CAROLINA HEADS WEST TO TAKE ON OAKLAND RAIDERS

CAROLINA AT OAKLAND

Carolina heads west to take on the Oakland Raiders at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum. The game is the first of back-to-back West Coast games for the Panthers as a trip to Seattle follows.

The Panthers enter the game against the Raiders following a 23-20 victory over the New Orleans Saints on Thursday Night Football. The Panthers have won three of their last four games.

Oakland enters the game at 8-2 following a 27-20 victory over the Houston Texans on Monday Night Football in Mexico City.

The Panthers and Raiders are meeting for the sixth time on Sunday. The teams last met in 2012 in Charlotte and Carolina leads the all-time series 3-2. The last game at Oakland came in 2008 when Carolina earned a 17-6 victory.



NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Panthers head coach Ron Rivera was born in Fort Ord, Calif., and played collegiately at the University of California.
- Panthers assistant defensive backs/nickels coach Curtis Fuller was a special teams assistant with Oakland in 2007.
- Panthers assistant defensive backs coach Richard Rodgers participated in the NFL's Minority Internship Program with the Raiders during the team's 1996 training camp.
- Panthers punter Michael Palardy entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent with Oakland in 2014 and spent the last game that season on the team's practice squad.
- Panthers linebacker Shaq Thompson is from Sacramento, Calif.
- Raiders head coach Jack Del Rio was the defensive coordinator for the Panthers in 2002.
- Raiders offensive coordinator Bill Musgrave was on the Panthers coaching staff from 1999-2000, serving as the quarterbacks coach in 1999 and the offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks coach in 2000.
- Raiders special teams coordinator Brad Seely was on the Panthers coaching staff from 1995-98. He also coached the offensive line at N.C. State in 1982.
- Raiders linebackers coach Sal Sunseri was a member of the Panthers coaching staff from 2002-08.
- Raiders strength and conditioning assistant Kevin Kijowski, a native of Charlotte, N.C., coached at Appalachian State from 2011-13 and UNC-Wilmington in 2014.
- Raiders cornerback David Amerson is from Greensboro, N.C., and played collegiately at N.C. State.
- Raiders cornerback Antonio Hamilton is from Johnston, S.C., and played collegiately at South Carolina State.
- Raiders defensive lineman Denico Autry is from Albemarle, N.C.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

NFL: 20th season **Panthers:** 6th season

Regular Season: 51-38-1 (.572)

Postseason: 3-3 (.500)

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In five seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, Rivera led the Panthers to their second consecutive NFC South championship and the team's first playoff win since 2005. The Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

Before joining the Panthers, Rivera was an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at Cal (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., Rivera and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Jack DEL RIO

NFL: 20th season Raiders: 2nd season

Regular Season: 83-82 (.503) **Postseason:** 1-2 (.333)

Jack Del Rio was named the 19th head coach in Oakland Raiders history on January 15, 2015. Del Rio is in his 31st year in the NFL and his 20th season coaching.

Last year, Del Rio oversaw significant improvements as the Raiders made considerable advances in all phases of the game.

Del Rio joined the Raiders after spending previous three seasons (2012-14) as the Denver Broncos' defensive coordinator. While with the Broncos, he was part of three-straight AFC West titles and helped lead Denver to an appearance in Super Bowl XLVIII following the 2013 campaign. Del Rio was interim head coach (weeks 10-13) in 2013 while John Fox underwent a heart procedure, posting a 3-1 record.

Del Rio was previously head coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2003-2011). His defenses have ranked in the top six in the NFL in yards per game allowed in 10 of his 18 seasons as a position coach, coordinator or head coach. During that time, he has coached 20 defensive players to a total of 29 Pro Bowl selections.

Del Rio played linebacker at Southern California. As a senior, he earned All-American honors and was drafted in the third round in 1985 by the New Orleans Saints, and went on to play 11 NFL seasons with Saints (1985-86), Kansas City Chiefs (1987-88), Dallas Cowboys (1989-1991) and Minnesota Vikings (1992-95). He played in 160 career games, totaling over 1,100 tackles and earning a Pro Bowl selection in 1994.

Born April 4, 1963 in Castro Valley, Calif., Del Rio and his wife, Linda, have four children including three daughters and a son.

GAME SUMMARY

CAROLINA 17, OAKLAND 6

DECEMBER 23, 2012 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, N.C.

