## **OAKLAND RAIDERS (4-11) vs.** DENVER BRONCOS (12-3)







The Oakland Raiders will take the field for the final time this season as they return home for the finale to host the Denver Broncos on Sunday, Dec. 29. Sunday's game will mark the third-straight contest for the Raiders against AFC West foes, having played the Chiefs and Chargers the last two weeks. Sunday's game will also mark the first time since 1995 that the Raiders have faced the Broncos in a season finale. The Raiders and Broncos met back in Week 3 on Monday Night Football in Denver, with the Broncos winning that match-up, 37-21.

Last week, Oakland fell in their final road contest of the season in San Diego to the Chargers, 13-26. Raiders QB Matt McGloin threw for over 200 yards for the fifth-straight game and WR Andre Holmes had a game-high 71 receiving yards. RB Darren McFadden returned from injury to score on a five-yard TD run in the second quarter, giving the Raiders an early lead. RB Rashad Jennings led the way on the ground, rushing 10 times for 45 yards. On defense, DT Pat Sims recorded 15 tackles, while CB Mike Jenkins tallied his second interception on the year.

The Denver Broncos enter the contest coming off their 12th win of the season, a 37-13 victory on the road over the Houston Texans. The headline of the game was QB Peyton Manning's four TDs, giving him 51 on the season, a new NFL record. It marked the second time in his career Manning has broken the record, as he broke it in 2004 before Patriots QB Tom Brady set the new mark in 2007. Denver also had two 100-yard receivers on the day, as WR Eric Decker (131) and WR Demaryius Thomas (123) both had big days. RB Knowshon Moreno paced the run game with 76 rushing yards. The Broncos clinched the AFC West as well with the win.

#### **Pro Connections**

- Raiders Head Coach Dennis Allen served as the defensive coordinator for the Broncos during the 2011 season. During that season, Allen's defense improved 12 spots over the previous year in overall defense ranking (from 32nd to 20th) and bettered their points allowed by eight spots (32nd to 24th).
- Raiders DE Jason Hunter played for Denver from 2010-12. In the 2011 season opener vs. Oakland, Hunter recorded six tackles, a sack and a forced fumble.
- Raiders CB Tracy Porter played for the Broncos during the 2012 season.
- Raiders defensive assistant Travis Smith is the son of Broncos linebackers coach Richard Smith.
- Broncos Head Coach John Fox was the defensive coordinator for the Raiders during the 1994-95 season. Under Fox, the Raiders defense finished in the top half of the league in both of his seasons.
- Broncos quarterbacks coach Greg Knapp served as the offensive coordinator for the Raiders during the 2012 season. Knapp lead the Raiders offense to the eighth-ranked passing unit in the league.
- Broncos S Michael Huff was drafted by the Oakland Raiders with the seventh-overall pick in the 2006 NFL draft and played for the Silver and Black from 2006-12. During his tenure in Oakland, Huff played in 108 games and had 11 interceptions.

#### **College Connections**

- Raiders offensive assistant Nick Holz was a wide receiver and holder for three seasons at the University of Colorado.
- Raiders TE Nick Kasa went to the University of Colorado from 2009-12. During his senior season, he was fourth on the team in receptions and third in yards, while having a teambest eight receptions of 20 yards or longer.
- Raiders G Mike Brisiel attended Colorado State University from 2001-04 and was an All-Mountain West Conference honorable mention in 2004.
- Broncos executive V.P. of football operations John Elway attended Stanford University, finishing with five major NCAA Division 1-A records and nine major Pac-10 marks.
   As a senior, Elway was a consensus All-American and finished second in the Heisman Trophy balloting.

#### Raiders Head Coach Dennis Allen

When Dennis Allen became the 18th head coach in Raiders history on Jan. 30, 2012, he promised to field a tough, smart, disciplined and committed football team, noting that organizations win games in the National Football League by more than talent alone.

Allen, 41, is the NFL's youngest head coach, more than six months younger than the league's previously youngest coach, Pitts-

In 2012, his first year as a head coach at any level, Allen guided an Oakland team in transition, posting a 4-12 mark. The 2012 Raiders were defined by offensive, defensive and special teams units that improved throughout the season, laying a foundation for future success.

With 17 years of combined coaching experience at the college and professional levels, Allen enters his 12th NFL season. On six occasions during his 10 years as an NFL assistant, his team earned a playoff berth: 2002, 2004, 2006, 2009, 2010 and 2011. And four of those trips came after division championships: The NFC South with Atlanta in 2004 and New Orleans in both 2006 and 2009, and the AFC West with Denver in 2011.

His résumé also includes football's ultimate prize, a Super Bowl XLIV ring he earned by helping the Saints beat season MVP Peyton Manning, who threw for more than 4,500 yards with 33 touchdowns, and the Indianapolis Colts to conclude the 2009 campaign.

The NFL's second-youngest defensive coordinator when the Broncos hired him in 2011, he coordinated a defense that helped Denver parlay an AFC West crown into a Wild Card win and a date in the Divisional round. During his only year in Denver, despite starting three rookies most of the season, the Broncos improved 12 spots over 2010 in overall defensive ranking (from 32nd to 20th) and bettered their points allowed by eight spots (from 32nd to 24th).

Prior to joining the Broncos, Allen was an assistant coach for five seasons with New Orleans, first as assistant defensive line coach (2006-07), then as defensive backs coach (2008-10). Under Allen's direction in 2010, the Saints' secondary allowed an NFL-low 13 touchdown passes while ranking fourth in the NFL in net passing yards per game (193.9).

In 2009, Allen tutored a secondary that played a key role in helping the Saints to their first Super Bowl victory. His unit accounted for an NFL-high six interception returns for touchdowns and totaled 22 picks en route to their championship.

In 2008, his first year as secondary coach, Allen helped the Saints overcome season-ending injuries to both starting cornerbacks and contributed to a defense that held five opponents under 200 yards passing.

Allen assisted in tutoring the Saints' defensive line from 2006-07, helping defensive end Will Smith become a Pro Bowler in 2006 after posting 101/2 sacks and forcing three fumbles.

He originally entered the NFL coaching ranks with Atlanta in 2002, spending four seasons with the Falcons as a defensive assistant. During his stint in Atlanta. the Falcons qualified for the playoffs twice—as a wild card in 2002 and as NFC South champs in 2004—and played in the NFC Championship in 2004.

Allen kicked off his football coaching career in 1996 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Texas A&M, where he was a four-year letterman as a safety. He worked with Aggies defensive backs for four seasons before coaching the secondary at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01.

#### **Broncos Head Coach John Fox**

John Fox is in his third season with the Broncos in 2013 after being named the 14th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 13, 2011. Fox, who has experience on multiple Super Bowl teams and is one of six active head coaches with 100 overall wins, joined the Broncos after spending the previous nine seasons (2002-10) as the head coach of the Carolina Panthers.



In his second year with the Broncos in 2012, Fox led the club to a 13-3 record and the AFC's No. 1 seed while earning his 100th career victory in the Broncos' regular-season finale. He became just the 10th coach in NFL history to deliver a division title in each of his first two years, posting the fifth divisional crown of his NFL head-coaching career. In addition, Fox became only the third head coach in NFL history to win back-to-back division titles after inheriting a team that finished with a losing record the previous season.

The Broncos ended the 2012 regular season in dominant fashion under Fox, recording 11 consecutive wins by at least seven points to becoming the third team in NFL his- tory to accomplish that feat. Posting an undefeated record in AFC West play for just the second time in club history, the Broncos were the only NFL team to finish in the Top 5 in both total offense (4th) and total defense (2nd).

Before joining the Broncos, Fox compiled a 73-71 (.507) regular-season record with the Panthers during his nine years as head coach. He led Carolina to three 11-win campaigns, two NFC South Division titles and three playoff appearances.

Carolina went 5-3 in the postseason under Fox, appearing in two NFC Championship Games and one Super Bowl (XXXVIII during the 2003 season). His teams won four playoff road games, a total that ranks third in NFL history behind Pro Football Hall of Fame coaches Tom Landry (7, Dallas) and Joe Gibbs (5, Washington).

Before his head coaching tenure with the Panthers, Fox spent five seasons as the defensive coordinator for the New York Giants from 1997-2001 and led a defense that consistently ranked among the league's most productive units. New York allowed the seventh-fewest points per game (18.7) in the NFL during that span while also finishing fourth in the league with a +25 turnover differential.

The Giants ranked third in the NFL with 230 sacks under Fox during that five-year period, including Strahan's NFL-record 22.5 sacks in 2001.

He began his NFL career in 1989 in Pittsburgh, where he coached the secondary during Pro Football Hall of Fame Head Coach Chuck Noll's final three seasons with the Steelers from 1989-91. In that capacity, he instructed Woodson, who in 1991 earned the first of his 10 Pro Bowl selections as a defensive back en route to earning induction into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

### **BRONCOS SNAPSHOT**



**Overview:** The Denver Broncos come into Sunday's contest having already secured their third-consecutive AFC West crown this year. Their 12-3 record is currently tops in the AFC, and Denver looks to secure home-field advantage throughout the playoffs with a victory in Week 17.

**Offense: QB Peyton Manning** has already set the record for passing touchdowns in a season with 51, and he is only 265 yards shy of breaking Saints QB Drew Brees' record for passing yards in a season. **WR Demaryius Thomas** leads the high-flying Broncos receivers with 1,194 yards and 11 touchdowns. **RB Knowshon Moreno** paces the team's ground game with 939 yards and 10 touchdowns to go along with 53 receptions for 481 yards and two touchdowns.

**Defense:** The Broncos' defense is led by second-year **LB Danny Trevathan**. Trevathan leads the team in tackles with 114 to go along with his four forced fumbles and three interceptions. The defensive line is led by **DE Shaun Phillips**, who leads the team in sacks with 10, while the secondary is paced by **CB Chris Harris** who has 59 tackles to go along with three interceptions.

#### RB Darren McFadden

- McFadden posted the second-highest rushing performance of his career vs. the Broncos on 10/24/10, when he rushed for 165 yards. The game kicked off a stretch where he would rush for at least 119 yards in three-straight games vs. Denver.

#### **WR Denarius Moore**

## **COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE**



The Raiders — who began play in the American Football League in 1960 — enter their 53rd year of professional football competition, including the last 43 as a member of the National Football League.

In five memorable decades — the 1960s, '70s, '80s, '90s and the 2000s — the Raiders have been dominant in professional football since Al Davis first pledged in 1963 to build the finest organization in pro sports.

During these Decades of Dominance, the Raiders have won an AFL Championship, four American Football Conference Championships, three World Championships of Professional Football, participated in five Super Bowls, played in 14 Championship Games, won or tied for 17 Division Championships, had 21 playoff seasons, finished 34 seasons at .500 or better and played in 40 postseason games.

Pro Football's Dynamic Organization placed first in the AFC West in 2000, 2001 and 2002 despite playing among the toughest schedules in the NFL in each of those seasons. With their appearance in Super Bowl XXXVII, the Raiders became the first NFL team to have had a season end in the Super Bowl in four different decades.

The Raiders are the only team to have been in Super Bowls in the '60s, the '70s, the '80s and the 2000s and have won the most games of any original AFL franchise.

The Silver and Black are the only AFC team — and one of just two NFL teams (Minnesota) — to have a season that advanced to

the conference championship game in the '60s, the '70s, the '80s, the '90s and the 2000s.

The Raiders are one of only two original AFL teams to have captured three World Championships of Professional Football with Super Bowl victories. The Raiders are one of only five AFC teams to have won more than one Super Bowl since 1980.

In their five Super Bowl appearances, the Raiders have been led by four different

head coaches and started four different quarterbacks.

The Raiders are the last AFC Western Division team to go to the Super Bowl.

Since 1963, when Al Davis first took over the failing Oakland franchise that had struggled to win only nine of 42 league games in the initial three seasons of the new AFL and pledged to build the finest organization in sports, the Raiders have totally dominated professional football in terms of consistent victory. During those memorable 50 years in Oakland and Los Angeles, the Raiders have won 421 league games, tied 11 and lost only 330.

"Commitment to Excellence" has never been an idle phrase to those who have proudly represented the Raider organization during the '60s, '70s, '80s, '90s and now the new millennium as shown by their domination of pro football.

Nineteen of the great players who proudly wore the Silver and Black, as well as Owner-Leader Al Davis and legendary Head Coach John



Madden, have been enshrined in the Professional Football Hall of Fame. The Raiders have also produced five Pro Coaches of the Year.

In addition, 62 Pro Bowl players have made 180 Pro Bowl appearances representing the Silver and Black. In 1970, as the Raiders began their second decade of play, the merger between the AFL and NFL became a reality on the field. In the 1970 through 2012 period of interconference play, the Raiders have compiled a remarkable 92-69-1 record against present National Football Conference rivals.

Another innovation came to professional football in 1970 — "Monday Night Football." The Raiders total domination of this prime-time television series has seen the Silver and Black build an incredible 37-26-1 record in Monday night play. In the 43 years of this series, the Raiders are 15-8-0 in "Monday Night Football" games at home.

