## SOCIAL JUSTICE SUPPORT & DONATIONS

The Baltimore Ravens have a long-established commitment to social justice reform. In recent years, the Ravens have donated over \$3.2 million to local organizations and have encouraged players to be at the forefront of change. In addition to financial contributions, Ravens players and executives have facilitated discussions with Maryland U.S. Senator Ben Cardin and the late Congressman Elijah Cummings and written letters to Maryland Senate President Bill Ferguson and House Speaker Adrienne A. Jones to discuss criminal justice reform and advocate for legislations. On Aug. 30, in the wake of the shooting of Jacob Blake, Ravens players and coaches held a team meeting to write an impassioned statement advocating for specific systematic changes and advancements. In addition to calling for the arrest and prosecution of the officers responsible for Breonna Taylor's murder and the shooting of Blake, the statement implored U.S. Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell to bring the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act to the Senate floor for vote. The next day, players and coaches came together to formally sign a letter.

On June 1, a week after the death of George Floyd, owner Steve Bisciotti and the Ravens organization donated \$1 million to support Baltimore-area nonprofits and their commitment toward social justice reform. Over the past months, Ravens executives, players and alumni have all worked together to identify grassroots organizations they felt most aligned with the goals and beliefs of the Ravens. A total of 28 organizations received funds that will support the Baltimore community.





Shortly after the death of George Floyd, owner Steve Bisciotti, head coach John Harbaugh, president Dick Cass, Ravens executives and players came together for an impassioned speech on social justice reform. Clips of the meeting were turned into an emotional Black Lives Matter tribute video and discussion that was released alongside a solo message from Bisciotti.



After declaring Juneteenth a national holiday within the organization and creating a diversity, equity and inclusion book club led by former Raven Torrey Smith and his wife, Chanel, the Ravens continue to encourage employees to educate themselves on the importance of social justice reform and the Black Lives Matter movement.
