SERIES INFORMATION

The Detroit Lions (2-7) return to Ford Field in Week 11 for a matchup with the Oakland Raiders (4-5) that marks the beginning of a three-game home stand for Detroit. The Lions are coming off an 18-16 win over the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field in Week 10, the team's first road win against the Packers since 1991, while the Raiders head to Detroit following a 30-14 loss against Minnesota. The Lions and Raiders have met 11 times in the regular season, with Detroit winning the previous meeting, 28-27 in 2011. Oakland leads the all-time series, 6-5-0.

FIRST SEASON IN DETROIT

By finishing the year with an 11-5 regular season record, Head Coach **Jim Caldwell** tied Patsy Clark (1931, Portsmouth Spartans) for the most wins in franchise history by a coach in his first year with the club.

- Caldwell is the third coach in team history to lead the Lions to the playoffs in his first year with Detroit (George Wilson in 1957; Bobby Ross in 1997).
- He is the seventh coach in franchise history (since 1930) to lead the Lions to a winning record (entire season) in his first year with the club.
- In four years as an NFL head coach, Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009).
- With 11 wins this season, Caldwell has won 10+ games for the third time in four seasons as a head coach in the NFL, including 14-2 in 2009 and 10-6 in 2010 with Indianapolis; 11-5 in 2014 with Detroit.

COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 14 NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 12 winning seasons and only once finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 149-75 regular season record, along with 12 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In first year as head coach for Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- Holds a 39-34 (.534) regular-season record in five seasons as an NFL head coach, including three seasons with at least 10 wins.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.

Lions QB **Matthew Stafford** saw his best statistical season in Downing's first year with the Lions, as he threw for over 5,000 yards and 41 touchdowns. Downing began his career with the Lions as the offensive quality control coach from 2009-10.
- Lions Special Teams Coordinator **Joe Marciano** and Raiders Defensive Line Coach **Jethro Franklin** held the same positions in Houston in 2007 and 2008.
- Raiders Tight Ends Coach **Bobby Johnson** coached in Detroit for two seasons in 2013 and 2014, where he was the tight ends coach in 2013 and the assistant offensive line coach in 2014. Lions Running Backs Coach **Curtis Modkins** and Johnson coached on the same staff in Buffalo in 2010 and 2011. Modkins was the offensive coordinator/running backs coach while Johnson served as the assistant offensive line coach.
- Raiders Wide Receivers Coach **Rob Moore** trained Lions WR **Golden Tate** as Tate prepared for the NFL Combine in 2010.
- Lions Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line Coach **Ron Prince** and Raiders Offensive Coordinator **Bill Musgrave** coached together at the University of Virginia in 2001 and 2002. Prince then replaced Musgrave as offensive coordinator in Charlottesville in 2003 when Musgrave went to work for then-Jaguars Head Coach **Jack Del Rio** in 2003 and 2004.
- Raiders Defensive Backs Coach **Marcus Robinson** coached in Detroit for two seasons, where he served as a defensive assistant in 2012 and the secondary coach in 2013.

QUOTE THE LIONS

The following is a quote sheet with excerpts from Lions Head Coach Jim Caldwell and Lions players following the team's 18-16 win over Green Bay in Week 10.

HEAD COACH JIM CALDWELL

On what it means to get a win over Green Bay:

"Well, you know, big win for us. It's the first one in this quarter against a division foe that, perennially, has been outstanding within the league. To be able to come in here and get a win is pretty special and not only that, I think it's special for our fans, special for the Ford Family and the organization because it's been a while since it's – I haven't necessarily been here, but I certainly can feel and sense how eager everybody was to come here and get a victory and our guys came through with that today. They played tough, played hard and I'm proud of them."

On how much credit he gives the players for maintaining their focus:

"I think that's kind of the mark of this group. Everybody underestimates that, but you guys can see it. You interview them and you know they keep their focus. They compartmentalize things. They don't get frustrated and we haven't had many issues like that. They bind together, they play for one another, they love one another and I think you can certainly see that the way they play."

