

2015 OAKLAND RAIDERS DRAFT RELEASE

THE DRAFT

The Oakland Raiders will host media members at the team's training facility in Alameda, Calif., for the 80th National Football League Draft from April 30-May 2 (Thursday through Saturday). There will be 256 selections, including 32 compensatory choices that have been awarded to 14 teams.

The draft will be held at Chicago's Auditorium Theatre of Roosevelt University. This year marks the first time since 1964 that the draft will be held outside of New York City, when it was also held in Chicago. The 2015 NFL Draft will begin on Thursday in prime time, the sixth consecutive year that it will kick off in an evening time slot. The first round will take place on Thursday, April 30, beginning at 5 p.m. PT. The second and third rounds will take place on Friday, May 1, and begin at 4 p.m. PT. The draft will conclude on Saturday, May 2, with the final four rounds, commencing at 9 a.m. PT.

Teams have 10 minutes to select a player in the first round and seven minutes in the second round. Except for compensatory selections, the selection time for rounds three through six is five minutes. The selection time for round seven and all compensatory selections is four minutes.

NFL Network and ESPN/ESPN 2 will televise the draft all three days.

NO. 4 PICK

The Raiders will select fourth overall in 2015 for the third time since the National Football League and American Football League adopted a common draft in 1967. With their two previous fourth-overall selections, the Silver and Black selected **Charles Woodson** in 1998 and **Darren McFadden** in 2008.

Since 2000, the fourth-overall pick has returned six Pro Bowl players and many high-impact contributors. The Cincinnati Bengals have had three selections with the fourth-overall pick since 2000, selecting two Pro Bowlers. The Buffalo Bills and New York Jets have eached selected fourth twice, with New York picking one Pro Bowler. The pick has been used to take a tackle five times since 2000, by far the most of any position. Wide receiver (three) and running back (two) are the only other positions to have been picked more than once. Last season, the Bills traded up to the fourth-overall pick with the Cleveland Browns, landing WR Sammy Watkins.

Thursday's first-round selections will be announced by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell live from the Auditorium Theatre of Roosevelt University in Chicago.

On Friday, the second round will be announced in Chicago by Pro Football Hall of Famer and current team ambassador Willie Brown.

For Oakland's selections in rounds 4-7 on Saturday, the Raiders' selections will be announced by former Raiders running back and former members of the United States Navy Napoleon Mc-Callum. The picks will be announced from Travis Air Force Base in Fairfield, Calif along with servicemen who are stationed there.

THE 2014 DRAFT CLASS

First Round – LB Khalil Mack (No. 5 overall)

- Mack started all 16 games last season and posted 84 tackles (59 solo), four sacks, four passes defensed and one forced fumble, according to official coaches' statistics.

- Mack finished third in voting for the Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year.

- Mack was named to the Pro Football Writers of America, Sports Illustrated and NFL.com All-Rookie Teams.

Second Round – QB Derek Carr (No. 36 overall)

Carr, the 14th quarterback to start all 16 games in his rookie season, is the owner of every major franchise rookie passing record and ranked first among 2014 rookies with 348 completions (second among all-time rookies), 3,270 passing yards (10th all-time among rookies) and 21 touchdowns (tied for fifth all-time among rookies).
Carr boasted a 2.0 interception percentage despite attempting 599 passes, marking the best percentage among 2014 rookies and the seventh best among all NFL quarterbacks. He is one of just four rookies with at least 20 touchdowns and 12-or-fewer picks.
Carr was named to Sports Illustrated's All-Rookie Team.

Third Round – G Gabe Jackson (No. 81 overall)

- Jackson earned the starting left guard job during training camp and went on to play in 13 games with 12 starts. He is the first Raider rookie offensive lineman to start at least 10 games since Stefen Wisniewski started 15 in 2011.

Fourth Round – DT Justin Ellis (No. 107 overall)

- Ellis was a surprise force on the defensive line, appearing in all 16 games with 14 starts after stepping into the starting position in Week 3.

- Ellis finished last season with 39 tackles (21 solo) and one pass broken up.

- Ellis was named to Sports Illustrated and $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Pro}}$ Football Writers of America All-Rookie Team.

Fourth Round – CB Keith McGill (No. 116 overall)

- Despite being plagued by injury through much of the year, McGill contributed on special teams all season long, posting three special teams tackles. He finished the year with 12 tackles (six solo) and four passes defensed.

- McGill finally got his opportunity as the starting cornerback in Week 17 at Den., where he made a heads-up play by picking up a fumble on a lateral pass and returning it 18 yards for a touchdown.

Seventh Round – CB TJ Carrie (No. 219 overall)

- Carrie made immediate contributions on both defense and special teams, appearing in 13 games and starting four at cornerback. He finished the year with 48 stops (40 solo), one interception, 12 passes defensed, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries (one special teams).

- As the Raiders' leading punt returner, Carrie brought back 26 punts for 195 yards (7.5 avg.). He also returned kickoffs, totaling 15 kick returns for 362 yards (24.1 avg.) with a long of 42 yards.

Seventh Round – DE Shelby Harris (No. 235 overall)

- Harris made his NFL debut in Week 17 at Den. after spending most of the season on the practice squad. He contributed two tackles (one solo) in the contest.

Seventh Round – S Jonathan Dowling (No. 247 overall)

- Dowling finished the season on the reserve/injured list after playing in four games. He finished the season with three tackles (two solo).

UNDRAFTED GEMS

Following each draft, personnel departments around the NFL scramble to sign talented players that were not selected in the draft. The Raiders have brought in numerous players that were not drafted, developing them into significant contributors for the Silver and Black.

- WR Andre Holmes, originally an undrafted free agent with the Minnesota Vikings in 2011, has two of the Raiders' top four single-game receiving totals over the last two seasons. He set career highs in 2014 with 47 catches for 693 yards and four touchdowns.

- In 2013, **P Marquette King** finished sixth in the NFL with 4,107 punting yards, and led the league in gross punting with an average of 48.9. In 2014, King set Raider franchise records in punts (109) and punting yards (4,930).

- On Nov. 17, 2013 **QB Matt McGloin** became the first undrafted rookie to throw for three-or-more touchdown passes in his first NFL start since 1987. He also became just the second quarterback to throw for three touchdowns without an interception in his first NFL start since the NFL-AFL merger in 1970.

- **T Donald Penn** has started 124 consecutive games a tackle, the third-longest streak in the NFL at his position.

- **FB Marcel Reece** has developed into one of the most versatile players in the league, earning three straight trips to the Pro Bowl from 2012-14.
