RAVENS SCHOLARS

For the third-consecutive year, five outstanding area high school seniors, who displayed remarkable academic achievement, extra-curricular participation and community service, were awarded a \$5,000 renewable scholarship (\$20,000 over four years to each scholar) to support their respective college educations. Funded by the Ravens All Community Team Foundation (RACTF), the scholarship program enables local youth to continue their education on a collegiate level. The Ravens have a long-standing history of service to local communities, and this fund supports those who exhibit the same commitment. Applications were accepted from students who attend public schools in Baltimore City, Baltimore County and Carroll County. The Ravens organization continued its partnership with CollegeBound Foundation, an independent, nonprofit program designed to work exclusively with local students, helping high schoolers achieve a post-secondary education. After receiving over

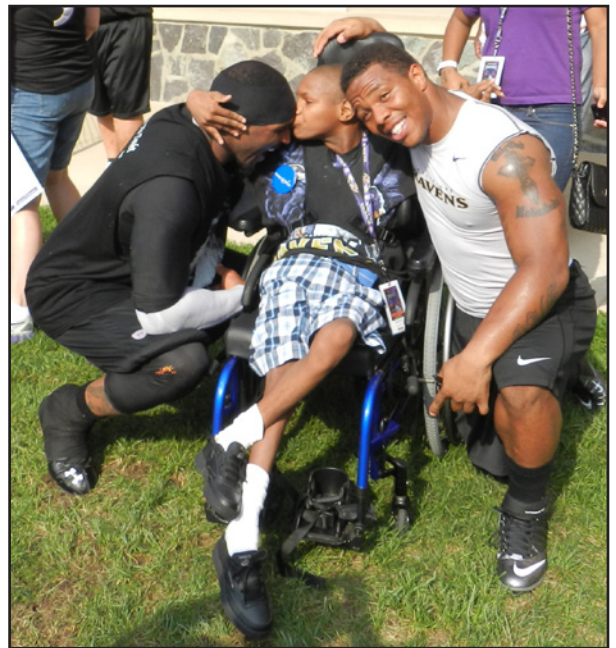
RAVENS MAKE WISHES COME TRUE
