Junior (2019)

Finished his time with the Crimson Tide ranked third on Alabama's career touchdown receptions list with 24 ... averaged 17.5 yards per catch across his three seasons, good for sixth on the UA career list (minimum 50 catches) ... owned the team-long rush (75 yards) and the second-longest reception (81 yards) in 2019 ... recorded 40 receptions for 746 yards and seven touchdowns to go with 75 yards rushing ... averaged a team-high 18.6 yards per catch to rank 24th nationally with 27 of his 40 receptions going for a Tide first down or touchdown ... also a threat in the kick return game, accounting for 286 yards on 12 kickoff returns with a long of 40 ... added six tackles on special teams ... joined Jerry Jeudy, DeVonta Smith and Jaylen Waddle on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List ... selected as one of the Alabama coaching staff's special teams players of the week for his efforts against Duke and Southern Miss ... added offensive player of the week accolades from the Tide coaches for his play at South Carolina and against Southern Miss. Duke: Caught two passes for 14 yards in the opener ... made plays on special teams, including a 22-yard kickoff return ... named one of the Crimson Tide coaching staff's special teams players of the week for his play against the Blue Devils. New Mexico State: Accumulated a team-high 160 all-purpose yards on the afternoon ... rushed once for a 75-yard score on the first play of the game ... added four catches for 66 yards and a touchdown to round out his game against the Aggies. South Carolina: Had a career day in Columbia ... recorded a career-high 122 yards on six catches, a total that matched his career-best number for receptions ... added a season-long and career-long 81-yard touchdown catch on a slant that he took to the house ... paired with DeVonta Smith to become the ninth receiving duo to eclipse the 100-yard mark in the same game ... earned offensive player of the week recognition for his play against the Gamecocks. Southern Miss: Selected as both an offensive and special teams player of the week for his output against the Golden Eagles ... finished with a career-high and team-best 148 yards on just four receptions ... matched the team-high mark with two touchdown catches, a total that tied his previous career best ... added two tackles on special teams with one stop on punt coverage and one on kickoff. Ole Miss: Suffered a lower body injury early in the game that limited his playing time ... converted a first down for the Tide with his one reception of 11 yards on the day. Texas A&M: Provided a spark in the kickoff return game, totaling 131 yards on four kicks with a long of 40 ... added one reception with his lone catch going for a 33-yard touchdown. Tennessee: Led all pass-catchers against the Volunteers with 72 yards on four catches with a long of 48 ... also returned a pair of kickoffs for 43 yards. Arkansas: Caught four passes for 47 yards and a score ... found the end zone from 14 yards out for the Tide's first touchdown of the night. LSU: Totaled 68 yards on three catches with all three receptions converting an Alabama first down ... also brought three kickoffs out for a combined 71 yards with a long gain of 29. Mississippi State: Exited early with a rib injury ... managed three catches for 39 yards with a long of 26 in his limited playing time. Auburn: Returned from injury to lead all Alabama wideouts with six catches for 99 yards and a touchdown ... moved the sticks on four of his other five catches in the Iron Bowl. Michigan: Exited the game with an injury just before the end of the first quarter ... caught two passes for 27 yards while adding one rush for no gain ... also contributed one tackle on kickoff coverage prior to his exit.

Sophomore (2018)