Wide receiver Steve Smith caught four passes for 45 yards and one touchdown and guarterback Cam Newton passed for 170 yards and one score leading Carolina to a 17-6 win over Oakland. Smith's 23-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter proved to be the winning score. thanks to a swarming defensive effort that limited the Raiders to just two field goals and 189 total yards. Shortly after Smith's score with 3:12 left in the first quarter. Panthers defensive end Greg Hardy hit Raiders quarterback Carson Palmer as he threw on third-and-1 from the Oakland 29-yard line. Palmer suffered a rib injury on the play and did not return. giving way to backup Matt Leinart. Leinart engineered an 11-play. 73-yard scoring drive in the second quarter that led to a 21-yard field goal from Sebastian Janikowski, Graham Gano tried to counter that score with a 48-vard attempt on the ensuing Carolina possession, but his kick sailed wide right with 1:41 remaining in the first half. The Raiders took over with two timeouts, but three plays later linebacker Luke Kuechly intercepted Leinart. A 22-yard screen pass to running back DeAngelo Williams set the Panthers up with first-and-goal from the seven yard line. On third-and-goal with 24 seconds to go in the half, Newton scrambled away from pressure for a three-yard touchdown run to give Carolina a 14-3 lead at halftime. Newton's streak of 176 passes without an interception - a franchise record - was broken on the final play of the third quarter. Linebacker Miles Burris picked off a deflected pass intended for Smith, giving Oakland the ball at the Carolina 18-yard line to start the fourth quarter. The Panthers defense held and Oakland settled for a 31-vard Janikowski field goal with 13:18 remaining in the fourth quarter. Trailing 14-6, the Raiders made a late push for the game-tying score with just over five minutes left, but on fourth-and-4 from the Carolina 24-yard line, Hardy broke up a swing pass intended for McFadden. A 19-yard run from Newton, followed by a 20-yard completion to tight end Greg Olsen, put the Panthers in field goal range where Gano converted a 51-yard field goal to give Carolina a two score advantage with 2:46 to go.

BUTLER BLOCKS FIELD GOAL

In Week Eleven vs. New Orleans (11/17/16), rookie defensive tackle Vernon Butler notched the first blocked field goal by the Panthers since Julius Peppers blocked a Philadelphia Eagles 51-yard attempt by David Akers on September 13, 2009.

Butler's block came on a 38-yard field goal attempt by Saints kicker Wil Lutz. The ball was recovered by linebacker Luke Kuechly and his return gave the Panthers possession at the New Orleans 40-yard line. The Panthers

scored on the next play.

NEWTON AMONG THE BEST IN SIXTH SEASON

With 197 total yards (192 passing, five rushing) quarterback Cam Newton passed Dan Marino (23,845 total yards from 1983-99) for the third-most combined rushing and passing yards by a quarterback in NFL history through a players first six seasons. Newton has 23,924 combined yards through the Panthers first 10 games.

Newton needs just 104 combined yards to pass Matt Ryan for the second-most combined passing and rushing yards in a quarter-back's first six seasons.

GINN GOES DEEP

In Week Eleven vs. New Orleans (11/17/16), wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. hauled in a 40-yard touchdown catch in the back of the end zone from quarterback Cam Newton with 16 seconds left in the first half to give the Panthers a 20-3 lead.

Nine of Ginn's 16 touchdown catches in two-plus seasons with Carolina (2013, 2015-2016) have gone for 25 or more yards, including six of 40 or more yards.

In 41 career games with Carolina (2013, 2015-16), Ginn has 16 touchdown catches. In 104 career games with other teams, Ginn totaled six touchdown catches.

The game was Addison's second multi-sack performance in the past three weeks, having previously recorded two sacks in Week Nine at Los Angeles (11/6/16). Addison's five sacks in the past three weeks are the most in the NFL during that time.

Addison's performance has helped the Panthers tie second in the NFL with 10 sacks in the past three weeks and the team is tied for third in the NFL overall with 30 total sacks this season.

Addison leads the Panthers with 6.5 sacks, tying his career high previously established in 2014.

PALARDY MAKES NFL DEBUT

First-year punter Michael Palardy, who was signed to the Panthers roster on Nov. 14 after Andy Lee was placed on injured reserve (hamstring) saw the first regular season action of his career in Week Eleven vs. New Orleans (11/17/16).

Palardy finished the game with six punts for 280 yards, a 46.7-yard punting average and a long of 56. He also served as the holder for kicker Graham Gano who converted all three of his field goal attempts and both PATs.

Palardy was initially signed by the Panthers to compete for the punting job this offseason but was waived during organized team activities. He has spent time on the Browns' and Falcons' practice squads during the 2016 season.

Palardy, a University of Tennessee product, was named first-team All-Southeastern Conference by *ESPN.com* in 2013 after leading the nation with 33 punts that landed inside the 20-yard line. That season, he was the lone left-footed kicker in the nation to handle punt, placekicking and kickoff duties.

STEWART REACHES 6,000

In Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16), running back Jonathan Stewart surpassed the 6,000 career rushing yards mark.

