PACKERS TRAVEL WEST TO TAKE ON THE RAIDERS

The Green Bay Packers return to the road for a matchup in Oakland against the Raiders.

- ►The Packers recorded the 750th total victory in franchise history last week (750-565-37), joining the Chicago Bears (757-571-42) as the only teams in NFL history to reach 750 total wins.
- ►Green Bay has won three of its last four games, including two road contests.
- ►The Packers have won six consecutive games against the Raiders, including two on the road. In those six games, Green Bay has outscored the Raiders, 210-70, scoring 28-plus points in each contest (29, 28, 28, 41, 38, 46).
- ►Green Bay is playing Raiders in Oakland for only the third time in franchise history. The Packers' first trip came in 1972, a 20-14 Raiders victory. Green Bay last played at the Raiders in 2003, winning 41-7.
- Since 1990, the Packers are 10-2 during the regular season in California (49ers / Raiders / Chargers / Rams), including 3-1 under McCarthy. This is the second game Green Bay will play in California this season, previously beating the San Francisco 49ers, 17-3, in Week 4.
- Sunday will be the second of two games this season against a franchise the Packers faced in the Super Bowl. In Week 3, Green Bay beat Kansas City, 38-28, at home in a rematch of Super Bowl I. This week the Packers play the Raiders, who they faced in Super Bowl II.
- ► Green Bay stays on the road for a game at the Arizona Cardinals in Week 16. The Packers have won seven of the last eight regular-season matchups against the Cardinals, including each of the past three.

ON THE ROAD

- Dating back to 2014, the Packers have won five of their last seven road games during the regular season.
- With a 4-2 road record so far this season, Green Bay has secured at least a .500 record away from Lambeau Field for the eighth time in 10 regular seasons under Head Coach Mike McCarthy.
- ► A win would give the Packers five-plus regular-season road wins for the fifth time since 2006 (7-1 in 2011 / 6-2 in 2007 / 5-3 in 2006 and 2009).
- ►Green Bay is 44-34 in regular-season away games during the McCarthy era. Its .564 road winning percentage since 2006 ranks No. 2 in the NFC and No. 4 in the NFL over that span (New England: 55-23, .705 / Dallas and Indianapolis: 45-34, .570).
- ► The defense has played a key role in the Packers' success on the road this season, ranking No. 3 in the NFL by allowing just 16.7 points per game.
- ► Green Bay's offense has only turned the ball over three times in road games this season, the fewest in the NFL.
- ► Dating back to 2008 when he became the starter, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has recorded a passer rating of 100.2 in regular-season road games, No. 1 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 pass att.).

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 22nd season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game to a regional audience.

- Play-by-play man Chris Myers joins color commentator Ronde Barber and sideline reporter Jennifer Hale.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (color) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 21st season calling Packers' games. McCarren has four times been voted Wisconsin Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 17th season of broadcasts together.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

FACING THE AFC

The Green Bay Packers have played well against AFC teams. Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 24-16 during the regular and postseason against teams from the AFC, including a 5-2 mark against the AFC since the start of last season. Green Bay's 24 wins are tied for the most among NFC teams since 2006 (Chicago).

Dating back to 2006, Green Bay's .600 winning percentage (including the postseason) against teams from the AFC is No. 2 among NFC teams:

- ► Under McCarthy, in the 40 regular and postseason games against the AFC, the Packers:
 - Scored over 30 points 19 times, including in 11 of the last 20 games
 - Registered at least 350 total net yards 28 times, including in 15 of the last 19 matchups
 - Tallied over 400 total net yards 13 times, including 448 in a victory over Kansas City this season
 - Rushed for over 100 net yards 25 times, including in 10 of the last 12 contests
 - Possessed the ball for 30-plus minutes in eight of the last 12 games
 - Turned the ball over one or fewer times in 29 matchups
 - Won 14 of the last 20 games
 - Recorded 13 wins in the 16 games they have held the opponent to 20 points or less
 - Tallied at least one interception in 28 games, including multiple interceptions 16 times

- ►As a team, the Packers have averaged 31.5 rushing attempts per game and 148.0 rushing yards per game in the month of December since 2013, both ranked No. 4 in the NFL over that span.

► Dating back to 2014, WR Randall Cobb ranks No. 5 in the NFL with 38 receptions in the month of December.

STAT OF THE WEEK

- Green Bay's running game fueled the 28-7 victory over the Dallas Cowboys in Week 14. The Packers rushed for 230 yards on 44 carries (5.2 avg.), their most rushing yards in a regular-season game since Nov. 29, 2004, vs. St. Louis (231 yards on 28 carries).
- The Packers posted a 37:48 time of possession, a season high and the best since Week 16 last season at Tampa Bay (38:38). Green Bay's 29 first downs (15 rushing) were the most since recording 30 vs. Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2013 (OT).
- RB Eddie Lacy recorded a season-high 124 rushing yards on 24 carries (5.2 avg.) and one touchdown to go with one reception for 24 yards. It was the fourth-highest rushing total of his career. Dating back to 2010, Lacy has five of the top six single-game rushing totals by Packers players during the regular season.
- ► Lacy also matched career highs by rushing for nine first downs (at MIN, Nov. 23, 2014) and recording five runs of 10-plus yards (at DAL, Dec. 15, 2013 / vs. MIN, Oct. 2, 2014).
- ► RB James Starks racked up 71 rushing yards on 11 carries (6.5 avg.) and one rushing touchdown to go with 32 yards on four receptions (8.0) and one receiving touchdown. Starks' 71 rushing yards were his third-highest single-game total this season.
- Lacy and Starks combined for 251 yards from scrimmage on 40 touches (6.3 avg.) with three touchdowns.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- ► If Green Bay wins it would clinch their seventh consecutive playoff berth, a franchise record.
- If the Packers win, it will mark the seventh time under Head Coach Mike McCarthy that Green Bay has won 10 or more regular-season games (2014, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2009, 2007), passing Curly Lambeau (six) for most 10-win seasons by a Green Bay head coach since they joined the NFL in 1921.
- ▶Green Bay has posted eight zero-turnover games this season, tied for No. 1 (2009) in franchise history (since 1933).
- ► Dating back to 1963, the Packers' three six-plus sack games ties a single-season franchise record (1966, 1978, 1991).
- ► The Packers have won eight of the last 10 games they have played in the month of December, including four a row.

OFFENSE

- ► If QB **Aaron Rodgers** throws for 300-plus yards, it will be the 44th 300-yard passing game of his career during the regular season.
- Rodgers looks to throw for multiple touchdowns for the 11th time this season. It would mark the fourth time in his career he has recorded 11 or more games with multiple touchdowns in a single regular season (14 in 2011 / 11 in 2012 and 2014).
- Rodgers is two touchdowns away from his fifth season with 30-plus passing touchdowns. He ranks second in team history behind Brett Favre's eight. Rodgers' four 30-plus passing touchdown seasons since 2009 are the fourth most in the NFL over that time span (NE Tom Brady and IND/DEN Peyton Manning, five / NO Drew Brees, six)
- Rodgers ranks No. 2 in the NFL with seven games this season with twoplus touchdown passes and zero INTs (New England QB Tom Brady, eight).
- ► Dating back to 2014, Rodgers has not thrown an interception in 22 of the last 29 regular-season games, including 11 of the last 15. The Packers are 19-3 in those games.
- Since the start of the 2014 season, Rodgers has thrown 66 touchdowns and 10 interceptions.
- ► WR **Randall Cobb** needs one catch to extend his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a reception to 54, the fifth-longest streak in franchise history. He trails WR James Lofton (58, 1979-83) for fourth place in team history.

