

DB DEVIN McCOURTY

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

- Devin McCourty is tied for fourth all-time in New England history with 36 total takeaways. He needs four total takeaways to join Raymond Clayborn (44), Fred Marion (42) and Ty Law (40) as the only players in team history with 40 total takeaways.
- McCourty enters 2021 tied with Ty Law for second-most Pro Bowl invitations as a Patriots defensive back with four. Only CB Mike Haynes (6) had more Pro Bowl nods as a Patriots defensive back.



- McCourty tied for fourth in the NFL with five interceptions in 2019, his
 third career season with five-plus interceptions. That mark tied Marcus
 Peters and Earl Thomas for most seasons with five-plus interception seasons since 2010. Additionally, McCourty's 29 regular season interceptions
 since he entered the league in 2010 are tied for the fifth-most in the NFL
 over that span.
- McCourty has played in 184 career regular season games. If he plays in all 16 games in 2021 he will have played in the 10th-most games in New England history

- McCourty became the third Patriots player too reach 30 interceptions with his pick at Atlanta on Nov. 18, 2021. He is in third on the all-time interception, behind Ty Law (36) and Raymond Clayborn (36).

THE MOST IMPORTANT ABILITY IS AVAILABILITY

• McCourty has played the second most defensive snaps since he entered the NFL in 2010 with 11,208 defensive snaps to Malcolm Jenkins (New Orleans and Philadelphia) who is first with 11,227 defensive snaps.

McCOUR-TD

• McCourty has four career touchdowns following a return of a blocked field goal for a touchdown at L.A. Chargers (12/6/20) and his 43-yard interception return for a touchdown at Seattle (9/20/20). McCourty also had an 84-yard interception return for a touchdown at Buffalo in 2018 and a 104-yard kickoff return vs. N.Y. Jets in 2012.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots in 2018 (now with Miami). The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. In the 2018 season opener, Devin and Jason became the first set of twins to play together on the same NFL team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louisville Colonels.
- Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

IN GOOD COMPANY

• Devin McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

BROTHERS IN ARMS

• Devin and Jason McCourty have seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. Devin's work with the local Boston Children's Hospital has helped advance research of the disease with doctors now as close as they've ever been to a cure.'

DB JALEN **MILLS**

THE RISE OF THE GREEN GOB-LIN

 Jalen Mills has embraced his nickname "The Green Goblin." The origins of the nickname started out as a joke during his rookie season with Philadelphia when he dyed his hair green. Mills is not sure whether it was a coach or the media but the spiderman villain nickname was inspired and took off with the fans.



• Said Mills, "It just kind of came from my rookie year and then just throughout my years playing for the Eagles, my style of play. That's what I get it from. It's kind of something that I stuck with."

DB ADRIAN **PHILLIPS**

VERSATILITY

- "I'm one of the guys that when you ask me what position I play, I say 'defense.' I want to be able to line up everywhere, and most importantly, I want to be able to produce everywhere."
- Began his career in 2014 in San Diego focusing on special teams and was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2018 as a special teamer.



- Started all 16 games at safety last year for the Patriots and led the team in tackles with a career-high 107.
- Phillips scored his first career touchdown on a 26-yard interceptions return at LA Chargers (10/31/21). He has a career-high of four picks in 2021.

ADRIAN PHILLIPS HAS FIRST CAREER PICK SIX

DB Adrian Phillips picked off a fourth quarter pass from QB Justin Herbert and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown at the L.A. Chargers on Oct. 31. It is Phillips' first career touchdown. It is the Patriots first interception returned for a touchdown since DB Devin McCourty returned a pick 43 yards for a touchdown at Seattle on Sept. 20, 2020. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.

PHILLIPS HAS FIRST CAREER TWO-INTERCEPTION GAME

Phillips finished with two interceptions against the Chargers. He also picked off Herbert in the second quarter. He earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his effort.

LB KYLE **VAN NOY**

LB KYLE VAN NOY HAS FIFTH CAREER GAME WITH AT LEAST TWO SACKS

LB Kyle Van Noy had two second quarter sacks with a 3-yard sack and a 13-yard sack of Atlanta QB Matt Ryan (11/18/21). It is his fifth career two-sack game. Four of his two sack games came while he played for the Patriots. He had two sacks on Oct. 15, 2017 at the New York Jets, Oct. 29, 2018 at Buffalo and Sept. 29, 2019 at Buffalo. He had a career-high three sacks on Dec. 6, 2020 vs. Cincinnati while he played for Miami. It's the third time in 2021 the Patriots had a player finish with at least two sacks. Matthew Judon has had two multiple sack games in 2021.



