

THE DRAFT

The Oakland Raiders will host media members at the team's training facility in Alameda, Calif., for the 81st National Football League Draft from April 28-30 (Thursday through Saturday). There will be 253 selections, including 33 compensatory choices that have been awarded to 13 teams.

The draft will be held at Chicago's Auditorium Theatre of Roosevelt University and Selection Square in Grant Park. The 2016 NFL Draft will begin on Thursday in prime time, the seventh consecutive year that it will kick off in an evening time slot. The first round will take place on Thursday, April 28, beginning at 5 p.m. PT. The second and third rounds will take place on Friday, April 29, and begin at 4 p.m. PT. The draft will conclude on Saturday, April 30, with the final four rounds, commencing at 9 a.m. PT.

Teams have 10 minutes to select a player in the first round and seven minutes in the second round. Except for compensatory selections, the selection time for rounds three through six is five minutes. The selection time for round seven and all compensatory selections is four minutes.

NFL Network and ESPN/ESPN 2 will televise the draft all three days.



2016 COMPENSATORY PICKS

This year, the NFL awarded 33 compensatory selections to 13 teams for the 2016 NFL Draft. The compensatory picks will be positioned within the third through sixth rounds based on the value of the compensatory free agents lost.

Under the rules for compensatory draft selections, a team losing more or better compensatory free agents than it acquires in the previous year is eligible to receive compensatory draft picks. Compensatory free agents are determined by a formula based on salary, playing time and postseason honors. The formula was developed by the NFL Management Council. Not every free agent lost or signed by a club is covered by this formula.

Compensatory picks may not be traded this year. A rule change approved by clubs in 2015 will permit compensatory draft picks to be traded beginning in 2017.

McKENZIE'S PRO BOWLERS

Since taking over as the Raiders' general manager in 2012, Reggie McKenzie has drafted four Pro Bowlers in his tenure, **RB Latavius Murray** in 2013, **DE Khalil Mack** and **QB Derek Carr** in 2014 and **WR Amari Cooper** in 2015. Each earned their first Pro Bowl berth in 2015.

----- LATAVIUS MURRAY -----

Career: Has played in 31 games with 19 starts over three seasons...Totals include 1,490 rushing yards on 348 carries with eight touchdowns...Has added 375 receiving yards on 58 receptions . Pro Bowl Season (2015): Started all 16 games in his first season as the team's primary rusher...Led the team in all rushing categories...Totaled 266 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards (4.0 avg.) with six touchdowns...Also hauled in 41 receptions, third most on the team, for 232 yards (5.7 avg.)...Finished sixth in the NFL in rushing and second in the AFC...Ranked third in the NFL in rushing attempts.

----- KHALIL MACK -----

Career: Has started all 32 games over his career and totaled 163 tackles (117 solo), 19 sacks, three forced fumbles and eight passes defensed.

Pro Bowl Season (2015): Started all 16 games and earned his first career Pro Bowl selection after totaling 79 tackles (58 solo), 15 sacks, two forced fumbles and four passes defensed...His 15 sacks ranked second in the NFL and fell just one short of a franchise record.

----- DEREK CARR -----

Career: Has started all 32 games over his career, passing for 7,257 yards on 698-of-1,172 passing (59.6 pct.) with 53 touchdowns, 25 interceptions and an 83.7 passer rating.

Pro Bowl Season (2015): Started all 16 games for the second straight year, throwing for 3,987 yards on 350-of-573 passing (61.1 percent) with 32 touchdowns and 13 interceptions with a 91.1 rating...Earned a Pro Bowl alternate selection...Led the NFL with 13 touchdown passes of 25-plus yards.

----- AMARI COOPER -----

Pro Bowl Season (2015): Had the most productive season by a rookie receiver in franchise history, recording 72 receptions for 1,070 yards (14.9 avg.) and six touchdowns in 16 games...His 72 receptions and 1,070 receiving yards are both franchise rookie records...Led all NFL rookies in receptions, receiving yards, receiving yards per game and tied for the lead in receiving touchdowns.



THE 2015 DRAFT CLASS

First Round - WR Amari Cooper (No. 4 overall)

2015 Season: Had the most productive season by a rookie receiver in franchise history, recording 72 receptions for 1,070 yards (14.9 avg.) and six touchdowns in 16 games...His 72 receptions and 1,070 yards are both franchise rookie records...Led all NFL rookies in receptions, receiving yards, receiving yards per game and tied for the lead in receiving touchdowns.