On ending the streak of losses at Lambeau Field:

"I don't downplay that. I want you to understand that. I just don't carry the weight of it. Mrs. Ford, I can guarantee you one thing, she's happy and extremely excited about it. It's a great organizational win and not only that, it's for the fans. The fans, that's one of the things that I would hear consistently from fans, they've always been great and positive when out on the street or in a restaurant or whatever. Everybody talks about going to Lambeau Field and getting a victory and because of the fact that it's been something that's just carried on for a number of years, so we're certainly happy to come in here and play well and well enough to win."

QB MATTHEW STAFFORD

On breaking the streak at Lambeau Field:

"It feels good just because we won the game. It was up and down, and obviously, it was not pretty in a lot of areas. We had some mistakes on all three phases, but we also made some big plays in all three, and sometimes offset those mistakes. We did a great job. Our defense played great. We made enough plays late in the game to win it and that's what it is all about."

On moving forward:

"It's really nice to not play your best and win a game. We didn't play our best, by any means. We had communication errors, we had physical errors, we had all sorts of errors on all three phases. That's the way football is. It's an imperfect game, but you have to make the plays to win it. We had a great kick off return, Golden (Tate) made a great play, Calvin (Johnson) made some great plays. Our defense stood tall and made some big time plays. We didn't give up a sack today. So, it was a lot of stuff to build off of, but also a lot of stuff to clean up as well."

WR CALVIN JOHNSON

On what it means personally to get a win at Lambeau:

"I went over to (Don) Muhlbach, I think he might've been close to shedding a tear, he almost made me feel the same kind of way. But there's a couple guys in this locker room, (Matthew) Stafford included, that have never got a win up here, so this is one of the more gratifying ones, one of the most gratifying ones."

On what this win says about the team:

"We have a lot of the same guys we had in the locker room last year, so guys expect to win. We all expect to win and the fact that we weren't doing it early, that's not going to deter us from working hard in practice and giving our all in the game."

CB CREZDON BUTLER

On Green Bay's failed two-point conversion attempt:

"We got a lot of pressure up the middle and he (Rodgers) put a little more air on the ball than he wanted to and I ended up making the play."

On frustrating Green Bay's offense:

"We played physical. We didn't want to sit back and let the receivers get into their routes. We didn't want them to have timing throws. We were looking to get up in their faces fast. We didn't want him (Rodgers) to be able to control the game. We wanted to control him, so we brought pressure and we were in their faces."

On the defensive effort against Green Bay:

"Before we left from the bye week, we talked about the mindset coming back, what it was going to take for us to win. We talked about being able to stop the run. We talked about being able to play man-coverage and lock up so that we can load the box and make sure we get the run stopped to get after the quarterback. We challenged our DBs to cover, we challenged our front seven to stop the run and today we did that. We were able to lock in and stay focused for the whole game and we stopped the run and we were able to play man-to-man coverage."

On the historic win:

"I hadn't heard anyone saying anything about a streak. But I told you guys earlier in the week, streaks and records are made to be broken. If it hasn't been broken, somebody is going to do it eventually, one day. Today was that day. It was a great win for us, it was a great win for this organization, and we got to stack them up."

TE BRANDON PETTIGREW

On what the win says about the team going forward:

"It's huge to come out here and perform like that and that game was so back and forth. I don't think any of us have been in a game that back and forth. It came down to the last little bit and we took care of business."

On how it felt to get in the end zone:

"It's been a while. That brought some more life into me. I was excited to get back into the end zone, always a good thing to get in the end zone. Say a prayer, thanks to the blessing of getting back in there."

2015 NEWS AND NOTES

A WIN IN GREEN BAY

With the 18-16 win over the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field in Week 10 (11/15), the Lions have now won three out of the past four games over Green Bay. It marks the first time the Lions have won three games in a four-game span against the Packers since a span of four games that covered the 1998-2000 seasons.

