THE DRAFT

The Oakland Raiders will host media members at the team's training facility in Alameda, Calif., for the 82nd National Football League Draft from April 27-29 (Thursday through Saturday). There will be 253 selections, including 32 compensatory choices that have been awarded to 16 clubs.

The draft will be held along the Benjamin Franklin Parkway in Philadelphia, Pa., incorporating famed city landmarks spanning from Philadelphia City Hall to the iconic steps of the Philadelphia Museum of Art. The 2017 NFL Draft will begin on Thursday in prime time, the eighth consecutive year that it will kick off in an evening time slot. The first round will take place on Thursday, April 27, beginning at 5 p.m. PT. The second and third rounds will take place on Friday, April 28, and begin at 4 p.m. PT. The draft will conclude on Saturday, April 29, with the final four rounds, commencing at 9 a.m. PT.

Teams have 10 minutes to select a player in the first round and seven minutes in the second round. Except for compensatory selections, the selection time for rounds three through six is five minutes. The selection time for round seven and all compensatory selections is four minutes.

NFL Network and ESPN/ESPN 2 will televise the draft all three days.

2017 COMPENSATORY PICKS

This year, the NFL awarded 32 compensatory selections to 16 teams for the 2017 NFL Draft. The compensatory picks will be positioned within the third through seventh rounds based on the value of the compensatory free agents lost.

Under the rules for compensatory draft selections, a team losing more or better compensatory free agents than it acquires in the previous year is eligible to receive compensatory draft picks. Compensatory free agents are determined by a formula based on salary, playing time and postseason honors. The formula was developed by the NFL Management Council. Not every free agent lost or signed by a club is covered by this formula.

Compensatory picks may be traded this year for the first time. A rule change approved by clubs in 2015 permits compensatory draft picks to be traded beginning in 2017.

THE 2016 DRAFT CLASS

First Round - S Karl Joseph (No. 14 overall)

2016 Season: Stepped into a starting role and proved to be an active, aggressive safety before sustaining a toe injury, playing in 12 games with 10 starts...Ended the year with 76 tackles (51 solo), good for fourth most on the team, while adding one interception, six passes defended and one forced fumble.

Honors/Awards: Named to the All-Rookie Team by the Pro Football Writers of America.

Second Round - DL Jihad Ward (No. 44 overall)

2016 Season: Emerged as a versatile defensive lineman, spending time at both defensive end and defensive tackle, appearing in all 16 games with 13 starts and collecting 31 tackles (21 solo) and one fumble recovery.

Third Round - LB Shilique Calhoun (No. 75 overall)

2016 Season: Played in 10 games, primarily as a rotational player on defense while seeing extensive time on the special teams unit in his rookie campaign, recording five tackles (three solo), 0.5 sacks and one pass defended before sustaining a knee injury in Week 12 and being placed on the Reserve/Injured list on Dec. 23.

Fourth Round - QB Connor Cook (No. 100 overall)

2016 Season: After spending most of the season inactive as the Raiders' third quarterback on the depth chart, became the first quarterback in the Super Bowl era to make first NFL start in a postseason game...Appeared in one game in his rookie season, completing 14-of-21 attempts for 150 yards with one touchdown and one interception for a passer rating of 83.4...In his postseason start, recorded 161 passing yards on 18-of-45 passing with one touchdown.

Fifth Round - RB DeAndré Washington (No. 143 overall)

2016 Season: Emerged as a dependable back, appearing in 14 games with two starts and totaling 467 yards on 87 carries (5.4 avg.) with two touchdowns while adding 17 receptions for 115 yards (6.8 avg.).

Sixth Round - LB Cory James (No. 194 overall)

2016 Season: Played in all 16 games with five starts, finishing the season with 48 tackles (38 solo) in addition to one forced fumble... Played significant action on special teams, making seven tackles (four) for the unit.

Seventh Round - G Vadal Alexander (No. 234 overall)

2016 Season: Appeared in nine games with five starts, contributing as an extra offensive lineman, including starts at right tackle and left guard as the offensive line shuffled due to injuries.

McKENZIE'S PRO BOWLERS

Since taking over as the Raiders' general manager in 2012, Reggie McKenzie has drafted four Pro Bowlers in his tenure, **RB Latavius Murray** in 2013, **DE Khalil Mack** and **QB Derek Carr** in 2014 and **WR Amari Cooper** in 2015. Each earned their first Pro Bowl berth in 2015, and Carr, Cooper, and Mack earned their second consecutive selection in 2016.

----- KHALIL MACK -----

Career: Has started all 48 games over his career and totaled 240 tackles (173 solo), 30 sacks, eight forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, one pick-six and 12 passes defended.

