Raiders 33, Cardinals 26

- The Raiders defeated the Arizona Cardinals in their second preseason contest of 2019 by a score of 33-26, bringing their record to 2-0.
- The Raiders improve their record to 9-8 against the Cardinals in preseason action, and now hold a 134-134-1 record all-time in the preseason.

Game Themes

- The Raiders had another strong performance on defense, totaling three sacks in the contest and holding the Cardinals to 2-of-12 (17 percent) on third downs.
- The Raiders' offense finished with a 75% red zone efficiency (3-for-4), while 14 different receivers caught a pass and four different players recorded a touchdown.
- **QB Mike Glennon** finished the contest with a perfect 158.3 passer rating after completing 11-of-14 passes for 175 yards with two touchdowns.
- Oakland's quarterbacks combined for 21-of-24 passing for 256 yards with three touchdowns for a passer rating of 150.7.

Raiders Debuts

• S Lamarcus Joyner

• Earning his first start of the preseason, Joyner recorded the team's first safety when he took down QB Kyler Murray in the end zone for a loss of nine yards.

• WR Tyrell Williams

 Williams recorded his first catch as a Raider, a 27-yard reception from QB Derek Carr on the Raiders' first offensive series of the game. Williams' catch set up a 13-yard touchdown by WR Ryan Grant two plays later.

• TE Luke Willson

• On the team's first offensive play of the third quarter Willson hauled in his first pass as a Raider, a 4-yard reception from QB Nathan Peterman.

LB Vontaze Burfict

• Burfict earned the start and finished with two tackles in his Raiders preseason debut.

NFL Debuts

- RB Josh Jacobs
 - Jacobs earned the start and finished with four carries for 21 yards (5.3 avg.), exiting the game after the Raiders' first offensive series.

Individual Highlights

- RB Mack Brown
 - Brown capped off a 15-play, 80-yard drive lasting 8:41, to mark the longest scoring drive of the night, with a 3-yard run. The touchdown marked the first for Brown as member of the Silver and Black.
- QB Derek Carr
 - Carr led the offense down the field on the opening drive of the game, orchestrating a six play, 75-yard drive lasting 3:09, which culminated in a 13-yard touchdown pass to WR Ryan Grant.
 - Carr finished the night 2-of-2 passing for 40 yards with one touchdown for a passer rating of 158.3.

• TE Derek Carrier

 Carrier hauled in his first pass of the preseason, a 2-yard touchdown reception from QB Mike Glennon, which culminated a 12 play, 65-yard drive lasting 7:05 to give the Raiders a 24-0 lead in the second quarter.

WR Keelan Doss

• Doss led the team with five receptions 38 yards (7.6 avg.), including a 20-yard long.

• WR Rico Gafford

- With :43 left in the first quarter, Gafford recorded his first touchdown of his career on a 53-yard reception from QB Mike Glennon.
- The 53-yard touchdown reception marks the Raiders' longest play from scrimmage of the preseason and ranks as the longest reception by a Raider in the preseason since 2000.

QB Mike Glennon

- Glennon connected on a deep pass late in the first quarter, a 53-yard touchdown reception to WR Rico Gafford. Glennon's pass marked the longest by a Raider in preseason play since 2012.
- Glennon finished the night completing 11-of-14 passes for 175 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 158.3.

WR Ryan Grant

 Grant recorded his first touchdown as a Raider on a 13-yard reception from QB Derek Carr. The touchdown was the culmination of a 6-play, 75-yard drive lasting 3:09 to give the Raiders a 7-0 lead on their opening drive.

LB Brandon Marshall

• Earned the start and recorded his first sack as a member of the Raiders, finishing with two tackles.

• CB Keisean Nixon

• Nixon led the team in tackles, finishing with five stops (five solo).

• QB Nathan Peterman

- Peterman finished the night completing 8-of-8 passes for 41 yards for a passer rating of 88.0.
- Peterman led the unit on 15-play, 80-yard scoring drive in the fourth quarter, which was culminated by a 3-yard rushing touchdown by RB Mack Brown.

• WR Hunter Renfrow

• Renfrow ended the night with two receptions for 26 yards, including a 19-yard long.

• RB DeAndré Washington

- On his first target of the night, Washington hauled in a 35-yard pass from QB Mike Glennon in the first quarter, marking the Raiders' third-longest passing play of the preseason.
- Washington ended his night adding eight carries for 17 yards, in addition to his one reception for 35 yards.

• DT Ethan Westbrooks

• Recorded his first sack of the preseason when he took down QB Chad Kanoff for a loss of six yards.

Additional Notes

- **K Daniel Carlson** converted on a 25-yard field goal attempt and was perfect on four PATs, scoring seven points.
- **P AJ Cole** punted five times for 247 yards (49.4 avg.) with a long of 54 yards. Cole placed three punts inside the 20-yard line, limiting the Cardinals to 10 punt return yards.