- ► WR James Jones is 35 yards away from becoming the 12th player in franchise history to reach 5,000 career receiving yards as a Packer.
- ► TE **Richard Rodgers** has five touchdowns in the last six games, tied for the fifth most in the NFL since Week 9.
- ► RB Eddie Lacy has three 100-yard rushing games in the past four weeks.
- Lacy's 333 rushing yards since Week 11 are the fourth most in the NFL over that span.
- ► Lacy is one 100-yard rushing game away from tying his single-season career high of four (2013).
- RB James Starks has set new career bests in receptions (39), receiving yards (369) and receiving touchdowns (three) this season.
- Starks has recorded 100-plus yards from scrimmage four times this season, including 103 yards in the Week 14 win over Dallas. His 884 yards from scrimmage are a new career high, surpassing the 794 yards in 2011.
- Starks is 64 yards away from surpassing his single-season career high of 578 rushing yards from 2011.

DEFENSE

- ► Over the last five games, S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix has 43 tackles (37 solo), an interception and two sacks.
- LB Clay Matthews has 13 career games with two or more sacks. He is one shy of tying Tim Harris (14, 1986-90) for No. 3 in team history (Reggie White, 16; Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 15).
- ► LB Julius Peppers leads the team with 7.0 sacks this season. Dating back to last season (including playoffs), Peppers has 11.5 sacks in the last 16 games.
- ▶ Peppers needs a half a sack to pass New York Giants LB Lawrence Taylor and San Diego/St. Louis/Kansas City DE Leslie O'Neal (132.5) for 12th most in NFL history (since 1982).
- ►In Week 13 at Detroit, LB Jake Ryan started the first game of his career and led the Packers in both total tackles (nine) and solo tackles (eight) while also registering the first fumble recovery of his career. He started his second career game last week versus Dallas and finished second on the team in tackles with six.

Special Teams

- K **Mason Crosby** is 11 points shy of 100 for the season, which would mark his ninth 100-point season and pass K Ryan Longwell for the franchise record.
- Over the last two weeks, P Tim Masthay became the first Packers punter to post a net average of 44-plus yards (min. four punts) in back-to-back games since net punting average was first tracked in 1976 (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 10th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ► Led the Packers to their sixth consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to seven playoff appearances in the last eight years (2007, 2009-14).
- Has guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring each of the past eight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ► His .657 winning percentage during the regular season (102-53-1) is ranked third among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first headcoaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

JACK DEL RIO... Is in his first year as the Raiders' 19th head coach.

- ► Served as the defensive coordinator for the Denver Broncos the past three seasons (2012-2014), helping earn three straight AFC West titles, an AFC Championship and an appearance in Super Bowl XLVII.
- Prior to Denver, he served as head coach in Jacksonville (2003-2011) and led the Jaguars to two playoff appearances in 2005 and 2007, including the team's first postseason win in eight seasons with a 31-29 road victory against the Steelers in the 2007 AFC Wild Card Game.
- ► While in Jacksonville, the club ranked sixth in the NFL in yards per game allowed (317.3) and eighth in points per game allowed (20.3).
- ► Led defenses that have ranked in the top six in the NFL in yards per game allowed in 10 of his 17 seasons as a position coach, coordinator or head coach. During that time, he has coached 18 players to a total of 27 Pro Bowl selections.
- Selected in the third round (68th overall) of the 1985 NFL Draft by New Orleans and went on to play 11 seasons as an NFL linebacker.

THE PACKERS-RAIDERS SERIES

These clubs first met in Super Bowl II, a Packers 33-14 victory to make Green Bay back-to-back Super Bowl champions.

- The regular-season series started in 1972 and the Raiders won each of the first five matchups. The Packers' first victory against the Raiders during the regular season came in 1990 and Green Bay has not lost to the Raiders since.
- ▶ In the last six regular-season contests, the Packers have outscored the Raiders 210-70, including scoring at least 35 points in each of the last three games (41, 38, 46).

Packers assoc. HC/LBs Winston Moss played LB for the Raiders for four seasons (1991-94)...Packers West regional scout Sam Seale played for the Raiders for five seasons (1984-87, 1992)...Packers secondarysafeties coach Darren Perry coached DBs for the Raiders for two seasons (2007-08) before coming to Green Bay in '09...Packers WR James Jones spent the 2014 season in Oakland, serving as one of the team's top receiving threats...Raiders S Charles Woodson was selected to the Pro Bowl four times (2008-11) and named AP Defensive Player of the Year (2009) when he played for the Packers (2006-12)...Raiders GM Reggie McKenzie worked in the Green Bay personnel department from 1994-2011, including serving as the director of pro personnel from 1997-2007 and the director of football operations from 2008-11...Raiders director-college scouting Shaun Herock spent 19 years with the Packers, including 11 as the assistant director of college scouting...Raiders college scout Raleigh McKenzie played guard for the Packers from 1999-2000...Raiders WR Jeremy Ross played for Green Bay in 2012... Players with connections to California include QB Aaron Rodgers (Chico, University of California), WR Davante Adams (Palo Alto, Fresno State) WR James Jones (San Jose State), T David Bakhtiari (San Mateo), DE Datone Jones (Compton, UCLA), LÉ Clay Matthews (Aguora Hills, ÚSC) LB Nick Perry (USC), TE Richard Rodgers (University of California), WR Ty Montgomery (Stanford) and QB Brett Hundley (Brentwood, UCLA)... California natives on the coaching staff include OL coach James Campen (Sacramento), def. quality control coach John Rushing (Merced), asst. Simmons played DB for the Texans while Franklin coached the DL... Raiders HC Jack Del Rio played for the Saints while Capers coached DBs...Del Rio and Packers senior personnel executive Alonzo Highsmith were teammates in Dallas from 1990-91...Packers assoc. HC/offense Tom Clements and Del Rio coached together in New Orleans from 1997-98...Del Rio was the DC and LBs coach Sal Sunseri coached the DL in Carolina while Packers DL coach Mike Trgovac and LB Julius Peppers were with the team...Sunseri coached Packers S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix and RB Eddie Lacy during his time at Alabama from 2009-11...Raiders OC Bill Musgrave also played alongside Highsmith in Dallas in 1991 and played in San Francisco while Solari was the TEs/asst. OL coach...Musgrave served as an off. asst./OC in Philadelphia in 2008 while Trgovac was the DL coach...Packers secondary-cornerbacks coach Joe Whitt Jr. served as the asst. DBs coach in Atlanta in 2007 while Musgrave was the QBs coach...Raiders DC Ken Norton Jr. played in Dallas and San Francisco while Solari was on both coaching staffs...Norton Jr. also coached Matthews and Perry during his time at Southern California... Raiders special teams coord. Brad Seely served in the same role with the Panthers from 1995-98 while Capers was the HC...Seely and Capers also coached alongside one another in New England in 2008...Seely and Solari were on the same staff in San Francisco from 2011-14...Raiders asst. DBs coach Rod Woodson played for the Steelers from 1987-96 while Capers was the DC (1992-94) and special teams coord. - ► Green Bay's average age on the opening-day roster was 25.23, making it the second-youngest team in the NFL (St. Louis, 24.96).
- Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 35 of them (66.0 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected eight players in the first round, seven of which are still on the team.

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in seven of his first nine seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

Packers LB **Julius Peppers** continues to show that age is just a number. He has registered a team-high 7.0 sacks this season.