- The team's win at Green Bay snapped a 23-game regular season losing streak on the road against the Packers. The team's last road win occurred December 15, 1991.

The Lions win at Green Bay, Detroit's first since 1991, snapped the Packers 12-game home winning streak, which was the second-longest active streak entering Week 10. During that 12-game win-streak, the Packers averaged 36.2 points per game.

- The 16 points allowed against Green Bay was the lowest points scored by the Packers at Lambeau Field in a game started by QB Aaron Rodgers since Week 17 of the 2010 season (10-3 vs. Chi 1/2/11). In 56 career starts by Rodgers at Lambeau Field, the 16 points allowed by the Lions tied for the second-lowest total by the Packers.

LIONS VS. NFC NORTH

With the Lions' win at Green Bay, Detroit improved to 11-5 (2-2 in 2015) against NFC North teams since 2013. Over the past three years, the Lions are tied for the third-best record against divisional opponents in the NFL. The Lions have the most divisional wins among all NFC North teams over the past three years.

AT THE CONTROLS

Lions QB **Matthew Stafford**, now in his seventh NFL season, has led the Lions offense to great offensive heights. He already has set single-season and career franchise records and closed in on more Lions career passing marks this season. Additionally, Stafford has finished among the top quarterbacks in the League passing rankings the past four seasons. He was selected to his first-career Pro Bowl in 2015, where he was named one of the game's two MVPs following a 316-yard, two-touchdown performance.

- Stafford led the Lions to a 37-34 overtime win over Chicago (10/18) by completing 27-of-40 passes for 405 yards and four touchdowns. He also ran for a career single-game high of 37 rushing yards, surpassing his previous best of 31 vs. Green Bay November 24, 2011.
- With 405 passing yards vs. the Bears, Stafford recorded his 7th career 400-yard game and is now only behind Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino (10) for the most 400-yard games by a player in his first seven seasons. He surpassed QB Peyton Manning for the second-most 400-yard games by a player in his first seven NFL seasons.

Through Week 10, Stafford maintained his place in the Top 10 in the NFL pass completions (8th, 217) and touchdown passes (T-10th, 15).

PASSING PRIDE - CAREER

Among Lions QBs, Stafford has passed his way into Lions lore by becoming the franchise leader in multiple categories.

CAREER YARDS

With 24,039 career passing yards, Stafford is the Lions' all-time leader in career yards and the only Lions QB to reach 20,000 career yards. With 362 in Week 11 at Pittsburgh in 2013 (11/17/13), Stafford broke the previous record of 15,710 held by Layne, which has stood for 55 seasons (1958). Stafford achieved this record in only 55 career games. Layne reached 15,710 yards in 97 career games.

➤ On Stafford's 30-yard completion to WR Golden Tate in the second quarter at Arizona last season (11/16/14), he surpassed 20,000 career passing yards. By reaching 20,000 career passing yards in his 71st career game, he set a new NFL record reaching that mark in the fewest career games. (Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau). Stafford, with 4,257 yards in 2014, reached 4,000 yards on the season and recorded his fourth career 4,000-yard season, an accomplishment he has done for the fourth-straight year (5,038 in 2011; 4,967 in 2012; 4,650 in 2013; 4,040 in 2014). By starting in Week 11 at Pittsburgh in 2013 (11/17/13), Stafford set the franchise record for consecutive starts by a Lions quarterback with 42, dating back to September 11, 2011. He broke a tie with QB Greg Landry (41) for the most consecutive starts by a Lions QB in franchise history. He also set that same mark for consecutive starts including playoffs (43).

- Stafford led the Lions to an 18-16 win over the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field in his 88th career start, including playoffs. By starting in his 88th career game, Stafford surpassed Hall of Fame QB Bobby Layne for the most overall starts (including playoffs) in team history. During his career, Layne started 87 career games (83 regular season and four postseason).

