- Oakland's all-time regular season series record against the Texans drops to 4-7, as they
 move to 1-1 against AFC South opponents.

Raiders Themes

- The Raiders offense has recorded 16 scoring drives of 10-plus plays, ranking first in the NFL this season.
- With two scoring drives of 70-plus yards in today's contest, the Raiders offense has recorded multiple 70-plus yard scoring drives in 6-of-7 games this season.
- The offensive line did not allow a sack for the third consecutive game and fourth time this season, becoming the only team in the NFL this season to hold four different teams without a sack.
- **WR Tyrell Williams** has recorded a receiving touchdown in five straight games, the longest active streak in the NFL and tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history.

Raiders Debuts

WR Zay Jones

o Jones finished with 27 yards on two receptions (13.5 avg.) in his Raiders debut.

Individual Highlights

QB Derek Carr

- On the Raiders first scoring drive of the game, Carr orchestrated an eight-play, 95-yard drive lasting
 3:31, culminating in a 65-yard receiving touchdown by WR Hunter Renfrow.
- o Carr's 65-yarder marks the fifth-longest passing touchdown of his career.
- o Carr orchestrated a 10-play, 70-yard scoring drive lasting 4:43, culminating in an eight-yard touchdown reception by **TE Darren Waller** to give the Raiders a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter.
- With two touchdown passes in the first half, Carr recorded his 39th career multi-touchdown game. Carr's 39 such games are tied for 11th-most in NFL history through a player's first six seasons.
- On the Raiders third scoring drive, Carr orchestrated a six-play, 77-yard drive lasting 2:35, which was capped by a 46-yard touchdown reception by **WR Tyrell Williams** to give the Raiders a 21-13 lead.
- o Carr has now tossed three touchdowns in two consecutive contests against the Houston Texans.
- Carr passed for three touchdowns for the first time in 2019, marking his 18th career three-TD game, tied for 13th most in NFL history through a player's first six years.
- Has 843 yards (281.0 avg.), seven touchdowns and a 100.1 passer rating in three career games against Houston.
- Recorded his fourth game in a row on the road and sixth in a row against AFC South opponents with two-plus touchdowns and a 100-plus passer rating.
- Carr finished the day completing 18-of-30 attempts for 285 yards with three touchdowns for a passer rating of 125.0.

RB Josh Jacobs

- Jacobs has the most rushing yards through a player's first seven career games in franchise history (620).
- Jacobs has the fourth-most rushing yards in NFL history by a 21-year old through a player's first seven career games.
- Jacobs continues to lead all rookie rushers in carries (124), rushing yards (620) and rushing touchdowns (four).
- Jacobs finished with a team-high 66 rushing yards on 15 carries (4.4 avg.), adding 15 receiving yards on two catches.

WR Hunter Renfrow

- Renfrow recorded his first career touchdown on a career long 65-yard TD reception, marking the longest receiving play by the Raiders this season.
- The 65-yard touchdown reception marks the longest receiving TD by a Raider since WR Amari Cooper's 87-yarder in Week 17 of the 2017 season.
- o Renfrow finished with 88 yards on four receptions with one touchdown.

TE Darren Waller

- Waller recorded his third touchdown of the season on an 8-yard reception from QB Derek Carr, bringing the Raiders lead to 14-7 early in the second quarter.
- Waller recorded a receiving touchdown in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- Waller ranks second amongst tight ends in catches (46), third in receiving yards (496) and tied for fourth in receiving touchdowns (three) through Week 8.

• WR Tyrell Williams

- Williams has recorded a receiving touchdown in five straight games, the longest active streak in the NFL and tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- o Williams finished with three receptions for 91 yards (30.3 avg.) and one touchdown.

Additional Notes

- K Daniel Carlson converted on a 44-yard field goal and was true on three extra points.
- **P A.J. Cole** punted six times for 292 yards (48.7 avg.) with a long of 57 yards, placing three punts inside the 20-yard line.
- **DE Maxx Crosby** finished with six tackles and one forced fumble. Crosby is one of only three rookies in NFL with a sack (two), forced fumble (two) and pass defensed (two) this season.
- The Raiders totaled three sacks in the contest, coming from **DT Johnathan Hankins, DE Arden Key** and **DE Benson Mayowa** to bring the club's season total to 13.0.
- **DE Benson Mayowa** has recorded a team-leading 5.5 sacks, tied for fifth-most in the AFC.
- **LB Tahir Whitehead** finished with a team-high 11 tackles (seven solo), marking his fifth game leading or tying for the team lead in tackles this season.
