Redshirted the 2015 season before a prolific run as a three-year starter from 2016-18 ... completed college career with 166 tackles, 50 tackles for loss, 27.0 sacks, 51 quarterback pressures, seven pass breakups and five caused fumbles in 2,167 snaps over 44 games (all starts) ... left Clemson as only the second two-time, first-team AP All-American and the school's first such player since 1981-82 ... despite playing only three seasons, his 44 starts were the most by any defensive end/outside linebacker in school history ... ranked tied for fourth in Clemson history with 27 career sacks, tied with William "Refrigerator" Perry ... entered 2018 as the No. 7 player in the nation in the preseason by Sports Illustrated and No. 8 player by NFL.com ... No. 4 defensive end in the nation in the preseason by Lindy's.

2018: Won the Ted Hendricks Award, awarded to the nation's top defensive end ... Bednarik Award semifinalist ... consensus first-team All-American, earning selections by AFCA, AP, Sporting News and Walter Camp ... with the AP selection, became Clemson's first two-time, first-team AP All-American since Terry Kinard in 1981-82 ... ACC Defensive Player of the Year ... first-team All-ACC ... unanimous first-team AP All-ACC selection and earned AP ACC Defensive Player of the Year...voted as a permanent team captain ... credited with 53 tackles (19.5 for loss), 11.5 sacks, four pass breakups, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries including one recovered for a touchdown in 691 snaps in 15 games (all starts) ... recorded three tackles, including a sack, in season opener against Furman ... racked up three tackles — all for loss, including two sacks — at Texas A&M, earning ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors and collecting a team defensive player of the week award ... compiled seven tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks in a team defensive player of the week performance vs. Georgia Southern, becoming the first Clemson player to have two or more sacks in consecutive games since Vic Beasley against Florida State and North Carolina in 2014 ... scored the first touchdown of his career, recovering a fumble in the end zone at Georgia Tech ... posted three tackles vs. Syracuse ... recorded a sack among his four tackles at Wake Forest ... made five tackles, including 2.5 for loss, vs. NC State ... recorded a sack at Florida State to move past Brentson Buckner and Bryant McNeal (22.0 each) on the school's all-time leaderboard for career sacks ... contributed five tackles (including a half-sack) vs. Louisville ... recorded a sack among his two tackles at Boston College ... notched 2.5 tackles for loss with 2.0 sacks among his three tackles vs. Duke ... contributed two tackles vs. South Carolina ... added five tackles (1.5 for loss) against Pitt ... recorded four tackles, one sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery as Clemson held No. 3 Notre Dame to three points in the Cotton Bowl ... tied William Perry (28.0) for fourth-most career sacks in school history with his sack in the Cotton Bowl ... contributed four tackles, including 1.5 for loss, in National Championship Game vs. No. 1 Alabama.

2017: One of five finalists for the Ted Hendricks Award ... first-team All-American by AP and Sports on Earth; became just the third Tiger freshman or sophomore in history to earn first-team AP All-America honors, joining Sammy Watkins and Deshaun Watson ... second-team All-American by The All-American, CBS Sports, Football Writers Association, Rivals, Sporting News, Sports Illustrated and USA Today ... First-Team All-ACC selection ... first-team All-ACC by AP and Phil Steele ... had 63 tackles, 18 tackles for loss, 9.5 sacks, 12 quarterback pressures, a pass breakup and two caused fumbles in 717 snaps over 14 games (14 starts) ... second in the ACC in sacks and second in tackles for loss ... had four tackles in 26 snaps against Kent State on Sept. 2 ... had five tackles, a sack, team-high three quarterback pressures and caused fumble in 67 snaps against No. 13 Auburn on Sept. 9 ... had three tackles and two quarterback pressures in 56 snaps at No. 14 Louisville on Sept. 16 ... had four tackles and two quarterback pressures in 54 snaps at No. 12 Virginia Tech on Sept. 30 ... had a sack in 48 snaps against Wake Forest on Oct. 7 ... had eight tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup in 81 snaps at Syracuse on Oct. 13; named ACC Defensive Lineman-of-the-Week; named team defensive player-of-the-game ... had six