Through the decades — the '60s, '70s, '80s, '90s and now the 2000s — the Raiders have had the greatest players, the greatest coaches, the greatest plays and participated in the greatest games in the annals of professional sports.

#### STUFFING THE RUN

### AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT

With the 2013 season heading towards the final week, here is a look at some of

the areas the 2013 Oakland Raiders have improved upon from a season ago.

Through 15 games this year, Oakland's defense is holding up well against the run. After finishing 18th in the NFL a season ago in rushing yards allowed per game, the Raiders currently rank sixth in the AFC this season, allowing just 106.9 yards per game. 

### **WOODSON RETURNS HOME**





One of the most beloved players to ever put on the Silver and Black signed with the Raiders on May 22, 2013, returning him home to the team that drafted him with their first-round selection in the 1998 NFL Draft. After seven years with the Green Bay Packers, Woodson brings his Hall of Fame credentials back to the Raiders, solidifying a revamped secondary.

Woodson grew to fame at the University of Michigan, where he helped the Wolverines capture the 1997 Associated Press National Championship. His individual performance during the 1997 season earned him the Heisman Trophy, becoming the first predominantly defensive player ever to win the illustrious award. He was also honored with the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Jim Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Award and Sporting News Player of the Year.

The fourth-overall selection by Al Davis in the 1998 NFL Draft made an immediate impact in the league, earning the Defensive Rookie of the Year and being selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first four seasons (1998-2001). During his first stint with the Raiders, Woodson also earned first-team All-Pro accolades on three occasions (Associated Press in 1999, Sports Illustrated in 2000 and Sporting News and College & Pro Football Newsweekly in 2001).

After signing with the Packers prior to the 2006 season, Woodson continued to collect the hardware and add to his legacy. From 2006-12 with Green Bay, he was selected to four Pro Bowls (2008-11), two more first-team All-Pro selections (2009 and 2011) and

the 2009 NFL Defensive Player of the Year. In addition to earning the highest honor a defensive player can achieve in a single season, Woodson followed up the 2009 campaign by helping the Packers win the Super Bowl in 2010.

All in all, the resume Woodson brings back to Oakland is impressive: The 1997 Heisman Trophy Award and National Championship in college, eight Pro Bowl selections, three first-team All-Pro selections, the NFL's 2009 Defensive Player of the Year award, four conference championship game appearances, two Super Bowl appearances and one Super Bowl championship. Charles Woodson has returned to the Silver and Black to write the next chapter.



#### WOODSON: OUICK HITS



- Woodson posted an interception touchdown in six-straight seasons (2006-11), becoming the first player in NFL history to do so. No other NFL player has accomplished the feat in more than four-consecutive seasons.
- In 2009, Woodson became the fourth player in NFL history (since sacks became an official statistic) to record at least nine interceptions and two sacks in a single season.
- Is the only player in NFL history to post at least seven interceptions and two sacks in back-to-back seasons.
- Became the first NFL player (since sacks became an official statistic) to record two interceptions, an interception touchdown, a sack and a fumble recovery in the same game when he posted all of those statistics on 11/26/09 at Det.





#### BRANCH ON THE ST







S Tyvon Branch has been one the most consistent Raiders over the last four seasons. #### CLUTCH PORT





With Peyton Manning and the Indianapolis Colts trailing by a touchdown and driving late in Super Bowl XLIV, CB Tracy Porter, then a member of the New Orleans Saints, made one of the clutch plays in NFL history. Porter stepped in front of Manning pass intended for Reggie Wayne, then raced 74 yards for the championship-sealing score. Porter, who has three interception

touchdowns with less than 3:30 remaining in the game and his team leading by one score or less in his career, is in his first season in Oakland.

Porter made NFL history on 11/10/13 when he recorded a pick-six against Eli Manning, making him the only player to record a pick-six against both Manning brothers, Peyton and Eli. Porter intercepted Eli in the second guarter and returned it 43 yards for the score, giving the Raiders the lead.







The Raiders' first-round selection (No. 12 overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft, CB DJ Hayden has come a long way. After suffering a life-threatening injury to his heart last November, Hayden played a major role in Oakland's defensive makeover. On the season. Havden has now recorded 29 tackles and two PD. In the Week 5 win vs. San Diego, Hayden hauled in his first NFL

interception, picking off Philip Rivers in the end zone to stop a potential Chargers scoring drive. He was placed on IR on Nov. 20.



LB Sio Moore, the Raiders third-round selection in the 2013 NFL Draft has emerged onto the scene in his rookie season. Moore, who has played in 13 games and started 10, was named the NFL Pepsi Next Rookie of the Week for his eight-tackle, 1.5-sack performance on 10/27 vs. Pit. Kevin and Kaelin Burnett became the first brothers to play in a regular season game in the history of the Raiders franchise in Week 1 at Indianapolis. The Burnett brothers are also the only active siblings in the NFL on the same team. Kevin, who is eight years older than Kaelin, joined Oakland on March 18, 2013, following two seasons with the Miami Dolphins. Kevin was originally drafted by the Dallas Cowboys in 2005 and has appeared in 135 games over his nine seasons. Kaelin originally signed with the Raiders as an undrafted free agent prior to the 2012 season. 

## Raiders fall to Chargers 26-13

SAN DIEGO -- You could sum up the Raiders season in the 12 plays that were run after officials ruled Rod Streater hadn't held on to what looked to be a 39-yard touchdown pass late in Sunday's 26-13 loss to the San Diego Chargers at Qualcomm Stadium.

When replay officials upheld the no-catch with 4:46 to play, the offense continued to fight its way toward the end zone -- getting in its own way with two penalties but eventually ending up with fourth-and-5 at the 6-yard line and 59 seconds to play.

In the end, Matt McGloin's desperation heave in the face of a blitz slipped through the hands of Marcel Reece in the end zone, and the little engine that couldn't had lost five straight games and seven of the last eight.

"We're fighting our butts off, and we're close," center Stefen Wisniewski said. "But we don't quite seem to make the play when we need to in the fourth quarter."

San Diego quarterback Philip Rivers completed 19 of 29 passes for 201 yards with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Keenan Allen, Ryan Mathews rushed for 99 yards on 25 carries with a 7-yard scoring run, and Nick Novak converted field goal attempts of 27, 48, 28 and 33 yards as the Chargers (8-7) remained in wild-card contention going into the season finale against Kansas City.

The Raiders (4-11) scored on 5-yard run by Darren McFadden and had field goals of 20 and 42 yards by Sebastian Janikowski heading into their last game at home against Denver.

McGloin was 19 of 36 for 201 yards and had a costly interception after the Raiders' Mike Jenkins had intercepted Rivers. The pick by Eric Weddle at the Oakland 20 set up Mathews' touchdown in the second quarter.

The Raiders were given 10 points on unforced San Diego errors in the first half. A shotgun snap Rivers never saw was the catalyst for a 58-yard drive resulting in McFadden's touchdown run. A muffed punt by Allen set up Janikowski's 20-yard field goal -- with the Raiders failing to produce a touchdown despite having first-and-goal at the 2-yard line.

Any concern felt by players on one-year contracts or coaches worried about their jobs was not alleviated by the manner of defeat. There were too many penalties (12 for 73 yards), too many third-down conversions by the Chargers (6 for 11) and too many missed opportunities.

Raiders coach Dennis Allen's job will be up for review two years into a four-year contract, with general manager Reggie McKenzie meeting with the staff and reporting to owner Mark Davis. How Davis reacts, given he has no history in the coach-removal business as his late father did, is anyone's guess.

"I can't speak for how anyone else thinks or feels," Allen said. "I can only speak for me. Every day we're trying to win a game. That's what my focus is, that's the only focus I can have. It would be selfish of me to think any other way."

Asked if the coaching staff and much of the personnel could be shipped out, Wisniewski acknowledged it was possible.

"I really don't know what they're thinking," Wisniewski said. "I've got another year here, so I'm going to show up to work. I don't know who the coach is going to be, but whoever it is I'll support 'em and do my best to lead whatever players are still here."

McGloin believes there has been no snowball effect regarding concerns for the future contributing to poor performance.

"Not in our facility. That's stuff we can't control, and we can't worry about that stuff," McGloin said. "We have one game left, and another week of practice."

"That's part of the business," safety Charles Woodson said. "There are a lot of teams going through the same thing. When the season is over, what's going to happen is going to happen."

Veteran linebacker Kevin Burnett tried to be philosophical.

"It's good to be living, to have another day to come out here and play the game that I love," Burnett said. "Other than that, it pretty much sucks right now. I don't know how else to put it."

## Raiders of old lose with penalties, mistakes

SAN DIEGO --- The Raiders hung around for a while thanks to three first-half turnovers by the Chargers, but in the end couldn't get out of their own way enough to pull up the upset. Penalties. missed opportunities and a fumble of its own stopped Oakland in its tracks and resulted in a 26-13 loss on Sunday afternoon.

The Raiders (4-11) were outscored 16-3 in the second half and have lost seven of their past eight games. Philip Rivers' four-yard touchdown pass to Keenan Allen with five minutes left in the third quarter was the go-ahead score, and the 77-yard drive was aided by two penalties on cornerback Mike Jenkins.

One was for taunting, when Jenkins knocked the ball out of running back Ryan Mathews' hands out of bounds after tackling him.

The Raiders had 12 penalties to the Chargers' three.

The Raiders tried to get back in the game, but Rod Streater dropped a deep pass at the goal-line from Matt McGloin with three minutes left in the game. The ball was underthrown but Streater seemed to make the adjustment and pull the ball in and score before being hit and losing the ball. But the officials ruled a drop and replay officials didn't overturn the call.

Later, on a fourth-down play close to the goal line, McGloin threw a ball up under pressure and Marcel Reece turned and ran under it but couldn't pull the ball in.

Both starting quarterbacks, McGloin and Rivers, were inaccurate much of the day. McGloin never saw safety Eric Weddle on a second-quarter interception that led to a Mathews touchcdown run. And Rivers underthrew Vincent Brown on his interception in the first half, and missed Allen several times when the Chargers settled for field goals.

Nick Novak hit field goals from 48, 28 and 33 yards in the second half to put the game out of reach.

The Raiders pulled even 10-10 after the Chargers committed their third turnover late in the first half.

Allen muffed a punt recovered by Shelton Johnson at the Chargers' 16. Sebastian Janikowski kicked a 20-yard field goal in the half's final minute.

Earlier, Chargers center Nick Hardwick snapped the ball to Rivers in the shotgun formation, but Rivers wasn't looking. The ball was pounced on by linebacker Miles Burris and the Raiders didn't squander their good fortune.

Running back Darren McFadden, back after missing two weeks with an an ankle injury, converted the turnover with a 5-yard touchdown run to give the Raiders a 7-3 lead. McFadden's scamper was set up by a 37-yard reception by tight end Mychal Rivera.

That's when McGloin threw the ill-advised pass that Weddle jumped and tipped to himself. The interception gave the Chargers the ball at the Raiders' 20-yard line. Mathews' 7-yard run pushed the Chargers ahead, 10-7.

The Chargers scored first when marching 82 yards in their opening possession, which was capped by Novak's 27-yard field goal, his first of four.

Owner Mark Davis has yet to decide on head coach Dennis Allen's fate, as can be seen by his lack of action regarding the assistant coaches' contracts.

Most of the assistants were given two-year contracts when Allen was hired in 2012. At the end of last season, general manager Reggie McKenzie recommended to Davis that the contracts of the assistants retained by the team be rolled over for another year, so that they'd continue to have two years on their deals.

Davis didn't see it that way, even though he has said McKenzie is running the football side of the business.

With coaches like defensive coordinator Jason Tarver perhaps getting antsy, Allen (who has a four-year deal) recently requested again that the staff be given a one-year extension. Davis against declined, according to league sources.

Allen is 8-23 and could definitely use a win, as could his players, many of whom are on one-year contracts. It didn't happen Sunday in San Diego, and 12-3 Denver is next to conclude the season.

## Instant Replay: Raiders' skid continues with 26-13 loss in SD

SAN DIEGO – The Raiders continue sliding down toward season's end. The brakes, it seems, have gone out.

Sunday's 26-13 loss to the host San Diego Chargers wasn't the train wreck of previous weeks, but it was a loss just the same.

It featured turnovers and penalties aplenty, with enough missed opportunities to complete what has become a signature Raiders defeat.

They fall to 4-11, just one loss away from matching Dennis Allen's first season as head coach. Allen's case for progress has holes, with one remaining chance to patch them. That shot comes in Week 17 against the Denver Broncos, who beat the Raiders handily in Week 3.

The Raiders have lost five straight and seven of their last eight, which has placed Allen's future with the team in doubt.

The Chargers jumped out to an early lead, but the Raiders tied it 10-10 by halftime with a 5-yard touchdown run from Darren McFadden and a 20-yard field goal from Sebastian Janikowski.

The Raiders fell behind by two scores when Nick Novak's 28-yard field goal made it 23-10. That score came after Greg Jenkins lost a fumbled kickoff in Raiders' territory and continued a run of 13 unanswered second-half points.