A key piece in the talented, young Alabama receiving corps ... hauled in 46 catches for 741 yards and 11 scores as a sophomore ... his 11 touchdown receptions tied for second in the SEC ... also ranked in the top 15 of the league in nearly every receiving category ... tallied 20-plus yard gains on 13 of his catches in 2018 while 34 of his grabs went for a first down or a touchdown ... also contributed eight tackles on special teams, including a team-high tying three on punt coverage ... selected as a special teams player of the week by the Alabama coaches for his efforts against Texas A&M, Tennessee and Auburn while earning offensive player of the week honors following the Louisiana game. Louisville: Earned his first career start, hauling in two passes for 15 yards. Arkansas State: Recorded three catches for 56 yards and a score ... tallied the touchdown on his season-long 31-yard reception ... added one tackle on kickoff coverage. Ole Miss: Productive during his time on the field, making three catches for 25 yards with a long reception of 13 for a touchdown ... exited the game early with an injury. Texas A&M: Made three catches for a third consecutive week, totaling one score and a career-high 84 yards ... earned special teams player of the week accolades from the UA coaches for his standout play on coverage units. Louisiana: Earned offensive player of the week honors from the Tide staff for his career day against ULL ... caught a team-high five passes for 116 yards and two scores ... all three marks were career bests for the sophomore ... his three non-scoring receptions each resulted in a UA first down. Arkansas: Recorded one catch for 21 yards while picking up a Tide fumble and taking the ball into the end zone from 12 yards out for his sixth score of the season. Missouri: Tied for the team lead in receptions with four totaling 50 yards, including a long gain of 29. Tennessee: Made an impact in the passing game and on special teams ... recorded three catches for 65 yards and a touchdown with two catches of 12 yards - each for a first down - and a 41-yard catch and run for a score ... also contributed one tackle on kickoff coverage to earn himself special teams player of the week honors from the Alabama coaching staff. LSU: Hauled in four catches for 55 yards and a score against the Tigers ... helped the Tide move the ball on his receiving plays, tallying a first down or touchdown on all four receptions. Mississippi State: Targeted twice against the Bulldogs but did not register a catch. The Citadel: Led all receivers with 114 yards coming on his team-high tying six receptions ... five of his catches went for a Tide first down with a long reception of 54 yards. Auburn: Tied for the team lead with five catches totaling 62 yards and a career-high tying two touchdowns ... two of his catches went for an Alabama first down to go with his pair of scoring receptions ... contributed a career-high two tackles, one apiece on each coverage unit, to earn himself special teams player of the week recognition from the Tide coaching staff. Georgia: Led all special teamers with three tackles against the Bulldogs ... added three receptions for 49 yards with two of his catches resulting in an Alabama first down ... also entered at punt returner but did not return any kicks. Oklahoma: Caught three passes for 14 yards and a touchdown in Miami. Clemson: Limited to one catch for a gain of three yards in the title game.

Freshman (2017)

Named to the All-SEC Freshman team ... returned 13 kickoffs for 239 yards while taking back eight punts totaling 46 yards ... added 12 receptions for 229 yards, six of which went for a touchdown. Florida State: Came out on kickoff coverage to start the game while also seeing time at wideout ... returned one kick for 15 yards ... did not haul in a pass but was targeted throughout the night. Fresno State: Caught his first career pass, a 16-yard touchdown reception from Tua Tagovailoa ... did not return a kickoff on the afternoon but remained in his kick returner role. Colorado State: Returned two kickoffs for 42 yards on the night ... registered a career-long return of 22 yards on his first return of the game ... was targeted twice in the passing game but was unable to haul in a catch. Vanderbilt: Resumed his duties on kickoff return team while also entering late for punt returns ... made his first punt return of the season, going 16 yards and nearly busting it for a score. Ole Miss: Caught one pass, an eight-yard strike from Tua Tagovailoa for a touchdown ... returned one kickoff for 22 yards ... added punt return to his duties following an injury to Trevon Diggs, totaling 21 yards on two punts with a long return of 16 yards. Texas A&M: Assumed the punt return duties in the absence of Trevon Diggs ... returned three punts for 10 yards with a long return of 12 ... had one reception for eight yards and a score, the Tide's third touchdown of the night ... also saw time on kickoff but did not record any returns. Arkansas: Caught his third touchdown reception in as many games, this one a career-long 20-yard reception from Jalen Hurts ... added two kickoff returns for 40 yards with a season-long return of 23 yards ... also returned two punts for a loss of one yard. Tennessee:

