2015 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF SUPER BOWL XL

The Pittsburgh Steelers will celebrate the 10th anniversary of its Super Bowl XL victory during Week 10 of the 2015 season.

On Saturday, Nov. 14, the Alumni Weekend Dinner at Heinz Field will highlight the Super Bowl XL team. The annual event benefits the UPMC Sports Medicine Concussion Program and Cancer Caring Center.

At halftime of the Steelers' game the following day against the Cleveland Browns at Heinz Field, members of the Super Bowl XL championship team will be introduced on the stadium field and recognized for their achievement in capturing the team's fifth of six Lombardi trophies.



SUPER BOWL 50 CELEBRATION

The 2015 season marks a year-long celebration of the Super Bowl to commemorate Super Bowl 50, which will be played on Sunday, February 7, 2016 at Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara, Calif.

The "On the Fifty" platform is designed to link the past 49 Super Bowls with this year's game and honor the teams, players, coaches, fans and communities that have been a part of those games.

The 2015 NFL regular-season schedule features 19 Super Bowl rematches - three of which features the Steelers.

The Steelers' first Super Bowl rematch of the 2015 season came in Week 3, when the team faced the Rams in St. Louis - a rematch of Super Bowl XIV in which Pittsburgh defeated the then Los Angeles Rams, 31-19, at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.



In Week 6, Pittsburgh hosted the Arizona Cardinals at Heinz Field, pitting the two Super Bowl XLIII participants against one another. At Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla., the Steelers were victorious over the Cardinals, 27-23.

The team's third Super Bowl rematch of 2015 will take place in Week 12 when the Steelers face the Seattle Seahawks in a road game. The two teams faced off in Super Bowl XL in Detroit, Mich., resulting in a 21-10 win for Pittsburgh.



Pittsburgh also faced the Minnesota Vikings in the 2015 NFL/Hall of Fame Game - the two contestants played in Super Bowl IX.

BETTIS TO HALL OF FAME

Former Pittsburgh Steelers RB **Jerome Bettis** was honored for his illustrious career as one of the NFL's most prolific running backs as he was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2015, and was enshrined on Saturday, August 8, at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium.

He was honored during the team's Thursday Night Football game in Week 4 against Baltimore during a special ring ceremony.

Bettis played in 192 regular-season games in his 13-year career, spending his first three years with the Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams and the final 10 with the Steelers. The Detroit native registered the sixth-most rushing yards (13,662) in NFL history. Bettis eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in 61 games during the regular season and three times in the postseason, compiling a 47-17 record in those contests.

He recorded 78 rushing touchdowns as a member of the Steelers during the regular season, the second-most in franchise history behind Hall of Famer Franco Harris (91). In all, Bettis led his team in rushing 11 seasons, three with the Rams and eight with the Steelers. His eight 1,000-plus yard seasons tied for third-best in the NFL when he retired.

Bettis was named to six Pro Bowls, voted first team All-Pro twice, second team All-Pro once and was the NFL's Comeback Player of the Year in 1996. In 10 years in Pittsburgh, Bettis helped the Steelers reach four AFC Championship games and win Super Bowl XL in 2005, finishing his career with a victory over the Seattle Seahawks. Before he came to Pittsburgh in 1996 and recorded 1,431 rushing yards in his first season, the Steelers had only one 1,000+ yard rusher in the previous 12 seasons.



FROM LAST WEEK'S GAME VS. CINCINNATI

THE STEELERS

- Pittsburgh is now 4-4 overall and 2-2 at home in 2015.
- The Steelers are now 55-35 against the Bengals in regular-season history, including 30-16 at home.
- The Steelers are now 17-10 against the Bengals in the month of November (6-4 at home in November).
- The Steelers are 427-275-2 during the regular season since 1970.
- The team's opening drive, 12 plays, 80 yards, resulting in a touchdown marked the offense's first opening drive resulting in a touchdown in 16 games, including playoffs.
- Held the Bengals offense to a 27% third-down conversion mark (4-of-15) and 16 points.

HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN

- Is now 86-50 during the regular season, including 49-19 at home.
- Is now 12-5 against Cincinnati in the regular season (6-3 at home).
- Is now 33-17 against AFC North opponents during the regular season, including 19-6 at Heinz Field.

QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER

- Returned to the field for the first time since Week 3 and completed 28-of-45 passes for 262 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions.
- Is now 108-54 as a starter during the regular season and to 61-21 at home.
- Is now 16-7 against Cincinnati in the regular season as a starter, 7-5 at home.
- Became the 16th quarterback in NFL history and first Steeler to reach 40,000 passing yards, ninth with one team.
- Became the fifth active quarterback to reach 40,000 passing yards, joining Peyton Manning, Drew Brees, Tom Brady and Eli Manning.
- Reached 40,000 career passing yards in his 163rd career game, surpassing Warren Moon for the fifth-fewest games to reach the milestone.
- With his touchdown pass, extended his consecutive home games played with at least one scoring toss to 34 – dating back to Dec. 19, 2010 – the second-longest active streak in the NFL (Drew Brees: 50) – and tying as the fifth-longest NFL history.
- Broke a tie with Sonny Jurgensen (255) for sole possession of the 15th-most touchdown passes in NFL history, now with 266.
- Increased his career totals to 455 and 5,313 passing yards and 30 touchdown passes in his career vs. Cincinnati. His 455 completions and 5,313 passing yards are tops among quarterbacks all-time vs. Cincinnati.
- Joined Warren Moon (37) as the second quarterback in NFL history to post 30 touchdown passes in a career vs. Cincinnati.

FB WILL JOHNSON

- Extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 39 – the third-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL fullbacks.

WR ANTONIO BROWN

- Caught six passes for 47 yards and a touchdown. Now has three touchdown catches in 2015 and 31 in his NFL career.
- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 28 – the third-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL wide receivers.
- Has registered at least one reception in 80 consecutive games in which he has played, including the postseason – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Has registered at least one reception in 76 consecutive regular-season games – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Has caught a touchdown pass in consecutive regular season games vs. Cincinnati (12/28/14).
- Has recorded 50 receptions in 2015 and reached the 50-catch plateau for the fifth consecutive season.
- Joined Hines Ward (10) as only the second player in Steelers history to post 50 receptions or more in five consecutive seasons.

RB Le'VEON BELL

- Has started each of his 35 career games played, and rushed for 45 yards on 10 carries and added two catches for 13 yards before leaving the game in the second quarter due to injury.
- Surpassed Franco Harris (2,759) for the third-most rushing yards by a Steelers running back in his first three seasons with the team, now with 2,777.
- Broke a tie with Fran Rogel (150) for sole possession of the fifth-most receptions by a running back in team history, now with 152.

RB DeANGELO WILLIAMS

- Led all players with 110 yards from scrimmage 71 rushing yards on nine carries (7.9 average) and 39 receiving yards on four catches.
- Recorded a season-long 55-yard rush in the third quarter, the longest of his career since Dec. 30, 2012 (65 yards).

TE HEATH MILLER

- Led the Steelers in receptions (10) and receiving yards (105).
- Tied a single-game career-high with 10 catches (Sept. 28, 2014 vs. Tampa Bay) and recorded his fourth career 100-yard game.
- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 38 – the third-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL tight ends.
- Joined Hines Ward (1,000) as only the second player in franchise history to record 550 receptions as a Steeler.
- With his first catch, became the sixth tight end in NFL history with 550 receptions.
- Joined Ozzie Newsome (92) and Todd Heap (71) as the third tight end in NFL history to tally at least 60 receptions in a career vs. Cincinnati, now with 68.
- Surpassed Eric Green (636) for the third-most receiving yards among NFL tight ends in a career vs. Cincinnati, now with 655.
- Eclipsed 50 receiving yards for the 52nd time in his regular season (third-most such games among active NFL tight ends).

K CHRIS BOSWELL

- Converted his only field goal attempt of the game, 32 yards, to remain perfect on the season, improving to 8-of-8 on field goal tries.