Sebastian Janikowski's 42-yard field goal on series later ended that run, but the Raiders couldn't climb all the way back.

Down by 10 with six minutes remaining, McGloin found receiver Rod Streater near the goal line. He seemed to catch the ball and took two steps into the end zone. The ball came out at the end, and officials ruled the pass incomplete on the field and after review.

The Raiders continued that drive deep into Chargers territory, but Marcel Reece dropped a sure touchdown catch. That ended slim comeback hopes.

More ill-timed turnovers: The Raiders have a habit of losing possession in their own territory. McGloin threw an interception at the Raiders' 20 – it was McGloin's fifth from the 20 on in – and Jenkins lost a kickoff return at the Raiders' 13-yard line.

The Chargers turned those opportunities into 10 points in a game the Raiders lost by 13.

The Raiders got a takeaway off a muffed punt and intercepted Chargers quarterback Philip Rivers – the Raiders assumed possession on their own 10 - and scored seven points off that.

Third-down woes continue: The Chargers had the NFL's best third-down offense entering Sunday, and the Raiders defense is one of the worst at allowing conversions.

Those rankings held strong on Sunday. The Chargers converted 6-of-11 third downs – a few of them via Raiders penalties – that gave scoring drives life.

Penalty prone: The Raiders hurt themselves time and again with penalties on crucial downs. They had 12 for 73 yards, a total which doesn't include THREE penalties declined by the Chargers.

Some were questionable, like a roughing the passer call on Miles Burris. Others, like Mike Jenkins' penalty for taunting, showed a real lack of discipline.

The Chargers, by contrast, were flagged only once in the first half and three times throughout the game.

Sitting it out: The Raiders weren't missing many active players on Sunday at Qualcomm Stadium. Darren McFadden returned from an ankle injury and Vance Walker was cleared to play after suffering a concussion two weeks ago.

The Raiders had several healthy scratches, including offensive lineman Andre Gurode and receiver Jacoby Ford.

What's next: There's one game left on the schedule this season, against the Denver Broncos at Oakland Coliseum. The Broncos clinched the AFC West on Sunday, and could lock up home-field advantage throughout the AFC playoffs with a victory over the Raiders.

Quarterback Peyton Manning is also in line to break the NFL's single-season passing record, assuming he plays.

## Growing up in Hurst, Oakland Raiders coach Dennis Allen knew his calling

OAKLAND, Calif. — Long before he became the youngest head coach in the NFL, Dennis Allen was — in a football sense — the oldest kid on his second-grade team. Grady and Kay Allen knew coaching ran through their son's blood by the way he lined up his teammates in the Colleyville Youth Football Association, giving them specific instructions on what to do.

"That's really what he was always good at," Kay Allen said from her home in Hurst. "He's just always had an instinct for it, knowing where to be and what to do. He was like that coach on the field from the start."

Allen's first official coaching job came just before his 24th birthday when he returned to Texas A&M as a graduate assistant after his playing career ended. The Oakland Raiders hired him as the franchise's 18th head coach 15 years later, when Allen was only 39.

Allen is the first NFL head coach in the league's post-1970 modern era bred in Tarrant County. Bo McMillin, from Fort Worth North Side High School, coached the Lions and Eagles from 1948-51.

Today Allen will coach the Raiders in Tarrant County against the Dallas Cowboys at AT&T Stadium.

He was born in Georgia but started kindergarten in Hurst after the family's move in 1977. Allen played in the Mid-Cities PeeWee and Mid-Cities Little Dribblers Leagues, attended Shady Oaks Elementary and became a multisport star at Bedford Junior High and L.D. Bell High School.

Allen never wanted to be a fireman, a policeman or even a doctor, like his older brother, Geoff, ended up becoming. Instead, Dennis declared in junior high that coaching was his future, a calling he wonders whether his now-deceased father regrets not heeding.

Grady Allen, who died last December of a heart attack at age 66, went into the industrial chemical business after retiring from the NFL. But he always found time to help coach his children's teams, a passion that rubbed off on Dennis.

"I think it's important for all players to know who they are," Dennis said at the Raiders' training facility. "I think sometimes players don't recognize who they are. They think they're something they're not. I knew I wasn't the biggest. I wasn't the strongest. I certainly wasn't the fastest. But I thought I could be smartest. I would use my football smarts to try to help other people. I always took pride in being a little bit of a coach on the field, even when I was real little. For whatever reason, it came natural to me. It probably came more natural than 10 times 10 or 7 times 9. I still don't know if I know those answers.

"I just always looked up to my coaches, and I love sports. When you can't play anymore, how else are you going to be involved in athletics? Coaching, I thought, was a great avenue for me."

Like father, like son

Grady Allen played defensive end for A&M from 1965-67. He earned All-Southwest Conference honors in '67 when the Aggies won the conference title and upset Alabama in the Cotton Bowl. Grady, who won the prestigious Aggie Heart Award as a senior, continued his career for five seasons with the Atlanta Falcons.

While growing up, Dennis imagined his father's career akin to that of Hall of Famer Dick Butkus. The truth is: Grady's intangibles turned him into an overachiever. He was a part-time linebacker and a core special teams player, with no starts in 59 NFL games and two career interceptions.

"He was a guy you'd look at and think there's no way he'd ever play," said Ralph Smith, Grady's position coach at A&M who now runs the Fort Worth office for Bourland & Leverich Supply Co. "He was a tremendous high school athlete — an old, rugged East Texas boy — but he was slow and always had knee problems. I've told people I could outrun Grady backward. But he just kept beating the ones out we brought in. He just had a knack, which is the same thing Dennis had."

Dennis, Geoff and their younger sister, Ann Marie, grew up with sports. The four-bedroom residence bears scratches from the sock baseball and Nerf basketball games played in the family room while a Cowboys, Rangers or some other game on TV provided background noise. They used a basketball goal in the driveway and a neighbor's vacant lot to take their games outside.

The family's social activities revolved around sports, too, with Grady and Kay never missing an organized game.

Dennis' favorite sport was whatever season it was. He once scored 63 points in a Little Dribblers game. His mom remembers the unassisted triple play he turned in Little League. It was big news one field day at Bedford Junior High when he was beaten out in a foot race. He was a catcher in baseball, a safety in football and a forward in soccer.

Dennis lettered in three sports in high school, but as the Class 5A state defensive player of the year in 1990 when he had 10 interceptions, eight forced fumbles and 107 tackles, he followed his father to A&M on a football scholarship.

"He had great instincts, but he also had all the tools to make the plays," said Tim Edwards, Bell's head coach from 1977-96. "He had enough speed, enough size, but I think one of the biggest things was he was just hostile. He was the opposite of what he was in the classroom and off the field. When he'd get there, he'd light you up."

## Coach DA

It was in college that Aggies defensive back Michael Hendricks started calling Allen by his initials — DA — a nickname that has stuck.

Allen, a safety, started the final 21 games of his career on the Aggies' Wrecking Crew defense. The Aggies finished in the NCAA's top five in total defense in 1994-95 while posting a 19-3-1 record. Most Aggies remember Allen for his fourth-quarter interception against Texas in 1993 that iced an 18-9 victory.

A&M coach R.C. Slocum saw the coaching potential in Allen soon after he arrived on campus.

"He was more than a player," said Slocum, who was 123-47-2 in his 14 seasons at A&M. "He was like a coach on the field. Dennis always showed a little more maturity than the average player. He'd come up to the office and watch tape, studying it like a coach."

After failing to catch on with the Buffalo Bills as an undrafted rookie free agent in 1996, Allen returned to A&M to begin coaching. He spent four years helping with the Aggies' defensive backs as a low-level assistant before Keith Burns, a 1979 L.D. Bell graduate, hired Allen as the secondary coach at the University of Tulsa.

Allen moved up the ranks quickly — two seasons at Tulsa, four with the Atlanta Falcons and five with the New Orleans Saints — before the Denver Broncos hired him as defensive coordinator.

"There's a presence that comes with Dennis that is that of confidence," New Orleans Saints coach Sean Payton said. "... Dennis is and was very highly thought of while he was here and was on track to be a coordinator here. Those plans never work out, though. Those guys get hired very quickly. Dennis got an opportunity to go [to Denver], and so it's not surprising to see the position he's in now — that of a head coach. I think the world of him and a lot of his ability."

Allen doesn't regularly wear his Aggie Ring or his Super Bowl ring from the 2009 Saints, but both mean a lot to him. They represent the two places he "grew up" as a football coach.

## White knight

After only one season as the Broncos defensive coordinator in 2011, Allen earned interviews with St. Louis and Oakland. The Raiders offered him their head coaching job, and Allen didn't hesitate even though Oakland's last winning season came in its 2002 Super Bowl season.

"I was aware of what the challenges would be coming in," said Allen, who is 8-19. "Now, maybe to what depth the challenges were, I don't know if I fully understood that, but I knew what the challenges were coming in here. I have never been afraid to step up to a challenge.

"I went to New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, and that team was 3-13 and had been displaced and everything's chaotic. I was like, 'Let's roll up our sleeves and go to work.' That's kind of the way I've approached this. Just roll up my sleeves and go to work and try to do the best I can and keep these guys motivated, try to teach them, try to have a team that's going to be tough, smart, disciplined, and we've made a lot of progress in that area.

"We haven't won as many games as I would have liked to have won, but I see a lot of great signs of where this thing is going, and it's heading in a positive direction."

The Raiders have started three quarterbacks this season and six in three seasons. Their biggestname players are aging safety Charles Woodson, who is in his second stint with the Raiders, and longtime kicker Sebastian Janikowski, leaving Allen as the face of the franchise.

Raiders safety Usama Young, who had Allen as his position coach for three seasons in New Orleans, calls Allen the "general" and the "captain."

"He's positive. He's intuitive. He challenges you," Young said. "He's a players' coach. He takes care of his guys. He's always been that guy who understands where we're coming from. He's got so much knowledge of the game. I respect him. He went through some rough times in New Orleans, and we won a Super Bowl. ... He definitely has what it takes to win here."

On this day, the team's white knight is dressed in all black — sweat pants, a Raiders sweatshirt, a visor with a red Sharpie attached and sunglasses atop his head. Allen, though, presents the picture of cool, with not a hint of sweat.

Allen not only inherited his father's rugged good looks — a modern-day John Wayne as former Bell coach Edwards portrays him — but also Grady's demeanor. He said his dad was "cut-and-dry, black-and-white, this-is-kind-of-the-way-it-is," but also a "big teddy bear." Dennis admits he just as easily could be describing himself with those words.

"I think he should have been a coach," Dennis said, "and, because of that, everything I did, I wanted to try to make him proud. He was a guy who really didn't show his emotions on the outside. Yet, you always knew. Within the family, there was a lot of love, a lot of caring, a lot of emotion."

Allen grew up 16 miles from Texas Stadium, watching another coach he admired. Dennis' sideline persona sometimes reminds Geoff Allen of Tom Landry.

"I think Dennis is pretty cool all the time," said Geoff, the division chief for Pediatric Critical Care Medicine and the medical director of the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit at Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City.

"He's got a little fire in his belly, but he doesn't get all bent out of shape if things don't flow exactly the way he wants it to. He rolls with that and adapts to what he needs to adapt to. But you're never going to see him wear that outfit Landry did. I don't think he could pull that off."

## Raiders' older Burnett pushes the younger

Kaelin Burnett was an undrafted rookie at the Raiders' training camp last year, talking to his brother on the phone. Kevin, then 29 and almost seven years older, was a starting linebacker for the Miami Dolphins.

"We were talking about how great it would be if we could ever be on the same team," Kaelin said. "Kev said you never know what will happen, and the next year, voila, we're on the same team. ... Dreams do come true."

Kaelin, also a linebacker, has wanted to be like his brother his whole life, and in Sunday's opener, they both will run out of the tunnel in Indianapolis wearing silver and black. Kevin, signed as a free agent, will start; Kaelin is a backup.

They are the 73rd set of brothers to play for the same team in the same season, according to the Pro Football Hall of Fame, and the first to do so for the Raiders.

They will have to buy a lot of tickets for family members this season, but Kaelin said the sticker shock will be well worth it.

"He's the reason I played ball when I was younger," said Kaelin, who grew up in the Los Angeles area. " 'My big brother plays football. I am going to play football, too. My big brother plays linebacker. I am going to play linebacker, too.' "

Kaelin didn't make the cut initially last season, but was placed on the Raiders' practice squad before being called up for the last six games. This year, he wasn't really sweating cut-down day Saturday. He was pretty confident based on how he played this preseason, and so was his family.

"My family felt I did way better this preseason than last preseason," Kaelin said. "They felt I looked the part."

They should know. Older brother Kevin has been an NFL linebacker for eight seasons, and a pretty good, underrated one. Playing for the Cowboys, Chargers and Dolphins, Burnett has made 49 straight starts, and his 311 tackles since 2010 rank 17th in the NFL.

