#### Raiders 14, Rams 3

- The Raiders defeated the Los Angeles Rams in their first tilt of the 2019 preseason by a score of 14-3, bringing their record to 1-0.
- The Raiders improve their record to 13-9 against the Rams in preseason action, and now hold a 133-134-1 record all-time in the preseason.

#### **Game Themes**

- The Raiders defense held the Rams to 190 total yards in the game and 3-of-14 (21 percent) on third downs.
- Oakland held the Rams to just three points, marking the lowest points allowed by the Raiders in a preseason contest since defeating the Rams 18-3 on Aug. 14, 2015.
- The Raiders defense was stout against the run game, holding the Rams to a total of 57 rushing yards.
- The Raiders offense recorded 227 net yards in the first half, as QB Mike Glennon completed 8-of-11 passes for 93 yards in the first quarter alone. Glennon connected with ten different receivers in the half.
- Two different Raiders scored as the Raiders' offense finished with 67% red zone efficiency (2-for-3).

# **Raiders Debuts**

# • WR J.J. Nelson

- On first-and-10 from the 50-yard line on the Raiders' first offensive series of the game, Nelson hauled in a 38-yard pass for the first down to set up the Raiders' first scoring drive of the preseason.
- Nelson finished second on the team with 43 yards on two receptions (21.5 avg.).

# • QB Mike Glennon

- Glennon led the unit into the red zone on the team's first offensive series of the 2019 preseason with a 38-yard pass to WR J.J Nelson, later resulting in a seven-yard rushing touchdown by RB DeAndre Washington. Glennon's pass to Nelson marked the longest passing play from scrimmage of the game.
- Spreading the offense around, Glennon connected with 10 different receivers in the first half with WR Ryan Grant leading the group with three receptions.
- Glennon completed 17-of-25 passes for 195 yards in his Raiders debut, exiting the game after the first half of play.

#### • QB Nathan Peterman

- Peterman led the unit into the red zone on his first series of the night with a 50-yard rush, resulting in a 3-yard touchdown pass to WR Keelan Doss two plays later. Peterman's run marked the longest play from scrimmage of the game.
- Peterman's 50-yard run marked the second-longest rush by a Raiders player in the preseason since 2000 (George Atkinson, 53-yard rush, 2016).
- Peterman finished the night 9-of-12 passing for 66 yards with one touchdown for a passer rating of 115.3.
- WR Ryan Grant
  - On the Raiders' second offensive series of the night Grant hauled in his first pass as a Raider, a 4yard reception from QB Mike Glennon.
  - Grant finished the game with 32 yards on three receptions (10.7 avg.), including an 18-yard long.

#### **NFL Debuts**

#### FB Alec Ingold

• Ingold earned the start and finished with four receptions for 22 yards.

#### WR De'Mornay Pierson-El

- o Pierson-El handled all the Raiders' kickoff/punt return duties in his debut, totaling 26 yards on seven punt returns (3.7 avg.).
- TE Foster Moreau
  - On the Raiders' second offensive series of the game Moreau recorded the first reception of his career, an 8-yard reception from QB Mike Glennon.
- WR Keelan Doss
  - With 10:40 left in the third quarter, Doss recorded his first touchdown of his career on a 3-yard reception from QB Nathan Peterman. The touchdown was the culmination of an 8-play, 75-yard drive lasting 4:23.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Doss finished with two receptions for nine yards.

# Individual Highlights

- DE Arden Key
  - Key recorded the Raiders' first sack of the preseason, as he took down QB Brandon Allen for a loss of five yards to force the Rams to settle for a field goal with 2:00 remaining in the first half.

# • RB DeAndré Washington

• Washington exploded in the first quarter when he tallied 24 yards on six carries, including a 6yard touchdown run, while adding two receptions for 21 yards with a 13-yard long.

#### • RB James Butler

• Led all running backs with 11 carries for 29 yards, while adding four receptions for 25 yards.

# • WR Keon Hatcher

• Hatcher finished the game as the team's leader with 45 yards on two receptions (22.5 avg.), including a 27-yard long.

#### • WR Marcell Ateman

• On his first target of the night, Ateman hauled in a 19-yard pass from QB Mike Glennon in the second quarter.

#### • LB Marquel Lee

• Lee led the team in tackles, finishing with five stops (three solo).