FROM LAST WEEK'S GAME VS. CINCINNATI

DE CAMERON HEYWARD

- Extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 72 – tying as the fifth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL defensive ends.
- Blocked a Cincinnati field goal attempt in the third quarter, the second block of his career, and the first by a Steeler since his block against the Bengals on Dec. 4, 2011.

DE CAM THOMAS

- Extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 72 – tying as the fifth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL defensive ends.

DT STEVE McLENDON

- Tallied his first sack of the season and fifth of his career, bringing down Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton.

S MIKE MITCHELL

- Recorded his second interception of the season, eighth of his NFL career, off of Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton.
- Finished the game with five tackles (three solo) and two passes defended.

CB WILLIAM GAY

- Extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 136 – the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL cornerbacks.

CB ANTWON BLAKE

- Tied for the team-lead of eight tackles (eight solo) to go along with an interception.
- Picked off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the end zone in the fourth quarter and returned the ball 42 yards.
- Has set a single-season career-high with two interceptions in 2015.

LB LAWRENCE TIMMONS

- Extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games started to 77 – the longest active streak among current Steelers – and the third-longest active streak among NFL linebackers.
- Extended his consecutive regular season games played streak to 96 – the fourth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL linebackers.
- Recovered a blocked Cincinnati field goal that was altered by DE Cameron Heyward in the third quarter.

LB JARVIS JONES

- Split a sack with LB Ryan Shazier, bringing down Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton on a third-down play. Increased his season total to 1.5 and career to 4.5.

LB RYAN SHAZIER

- Tied for the team-lead with eight tackles (six solo), along with two tackles for a loss and a half-sack.
- Split a sack with LB Jarvis Jones, bringing down Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton on a third-down play. Increased his season and career total to 2.0 sacks.

LB BUD DUPREE

- Recorded his team-leading fourth sack of the season in the first quarter, bringing down Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton for a loss of zero yards.
- Tied LaMarr Woodley (4.0) for the third-most sacks by a Steelers rookie since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

OAKLAND – The Steelers could not erase an 18-point first-half deficit and lost to the Oakland Raiders, 21-18, at the O.co Coliseum.

On the Raiders first play of the game, QB Terrelle Pryor faked a handoff to RB Darren McFadden, and then ran 93 yards for a touchdown to give Oakland an early 7-0 lead. P Zoltan Mesko's attempt was blocked midway through the first quarter, which set Oakland up at the Steelers' 26-yard line. Five plays later, McFadden scored on a seven-yard run to give the Raiders a 14-0 lead.

Late in the first quarter, S Troy Polamalu picked off Pryor and returned it to the Raiders' 48-yard line. K Shaun Suisham capped off the ensuing drive with a 47-yard field goal to cut the lead, 14-3. The Raiders scored their final points of the game after the two-minute warning when McFadden scored on a four-yard run to give the Raiders a 21-3 lead at halftime.

Neither team scored in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, DE Brett Keisel recovered an Oakland fumble that was forced by **LB Lawrence Timmons**, and three plays later **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found WR Emmanuel Sanders for a nine-yard touchdown to cut the lead, 21-10.

With 1:27 left in the game, **RB Le'Veon Bell** scored on a two-yard run, and Sanders scored on a two-point conversion to cut the lead, 21-18. The Steelers attempted an onside kick but it was recovered by the Raiders.

Despite the loss, the Steelers defense forced a season-high three turnovers and held their opponents to a season-low 82 net passing yards.

THE TOMLIN FILE

Mike Tomlin was named the 16th head coach in Pittsburgh Steelers history on Jan. 22, 2007. Hired at the age of 34, Tomlin became only the third head coach hired by the Steelers since 1969. Tomlin became the youngest head coach in NFL history to both coach in and win a Super Bowl when he led the Steelers to a 27-23 victory over the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. By winning the Super Bowl in only his second season as a head coach, he also became the fastest to win a Super Bowl title in Steelers' history.

