MIAMI DOLPHINS MEDIA WORKROOM ACCESS & PARKING INFORMATION FOR THE 2017 SEASON

As a reminder, the workroom for accredited media covering the Miami Dolphins is located behind the Dolphins Pro Shop at the Baptist Health Training Facility at Nova Southeastern University. Access to the media workroom is granted by the Communications Staff to members of the media upon their arrival at training camp.

Parking passes are distributed by the Communications Department. The passes **need to be clearly displayed** to gain entry into the media parking areas. Media parking is available at the Nova Southeastern University Medical School garage (HPD Garage), which is next to the Dolphins Pro Shop, and located near the intersection of University Drive and S.W. 30th Street, between Griffin Road and I-595. Access to this garage is off University Drive and S.W. 30th Street. In the event the HPD Garage is full, the overflow media parking will be in the AUX Parking Lot next to the NOVA Softball fields.

PLEASE NOTE – ALL MEDIA ARE ASKED TO PARK ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF THE HPD GARAGE. PARKING ON THE FIRST FLOOR IS RESERVED FOR NOVA PATIENTS ONLY. THE GARAGE WILL BE MONITORED BY NOVA AND THOSE WHO PARK ON THE FIRST FLOOR WILL BE TICKETED.

DOLPHINS EN ESPAÑOL

LOS DOLPHINS REGRESAN A SUNDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

Los Miami Dolphins albergan los Oakland Raiders el domingo 5 de noviembre a las 8:30 p.m. como parte de la programación de Sunday Night Football de NBC. Es la primera aparición de los Dolphins en Sunday Night Football desde el 26 de septiembre de 2010 cuando perdieron a los Jets de Nueva York, 31-23. Los Dolphins también jugaron el NFL Kickoff Game en 2006 el 7 de septiembre de 2006, el primer partido de temporada regular transmitida por NBC bajo la marca de Sunday Night Football.

LOS DOLPHINS HAN GANADO 13 DE SUS ÚLTIMOS 18

Miami ha ganado 13 de su último 18 juegos de temporada regular, remontándose a Semana 6 de la temporada de 2016.

- El equipo ha ganado durante ese lapso con tres quarterbacks titulares diferentes – Ryan Tannehill, Matt Moore y Jay Cutler.
- La última vez que Miami ganó 13 de 18 partidos de temporada regular fue desde el 28 de octubre de 2001 hasta el 20 de octubre de 2002.

ENTRE LOS MEJORES EN EL NFL DURANTE LOS PASADOS 18 PARTIDOS

El récord de 13-5 de los Dolphins durante los pasados 18 juegos clasifica al equipo entre los mejores en el NFL en ese lapso. La marca de 13-5 durante los pasados 18 partidos de temporada regular es empatada para tercer mejor en la liga.

MARCHANDO EN HARD ROCK STADIUM

Miami no ha gastado tiempo estableciendo una ventaja en casa con las renovaciones importantes y la cubierta añadidos a Hard Rock Stadium.

- En 2016, el primer año con la cubierta, los Dolphins fueron 6-2 en casa, su mejor marca desde 2002.
- Miami tuvo una racha de cinco victorias en casa en el medio de la temporada de 2016, cual fue la racha de victorias en casa más larga desde 2001-02.
- Los Dolphins ya son 2-0 en casa este año, ganándole a Tennessee 16-0 en Semana 5 y los Jets de Nueva York en Semana 7.
- Las nueve ganadas en los últimos 11 partidos en Hard Rock Stadium crean la 11ª mejor racha en casa desde que ganaron 11 de 12 desde el 23 de septiembre de 2001 hasta el 6 de octubre de 2002.

'JUICE' ACERCÁNDOSE AL RÉCORD

Receptor Jarvis Landry está acercándose al récord de NFL de más atrapadas en los primeros cuatro años de una carrera y todavía tiene nueve juegos quebrante esta temporada. Solamente necesita cinco atrapadas más para pasar al líder Anquan Boldin. Landry ya tiene el récord para más atrapadas en los primeros dos años de una carrera (194) y es empatado para los más en los primeros tres años (288).

LA DEFENSA DE LOS DOLPHINS CONTINUA BRILLANDO EN TERCERA OPORTUNIDAD

A lo largo de siete semanas, los Dolphins son quinto en el NFL en tercera oportunidad, limitando la oposición a un promedio de conversión de 32.9. La defensa de Miami ha limitado la oposición a una tasa peor que 50 por ciento en seis de siete partidos. Miami terminó cuarto en el NFL el año pasado en promedio de conversión permitido, aguantando la oposición a una tasa de 36.2.

LA DEFENSA EN LA SEGUNDA MITAD

Miami he aguantado la oposición a 7 puntos o menos en la segunda mitad en cuatro juegos en seguida (no incluyendo touchdowns anotados por la defensa de la oposición). En Semana 7 contra los N.Y. Jets, los Dolphins permitieron solo 81 yardas en la segunda mitad y causaron dos cambios de posesión. Marcó tres partidos en seguida en que los Dolphins limitaron la oposición a menos de 110 yardas en la segunda mitad. Los 68 puntos permitidos por Miami después del medio tiempo son empatados para 10º en el NFL a pesar de que 14 de esos puntos vinieron en dos touchdowns defensivos de la oposición.