VAN NOY SCORES ON AN INTERCEPTION

Van Noy intercepted QB Matt Ryan in the fourth quarter and returned the pick 35 yards for a touchdown at Atlanta (11/18/21). It is his first pick six and fourth career touchdown. BAILEY SETS TEAM RECORD

Jake Bailey finished first in the NFL with 45.6 net yards per punt in 2020, a new single-season team record. The previous record was 41.5 by Zoltan Mesko in 2011. His gross punt average of 48.7 is also a team record, besting the 46.5 gross average by Mesko in 2011. His 45.6 net yards per punt is second all-time in NFL history in a single season to the 46.0 net average by Johnny Hekker in 2016 with the Rams

DIMINISHING [PUNT] RETURNS

Bailey's punting in 2020 allowed a total of just 71 punt return yards on 12 returns. It is the fewest punt return yards allowed by the Patriots in team history and the sixth-fewest punt return yards allowed in a season in NFL history. The 12 punt returns allowed are second in NFL history and team history to the 11 by New England in 2008.

Justin Bethel has reached double-digit special teams tackles in each of his nine NFL seasons, and will try to reach 10 straight in 2021. Bethel led the team with 14 special teams tackles in 2020.

CODY DAVIS IS SPECIAL

Cody Davis had one special teams tackle against Tennessee (11/28) to push his totals to a team-leading 10 special teams tackles and added one at Buffalo (12.6) to set a career-high with 11 special teams tackles. It is the third time in his career that he has reached double-digit special teams tackles. Davis had 10 special teams tackles in 2015 with St. Louis and 10 special teams tackles in 2018 with Jacksonville.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2021

Gunner Olszewski will attempt to become the first New England player to lead the NFL in two straight years in punt return average and the first NFL player to do so since Devin Hester led the NFL in 2010 and 2011.

Olszewski will look to become the first NFL player to average 17.0-yards per punt return or more in back-to-back seasons. Devin Hester owns the best mark with a 17.1-yard average in 2010 followed by 16.2-yard average in 2011. He is currently second in the NFL with an 12.5-yard punt return average so far in 2021.



PUNT RETURN RECORD

WR Gunner Olszewski finished first in the NFL with a 17.3-yard punt return average (20 returns for 346 yards and one touchdown) in 2020. It is the highest return average in Patriots history and the second-highest in the NFL since 1970. Julian Edelman had the highest average in a season at 15.5 in 2012. Olszewski is the fourth Patriots player to lead the league in punt return average. Danny Amendola led the NFL with a 12.0-yard average in 2015, Troy Brown led in 2001 with a 14.2-yard average and Irving Fryar tied for the NFL lead with a 14.1-yard average in 1985.

OLSZEWSKI SCORES FIRST NFL TD ON A PUNT RETURN

WR Gunner Olszewski scored his first NFL touchdown on a 70-yard punt return at the L.A. Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020. It was the first punt return for a touchdown for New England since WR Julian Edelman returned a punt 84 yards vs. Denver on Nov. 2, 2014. Olszewski's return came on the heels of an 82-yard punt return for a touchdown that was called back due to a penalty in the previous game.

Olszewski finished with 145 punt return yards in the win at the L.A. Chargers (12/6/20), the second-most ever by a Patriot in a single game.

GUNNER GOES LONG TWICE

Olszewski scored on a 70-yard punt return touchdown and had a 61-yard return in the Patriots win at the L.A. Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020. He is the first player in Patriots history with two punt returns of at least 60 yards in a single game and the first NFL player to do so since Indianapolis RB Nyheim Hines had 84 and 71-yard punt return touchdowns vs. Carolina on Dec. 22, 2019. Before Olszewski, the two longest punt returns in a single game for the Patriots was Julian Edelman on Nov. 18, 2012, vs. Indianapolis with a 68-yard punt returned for a touchdown and a 49-yard return.