- ▶ Peppers has recorded a half sack or more in seven games this season, which is **tied for the ninth most in the NFL**.
- Dating back to last season, he has 12 sacks in the last 17 games (including playoffs).
- ▶ Peppers and Houston Texans DE J.J. Watt were the only players in the NFL last season to have at least one sack (seven), a forced fumble (four), a fumble recovery (three), an interception (two) and a defensive touchdown (two).
- ► For the fifth time in his career, Peppers recorded a sack, an interception, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a season (2004 / 2007 / 2009 / 2013 / 2014). Dating back to 2002 when he entered the league, that is tied for the second-most seasons in the NFL to record a stat in all four categories.
- Peppers is No. 3 among active players with 132.5 career sacks during the regular season:

- ► In Week 13, Peppers tied New York Giants LB Lawrence Taylor and San Diego/St. Louis/Kansas City DE Leslie O'Neal (132.5) for No. 12 in NFL history (since 1982).
- ▶ Peppers recorded a sack and forced fumble on Detroit QB Matthew Stafford in Week 13. According to STATS LLC, he ranks **No. 5 in the NFL** in forced fumbles since 1994:

- He is the only player in NFL history to register at least 10 interceptions and 100.0 sacks (since 1982):

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his young career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he has played in every game since the start of the 2013 season. He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.

- This season, Daniels leads the Packers' defensive line in tackles (56) and sacks (four). He is second on the team with 11 QB hits.
- In Week 5 versus St. Louis, he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- Daniels is second on the Packers with 16.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Matthews-24.0). His 16.0 sacks are No. 8 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC:

DEFENSE SHIELD

The Packers' secondary is led by veteran cornerback **Sam Shields**, who earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl after a 2014 season that saw him record multiple interceptions for the fifth consecutive season.

- With a team-high three interceptions this season, Shields has registered multiple interceptions in each season from 2010-15.
- This season, he recorded interceptions in back-to-back games for the first time in his career (Weeks 3-4).
- Including playoffs, Shields is tied for No. 3 in the NFL among active players in interceptions since 2010:

MAKING AN IMPACT

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers' defense since his rookie season.

- ►After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests last season, he has started every game this season.
- Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and currently leads the Packers with 105 tackles (86 solo) this season.
- ► The second-year player registered a total of three interceptions last season (including playoffs). He is tied for second on the team with two this season.
- According to STATS LLC, his two sacks on the season are tied for the third most among NFL safeties.
- ► He has registered eight-plus tackles in eight games this season, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.
- Clinton-Dix has led the Packers in solo tackles a team-high four times this season.

GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION

Packers rookie CBs **Damarious Randall** and **Quinten Rollins** have stepped in and contributed in their first NFL season.

- ► Both Randall and Rollins are tied for second on the team with two interceptions.
- Randall leads the Packers with 14 passes defensed.
- Rollins is one of seven NFL rookies to have an interception and a sack this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

316 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Cowboys in Week 13 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 316 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 59th season of football in 2015. Including the playoffs, a total of 704,818 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the nine games last season. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. Last season, the Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 59-19-1 (.753) at home in the regular season since 2006.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 95th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling), including a Thanksgiving night game at Lambeau Field against the Chicago Bears, the first home Thanksgiving game since 1923.

- ► The Packers honored two of its all-time greats Brett Favre and Ron Wolf in halftime ceremonies during the 2015 season, with Wolf's name unveiled next to fellow Pro Football Hall of Famers on the stadium's east side Nov. 15 and Favre's name and retired No. 4 unveiled on Lambeau Field's north façade on Nov. 26.
- Green Bay's schedule includes seven games against 2014 playoff teams. Three of those games (Dallas, Detroit, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while four (Arizona, Carolina, Denver, Detroit) will come on the road.
- ► The Packers opened the season on the road, traveling to Chicago to play the Bears in Week 1 for the first time since 1981.
- ► Green Bay spent Week 2 playing a Sunday night game against the Seattle Seahawks. In Week 3, they faced the Kansas City Chiefs on *Monday Night Football*. It was the first time since 2008 that the Packers played their first two home games in primetime. It is the 23rd consecutive season (1993-2015) that the Packers are appearing on *MNF*. Green Bay is 15-8-1 at home on *MNF*, including 5-1 under McCarthy.
- ► The Packers traveled to San Francisco in Week 4, the fifth time the Packers and 49ers will met in the regular or postseason since 2012.
- ► The St. Louis Rams visited Lambeau for the first time since 2011 in Week 5, and in Week 6 the Packers hosted the San Diego Chargers for the first time since 2007 and only the fifth time overall. Green Bay improved to 8-2 against the Rams at Lambeau Field (dating back to 1990) and improved to 10-1 all-time versus the Chargers.
- ► Following Green Bay's first Week 7 bye since 2007, the Packers traveled to play the Broncos in Denver for the first time on a Sunday night. It was Green Bay's seventh visit to the Mile High City during the regular season and first since a 19-13 overtime victory in 2007. It was a matchup of two of three NFL teams (New England) that have won their division each of the last four years. It was the first of a three-game stretch the Packers will play against 2014 playoff teams.
- ► The Packers stayed on the road for a Week 9 game at Carolina, facing the Panthers in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2007-08. Green Bay fell to 8-5 against the Panthers during the regular season, including 5-3 at Carolina.
- ▶ The second half of the regular season saw Green Bay face division opponents in four consecutive weeks. The Packers faced the Lions at home in Week 10, traveled to play Minnesota in Week 11, came home and played the Bears on Thanksgiving in Week 12 and played at Detroit in another Thursday night game in Week 13. It was the first time Green Bay played division opponents in four consecutive weeks since 2000 (Weeks 14-17) and the first time the Packers played on consecutive Thursdays since 2007 (Weeks 12-13).
- ▶ The Packers' final four regular-season games are bookended by two home contests, which started with Dallas returning to Green Bay in Week 14. Including the postseason, the Packers won their fifth consecutive game against the Cowboys. Green Bay is 11-4 against Dallas at home during the regular and postseason.
- ▶ In Weeks 15-16, Green Bay travels west to play the Oakland Raiders and Arizona Cardinals. The Packers have won six consecutive games against the Raiders, including two on the road. In those six games, Green Bay has outscored the Raiders, 210-70. The Packers have won seven of the last eight regular-season matchups against the Cardinals, including each of the past three.
- ► Green Bay will host the Vikings at Lambeau to close out the regular season, marking the sixth time the two have met in the regular-season finale and first at Lambeau since 1996. Including playoffs, Green Bay has a 8-1-1 mark (.833) against the Vikings at Lambeau Field under Head Coach Mike McCarthy.

STREAKS & MILESTONES – REGULAR SEASON

18 RANDALL COBB

- ► Joined by WR **Jordy Nelson** as the first duo in franchise history to both catch 10-plus touchdown passes in the same season in 2014.
- ► Reached the 1,000-yard receiving mark for the first time in his career last season (1,287). He joined Nelson (1,433) as the the second duo in Packers' history to each reach 1,200 receiving yards in the same season, joining the 2004 duo of Javon Walker (1,382) and Donald Driver (1,208).
- ►With a career-best 91 receptions in 2014, seventh most in franchise history, joined Nelson (92) to become the only pair of Packers' players to reach 90 receptions each in the same season.
- ► Joined Nelson to become the first duo in NFL history to record 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season (2014).
- ► Cobb and Nelson became just the third set of teammates in NFL history with at least 1,200 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns each in the same season (2014), joining Minnesota's Cris Carter and Randy Moss in 1999 and Denver's Demaryius Thomas and Eric Decker in 2013.
- Registered a touchdown reception in a career-best six consecutive games (Games 4-9, 2014). It was the longest streak by a Packer since WR Sterling Sharpe (six) in 1994.
- ► Set a single-season franchise record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- ► With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, became the first person in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.
- ► Has three kick return scores (two punts, one kickoff) in his career, which ties him for No. 2 in franchise history behind only RB Travis Williams' six return TDs (one punt, five kickoffs).