TIMMONS ACERCÁNDOSE A 1,000 TACLEADAS

LB Lawrence Timmons entra el juego de esta semana con 989 tacleadas en su carrera (682 solo), solo 11 tacleadas menos de 1,000. Timmons se convertirá en el 46º jugador desde 1994 para acumular 1,000 tacleadas en su carrera y solo el sexto jugador actual.

DENNEY A JUGAR EN SU 200 JUEGO EN EL NFL EL DOMINGO

Se anticipa que LS John Denney va a jugar en su 200 partido en el NFL el domingo, uniéndose con Dan Marino (242) y Jason Taylor (204) como los únicos Dolphins a jugar en 200 partidos con el equipo. Denney se convertirá en el 20 jugador actual y el 313 en historia para jugar en 200 partidos en su carrera.



TEAM NOTES

THE DOLPHINS RETURN TO SUNDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

The Miami Dolphins **host the Oakland Raiders on Sunday, Nov. 5 at 8:30 p.m.** as part of NBC's Sunday Night Football package. **It's Miami's first Sunday Night Football game since Sept. 26, 2010 when they lost to the N.Y. Jets, 31-23.** The Dolphins also played the 2006 NFL Kickoff Game at Pittsburgh on Sept. 7, 2006, the first regular season game broadcasted by NBC under the Sunday Night Football brand. Overall, the Dolphins are 19-8 in games played on Sunday night, including a 13-5 mark at home.

THE DOLPHINS HAVE WON 13 OF THEIR LAST 18

Miami has won 13 of its last 18 regular season games, dating back to Week 6 of the 2016 season.

- The team has won during that stretch **with three different starting quarterbacks - Ryan Tannehill, Matt Moore and Jay Cutler.**
- The last time Miami won 13 of 18 regular season games was from Oct. 28, 2001 to Oct. 20, 2002.

AMONG THE NFL'S BEST OVER THE LAST 18 GAMES

The Dolphins' 13-5 record in their past 18 regular season games ranks them among the best teams in the NFL in that recent span. In fact, **if you look at every NFL team's record of their past 18 regular season games, the Dolphins' 13-5 mark is tied for third-best in the league.**

ROCKING AT HARD ROCK STADIUM

Miami has wasted no time establishing a home-field advantage with the major renovation and canopy added to Hard Rock Stadium.

- In 2016, the first year with the canopy, **the Dolphins went 6-2 at home, their best home record since 2002.**
- Miami had a stretch of **five straight home victories** in the middle of the 2016 season, which was **the team's longest home winning streak since 2001-02.**
- The Dolphins are already 2-0 at their home venue this season, defeating Tennessee in Week 5 and the N.Y. Jets in Week 7.
- **Miami's nine wins in their past 11 games at Hard Rock Stadium is the team's best 11-game home stretch since they won 11 of 12 from Sept. 23, 2001 to Oct. 6, 2002.**
- This is the first season since 2005 the Dolphins have won their first two games played at Hard Rock Stadium.

THE COMEBACK KIDS

In Weeks 6 and 7, the Dolphins trailed 17-0 at halftime in Atlanta and faced a 14-point fourth-quarter deficit vs. the N.Y. Jets before coming back to win both games, with different quarterbacks.

- The last time **the Dolphins won consecutive games trailing by 14-plus points** in a second half was a **three-game streak from Sept. 14-28, 1980.**
- **The 17-point halftime deficit the Dolphins overcame in Atlanta was the biggest in the NFL this season and tied for the largest in franchise history.** They also trailed 17-0 at halftime to Buffalo in 1968 and rallied for a 21-17 win.
- The comeback in Atlanta was **tied for the sixth-largest comeback in team history** and was the largest since a 21-point comeback vs. Buffalo on Dec. 4, 2005.
- The 17-point come-from-behind victory vs. the Falcons was **Miami's largest comeback on the road since an 18-point comeback at the N.Y. Jets on Nov. 27, 1994, also known as the "Fake Spike" game.**

GASE ESTABLISHING HIMSELF AS ONE OF NFL'S TOP COACHES

In just one and a half seasons, Adam Gase is quickly establishing himself as one of the league's top coaches. With a 14-9 record, his career winning percentage of .609 is fifth-best among active NFL head coaches (min: 20 games).