Stewart (6,179) joins DeAngelo Williams (6,846 from 2006-14) as the only backs in team history with at least 6,000 rushing yards.

Stewart missed three games this season due to a hamstring injury, but he stands just 698 yards behind DeAngelo Williams for the team's all-time mark.

Last season, Stewart's 989 rushing yards ranked eighth in the NFL. He rushed a career-high 242 times, the seventh-most in the NFL. Stewart's six touchdowns are his most since he tallied 10 touchdowns in back-to-back seasons in 2008 and 2009.

BENJAMIN PRODUCING IN RETURN

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin, the Panthers first-round draft choice in 2014, returned to the lineup in Week One at Denver (9/8/16) after missing all of last season with a knee injury.

This season, Benjamin has totaled 46 receptions for 683 yards and four touchdowns.

In 2014, Benjamin ranked third among NFL rookies with 1,008 receiving yards, 73 receptions and nine receiving touchdowns. Fifty of Benjamin's 73 catches resulted in first downs, second among rookies to only New York Giants receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. (57).

That season Benjamin and tight end Greg Olsen finished the year tied for the team lead with 1,008 receiving yards, becoming the first pair of Panthers to each gain 1,000 receiving yards in a single season since Muhsin Muhammad and Patrick Jeffers in 1999.

Benjamin's numbers are the best by a rookie in Panthers history, surpassing Keary Colbert's numbers in 2004 (47 for 754 and five).

OLSEN LEADS THE WAY AT TIGHT END

In 2015, Greg Olsen tallied a career-high 1,104 receiving yards, his second consecutive season with 1,000 yards. He is the seventh tight end in NFL history with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons. Olsen is seeking to become the first tight end in NFL history to record three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

With 745 receiving yards this season, Olsen has registered at least 500 yards in eight of the past nine seasons (2008-09, 2011-16). He has also notched the seventh 50-catch season of his career. Olsen is on pace for his fifth consecutive season with at least 800 yards and is aiming for his fourth consecutive 70-catch season.

Olsen's seven touchdown catches in 2015 made him the only active NFL tight end with five or more touchdowns in every season since 2008 (2008-15).

Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (128) and career rushing touchdowns (47).

In Week One at Denver (9/8/16), Newton produced his 32nd game with both a passing and rushing touchdown, breaking a tie with Pro Football Hall of Famer Steve Young for the most in NFL history. He produced his 33rd such game in Week Six at New Orleans (10/16/16) and his 34th in Week Ten vs. Kansas City (11/13/16).

LOTULELEI EARNS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Defensive tackle Star Lotulelei earned his first career NFC Defensive Player of the Week Award for his performance in Week Eight vs. Arizona (11/6/16).

Against the Cardinals, Lotulelei recorded a career-high 3.0 sacks. The 3.0 sacks matched Lotulelei's previous career high for a single season set in 2013 rookie season.

Lotulelei's first sack of the game came on Arizona's first drive and was a strip-sack that resulted in a 46-yard touchdown return by linebacker Thomas Davis.

Lotulelei's three sacks were part of an eight-sack performance by Carolina. The eight sacks are the second-most in a regular season game in Panthers history.

Lotulelei also contributed to a defense that limited Arizona running back David Johnson to 24 rushing yards. Johnson entered the game with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games.

Lotulelei is the second defensive tackle in franchise history to win a Defensive Player of the Week Award, joining Kawann Short in 2015.

GANO GETS HIS KICKS

In Week Three vs. Minnesota kicker Graham Gano scored four points to pass wide receiver Steve Smith (454 from 2001-13) for second on the franchise's all-time points scored list. Gano has 504 points in his Panthers career (2012-present). John Kasay (1,482 from 1995-2010) is the franchise's all-time leader.

In Week Two vs. San Francisco (9/18/16), Gano set a career high with 16 points by converting all four field goal attempts and four of five PATs (one was blocked).

Last season, Gano set the Panthers franchise record with 146 points in 2015, surpassing John Kasay's previous record of 145 in 1996. Gano's 146 points ranked second in the NFL behind New England's Stephen Gostkowski (151).

Gano made 30-of-36 field goals in 2015. The 30 field goals tied for fifth-most in the NFL and third-most in a season in team history. Gano kicked two game-wining field goals (final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) in 2015.

Gano earned his first career Player of the Month Award, garnering NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November

In addition to his field goal abilities, Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano leads the NFL with a 74.1 touchback percentage.

In 2014, Gano placed 61 of his 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. The 77.2 percent touchback rate was best in the League and his 61 kickoffs were the most in the NFC.

In 2013, 63 of Gano's 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. His 79.7 touchback percentage was the top mark in the NFL that season and is the highest percentage in a season since Brad Daluiso in 1992 (81.3 percent).