2 MASON CROSBY

- ► Is the franchise all-time leader in career points (1,126) and field goal attempts (290) during the regular season.
- ► With 1,037 points from 2007-14, passed NE K Stephen Gostkowski (1,023) for the most points by an NFL player in his first eight seasons.
- ► Made six consecutive field goals from 50-plus yards during the 2014 season, a franchise record.
- ► Tied for No. 1 in team history for the most 100-point seasons with eight (Longwell).
- ► Made 23 straight field goals from Week 13 of 2010 through Week 10 of 2011, the longest regular-season streak in franchise history.
- ► In 2011, set a franchise record with a 58-yard field goal in Week 7 at Minnesota, eclipsing the mark of 56 yards he held (Week 1 at Philadelphia, 2010; Week 5 at Atlanta, 2011).

27 EDDIE LACY

- ► Became the first player in franchise history to rush for at least 1,000 yards and score 10-plus scrimmage touchdowns in each of his first two seasons (2013-14).
- ► With 2,317 rushing yards in 2013-14, passed John Brockington (2,132) for the most by a Packers' running back in his first two NFL seasons.
- ► With 13 touchdowns during the 2014 season, joined WRs Randall Cobb and Jordy Nelson as the first Green Bay trio to each score 10-plus touchdowns in the same season.
- ► Was the first Packers back to ever to record 100 yards from scrimmage and a touchdown reception in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12, 2014).
- ► Set a franchise record with nine straight games with more than 100 yards from scrimmage (2014).

- Became first Green Bay running back to register receptions of 55 yards or more in consecutive games (2014: at NO and vs. CHI).
- ► His 123 receiving yards at New Orleans in Week 8 (2014) were the second most by a Green Bay running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Eddie Lee Ivery's 128 yards at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.
- ► Set franchise rookie records in 2013 for rushing yards (1,178), rushing TDs (11) and rushing attempts (284).
- ► Tied the team rookie mark for 100-yard rushing games with four (2013).
- ► Named NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by *The Associated Press* and was selected to the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Vikings RB Adrian Peterson.

8 TIM MASTHAY

- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history (min. 150 punts) with a 44.1-yard gross punting average.
- ► Has recorded at least one 60-yard punt for six straight seasons (2010-15), a franchise record.
- ► In Weeks 13-14 this season, he became the first Packers punter to post a net average of 44-plus yards (min. four punts) in back to back games since net punting average was first tracked in 1976 (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Set a franchise record with nine punts against Detroit in Week 10.
- Ranks No. 1 in team annals (since 1976) with 129 punts placed inside the 20-yard line in his career.
- ► Set a single-season franchise record with his 45.6-yard gross average in 2011, surpassing Hentrich's 45.0-yard mark in 1997.
- ► Tied Sean Landeta's single-season franchise record (1998) by placing 30 punts inside the 20-yard line in 2012.
- ►Holds the top four single-season marks for net punting average in franchise history (since 1976) with a 38.95 average in 2013, a 38.93 average in 2012, a 38.56 average in 2011 and a 37.65 average in 2010.

52 CLAY MATTHEWS

- ► Led the team with 11.0 sacks in 2014 and earned his fifth trip to the Pro Bowl. Ranks No. 3 in team history with 66.5 career sacks.
- ► Tied for No. 1 in team history with four 10-plus sack seasons.
- Only player in franchise history to be named to the Pro Bowl each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).
- ►Only player in team history to score a defensive TD in each of his first three seasons in the league (2009-11).
- ► His 17 sacks in his first 20 games were the most by an NFL player to start his career at the time, eclipsing the mark of 16.5 set by Leslie O'Neal (1986, 1988) and John Abraham (2000-01).
- ► Is the first NFL player since sacks became an official stat in 1982 to post a double-digit sack total and a defensive TD in each of his first two seasons in the league.

- ► First player in franchise annals to post 10-plus sacks in each of his first two years in the NFL.
- ► His 29.5 sacks from 2009-11 were tied for No. 1 in team history with Tony Bennett for the most sacks by a Packer in his first three seasons in the league.

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

- ► Is the only player in NFL history with 100 career sacks and four interception returns for touchdowns.

- Has been selected to eight Pro Bowls since entering the league in 2002, which ties him with Charles Woodson and DeMarcus Ware for the most among active defensive players.
- ► With eight double-digit sack seasons as a pro, is tied with Jared Allen and DeMarcus Ware for the most in the NFL since 2002.
- ► Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times and was selected to the NFL's All-Decade team for the 2000s.

12 AARON RODGERS

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history with a 105.0 career passer rating.
- ► Reached the 30,000 career passing yards on his 3,652nd attempt, the fewest attempts needed in NFL history as he bested the previous record held by QB Johnny Unitas (3,695 attempts).
- ► Set NFL records with 494 pass attempts and 44 touchdown passes (586 and 49 including playoffs) at home without an interception. The streak lasted from Dec. 2, 2012, to Oct. 11, 2015.
- ► In 116 regular-season starts, has 43 career 300-yard games, 46 three-TD games and 70 zero-INT games (min. 15 attempts).
- ► Is the only QB in team history with four 400-yard passing games, including a 480-yard effort vs. Washington in 2013 that tied a franchise record. No one else has more than one 400-yard game.
- ► Tied with Brett Favre for the franchise record for 4,000-yard passing seasons (five).
- ► Threw for a career-best five interceptions last season, the third fewest in a single regular season in Packers' history.
- ►Threw six touchdown passes in the first half against the Bears in Week 10 (2014), tying Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (vs. Buffalo, Oct. 19, 1969) for the NFL record for most touchdown passes in a half. It was the second time Rodgers threw for a franchise-best six touchdowns in a game.
- ▶ Posted six consecutive zero-interception games during the 2014 season (Weeks 2-7), tying Bart Starr's franchise record (min. 15 attempts a game) set in 1964.
- Joined Patriots QB Tom Brady (2007) as the only players in NFL history to register four straight three-touchdown/zero-interception games in a single season (Weeks 4-7, 2014). Also joined Brady (eight in 2007) for the most three-touchdown/zero-interception games in NFL history in a single season (2014).
- ► When he hit the 200-TD mark for his career, he had thrown just 53 INTs to that point, the fewest in NFL history as he bested Tom Brady's mark of 88 INTs at the time of his 200th TD pass.
- ► In 2014, he became the first NFL quarterback to throw for 18-plus touchdowns with one or fewer interceptions in the first seven games of a season.
- ► Ranks No. 2 in NFL history for the most touchdown passes in a player's first 100 games with 203 (MIA QB Dan Marino, 217).
- Set an NFL single-season record in 2011 with a 122.5 passer rating and set team marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25), TD/INT ratio (7.50) and 300-yard games (eight).

- Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, the most in NFL history by a quarterback in his first five seasons as a starter.
- Threw a TD pass in 35 straight regular-season games at Lambeau Field from 2008-12, a team record (previous mark was 25 by Brett Favre, 1992-96). It was the second-longest home streak in NFL history behind Dan Marino's 39-game streak from 1983-88.
- Tied a single-game franchise record with six TD passes at Houston in Week 6 of 2012, matching Matt Flynn's mark (Jan. 1, 2012, vs. Detroit).
- Posted a 100-plus passer rating in six straight seasons (2009-14), the only quarterback in league history to accomplish that feat.
- ► In 2009, became first QB in NFL history to throw 30 or more TDs, seven or fewer INTs, and rush for five TDs in the same season.
- Has registered a passer rating over 110.0 in four or more consecutive games three times in his career (Weeks 3-7, 2009; Week 9, Weeks 11-13, 2010; Weeks 1-7, 9-12, 2011), one of only two quarterbacks in franchise history (Bart Starr, 1966) to accomplish the feat in a single season.

PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE

WR Davante Adams, 2nd Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- Has started 23 of the last 27 games, including the postseason.
- Started 11 of 16 regular-season games played as a rookie in 2014 and both playoff contests.
- Recorded 121 receiving yards against New England in Week 13 last season, the most by a Green Bay rookie since WR Sterling Sharpe's 124-yard effort vs. Detroit on Nov. 20, 1988.
- ► Set franchise postseason single-game records for the most receptions and receiving yards by a rookie when he posted seven catches for 117 yards (16.7 avg.) and a touchdown in the NFC Divisional playoff victory vs. Dallas.

LT David Bakhtiari, 3rd Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ► Has started every game at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ► Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.
- Earned second-team All-Pacific-12 honors from the conference's coaches each of his last two seasons (sophomore and junior) at Colorado.

LG Josh Sitton, 8th Year, Central Florida, D4b-08

- ► Has started 107 games since 2009, the most by an offensive player in a Green Bay uniform over that span.
- ► Was named to his second career Pro Bowl after the 2014 season.
- ► Was named 2010 Offensive Lineman of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association.
- ► According to STATS LLC, has allowed allowed just 15.0 sacks in his eight-year career.
- ► Was the only Packer on either side of the ball to not miss a snap from 2009-10.

C Corey Linsley, 2nd Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ► Has started every game he has played in. He has only missed two games in his career, Week 12 and Week 14 (ankle).
- First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ► Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.
- ► The Ohio native was part of a Buckeye team that won 24 consecutive games from 2012-13.

RG T.J. Lang, 7th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (44 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 in 2013.
- ► Has started 75 contests since 2011.
- Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ► Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 6th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3. Has started 24 of 29 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ► Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder), the most regularseason starts by a Packers rookie tackle since Tauscher's 14 in 2000.
- Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Richard Rodgers, 2nd Year, California, D3a-14

- Ranks second on the team this season in receptions (49).
- ► Is tied for the team lead with seven touchdown receptions this season.
- Set a regular-season franchise record for a tight end with 146 yards on eight receptions (18.3 avg.), including a game-winning 61-yard touchdown catch with no time on the clock, at Detroit in Week 13.

- ► Including the postseason, has registered one or more receptions in 22 of the last 24 games.
- Played in all 16 games with five starts as a rookie in 2014, recording 20 receptions for 225 yards (11.3 avg.) and two touchdowns.
- ► Became the first rookie TE to start for the Packers in a season opener since Jackie Harris opened in a two-tight-end set in 1990.
- ► Was the first rookie TE to appear in all 16 games for Green Bay since Bubba Franks in 2000.

WR Randall Cobb, 5th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- Leads the team in receptions (65) and receiving yards (737) and is No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six).
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ► His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 were the seventh most in team history.
- ► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ▶ Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 in 2013, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.
- ► Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- ► With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, he became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 11th Year, California, D1-05

- His career passer rating of 105.0 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
- ▶ In 116 regular-season starts (78-38 record), has posted 43 games with 300-plus passing yards, 70 without an interception and 67 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB James Starks, 6th Year, Buffalo, D6-10

- ► Has set career highs in scrimmage yards (884), receptions (39), receiving yards (369) and receiving touchdowns (three) this season.
- ► Has put together two of the finest rushing games of his career this season. In Week 2, he carried the ball 20 times for 95 yards (4.8 avg.), and in Week 6, he racked up 112 yards on just 10 carries (11.2 avg.), becoming the first Packers player to rush for 100-plus yards on 10 or fewer carries since RB Brandon Jackson at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010 (115 yards on 10 carries). He also registered a 65-yard touchdown against San Diego, the longest by a Green Bay player since RB DeShawn Wynn's 73-yard touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2008.
- Led the NFL with 315 rushing yards during the 2010 playoffs.

FB John Kuhn, 10th Year, Shippensburg, W-07 (Pit)

- Selected to the Pro Bowl for the second time in 2014. His first selection came in 2011, when he was the first Green Bay fullback to be honored since William Henderson in 2004.
- ► Has played in 135 of 140 games (146 of 151 including playoffs) during his nine seasons in Green Bay, appearing in all 16 regular-season contests in five of those seasons, including 2014.
- Only player on the team to have a rushing and receiving touchdown each season from 2008-11, and was the first Packer to achieve that feat since RB Ahman Green (2001-04).
- ► Led the team with four rushing TDs in 2011 and led the running backs with six total TDs.

PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

DE Letroy Guion, 8th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- Has started four of the 10 games he has played in this season after starting all 16 regular-season games and both postseason contests last season.
- Signed with Green Bay during the 2014 offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.
- Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota over the past two seasons, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

NT B.J. Raji, 7th Year, Boston College, D1a-09

- Has started 12 of 13 games this season after missing the entire 2014 season with a biceps injury suffered during a preseason game vs. Oakland.
- Played in 70 games from 2010-13 (including playoffs), tied for second most in NFL by a defensive lineman over that span.
- ► Named to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Packers defensive tackle since Bob Brown in 1972 to receive the honor.
- ► Earned All-Rookie team honors from *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA in 2009, the first Packers defensive lineman to be selected since DE Vonnie Holiday in 1998.

DT Mike Daniels, 4th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks second on the team with 16.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Clay Matthews-24.0).
- Started all 16 games for the first time in his career in 2014 and finished first on the Packers defensive line with 5.5 sacks while setting a career high with 69 tackles.
- ▶ Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Mike Neal, 6th Year, Purdue, D2-10

Has started a career-best 12 of 13 games played this season.

- ▶ Ranks No. 3 on the Packers with 16.5 sacks since 2012.
- ► Transitioned to a hybrid OLB/DE role in 2013 and racked up 102 tackles (66 solo), a interception, a forced fumble and 9.5 sacks from 2013-14.

BLB Jake Ryan, Rookie, Michigan, D4-15

- Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 at Detroit in his first pro start.
- Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

MLB Clay Matthews, 7th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- Ranks No. 7 in the NFL since entering the league in 2009 with 66.5 sacks. His sack total ranks No. 3 in team history (since 1982).
- ► With a team-high 11.0 sacks last season, is now tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Was named to the Pro Bowl for the fifth time in 2014. Is the only Packer in team history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the NFL (2009-12).
- Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- ▶ Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year voting.

ROLB Julius Peppers, 14th Year, North Carolina, FA-14

- Signed with Green Bay last offseason after playing the previous four seasons for Chicago and the first eight of his career for Carolina after being selected as the No. 2 overall pick in 2002.
- ▶ Only player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl eight times (2004-06, 2008-12) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- Has played in 125 consecutive regular-season games, tied for the longest active streak among NFL linebackers.
- Ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (132.5) and No. 5 in forced fumbles (45) since entering the NFL in 2002. His sack total is tied for No. 12 in NFL history (since 1982).
- Has blocked 13 kicks (12 field goals, one extra point) during his career.