GAME BALL TO GUNNER

Olszewski scored his first touchdown reception on a career-long 38-yard pass in the win at the L.A. Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020. Olszewski joined Julian Edelman (vs. Denver in 2014 and vs. Indianapolis in 2012), Stanley Morgan (vs. Baltimore in 1979) and Irving Fryar (vs. Indianapolis in 1985) as the only Patriots with a punt returned touchdown and a touchdown reception in the same game.

GUNNER OLSZEWSKI GOES LONG THREE TIMES

Gunner Olszewski had three 20-yard punt returns at the L.A. Chargers on Oct. 31, 2021 with a 20-yard return, a 21-yard return and a 27-yard return. The last NFL player with three punt returns of 20 or more yards in a single game was Nyheim Hines of Indianapolis on Dec. 22, 2019 vs. Tennessee. The last New England player to do so was Troy Brown on Sept. 11, 2000 at the New York Jets (31, 21 and 38-yard returns).

- · Slater has been named to nine Pro Bowls for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the 11th straight season
- · He shared what it means to be a captain with high school football players in a story published by The Boston Globe. "You have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice - putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

• Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

· During a 2007 game against Arizona State, UCLA's Matthew Slater returned a kickoff 89 yards for the final touchdown of his collegiate career. In the Patriots 16-10 win over Buffalo on Sept. 29, 2019, DB J.C. Jackson blocked a punt, which Slater returned 11 yards for his first NFL touchdown, 12 seasons after his last touchdown.



LOCAL LINEAGE

Nick Folk's mother is a direct descendant of William Bradford, a founder, settler and longtime governor of the Plymouth Colony settlement. Bradford was also a passenger on the Mayflower's original voyage to America.

FOLK HERO

Folk kicked his second game-winning field goal as time expired in 2020, connecting on a 50-yard field goal against Arizona (11/29/20) to give the Patriots a 20-17 win.



He had a 51-yard game-winning field goal as time expired at the New York Jets on Nov. 9, 2020 to give the Patriots a 30-27 victory. He is the first NFL kicker with two game-winning field goals as time expired in a single season. Overall, he has three-game-winning field goals as time expired. He also kicked a 53-yard field game-winning field goal as time expired at Buffalo on Oct. 8, 2007, when he was a rookie with the Dallas Cowboys.

FOLK DIGS THE LONG BALL

Folk's 50-yard game-winning field goal vs. Arizona (11/29/20) was the second-longest game-winning field goal with no time left in Patriots history, behind the 51-yarder he hit at N.Y. Jets (11/9). The previous long was 48 yards by Adam Vinatieri in Super Bowl XXXVI vs. the St. Louis Rams.

NICK FOLK SETS TEAM RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS

K Nick Folk set the team record with 33 consecutive field goals after connecting on field goals of 46, 49, 32 and 26 yards at the New York (9/19/21) and extended that mark to 36 straight field with a 27-yarder vs. Tampa Bay before missing a 56-yarder in the fourth quarter. He passed Stephen Gostkowski, who connected on 31 straight field goals. After missing his first two field goals of the 2020 season, he kicked 36 straight field goals. Folk's previous longest streak was 23 straight field goals in 2013 when he played for the New York Jets. The NFL record is 44 straight field goals by Adam Vinatieri.

NICK FOLK DRILLS TWO 52-YARD FIELD GOALS LONGEST FIELD GOALS AS A MEMBER OF THE PATRIOTS

K Nick Folk drilled a 52-yard field goal in the second quarter and 52-yard field goal in the third quarter at Houston (10/10/21), his longest field goals as a member of the Patriots. He had a 51-yard field goal on Dec. 21, 2019 vs. Buffalo and a 51-yard field goal at the New York Jets on Nov. 9, 2020. His career-long is a 56-yard field goal on Oct. 17, 2010 at Denver when he played for the New York Jets.

FOLK HAS SECOND NFL GAME WITH TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS

Folk had his second NFL game with two 50-yard field goals at Houston (10/10/21) He had two 51-yard field goals on Nov. 18, 2012 t St. Louis as a member of the New York Jets.

FOLK BECOMES SECOND PATS PLAYER TO CONNECT ON TWO 50-YARD FIELD GOALS IN ONE GAME

Folk is the second Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in one game after he drilled two 52-yard field goals at Houston on Oct. 10, 2021. K Stephen Gostkowski accomplished the feat three times with the most recent happening against Oakland on Nov. 19, 2017 in Mexico City.

