Raiders 10, Broncos 16

- The Raiders were defeated by the Broncos by a score of 16-10 in the first divisional contest of the 2017 campaign. The team is now 2-2 on the season.
- The loss moves the all-time regular season series against the Broncos to 61-51-2.
- Now at 2-2, the Silver and Black will return home to face the Ravens in Week 5, and have divisional matchups against the Chargers and Chiefs in the back-to-back weeks to follow.

Game Highlights

- WR **Johnny Holton** scored his first receiving touchdown on the Raiders' longest offensive play of the season (64 yards).
- LB **Cory James** led both teams in tackles (10) for the second consecutive game.
- DE **Khalil Mack** recorded first multi-sack game of 2017, also marking his third-consecutive game with a sack.

Offense

- **QB Derek Carr**
 - Carr put the Raiders on the board late in the second quarter with a 64-yard pass to **WR Johnny Holton** to culminate a 5-play, 99-yard drive lasting 2:23 to cut the Broncos lead to 10-7. The 64-yard pass to Holton marks the Raiders' longest play of the season.
 - The 99-yard drive by the Raiders' offense was the first such drive since Oct. 2, 2011.
 - Carr exited the game in the third quarter with an injury.
 - Carr finished throwing for 143 yards 10-of-18 passing with one touchdown for a passer rating of 100.0.
- **WR Johnny Holton**
 - With 3:36 left in the opening half, Holton recorded his first NFL touchdown hauling in a 64-yard pass from **QB Derek Carr**, marking the Raiders longest passing play of the 2017 season.
 - Prior to today's matchup, Holton had recorded just two receptions for 34 yards, all coming in 2016.
 - Holton recorded

QB EJ Manuel

- Manuel entered the game with 4:18 left in the third quarter after **QB Derek Carr** suffered a back injury.
- On his first full offensive series, Manuel led the team down on a 9-play, 73-yard scoring drive culminating in a 38-yard field goal by **K Giorgio Tavecchio**.
- Manuel finished the day with completing 11-of-17 attempts for 106 yards.

Defense

- **DE Mario Edwards Jr.**
 - On the second play of the game, Edwards Jr. got to QB Trevor Siemian for a 10-yard sack, his third takedown of the season. Edwards Jr.'s sack helped forced a three-and-out for the Broncos on the opening series of the game.
 - His three sacks on the year mark a new career high.
 - Edwards Jr. totaled three tackles and one sack in the loss.
- **LB Bruce Irvin**
 - Irvin recorded his first sack of the season, taking down QB Trevor Siemian on third-and-15 for a loss of four yards. The sack gave the Raiders the ball back with 1:08 left in the first half.
 - Irvin finished with two tackles (one solo) and one sack.
- **DE Khalil Mack**
 - With 11:28 to play in the third quarter, Mack brought down QB Trevor Siemian for a 2-yard loss, his third consecutive game with a sack.
 - Mack recorded his second sack of the day with 6:15 left in the third quarter for a loss of four yards.
 - With his two sacks, Mack has 9.0 sacks in his last four games against Denver. It also marks his third multi-sack game against the club.
 - Mack now has eight career games recording at least two sacks, tied for fifth-most in club history (Bill Pickel), and tied for 24th-most in NFL history through four seasons.
 - His second sack of the afternoon also marked the 34th of his career, moving him into eighth on the club's all-time sack list.
 - Mack finished the night with seven tackles (seven solo), three for loss and two sacks for 10 yards.

Special Teams

- **P Marquette King**
 - King downed the Broncos inside the 5-yard line early in the second quarter, his third time doing so this season. King's three such punts in 2017 lead the NFL among punters.

- King entered Week 4 leading the league in punting average (53.3) and punted a total of six times for 306 yards (51.0 avg.) with a long of 58 yards and two punts downed inside the opponent's' 20-yard line.
- **K Giorgio Tavecchio**
 - Tavecchio remained perfect on the year (seven-for-seven) following his 38-yard field goal with 5:23 to go in the fourth quarter. The field goal brought the contest to a one-possession game.
 - Tavecchio finished making his lone field goal attempt and added one PAT.

Other Notables

- **LB Cory James** finished the day as the game's leading tackler, recording 10 stops (10 solo) with two tackles for loss.
- **WR Cordarrelle Patterson** led the team with six receptions and totaled 33 yards (5.5 avg.), adding two kick returns for 70 yards (35.0 avg.).
- **T Donald Penn** started in his 160th consecutive regular season game, tied for the second-most starts among active offensive lineman.