Honors/Awards: Named the Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week for his Week 7 performance at San Diego, totaling 133 receiving yards on five receptions (26.6 avg.) and one touchdown...Named the Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week for his Week 9 at Pittsburgh after recording seven receptions for 88 yards and one touchdown...Named the Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week in Week 12 at Tennessee, finishing with seven receptions for 115 yards...Selected to his first Pro Bowl...Named to PFWA and Gil Brandt's All-Rookie Team.

Second Round - DE Mario Edwards Jr. (No. 35 overall)

2015 Season: Stepped into a starting role and made a big impact before being placed on IR, playing in 14 games and posting 41 tackles (30 solo), two sacks, three forced fumbles and two passes defensed

Honors/Awards: Named the Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week for his Week 11 performance vs. Minnesota when he posted 11 tackles (eight solo), one sack and one forced fumble...Named to Gil Brandt's All-Rookie Team.

Third Round - TE Clive Walford (No. 68 overall)

2015 Season: Emerged into a dependable receiving option and blocker as the season went on, recording 28 catches for 329 yards (11.8 avg.) and three touchdowns in 16 games.

Fourth Round - G/C Jon Feliciano (No. 128 overall)

2015 Season: Played in six games with three starts at right guard in his rookie campaign, earning his first start in Week 15...Started final three games of season at right guard.

Fifth Round - LB Ben Heeney (No. 140 overall)

2015 Season: Saw his playing time increase significantly in the second half of the season, playing in 15 games with three starts and totaling 39 tackles (28 solo), 2.5 sacks and one forced fumble...Started three of the team's final four games.

Fifth Round - LB Neiron Ball (No. 161 overall)

2015 Season: Emerged as a starter at outside linebacker before injuring his knee in Week 7, totaling nine tackles (four solo), one sack and one pass defensed in six games with two starts.

Sixth Round - DE Max Valles (No. 179 overall)

2015 Season: Spent the majority of the season on the team's practice squad before being signed to the Buffalo Bills' active roster in Week 15.

Seventh Round - T Anthony Morris (No. 218 overall)

2015 Season: Was waived/injured on Sept. 5.

Seventh Round - WR Andre Debose (No. 221 overall)

2015 Season: Suffered an injury in June 2015 and spent the season on the Reserve/Injured List.

Seventh Round - CB Dexter McDonald (No. 242 overall)

2015 Season: Played in six games for the team, recording four tackles on defense and one special teams tackle.

UNDRAFTED GEMS

Minutes after every draft, scouts and personnel members attempt to sign hundreds of undrafted players to their respective team. **Reggie McKenzie** has brought in numerous players that were not drafted, developing them into significant contributors for the Silver and Black.

- **WR Andre Holmes**, originally an undrafted free agent with the Minnesota Vikings in 2011, has two of the Raiders' top four singlegame receiving totals from 2013-14. He set career highs in 2014 with 47 catches for 693 yards and four touchdowns.
- In 2015, **P Marquette King** set a franchise record with 40 punts placed inside the 20-yard line, ranking second in the NFL and breaking the team record of 33. In 2014, King set Raider franchise records in punts (109) and punting yards (4,930). In 2013, he posted numbers among the NFL's best in both gross average and punting yards. With 4,107 punting yards on the year, King finished sixth in the NFL, and led the league in gross punting with an average of 48.9.
- **QB Matt McGloin** made his mark on the NFL in his rookie season, making his first career start on Nov. 17, 2013 at Houston. In that game, McGloin became the first undrafted rookie to throw for three-or-more touchdown passes in his first NFL start since 1987. He also became just the second quarterback to throw for three touchdowns without an interception in his first NFL start since the NFL-AFL merger.
- **WR Seth Roberts** posted five touchdowns in 2015, including two game-winning touchdowns in 2015 (Week 2 vs. Baltimore and Week 12 at Tennessee).

Since the common draft started in 1967 as part of the AFL-NFL merger, Oakland has selected just one interior offensive lineman in the first round (Gene Upshaw, 1967). Don Mosebar was drafted as a tackcle in 1983 before moving to center.