Through eight seasons, Tomlin has accomplished many things that have never been done in the team's storied history. His 82-46 record (.641) is best start in franchise history. He has guided the Steelers' defense to the NFL's top ranking in total defense four times, including most recently in 2012. He has also sent a total of 45 selections to the league's annual Pro Bowl, including five following the 2014 season. Tomlin has reached the playoffs five times in his first eight seasons, including two trips to the Super Bowl (winning Super Bowl XLIII).

Tomlin is one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach. Tomlin is the only head coach in Steelers history to lead the team to two Super Bowls in his first four seasons at the helm, including an appearance against the Green Bay Packers in Super Bowl XLV. He is one of only two Steelers' head coaches to win three division titles in his first four seasons. Tomlin was appointed by Commissioner Roger Goodell to the NFL's Competition Committee in March, 2013.

In 2014, Tomlin, who has a defensive coaching background, orchestrated one of the top offensive outputs in team history. The Steelers broke numerous offensive records, including points scored (436), total yards (6,577), passing yards/game (301.6) and total first downs (379).

On an individual basis in 2014, Tomlin guided QB Ben Roethlisberger, WR Antonio Brown and RB Le'Veon Bell – whom all made the Pro Bowl – to record-setting years. Roethlisberger had personal bests in passing yards (4,952), completions (408) and passing TDs (32, T-2007), while Brown established team records for receptions (129), receiving yards (1,698) and receiving TDs (13). Bell, in his first full year as a starter, who was also named Team MVP, broke the Steelers' records for scrimmage yards (2,215) as well as receptions (83) and receiving yards (854) by a running back.

Over the past two seasons, Tomlin has led the team to a 7-1 record in the month of December, winning each of the last four in 2014 to capture the AFC North title.

Arguably one of his best coaching performances may possibly have come in the second half of the 2013 season. Despite an 0-4 and 2-6 start to the season, the Steelers finished the regular season surging to a 6-2 second-half record, falling just short of the playoffs. However, he rallied the team despite numerous injuries on both sides of the ball, to stick together and finished second in the AFC North. The 2013 campaign also saw QB Ben Roethlisberger, WR and team WR Antonio Brown and RB Le'Veon Bell break numerous regular-season records for the Steelers. Brown and S Troy Polamalu were each selected to the Pro Bowl following the season.

Tomlin led the Steelers to a 27-10 victory over the New York Jets in the 2012 home opener, becoming the first coach in team history to win his first six home openers. The Steelers finished the season with the top-ranked overall defense (275.8 ypg) and finished first in passing defense (185.2 ypg).

In 2011, Tomlin led the Steelers to a 12-4 record, marking the second straight season the team posted 12 wins, which marked only the second time in team history it has been achieved.

The Steelers finished second in total defense under Tomlin in 2010, allowing only 276.8 yards per game. Pittsburgh led the NFL and set a team record in rushing defense, yielding only 62.8 yards per game (1,004 yards), the third-best total in NFL history dating back to 1970. The Steelers also established an NFL record in 2010 by not allowing an opponent to rush for more than 75 yards in any of their first eight games during the regular season.

THE TOMLIN FILE CONT'D

In all, the Steelers defense led the NFL in 2010 in rushing yards allowed, points allowed (232), touchdowns (22), quarterback sacks (48), rushing average (3.0), yards per play (4.5) and yards allowed on first down (4.08).

Tomlin was a three-year starter at wide receiver at William and Mary (1990-94) and finished his career with 101 receptions for 2,054 yards and 20 TD catches. A first-team All-Yankee Conference selection in 1994, he established a school record with a 20.2 yards-per-catch average.

GOOD FIRST EIGHT

Mike Tomlin has accomplished a lot in his first eight seasons as head coach of the Steelers. Tomlin's 82 wins after his first eight seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach after his first eight seasons. His two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first eight seasons. Tomlin's five postseason berths and four division titles are tied for second for the most in a coach's first eight seasons.

OUR HOUSE

Mike Tomlin has led the Steelers to a 49-19 career regular-season record at Heinz Field. In 2012, he won his first four home games for the fourth time in his career (2007, '09 and '11). He guided the Steelers to a 6-2 mark in the team's eight home games in 2014 and a victory in two of the team's four 2015 home games (Week 2 vs. San Francisco and Week 5 vs. Arizona).

Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first eight seasons as the team's head coach.

Tomlin has won at least four games against division opponents in five of his eight seasons. He owns an impressive 19-6 record against divisional foes at Heinz Field.

PRIMETIME SPECIALIST

Pittsburgh has played 23 games in primetime since the 2011 season, and have appeared in three of their five scheduled primetime contests in 2015: Thurs., Sept. 10 at New England (L, 28-21), Thurs., Oct. 1 vs. Baltimore (L, 23-20 OT), Mon., Oct. 12 at San Diego (W, 24-20), Sun., Dec. 6 vs. Indianapolis and Sun., Dec. 27 at Baltimore.

In 2014, the Steelers won five of their six primetime games.

Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** is 27-16 overall in primetime games, including a 13-9 record on the road. He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 12-8 on Sunday Night Football and 5-6 on Thursday Night Football.

TE Heath Miller has been a consistent performer for the Steelers since joining the team as a first-round draft selection in 2005.

The 11-year veteran tallied eight catches for 84 yards in the team's 2015 Kickoff Weekend game at New England - moving into second on the team's all-time receptions chart with his sixth grab. BRYANT'S '15 CAMPAIGN

Second-year **WR Martavis Bryant** had an electric game in his 2015 debut in Week 6 vs. Arizona, leading the team with 6 receptions for 137 receiving yards and 2 touchdowns. His 137 receiving yards were the second-most in a single-game in his career (143, Nov. 9, 2014 at N.Y. Jets) and his two touchdown catches marked his third career multi-touchdown game in the regular season. His second scoring play of the game came on a 88-yard catch-and-run in the fourth quarter, which tied as the eighth-longest pass play in team history.

Bryant added three catches for 45 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown catch in Week 7 at Kansas City.

Bryant totaled 11 touchdown catches in his first 12 career games. Only five other players (Billy Howton: 1952, Harlon Hill: 1954, Bill Groman: 1960, Randy Moss: 1998 and Odell Beckham: 2014) had at least 11 touchdown catches in a player's first 12 NFL games.

With 11 touchdown catches, Bryant is the 10th player in Steelers history to have 10 or more touchdown catches in his first two seasons with the team.

WILLIAMS IN BLACK AND GOLD

RB DeAngelo Williams made his Pittsburgh Steelers debut rumbling out of the backfield for 127 rushing yards on 21 carries (6.0 average) and added a reception for five yards at New England on Thursday night in Week 1.

He continued his feature back role in Week 2's home opener against San Francisco and tied a franchise single-game record with three rushing touchdowns - his 12th career multi-touchdown game - and finished with 92 yards from scrimmage (75 rushing and 15 receiving).

Williams led all AFC rushers with 204 yards (second in the NFL) and led the NFL with three rushing touchdowns in Weeks 1-2 of the 2015 season.

In Week 8 vs. Cincinnati, Williams led all players with 110 yards from scrimmage 71 rushing yards on nine carries (7.9 average) and 39 receiving yards on four catches. He recorded a season-long 55-yard rush in the third quarter, the longest of his career since Dec. 30, 2012 (65 yards).

Williams, who joined Pittsburgh as a free agent on March 13, left the Carolina Panthers as the team's all-time leader in rushing attempts (1,432), rushing yards (6,846), rushing touchdowns (46) and 100-yard rushing games (18), was originally drafted by the Panthers in the first round (27th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft.

JONES' DEBUT FOR THE AGES

QB Landry Jones led the Steelers to a 25-13 come-from-behind victory in Week 6 vs. Arizona after entering the game and seeing regular-season action for the first time in his career.

Jones completed 8-of-12 passes for 168 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 149.3. He connected with **WR Martavis Bryant** for both touchdowns, one coming from eight yards and the other from 88 yards. The 88-yard touchdown is tied for the eighth-longest pass play in team history.

Jones' 149.3 passer rating is the second-highest for an NFL quarterback in their first career game (min. 10 attempts) behind only Tennessee's Marcus Mariota's 158.3 in 2015.