SIXTEEN STRAIGHT

With the Dolphins' Week 1 game against Tampa Bay being moved to Nov. 19 due to Hurricane Irma, **Miami is playing 16 straight weeks for the first time since 1992**, when a similar situation occurred. Hurricane Andrew forced the Dolphins to move their season opener vs. New England to the bye week. Miami beat the Patriots on Oct. 18, 1992 and **went on to win 11 games, the AFC East title and reach the AFC Championship game that season.**

BREAKING DOWN THE DOLPHINS ROSTER:

Here is how the Dolphins' current 52-man roster breaks down:

- There are 23 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

'JUICE' ON THIRD DOWN

WR Jarvis Landry is second in the NFL with 17 receptions on third down. In 2016, Landry was tied for seventh in the league with 26 third-down receptions. The reliable target had 335 yards on third downs, the ninth-best mark in the NFL that season.

LANDRY'S 2016 CAMPAIGN

WR Jarvis Landry finished the 2016 season with 1,136 receiving yards, good for the eighth-most in single-season team history. Landry became the first Dolphins wide receiver to top 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons since Brian Hartline did in 2012 and 2013 and was the sixth Dolphins wide out to ever post consecutive 1,000-yard seasons (Mark Clayton, Mark Duper, Irving Fryar, Brian Hartline and Brandon Marshall). He totaled 1,157 receiving yards in 2015.

CUTLER LEADING FOURTH QUARTER COMEBACKS

QB Jay Cutler has led the Dolphins to two fourth quarter comebacks despite finishing just five games this season. The comebacks – in Week 2 at L.A. Chargers and Week 5 at Atlanta – were the 22nd and 23rd fourth quarter comebacks of his career and his first since the 2015 season. Miami's 17-point comeback win in Week 6 at Atlanta was the largest come-from-behind victory of Cutler's career.

"I think Cutler does a really good job of making sure everybody understands the way he wants things to go. I think that's super important for the quarterback position. We have to have an understanding of how he wants us to run the route, what he's looking for and when, situationally. He's done a really good job of coming in and letting us know, 'Hey, this is what I expect. This is what I'm looking for.'" - Tight End Julius Thomas

QB Matt Moore relieved an injured QB Jay Cutler in the second half of the Week 7 come-from-behind win vs. the N.Y. Jets. The 14-point fourth-quarter comeback was the fifth come-from-behind victory in Moore's career and the largest fourth-quarter deficit he has overcome. Moore and Cutler had two touchdown passes each. 

CAM WAKE STILL SACKING QBs AT 35 YEARS OLD

During the 2016 season, **DE Cameron Wake had one of the most impressive comebacks in the NFL.** Coming off an Achilles injury in 2015, Wake was dominant, posting 11.5 sacks, which was third in the AFC and tied for sixth in the NFL.

Miami re-inserted Wake as a starter in Week 6 last year and since then, **he is second in the NFL with 16.5 sacks and has helped Miami win 13 of its last 18 regular season games.**

Wake was tied for second in the AFC and tied for third in the NFL with five forced fumbles in 2016. **He has nine forced fumbles since 2015, tied for the most in the NFL during that span,** despite playing just seven games in 2015.

Since joining the Dolphins in 2009, Wake has compiled four double-digit sack campaigns, seven straight seasons of seven-plus sacks and is **second in team history in all-time career sacks**, behind Hall of Famer Jason Taylor.

SUH CONSISTENTLY MAKES STOPS

DT Ndamukong Suh topped 350 career tackles during the 2016 season. Since he entered the NFL in 2010, **Suh leads all defensive tackles with 393 total tackles** and his total is third among all defensive linemen.

Suh set a new career high and was third among all interior defensive linemen in total tackles in 2016 with 72 (41 solo). He **finished among the top five** in total tackles by an NFL interior defensive linemen for **the third consecutive season.**

DEFENSE NOTES

THE DOLPHINS SECOND-HALF DEFENSE

Miami's defense has held its opponents to 7 points or less in the second half in four straight games (does not include touchdowns scored by the opponent's defense). In Week 7 vs. the N.Y. Jets, the Dolphins allowed just 81 yards in the second half and forced two turnovers. **It marked three straight games the Dolphins limited their opponents to less than 110 yards in the second half during the team's three-game winning streak.** Miami's 68 points allowed after halftime are tied for 10th in the NFL despite 14 of those points coming on two defensive scores by the opponent.

STOPPING THE RUN

The Dolphins defense entered the 2017 season with an emphasis on stopping the run and through six games, they've done just that. **The Dolphins are eighth in the NFL in rushing defense, allowing 95.4 yards per game, and 10th in the NFL allowing 3.77 yards per carry.** In Week 2, the Dolphins held the Chargers to 44 net rushing yards in the winning effort. **The 44 rushing yards allowed were the fewest by a Dolphins defense since Sept. 30, 2012, when they allowed just 28 at Arizona.** It was the second-fewest rushing yards by the Chargers in their past 14 games. Baltimore RB Alex Collins is the only opposing back to rush for more than 70 yards in a game against Miami this season, doing so in Week 8.

HAYES AMONG NEW DOLPHINS ADDITIONS

DE William Hayes was acquired by the Dolphins in a trade with the Los Angeles Rams on March 10, 2017. The defensive end brings a reputation of setting the edge against the run and is one of the most experienced defensive linemen in the NFL. He also recorded a sack in the season opener at the L.A. Chargers.