"Kevin's done a nice job," head coach Dennis Allen said. "I think he's an athletic linebacker. I think he fills a leadership role for us on defense, and we expect big things out of Kevin."

And, as you can expect, big brother expects big things out of his little brother. Kevin is often yelling at Kaelin during plays.

"I love it," Kaelin said. "He's helping me with everything, picking up on little keys. ... It's just great having your big brother here looking after you."

Kevin's pretty tough on him, right?

"Yeah, ever since I was young," Kaelin said, "so I am used to it by now." Well ...

"It's hard for him to take," Kevin said, "and hard for him to accept at times. I'm yelling at him while a play is going on, and then after the play, and it bothers him to some extent."

Kaelin has gotten a lot better, improving his hand-placement and pad-level techniques and getting off blocks. But not too quickly.

"Sometimes, I get too hyped up," Kaelin said. "I need to extend them first, use my eyes and see where the play is going and then get to the ball. Body control."

Allen said that Kaelin's "a guy that can run. He's still got a lot of developing that he needs to do, but he has a chance to develop."

Kaelin thinks he got better this preseason, and Kevin agrees.

"He's coming along," Kevin said. "I can't ask anything more of him. He is eager to learn and he wants to be good. He wants to be 100 percent on his assignments. Now it's just doing it over and over again."

When they leave the team facility at night, Kevin lists the things that Kaelin did wrong that day, so Kaelin can come in the next day and address them.

"I don't want to be a repeat-mistake offender," Kaelin said.

But, yes, there are times Kaelin doesn't want to hear what Kevin is saying. Because Kaelin not only grew up wanting to be like his brother, but he wanted to be better.

"It's very competitive, I must say," Kaelin said after a big sigh. "I love competing. We try to keep the smack-talking level down, but I feel like I am going to be a better player than him.

"He always tells me, 'Know your role. I am the big brother.' But I feel like in a few years, teams are going to have to look out for me."

Let you in on a little secret: Kevin wants Kaelin to be better than he is, too.

"I want him to be the best Burnett linebacker," Kevin Burnett. "It's not about who's better than who, it's about reaching your potential. "If his potential is better than (mine), I am going to help him reach that."

Raiders' Houston no longer 'little brother'

ALAMEDA, Calif. – How different will the Oakland Raiders' defense look Sunday?

Consider: Besides there being nine new starters, Lamarr Houston, who is making the switch from left defensive end to the right side, will be the only Raiders defensive player who had a sack last season with Oakland.

Yes, the Raiders had 25 sacks as a team last year, which ranked 31st in the NFL, and Houston tied for the team lead with four. Linebacker Miles Burris, who is on the reserve/physically unable to perform list, added 1.5 sacks. And that's it.

It's no surprise, then, that much is expected this season of Houston, who was voted a team captain along with fullback Marcel Reece and long-snapper Jon Condo.

"Lamarr was a guy that, going into this season, we kind of pegged as a guy that we wanted to be a leader for this team," said Raiders coach Dennis Allen. "He began to take a little bit of that role at the end of last year, and I think he's continued to improve in that regard as we've gone through the offseason and training camp.

"I think he'll continue to develop as a leader for this football team as we go forward."

Selected in the second round of the 2010 draft, Houston immediately made a mark with numerous training camp scraps. But he seemed soft-spoken off the field.

"When I was younger, I had (Richard) Seymour and Tommy (Kelly) here, so I thought I was going to be 'little brother' forever," Houston said with a roaring laugh. "Nah, but as the years have gone by, I could see myself being a captain now. A lot of my teammates respect me and it means a lot to me -- and I'm going to do the best I can to fulfill this role for this team."

So what, exactly, does being tabbed a captain mean to Houston?

"It means it's a lot of responsibility, a lot of respect," he said. "It's a big role to play. It means you're a leader. You basically represent the team when you're a captain, so it's a great honor. But it's more about the team."

And still, there are questions about Houston's skill set, and how it translates to the more pass-rush-emphasized right side.

At 6-feet-3, 300 pounds, Houston is not your stereotypical edge rusher, nor is he a bull-rusher.

"To be honest, I think my skill set fits perfect," he said. "Pass-rushing is about technique; it's not about who's the fastest or who's the strongest. I've been working on that a lot this offseason and it's been showing up in this preseason a little bit and in training camp, so I'm just going to try and build on that and do whatever I can to get better at playing on that right end."

## **Oakland Raiders' Jason Hunter likes living on the edge** By Jerry McDonald

NAPA -- Living life on the edge as a defensive end isn't the most glamorous job in the NFL, but it suits Jason Hunter just fine.

The Raiders' starting left defensive end loves "setting the edge," a part of the game that doesn't carry with it the kind of fame and glory that comes from rushing the passer.

"Basically setting an edge is getting an extension on that tackle and knocking him back, that way it stops the line of scrimmage so the (running) back can't just get to the edge, and it forces him back inside to where the help is," Hunter said.

Setting edges has been an issue for a Raiders defense that has been run-challenged for the better part of the past decade. Right tackle Khalif Barnes, who has worked against Hunter throughout the offseason and training camp, thinks Hunter is more stout than his 6-foot-4, 270-pound build would suggest.

Offensive tackles blocking Hunter typically outweigh him by at least 30 pounds.

"He's thick, powerful, and he may look smaller, but he's very strong and has good hands," Barnes said.

In most cases, if Hunter has done his job, he hasn't made the tackle himself. Rather, he's set up an interior lineman or linebacker to make the hit.

"He's a guy who just tries to do his part," Barnes said. "If you try and do your part and then half of somebody else's, that takes away what you do by half. Do your part. It's a great mindset and the whole team needs to be like that."

Hunter's willingness to set the edge, as well as his work ethic and demeanor, are what led him back to general manager Reggie McKenzie and coach Dennis Allen.

McKenzie was a personnel executive in Green Bay when Hunter played with the Packers as an undrafted free agent out of Appalachian State from 2006 through 2008. When Allen was defensive coordinator in Denver in 2011, Hunter was a reserve defensive end, having played the season before in a 3-4 defense as an outside linebacker.

On a Raiders defensive line that too often has failed in terms of maintaining gaps and position despite having well-regarded talent, Hunter brings a reputation of carrying out his assignments with enthusiasm.

"Jason loves football, and he enjoys competing," Allen said. "He likes the physical aspect of the game where you're not begging Jason to come out here and want to play. You're not begging Jason to get the pads on."

Hunter was particularly excited to get the pads on this season after spending the 2012 season on injured reserve because of a torn triceps. It happened at a time when Hunter had ascended to a starting position under Jack Del Rio, who replaced Allen as defensive coordinator.

The timing could not have been worse.

"It really hurt me, man," Hunter said. "I thought I was having a real good training camp. It was hard, sitting at home, watching on TV and seeing all my peers from around the league playing games. It made me more focused to take care of my body, do the right things."

## **Newcomer Jennings takes sleep seriously**

NAPA – Rashad Jennings takes every precaution he can to keep his body in top shape necessary for an NFL running back.

He eats a gluten-free diet and sticks to organic foods. He stretches every night and has a regular routine of pilates, acupuncture, yoga and massage.

And when the long days at Oakland's training camp are over, instead of settling into a soft bed, the first-year Raider climbs into a hyperbaric oxygen chamber to sleep.

Jennings bought the oxygen chamber as a rookie instead of splurging for a car, thinking it would help keep him fresh and prolong his career.

He admits it "freaks" out some people at first, and the loud noise forced him into a single room in what he calls the "dungeon" of the team hotel at camp.

But Jennings is working on getting some converts, saying at least six teammates are waiting to try out the chamber next week.

"It's not an end-all be-all," Jennings said. "It's not like this is the biggest healer in the world type of thing, but it does heal you on a certain level. It speeds up the process. I love to practice, and I love to stay on the field. It keeps you healthy. Playing this game is important to me. The way I eat and take care of my body is pretty important."

The Raiders are counting on a healthy Jennings as the backup to Darren McFadden, who has never made it through any of his five NFL seasons without an injury.

Playing the role of a backup to a big-play back is something Jennings has plenty of experience doing. He served in that role behind Maurice Jones-Drew in Jacksonville to start his career.

"I tell people all the time there aren't any backups in this league," Jennings said. "The backups are at home. You got to prepare as the starter.

"It's too late to prepare when the opportunity presents itself. I'm a piece of a puzzle. When I'm called upon, I have to make sure I'm making my statement."

Jennings did a good job of that in the preseason opener Friday against Dallas, carrying nine times for 39 yards.

He broke loose for a 16-yard run on a read-option play with quarterback Terrelle Pryor and showed the ability to grind for tough yards, something the Raiders are looking for in McFadden's

backup.

Jennings is working his way back from two disappointing seasons in Jacksonville. After averaging more than five yards a carry in each of his first two seasons, Jennings missed the 2011 season because of a knee injury.

He then struggled mightily last season, averaging 2.8 yards per carry and becoming the 10th back with at least 100 carries to average fewer than three yards since 2000.

"It was a lot of things," Jennings said. "Looking at film, I could've done better, but it's all in the past whatever happened. It's a fresh start as a Raider, and that's what I'm out here to capitalize on."

Jennings entered camp in a competition with sixth-round pick Latavius Murray to be McFadden's backup and seems in position to get that job because of his experience and reliability.

Murray also showed some good signs in the preseason opener, carrying eight times for 29 yards. But he has missed time throughout camp with injuries, to coach Dennis Allen's dismay.

"Being available and being accountable are two things that we have to make sure we're able to be," Allen said.

## Oakland Raiders' Rashad Jennings has a healthy attitude

NAPA -- When Rashad Jennings entered the league, he did what most rookies do when they get their first chunk of money. He indulged in a big-ticket purchase.

Instead of a house for his mother or a fancy car for himself, though, Jennings bought a hyperbaric chamber as a means of helping his body recover quicker and better from the rigors of football.

"I bought one in my rookie year instead of buying a car because I knew this was going to prolong my career," Jennings said.

Sure enough, the day Jennings arrived here for his first training camp with the Raiders, Jennings unloaded the hyperbaric chamber from his car and hauled it up to his hotel room.

The device allows Jennings to sleep in an oxygen-rich environment, which promotes healing of his body. He also is on a gluten-free diet, eats organic foods, stretches every night and delves in yoga, Pilates, acupuncture, whatever has the ability to give him an edge.

The 4-foot-by-9-foot sleeping chamber also tends to make a ton of noise. Hence, Jennings is going solo this year, whereas his teammates share a room with one other player.

In Jennings, the Raiders are confident that they found a back that can make some noise as a replacement for departed veteran Mike Goodson, who served as Darren McFadden's primary backup last season.

The jury is out, for Jennings averaged only 2.8 yards per carry for the Jacksonville Jaguars last season in becoming one of 10 backs since 2000 to average fewer than 3 yards per carry with at least 100 rushes.

Goodson averaged 6.3 last season, though on only 35 carries. He bolted for the New York Jets in free agency. Soon thereafter, the Raiders pounced on Jennings.

Jennings, 6-foot-1 and 231 pounds, views himself as a lead back, though he has spent his entire NFL career backing up Maurice Jones-Drew. He is competing for the backup spot in Oakland against the likes of Jeremy Stewart and rookie Latavius Murray.

"I see myself just as a complete back, day-in, day-out, getting better," Jennings said. "Never making the same mistakes twice. I'll let the geniuses figure out where to put me on the field."

In a recent practice, Jennings was on the field as a short-yardage back. He showed little difficulty in converting third-and-1 plays during the drill.

"He's done some good things for us," Raiders coach Dennis Allen said. "One of the challenges you have for Rashad is ... Rashad's a big back, we want Rashad to play like a big back. That will be something we're going to look at as we go into the preseason is him being that big physical presence that we expect him to be."

So far, Jennings is looking more like the back that averaged 5.2 yards and 5.5 his first two seasons, respectively.

In a strange way, Jennings and the Raiders are alike in that they can't wait to put last year behind them and recapture past glory.

"These fans don't deserve that," Jennings said of the team's negative perception. "This organization doesn't deserve it. The city doesn't deserve it. Nobody on this team thinks that's going to happen this year, and we're going out every single day, erasing what happened from yesterday and preparing and focusing on turning things around."

## Taiwan Jones carving niche at 'gunner'

ALAMEDA, Calif. -- Taiwan Jones, drafted to be a speedy change-of-pace back for Darren McFadden in 2011 before being converted to cornerback this offseason, has found a home on special teams.

And he's made being a gunner on the Raiders' punt-coverage teams somewhat fashionable.

"I think Taiwan Jones, if he's not the best special-teams player in the league, he's one of the best in the league," said Raiders coach Dennis Allen. "He's a difference-maker in all of our coverage units.

"The type of speed that he's got, his willingness to go down and create contact and make tackles ... those are the things that you have to have and I think he's done an outstanding job."

Besides disrupting punt returners, often while being double-teamed, Jones has also flashed his world-class speed. On a trick play against Washington, he took the direct snap from Jon Condo after the Raiders shifted into a formation out of a punt with Jacoby Ford just off center. Jones then sped off for a 19-yard gain and a first down.