tackles in 25 snaps against Georgia Tech on Oct. 28; named team co-defensive player-of-the-game ... had a team-high 12 tackles, five tackles for loss and a sack at No. 20 NC State on Nov. 4; named ACC Defensive Lineman-of-the-Week; named team co-defensive player-of-the-game ... had three tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack, two quarterback pressures and a caused fumble against Florida State on Nov. 11; named team co-defensive player-of-the-game ... had four tackles in 27 snaps against The Citadel on Nov. 18 ... had five tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack in 39 snaps at South Carolina on Nov. 25 ... had four tackles and a tackle for loss in 35 snaps against No. 7 Miami (Fla.) in the ACC Championship Game on Dec. 2 ... had two tackles and a sack in 70 snaps against No. 4 Alabama in the Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1; named team co-defensive player-of-the-game.

2016: Shared team defensive rookie-of-the-year honors with Dexter Lawrence ... produced 50 tackles, including 12.5 for loss and six sacks, to go along with a team-high 24 quarterback pressures in 15 games (15 starts) ... started first collegiate game at Auburn, and posted three quarterback pressures ... posted two sacks in the win over No. 3 Louisville, part of 10 tackles for loss against the Cardinals ... tallied three-yard sack in Clemson's road win over Boston College ... defensive player of the game against Florida State, when he recorded two tackles for loss, a sack and a pass breakup in Clemson's big win ... posted half a tackle for loss in game against Pittsburgh ... had a pass breakup and two pressures against South Carolina ... posted two tackles for loss, including a sack, in ACC Championship Game against Virginia Tech ... named defensive Most Valuable Player in the Fiesta Bowl after posting three tackles for loss, including a sack ... played just 36 snaps due to injury in the National Championship Game, but contributed two pressures and a tackle for loss.

Under Armour All-America Game selection, but did not play due to injury ... did not play as a senior due to a torn ACL ... had 60 tackles, 26 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks as a junior ... all-state selection as a junior ... played two years of basketball ... coached by Greg Lilly ... recruited by Marion Hobby and Brent Venables.

Junior (2018)

An elusive back who was an offensive weapon ... versatile athlete who also provided a threat on special teams ... averaged 28.6 yards per kickoff return for his career (514 yards, 18 returns) to rank third in UA annals (minimum 15 returns) ... selected as the Most Valuable Player of the SEC Championship Game ... contributed in numerous ways as a junior, totaling 15 touchdowns (11 rushing, three receiving, one kickoff return) to rank eighth in the SEC and his 11 rushing scores tied for seventh in the league ... wrapped up 2018 tied for the team lead in all-purpose yards with 1,315 to average 87.7 yards per game ... ranked second on the Tide in scoring with 90 points ... rushed 120 times for 640 yards and a team-high 11 scores while catching 20 passes for 247 yards and three touchdowns ... 50 of his rushes as a junior went for a first down or score while 14 of his reception led to a Tide touchdown or first down ... added 14 kickoff returns for 428 yards with one score of 77 yards ... his 30.6 yards per return average led the SEC and was second in the FBS, a big part of the Tide's 23.5 average return on kickoffs that ranked 19th nationally ... the 30.6 kickoff return average is second-best in Alabama single-season records (minimum 10 returns) ... earned special teams player of the week honors from the UA coaches for his play against Louisville, Ole Miss and Missouri while earning offensive player of the week recognition for his performances against the Tigers on Homecoming and against Mississippi State and Auburn. **Louisville:** Totaled two touchdowns by night's end to earn special teams player of the week accolades from the Tide coaching staff ... rushed six times for 45 yards and a score ... added a 77-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the first of his career. **Arkansas State:** Carried five times for 14 yards and added a career-high tying three receptions totaling 23 yards against the Red Wolves. **Ole Miss:** Excelled in his returner role once again, taking two kickoffs back for 101 yards with a long return of 74 to set up a Tide field goal ... graded out at 100 percent on his kickoff coverage and kickoff return snaps to earn special teams player of the week honors from the Tide coaches ... added six carries for 18 yards and a score while catching one pass totaling 18 more yards. **Texas A&M:** Contributed in the rushing and passing games against the Aggies ... carried six times for 11 yards and his third score of the season in addition to one catch for a season-long 25-yard gain ... also recorded his first tackle of the season on kickoff coverage. **Louisiana:** Rushed just six times but made them count, totaling 49 yards and a team-high two rushing touchdowns on the afternoon ... carried from one- and nine-yards out for his two scores with three of his other four carries going for a UA first down. **Arkansas:** Carried five times for 10 yards and scored his sixth touchdown of the season ... added a career-high three kickoff returns for 42 yards with a long of 20. **Missouri:** Named as one of the Tide coaching staff's offensive and special teams players of the week for his standout performance against the Tigers ... rushed nine times for 52 yards on offense to average a team-leading 5.8 yards per rush ... also returned three kickoffs for 88 yards with a long gain of 50, nearly breaking the return for a score ... finished his night with a season-high 140 all-purpose yards. **Tennessee:** Made the start at tailback and put together a standout performance ... led all Alabama backs in rushing yards with 68 on 12 rushes and