Jones made his first career NFL start in Week 7 at Kansas City, and completed 16-of-29 passing for 209 yards with a touchdown.

VICK LEADS TEAM TO COMEBACK

QB Mike Vick led Pittsburgh to a fourth-quarter comeback and game-winning drive on Monday Night Football in Week 5 at San Diego in the team's 24-20 win over the Chargers. He connected with **WR Markus Wheaton** for a 72-yard touchdown and finished the game with 203 passing yards on 13-of-26 passing with a touchdown and interception for a passer rating of 73.1.

The come-from-behind win marked Vick's 14th fourth-quarter comeback and 15th game-winning drive of his NFL career and first since Sept. 30, 2012 while with Philadelphia.

Vick made his first start with the Steelers in Week 4 vs. Baltimore due to an injury to **QB Ben Roethlisberger**. In his Pittsburgh starting debut, he completed 19-of-26 passes for 124 yards and a touchdown for a passer rating of 95.7.

Vick joined the Steelers as a free agent on August 25 and is in his 15th NFL season after being selected with the first overall selection by the Atlanta Falcons in the 2001 NFL Draft and remained with the Falcons through 2006. He was signed by the Philadelphia Eagles in 2009 and spent five years with the Eagles before joining the New York Jets in 2014.

In his NFL career, Vick has appeared in 143 games (114 starts) and completed 1,807-of-3,217 passes for 22,464 yards with 133 touchdowns and added 6,109 rushing yards - the most rushing yards by an NFL quarterback in league history - and 36 rushing touchdowns on 873 rushing attempts. Vick, a four-time Pro Bowl selection, also earned NFL Comeback Player of the Year accolades in 2010.

WHEATON IN THE MIX

WR Markus Wheaton sparked Pittsburgh's offense a 72-yard touchdown catch that tied Week 5's game at San Diego up at 17-17 on Monday Night Football. The 72-yard touchdown reception established a new career-long for the third-year receiver. Through the first eight games of the 2015 season, Wheaton has notched 13 receptions for 257 yards and a touchdown.

In Week 1 vs. New England, Wheaton caught a personal 2015 single-game high three catches for 55 yards, and added an individual 2015 single-game best of 67 yards on two catches in Week 2.

BIG PLAY GAY

CB William Gay intercepted Atlanta QB Matt Ryan in Week 15 in 2014, and returned the ball 52 yards for a touchdown to mark his third INT-TD of the season and set a new Steelers single-season record. He also led the Steelers defense with eight tackles and two pass break-ups.

His two other INT-TDs on the season occurred in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis and at Tennessee on Monday Night Football in Week 17.

Gay totaled 64 tackles (54 solo) and led the Pittsburgh defense with 12 pass break-ups.

HEYWARD EMERGES

DE Cameron Heyward produced his first sack of the season - recording a quarterback takedown of San Francisco QB Colin Kaepernick in Week 2's home opener in 2015. He added his second sack of the season on a strip-sack of Baltimore QB Joe Flacco in Week 4 and in Week 7 brought down Kansas City QB Alex Smith for his third sack of 2015.

Since the start of the 2014 season, Heyward has totaled 10.5 sacks - the eighth-most among AFC defensive ends.

In the third quarter of Week 8's game vs. Cincinnati, Heyward blocked a Bengals' field goal attempt, the second block of his career, and the first by a Steeler since his block against the Bengals on Dec. 4, 2011.

DO-IT-TUITT

DE Stephon Tuitt has set a single-season career-high and ranks second among the Steelers' defense with 3.5 sacks through the eighth week of the 2015 season. He recorded a quarterback takedown in three straight games from Weeks 2-4.

The second-year defensive end brought down Ravens QB Joe Flacco for a sack in Week 4. Combined with his takedown of Rams QB Nick Foles for a sack in Week 3 game at St. Louis and his first career multi-sack game of his career in Week 2, the Notre Dame product has posted the first sack streak in his NFL career.

BLAKE SETS I.N.T. MARK

CB Antwon Blake has set a single-season personal-best with two interception in 2015.

