The Seahawks conclude their preseason schedule with the now-annual match-up with the Oakland Raiders this Thursday at 7:00 p.m. (PT). It will be the 14th-straight year ending the preseason against the Raiders, with 10 games taking place in Seattle and four in Oakland.

This will be the 18th preseason meeting between the teams with Seattle leading the series, 12-5. Oakland defeated Seattle last year, 30-19, on August 30 in Seattle.

Seattle is 24-15 in the preseason under Pete Carroll and had a franchise-record nine-game winning streak from 2011-13. The Seahawks were 0-4 last year, marking the first time the Seahawks have been winless in a preseason.

## **2018 RECAP**

### **TEAM**

- \* Since 2012, including playoffs, Seattle is 52-0 when leading by four or more points at halftime.
- \* Clinched a postseason berth for the seventh time in Pete Carroll's nine seasons as head coach and became the 28th team since the playoff format was instituted in 1990 that had a losing record after nine games to make the playoffs.
- \* Fourth team in NFL history to have a 1,000-yard rusher and three 300-yard rushers, and first since the 2001 Steelers.
- \* Scored the second-most points in franchise history with 428.
- \* 2,560 rushing yards were the third-most in franchise history, marking the top-three rushing seasons all under Pete Carroll (2012, 2014, 2018).

### PETE CARROLL

- \* Ranks 28th on the NFL's all-time coaches wins list with 132.
- \* Passed Mike Holmgren as the franchise's all-time winningest coach (regular season & postseason) with win over Oakland.

### **CHRIS CARSON**

\* Became Seattle's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2014 (Marshawn Lynch) and just the sixth player in franchise history to accomplish that feat with a career-high 1,151 yards.

### FRANK CLARK & JARRAN REED

- \* Clark set career-high with 13.0 sacks and Reed set career-high with 10.5 sacks.
- \* Combined 23.5 sacks is the most by Seattle teammates since Patrick Kerney and Julian Peterson posted 24.0 in 2007.

### **MICHAEL DICKSON**

\* Set the franchise single-season punt average (48.2) and net average (42.5) records.

- \* Is first Seattle punter to make the Pro Bowl since Rick Tuten in 1994 and is the first rookie punter since the Los Angeles Rams' Dale Hatcher in 1985 to be selected to the all-star game.
- \* First rookie punter to be named first-team AP All-Pro since Oakland's Shane Lechler in 2000.

### **SEBASTIAN JANIKOWSKI**

\* Became the third player since 1970 to kick three game-winning FGs with no time left on the clock in a season.

### TYLER LOCKETT

\* Posted career-highs in receptions (57), yards (965) and touchdowns (10).

### **RUSSELL WILSON**

- \* Named to his sixth Pro Bowl in his seven seasons.
- \* Tied career-low with seven interceptions.
- \* Ranks third on Seattle's all-time passing attempts list with 3,261.
- \* Ranks third on Seattle's all-time passing completions list with 2,095.
- \* Ranks third on Seattle's all-time passing yards list with 25,624.
- \* Ranks first on Seattle's all-time passing touchdowns list with 196
- \* Ranks sixth on the NFL's all-time list for most passing yards in a quarterback's first seven seasons with 25,624.
- \* With the win vs. Kansas City (12/23/18), became the first quarterback in NFL history with a winning record in each of his first seven seasons.

- \* With the win at Carolina (11/25/18), passed Dave Krieg as the franchise's all-time winningest quarterback in the regular season with 71. Currently has 75 victories.
- \* With the win at Arizona (9/30/18), passed Matt Hasselbeck as the franchise's all-time winningest starting quarterback with 75 (regular season & postseason). Currently has 83 career wins.
- \* His 28-7 record following an in-season loss is the best record by a quarterback since the 1970 merger.
- \* Has started 112 consecutive games, the fourth-longest active streak among quarterbacks.
- \* Has started every game played with 125 (112 regular season, 13 postseason).

## **2018 RECAP**

### **27 OR MORE POINTS SCORED**

Seattle ranks sixth in the NFL in scoring with 26.8 points per game but has scored 27 or more points in nine of its last 12 contests (28.6 ppg) and has scored 30 or more points five times last year.

In 2017, the Seahawks scored 27 or more points four times and 30 or more points three times.

Over the last half of the season, the Seahawks ranked third in the league averaging 30.0 points per game.

### **58-13 WHEN WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE**

Since 2010, Seattle is 58-13 when winning the turnover battle. It led the NFL in 2013 with 39 takeaways and a +20 differential, ranked fourth in the league in 2014 at +10 and finished 2015 tied for fifth at +7.

Seattle ranks first in the NFL last season with a +15 turnover differential.

Seattle's commitment to the running game has been apparent since Week 3, with at least 32 rushing attempts in 12 of its last 14 games, with Seattle rushing 28 times at Carolina (11/25) and 29 times vs. San Francisco (12/2), including a season-high 43 attempts vs. Kansas City (12/23).

The Seahawks posted a team-record **seven-consecutive games with at least 150 team rushing yards** from Weeks 4-11.

### **138 CONSECUTIVE SELL OUTS**

Since the Seahawks trip to Super Bowl XL, NFC West crowns from 2004-07, 2010, 2013-14 and 2016, a Super Bowl XLVIII championship and Super Bowl XLIX appearance, Seattle's fans do not want to miss out on seeing their team in action. Since 2003, all but one game has sold out, giving the team 138 consecutive sell outs entering the 2019 season, including playoffs.

Fans set the CenturyLink Field attendance record (69,190) vs. Philadelphia (11/20/16).

For the seventh-consecutive year, Seattle posted at least a 97% season ticket renewal rate while selling all 61,000 available season tickets.

### 80-39-1 RECORD IN LAST 120 GAMES

Seattle has compiled an 80-39-1 record since the final half of the 2011 regular season and in those 39 losses, the average margin of victory for the opponent has been 6.3 points (247 points).

### 28-19-1 ROAD RECORD SINCE 2013

Seattle is 28-19-1 in its last 48 road games dating back to 2013 and posted an 11-6 record in its last 17 10 a.m. (PT) kickoff starts.

The Seahawks posted a franchise-best 6-2 road record in 2013 and 5-3 records in 2014, 2015 and 2017.

### **2,181 ROSTER TRANSACTIONS SINCE 2010**

Since forming their relationship in 2010, General Manager John Schneider and Pete Carroll have put together the NFL's most competitive, deep and talented roster over the last 10 seasons.

Of the 90 players on Seattle's 2019 active roster, 37 are Seattle draft choices, seven have been acquired via trade, waiver claim or practice squad, and the remaining 46 players have been signed as free agents.

### 95-41 HOME RECORD SINCE 2002

One thing that has been a constant from the early days of the Kingdome through the championship years of CenturyLink Field is that the 12s have given that extra edge to the Seahawks when playing in the Puget Sound.

Seattle has the NFC's best home winning percentage since moving to the NFC in 2002 with a 95-41 record, and is one of two teams with 90-plus wins during that span.

In 2012, Wilson threw a game-winning touchdown pass in the final two minutes of regulation or overtime three times (vs. Green Bay, vs. New England, at Chicago), the most ever by a rookie since at least the 1970 merger, and won another (vs. St. Louis) with a 1-yard touchdown run.

His 27 fourth-quarter comebacks rank tied for first in the NFL since the beginning of 2012.