recorded a team-leading two rushing touchdowns ... added one reception for two yards ... also contributed three kickoff returns totaling 63 yards with a long of 42 yards coming on the first play of the game. **LSU:** Rushed four times for 17 yards while adding two receptions for 23 yards against the Tigers. **Mississippi State:** Totaled a career-high 20 carries for 97 yards and a touchdown to average 4.8 yards per tote ... added two catches for 12 yards and the Tide's lone touchdown reception of the day ... earned offensive player of the week accolades from the Tide coaching staff for his efforts against State ... also returned one kickoff for 27 yards to finish with 136 all-purpose yards against State. **The Citadel:** Carried twice for three yards against the Bulldogs ... recorded a Tide first down with his lone reception of the day that totaled 15 yards. **Auburn:** Finished with 81 yards of total offense against the Tigers ... rushed five times for 28 yards to average 5.6 yards per tote ... added four catches for 53 yards and one score ... selected as one of the UA coaching staff's offensive players of the week for his output in the Iron Bowl. **Georgia:** Selected as the SEC Championship's Most Valuable Player for his standout performance against the Bulldogs ... led all Tide rushers with 86 yards and two touchdowns on only eight carries ... averaged a game-high 10.4 yards per carry. **Oklahoma:** Accumulated 158 all-purpose yards in an impressive Orange Bowl performance against the Sooners ... rushed a team-high 15 times for 98 yards, a total that also led UA ... added four receptions for 60 yards with a 27-yard catch and score that saw him truck an OU defender to get to paydirt. **Clemson:** Contributed all over the field in the title game ... rushed 11 times for 47 yards, collecting five first downs in the process ... also caught one pass for a 16-yard gain and Tide first down ... added one kickoff return for a 30-yard gain.

Sophomore (2017)

An shifty back with tons of speed who missed the first two games of his sophomore campaign due to a hamstring injury but finished with 12 games of action including one start ... totaled 284 yards on 46 carries and a touchdown, while catching 14 passes for 168 yards and two touchdowns ... also worked on kickoff return, taking back four kicks for 86 yards with a long return of 23 yards ... earned special teams player of the week recognition from the Tide coaches for his efforts against Arkansas ... also tabbed an offensive player of the week by the UA coaches for his performances against Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Mercer. **Colorado State:** Returned to the field after sitting out the first two games ... made the start at tailback, finishing with one rush for six yards on the night. **Vanderbilt:** Rushed four times for 28 yards with a long rush of 13 ... contributed to the Crimson Tide's 496 yards rushing on the afternoon. **Ole Miss:** Saw his most extensive time of the season ... rushed two times for 51 yards with a season-long scamper of 45 yards ... also had an impact in the passing game, catching a pair of passes - each for 18 yards - and recording his first career touchdown reception ... selected as an offensive player of the week by the Alabama coaches for his efforts against the Rebels. **Texas A&M:** Saw time against the Aggies but did not record any stats. **Arkansas:** Carried a season-high nine times for 39 yards with a long rush of 10 ... added a pair of receptions for 36 yards with a career-long, 33-yard catch and run ... made his first tackle on special teams, stopping the Razorback returner after a 10-yard gain ... earned special teams player of the week honors from the Tide coaches for his