Hayes is among the NFL's top 25 active defensive linemen career leaders in several categories. **He ranks No. 7 in stuffs (47.5), No. 18 in tackles (325), tied for No. 19 in games played (131) and No. 24 in sacks (35.5).**

TIMMONS BRINGS EXPERIENCE & PRODUCTION

After 10 seasons with the Steelers, **LB Lawrence Timmons** left The Steel City and came to Miami this offseason as one of the most productive linebackers in the game today. When Timmons left Pittsburgh, he was second in team history with 952 career tackles. **Since becoming a full-time NFL starter in 2009, Timmons is second in the NFL with 917 total tackles (638 solo).**

LB Mike Hull was third in the NFL with 18 special teams tackles in 2016 and is also tied for second on the team with four special teams tackles this season.

MIAMI'S KICKOFF TEAM IS NFL'S BEST

The Dolphins have several top 10 units on special teams. The kickoff unit is the best in the NFL as opponents' average starting field position is just the 21.3-yard line following kickoffs, 1.7 yards better than anybody else in the league.

PARKEY HITS THE SPOT

Miami signed K Cody Parkey on Sept. 3 to take over placekicking duties and he has played a big role in the team's victories. Parkey is 8-for-9 in field goal attempts and has made three game-winning kicks this season. In Week 2, his first game with the Dolphins, he kicked the longest game-winning field goal in team history, a 54-yarder with 1:05 left to beat the L.A. Chargers. In Week 6, Parkey kicked a game-tying and game-winning field goal in the fourth quarter to win at Atlanta. It was the first time in Parkey's four-year NFL career he made game-tying and game-winning kicks in the same contest. Parkey also connected on a 39-yard game-winner with 22 seconds left to beat the N.Y. Jets in Week 7.

K Cody Parkey has a track record for being accurate on long kicks. He is 6-for-7 all-time when kicking 50-plus yard field goals and is the most accurate active NFL kicker on 50-plus yard kicks (min: 6 att.).

Drake returned a kickoff for a 96-yard touchdown to win the game in Week 9 vs. the N.Y. Jets, had a 78-yard kickoff return in Week 12 vs. San Francisco and posted a 58-yard kickoff return in the AFC Wild Card game at Pittsburgh.

The Dolphins were facing a long trip back home after their game against the Oakland Raiders at Wembley Stadium in London. But at least they could spend a lot of the time on the plane reliving everything that went right in their most dominating performance in years.

Behind a near-flawless performance from quarterback Ryan Tannehill and a defense that not only came up with its first three interceptions of the season but also its first score, the Dolphins turned the first of three London games into their showcase.

After disappointing losses against Buffalo and Kansas City, the Dolphins got a much needed victory that gave them a 2-2 record heading into their bye.

For all intents and purposes, the game was decided by halftime and only a meaningless fourth-quarter touchdown by the Raiders kept the Dolphins from recording their largest margin of victory in 13 years. As it was, the 38-14 final represented the Dolphins' most lopsided victory since Nov. 20, 2011 when they beat the Buffalo Bills 35-8.

Lamar Miller scored two touchdowns for the Dolphins, who also got TDs from tight end Dion Sims, Mike Wallace and cornerback Cortland Finnegan.

Before he went to the sideline to watch Matt Moore wrap up the blowout, Tannehill put together one of the best performances of his three-year NFL career, completing 23 of 31 passes for 278 yards with two touchdowns and a passer rating of 109.3. The only blemish on Tannehill's stat line was a third-quarter interception on a pass that was tipped by Sims after it was thrown slightly behind him.

The running game continued its strong work, with the Dolphins rushing for 157 yards and a solid 4.5 yards per carry.

Tannehill completed his last 14 passes of the first half, matching the fourth-longest streak in Dolphins history, and he had a passer rating at the half at 146.5.

This multi-purpose, open-air complex is in the midst of a multi-year, \$500 million renovation to enhance the fan experience. The modernization is being privately funded by Stephen Ross.

Goldman Global Arts and the Miami Dolphins collaborated to transform Hard Rock Stadium into a vibrant, monumental public art experience. Highlighting 18 artists from ten countries, the landmark mural project looks to create an artistic legacy and cement Hard Rock Stadium as an iconic, world class, cultural venue of Miami.

The collection at Hard Rock Stadium is one of the world's largest street art museums, curated by Goldman Global Arts. The exceptional line-up of international artists brings a variety of techniques and styles together to create a jaw-dropping tapestry of urban art contained in a single location.

NEW SEATING PRODUCTS

Hard Rock Stadium's modernization included doubling unique seating experiences from 8 to 16. Some of the newest seating products include:

The 72 Club: The 598 seats in the 72 Club take the premium seating experience to another level. It's the most luxurious seating experience in all of South Florida sports and entertainment. Seats are double-padded, have 11 inches more legroom and are located at midfield. At any point in-game, guests are able to walk on the field on their way to a private club designed by the Rockwell Group.