Ninth-year WR Calvin Johnson has produced some of the most prolific numbers among receivers in NFL history during his career and continues to establish himself as perhaps the best receiver in the League. Johnson has earned a spot in the past five Pro Bowls and was named AP All-Pro in three of the past four seasons.

- Johnson caught 6 passes for 166 yards and had 1 touchdown in the Lions' win vs. Chicago (10/18). With 166 receiving yards, Johnson recorded his 45th career 100-yard game and surpassed Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice for the fourth-most 100-yard games by a player in his first nine NFL seasons. By reaching 45 career 100-yard games, he also tied WR Isaac Bruce (45) for 11th on the NFL's all-time 100-yard receiving games list.
- On his first reception of the game, a 9-yard catch in the first quarter in Week 5 vs. Arizona (10/11), Johnson set the franchise record for career receptions with 671 and surpassed WR Herman Moore, who caught 670 passes from 1991-2001. Johnson finished with 5 receptions in the game and now has 675 career catches. Johnson broke the record in his 124th career game, while Moore tallied his 670 receptions in 145 career games.
- By surpassing Moore for the most career receptions in team history, Johnson has now captured the four most notable career franchise receiving records.
- Johnson recorded 10+ receptions for the 12th time in his career with a 10-catch, 83-yard performance in Week 2 at Minnesota (9/20). His 11-yard touchdown grab in the second quarter was the 75th receiving touchdown of his career, as he became the 30th player in NFL history with 75+ touchdown receptions.

7,500 YARDS OVER 75 GAMES

WR Calvin Johnson's 166 yards in the Lions win over Chicago (10/18) once again put him in very elite company when it comes to his accumulation of receiving yards over long spans. Johnson's 166 yards pushed his total over 7,500 yards over the past 75 games, becoming only the second player in NFL history to record 7,500 yards over any 75-game span. This equates to a 100+-yard per game average over 75 games. Johnson joined Hall of Fame WR Lance Alworth as the only players to accomplish this feat.

- With 166 yards vs. Chicago, Johnson tallied 7,531 yards over the past 75 games, which is average per game of 100.4 yards.
- Alworth surpassed 7,500 yards over 75-game spans eight different times, with a high reaching 7,620 yards.

7,000 YARDS OVER 70 GAMES

Johnson and Hall of Fame WR Lance Alworth are the only players in NFL History to average 100+ yards (7,000+ yards) over a stretch of 70 games.

- In Week 1 last year, Johnson's 164 receiving yards vs. the New York Giants (9/8/14) in the opener allowed him to reach a 100-yard average over 70 games for the first time in his career (100.8; 7,053 yds), joining Alworth as the only players to accomplish this feat.

6,000 YARDS OVER 60 GAMES

Johnson is one of only two players in NFL history to maintain an average of 100 receiving yards over at least one 60-game span. He first reached that mark in 2013 (83 yds at Chi11/10/13). In the 2014 season opener, Johnson registered 164 yards vs. the New York Giants and set a new NFL record for the highest average over a 60-game span when he moved his average over the previous 60 games to 105.4 (6,326), which surpassed Alworth's mark of 104.7 (6,283 yds) over a 60-game span during his career. Only Johnson and Alworth have ever averaged 100+ yards over 60 games.

DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

Over the past six seasons, few defensive line units have been as distributive against the pass and the run as the Detroit Lions. Under the direction of Defensive Line Coach Kris Kocurek since 2010, the Lions have instituted a an attack upfront the first concentrates on stopping opponent in the run game and then applying heavy pressure on their way to the passer. In 2015, the Lions defensive line have 47.0 total tackles for loss or no gain (3rd in NFL), which includes 18.0 sacks (tied for 3rd in NFL), 25.5 tackles for loss or no gain against the rush and 3.5 tackles for loss or no gain on completed passes.