efforts on kickoff coverage. **Tennessee:** Factored heavily into the gameplan once again ... rushed eight times for 47 yards with a long rush of 22 ... added a pair of receptions for 24 yards. **LSU:** Rushed once for three yards against the Tigers. **Mississippi State:** Named one of the UA coaches' offensive players of the week for his efforts against the Bulldogs ... rushed six times for 36 yards and a touchdown with a long rush of 13 yards ... carried it over the goal line from one-yard out to keep the score even at 14 heading into half ... also caught a pair of passes for 18 yards. **Mercer:** Contributed in the passing and rushing game ... carried six times for 41 yards with a long rush of 13 yards ... added two receptions for 45 yards with one score from seven yards away ... selected as one of the Tide's offensive players of the week by the coaching staff. **Auburn:** Carried the ball six times for 25 yards and added two catches for six yards out of the backfield ... also registered the first two kickoff returns of his career for 44 yards. **Clemson:** Caught a pair of passes out of the backfield for three yards in the CFP Semifinal matchup. **Georgia:** Returned a pair of kickoffs for 42 combined yards with a long return of 22 ... added three rushes for eight yards out of the backfield.

Freshman (2016)

Played a key role in a Tide backfield that was tasked with replacing Heisman Trophy winner Derrick Henry ... rushed 85 times for 567 yards and four touchdowns to average 6.7 yards per carry, a total that ranked second among Tide backs ... also added 14 receptions for 156 yards ... selected as the SEC Freshman of the Week after his performance against Kentucky ... named one of the UA coaching staff's offensive players of the week for his performances against Kent State and Kentucky, and one of the special teams players of the week after the Florida game. **USC:** Earned his first collegiate action against the Trojans, rushing four times for 20 yards with a long of eight yards. **Western Kentucky:** Saw time against the Hilltoppers but did not record any stats. **Ole Miss:** Was the first option off the bench at tailback, toting the ball three times for 33 yards with a long of 25 ... provided key blocks to allow time for Jalen Hurts to find open receivers. **Kent State:** Led all Tide backs with 11 rushes for 97 yards and a pair of touchdowns ... had a long rush of 24 yards which he took in for his second score of the day and finished with five rushes of 10 or more yards ... hauled in two passes for 23 yards with a long of 15 yards ... six of his rushes and one of his two pass receptions went for a first down or a touchdown. **Kentucky:** Set new career highs in nearly every category, rushing 16 times for 100 yards while catching three passes for 44 yards - all career marks - in his first start for the Crimson Tide ... also added one touchdown on the ground ... collected a career-long rush of 28 yards and a 23-yard reception, also a new career-high mark ... his performance earned him SEC Freshman of the Week honors. **Arkansas:** Rushed three times for 57 yards with a long of 56, all coming on the first drive ... exited the game for good after suffering an injury near the Razorbacks' goal line on the Crimson Tide's opening drive. **Tennessee:** Totaled 38 yards on six carries with a long rush of 22 ... also caught one pass for a gain of eight yards. **Texas A&M:** Finished with 10 carries for 36 yards while adding one reception for 11 yards ... had a long rush of eight yards against the Aggies. **LSU:** Rushed five times for a loss of three yards while adding one reception for a gain of three against the Tigers. **Mississippi State:** Provided a versatile option in both the rushing and passing

game for the Tide ... rushed nine times for 89 yards with three of his runs going for a first down ... added three receptions for 34 yards while notching two first downs on receptions of 26 and 10 yards. **Chattanooga:** Totaled 17 yards on five rushes with a long of seven against the Mocs. **Auburn:** Rushed five times for 32 yards with a long run of 26 yards that he nearly broke for a score ... also added one reception for a season-high 30 yards. **Florida:** Earned special teams player of the week honors from the UA coaching staff for his efforts against the Gators ... took a Derrick Gore blocked punt into the end zone for the Tide's second touchdown of the day ... rushed six times for 35 yards with a touchdown from six yards out ... also caught one pass for six yards. **Washington:** Saw limited time in the Tide backfield ... did not attempt a rush but caught one pass for negative yardage. **Clemson:** Played limited snaps as the Tide focused on a power rushing attack ... carried the ball twice for 16 yards with a long rush of 13 against the Tigers.