Living Room Boxes: Hard Rock Stadium created four-person private Living Room Boxes. Located on the 35-yard line and within the Atos Club presented by Dell EMC and Ford Field Clubs in the end zones, Living Room Boxes are the biggest, most comfortable seats in the stadium. These boxes give guests the ability to watch replays and highlights on their own private screens.

Hyundai Club: The Hyundai Club is a club located between the 30-yard lines on the north side that offers wider, padded seats. The club is designed by the Rockwell Group.

Corner Terraces: The 100 level Corner Terraces provide a unique social experience where guests can watch the game from a high-top table and comfortable swivel chairs. Corner Terraces provide guests the enjoyment of sitting with family or friends without being confined to a row of seats.



PHASE I

Phase I of the project that was completed for the 2015 season changed every seat in the stadium, rebuilt the concourses on the 100 and 300 levels, reduced capacity from 76,018 to 64,767, moved seats 25 feet closer to the field on the north and south sidelines, introduced five new premium spaces and allowed fans to enjoy improved food, enhanced concourses and 16 new restroom facilities throughout the venue.

Hard Rock Stadium's renovation stands apart in enhancing every fan experience. In delivering a new caliber of luxury, Phase I introduced The NINE hosted by Aston Martin Residences Miami, The 72 Club, the Hyundai Club, Ford Field Club and the Atos Club presented by Dell EMC.

For the everyday fan, new seating experiences debuted in the corner terraces, providing a unique social experience where guests watch the game from a half-round table and comfortable swivel chairs. Corner Terraces provide guests the enjoyment of sitting with family or friends without being confined to a row of seats.

The NINE hosted by Aston Martin Residences Miami: The NINE hosted by Aston Martin Residences Miami are nine open-air suites between the 30-yard lines that connect to a private club designed by the Rockwell Group. The NINE offers the best view of the field with the convenience of a private club.

PHASE II

For the 2016 season, a state-of-the-art canopy was installed that keeps as many as 92 percent of fans in the shade and protected from the rain along with four giant high-definition video boards.

On Aug. 17, 2016, the Miami Dolphins christened the second phase of the renovation with a landmark 18-year naming rights agreement with Hard Rock International to name the newly renovated facility Hard Rock Stadium.

Video Boards

- Four 1,472-inch screens in each corner of the stadium for a total of 22,400 sq. ft. – the largest in the AFC East (compared to 12,000 total square footage in old stadium).
- A total of 18 million LEDs will showcase game day on the boards.
- High-definition picture positioned for easy sightlines for every fan.

SHADE CANOPY

- Shades approximately 92 percent of fans (increase from 17 percent in old stadium).
- The shade canopy is approximately 626,000 square feet [14.37 acres] and is comprised of 17,000 tons of steel.
- Covering the remainder of the canopy area [94,000 square feet] immediately adjacent to the ocular over the field is a translucent material called ETFE. This material provides supplemental light in the bowl while reducing solar heat.
- Four spires rise an additional 200 feet above the roof surface achieving a total height of 357 feet from the ground. Several steel cables secured at the top of each spire will be extended to the roof to provide additional structural support. Cable diameters range between 3.5" to 5.5" in diameter.


FIELD FACTS

- First team in the NFL to use Paspalum Platinum (shorter versions are Platinum TE or TE). The TE species works well in warm climates with growth not hindered in shade.
- Texture: Courser, thicker grass
- Feel: TE is thicker and lusher so there is a difference in feel and cushion in footing
- Sustainability: More shade tolerance
- Growth: TE grows aggressively and requires less nitrogen in the fertilizer than Bermuda.
- Color Variation: TE is a lighter green shade.

The 2017 renovation brought additional luxury to the midsection of the stadium, renovating the BankUnited Club Level.

- Hard Rock Stadium's 147 suites were completely renovated during the 2016-2017 offseason. These suites offer luxury and comfort in the ultimate setting to watch any event.
- Suites vary in size from 10 seats up to 50 seats offering air conditioning and NFL Sunday Ticket, multi-feed sound systems, refrigerators, ice-makers and private telephone services.
- Suite attendants provide personal service in each suite during the games. Centerplate caters the suites with a wide-variety of food and beverages from which to choose.

New in 2017, Hard Rock Stadium features Theatre Boxes on the BankUnited Club Level. These 4-6 person individual boxes are located in a shared suite environment with inclusive food and beverage. Hard Rock Stadium also debuted four new corner clubs, – including the new UHealth, University of Miami Health System Cornerstone Club – giving suite members access to the corner's interior space and bar.



PHASE III

Unveiled in 2017 are remodeled, modernized suites throughout the stadium offering a more intimate club space on the BankUnited Club Level with improved amenities and food, as well as the addition of theatre boxes and four new corner clubs.