- Since 2010, the Lions rank third overall (431.0) in the NFL in stopping opponents for either loss yardage or no game, which includes sacks, tackles on rushing plays and tackles on complete passes.
- The Lions defensive line has garnered 176.5 sacks over the past six seasons, which ranks as the third-highest in the NFL among defensive line units during that span.
- Against the run, the Lions defensive line has generated 232.0 tackles since 2010 that have resulted in the opponents losing yards or getting stopped at the line of scrimmage, which is the fourth-highest mark in the NFL.
- Detroit's defensive linemen have also generated a league-high 22.5 tackles on completed pass plays that resulted in opponents losing yards or gaining zero yards.
- With 46 forced fumbles since 2010, the Lions' defensive line have the second-most in the NFL.
- Detroit's D-line has also registered three safeties since 2010, tied for the second-most in the NFL over the past six seasons.

SAFETY PATROL

Lions S Glover Quin and S James Ihedigbo combined last season to form one of the best safety tandems in the NFL. Quin finished the 2014 season with the League lead in interceptions with seven and Ihedigbo finished closely behind with four interceptions. Quin was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for Week 15, becoming the first Lions defensive back to win the award since S Kurt Schultz in 2000 (Week 4), and also earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl.

- Quin picked up where he left off last season when he registered his first interception of 2015, a 31-yard interception returned for a touchdown in the second quarter at San Diego (9/13).
- Quin intercepted a Broncos pass at the Detroit 8-yard line on the first play of the second quarter in Week 3 (9/27). His pick was the second interception of the season and the ninth pass he has picked off since the beginning of the 2014 season.
- His nine interceptions since 2014 and 12 interceptions since 2013 are both tied for second, respectively, during those spans.

PIN THEM BACK

Quin, with an interception in the Lions' 20-14 win at Chicago last season (12/21/14), recorded his seventh pick of the season to become the first Lions defensive player to record seven interceptions in a season since S Kurt Schulz (7) in 2000.

- Quin became the first Lions player to lead the NFL in interceptions since Hall of Fame CB Lem Barney in 1967 when he registered 10 during his exceptional rookie campaign.
- Quin is the first Lions defensive player to finish the season sole possession of first place among league leaders in interceptions since Hall of Fame DB Jack Christensen in 1953.
- Since 1940, Quin is now the fourth Lions defensive player (fifth time) to lead the NFL in interceptions during a season.

- With an interception against the Bears in Week 16 last year, Quin picked off a pass in four-straight games to become the first Lions player since CB Jerry Holmes in November 1989 to intercept a pass in four-straight games. Quin is now one of four Lions players since 1960 (Holmes, CB Jimmy Allen in 1980 and CB Dick "Night Train" Lane in 1962) to record interceptions in four-straight games.
- As a unit, the Lions safeties led the NFL in interceptions with 11 and ranked fourth in pass defenses with 20.

Martin punted four times for 221 yards and garnered a punting average of 55.3 and a net punting average of 48.5 vs. Chicago (10/18). Martin swung the game during overtime when he connected on punts of 55 and 60 yards for an average of 57.5 and net average of 50.0.

- His final punt, a 60-yarder, occurred on Detroit's 18-yard line. It swung the battle for field position at the time when just a field goal was needed to win the game. The long punt and a tackle for no gain on the return forced the Bears to start what would turn out to be their last drive at the Chicago 22-yard line.
- Martin's 55 and 60-yard punts are the two longest punts during overtime in franchise history.
- Among his 27 career games with 4+ punts, his 55.3 average is a career high. His net punting average of 48.5 was the third-highest single game tally in game with 4+ punts.
- Since 1960, Martin's 55.3 punting average was the second-highest by a Lions punter in a game behind only Hall of Fame S/P Yale Lary's 57.3 average (4 punts) vs. San Francisco October 6, 1963.

SERIES NOTES

➤ In the team's first meeting, the Lions defeated Oakland 28-14 on Thanksgiving Day (11/26/70). The win was the second of five straight wins by the Lions that propelled them to their first playoff berth since 1957. RB Mel Farr rushed 21 times for 121 yards, rallying Detroit from a 14-0 deficit.

