



GAME NOTES

HEADLINES

INSIDE THE 20s: The Jets are the only NFL team to field both an offense and a defense that ranks in the top three inside the 20. New York's offense is third in the NFL, scoring a touchdown 69.6 percent of the time when they cross the opponent's 20. The Jets defense is second best in the NFL, allowing opponents to score a touchdown on only 41.2 percent of trips inside of their 20. The Cincinnati Bengals are the only other team to rank in the top five in both offense and defense efficiency inside the 20.

TOP FIVE: New York's defense is ranked in the top five of eight major defensive categories: First Downs per Game (1st), Rushing Yards per Game (1st), Rushing Yards per Attempt (1st), Yards per Game (2nd), Yards per Play (2nd), Passing Net Yards per Play (3rd), Points per Game (4th), Passing Net Yards per Game (4th).

RUSHING DEFENSE: Led by a line that includes NT **Damon Harrison**, and DEs **Sheldon Richardson**, **Muhammad Wilkerson** and **Leonard Williams**, the Jets defense ranks first in the NFL against the run, allowing 71.5 yards per game and 3.4 yards per rush. The Jets have allowed two rushing touchdowns this season.

SECONDARY: After adding CBs **Antonio Cromartie**, **Darrelle Revis** and **Buster Skrine** as well as S **Marcus Gilchrist** during the offseason, New York's secondary has helped power a Jets defense that ranks first in the NFL in completion percentage (54.8%) and yards per attempt (5.64). Additionally, the defense is second in opponent passer rating (68.5). Led by CB **Darrelle Revis'** NFL-leading six takeaways (3 INTs and 3 FR), the unit has had a hand in 12 of the team's 15 turnovers. The group has accounted for all eight of the club's interceptions and four of the team's seven fumble recoveries.

CHRIS IVORY: RB **Chris Ivory** has gained 501 yards over his first five games of the season. He did not play vs. PHI (9/27). **Ivory** is third in the NFL averaging 100.2 yards rushing a game.

Ryan Fitzpatrick: QB **Ryan Fitzpatrick** has led his team to victory in seven of his last 11 starts. In those games, he has thrown 20 touchdowns against eight interceptions for a passer rating of 93.6.

TAKEAWAYS: The Jets defense ranks fourth in the NFL with 15 takeaways and has surpassed the team's total for the 2014 season. The turnovers include eight interceptions and seven fumble recoveries. All eight of the interceptions have been by defensive backs, led by CB **Darrelle Revis** (3), S **Marcus Gilchrist** (2) and CB **Marcus Williams** (2). CB **Calvin Pryor** has one interception.

MUHAMMAD WILKERSON: After registering a sack against NE (10/25), DL Muhammad Wilkerson now leads the team with 5.0 sacks in six games. He has registered at least a half of a sack in six of his last seven contests dating back to 2014 (NE 12/21). Since entering the NFL as a first-round pick in 2011, Wilkerson's 29.5 sacks are the most on the Jets, while his 21.5 sacks since the start of 2013 trails only J.J. Watt (HST) and Cameron Jordan (NO) among 3-4 defensive linemen.

OFFENSE

WR 87 ERIC DECKER 6th Season
Has played in five games this season and is tied for the team lead with 4
touchdown receptions, catching one in each of his first 4 games.

LT 60 D'BRICKASHAW **FERGUSON 10th Season** Started all 150 regular season games since being drafted by the Jets in 2006, behind only NYG QB Eli Manning for the most consecutive starts in the league.

LG 77 JAMES **CARPENTER** 5th Season Former Super Bowl Champion that joined the Jets as a UFA this offseason. Part of a Jets offensive line that is 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards per game and has allowed just 4 sacks through 6 games.

C 74 NICK MANGOLD 10th Season Part of a Jets offensive line that is 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards per game and has allowed just 4 sacks through 6 games. Has earned six Pro Bowl selections, including consecutive trips in 2013-14.

RG 66 WILLIE **COLON 10th Season** Former Super Bowl Champion who will play in his 100th regular season NFL game at OAK. Part of a Jets offensive line that is 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards per game and has allowed just 4 sacks through 6 games.

RT 68 BRENO GIACOMINI 8th Season Former Super Bowl Champion who enters his 2nd season with the Jets. Part of a Jets offensive line that is 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards per game and has allowed just 4 sacks through 6 games.

