GAMEPLANEARTH KICKOFF

On Monday (12/8), the Baltimore Ravens kicked off their GamePlanEarth initiative, a week filled with environmental activities led by the Ravens. By collaborating with two local environmental organizations, the team worked to help better the communities of Baltimore. First, Ravens staff and players **S Terrence Brooks**, **TE Owen Daniels**, **RB Justin Forsett** and **G/C Gino Gradkowski** partnered with the Parks & People Foundation for a morning of tree planting and trash removal in the Sandtown-Winchester neighborhood of Baltimore City. The Ravens then took a trip to the Baltimore Inner Harbor for an informational session presented by Healthy Harbor, a Waterfront Partnership initiative, about Baltimore's clean-water practices. Ravens players **T Eugene Monroe**, **QB Tyrod Taylor** and **K Justin Tucker** saw how oysters are grown for the Healthy Harbor Oyster Partnership and met the inventor of the Inner Harbor Water Wheel, which helps to collect trash from the Baltimore water.