LCB Casey Hayward, 4th Year, Vanderbilt, D2b-12

- Played in all 16 games in 2014 and tied for No. 1 on the team (LB Julius Peppers) and No. 7 in the NFL for total takeaways with five (three INTs, two fumble recoveries).
- ► Missed most of the 2013 season with a nagging hamstring injury.
- Became the first Green Bay CB ever to be named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team (est. 1974) and was chosen as the league's Defensive Rookie of the Year by ProFootballFocus.com in 2012. Led all NFL rookies with a team-high six INTs.

RCB Sam Shields, 6th Year, Miami, FA-10

- ► Leads the team with three interceptions this season.
- Recorded interceptions in back-to-back games this season (Weeks 3-4) for the first time in his career. Ranks No. 2 on the team in passes defensed this season (13).
- ► Finished second on the team with 13 passes defensed in 2014 to go along with two interceptions. Earned first career trip to the Pro Bowl.
- Started all 14 games he appeared in during the 2013 season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- In Green Bay's NFC Championship Game win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 6th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ►Finished with a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-offensive linemen in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 2nd Year, Alabama, D1-14

- Leads the team in tackles this season with 105 (86 solo) and is tied for second on the team in interceptions (two).
- Has started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games last season, finishing second on the team in tackles (95).
- ► Was the second safety ever drafted by Green Bay in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 overall in 1993).
- Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

MIKE McCARTHY PRESS CONFERENCES

During the regular season (for a Sunday game), the head coach will be available in the Media Auditorium on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

The team's locker room will generally be open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and following games.

- ► At the conclusion of all games, the locker room will be opened following the NFL's standard "cooling-off period."
- All interviews with players on the practice squad or injured reserve need to be requested and approved through the P.R. department.
- ► Any requests to interview players other than at the aforementioned times should be directed to a member of the Packers' P.R. department.

ASSISTANT COACH AVAILABILITY

All interviews by request only, through the P.R. department

- ► All assistants will generally be available in-person one day per week in the media auditorium (special teams/defense) and interview room (offense).
- Following games, McCarthy will be the only coach available to the media.
- ► Tom Clements (associate head coach/offense), and coordinators Edgar Bennett (offense), Dom Capers (defense) and Ron Zook (special teams) – will continue to serve as primary spokesmen in their respective areas.
- ► However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinator.
- ► Assistant coaches also are available for interviews on more personal subjects, such as Winston Moss on his NFL playing career.
- ► No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- Sarah Quick (quicks@packers.com) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact Tom Fanning (fanningt@packers.com) or Nate LoCascio (locascion@packers.com).

GENERAL PRACTICE REPORTING GUIDELINES PRACTICE INFORMATION

Once granted admission to practice, the Packers make the following requirements of reporting across all media platforms (print, television, radio, online or other) mandatory. All policies in place during the regular season are done so for competitive reasons and in accordance with guide-lines established by the Pro Football Writers of America. Failure to adhere to the following policies will result in the revocation of practice access.

- ►NO reporting of specific plays (trick or other), personnel groupings or special/unusual formations. This includes the reporting of individual players as part of sub-packages or special formations across offense, defense and special teams.
- ►It is incumbent upon media to ask a member of the P.R. staff about any information that may be close to violating these policies BEFORE it is reported.

PRIVATE TEAM COMMUNICATION

The Packers ask all media to refrain from reporting and/or recording/filming any team communication meant solely for the team.

- ► This includes the post-practice team huddle, in which McCarthy addresses his players. It also includes mid-practice and/or post-practice communication between any coach and his players, especially conversations of a reprimanding, negative nature.
- In general, reporting that the conversation took place is acceptable, just not the details of those conversations. Details are not to be relayed to the

public either directly (through first-hand hearing), or indirectly (through interviews, even if the subject answers the question).

► If media has any question as to whether communication should be kept private, please contact the P.R. department before writing or airing such conversations.

INJURY INFORMATION

All information concerning player injuries will be issued by Head Coach Mike McCarthy. Please do not address injury questions to Ted Thompson.

PRACTICE ACCESS & PHOTOGRAPHY GUIDELINES PRACTICE CREDENTIAL INFORMATION

Admittance will not be granted without a credential. No guests will be

permitted to use media credentials, which are subject to revocation if used in that manner.

- ► Practice sessions will be open to members of the media who cover the team on a regular basis, unless otherwise stipulated.
- ►All other media (news departments, etc.) must secure a practice field pass from the public relations department and sign the necessary waiver before attending practice. No exceptions can be made.
- ► Visiting media may not attend practice in the regular season.
- ▶ Practice field (season-long photo ID and daily) credentials, required for all practice sessions, are not transferable and will be closely monitored.
- ► Under policy, members of the media (who have yet to do so) will need to sign a liability waiver before gaining access to the Packers' practices. They will be able to sign the waiver upon picking up their practice field credentials from Sarah Quick in the P.R. department office.
- ► Members of the media are asked to email their requests for practice field credentials to the P.R. department's Sarah Quick (quicks@packers.com) at least 24 hours in advance of the day (or days) on which they wish to cover practice.
- Practices will be open to media for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also, as in previous years, videotaping opportunities will be limited to a few periods at the beginning of practice. Camera phones are allowed to take only still photos during permissible "shooting" periods, any social media video applications (Vine, Instagram, Periscope etc.) are not allowed at anytime.

ADDITIONAL PHOTO/VIDEO GUIDELINES

- ► Filming or relaying messages/information on closed-circuit televisions throughout the building, including the locker room, is prohibited.
- Shots that require members of the media to be in a kneeling position with camera resting on the ground are strongly discouraged.
- ► No tripods are allowed during practice.
- Still photography is not permitted in the locker room.

INJURY-FOOTAGE POLICY

- Again this season, the Packers respectfully ask all photographers (video and still) to follow guidelines related to shooting injured players.
- Photographers are asked to avoid filming, photographing, printing and/ or airing any shots of any injury situation, while the injury occurs, while trainers attend to/treat the injured player, and while the player is leaving the field, either on his own or with aid. This includes minor injuries.
- ► The team will allow shots of players after they've been treated. For instance, cameras are allowed to shoot a player on the sideline with ice on his knee, after trainers have left.
- However, cameras are not allowed to film a player on crutches, either on the field or in the locker room.
- If outlets choose not to respect this policy or any other policy the team will have no choice but to consider limiting access to the field and/ or locker room.

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

Photo credentials will not be issued to free-lance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

OTHER POLICIES & INFORMATION 2015 NFL NON-GAME ONLINE CONTENT POLICY

- Accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution:
- is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds maximum in two-team markets -- 90 seconds per team);
- may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours;
- appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content);
- ▶ is not posted live, and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website, www.packers.com in this instance.
- The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is comprised entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("Talking Head" reporting), including pre- or post-game stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.
- While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the Accredited Organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.
- The Packers do not permit raw video of any regular-season practices to be posted on the Internet (including Vine, other video applications).

LIVE BLOGGING/TWITTER POLICY

The Packers ask that members of the media utilizing such technology adhere to the following guidelines, similar to policies already in place:

- ► NO live reports can be filed from the practice field.
- ►NO detailed speculation as to the potential nature or severity of an injury or level of practice participation until the injury report is issued. Once again, acknowledging that an injury occurred and providing general details (i.e. 'right leg...' or 'left wrist...') is permitted, but anything beyond that would be purely speculative and possibly inaccurate, likewise with levels of practice participation.
- ►NO entries that violate the team's policy in regards to practice information (schemes, formations, etc.) or private team communication.