TE 85 JEFF **CUMBERLAND** 5th Season Started a career-high 14 games in the 2014 season, finishing with 23 receptions for 247 yards and three touchdowns.

WR 15 BRANDON MARSHALL 10th Season Became the 9th active player to reach 10,000 yards receiving, after logging 10 rec. for 109 yards vs. PHI (9/27). Became the first Jets WR since Don Maynard in 1968 to register four consecutive 100-yard receiving performances.

QB 14 RYAN FITZPATRICK 11th Season Surpassed 20,000 career yards passing on the first play of the game against MIA (10/4) as he connected on a 58-yard pass to Marshall.

RB 33 CHRIS IVORY 6th Season His 100.2 rushing yards per game is the 3rd most in the NFL. Followed his career-best performance against MIA (10/4), with a 146 yard game against WAS (10/18), marking the first time in his career that he has recorded consecutive 100-yard performances.

FB 40 TOMMY BOHANON 3rd Season Helps block for a rushing offense that averages 136.5 yards a game, 3rd best in the NFL. The unit rushed for a season high 221 yards in their Week Six win against WAS (10/18).

KEY RESERVES

TE 47KELLEN **DAVIS**8th Season

Veteran TE that has collected 12 receiving touchdowns in his career while primarily being utilized as a blocker. Earned his first start of the season vs. MIA (10/4) in place of an injured Jeff Cumberland as he blocked for a

rushing offense that produced 207 yards on the ground.

WR 19 DEVIN SMITH Rookie 2015 Second-round selection with 6 catches for 60 yards in 4 games played.

WR 11 JEREMY **KERLEY** 5th Season Third on the team with 2 touchdown receptions. Also has 9 receptions for 60 yards.

RB 29 BILAL **POWELL** 5th Season Earned the start in place of an injured Chris Ivory vs. PHI (9/27).

KICKER

K 2 NICK **FOLK** 9th Season Has made 16 field goals of 50-or-more yards since joining the Jets in 2010.

DEFENSE

DE 96 MUHAMMAD **WILKERSON 5th Season** Recorded his 3rd career game with at least 2.0 sacks in Week 4 against MIA (10/4). Leads the team this season with 5.0 sacks in 6 games.

DT 94 DAMON "SNACKS" **HARRISON** 4th Season Since entering the starting lineup in 2013, the Jets have held opponents to just 3.54 yards per carry, the lowest average in the league.

DE 92 LEONARD **WILLIAMS Rookie** The sixth overall selection by the Jets in the 2015 NFL Draft, he recorded his first half-sack, teaming with Wilkerson for a 10-yard sack vs. PHI (9/27).

OLB 98 QUINTON **COPLES** 4th Season Set a single-season career-best in sacks (6.5) in 2014, while also matching his career high in tackles (seven) vs. BUF (10/28/14).

ILB 56 DEMARIO **DAVIS** 4th Season Leads the team in total tackles after he posted a career-high 15 tackles vs. PHI (9/27).

ILB 52 DAVID **HARRIS** 9th Season Logged his second sack of the season against MIA (10/4), the 8th time in 9 seasons he has had multiple sacks in a year. Currently 3rd on the team's all-time tackles list.

OLB 97 CALVIN PACE 13th Season Recipient of the 2014 Dennis Byrd Most Inspirational Player Award, as voted by his teammates. Started all 16 games for the fourth-consecutive season and finished with 45 tackles, five sacks, nine tackles for loss and three passes defensed.

CB 24 DARRELLE **REVIS** 9th Season Returns after winning Super Bowl XLIX. Earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after Week Two. Has three fumble recoveries and three interceptions this season.

CB 31 ANTONIO CROMARTIE 10th Season Rejoined Jets after leading ARZ with 12 passes defensed in 2014. The four-time Pro Bowler started all 16 games last season for the fourth-consecutive time in his career.

FS 21 MARCUS GILCHRIST 5th Season Veteran safety that joined the Jets this offseason after signing as a UFA. Has equaled his single-season high in interceptions (2) through six games.

SS 25 CALVIN PRYOR 2nd Season Responsible for takeaways in consecutive weeks as he forced a fumble at the goal line in Week One and picked off the first pass of his career in Week Two.