And, yes, while there was satisfaction in bursting down the left sideline on that play, his main job description is to blow up punt returns. And the way he's been playing the position of late -- he has five tackles on the season, including two at Kansas City last weekend -- he is getting satisfaction out of it.

"I have a lot of pleasure," he said. "I'm having fun out there. Being a gunner, it's one of those positions where it's not too much scheming; it's just man on man, mano y mano out there, and whoever has the most effort out there is going to win. That's one thing I enjoy."

Sunday, he limited Dexter McCluster to a 1-yard punt return off a Marquette King 50-yard punt in the third quarter before stopping McCluster for a 7-yard gain on a 51-yard King punt in the fourth.

"You've got to watch film," Jones said. "You've got to learn other team's tendencies, key into some of the clues they give you and use them to your advantage."

Jones said his goal is to make the Pro Bowl as a special-teamer.

"I'm shooting to be the best at what I'm doing right now," he said.

Allen obviously believes Jones is coming through on that promise.

"It means a lot because when you're putting it out on the field every day," Jones said, "it's good to see your head coach notice that."

Jones is making it easy for Allen, and opponents, to notice.

Motivated McFadden 'owes Raiders fantastic season'

Darren McFadden hears you talking.

The Raiders feature running back knows you call him injury prone. He knows you think his best football is behind him.

That's okay. Everyone's entitled to an opinion. It won't change the way he plays football.

He takes the negativity, bottles it up and turns it into fuel.

"I feel I've shown glimpses of what I can do," McFadden said, "but I still think my best football is ahead of me."

McFadden has reason to believe a career year is upon him. He's in the best shape of his life. He's working in a downhill, gap-control running scheme that suits his rushing style.

It's tailor-made for McFadden, a fact not lost on the former first-round pick.

"The organization has shown tremendous faith in me, and I'm very grateful for that," McFadden said. "I feel like it shows real faith in me and in this offense as a whole. They clearly have confidence in my ability and what I can do in a downhill running scheme.

I'm so excited to be able to run in this type of offense again. I feel like I owe the Raiders a fantastic season."

McFadden can only do that by staying healthy. He's been hurt in each professional season, making durability the biggest knock on this undeniable talent.

McFadden doesn't like being called injury prone. Hates it in fact. But he doesn't let it psyche him out.

"I just let it roll off my back," McFadden said. "But, at the same time, you can't help but think about it. I don't want to be known or thought of as injury prone, but I have gotten hurt. It's not going to change how I play the game. If I get hurt, then I get hurt. Those things happen. I'm going to play hard."

McFadden is also going to play fast. He has the speed of a less weathered back, the strength of a short-yardage back and the agility of a big-play maker.

Fans haven't seen that because McFadden has been extremely limited during a preseason where

health is the only concern. Coaches have.

"I see the speed, I see that from Darren McFadden," Raiders offensive coordinator Greg Olson said. "We haven't gotten into any real live performance where he's going to go in an carry it 20 times a game but I don't see wear and tear on this running back, I don't see a decline in speed.

"We'll get a chance to see when the regular season gets going but we still believe that we have a real fine running back."

McFadden didn't live up to that billing last season. He averaged a career-worst 3.3 yards per carry and scored just three touchdowns. Then-coordinator Greg Kanpp's zone-blocking became the scapegoat for such a performance, especially after McFadden averaged 5.3 yards per carry in the two previous seasons.

The scheme was a source of aggravation for McFadden and the offense. He admits the season wore on his psyche.

McFadden enters this season with renewed optimism about this team.

"I think we're being underestimated," McFadden said. "We're better than most people think. I think we'll win some games and prove some of our doubters wrong."

McFadden is speaking for the Raiders and himself. He considers this the most important season of his career. A second straight bomb will kill his street cred and his earning power.

He enters a contract year looking for one more big payday. He prefers his checks signed by a Davis. If he doesn't perform, that won't happen. If he doesn't perform well, a long-term contract is out of the cards, maybe forever.

"It's going to enhance your motivation. How could it not?" McFadden said. "It's in the back of your head, but I'm still focused on football. I know that, if I take care of business on the field, everything else will fall in line."

This training camp hasn't lined up perfectly. His best blocker, left tackle Jared Veldheer, is lost until midseason. The interior line is in flux and Menelik Watson is playing out of position. Despite a radical change in scheme, the stars haven't aligned.

Having quarterback Terrelle Pryor should take some pressure off McFadden and the run game, but the world still knows No. 20 is gettin' the rock. While Pryor steals headlines, McFadden's the real marquee player. Without him, the offense can't survive.

McFadden is ready, willing and able to shoulder such responsibility.

"I feel as good as I ever have," McFadden said. "I'm 26 years old, but I still feel young. I feel like it shows when I'm on the field. I can still go out and fly around and make big plays. I'm always going to give my team maximum effort. I go all out on every play."

## Raiders' Matt McGloin helped Penn State program rally

ALAMEDA -- In the wake of Penn State's Jerry Sandusky scandal, the football program had been put through the wringer: scholarship and financial penalties, bowl game bans, transfers galore. No one gave the once-storied Nittany Lions any chance for success.

In other words, it was a situation made for Raiders rookie quarterback Matt McGloin.

"It played right into his underdog story," said Penn State tackle Eric Shrive, a college and high school teammate of McGloin's in Scranton, Pa. "We knew we were in a tough situation, but we weren't going to be anybody's charity case.

"People didn't think we were any good, and Matt was going out there to prove he was the best quarterback in the Big Ten."

McGloin led the Nittany Lions to an 8-4 record under coach Bill O'Brien to help keep the program afloat.

Tennessee Titans coach Mike Munchak, a Penn State alum raised in Scranton, praised McGloin in a conference call for "being a big part in holding that place together in one of the biggest years in Penn State history."

A year later, McGloin is attempting to resuscitate the fortunes in Oakland with a franchise on its 15th starting quarterback since 2004.

In leading the Raiders to a 28-23 win over Houston, and throwing three touchdown passes in his starting debut, McGloin surprised just about everybody except those who have witnessed his magic before in Scranton or State College, Pa.

The quarterback who wasn't invited to the NFL scouting combine and not selected in the draft gets another shot Sunday when the Raiders (4-6) face the Titans (4-6) at O.co Coliseum in a battle between two teams on the outer fringe of the wild-card race.

"The mindset I've always had is that I never took a back seat to anybody," McGloin said. "I really don't look at who is ahead of me on the depth chart or behind me. I figure each day is a chance to get better, improve as a leader. Now that I'm starting, that hasn't changed."

McGloin beat out an incumbent quarterback as a sophomore at West Scranton High, beating a Crestwood team with a 25-game win streak in his varsity debut. He would go on to win two district championships. He was also the star of the baseball and basketball teams, serving as a pitcher, infielder and point guard.

"He was the guy throwing the touchdown pass, making the big shot or hitting the home run, and his attitude was always the same," Shrive said. "He had that chip on his shoulder where he'd think, "You don't think I'm good enough? Then just watch.' "

At 6-foot-1, McGloin was considered a Division I-AA prospect at best and was under the radar in part because of Raiders teammate Terrelle Pryor, who was the nation's top recruit and played in the same state at Jeannette High.

While Penn State awaited word on Pryor (who eventually went to Ohio State), McGloin accepted an invitation as a preferred walk-on.

McGloin's father, Paul McGloin, asked Matt what he would do if Pryor came to Penn State.

"He said, 'I'd wish him luck,' " Paul McGloin Sr. said, "then I'll go out there and show people what I can do.' "

Other more decorated quarterbacks came and went, but it was McGloin who ended up a two-year starter, completing 57.4 percent of his passes for 6,390 yards and 46 touchdowns.

McGloin's performance against Houston enhanced his legend in Scranton, a blue collar community that supports its own with a fervor bordering on fanatical.

When Scranton native Gerry McNamara played basketball at Syracuse, it took 50 buses to bring the town's well-wishers to the Carrier Dome for his senior night in 2006. Two of the kids on the bus were Shrive and McGloin, later high school and college teammates.

Paul and Cathy McGloin have owned and operated a Main Street Floral shop in Scranton for 34 years. All week, people have honked, waved and come in to the shop to talk about Matt.

During a meal at a diner on Mike Munchak Way in Scranton, Cathy McGloin said in a phone interview the community reaction has been overwhelming.

"It's been crazy," Cathy McGloin said. "People stop us in church and the grocery store. Everybody is waving, beeping the horn. Two nice people just stopped to say congratulations to my son. This is what Scranton's all about."

The McGloins opened their doors to as many friends as they could cram into their house to watch the Raiders-Texans game on NFL Ticket.

"Everyone was screaming, kissing, giving high-fives, jumping up and down," Cathy McGloin said.

Paul McGloin said Matt owes much of his competitive nature to his older brothers, Paul Jr. and John. Each brother is separated by seven years, with Paul Jr. old enough at 14 to change his baby brother's diapers when Matt was born.

The brothers never took it easy on Matt.

"My mother used to yell at us all the time, 'Can't you let him win just once?' " John McGloin said. "We'd say, 'Absolutely not. He's never going to learn if you think that way.' "

Said Paul McGloin Jr.: "I used to say he was competitive to a fault. If I beat him in basketball, he wouldn't talk to me for a few hours."

The McGloin brothers still send Matt near-daily reminders about dedication and focus.

"He's to the point now where he'll sass back and answer, "Hey, I'm working! You don't need to tell me that,' "John McGloin said.

Paul McGloin Jr., a scout for the New York Yankees, has talked often with Matt about his mental approach and said, "I don't think he steps back and looks at the magnitude of the situation and what it means."

Raiders center Stefen Wisniewski played with McGloin for three years at Penn State and said he's the same guy in an NFL huddle as he was in college.

"He was always so confident -- so confident we joked about how confident he was," Wisniewski said. "That's the way he handles himself. Players love him. He's everything you want in a quarterback."

## Life lessons have only strengthened Sio Moore

Sio Moore was given a second chance at life. Not everyone does, just look at yesterdays tragedy for an example of two athletes that weren't granted that luxery. Texas A&M redshirt freshman Polo Manukainiu and Utah incoming freshman recruit Gaius "Keio" Vaenuku lost their lives in a car crash yesterday. Sadly all we can do at moments like this is let them truly remind us of how lucky we are to be alive.

Sio doesn't need the reminder even if some of us do forget how lucky we are from time to time. No, Sio Moore already lives his life knowing how close it was to being taken away. He has used his near death experience as motivation, always remembering how just a shake of his head could have taken his life.

Moore's family is originally from Liberia, a country torn by a Civil War that got so bad that his parents migrated to the US in 1990. Ironically they took him from a true war zone in Liberia, to one that he put himself squarely in the middle of by associating with the wrong crowd.

Sio knows now that the people he was with were not who he belonged around. He was risking himself by being in the wrong places at the wrong times and it took a near death experience to awaken his inner warrior. He was just 14 and at a party that had just been shutdown. It was here where he had his moment of change. It came from a gunman firing at the back of his head as he fled for his life.

"I wasn't hanging around the right people," Moore told New Haven Register columnist Chip Malafronte "I was getting myself into situations I shouldn't have been in. It took a near-death event for me to realize the path I was going down was the wrong one."

"A bullet went right by my right ear and hit a car next to me," Moore said. "That haunted me for a good while. I kept thinking about it. What if I turned around at the wrong time? That bullet would have hit me in the head."

After that day Sio stopped hanging out with that crowd, he realized he must live better, and he uprooted himself on his own to make his desire for a better life a reality. He picked up the phone and he called his sister Tiplah Broadnax who is 19 years his senior and her husband Grady. He asked them if he could live with them, and then Sio promptly moved many miles away from where that speeding bullet almost took his life.

Our own Levi Damien recently interviewed Sio and he asked about that moment. Its easy to see what we all like so much about Moore when you read his response.

"Yeah, man. 100 percent. My life could have been changed multiple times. That was only once. I had Civil War broken out in 1990, I would have never came to the U.S. There are so many things

that I'm thankful for, blessings and things around me."

Though the attempt at his life was plenty enough of a life changing event to change Sio deep within his soul, it would still not be all that he would face. Even after he made his way out of the life he was living and onto Connecticut University's football roster the fates would still test him more.

The new test would come at the expense of another young man who was cut down mercilessly and unjustly, though this was no accident like what took the lives of Polo and Keio. The test would come at the expense of a teammate, a leader of the Husky defense, and a friend who was succeeding at life in a way few are lucky enough to experience. The test would come at the expense of UConn DB Jasper Howard, who was stabbed to death in a senseless crime that happened on campus in 2009.

Now Sio Moore lives life to the absolute fullest. He carries a reminder of his friend Jasper with him everywhere, he has a tattoo in memory of him across his mid-section in the same area that Howard was stabbed in. Its another reminder of the pain he has gone through that has strengthened his resolve, the same as another tattoo that depicts his life without his father has.

Though those tattoos remind him of the pain he felt, there is also hope and love deeply involved in them. The hope in the tattoo of Jasper is the hope of honoring his lost friend, the hope of living his life in a way that would make Jasper proud. It's a reminder to never again take his life for granted, which is a hope that we could all use instilled in us.