➤ The Lions shut out the defending Super Bowl champion Raiders 16-0 on September 27, 1981. Detroit was the first team to shut out the Raiders in 15 years, as the Lions limited Oakland to only 131 yards in total offense. The Lions collected six sacks and DB Jimmy Allen intercepted his fourth pass in as many games. RB Billy Sims earned his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game (133 yards) while RB Dexter Bussey passed RB Altie Taylor as the club's all-time leading rusher at the time.

➤ In a *Monday Night Football* meeting on December 10, 1990, there were five Heisman Trophy winners on the field (Det: Barry Sanders and Andre Ware, Oak: Marcus Allen, Tim Brown and Bo Jackson). Sanders finished the game with 176 yards rushing, while Jackson led the Raiders with 129 yards on the ground.

➤ The Lions defeated the defending AFC Champion Oakland Raiders on November 2, 2003 at Ford Field, the Raiders' first trip to Detroit since 1990.

➤ DE Dewayne White was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance at Oakland (9/9/07) as he was a force in the fourth quarter when Detroit scored 16 unanswered points in the final 10:45 to come away with the victory. After the Lions took a 26-21 lead in the fourth quarter, White intercepted a pass on the ensuing Raiders drive and returned it 28 yards to set up a field goal to increase Detroit's lead to eight. On the first play of the next Oakland possession, White recorded a sack-fumble that was recovered by the Lions. The play helped set up a touchdown to seal the win.

➤ Trailing 27-14 with 7:47 left in the fourth quarter on December 18, 2011, the Lions completed the 13-point comeback and became the first team in NFL history to record four 13+-point comebacks in a season. The Lions game-winning drive started at the Raiders' 2-yard line with 2:14 left in the fourth quarter and was completed when QB Matthew Stafford hit WR Calvin Johnson on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 0:39 left to play.

➤ QB Matthew Stafford broke the Lions single-season touchdown record with his 33rd touchdown pass of the season at Oakland (12/18/11). He passed QB Scott Mitchell who threw for 32 in 1995. Stafford completed the 2011 season with 41 touchdown passes.

SUMMARY

The Lions traveled across the Atlantic to London, England for their Week 8 showdown with the Kansas City Chiefs. Lions QB Matthew Stafford and new offensive coordinator Jim Bob Cooter led the Lions to the first points of the game, a 35-yard field goal, to put the Lions up 3-0. SUMMARY

Coming off a bye week, the Lions traveled to Green Bay and ended a 24-year losing streak at Lambeau Field against the Packers, with the last Detroit victory coming in 1991. The first half was a defensive battle, as both offenses were held to just three points. The Lions started off the second half with a bang, as RB Ameer Abdullah took the opening kickoff 104 yards before being chased down at the 1-yard line. After a negative run and a two-yard completion, QB Matthew Stafford found TE Brandon Pettigrew in the end zone to put the Lions up by six. The fourth quarter saw more points than the rest of the game combined, beginning with a K Matt Prater 51-yard field goal to give the Lions a 12-3 lead. The Packers then found the end zone with just under six minutes to go, as QB Aaron Rodgers found TE Richard Rodgers from four yards out to cut the Detroit lead to two. Stafford followed with a crucial nine-play, 80-yard touchdown drive, draining four minutes off the clock as he found WR Lance Moore in the end zone to make the score 18-10 with just under two minutes to play. Rodgers quickly answered the call, manufacturing a 73-yard drive, finding TE Justin Perillo to cut the lead to two, setting up a game-tying two-point conversion attempt. Rodgers' pass was batted down by Lions CB Crezdon Butler on his first play of the afternoon to keep the Lions in the lead. Green Bay then recovered the onside kick, and converted a long third down to set up a potential game-winning 52-yard field goal that came up short, giving the Lions an 18-16 victory.