Phase III of the renovation brought new party terraces on the 300 level of Hard Rock Stadium. These party terraces have a bar that services guests on the concourse, as well as a double-sided bar with awesome views of the field. Each corner includes two semi-private spaces that each can hold up to 100 people – creating a new experience for a total of 800 guests per event. The Dolphins additionally have made a commitment to donate a party terrace of 100 military tickets each game to local troops serving our country.

Throughout Phase III of the renovation, the exterior of the facility saw enhancements in the redesign of the parking lots and landscaping.

During the Phase III renovations, The NINE also received new teak flooring, enhancing the most luxurious atmosphere in sports to create the feel of watching a game from the back of a yacht.

On May 19, 2016, the Miami Dolphins announced a multi-year radio broadcast rights partnership with Miami's Sportsradio 560 WQAM, with the station becoming the official English flagship radio partner of the franchise. In addition, all Dolphins games are simulcast on KISS 99.9 FM "South Florida's NEW Country" and feature expanded pre-, halftime and postgame shows. The games also can be heard on Dolphins.com and throughout South and Central Florida on a variety of stations that make up the Miami Dolphins Radio Network.

The Dolphins previously had their games broadcast on Miami's Sportsradio 560 WQAM during the 1997-2004 and 2007-09 seasons.



As part of the agreement, Sportsradio 560 WQAM has the English radio broadcast rights for all preseason, regular season and playoff games. Dolphins fans who tune into Miami's Sportsradio 560 WQAM have the opportunity to listen to live broadcasts of Head Coach Adam Gase's day-after-game press conferences and "Dolphins Friday," a day of Dolphins-centric content on the station featuring interviews with players, coaches and team executives. Additionally, CBS Radio Miami promotes Miami Dolphins Foundation and community initiatives across multiple platforms.

During the regular season, Cefalo and Rose are joined by former Hall of Fame quarterback Bob Griese serving as an analyst with former Dolphins Pro Bowl linebacker/defensive end Kim Bokamper reporting from the sidelines.



Univision Deportes Radio 1140 AM is the Dolphins official Spanish radio broadcast partner for all preseason, regular season and playoff games. Raul Striker Jr. handles play-by-play duties with Eduardo Martell as a color analyst. WQBA 1140 AM additionally airs a pregame show and postgame show.




HALL OF FAME DEFENSIVE END/LINEBACKER JASON TAYLOR

Defensive end Jason Taylor was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Feb. 4, 2017 and inducted into the Hall of Fame on Aug. 5, 2017.

JASON TAYLOR BY THE NUMBERS

- 2** One of two Dolphins defenders to be elected to the Hall of Fame, joining Nick Buoniconti.
- 3** First-team All-Pro selections (2000, 2002, 2006). He also earned a second-team All-Pro selection in 2001.
- 5** One of five Dolphins to be elected to the Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility, joining Don Shula, Dan Marino, Jim Langer and Paul Warfield.
- 6** Pro Bowl selections in his career (2000, 2002, 2004-07).
- 6** Number of double-digit sack seasons in his 15-year NFL career.
- 9** Touchdowns scored in his career - all with Miami. Six were scored via fumble return and the other three were on interception returns. It's the highest number of touchdowns in NFL history by a player who was primarily a defensive lineman or linebacker.

- 2007** The year he won the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award, the only league honor that recognizes both on-field and off-field contributions.





In their long-awaited season debut, the Dolphins pulled off a remarkable fourth-quarter victory.

Cody Parkey's fourth field goal of the game, a 54-yarder with 1:05 remaining, gave the Dolphins a 19-17 victory against the Los Angeles Chargers at StubHub Center. Parkey, claimed off waivers from Cleveland on Sept. 3, improved to 6-for-6 in his career on field goals of 50 yards or longer.

The Dolphins clinched the victory on defense when Younghoe Koo missed a 44-yard field goal attempt with five seconds left.

Parkey's winning kick capped a 15-yard scoring drive after the Dolphins defense made a stop and Jakeem Grant had a 14-yard punt return. Jay Ajayi, who picked up where he left off last season by rushing for over 100 yards, started the drive with a 10-yard run.

Parkey earlier kicked field goals of 30, 28 and 35 yards, and Jay Cutler threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to Kenny Stills in his first game in a Dolphins uniform.

Antonio Gates for the Chargers on a 17-yard touchdown pass, which helped him set an NFL record for tight ends with his 112th career touchdown. Melvin Gordon scored on a 1-yard run and Younghoe Koo kicked a field goal in the first half.

Both offenses picked up considerably in the second half, starting with the Dolphins taking the opening drive 75 yards for the Stills touchdown that tied the score 10-10.

The drive began with an 11-yard pass to Landry and ended when Cutler rolled right and threw on the move to Stills, who beat linebacker Jatavis Brown in the end zone.

The Dolphins said all week they were expecting a tough battle from the New York Jets regardless of what happened in the first two weeks of the NFL regular season, but they weren't expecting such a difficult afternoon at MetLife Stadium.