He provided Pittsburgh with its first touchdown in Week 5's Monday Night Game at San Diego courtesy of a 70-yard interception returned for a touchdown - the first pick six of his NFL career - and his second career interception.

His 70-yard INT-TD marked the longest pick six by a Steeler since DE Brett Keisel's 79-yard return for a touchdown in 2010 (Sept. 26 at Tampa Bay).

In Week 8 vs. Cincinnati, Blake picked off QB Andy Dalton to mark his second interception of the season and third of his NFL career.

HARRISON RETURNS

LB James Harrison, who announced his retirement on September 5, 2014 returned to the Steelers for a 12th season in the NFL in 2014 (11th with Pittsburgh: 2002, 2004-12 and 2013 with Cincinnati) and re-signed with the franchise on March 22, 2015.

Harrison posted his first sack of the 2015 season in Week 4, bringing down Ravens QB Joe Flacco and added a sack and forced fumble vs. Arizona in Week 6 - increasing his totals to 71.5 sacks in his tenure with the Steelers - and 73.5 in his NFL career.

S Mike Mitchell recorded his seventh career interception - first as a Steeler - in the team's end zone during the fourth quarter of Week 6's game vs. Arizona. Mitchell was also credited with a fumble recovery, on a forced fumble caused by LB James Harrison, his fourth career defensive fumble recovery, and first as a Steeler.

Mitchell added his second interception of the 2015 season - eighth of his NFL career - in Week 8 vs. Cincinnati, picking off Bengals' QB Andy Dalton.

ALLEN SEALS WEEK 3 WIN

S Will Allen helped seal Pittsburgh's Week 3 victory at St. Louis with an interception of QB Nick Foles with 3:02 remaining in the fourth quarter.

For Allen, a 12-year NFL veteran, the interception marked his seventh in his NFL career, and second as a Steeler.

Allen started each of the team's first five games in 2015, recording 25 tackles (20 solo) and tied for the team-lead with seven stops in Week 3.

TIMMONS TIME

LB Lawrence Timmons has recorded a team-best 58 tackles through the first eight games of the 2015 season.

Timmons posted a game-high 10 tackles (7 solo) and shared a sack with **LB Ryan Shazier** of Kansas City QB Alex Smith in Week 7 at Kansas City.

In Week 5 vs. Arizona, Timmons picked off Arizona QB Carson Palmer off of a tip by LB Vince Williams to mark the 10th interception of his NFL career, to go along with 6 tackles (4 solo) and a quarterback hurry.

He recorded 11 tackles (10 solo) in Week 4's game vs. Baltimore and 9 stops (five solo) in Week 5 at San Diego. In Week 2, Timmons had 9 tackles (6 solo) along with a pass defended vs. San Francisco, and tied for the team-lead of 7 stops (2 solo) in Week 3 vs. St. Louis.

Timmons, who has missed only two games his entire career, started his team-leading 77th consecutive regular-season game in Week 8 at vs. Cincinnati.

Since the start of the 2010 season, Timmons has started (87) and played in (88) the most games out of any Steelers' linebacker, while also leading the group in tackles over that time.

TIMMONS' DIGITS

Timmons recorded the 10th interception of his NFL career in Week 6 of 2015 vs. Arizona. He joined Jack Ham (32), Jack Lambert (28), Bryan Hinkle (15), Levon Kirkland (11), Mike Merriweather (11), David Little (10), Greg Lloyd (10) and Joey Porter (10) as the ninth Steelers linebacker to record 10 interceptions in the modern era of the NFL (since 1970).

Timmons led Pittsburgh's defense with 10 total tackles (7 solo) in Week 7 in 2015. He has registered double digit tackles in 35 games during his career, including 22 times since the start of the 2012 season.

In Week 8 of the 2013 season, Timmons forced a fumble that was recovered by Pittsburgh at the Oakland 11-yard line early in the fourth quarter. It was the 10th forced fumble of his career.