KEY RESERVES

DE 78 LEGER **DOUZABLE** 8th Season Veteran DL who returned to the Jets this offseason. Has played in all 38 games since joining the club in 2013. Established career bests in sacks in his first two years with New York.

DE 91 SHELDON RICHARDSON 3rd Season 2014 Team MVP and Pro Bowler returns to lineup after missing first four games of 2015. Recorded 1.5 sacks in two games, while helping to hold opponents to 1.9-yards a rush on 26 carries.

CB 41 BUSTER SKRINE 5th Season

Signed with Jets this offseason after starting all 16 games for CLV for the first time in his career, finishing the season with 18 passes defensed, 66 tackles and career-high four interceptions – tied for eighth in the NFL.

CB 20 MARCUS **WILLIAMS** 2nd Season Has recorded 3 INTs in 13 career games, including an INT on the final MIA offensive possession in the Week Four win.

P 4 RYAN QUIGLEY 3rd Season Established franchise season highs and career highs in average yards per punt (45.9) and net punting average (40.4) in 2014.

- Head Coach Todd Bowles begins his first season as the head coach of the New York Jets, returning to the franchise he began his NFL coaching career with in 2000.
- Bowles recorded his second win of the 2015 season, becoming only the fourth first-year head coach in franchise history to start off the season 2-0 or better. Pete Carroll started the Jets off to a 2-0 start in 1994, while Al Groh started the 2000 season 4-0. In 2009, Rex Ryan was the last first-year Jets head coach to start the season off to a 3-0 start.
- Bowles became the first Jets head coach to win his season opener at home in his first year at the helm since 1960, when Sammy Baugh won the first game in the franchise's history as the Titans of New York defeated BUF, 27-3 (09/11/60).
- Last season, Bowles became the inaugural recipient of the Assistant Coach of the Year Award from The Associated Press and the PFWA after his second season as ARZ defensive coordinator.
- During his first season as the defensive coordinator for ARZ (2013), Bowles' defense finished with the league's number one rushing defense for the first time in franchise history, improving from 28th in the league in 2012.
- During Bowles' second season with ARZ, the defense was able to sustain elite status despite key player losses to injury, tying for third-best in the NFL in interceptions returned for touchdowns (three), fifth-best in fewest touchdowns allowed (32), turnover margin (+8) and points allowed per game (18.7).
- From 2005-07, he served as the secondary coach for DAL. In that time, we worked with five other future NFL head coaches, including Jason Garrett (DAL), Todd Haley (KC), Sean Payton (NO), Tony Sparano (MIA) and Mike Zimmer (MIN).



- Bobby April enters his first season as a special teams coordinator for the Jets, his 24th season in the NFL and 21st as a special teams coordinator.
- April returns to the AFC East after coaching six seasons with BUF where he was twice recognized as Special Teams Coach of the Year (2004, '08)
- During his two seasons with PHI (2010-12), April's special-teams corps ranked third in the league in punt coverage (2012), seventh in net punting average, ninth in kickoff coverage and 12th in punt-return average. Under his guidance, former Eagles K Alex Henry set a team and NFL rookie mark, going 24-for-27.



- Named the offensive coordinator on January 20, 2015, Chan Gailey has coached 18 years in the NFL with a background that includes four Super Bowl appearances, 18 years as a college coach and two years in the World League (WLAF).
- Gailey makes his return to the AFC East after previously serving as head coach of BUF (2012), whose offense ranked sixth in the NFL in rushing (138.6 ypg) and fourth in yards per attempt (5.02).
- Has coached two running backs to 1,000+ rushing yards and improved the rushing yards for three NFL franchises as a head coach and offensive coordinator (1998, 2000, 2012).



- Prior to re-joining Coach Bowles, Kacy Rodgers served as the defensive line coach for MIA, overseeing three consecutive seasons of their defensive line, accounting for 70% of the team's total sacks. The MIA defense ranked in the top 10 in total sacks (287), rushing average (4.02 yards per carry) and rushing touchdowns allowed (80).
- DT Paul Soliai (2012), DT Randy Starks (2010, '12) and DE Cameron Wake all made their first Pro Bowl Appearances under the tutelage of Rodgers, with Wake and DE Olivier Vernon posting the third highest total in sacks from a pair of defensive lineman (38.0).