Continued his hot streak with another touchdown reception ... caught a career-long 60-yard reception for a score from Tua Tagovailoa ... split three defenders and then burst out in front of the defense for the final 40 yards on the play ... also assumed his duties on kick return but did not record any stats. LSU: Recorded one catch for 47 yards while returning one kickoff for 18 yards against the Tigers ... secured the pass despite being tackled by the defensive back in the process. Mississippi State: Returned one kickoff for an 18-yard gain against the Bulldogs. Mercer: Caught one pass on the day for a gain of 17 yards against the Bears. Auburn: Saw time against the Tigers but did not record any stats. Clemson: Returned a season-high three kickoffs for a combined 48 yards ... recorded a season-long return of 22 yards on one of the boots ... added two catches for 25 yards in the CFP Semifinal matchup. Georgia: Tied for second on the team with three receptions totaling 29 yards ... added his team-leading sixth touchdown reception of the season on a six-yard pass from Tua Tagovailoa for the Crimson Tide's first touchdown of the evening.

Lee High School in Montgomery ... a five-star prospect by 247Sports, No. 24 nationally in their Top247 and the outlet's top-rated receiver nationally ... No. 77 overall in the 247Composite, the No. 11 wide receiver and the No. 2 player in the state of Alabama ... Scout.com ranked him as the No. 10 wide receiver nationally and No. 75 in the Scout 300 ... was also the No. 6 receiver in the South by Scout.com and the top wideout in Alabama ... No. 125 in the Rivals250 and the No. 19 wide receiver while ranking as the No. 5 player in the state ... ESPN listed him at No. 166 in the ESPN 300 and the No. 23 wideout ... participated in the U.S. Army All-American Game ... played in the Alabama-Mississippi All-Star Game ... took part in the Rivals100 Five-Star Challenge ... PrepStar 300 All-American ... named the 7A Back of the Year by the Alabama Sports Writers Association ... an All-State selection by the Alabama Sports Writers Association (ASWA) ... accounted for 20 touchdowns on 102 touches in nine games as a senior in 2016 ... had 38 catches for 639 yards and nine scores while rushing 36 times for 446 yards and seven touchdowns ... also returned seven kickoffs for 352 yards and one score ... forced into quarterback duty late in his senior season, went 11-of-23 for 186 yards and three touchdowns ... as a junior in 2015, Ruggs caught 44 passes for 1,010 yards and 11 touchdowns, while adding another 237 yards on eight kickoff returns ... coached by Tyrone Rogers at Robert E. Lee ... chose Alabama over Auburn, Florida, Florida State and Michigan.

Career

- Played in 39 career games with 25 starts
- 2019 Paul Hornung Award winner
- 2019 First-Team All-American and All-SEC selection
- In three seasons, became just the 38th player in school history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards, totaling 1,530 for No. 21 on UK's career list
- Totaled 1,303 career receiving yards for No. 18 on UK's career list
- Totaled 114 career receptions for No. 13 on UK's career list
- Just the 10th player in school history to reach 4,000 all-purpose yards in a career, finishing with 4,660 career all-purpose yards for No. 5 on UK's career list
- Also had 71 kick returns (third in school history) for 1,628 yards (fourth in school history) and nine punt returns for 199 yards and two scores
- Just the second player in school history (also Randall Cobb) with 1,000 career yards in receiving, rushing and kickoff returns

 - most rushing yards by a quarterback in a bowl game (233 vs. Virginia Tech in 2019 Belk Bowl)
 - most rushing yards in a game by a quarterback in SEC history (284 vs. Louisville in 2019)
 - tied the school records for most TDs in a game and most rushing TDs in a game (four vs. Louisville in 2019)
 - most 100-yard rushing games in a single season by a QB in school history (seven in 2019)
 - tied the school record for most 200-yard rushing games in a season and a career (three in 2019)
 - best yards per rushing attempt in a single season (7.9 in 2019)
 - most kick return yards in a single season (869 in 2017)
- Went 6-2 as UK's starting quarterback in 2019

