Raiders 10, Redskins 27

- The Raiders fell to the Redskins by a score of 27-10 in first-of-five primetime appearances this season. The loss gives the team a 18-19 record on Sunday Night Football.
- The defeat pushes the overall series against the Redskins to 7-6, with the Raiders holding the advantage.
- Now at 2-1, the Raiders are tied for second in the division with the Denver Broncos, and will travel to Denver next week to face their division rival.
- Tonight marked the first-of-four games against the NFC East, with their next matchup coming against the division on Dec. 3 at home against the New York Giants.

Game Highlights

- **DE Khalil Mack** recorded a sack for the second consecutive game, pushing him into ninth on the club's all-time sack list with 32 in his career.
- **TE Jared Cook** registered his first receiving touchdown with the Raiders.
- LB/DE James Cowser recovered a career-high two fumbles recoveries in the game.

Offense

• QB Derek Carr

- With 4:00 remaining in the third frame, Carr found TE Jared Cook on second-and-13 from the Washington 21-yard line for their first touchdown connection as teammates. The drive lasted two plays and totaled 18 yards in :47 seconds, following a LB/DE James Cowser fumble recovery on a muffed punt.
- Carr finished throwing for 118 yards 19-of-31 passing with one touchdown.

• TE Jared Cook

- Cook hauled in his first receiving touchdown in the Silver and Black uniform when he and **QB Derek Carr** connected from 21 yards out. The score was the first of the ball game for the Raiders.
- Cook recorded four receptions for 43 yards (10.8 avg.) with 21-yard long and one touchdown.

Defense

LB/DE James Cowser

- Following P Marquette King's sixth punt of the night, WR Jamison Crowder muffed the catch at the Washington 9-yard line, where Cowser recovered the ball on the 18-yard line. Two plays later, the Raiders scored their first touchdown of the night from 21 yards out.
- Cowser recorded another takeaway in the fourth quarter, following a **LB Cory James** forced fumble on the Washington 11-yard line (recovered at the 12).
- Cowser finished the night with three tackles (two solo) on defense in addition to his two recoveries.

• LB Cory James

- James recorded his second career forced fumble that was recovered by the defense, the team's second takeaway of the night.
- James finished as the leading tackler on the evening with 12 stops (six solo), adding one forced fumble.

• DE Khalil Mack

- With 12:44 left in the second quarter and on third down, Mack recorded his second sack of the season, good for a 9-yard loss. The sack by Mack marks consecutive games getting to the quarterback.
- Mack finished the night with nine tackles (five solo) and one sack for nine yards.

Special Teams

- P Marquette King
 - King entered Week 3 leading league in punting average (54.0 avg.), and began his night with four boots of 50-plus yards in the first half, flipping the field position for the Raiders' defense.
 - King punted a total of seven times in tonight's game, pinning four inside the 20-yard line and averaging 52.7 yards per kick.
 - King has averaged over 50 yards per kick in each week thus far in 2017.

• K Giorgio Tavecchio

- Following a **LB/DE James Cowser** fumble recovery, Tavecchio added his first field goal of the night from 22 yards out. His field goal brought the score to 24-10, Redskins.
- Tavecchio finished perfect on the evening, knocking in his lone field goal and PAT.
- Tavecchio is six-of-six kicking field goals on the season and nine-of-nine on PATs.

Other Notables

- WR Michael Crabtree extended his streak of at least one reception in a game to 114, before exiting in the fourth quarter with a chest injury.
- **T Donald Penn** started in his 159th consecutive regular season game, tied for the second-most starts among active offensive lineman.