FOLK 4-FOR-4 ON FIELD GOALS IN FOUR 2021 ROAD GAMES

Folk connected on all four field goals (52, 52, 32 and 21) at Houston on Oct. 10, 201 and was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week. He has connected on four field goals in four of the six 2021 road games - at the NY Jets (9/19), at LA Chargers (10/31) and at Atlanta (11/18). Overall he has had at least four field goals in a game 14 times and six times as a member of the Patriots. He has connected on five field goals in a game three times, including making five field goals vs. Tennessee (11/28/21)

NICK FOLK CONNECTS ON HIS 300TH CAREER FIELD GOAL

Nick Folk (318) became the 35th NFL player to reach 300 career field goals following his 39-yard field goal in the second quarter at the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021. He became the fifth active kicker to reach 300 career field goals, joining Robbie Gould (413), Mason Crosby (364), Matt Prater (338) and Justin Tucker (319).



CHILDREN'S TUMOR FOUNDATION

The Children's Tumor Foundation has a special place in Patriots kicker Nick Folk's heart. His cousin, Blake, has neurofibromatosis (NF), a genetic disorder that causes tumors to grow on nerves throughout the body. The term NF represents three distinct disorders: NF1, NF2 and schwannomatosis. For Blake, his NF impacts him most where his optic nerves cross in his brain. He currently has 5 brain tumors.

When Blake was a baby, Nick's mom, Kathryn, a pediatrician, noticed light brown spots on Blake's skin. Further testing showed that Blake was diagnosed with NF.

Nick and Blake have both been pillars in each other's lives. In 2007, Blake was seven years old and had a big surgery coming up to remove the fluid build up in his brain. He was required to shave half his head for the surgery. While on the Cowboys roster, Nick asked for time off during the offseason to fly out to California to be with Blake, turning up with half his head shaved to match Blake.

Nick has partnered with the Children's Tumor Foundation for many years and has chosen to represent the foundation on his cleats for the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats campaign. Blake's mom, Kim, currently works for the Foundation as the Development Special Events Manager. As for Blake, he hit a milestone of turning 20 years old in 2020 after undergoing 20 surgeries.

UNDERSTANDING NF

The Children's Tumor Foundation's mission is to drive research, expand knowledge, and advance care for the NF community.

ABOUT NEUROFIBROMATOSIS, OR NF

Neurofibromatosis, or NF, is a genetic disorder that affects 1 in every 3,000 people. It causes tumors to grow on nerves throughout the body and can lead to deafness, blindness, disfigurement, bone abnormalities, learning disabilities, disabling pain, and cancer. 120 kids are born with NF each day, which means that a new NF patient is born every 12 minutes. NF occurs in all populations equally, and there is not yet a cure.

CAN NF BE CURED?

At this time, there is no approved cure for NF, but a number of promising NF clinical trials are under way. As researchers continually learn more about the underlying causes of NF and what makes tumors grow, the Foundation is getting closer to the development of effective treatments for NF. In 2020, the FDA approved the first ever treatment for one form of NF that shrunk tumors in patients, but more treatments are needed for all forms of NF.

RAISING AWARENESS

MAKE NF VISIBLE

Though NF affects over 2.5 million people worldwide, it is still relatively unknown in the general public. The Children's Tumor Foundation's MAKE NF VISIBLE campaign brings awareness and inclusion to all NF patients. Those with visible signs of NF struggle to be seen as more than just their NF, while patients whose NF is invisible struggle to make others understand. MAKE NF VISIBLE is about seeing NF, and seeing the person living with it. Learn more at makenfvisible.



- After the Patriots defense forced a three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.
- On the Bears first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown that gave the Patriots a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half

COMEBACKS FOR THE AGES

The Patriots have staged two historic come-from-behind victories over the past several seasons:

Belichick coached the Patriots back from a 25-point deficit to win Super Bowl LI. A comeback of that magnitude is extremely rare. There had been 2,656 games in which a team led by 25 points or more in NFL history, including the postseason. Teams leading by 25 had recorded 2,647 wins, seven losses and two ties, a winning percentage of .997.

New England came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest regular season comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (09/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (01/01/12).