MISCELLANEOUS

For their safety and the safety of Packers players, media are requested to adhere to the following:

- Any member of the media who does not have a credential will be asked to obtain one and sign the necessary waiver at the P.R. office or practice field before gaining admittance.
- All items brought to practice (cameras, bags, equipment, etc.) should be stored against the wall, away from the field, for safety reasons.
- ► Food is not allowed during practice. Bottled drinks are allowed, as long as they are stored in a personal bag against the wall, and consumed near the wall.
- Any equipment not stored should be held at all times; when avoiding oncoming action, it is important that anything in your possession moves as you move.
- ▶ When asked to move, media should move immediately.
- No players or coaches may be actively engaged in conversation or interviewed while practice is in progress.

CELL PHONES

The team does not tolerate cell-phone distractions at practice. Please set all phones to off or vibrate. Any phone conversations should be conducted well away from the field, while lengthy conversations must be conducted outside of the practice gate.

Sunday afternoon. The Packers got all they could handle from the rebuilding Bears but took control down the stretch to beat them for the 10th time in 11 games. Rodgers threw for three touchdowns, two to Jones, and the Green Bay Packers beat Chicago 31-23 to spoil John Fox's debut as Bears coach

including the postseason.

Rodgers improved to 13-3 lifetime against Chicago. The 2014 MVP completed 18 of 23 passes for 189 yards. Jones, who spent seven seasons in Green Bay before signing with Dakkand lastyvear, caught four passes for 51 yards. That included a one-handed grab on a 13-yard score late in the first quarter that left Rodgers flashing back to 2012, when Jones led the league with 14 TD catches. He added a 1-yarder in the third - a good start after being released by the Raiders in the spring and by the New York Giants on the final roster cut. With Jordy Nelson (knee) out for the season, the Packers were quick to bring back Jones. Randall Gobb, hampered late in the preseason by a sprained right shoulder, had 38 yards receiving. He caught a 5-yard buchdown that made it

24-16 early in the fourth quarter, and Clay Matthews sealed the win by intercepting Jay Cutler at the Green Bay 20 and returning it 42 yards. Eddie Lavy ran for 85 yards and a tate touchdown. Julius Peppers chipped in with 1½ sacks for the four-time defending NFC North champions. The Bears, essentially starting over under Fox and new general manager Fyan Pace after a five-win season, kept this one close though Cutler had a rough afternoon. He was 18 of 36 for 225 yards, with that late interception by Matthews. He also threw a 24-yard touchdown to Martellus Bennett with 34 seconds left, but Green Bay recovered the onside kick.

Under pressure near his own end zone, Smith also threw an interception to Sam Shields at the Chiefs' 19 with about 7 minutes left in the third quarter. Shields returned it 15 yards, and on the next play, Rodgers found Cobb for a 4-yard touchdown and a 31-7 lead. Rodgers and Cobb hooked up for another 4-yard scoring pass in the fourth. With the score, Rodgers set the franchise record with his fourth career game of at least five touchdown passes

GREEN BAY 17, SAN FRANCISCO 3

SANTA CLARA, Calif. -- With his receiving corps banged up and depleted, Aaron Rodgers still made all the big throws to keep Green Bay unbeaten and exactly where it expected to be a quarter into the season. It just took all the while to gate warmed up before things got rolling. Rodgers passed for 224 years and a touchdown, ran Ty yards to set up a key second-half score, and the Packers beat the hapless San Francisco 49ers 17-3 on Sunday for their first 4-0 start in four years.

Richard Rodgers caught a 9-yard touchdown pass on the game's opening drive before Rodgers got his team going in the second half after a slow

start to snap a four-game losing streak to San Francisco, which included a pair of playoff defaals. While methodical with nothing fancy, Green Bay seemed unfazed with a short week and long trip West after beating Kansas City last Monday night. This is the team's first 4-0 start since winning the initial 13 games in 2011. Green Bay wanted to get this far unscathed. The Packers certainly hope their trip to Lew's Stadium will be the first of two this season. The Super Bowl comes to the second-year, \$1.3 billion

Bay Area venue in four months for its 50th year celebration. Colin Kaepernick threw his fifth interception in two games and the 49ers (1-3) have been limited to 28 total points over three games while giving up 107 points. The guarderback was booed in the fourth quarter along with rookle punter Bradley Pinion. Green Bay capitalized shortly after San Francisco's Reggie Bush was stuffed for no gain trying to go up the middle on third-and-11 in a play call

that was immediately scrutinized

On the ensuing drive, James Jones caught a 38-yard pass on the left sideline by barely staying in bounds. Rodgers then scrambled 17 yards to

set up John Kuhn's 1-yard scoring burst. Green Bay made just enough plays. The Packers sacked Kaepernick on consecutive snaps late in the first half, and the Niners settled for Phil Dawson's 33-yard field opal in their best scoring opportunity of the day. Jones wound up with five receptions to 83-yards in the fifth meeting between the rivals since 2012, while Randall Cobb had his streak of seven games with either a touchdown or 100-plus yards receiving snapped. Eddie Lacy ran for 90 yards and converted two fourth downs. Cobb and Richard Rodgers also had five catches apiece.

Green Bay went on the road after a Monday night game for just the fifth time since 2006, improving to 4-1 in those games. The Packers also improved to 10-2 during the regular season in California since 1990. Kaepernick, who had played some of his best games against the Packers, went 13 for 25 for 160 yards and a 55.4 passer rating. Carlos Hyde was

held to 20 yards on eight carries.

GREEN BAY, Wis. - Aaron Rodgers' remarkable run of mistake-free football at home is over. Green Bay, though, is still perfect this season. A relentless defense helped the Packers overcome an unusually average day from their MVP quarterback. Rodgers threw for two touchdowns and 241 yards, and the defense had three sacks and four interceptions to hold off the St. Louis Rams for a **GREEN BAY 24, ST. LOUIS 10**

24-10 victory on Sunday. Rodgers was 19 of 30 with long scoring strikes to receivers Ty Montgomery and James Jones for the Packers (5-0).

But NFL-record streaks of 586 pass attempts and 49 touchdown passes at home without an interception for Rodgers ended in the first quarter on linebacker James Laurinatis' diving pick of a tipped ball for the Rams (2-3). Rodgers threw another interception in the second quarter before losing a fumble in the third on a sack.

The Rams defense heeded coach Jeff Fisher's advice to get their hands on the football. The Packers defense was still better. Relentless pressure on quarterback Nick Foles helped keep the Packers unbeaten. Foles' four interceptions were a career worst, with two in the

fourth quarter inside the Packers 10. Rooke cornerback Quinten Rollins returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown for a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, and picked off another pass at the 7 with 23 seconds left. Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix intercepted a tipped pass in the end zone on third-and-goal at the 7. Greg Zuerlein was 1 for 4 on field-goal tries, hitting from 42 but missing his other three attempts, all coming from at least 50 yards. One kick in the second half was blocked by Datone Jones.

The mistakes wasted another strong effort for Rams rookie Todd Gurley, who for the second straight week had his best production, with 159 yards rushing on 30 carries. He dented a defense that had held opposing starting running backs to an average of 36 yards on 11 attempts the previous three games.