The tattoo about his father has a man and a boy standing next to each other with a space between their reached out hands, which Sio says is to symbolize his non-relationship with his own dad. The hope is there though still because he plans on uniting the hands the day he has a child. The tattoo is there to remind himself to be a better father than the one he had, which is a hope that many people understand more than words can express.

Seeing the strength of Sio's commitment to life is what so many of us are drawn to. We don't know yet if he will be able to play in the NFL, but he gives every reason there is to believe he can. He is the change we need in this franchise and the hope we all have for the Raiders future. Its a lot of pressure but it feels right to put it on Moore's shoulders. After all, his life has shown that he is already a man that refuses to break.

#### For Pryor, challenge of being first-time starter extends beyond field

It's midday of an October Friday, and with the Raiders in their bye week after losing four of their first six games, many players have left town to recharge and regroup. Quarterback Terrelle Pryor isn't among them. He's spent this morning at the team's training facility in Alameda, Calif., devouring digital cut-ups for things to work on, most notably not drifting in the pocket when taking snaps from shotgun formations.

Despite showing promise over the first half of the season -- his 58.9 completion percentage tops that of Andrew Luck, Tom Brady and Eli Manning, for instance, and his 63 rushing yards per game lead all quarterbacks -- he has been sloppy as times, especially in the previous Sunday's 24-7 loss at Kansas City. So he grabs a football and corrals quarterbacks coach John DeFillipo and prepares to head out back to an empty practice field, only to receive word from GM Reggie McKenzie that the impromptu session was impermissible because it would violate the collective bargaining agreement, which requires players to have four consecutive off days during the bye week.

Undeterred, Pryor tucks the ball and relocates to an off-site field where he practices his drops until his quads burn and sweat beads roll down his face. Then he slides into his sleek black Mercedes coupe and heads to his townhouse at the end of a cul-de-sac in the Oakland Hills. The view is spectacular. From the living room he can see the Bay Bridge to the right, and past it, San Francisco, partially hidden by a low marine layer. In the valley below sits antiquated O.co Coliseum, where he plays home games and two weeks prior led a stunning late-night upset of the Chargers, in which he completed 18-of- 23 passes for 221 yards, two scores and a 135.7 passer rating.

But football is the last thing on this 24-year-old's mind right now; his body is tired, his head sleepy. He has put in more practice hours and taken more game snaps in the first six weeks of 2013 than he did in his first two years combined, when he was a backup. He wants to nap as he unfolds his 6-foot-4, 233-pound frame over a white leather chair, but he's unable to do so because punter Marquette King, a close friend, and marketing manager Tyler Acevedos are visiting. A national media outlet also is calling repeatedly in hopes of setting up a photo shoot the next day, and two other journalists from another national magazine are waiting to conduct a previously scheduled interview.

Such are the blessings and curses of being a starting quarterback in the NFL. For Pryor, who entered the league as a third-round supplemental draft choice in 2011, his time was basically his own his first two seasons. He was third on the depth chart, which meant he was basically invisible to coaches, whose time was spent preparing the starter and, to a lesser extent, the backup each week. But that changed before the season opener, when Pryor beat out Matt Flynn for the starting job. After doing only a handful of interviews each of his first two seasons, he received 50-75 requests in the first week he was formally named the starter. His life has not been

the same since.

Over the first eight weeks of the season Pryor provided SI with a behind-the-scenes glimpse of what young quarterbacks face when becoming a full-time starter for the first time. Talents such as Andrew Luck, Robert Griffin III and Russell Wilson made it look easy last year, when they led their clubs to the playoffs as rookies. But the challenges are significant. The most notable for Pryor were learning to manage his time and outsiders' expectations; establishing himself as a leader; and dealing with adversity.

If Pryor didn't realize the responsibility that comes with being the face of a franchise beforehand, he did early in the season when a fan approached him. Like most who run into the former Ohio State star around town, the fan just wanted to say hello and offer a few words of encouragement. But this time was different because the fan became overly emotional. Tears ran down his face as he thanked Pryor for bringing hope to a franchise that has not had a winning season since 2002. Pryor didn't know how to respond. This was deeper than football. He knew the pain of losing a game, but seeing someone who had lost hope -- and now rediscovered it -- was a sobering lesson that he was accountable not only to his teammates and coaches, but also a fan base starved for success.

Pryor smiled and hugged the fan. Football players often are erroneously viewed as brutes who lack compassion, but the exchange clearly resonated with Pryor. Since leaving Ohio State a year early after being suspended for receiving improper benefits, he has become more spiritual and appreciative of friends and supporters. It's common for him to tell friends to text him when they get home so he knows that they've arrived safely. He is similarly concerned when it comes to his team, which he's learned leads to physical and mental fatigue.

That wasn't an issue his first two seasons, when he was the forgotten man as the No. 3 QB. He knew there was virtually no chance of playing on Sundays, so he would arrive at the Raiders' headquarters shortly before the first meeting and head home almost immediately after the last one. He worked hard in between, but when the work day was over he often was home by 3:30 or 4 p.m., stretched out on the couch, watching a movie or fiddling with a Madden controller. "I figured, 'Hey, if they don't want me to play ...'" said Pryor, who now can be found at the facility from 5:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.

The "office" has become a sanctuary for Pryor, who has become a target since moving into the starting lineup. People want to greet him, take a picture, get an autograph. Now, if he's in the mood for relative privacy, for a dinner without interruption, as he was three nights before a Week 4 game against Washington, he'll drive 20 miles east, through the Caldecott Tunnel, to the less intrusive suburb of Walnut Creek. But even there he's not entirely safe. His waiter at an upscale steak house gets tongue-tied discussing the specials because, he says, he's a huge Raiders fan; his mom even worked at a popular sports bar frequented by Raiders fans.

The reality is that there's no place for Pryor to hide, not even in his own locker room. Quarterbacks face more scrutiny than any other player. He's the person who sets the tone for the team, and how he handles a difficult situation --a loss, an injury, a locker room issue -- could have a ripple effect. If he is lackadaisical in his approach, others might be as well. If he takes short cuts, they might too.

That lesson was driven home early this season after Pryor was late for an offensive meeting because, well, he needed a few extra minutes in the bathroom. Irritated by this, offensive coordinator Greg Olson let him have it. Olson, who is liked and respected by his players, demands accountability from them. In this instance he reminded Pryor that everything he does has consequences, good or bad. If the starting quarterback doesn't think it's important to be at a meeting on time, regardless of the reason, then why would someone else?

Now, Pryor says he's so aware of Olson's words that he hesitates to hit the head even when he has the urge.

In most organizational models, the quarterback sits at the top of the pyramid when it comes to players. He's the guy who sets the tone and holds others accountable. But if you're Pryor, and you've had only one start coming into this season, how do you lead when all you've done for two years is follow? How do you make your voice ring resoundingly when for two years your role was to be seen and not heard?

"There's a respect factor involved," Pryor said. "I like to challenge everyone on the team, not just the offense. But in the beginning I couldn't do that because -- imagine that you're [defensive end] Lamarr Houston and you're a solid player, been in the league four years, one of the team captains, you've got respect in the game, and I come up to you and say, 'Hey, pick up practice.' You would look at me sideways and smirk. But if you earn your way and you get a little respect and you go up to him and say that same thing, it's different. He'll respond."

But how best to do that? Working hard and making plays are definite requirements, but there's so much more to being someone who commands respect in and outside the locker room. Lamonte Winston, the Raiders' Director of Player Engagement, has been instrumental in helping to develop Pryor as a leader. He studies him during practice and games and meets with him weekly to discuss the necessary characteristics of being an effective leader. Their early talks dealt with being a professional and managing the media. Look reporters in the eyes, Winston said. Keep your head up. If you've got a baseball cap on, raise the bill so people can see your face, he said. He reminded Pryor that the media were there to see and hear him, so don't act like it's an imposition to be there. Engage them.

Later their conversations turned to things that happened in the game. Winston can recall an early-season matchup in which Pryor was upset about something that happened on the field and vented as he came to the sideline. The rant didn't stop there, however. Pryor kept venting for everyone to hear. The next week Winston informed him that the behavior would push away teammates instead of unifying them. Pryor took the words to heart and has since been much more conscious of his words and actions in the heat of the battle.

"Terrelle is a very conscientious young man," Winston said. "He wants to do well. He wants to be really, really good. The thing he had to learn was that when you sit in the captain's chair as a quarterback, all eyes are on you. There's a default look that we all have when you think nobody is looking at you, and he didn't know that he had that. I said, 'How you carry yourself is important.' It's an unwritten part of the job, but it's there. If you don't play well, you should have the same confidence and look and approach to folks as when you do play well. We have to assume our responsibility. People want to see the consistency in your personality. That's the development of a great leader. Once Terrelle understands something from a trusted source, he'll do whatever it

takes to change."

Pryor now has earned the right to have his voice heard in practice and meetings. He has no reservations about speaking up or speaking out. In practice, when the tempo is lacking, or he sees an offensive lineman dragging and sucking air, he'll sprint downfield after a handoff even if the play doesn't call for him to do so. Then he'll hustle back to the huddle, showing his teammates that he's willing to do more than what's asked of him. That he's holding himself accountable.

"I try to pick guys up and make them play to a level of expectation," he said. "I feel like I have a connection with everyone on the team, that I can challenge them without them taking it wrong. I challenge them to be great."

After a Week 1 loss to Indianapolis, which concluded with him throwing an interception at the Colts' six-yard line in the final minute with the Raiders trailing by four, Pryor was more angry than disappointed. He felt he had lost the game not by throwing the pick, but by taking a 16-yard sack two plays earlier, on first-and-goal from the 8. When told afterward that Indy's coaches were effusive in their praise of him, he said: "Tell them they won't beat me again. ... They got lucky."

Cocky or confident, it was just the right tone for a team seeking a return to relevance. If he didn't believe it, why should his teammates?

Winston thinks it's working, and he points to the reception Pryor received two weeks later when, after sitting out Wednesday and Thursday practices while recovering from a concussion, he returned to the field on Friday. Offensive linemen stopped what they were doing and approached the QB. It was a sign that they not only cared about him, but they trusted him as the guy to lead Oakland back to respectability.

"It was so awesome that I brought it up to him later," Winston said. "I wanted him to understand what had happened. That was a huge moment. When nobody was looking, when it was just him and his offensive line, there was that bonding moment. How great was that?"

It's a harsh reality of the NFL: First-rounders and high-price free agents traditionally get more time to work through their struggles because their teams have made significant investments in them. But when you're someone like Pryor, a third- round supplemental pick who early on had the stigma of the Ohio State scandal attached to his back, your opportunities aren't usually as plentiful. A few bad performances, an injury and -- who knows?

Pryor was reminded of this on the evening of Oct. 5, while communicating with fans on Instagram. He had played reasonably well in the Raiders' first three games -- a close loss to Indy, a win over Jacksonville and a loss at high-powered Denver -- but now fans were asking him about the Raiders' reported interest in QB Josh Freeman, who had been released by Tampa Bay two days earlier. Pryor was blind-sided.

"When I heard about it, I'm like, 'Geez, I haven't played terribly,' " Pryor said the following night after an impressive showing in the win over San Diego. "The two losses -- Indianapolis and Denver, are two of the top teams in the league. I was thinking, Maybe they [the fans] don't like

me."

Pryor smiled as he said it, but McKenzie, who was not with the team when Pryor was drafted, wasn't joking when he said after the San Diego victory that his job is to assemble the best 53-man roster possible, then let players compete for playing time. In the Raiders' eyes, Pryor remains raw, particularly as a passer. That's not surprising considering he averaged just 159 pass attempts over his three seasons at Ohio State. Pryor's strength always has been his dynamic running ability, and the hope in Oakland is that he will one day complement that with an improved passing game.

In the meantime, they remain non-committal on him longterm (he's in Year 3 of a four-year rookie deal). They need to see more plays like this one against the Chargers: Midway through the fourth quarter, San Diego had cut Oakland's 24-3 lead to a touchdown. The Chargers had momentum and the Raiders faced 3rd-and-14 at their own 41; a defensive stop would've given San Diego great field position for a potential tying score. Instead, Pryor eluded a would-be sack in the pocket, sprinted to his right and lasered a 19-yard completion to Brice Butler. Four plays later, Sebastian Janikowski kicked a 50-yard field goal for a comfortable two-score lead.

Still, it's games like the following week's loss at Kansas City that give Oakland pause. There, Pryor was sacked nine times and threw three interceptions, one more than he accumulated in his first four games combined. The QB easily could've pointed to his third-string center and left tackle or to his reserve right/left guard, but Pryor put the performance on his own shoulders. He missed protection calls at times and forced plays at others.

"We were down 14-7 and we were getting first downs, but every time we got near the 50 we had to punt," he said. "Their quarterback, Alex Smith, was managing the game better than me, checking down and moving the chains. So, I was like, I've got to make something happen. I've got to make something happen. I've got guys who look up to me as a leader, and they're saying they need me to make a play. I got caught up in that trap and tried to do more than I should have."