- Totaled 1,468 rushing yards on 185 carries with 13 TDs; Caught a team-high 30 passes for a team-high 348 yards and one TD; Completed 35 of 74 passes for 403 yards and three TDs (three INTs)
- Led the SEC and ranked fifth nationally in all-purpose yardage, 160.7 yards per game (note that all-purpose yardage does not include Bowden's passing yardage as a quarterback)
- Second nationally in rushing yards per carry (7.9), breaking the school record of 7.10 set by Stanley "Boom" Williams in 2015
- Even though he ran the ball in only eight games, led the SEC and ranked 11th nationally in total rushing yards
- The 1,369 yards during his eight games at quarterback is a school record for most rushing yards in a season by a QB
- The only player in the FBS to lead his team in both rushing and receiving yards
- Had seven 100-yard rushing games, the most 100-yard rushing games by a QB in school history (missed having 100 yards in the Georgia game by one yard)
- Had three 200-yard rushing games, becoming the first SEC quarterback since 2000 to have three 200-yard rushing games in a single season
- One of four SEC players with a 200-yard rushing game this season (Miss. State Kylin Hill, TAMU Isaiah Spiller, Ole Miss John Rhys Plumlee)
- His 233 rushing yards vs. Virginia Tech were an NCAA record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a bowl game
- Become the ninth player in school history with 1,000 rushing yards in a single season, finishing with 1,468 ... Ranks No. 2 on UK's single-season list behind Moe Williams' 1,600 rushing yards in 1995
- UK's leading receiver with 30 catches for 348 yards and a score
- Had a team-high nine kick returns for 202 yards (24.4) ... Also had four punt returns for 53 yards (13.2)
- Named CFPA National Performer of the Week, SEC Offensive Player of the Week, Manning Quarterback of the Week and Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll for his performance vs. Louisville in the regular-season finale ... Rushed 22 times for a career-high 284 yards and career-high four touchdowns – breaking or tying six records in the process ... 284 yards broke the SEC record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a single game ... Set Governor's Cup records for most rushing yards and most rushing TDs and was given the Howard Schnellenberger Award as the game's Most Valuable Player ... Tied the school records for most TDs in a game and most rushing TDs in a game ... Averaged 12.9 yards per rushing attempt, third-best in SEC history (min. 20 attempts), highlighted by a career-long 60-yard touchdown run ... Broke the school record for most rushing yards in a season by a QB and became the ninth 1,000-yard rusher in school history
- Earned SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week and the Paul Hornung Award for the second time in three games after his performance vs. Missouri after accounting for 261 yards total offense and two touchdowns ... Rushed 21 times for a career-high

- 204 yards and two touchdowns ... Became just the seventh player in UK history to rush for 200 yards in a game, and just the second QB ... Mike Fanuzzi ran for 208 yards vs. Miami (Ohio) in 1974 ... Playing in a downpour for most of the night, completed 3 of 7 passes for 54 yards, including a career-long 44-yard bomb that set up UK's first touchdown
- Earned SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week, Manning Quarterback of the Week and Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll for his performance in his first collegiate start at quarterback vs. Arkansas ... Accounted for 274 yards total offense and all three touchdowns in Kentucky's 24-20 win ... Rushed 24 times for 196 yards and two touchdowns vs. the Razorbacks ... First UK quarterback to rush for 100 yards since Terry Wilson in last season's win at Florida ... Completed 7 of 11 passes for 78 yards and his first collegiate TD pass ... First UK quarterback with two rushing and one passing touchdown since Patrick Towles vs. Mississippi State in 2014
- Playing QB, ended a streak of catching a pass in 19 consecutive games

2018 - Sophomore

- His 67 catches broke the school record for most by a sophomore in school history ... Derek Abney had 66 catches as a sophomore in 2001 ... Most receptions for a Wildcat since Randall Cobb had 84 in 2010
- Had two punt returns for TDs on just five total returns, a 58-yard punt return for a TD in the first quarter vs. Penn State and 67-yarder at Missouri
- One of just three players nationally with two punt returns for a TD
- Named to the All-Bowl Team by the AP and USA Today after catching five passes for 84 yards and returning a punt for a TD in the win over Penn State in the Citrus Bowl ... Marked the first punt return for a TD in the Citrus Bowl since 1992 and UK's first punt return for a touchdown in a bowl game in school history
