Raiders 17, Bengals 10

- The Raiders defeated the Bengals by a score of 17-10, improving to 6-4 on the season, with the team’s three-game winning streak marking their longest since 2016.
- The Raiders continue to dominate as the home team throughout the series, improving to 13-2 in both Oakland and Los Angeles.
- The win snaps the Raiders three-game losing streak to Cincinnati dating back to 2009.
- The Silver and Black improve their all-time record against the Bengals to 21-11, including 2-0 in the playoffs.
- Head coach Jon Gruden improves his all-time record against the Bengals to 4-1.

Raiders Themes

- **DE Maxx Crosby** recorded his first career multi-sack game with 4.0 sacks, tied for the second-most sacks in NFL history by a rookie in a single game and the most by a rookie in franchise history.
- **RB Josh Jacobs** surpassed RB Marcus Allen's franchise record for the most 100-yard contests by a rookie (four).
- The **rookie class** tied a franchise record for the most total touchdowns (14) by rookies in a single season, scoring at least one TD for the seventh consecutive game dating back to Week 4 against the Colts.
- Jacobs (seven), Moreau (four) and Renfrow (two) are the only trio of rookie teammates with two-plus TDs this season.
- The **Raiders** lead the NFL with 10 sacks among rookie defenders and are the only team to have at least two rookies with at least three sacks apiece.
- The **Raiders** continue to lead the NFL with 119 points on drives of at least 10 plays and rank first in passing completion percentage (72.3).
- The **Raiders' offense** continues to excel on third down, ranking third in the NFL in third down percentage (47.6).
- The **Raiders' defense** has recorded five-plus sacks in consecutive games for the first time since 2011 (Week 10 vs. Chargers – 6.0 and Week 11 vs. Minnesota – 5.0).
- The **Raiders' defense** has now forced a turnover on their opponents opening drive in three consecutive contests (Weeks 9-11).

Individual Highlights

- **QB Derek Carr**
 - On the Raiders first scoring drive, Carr orchestrated an 11-play, 91-yard scoring drive lasting 7:07, culminating in a 2-yard receiving TD by **TE Foster Moreau**. Carr completed 7-of-7 passes for 101 yards with one TD on the drive.
 - On the Raiders following offensive possession, Carr rushed for a 3-yard TD, capping a 10-play, 80-yard drive lasting 3:39. The rushing TD marked a career-long and is only the second of Carr's career (last: 10/28/18 vs. Colts).
 - Carr finished the first half completing 14-of-15 pass attempts (93.3 percent) for 151 yards with one TD, including a career-high 14 consecutive completions to open the game.
 - Carr orchestrated a 10-play, 65-yard drive lasting 4:20, which was capped by a 20-yard FG attempt by **K Daniel Carlson** to give the Raiders a 17-10 lead with 9:15 remaining in the contest.
 - Recorded a passer rating of at least 100.0 (105.7) for the 30th time in his career and for the sixth time in his last eight contests. Carr has surpassed a 95.0 passer rating in eight consecutive contests.
 - Has completed 53-of-79 attempts (67.1 percent) for 616 yards for two TDs against one INT for a passer rating of 93.6 in three career contests against the Bengals.
 - Carr continues to rank first in the NFL with 11 passing TDs on third down.
 - Carr currently ranks second in the NFL in completion percentage (72.3 percent.).
 - Carr currently ranks sixth in the NFL with a passer rating of 105.2.
 - Carr currently ranks seventh in the NFL with an average of 8.0 pass yards per attempt.
 - Since Week 7, Carr ranks second in pass yards per attempt (9.2 avg.), sixth in passer rating (114.4) and is tied for sixth in passing TDs (nine).
 - Carr ended the day completing 25-of-29 attempts for 292 yards with one TD for a passer rating of 105.7.

- **DE Maxx Crosby**
 - Crosby recorded his first career multi-sack game with 4.0 sacks, tied for the second-most sacks in NFL history by a rookie in a single game and the most by a rookie in a single game this season.
 - Crosby surpassed Greg Townsend's franchise rookie record of 3.0 sacks in a single contest (11/27/83 vs NYG).
 - Crosby is one of six players in the NFL with at least three sacks (6.5), three forced fumbles (three) and three passes defensed (three) in 2019.
 - Crosby ranks first in franchise history with 6.5 sacks through a player's first 10 career games.
 - Crosby ranks fourth among all rookies in franchise history with 6.5 sacks on the year.
 - Crosby is just the 37th player in NFL history with at least 6.5 sacks through his first 10 career games.
 - Crosby finished the contest with five tackles (four), a career-high four sacks and one forced fumble.

- **RB Josh Jacobs**
 - Jacobs led all rushers in the first half with 73 yards on 12 carries (6.1 avg.), including a 21-yard long.
 - Jacobs recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game, surpassing Marcus Allen's franchise record for the most 100-yard contests by a rookie (four).
 - Jacobs became the 12th player in NFL history with at least 900 yards (923) through a player's first 10 career games.
 - Jacobs has recorded 100-plus scrimmage yards (124) in three consecutive games, including five of his past six contests.
 - Jacobs currently ranks fourth in the NFL in rushing yards (923).
 - Jacobs currently ranks tied for sixth in rushing touchdowns (seven).
 - Jacobs currently ranks fourth in the NFL in average rushing yards per game (92.3 avg.)
 - Jacobs continues to lead all rookie rushers in carries (191), rushing yards (923) and rushing touchdowns (seven).
 - Jacobs finished with 112 yards on 23 carries (4.9 avg.), adding three receptions for 12 yards.

- **TE Foster Moreau**
 - Moreau capped an 11-play, 91-yard drive lasting 7:07 with a two-yard TD reception to tie the game 7-7.
 - Continues to lead all rookie tight ends in the NFL with four receiving TDs.
 - Moreau finished with two receptions for eight yards and one TD.

- **TE Darren Waller**
 - Waller currently ranks first amongst all tight ends in the NFL in yards after catch (337).
 - Waller currently ranks tied for first amongst all tight ends with 56 receptions.
 - Waller currently ranks second amongst all tight ends in the NFL in receiving yards (666).
 - Waller currently ranks fifth amongst all tight ends in receiving first downs (30).
 - Finished with 78 yards on five receptions (15.6 avg.), including a 32-yard long.

- **WR Tyrell Williams**
 - Williams led all receivers in the first half with three receptions for 65 yards (21.7 avg.).
 - Williams finished with a game-high 82 receiving yards on four receptions (20.5 avg.).

Additional Notes

- **DE Dion Jordan** recorded one sack in his Raiders debut.
- **CB Trayvon Mullen** recorded his first career INT and finished second on the team with five tackles.
- **S D.J. Swearinger** led the team with seven tackles (five) in his Raiders debut.
- The **Raiders tight ends** rank second in the NFL in receptions (79), receiving yards (885) and touchdowns (seven) amongst their position group.