- Mike Caldwell joins Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff as the assistant head coach and linebacker coach after spending two seasons leading an impressive defensive unit in ARZ.
- During his first season as the linebackers coach for PHI, Caldwell developed and integrated young players into key role players, including Jamar Chaney, DeMeco Ryans, and rookies Brian Rolle and Casey Matthews. Chaney led the team in tackles during the 2011 season (104) with Ryans leading the team in 2012 (113), including 15 tackles for loss.
- With ARZ, Caldwell's linebacker corps contributed to a fifthranked defense, despite the loss of ILB Karlos Dansby to free agency and Daryl Washington to injury.



- Robby Brown made his NFL coaching debut with the Jets, previously serving as a coach at the collegiate level for 10 seasons at South Alabama, Northwestern State, Valdosa State, Henderson State, Southwest Baptist and Troy.
- While Brown served as the offensive coordinator for Valdosta State in 2012, the team averaged 469 yards, scoring 40 points-per-game and clinching the NCAA Division II National Championship.



- For five seasons, Mark Collins served as the outside linebackers coach and defensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons. In those seasons, Collins oversaw a defensive line whose run defense recorded a tackle for loss every 10.2 rushing attempts. The Falcons defense also produced the seventh most takeaways in the league (140) under Collins' guidance.
- Before he began his coaching career in the NFL, Collins spent 11 seasons at the collegiate level coaching for his alma mater East Tennessee State, Elon, Louisiana-Monroe, Georgia Southern, Georgia and two seasons with Michigan that led to back-to-back appearances in the Rose Bowl.



- Joe Danna spent five seasons with the Atlanta Falcons before joining the Jets in 2015, the last three as defensive backs coach.
- During the 2014 season, Danna worked with two second-year starting cornerbacks, Desmond Trufant and Robert Alford, as well as young safety Dezmen Southward. Trufant started in all 16 games and Alford started in all 10 games he played, with both picking off three passes, while Southward played in all 16 games, posting one sack and an interception.
- Before his time in Atlanta, Danna spent two seasons with the Miami Dolphins (2010-11), coaching a secondary that held opposing quarterbacks to the eighth-lowest completion percentage during that span.



- Karl Dorrell returns to the AFC East in 2015 as the Jets wide receivers coach after accumulating 25 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and professional level. Dorrell has spent 15 years at the collegiate level and 10 years in the NFL.
- In his last coaching stint with the NFL, Dorrell served as quarterbacks coach, helping tutor QB Matt Schaub to his second-career Pro Bowl. Dorrell is also reunited with WR Brandon Marshall, who he coached in Miami (2008-10).
- As a former head coach at UCLA, Dorrell guided the Bruins to five bowl games and an overall record of 35-27. He was named Pac-10 Conference Co-Coach of the year in 2005.



- Steve Hagen returns for his third season with the Jets in 2015 and his first as the assistant special teams coach. Hagen has coached for 30 years with 20 years of his experience in collegiate football.
- Last season, Hagen led a TE group that included rookie second-round pick Jace Amaro, who led all rookie tight ends in receptions (38), receiving yards (345) and tied for the lead in receiving touchdowns (two).



- Ron Heller enters his third season with the Jets in 2015, finishing last season with an offensive line that blocked for a rushing offense that produced 142.5 yards per game the third best average in the league.
- During the 2013 season, the Jets finished with the sixthranked rushing offense in the league (134.9 yards per game); the rushing offense included two new starters, a first since the 2008 campaign.
- After 12 seasons as an NFL offensive tackle (1984-95), Heller worked as both an assistant offensive line coach and offensive line coach for clubs in the NFLE (2004, 06-07), CFL (2009) and the UFL (2012).



- After a year hiatus, Jimmie Johnson returns to the NFL as the tight ends coach for the Jets in 2015. Prior to joining the Jets, Johnson was the tight ends coach for the Minnesota Vikings for eight seasons.
- Under Johnson, Visanthe Shiancoe posted 208 catches for 2,424 yards and 24 touchdowns in five seasons, despite amassing just 35 catches for 253 yards and three touchdowns in the four seasons prior to joining MIN. In his final two seasons with Johnson, Kyle Rudolph, a former second-round selection, posted 12 touchdowns. Although he missed eight games in those two seasons, Rudolph's 12 touchdowns tied for the fifth-most among tight ends in the NFL.
- In their time under Johnson, MIN tight ends excelled in the red zone, producing 36 touchdowns on just 75 targets, or almost half a touchdown per target, the best in the league.
- After a 10-year playing career, Johnson began his coaching career at the collegiate level with South Carolina State (2001), Shaw (2002-03) and Texas Southern (2004-05).



