





For its 2020 signature project, the Ravens Foundation once again partnered with KABOOM! to bring a new, kid-designed playground to students at Edgecombe Circle Elementary School in Baltimore City. This is the fifth time the Ravens have teamed up with KABOOM! - the nonprofit organization focused on ending playspace inequity – also building playgrounds at Douglass Homes (2018), German Park (2011), Good Samaritan Hospital Child Development Center (2009) and Collington Square School (2007). This past June, children from the school took part in a "virtual design day," where they creatively thought of ideas to create their dream playground together. With the help of the Ravens and KABOOM! their vision was turned into a reality a few months later.

"Being a community school is something that's important to us, because we realize that our students live in the community, and they are going to transform this community. ... I want our families to see the work we're doing on behalf of their children and see the people who are championing this work.