But a week after defeating previously unbeaten Arizona, the Rams couldn't repeat the feat on a warm fall afternoon in Green Bay. Foles was 11 of 30 for 141 yards and a touchdown. His longest completion came on a 68-yarder to Stedman Bailey late in the fourth quarter. Otherwise, the Packers' pass rush overwhelmed an inexperienced offensive line that lost veteran guard Rodger Saffold in the first quarter to a

shoulder injury. The defense held up in spite of losing tackle B.J. Raji to a groin injury and linebacker Nick Perry (shoulder). Guard T.J. Lang also left in the second

quarter with a knee injury.

Star linebacker Clay Matthews set the tone with 11/2 sacks and several other trips into the backfield.

Down by 8, Rodgers' fourth-and-goal pass from the Carolina 4 was intercepted by linebacker homas Davis

It capped a frustrating day for the Packers. It was the second straight game the Panthers nearly surrendered a commanding fourth-quarter lead. Carolina lost a 17-point lead on Monday night to Indianapolis before rallying to win 29-26 in overfime. Coach Ron Rivera said the Panthers can't put themselves in that position. Carolina outscored Green Bay 24-0 in the second quarter to open a 27-7 halftime lead behind three Newton scores. The dual-threat quarterback was dominant in the first half, throwing for 209 yards and two touchdowns and rushing for 37 yards and another score. The Packers opened the game in man coverage and Newton made them pay right away by finding huge holes to run through for big gains. Carolina the lead for good at 10-7 with a 52-yard pass to rokie Devin Funchess leading to a 7-yard TD pass to Greg Olsen. Later, he came back with a 39-yard touchdown strike to Corey Bown with 41 seconds let in the half. Still, Rodgers wouldn't give in. His 29-yard TD pass to James Starks and a 2-point conversion toss to Davante Adams cut the lead to 15. Then, on fourth-and-14. Rodgers rolled to ins left evading three pass rushers and fired over the middle on the run to James Jones for a 36-yard completion to keep Green Bay's hopes alive. Rodgers completed the drive with a 3-yard pass to Richard Rodgers, his second touchdown of the game, to cut

the lead to 37-29.

A nervous Stafford said he couldn't watch that play. He threw for 242 yards for the league-worst Lions, an organization that had been reeling following the midseason firings of the team president and general manager. to break up the conversion try.

The Packers (6-3) lost their third straight game, but this was a new low after their two previous defeats came on the road to Super Bowl

contenders Denver and Carolina. A sluggish game filled with three-and-outs turned into a thriller in the fourth quarter. The Lions barely held on for their first road win against Green Bay since 1991. Matt Prater missed two extra points, but also hit field goals from 49 and 51 yards.

Rodgers was 35 of 61 for 333 yards, but wasn't at his best. Receivers including Randall Cobb and Adams had a few drops. Green Bay finally got into the end zone when Rodgers found tight end Richard Rodgers for a 4-yard touchdown pass with 5:55 left. Lance Moore's 4-yard touchdown reception increased Detroit's lead to 18-10, and the Lions held off the Packers following Perillo's score. It has been a precipitous decline for a quick-strike offense that was once the envy of the NFL. The Packers' running game stalled, with James Starks gaining just 42 yards on 15 carries against the league's 26th-ranked defense. Even Crosby's 44-yard field goal in the first quarter needed a little luck after glancing off the left upright but over the crossbar. Otherwise, a Derroit defense without linebacker DeAndre Levy and cornerback Rashean Mathis for the year frustrated Aaron Rodgers and the

Packers for much of the afternoon. The Lions didn't accomplish much against the Packers' rejuvenated defense until the fourth quarter.

GREEN BAY, Wis. -- Drenched from a soaking rain, Jay Cutler finally walked out of Lambeau Field with a win. The defense helped make Thursday night a Thanksgiving to remember for the Chicago Bears. Cutler: threw for 200 yards and a score and the Bears held off the Green Bay Packers on fourth-and-goal from the 8 with 22 seconds left for a

17-13 victory Aaron Rodgers' throw to the end zone deflected off receiver Davante Adams' hands in the cold rain. James Jones couldn't hang on to a potential

touchdown catch on third down

Cornerback Tracy Porter Intercepted Rodgers' pass with 3:19 left at the Bears 45 on the previous drive. Rodgers took a shot to the back of his left arm near the elbow in the third quarter from intebacker Lamarr Houston while the quarterback recovered a high snap. He said he lost teeling for a wildle in his left hand, gradually regaining full feeling in three fingers by the end of the game. Rodgers was 22 of 43 for 202 yards and a touchdown. Cutler was a little better, somewhat of a surprise given how poortly he has played at Lambeau in his career with the Bears. In his four previous games at Lambeau, all losses. Cutler had thrown 12 interceptions. But with head coach John Fox and offensive coordinator Adam Gase. Cutler avoided throwing an interception.

Green Bay had won six of its previous seven at Lambeau in the series. And Thursday night seemed to set up perfectly for the Packers faithful on an emotional night with the team honoring former quarterback Brett Favre at halftime. His name and No. 4 joined the franchise's five other retired numbers on the north facade inside the stadium.

Chicago (5-6) has won there of its last down. The Packers (7-4) lost a second straight home game. The Packers caught a break after Cutter mishandled a shotpun snap on third-and-11 to set up a punt. But McCarthy's offense couldn't capitalize, moving quickly up the field on its final two drives only to come up short. Robbie Gould's 21-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for Chicago was the only scoring for either team in the second half in a game played in featile Lacy fumbled deep in Bears territory in the second quarter after getting hit from behind. Cutter cashed in on Chicago's next drive by finding Zach Miller for a 3-yard touchown pass in the open on third-and-11 with 603 beft in the half. Adams dropped another pass in the open on third-and-long in the first quarter that could have led to a big gain. Lacy ran for 105 yards on 17 carries, and also scored on a 25-yard catch-and-run. For the Bears, Jeremy Langford had 48 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. Matt Forte returned after missing three games with a knee injury and ran for 44 yards on 15 carries. The Bears also got Alshon Jeffery back, who had seven catches for 90 yards. He has missed five games this season with groin and shoulder allments. The defense made the biggest statement.

With 435 yards and 29 first downs, the Packers (9-4) got better balance and production out of an offense that still struggled at times with penalties

and short-yardage situations. The defense and running game came up with big plays in the fourth quarter. The biggest change for the Packers this week was McCarthy taking back play-calling responsibility from associate head coach Tom Clements. He called it a tough personal decision to make with a long time assistant.

Dallas' touchdown came on Robert Turbin's 7-yard run midway through the third quarter to make it 14-7. The Cowboys (4-9) suffered a setback to their chances of winning the mediocre NFC East. Aaron Rodgers threw for 218 yards and two scores. But all the Packers really needed from their star quarterback late in the game was to hand

off the ball.

Lacy and Starks each had touchdown runs in the fourth quarter during the rainy evening. Dalks also had success on the ground, with Darren McFadden running for 111 yards on nine carries. Dalks rushed for 171 yards, and 80 came on four plays that led to Turbin's score. But the Cowboys' passing game struggled.

Matt Caseel, starting his sixth game for the injured Tony Romo, was 13 of 29 for 114 yards. A pass that deflected off star receiver Dez Bryant's hands was intercepted in the end zone by Sam Shields in the first quarter. Bryant was held to one catch for 9 yards. He had a long reception in the second quarter overturned on replay - the same thing happened to him last season during the Cowboys' loss to the Packers in an NFC divisional round playoff game.