- Pepper Johnson enters his first season as Jets defensive line coach, returning to the club he finished his playing career with in 1997-98.
- Under his direction, nine different defensive linemen registered at least 5.0 sacks, including a pair of 10.0-sack efforts (Mark Anderson and Andre Carter) in 2011 and a trio in 2014 (Marcell Dareus, Jerry Hughes and Mario Williams).
- Johnson has been to seven Super Bowls as a player or coach, winning five, including winning titles as a player with NYG in 1986 and 1990.



- Steve Marshall enters his 35th season coaching football with 27 years coaching at the collegiate level.
- Directed CLV and GB offensive lines that ranked top 10 in the league in sacks allowed each season, helping Derek Anderson (Browns, 2007) and Aaron Rodgers (Packers, 2014) earn Pro Bowl appearances.
- While coaching at the collegiate level, Marshall has tutored 19 future NFL players, including David Bakhtiari, Mitchell Schwartz and five-time Pro Bowler Andre Gurode.



- Daylon McCutcheon enters his first season as assistant defensive backs coach for 2015. McCutcheon had previously worked with the Jets as a training camp intern in 2013 with the defense.
- Prior to returning to the Jets, McCutcheon served as a training camp intern with ARZ (2014), working with Todd Bowles,
 Mike Caldwell, Ryan Slowik and the ARZ defense.
- Following his eight-year playing career, he returned to his high school alma mater to serve as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach (2008-14).



- Reunites with offensive coordinator Chan Gailey for his first season with the Jets as the quarterbacks coach.
- Prior to joining the Jets, Patullo served as the assistant wide receivers coach for TEN (2014), helping WR Nate Washington rank seventh-best in the league in yards per catch (16.2). Patullo also coached WR Kendall Wright to a career best in yards per catch (12.5) and touchdowns scored (six) despite missing two games.
- Before joining the Titans, Patullo served as the offensive quality control and assistant wide receivers coach for BUF (2010-12) with Gailey as head coach. Patullo coached WR Stevie Johnson's three best seasons of his career as Johnson topped 75 receptions, 1,000 yards and six touchdowns in each season.





- After serving 12 seasons at the collegiate level, Scott begins his first year in the NFL with the Jets as the quality control – defense coach for 2015.
- Prior to joining the Jets, Scott coached the defensive line and outside linebackers for seven collegiate teams, which include Buffalo (2015), Texas Tech (2013-14) and Georgia Southern (2010-12).
- His playing career included two seasons with the AFL2's Greensboro Prowlers as a defensive end (2000-01), earning recognition as the Defensive Player of the Year (2000).



- Marcel Shipp returns to the NFL as the running backs coach for the Jets. Prior to joining the Jets, Shipp served as the running backs coach for his alma mater, the University of Massachusetts (2014).
- Shipp began his professional coaching career with the UFL's
 Las Vegas Locomotives as an assistant coach (2012) following his playing career with the club as a running back (200911). After his stint with the Locomotives, Shipp spent training camp with ARZ as a coaching intern (2013).
- During Shipp's playing career, he spent seven seasons with ARZ at running back (2001-07) with 605 carries for 2,197 yards, 14 total touchdowns and 113 receptions for 937 yards.



- Ryan Slowik begins his first season as an assistant defensive line coach for the Jets in 2015 after spending seven seasons with ARZ.
- Prior to joining the Jets, Slowik assisted an ARZ defense that forced 88 takeaways and allowed opponents to convert on just 35.3% of their third-down attempts. He coached various parts of the ARZ defensive unit, including defensive assistant/defensive back (2013-14), outside linebackers (2012) and quality control – defense (2009-11).
- Before working with ARZ, Slowik served in an array of roles for four seasons with DEN, including the assistant defensive backs coach (2008), assistant special teams coach (2007) and defensive assistant (2005-06).