Veteran quarterback Josh McCown threw a 69-yard pass to Robby Anderson late in the first half and the Jets defense stifled the Dolphins in a 20-6 victory Sunday afternoon.

The Dolphins, coming off a thrilling 2-point victory against the Los Angeles Chargers in their delayed season opener, were one play away from being shut out for the first time since Dec. 22, 2013. DeVante Parker scored on a 3-yard touchdown pass from Jay Cutler on the final play of the game before Cody Parkey missed the extra point, perhaps a fitting ending for this disappointing afternoon.

The Dolphins did not take a snap inside the Jets 45-yard line until the fourth quarter, which is also the only time they converted a third-down situation. The Dolphins were 0-for-3 in fourth-down conversions, including a pass by Matt Haack on a fake punt that resulted in an interception by safety Terrence Brooks.

Another fourth-down attempt came from the Jets 21-yard line early in the fourth quarter with the Dolphins trailing 20-0. The Dolphins reached the Jets 29-yard line later in the fourth quarter, but that drive ended with Brooks' second interception of the game.

Jay Ajayi, who rushed for 122 yards against the Chargers, was held to 16 yards on 11 carries.

The Dolphins defense started off strong, with Cameron Wake and Andre Branch each getting a sack in the first quarter, but the Jets started moving the ball effectively in the second quarter. The Dolphins also lost two defensive backs to injury when Byron Maxwell (eye) and Nate Allen (hamstring) left the game.

Maxwell returned and forced a turnover when he knocked the ball loose from running back Elijah McGuire and linebacker Mike Hull recovered the fumble.

A promising first drive had a disappointing ending for the Dolphins, and things didn't get better after that in London.

The Dolphins offense could get little going after an end zone interception on that first drive and the result was a 20-0 loss against the New Orleans Saints at Wembley Stadium.

Drew Brees threw touchdown passes to wide receiver Michael Thomas — not to be confused with Dolphins safety Michael Thomas — and running back Alvin Kamara, and Will Lutz kicked two field goals for the Saints.

The Dolphins drove 81 yards on the opening drive of the game and had a first-and-goal after a 22-yard completion from Jay Cutler to tight end Julius Thomas on third-and-7. But on first down from the Saints 4-yard line, cornerback Ken Crawley picked off Cutler when he attempted a fade pass to Thomas, who was lined up wide to the right.

The Dolphins had only one other promising drive, but that one ended with a questionable offensive pass interference call on Kenny Stills when Cutler had hit Jarvis Landry for a first down inside the New Orleans 40-yard line.

The Dolphins suffered their first shutout loss since December 2013 when they dropped a 19-0 decision against the Buffalo Bills.

The defense held New Orleans off the scoreboard until the final play of the first half when Lutz hit a 43-yard field goal. The Saints began the drive at midfield with 1:10 left after the Dolphins' previous was derailed by back-to-back penalties that created a first-and-26 from their 6-yard line.

Defensive end Cameron Wake had his second sack in two games in the fourth quarter, but Kamara scored on a 12-yard shovel pass on third-and-goal on the very next play.

New Orleans increased its lead to 10-0 when it took the second-half kickoff and marched 77 yards for a touchdown. The drive was kept alive when defensive tackle Davon Godchaux was flagged for a defensive holding on a third-and-1 where safety Reshad Jones dropped running back Mark Ingram in the backfield for a loss. There also was a fourth-and-inches conversion by Brees on a sneak when the spot barely was good enough for a first down.

The Saints made it 13-0 early in the fourth quarter when Lutz kicked a 45-yard field goal.

The Dolphins, meanwhile, did not take an offensive snap beyond their 40-yard line the second half until the final minutes.

Safety Reshad Jones recovered two fumbles, including one for a touchdown, and the defense recorded six sacks in a 16-10 victory against the Tennessee Titans at Hard Rock Stadium.

Jarvis Landry scored the go-ahead touchdown early in the fourth quarter when he caught a 6-yard pass from Jay Cutler on third-and-goal.

The six sacks, including two by Andre Branch, came against backup quarterback Matt Cassel, who started for Tennessee in place of the injured Marcus Mariota. Rookie first-round pick Charles Harris had his first NFL sack and it was a big one — it came on third down in the final four minutes of the fourth quarter.

The Dolphins then all but clinched the victory when Jay Ajayi gained a first down with an 8-yard run on third-and-7.

Jones and Cameron Wake shared a QB sack that almost produced a safety in the third quarter, and Ndamukong Suh had the other.

Jones' touchdown was the fourth of his career, but the first on a fumble return. The other three were on interception returns, including one against Tennessee in 2015.

It was the team's first fumble return for a touchdown since 2014 when Cortland Finnegan scored in London against the Oakland Raiders.

The Dolphins took the lead in the first quarter on Parkey's 41-yard field goal, which came after Jones recovered a DeMarco Murray fumble forced by rookie defensive tackle Davon Godchaux.

