Game Themes

- QB Derek Carr recorded 29 completions in the contest to move him into second place in NFL history for the most completions through a player's first five years with 1,670, trailing only Peyton Manning (1,749).
- With 17,802 career yards after today's contest, **Carr** is second in club history only to Ken Stabler, who holds the record with 19,078.
- The Raiders recorded a season-best 171 rushing yards behind **RB Jalen Richard**'s career-high 95 yards on the ground.
- The Raiders converted on 75 percent of their third downs (9-of-12), which marks a season high and their third best conversion percentage in franchise history dating back to 1991.

Individual Highlights

WR Marcell Ateman

- Ateman hauled in a 9-yard touchdown pass from **QB Derek Carr**, the first of his career, capping a six-play, 54-yard drive to cut the lead to 30-33 with 6:46 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- Ateman is just the sixth player who was drafted in the seventh round or later to record a receiving touchdown this season, and just the second rookie.
- o Ateman finished with two receptions for 16 yards and one touchdown.

• K Daniel Carlson

- Carlson connected on a 50-yard field goal, capping a 8-play, 43-yard drive lasting 3:54. The 50-yard field goal marks a career-long.
- Carlson split the uprights for the second time in the contest, this time from 44 yards out with 30 seconds left in the contest.
- Carlson finished the game 2-for-2 on field goals and was perfect on three PATs.

QB Derek Carr

- On a 29-yard pass to **TE Jared Cook** in the second quarter, Carr surpassed Rich Gannon for second place on the franchise all-time passing yards list. With 17,802 career yards after today's contest, Carr is second only to Ken Stabler who holds the record with 19,078.
- Carr orchestrated the Raiders' first touchdown drive of the game in the second quarter, an 11play, 75-yard drive lasting 5:58 that culminated in a 1-yard rush by RB Doug Martin.
- Carr later recorded his first touchdown of the day, completing a 24-yard pass to Cook to cap a 6play, 68-yard drive lasting 2:20 in the third quarter.
- Carr brought the Raiders within 10 with 10:41 left in the game with a 1-yard pass to TE Lee
 Smith to culminate a 10-play, 75- yard drive lasting 4:23.
- With his second touchdown pass, Carr passed Cam Newton for the seventh-most passing touchdowns in the NFL through a player's first five years with 118.
- With 6:46 left in the contest, Carr connected with WR Marcell Ateman for a 9-yard score to cut the Chiefs lead to 33-30.
- Carr's 29 completions on the day move him into second place in NFL history for the most completions through a player's first five years with 1,670, trailing only Peyton Manning (1,749).
- Carr earned a passer rating of 123.2 in the game, his 22nd career game with a passer rating of at least 100 points to tie Jim Plunkett for fourth-most in franchise history.
- On 29-of-38 passing, Carr earned a completion percentage of 76.3, marking his seventh game this season with a completion percentage of 70.0 or better.
- For the seventh consecutive contest, Carr protected the football by not recording an interception.

TE Jared Cook

- With 3:28 left in the third quarter, Cook set a career-high recording his sixth touchdown of the season, a 24-yard reception to culminate a 6-play, 68-yard drive lasting 2:20.
- On the touchdown reception Cook brings his career total to 25, giving him sole possession of 13th place in the league among active tight ends.
- Cook also extended his streak of touchdowns to three games, marking a new career high.
- With 100 receiving yards in the contest, Cook's season total is now at 709, which marks the second-most in his career. It also marks just the second time in his career that he's surpassed 700 receiving yards in a season.

• The contest marks the ninth time Cook has recorded 100-or-more yards in a contest and the second time he's done so against the Chiefs.

RB Doug Martin

- Martin broke the goal line from 1-yard out, helping put the Raiders on the board with 1:04 remaining in the first half. His touchdown culminated an 11-play, 75-yard drive lasting 5:58.
- Martin recorded a rushing touchdown in consecutive games for the first time since Week 5 and Week 6 of the 2017 season.
- Martin ended the day with 61 yards on 18 carries (3.4 avg.) with one touchdown, adding two receptions for six yards.

WR Jordy Nelson

- Nelson set a season high by hauling in 10 passes on the afternoon while totaling 97 yards, the most he's recorded since his 173 in Week 3 against the Miami Dolphins.
- Nelson's 10 receptions were a team high and also tie a team high on the season, with six of his 10 receptions going for first downs.

• RB Jalen Richard

- Richard set a career high with 95 rushing yards on just six carries (15.8 avg.), besting his previous high of 84 yards which he set in Week 1 of 2016, his first career game.
- With three receptions for 31 yards, Richard surpassed 100 yards from scrimmage for just the second time in his career.

TE Lee Smith

- Smith recorded his first touchdown since the 2015 season, grabbing a 1-yard pass from QB
 Derek Carr early in the fourth quarter to cut the Chiefs lead to 33-23.
- The score marked just the fifth of Smith's career, and his second as a member of the Silver and Black.

Other Notables

- The Raiders defense wasted no time getting the offense on the field, as **LB Tahir Whitehead** forced a fumble that **CB Nick Nelson** recovered on the first play of the game. The defense held the Chiefs to 295 passing yards, their sixth consecutive week keeping an opponent to less than 300 yards passing.
- Oakland's offense surpassed 400 total net yards for the third time this season, finishing the day with 442.
- Oakland's offense finished the day a perfect four-of-four inside the red zone.
- **LB Tahir Whitehead** led the team with in tackles for the ninth time this season with nine stops (nine solo).
- **DE Arden Key** recorded the Raiders first blocked kick of the season, Harrison Butker's extra point attempt in the second quarter.