Raiders coach Dennis Allen has said on multiple occasions that one of the things he likes about Pryor is his ability to learn from his mistakes, and the first-year starter's words suggest the coach is on to something. "I truly believe [we were] meant to run into Kansas City this early so I could learn and understand situations," Pryor said. "Managing the game is going to come up at important times. I don't know when or where, but I know it will be important."

The words proved prophetic following the bye, when the Raiders held off the Steelers after building a 21-3 lead. But the past two weeks have involved more learning and more growing pains, first a 49-20 loss to the Eagles and a 24-20 defeat against the Giants. Pryor struggled against Philadelphia and failed to finish the game because of a knee injury. It wasn't the first time he had dealt with adversity, and it won't be the last. (Pryor faces another challenge this week as the knee injury suffered against the Eagles continues to plague him.) The unanswered question is, how will he handle it? Before finally taking a nap during the bye week, he addressed the ups and downs of being a young starting quarterback as follows:

"I'm enjoying the process of getting better," he said. "I know I'm not the greatest, but I kind of amuse myself in my mind by acting like I am. That's how you've got to be. That's the first step to achieving your goal. There are so many things you have to deal with as a young quarterback that

if you don't believe in yourself, who will?

#### Raiders' Marcel Reece not looking for leading role

ALAMEDA -- Chances are Marcel Reece will again recede into the background with leading rusher Rashad Jennings having recovered from a concussion.

Having played in less than half of the Raiders' offensive snaps this season, Reece by necessity was on the field for all but two snaps in a 37-27 loss to the New York Jets.

The result was 19 carries, a career high 123 yards rushing, acknowledgment of a job well done and likely an immediate future of being shuttled on and off the field depending on the down, distance and play call when the Raiders play the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday at O.co Coliseum.

Yet Reece has no illusions of morphing from versatile fullback to lead tailback.

"I don't worry about that, I don't think about that," Reece said Wednesday. "The two initials next to your name on the roster mean nothing. I don't worry about my position. I just worry about making plays for my team and helping us win.

"Whatever these coaches need me to do, whatever my team needs me to do, I'm going to do it."

When the Raiders needed Reece to do everything against the Jets, he was up to the task, with the highlight being a 63- yard touchdown run that jump-started a sagging offense.

"He had to carry a load," Jennings said. "He had to block and run deep routes and churn out tough yards. He had a big run through an arm tackle before showing his speed."

A college wide receiver at Washington, Reece retains those skills in a 6-foot-1, 255-pound frame to go along with reasonable success running from scrimmage despite minimal work as a lead runner.

Reece did have a four-game stretch last season where he rushed 54 times for 261 yards when Darren McFadden and Mike Goodson were out with injuries, then carried only four times in the last four games of the season when they were healthy.

With McFadden missing practice Wednesday with an ankle injury and not likely to face the Chiefs, Reece will spell Jennings as the lead runner.

"When he has gone into the game, he has had some success," Raiders coach Dennis Allen said. "He's a pretty patient runner, has pretty decent vision. I thought he did a great job on the long run of being able to hit the hole and split the seam. He probably doesn't have that explosive, breakaway type of speed, but nobody was catching him."

If Reece has any thoughts on gaining a rhythm as a runner with more work, he hides them by putting up a team-first front.

"I don't really think about it as an individual," Reece said. "It is important for us to get into rhythm as an offense, to stay on schedule. To get three, four yards on first down, to keep things manageable on third down so they can't get into those abstract blitzes. Our playbook opens up. As an individual you really don't think about it."

#### Roach at the middle of revival of Raiders' D

ALAMEDA, Calif. – The improvement of the Oakland Raiders' defense has been as stunning as it has been rebuilt.

With 10 new starters, the Raiders just a few weeks ago had the 10th-ranked defense in the NFL (the anomaly that was the blowout loss to Philadelphia has them at No. 17 overall now), and they currently have the No. 6 rushing defense. Last year, Oakland was 18th against the run.

At the center of this Raiders revival is their new middle linebacker, Nick Roach. A year after Oakland finally gave up on a failed first-round draft pick in Rolando McClain, Roach has been a model of consistency. And calm.

"Nick is amazing in how fast he can go to the next play," Raiders defensive coordinator Jason Tarver said. "He's just onto the next play. He will align guys and use his rules.

"The guys that can focus in the moment like that are special, and he's special that way. He can just flush whatever has happened [and] go onto the next play, which allows you to do those things. It really does."

Roach spent his first six seasons with the Chicago Bears, where he was primarily a strongside linebacker. He signed a free-agent deal with the Raiders in March and moved to the middle, and he now leads the team with 68 tackles (48 solo) and has two sacks.

Perhaps more impressive is the fact that he has yet to come off the field, having played all 688 snaps this season, per Pro Football Focus.

## Roach shrugged.

"I feel like that's just part of the job description," he said. "I wouldn't like to come off the field at any point. I realize that it's a blessing to be able to play all the snaps because things happen that are out of your control all the time. So hopefully I've been able to take advantage of it to the fullest so far."

There have been no complaints.

"Beyond being a good player, Nick's a good person," said rookie linebacker Sio Moore. "I think that's what correlates to his field play and, really, how he prepares, how he goes about his business on the field. I sit next to him every day, so I try and take something from him every day.

"He doesn't say much. He just goes out there and is effective."

Indeed. In last week's win over the Houston Texans, Roach got his first career interception when he picked off Case Keenum with about four minutes to go in the first quarter. The takeaway set the Raiders up at the Texans' 16-yard line, and one play later, Matt McGloin hit Rod Streater for a touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

"Every dog has his day," Roach said. "I'll put it that way."

Especially if said dog plays every snap.

#### Raiders' Roach masters art of leading the defense

Nick Roach grew up drawing pictures and went on to earn a degree in art theory and practice at Northwestern. He's always working on a sketch in his mind, and the one of his budding football career is finally ready to hang on the wall. Seven years along, the last details and shadings are becoming clear as he leads a resurgent Raiders defense.

Oakland, which hosts Philadelphia (3-5) Sunday, is a surprising 3-4 largely on the back of its defense. Safety Charles Woodson is the one star, but the other pistons have been firing pretty well, too - and Roach, the once-undrafted middle linebacker, is the fuel and air.

Roach calls the plays, and he is adept at both run defense and pass coverage.

"He is the leader of the defense," defensive end Lamarr Houston said. "He runs the whole machine. He is the guy behind the curtains, and he never shies away from it."

The Raiders, sixth in the NFL in run defense, have held three opponents under 40 yards rushing after doing that just four times in the previous 10 seasons. Oakland also blitzes often and from everywhere, and already has 21 sacks after having 25 all of last season.

The biggest difference is Roach - and the guy he replaced. Rolando McClain, the Raiders' first-round pick in 2010, was supposed to be everything Roach is now, only in a bigger package. But McClain struggled on the field and was often in trouble off it. The Raiders have 10 new starters on defense now, and the one holdover, Houston, acknowledged the importance of the McClain-to-Roach transition.

"It is different, it is," Houston said. "That was the point of them going out and getting guys that will fit in and do what they're supposed to, understand what they're supposed to do and how they're supposed to do it.

"That's a testimony to (general manager) Reggie McKenzie and (coach) Dennis Allen as to how they put this team together."

Roach got a four-year contract on a defense largely consisting of one-year free agents. He wasn't

daunted by the task of strangers coming together to play defense, taking a direct, humble, hardworking approach at training camp. Roach admitted his mistakes and implored teammates to grow together.

"Defense isn't about how many guys have been together before," Roach said. "It's just if guys have played good football before. Guys wanted to win, and that was the foundation."

Roach has spent seven years building his own foundation, going from an undrafted player out of Northwestern to the Chargers' practice squad in 2007 before getting picked up by the Bears.

He was a backup, an outside linebacker and a middle linebacker when Brian Urlacher was hurt. Then he packed up the RV and headed west when Oakland signed him this offseason.

McKenzie, Allen and defensive coordinator Jason Tarver loved Roach's understated approach, intelligence and underrated playmaking ability. The one question mark was if Roach was, at 6-foot-1, 234 pounds, a bit undersized for a middle linebacker, but Tarver shook his head.

"Undersized is one thing, and the ability to get off the block is another," Tarver said. "Nick knows how to use his hands and has long arms for his body.

"You can look at the guys I was around before, Patrick Willis and NaVorro Bowman - Nick is a little bit lighter than those guys, but they're similar in arm length so they can shed and get off blocks."

Roach was a running back in high school, and can still find the open space as a linebacker.

"He's been a pleasant surprise," former Eagles scout and radio analyst John Middlekauf said. "He was a demon on special teams when we used to play the Bears, and now he is a consistent, efficient tackler."

Roach has a team-high 39 tackles, according to Pro Football Focus, to go along with a sack, eight quarterback hurries and two forced fumbles.

"We put a lot on him," Allen said. "He's accepted that challenge, and I think he's been an outstanding player for us."

#### Jason Tarver uses passion to vault Raiders' no-name defense

Jason Tarver has never been more popular, a product of being famous and infamous at the same time.

The Raiders defensive coordinator has received praise for vaulting a no-name defense (save Charles Woodson, of course) into the NFL's top 10. His inventive blitz schemes have helped exceed expectations as the Raiders push for a .500 record Sunday against the Philadelphia Eagles.

Oh, and he may have flipped off some game officials. And was caught on camera. He now has a commemorative hashtag on Twitter. There may or may not be T-shirts.

#Tarvering is just a fad. His defensive scheme is not. Neither is his passion for the game or his desire to win or his defense's faith in the Tarver way.

While a momentary lapse in judgment wasn't condoned, those who know him best didn't vilify it.

"The only thing I'll say is I think he's done an outstanding job with this defense," Raiders coach Dennis Allen said a day after the incident. "I think he's a fiery and emotional guy, and I think our players have really taken to that. I think they've embraced that type of attitude, and I think he's got the defense playing at a high level right now."

Allen said it best. Tarver coaches with passion. His defense plays with it.

The often-wacky, never-dull, always-engaging 39-year old Bay Area native drives his players to do so. The man many call the "mad scientist" – Tarver has a master's degree in molecular biology and biochemistry. True story. And he wouldn't have it any other way.

"I think that D.A. [Dennis Allen] gave me a great compliment Monday when he said that I coach with passion," Tarver said after Thursday's practice. "If you're going to do anything in life, you want to be the best. Why limit yourself?

"That's what we talk to the players about. We say, 'You guys can run and you're smart and you love this game, so if you love this game why limit yourself? Why say, 'I can't do that,' ever?"

Pundits said the Raiders wouldn't be able to keep up on defense. Not with nine (now 10) new starters. Not without young star power. Not with so much dead money spent on castaways.

The Raiders ignored all that. They kept their heads down and worked and grew and learned to play as one. Now they're showered with compliments. The Raiders are 10th in total defense and sixth against the run. They have 11 takeaways in five games. They have 21 sacks from 14

different defenders.

That's part personnel, part belief in the scheme.

"J.T. gives everybody confidence that they can make a play," linebacker Sio Moore said. "If you buy in and work hard, he'll you in position to make a game-changing moment."

That's the message given to his charges, with aforementioned numbers to support it.

"There are no perfect calls; there's only perfect execution," Tarver said. "That's how we approach it. We say, 'Hey look, do your job. Do your job, and do it with that kind of passion.' If you're not doing it with passion, you're going to hear about it, but there are very few of our guys who are that way.

"That's why we're thankful to (general manager Reggie McKenzie and Allen) for who they brought in and who they keep bringing in, because these guys want to be great. Greatness is not one thing. It sure as heck doesn't have to do with me. I don't cross that white line. I don't play. My job is just to put them in position to make plays."

Tarver gets excited when they do. Raw passion comes out in practice and occasionally on the sidelines, where he has to rein himself in. He failed to do so when cornerback Mike Jenkins was improperly flagged against Pittsburgh for striking a defenseless receiver. A middle finger came flying out, an act of frustration normally dealt with in other ways.

"Well, you better have just an outlet (for the emotion)," Tarver said. "I'll quickly take a deep breath or say something, and then you go to the next play. I mean, that's what happens, so that's it. You've got to let it go. You breathe; you go to the next play."

Tarver finds solace in the film room, where it's crystal clear he's doing something right.

That was evident after Jenkins sniffed out a screen pass in the first quarter of Sunday's game versus Pittsburgh and made a terrific open-field tackle that forced a punt. Before Jenkins could get up, the entire defense mobbed him in celebration.

Tarver watched that play again and loved everything about it. Great read, flawless execution and, most importantly, everybody reveled in a job well done.

"That moment is what it's all about," Tarver said. "When we put on our black jerseys, that's what we want to do. We want every guy to be on the screen at the end of every play and enjoy the heck out of playing football."

**Raiders' mad scientist of defense: Tarver has Oakland on upswing**Jerry McDonald

Jason Tarver recalls meeting with 49ers general manager Bill Walsh, coach Steve Mariucci and front office executive Bill McPherson in 2001, hoping to get a job as a low-level assistant coach.

