Since the beginning of their partnership 21 years ago, M&T Bank and the Ravens have honored nearly 16,000 youth volunteers from a wide range of organizations. The Baltimore Ravens have selected eight past Honor Rows recipients to be highlighted throughout the 2020 season. Baltimore Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, Baltimore Beyond Plastic, Best Buddies Maryland, Big Brothers Big Sister at the Y, Girl Scout Troop 1093, Maryland National Guard Freestate Challenge Academy, Montgomery County Recreation and We Cancerve Movement, Inc. were selected from over 300 organizations that have been recognized over the past 20 seasons of Honor Rows programming. Each organization will be spotlighted during each Ravens home game throughout the 2020 regular season. All eight organizations work to serve the Maryland community, through service and volunteerism, with efforts that have continued despite the COVID-19 pandemic. Ranging from advocating for public health and environmental legislation, to working with people who have disabilities to provide them with an opportunity for equal access to recreational activities, to youth mentorship and bullying prevention, the 2020 Honor Rows spotlight honorees have earned their distinguished reputation serving our region in a variety of ways.