Jones' touchdown made it 10-0 before Tennessee cut the Dolphins with a field goal after the Titans recovered a Jay Ajayi fumble.

Tennessee tied the game in the third quarter with a 69-yard touchdown drive capped by an 11-yard pass from Cassel to tight end Phillip Supernaw. The play came after Supernaw had been flagged for two false starts to move the ball from the Miami 1-yard line to the 11.

Linebacker Rey Mauluga made his Dolphins debut after missing the first three games because of a hamstring injury.

The Dolphins pulled off a remarkable comeback in their first-ever visit to Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

The Dolphins scored 20 unanswered points in the second half to stun the defending NFC champion Atlanta Falcons, 20-17. This marked the first time the Dolphins erased a 17-point second-half deficit on the road since the famous "Fake Spike" game against the New York Jets in 1994.

Kicker Cody Parkey's second field goal of the game, a 38-yarder with 2:45 remaining in the fourth quarter broke a 17-17 tie. Safety Reshad Jones then clinched the victory when he intercepted Matt Ryan at the Dolphins 7-yard line with 38 seconds left after the Falcons had moved into field goal range.

Rookie third-round pick Cordrea Tankersley broke up Ryan's pass intended for tight end Austin Hooper and Jones was there to grab the floating ball.

Parkey earlier had tied the game with a 49-yard field goal in the fourth quarter after Jay Cutler threw touchdown passes to wide receivers Kenny Stills and Jarvis Landry.

Running back Jay Ajayi was a key factor in the victory as well, as he rushed for 130 yards — his second 100-yard performance of the season.

The defense shut out the potent Atlanta offense in the second half, thanks to the pass rush and Jones' heroics.

The Dolphins began their comeback with the opening drive of the second half when they drove 75 yards on 15 plays. The 8:43 drive was the Dolphins' longest in terms of time since 2013 when they had a 9:10 drive against the New York Jets. The key play in the drive was a 3-yard completion from Cutler to running back Damien Williams.

The drive also featured an 18-yard completion from Cutler to Stills on third-and-2 and ended with the two hooking up for an 11-yard touchdown on third-and-7.

Matt Moore came off the bench to help the Dolphins produce another thrilling comeback victory.

After replacing injured starting quarterback Jay Cutler, Moore threw two touchdown passes to Kenny Stills to help erase a 28-14 fourth-quarter deficit and cornerback Bobby McCain had an interception to set up Cody Parkey's 39-game winning field goal with 22 seconds left as the Dolphins defeated the New York Jets 31-28 at Hard Rock Stadium.

The victory, which came a week after the Dolphins rallied from a 17-0 halftime deficit against the Atlanta Falcons, was their 12th consecutive in games decided by seven points or less. That's two shy of the NFL record, set by the Indianapolis Colts between 2008 and 2009.

On a first-and-10 from the Jets 15-yard line, McCain intercepted a pass near the sideline intended for wide receiver Jermaine Kearse.

Cutler threw two touchdown passes in the first half, connecting with Landry and Fasano, as the Dolphins score 14 points in the first half after combining for 13 in the first two quarters in their first five games.

Cutler and Moore became the first pair of Dolphins quarterbacks to throw touchdown passes in the same game since 2010 when Chad Henne and Tyler Thigpen did it in a 29-17 victory against the Tennessee Titans.

Quarterback Josh McCown threw for three touchdowns and ran for another for the Jets, who were trying to sweep the season series.

Along with Cutler, the Dolphins also lost left tackle Laremy Tunsil to a knee injury in the third quarter.

It was another disappointing visit to Baltimore for the Miami Dolphins. Quarterbacks Joe Flacco and Ryan Mallett each threw a touchdown pass to help the Ravens build a 20-0 halftime lead on their way to a 40-0 victory in a Thursday night game at M&T Bank Stadium.

Linebacker C.J. Mosley and cornerback Jimmy Smith both returned interceptions for touchdowns, Mosley going 63 yards in the third quarter and Smith going 50 in the fourth. Wide receiver Chris Moore had another fourth-quarter touchdown when he recovered a Baltimore fumble in the end zone.

Justin Tucker kicked two field goals, though rookie Dolphins defensive tackle Vincent Taylor blocked a 46-yard attempt in the second half. That, unfortunately, was a rare highlight for the Dolphins.

Running back Jay Ajayi had a season-long 21-yard run on his first carry, but found little room to run after that.

Matt Moore made his first start of the season at quarterback in place of injured starter Jay Cutler, but he couldn't duplicate his first start of 2016 when he had four touchdown passes against the New York Jets.

Moore was sacked three times, including a fourth-down play in the fourth quarter.

Along with Cutler, the Dolphins also played without starting defensive end Andre Branch and starting left guard Anthony Steen, who were nursing groin and foot injuries, respectively. Rookie first-round pick Charles Harris made his first NFL start in place of Branch.

The loss at Baltimore ended the Dolphins' three-game winning streak. The Dolphins had a six-game winning streak end in Baltimore last season.