An explosive athlete at running back who arrived on the scene late in the recruiting process ... a four-star prospect, the No. 2 player in Oklahoma and the No. 6 all-purpose running back nationally ... ranked as the No. 10 all-purpose running back in the 247Composite and the No. 2 player in the state of Oklahoma ... Rivals.com rated him ninth in the state ... ESPN listed him as the No. 4 player in Oklahoma and the No. 36 running back nationally ... averaged an astounding 15.1 yards per carry and 245.8 yards per game as a senior with 2,704 rushing yards on 179 carries with 31 rushing touchdowns ... first team All-State in 4A by the Oklahoma Coaches Association and OKPreps.com ... a second-team choice by The Oklahoman ... played in only six games as a junior in 2014 due to injury, rushing for 948 yards and 13 scores in just over four games ... finished his career at McLain with 5,372 yards rushing and 56 touchdowns ... played for head coach Jarvis Payne at Tulsa McLain ... chose Alabama over Oklahoma and Missouri.

Hard-hitting, instinctive safety who has a nose for the football ... Has been touted as the No. 1 safety in the 2019 NFL Draft ... Vocal leader on and off the field ... Boasts three years of SEC experience with his last two at MSU ... Played in 26 games with 18 starts at MSU ... Totaled 170 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, five sacks, three fumbles forced and two interceptions in two seasons in Starkville ... Put together an All-America senior season ... Teamed with Mark McLaurin to form one of the elite safety tandems in the country ... Arrived at MSU via the junior college ranks and prior to that played as a freshman at Georgia ... Graduated from MSU in December 2018 with a degree in interdisciplinary studies.

2018 SENIOR SEASON

Regarded as one of the top defensive backs in college football ... Saw action in 13 games with 11 starts – nine at safety and twice at star ... Earned six All-America honors which included The Athletic (second team), Sports Illustrated (second team),

The Associated Press (third team), CBS Sports (second team), American Football Coaches Association (second team) and Phil Steele (third team) ... Also collected All-SEC first-team honors from the AP and second-team honors from the coaches ... Led the team and ranked eighth in the SEC in tackles (99) ... Filled the stat sheet with nine tackles for loss, three sacks, two interceptions, five pass breakups, one fumble forced and one fumble recovered ... Was tops in the SEC and third in the nation in total pressures among safeties (16) according to Pro Football Focus ... Five of his recorded pressures were QB hits, which led the SEC and tied for third in the country among safeties ... His 99 tackles also were the most of any SEC defensive back ... Finished with at least one tackle for loss in each of the last four games, including a career-high 3.5 on Senior Day vs. Arkansas (11/17) and totaled seven during that span ... Closed out the regular season tops in the SEC among safeties with a 43.6 passer rating allowed, per PFF ... Dominated the month of November with 31 tackles, six tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, one interception, a forced fumble and a recovered fumble ... Averaged 8.4 tackles in conference games, which led all SEC defensive backs ... Logged at least eight tackles in eight different games ... His nine tackles for loss were the second-most in the SEC among defensive backs ... Recorded his first interception of the season in the third game vs. Louisiana (9/15) ... Turned in his first of two double-digit tackle efforts (10) and added one sack at No. 5 LSU (10/20) ... Was a ballhawk at No. 1 Alabama (11/10) as he tallied nine tackles, one tackle for loss and three pressures, including a pair of QB hits ... Earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance vs. Arkansas (11/17) which included career highs in tackles (12), tackles for loss (3.5) and sacks (1.5) ... Also forced and recovered a fumble and was responsible for a season-high five pressures according to PFF against the Razorbacks ... Closed the regular season with four tackles, including one for loss, and an interception at Ole Miss (11/22).

Appeared in 13 games with seven starts at safety ... Over his debut season, recorded at least five tackles in nine of his 13 appearances, including a career-high nine in the TaxSlayer Bowl vs. Louisville (12/30) ... Ranked second on the team with 71 total tackles, which was 29th in the SEC ... His 43 solo tackles led MSU ... Also had five tackles for loss ... Starts came against Louisiana Tech, Georgia, BYU, UMass, Arkansas, Ole Miss and Louisville ... Made his debut as a Bulldog in MSU's season opener against Charleston Southern (9/2) ... Earned his first-

career start at Louisiana Tech (9/9) and tallied seven tackles ... Grabbed four tackles and recorded his first-career pass break-up in MSU's historic win over No. 11 LSU (9/16) ...