SHAZIER'S SOPHOMORE CAMPAIGN

Pittsburgh's 2014 first round draft selection - **LB Ryan Shazier** - led the team's linebacking corps with seven tackles (five solo), including two tackles for a loss in the team's regular-season opener at New England in Week 1.

Shazier recorded a game and career-high 15 tackles, including three stops for a loss and tallied his first career sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery in Week 2's game against San Francisco and was inactive in Week 3 at St. Louis.

Shazier ranked fifth among all NFL defenders with a combined 22 tackles in the first two weeks of the season.

The second-year linebacker returned to the field in Week 7 at Kansas City, and contributed 4 tackles (3 solo), along with a split-sack with **LB Lawrence Timmons**.

In Week 8 vs. Cincinnati, Shazier tied for the team-lead with eight tackles (six solo), along with two tackles for a loss and a half-sack.

ROOKIE DUPREE

LB Bud Dupree - the team's first round selection in the 2015 NFL Draft - has provided the defensive unit with a sack in three games in 2015 (Weeks 1-2 and 5) - and posted his fourth quarterback takedown in Week 8 vs. Cincinnati.

BOS-DOES-WELL

K Chris Boswell made his NFL debut with the Steelers on Monday Night Football in Week 5 at San Diego after being signed to the team's 53-man roster on Oct. 3.

In the first game of his NFL career, the Rice product converted his only field goal attempt from 47 yards, and successfully placed each of his three extra point tries through the uprights.

Boswell converted each of his four field goal attempts (47, 48, 51, 28) in Week 6 vs. Arizona to become the first Steelers kicker since Oct. 20, 2013 (Shaun Suisham vs. Baltimore) to convert each of his four field goal attempts in a game.

In Week 7, Boswell converted each of his two field goal tries (24 and 36) and his sole extra point attempt and in Week 8, the first-year kicker placed his only attempt from 32 yards out through the uprights.

On the season, Boswell is 8-of-8 on field goal attempts, including four from 40-plus yards, and 6-of-6 on extra point conversions.

BOSWELL NAMED PLAYER OF WEEK

Steelers **K Chris Boswell** was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his Week 6 performance against the Arizona Cardinals, it was announced today.

In Boswell's second career game, he made all four field goal attempts (47, 48, 51 and 28) and his lone extra point attempt in the Steelers' 25-13 victory vs. Arizona at Heinz Field. He became the first Steelers kicker since Shaun Suisham (10/20/13 vs. Baltimore) to make four field goals in a game.

Boswell is a perfect 5-for-5 on field goals and 4-of-4 on extra points in two games this season after signing with the Steelers on October 3, 2015. This marks the first time he was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

Preseason Game #1 Minnesota 14, Pittsburgh 3 Aug. 9, 2015

Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium (22,364)

CANTON, Ohio – The Steelers could not overcome two turnovers and missed opportunities and lost to the Minnesota Vikings, 14-3, in the NFL/Hall of Fame Game.

Pittsburgh marched into Minnesota territory midway through the first quarter, but **WR C.J. Goodwin** fumbled the football and the Vikings recovered.

Midway through the second quarter, Pittsburgh would score its only points of the game, coming off of **K Shaun Suisham's** 36-yard field goal to give the team a 3-0 lead.

The Vikings responded on their ensuing drive as they marched 81 yards in eight plays. QB Mike Kafka capped off the drive with a 34-yard touchdown pass to TE MyCole Pruitt to give Minnesota a 7-3 advantage.

QB Landry Jones led Pittsburgh into Minnesota's red zone on the Steelers' next possession. But the Steelers were unable to score, failing at a fourth-and-goal attempt at the one-yard line. Pittsburgh would trail 7-3 at halftime.

Midway through the third quarter, WR Stefon Diggs returned a punt 62 yards to the Steelers' one-yard line. On the next play, RB Joe Banyard scored on a one-yard run to seal the victory for Minnesota.

Despite the loss, the Steelers' defense limited Minnesota to 14 first downs and held them to 3-of-13 on third-down conversions. **LB Ryan Shazier** led the team with five tackles. **CB Kevin Foggy** recorded an interception. And **DE Ethan Hemer** registered the team's only sack.