His résumé included a master's degree in biochemistry and molecular biology and an award bestowed by the UCLA chemistry department for distinguished teaching in biochemistry.

All which of made Walsh wonder why Tarver was sitting at the table.

"The first thing he asked me was, 'Why don't you go out and invent something?' " Tarver said.

A dozen years later, Tarver, in his second season as defensive coordinator, has helped reinvent the way the Raiders play defense.

Quarterbacks Philip Rivers of San Diego and Alex Smith of Kansas City came out of games against the Raiders talking about the confusing array of blitzes and alignments thrown their way.

Long a four-man rush team with press coverage influenced by the late Al Davis, the Raiders under Tarver and coach Dennis Allen are mixing coverages, blitzing often and seldom showing the same thing twice.

There are 10 new starters, none of whom were big-ticket items in the offseason but have the shared trait of being enthusiastic workers who believe in team defense.

Of the 16 sacks generated by the Raiders, Lamarr Houston has the most at three, and the remaining 13 are divided among 11 players.

Opponents are averaging 22 points per game and 99.0 yards per game rushing, with only the Denver Broncos and Peyton Manning putting up the kind of points (37) and yardage (536) the Raiders have given up far too often in the last 10 years.

The Raiders are faster, are better tacklers and playing smarter than at any time in recent memory, and Allen credits Tarver with allowing his unit to play as fast as possible.

"He's really smart, and he's able to take something that might seem complicated and make it as simple as he can for the players," Allen said.

Free safety Charles Woodson, aware of Tarver's advanced education, has a mental picture of his coach in the role of a scientist.

"A lab coat, glasses, pens in his pocket," Woodson said. "I can see the whole thing."

Tarver, 39, who chose coaching over medical school, doesn't see his career path as unusual. Chemistry, like coaching, is about applying rules and logic to solve problems.

"You don't know how that weird-shaped brown ball and 22 pieces are going to move," Tarver said. "It's the ultimate puzzle -- a human puzzle."

In truth, for as good as Tarver was in his studies at Pleasanton's Foothill High, Santa Clara University and graduate school at UCLA, his passion was always football.

A safety at Foothill for coach Matt Sweeney, Tarver immediately took to scouting and preparation, which made up for what he lacked in pure athletic ability.

"He was just so off-the-charts smart," Sweeney said. "He was a 17-year-old that really could have been hanging out with 40-year-olds. Sometimes you win because of a certain number of guys who are behind the scenes acting like a coach with his classmates. That was Jason."

As a senior, Tarver blew out his anterior cruciate ligament, and according to Sweeney, "played his whole senior year without an ACL. He just put on a brace and lived with it."

Still living with it, as it turns out. Tarver had arthroscopic knee surgery last Thursday and was back in the office watching film by midafternoon.

Tarver's father is a research chemist at Lawrence Livermore Laboratory, while his mother, sister and brother are all educators.

"We didn't talk about if we were going to college," Tarver said. "It was about where and when you would go to college."

Jon Evans, a Foothill teacher and assistant football coach who was a close friend of Tarver's brother James, spent much of his youth at the Tarver home. On the court where they lived, pickup football and basketball games were daily occurrences, with Jason doing most of the organizing.

Although Tarver was an "A" student, Evans can't remember a time when he saw him doing homework.

"He was always working on football and studying Coach Sweeney's game plans," Evans said. "I don't think he had to spend a lot of time to get straight A's. I don't think he was challenged academically until he got to college."

Tarver was a biochemistry major at Santa Clara but played football at West Valley College in Saratoga after Santa Clara dropped football. He worked for a year as an assistant coach at West Valley and caught the coaching bug, which he took with him to UCLA -- where Tarver worked as a graduate assistant coach and eventually as an instructor while getting his master's degree.

"I would finish with spring ball, throw a lab coat over my football coaching stuff and literally run across campus to teach a four-hour lab, and I loved it," Tarver said.

Raiders running backs coach Kelly Skipper, then the offensive coordinator at UCLA, said Tarver was immediately identified as an "out of the box thinker" who absorbed everything he could on both sides of the ball. The coaching staff was both amazed and amused at Tarver's workload and surprised that he seemed like a fairly normal person.

"The thing about him is here's a guy with that kind of intellect, and he relates to people so well," Skipper said. "He's not off in his own little world. I think that's what makes him a pretty good coach, because he can talk to players. He can talk to anyone, at any level."

When Tarver interviewed with the 49ers to be a quality control assistant, he talked for  $3\frac{1}{2}$  hours with Walsh, Mariucci and McPherson, got the job, and remained on the 49ers staff through the tenures of Mariucci, Dennis Erickson, Mike Nolan and Mike Singletary, coaching both offense and defense.

Tarver was hired by David Shaw to be co-defensive coordinator at Stanford before moving on to the Raiders last season.

His coaching style is best described as relentlessly positive, and players appreciate the freedom to make their own adjustments within the system.

"He doesn't coach any robots," cornerback Tracy Porter said. "He calls the play, and if you see something different and make the play, he's all for it."

Said linebacker Sio Moore: "He allows you to just go, and gives everybody the confidence to make a play. Once you understand a piece of his brain, what he's trying to do, it makes things less complex. It makes it easy."

#### 'Old man' Woodson drives Raiders defense

The Raiders were seven yards from wasting a near-perfect start, and Charles Woodson could sense disappointment wearing on the huddle. The Jaguars marched right downfield, with little sign of slowing before pay dirt.

This defense -- this team -- needed a pick-me-up. The veteran free safety knew words wouldn't work. Actions would speak louder.

Maurice Jones-Drew ran left toward the pylon, and Woodson was presented with an opportunity. He could pursue him toward the goal line and push him out of bounds just in time.

Woodson went with Option B. D.J. Hayden was getting manhandled by a blocker twice his size, creating a bubble for Jones-Drew that could only be popped from the top.

Woodson took flight, sailing over left tackle Eugene Monroe completely horizontal. He hit Jones-Drew unaware, knocking him out of bounds after a 3-yard gain.

The crowd went nuts. So did the Raiders defense. Woodson drew a wry smile with one thought in mind. Mission accomplished.

Woodson killed the Jaguars momentum -- they settled for a field goal -- energized a sulking defense and got the Raiders back on track in their 19-9 win over Jacksonville. In short, the 36-year old did his job.

"That was a critical play in the game and a big momentum builder for us," Raiders coach Dennis Allen said. "You could feel the enthusiasm of the whole stadium when he made that play on Maurice Jones-Drew.

"Charles has been a heck of a football player for us. He's been a great leader for us. He's been everything that we had hoped for and anticipated when we brought him here."

The Raiders needed a veteran to mentor a young team in transition in the locker room and on the field. The 36-year old's wisdom and his status as a Bay Area icon ensured the former. It was uncertain how much the old man had left.

The NFL wasn't so sure. A humbling free agent tour expressed that. The Green Bay Packers thanked him for seven excellent years and moved on. The Denver Broncos wouldn't offer a dime in guaranteed money. The San Francisco 49ers took a pass.

The Raiders made him feel welcome, wanted. They gave him a real chance, and Woodson has

rewarded them with excellent play at retirement age.

"All I hear these days now is 'old man,'" Woodson said. "Like I told these guys when I first got here, man, I love playing football. Those kinds of plays, like the one from Sunday, are second nature. As long as I'm out there on the field, that's the kind of effort I'm going to give."

That's the effort Woodson expects from others. He hopes unspoken peer pressure brings out the best in these Raiders.

Woodson's leadership gives the Raiders faith they can survive without a talent like Tyvon Branch. His play within a strong secondary gives the team a puncher's chance on Monday night against quarterback Peyton Manning and the Broncos.

That's because Woodson has made more than one big play. He led the team with six tackles last week and had three the week before. He can rush the passer, but is generally the last line of defense on passing downs. By doing so well, it gives coordinator Jason Tarver the confidence to blitz defensive backs without feeling vulnerable in the passing game.

Woodson is happy in this place, and in awe of the fan response that prompted him to re-sign with the team that drafted him.

The defense was announced before Sunday's home opener and, cheers reached a crescendo at No. 24. A few quarters later, Woodson eclipsed himself with that awesome, flying strike.

"It was one of those sellout plays that you need during the course of a game that hopefully can turn the tide and give you some momentum," Woodson said. "That's what I love to do."

#### Candid Charles Woodson out to prove the doubters wrong

NAPA, Calif. -- Raiders safety Charles Woodson doesn't believe in taking the scenic route. He wants to get from Point A to Point B as quickly as possible, not only on the football field but also in conversation. Consider his response when asked whether he pays attention to reports that his game has slipped in recent years.

Many players would respond with verbal detours. They'd rather give out the password to their bank account than publicly acknowledge an outsider's criticism. Not Woodson, who is returning to his Oakland roots after seven seasons with the Packers. He goes straight at the subject as if it were an unprotected quarterback and he was coming on a blindside blitz.

"I read all of it," the 16-year veteran says, smiling. "Basically they say I can't do it. They say I haven't been getting it done for the last three years. I've read a lot of things like that -- that I've been declining every year, which is funny because I was just All-Pro two years ago.

"But it's all good because when I turn on the film or I look at me on the football field, no one plays faster than me. You can go ask coaches in Green Bay, as far as how I played before breaking my collarbone last year. Ask them who played faster than me, and I don't think they would say anybody. Maybe Clay Matthews -- Clay is a bad boy. But, nah. All the stuff they're saying just ain't true."

Woodson is not alone in his determination to prove himself a still-viable force. The Raiders, one year after allowing the third-most offensive points in the NFL, could end up fielding as many as nine new defensive starters, each of whom was given up on by his former club. The unit might look like the Land of Misfit Players to some outsiders, but within the locker room the focus is on opportunity.

"The organization brought in some hungry guys," says Woodson, who turns 37 in October. "They're guys who signed one-year or two-year deals who can come out here, show out, then next year be looking at something [more lucrative] here or elsewhere."

Even in a league where roster turnover is common, what the Raiders have done is eye-popping. According to Football Outsiders, it's only the second time in the modern era that a team has changed as many as nine primary defensive starters in one year. The only other time it was done was in 2002, by ... the Raiders, who also made nine changes.

That Oakland team advanced to the Super Bowl (where it was routed by the Bucs), but no one is expecting the past to be prologue. The Raiders haven't had a winning season in 10 years, and one Las Vegas sports book lists their over/under at 5.5 victories. To even have a shot at that figure, the defense must be better than it was a year ago, when it surrendered 18 touchdowns on the ground (which tied for third-most in the league), 28 scores through the air (more than all but seven other teams) and managed just 25 sacks (second-fewest in the league).

Enter tackles Pat Sims and Vance Walker, end Jason Hunter, linebackers Nick Roach, Kevin Burnett and Kaluka Maiava, cornerbacks Mike Jenkins and Tracy Porter and Woodson. The Raiders also used a first-round pick on cornerback D.J. Hayden and a third-rounder on linebacker Sio Moore, both of whom could challenge for starting jobs as rookies.

The issue is how best to turn nine new starters into a cohesive unit. "The challenge is these guys really understanding ways that guys are going to play the game and really get a feel for what everybody else is seeing on the football field," says coach Dennis Allen. "It's really about getting 11 guys to play together and understand what their role is within the scheme. The thing we've got is that we have some veteran players, who understand how to do the job. The bad thing with that sometimes is that guys can be set in their ways. The good thing is, this is a group of guys that is eager and willing to do it the Raider way. That's why I like this team."

What Allen also likes is the players' willingness to practice. It was a struggle at times last season to get some veterans to consider practice as important as he did in his first year as a head coach. In fact, there were times early in training camp when newcomers could be seen grimacing from aches and bruises, strains and sprains, yet they refused to leave the field.

Defensive coordinator Jason Tarver, meanwhile, is pleased to have a group of veterans who are capable of making adjustments on the fly. "You can talk to them about subtle things and you can talk to them about major things," he says. "It's not too big for them. The personalities are big, too. Roach is smart, a little bit funny, he wants to do it right, and he likes solving things in the moment. Communicating with those players is really what you love about coaching."

Coaches are also enamored of talented veterans who are motivated, such as Woodson. He commands your attention when he's on the field. There is a suddenness when he breaks on the ball that few players possess. Woodson makes the game look easy even when it's difficult, as the rookie Hayden has learned. As Hayden walked off the field after a recent practice, sweat pouring down his face, multiple sets of shoulder pads and helmets in his hands, he shook his head at what he had just witnessed from Woodson.

"I couldn't even believe it," Hayden said. "I don't even think he was sweating. He's just so smooth."

"I told him I'm a machine," says Woodson, who breaks into a deep laugh.

One thing Woodson won't laugh about is his desire to show he's still a defensive force. And once again he gets straight to the point. "I ain't going to lie, it's kind of hurtful to have people taking shots at you for whatever reason, or just because you're 35, 36 or going on 37," he says. "But it's all good. I read it and put in my mental bank."

Like his new teammates, he hopes to collect interest beginning in Week 1.