Pro Bowl Seasons:

(2016): Started all 16 games for the third consecutive season, registering 77 tackles (56), 11 sacks, one pick-six, five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, and four passes defended...Earned his second consecutive Pro Bowl and AP All-Pro selection in addition to becoming the AP Defensive Player of the Year...Tied an NFL record by registering a sack in eight consecutive games.

(2015): Started all 16 games and earned his first career Pro Bowl selection after totaling 79 tackles (58), 15 sacks, two forced fumbles and four passes defended...His 15 sacks ranked second in the NFL and fell just one short of a franchise record.

----- DEREK CARR -----

Career: Has started all 47 games over his career, passing for 11,194 yards on 1,055-of-1,732 passing (60.9 pct.) with 81 touchdowns, 31 interceptions and an 87.9 passer rating.

Pro Bowl Seasons:

(2016): Started in all 15 games played in before his season-ending injury in Week 16...Named the Castrol Edge Clutch Performer of the Year after delivering a club-record seven game-winning drives in 2016, while accounting for 3,937 yards through the air on 357-of-560 attempts, adding 28 touchdowns to just six interceptions for a passer rating of 96.7...An MVP candidate, and the only player to in the NFL to win multiple Castrol Clutch Performer of the Week awards while being selected to his second consecutive Pro Bowl.

(2015): Started all 16 games for the second straight year, throwing for 3,987 yards on 350-of-573 passing (61.1 percent) with 32 touchdowns and 13 interceptions with a 91.1 rating...Earned a Pro Bowl alternate selection...Led the NFL with 13 touchdown passes of 25-plus yards.

----- AMARI COOPER -----

Career: Has appeared in all 32 games to begin his career, starting in 29 of them and totaling 155 receptions for 2,223 yards (14.3 avg.), and 11 touchdowns.

Pro Bowl Seasons:

(2016): Led all second-year players for with 1,153 yards on 83 receptions, and added five touchdowns...His receptions and yards were the most in club history by a second-year player, while he became just the third player in NFL history to amass 1,000 yards and 70 catches in each of his first two seasons en route to earning his second career Pro Bowl selection...Tied for the NFL lead with five touchdowns over 30 yards, and set a franchise record with 15 receptions of at least 25 yards.

(2015): Had the most productive season by a rookie receiver in franchise history, recording 72 receptions for 1,070 yards (14.9 avg.) and six touchdowns in 16 games...His 72 receptions and 1,070 receiving yards are both franchise rookie records...Led all NFL rookies in receptions, receiving yards, receiving yards per game and tied for the lead in receiving touchdowns.

----- LATAVIUS MURRAY -----

Career: Played in 45 games with 31 starts over four seasons with the Raiders...In 2016, tied for the third most rushing touchdowns (12) in single-season club history...Totals include 2,278 rushing yards on 543 carries with 20 touchdowns...Has added 639 receiving yards on 91 receptions .

Pro Bowl Season:

(2015): Started all 16 games in his first season as the team's primary rusher...Led the team in all rushing categories...Totaled 266 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards (4.0 avg.) with six touchdowns...Also hauled in 41 receptions, third most on the team, for 232 yards (5.7 avg.)...Finished sixth in the NFL in rushing and second in the AFC...Ranked third in the NFL in rushing attempts.

Prior to the Raiders, McKenzie spent 18 years in the Packers' personnel department. He was promoted to Director of Pro Personnel for Green Bay in 1997 and Director of Football Operations in 2008. As a Director, McKenzie had a hand in drafting 20 eventual Pro Bowlers for the Packers, 10 of which earned multiple selections, and four whom are still major contributors to the team. In addition, McKenzie produced Pro Bowlers from 13-of-15 draft classes. Those 20 players are listed below:

UNDRAFTED GEMS

Every preseason, hundreds of undrafted free agents vie for a spot on their team's 53-man roster. **Reggie McKenzie** has brought in numerous players that were not drafted, developing them into significant contributors for the Silver and Black.

- In 2015, **P Marquette King** set a franchise record by placing 40 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line. In 2014, King set Raider franchise records in punts (109) and punting yards (4,930).

- On **RB Jalen Richard's** first career carry, he rushed 75 yards for a touchdown. With his 75-yard touchdown, Richard became just the fourth player ever to record a 75-or-more-yard rushing touchdown in his NFL debut, joining Oran Pape (1930), Alan Ameche (1955) and Ottis Anderson (1979).

- **WR Seth Roberts** has totaled four game-winning touchdowns in his career (Week 2 of 2015 vs. Baltimore, Week 12 of 2015 at Tennessee and Week 1 of 2016 at New Orleans). The Raiders are 9-0 in games when he records a touchdown reception.

Since the common draft started in 1967 as part of the AFL-NFL merger, Oakland has selected just one interior offensive lineman in the first round (Gene Upshaw, 1967). Don Mosebar was drafted as a tackle in 1983 before moving to center.
