The Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Award recognizes an NFL player for his excellence on and off the field. Representing the best of the NFL's commitment to philanthropy and community impact, 32 players are selected as their team's Man of the Year and become eligible to win the national award. The winner of the award each year receives \$250,000 donated to the charity of his choice. All other nominees receive up to \$40,000 donated to their charity of choice.



For the second straight year, the Baltimore Ravens have selected C Bradley Bozeman as the team's Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award recipient and nominee for the national award.



Now in his fourth season as a Raven, Bradley and his wife, Nikki, have made a sizeable impact on the Baltimore community through their foundation's work to eliminate food insecurity and advocate for anti-bullying legislation.



ABOUT THE BRADLEY AND NIKKI BOZEMAN FOUNDATION

AFTER BRADLEY WAS DRAFTED BY THE BALTIMORE RAVENS IN 2018, THE BOZEMANS IMMEDIATELY BEGAN STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES IN THEIR NEW HOMETOWN, ONE SCHOOL VISIT AT A TIME. TOGETHER, BRADLEY AND NIKKI TRAVELED ACROSS THE COUNTRY TO VISIT ELEMENTARY THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO TALK ABOUT THE DANGERS OF BULLYING AND THE IMPORTANCE OF ACCEPTING DIFFERENCES IN OTHERS. IN ADDITION TO ANTI-BULLYING MESSAGES, THE FOUNDATION'S WORK HAS EXPANDED TO INCLUDE TACKLING FOOD INSECURITY. SINCE JULY 2020, THE BRADLEY AND NIKKI BOZEMAN FOUNDATION HAS PACKAGED AND DISTRIBUTED OVER 1.9 MILLION NON-PERISHABLE AND FRESHLY PREPARED MEALS TO HOUSEHOLDS THROUGHOUT BALTIMORE.
