

Baltimore's Marching Ravens 2024 Auditions



Thank you for auditioning for the 2024 season of Baltimore's Marching Ravens. Included you will find information regarding the music audition, marching audition, and start of season dates. The goal of Marching Raven auditions is to ensure that the highest quality musicians and marchers represent the Ravens in every aspect of musical performance. We are the largest musical group in the NFL; representing our team, metropolitan Baltimore, the state of Maryland, and the NFL on local and world stages.

Season Opening Dates

Wind Music Auditions

The wind music audition will consist of three parts: scales, two etudes, and sight reading. Each part of the audition may be performed for a different set of adjudicators. Adjudicators are instructional staff and local professionals within the music and marching community. Scoring for the music audition is point based. The scoring guide is based on criteria used by the Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association, Maryland Music Educators' Association, and National Association for Music Education. Percussion Music Auditions

The percussion music audition will consist of three parts: basics, etudes, and sight reading. Adjudicators are instructional staff and local professionals within the music and marching community. Scoring for the music audition is point based. The scoring guide is based on criteria used by the Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association, Maryland Music Educators' Association, and National Association for Music Education. 




Baltimore's Marching Ravens 2024 Percussion Audition




Baltimore's Marching Ravens 2024 Cymbal Audition










Tenor Line Trilogy Duple/Triple K. Smith Mark time 5 7</t Feet apart- Stanky Leg

Cymbal Line




Baltimore's Marching Ravens 2024 Marching Auditions



Marching Auditions will take place on a clearly marked surface, so please come prepared with the appropriate athletic wear (sneakers, and loose or flexible clothing). The marching audition will consist of **2 Stages: Marching Basics and Drill Learning.** These will be evaluated based on **Posture, Timing, Accuracy, Footwork**, and **Playing**. Judges for marching will consist of Outside Adjudicators and Instructional Staff. Marching Auditions will be completed in groups with proper spacing for social distancing guidelines. Rarely will you march as an individual, so it makes sense to work with others during the marching audition. Remember, marching techniques can vary from group to group. The Marching Ravens use a "low step" march. **Most importantly:** if you make a mistake do not be discouraged, stay positive and just keep going.


Stage 1 - Basic Marching Skills w/ Playing

In this Stage each performer will march **"Box Drill"** while playing. Performers will march a "Left Box", "Right Box", and "Forward March" connected as one exercise. This stage will be performed at 3 separate tempos and will be reset in between. WINDS will play a <u>Concert Bb Scale</u> in whole notes (see below). BATTERY PERCUSSION will play "8 on a hand". CYMBALS will play whole notes in "concert style" crashes. See Music and Movements Below.

Stage 2 - Marching Winds and Percussion: Drill Learning

In this Stage each performer will be given a **Coordinate Sheet** (see example) with specific positions on the field. It will consist of **Multiple Drill Sets** and in larger groups. Each performer will be given time to find each Drill Set (one set at a time) and will be given repetitions of each set before putting them all together. Drill Learning will end with full runthroughs of all each set connected at 3 separate tempos (100, 132, 160 bpm).

*This segment of auditions is used to recreate the drill learning process throughout the season.

Stage 2 – Coordinate Sheet Reading

The Marching Ravens use Individual Coordinate Sheets for each performer for field shows. Each performer is expected to write their positions in their music, Dot Books, or have coordinate sheets to reference when rehearsing field shows. The Marching Ravens use an **"8 to 5"** step grid like most Drum Corps, High School, and Collegiate Bands. Please see the example below on reading coordinate sheets.

Example of Coordinate Sheet

- Side 1 = Performers Stage Right Side of 50
- Side 2 = Performers Stage Left Side of 50
- Inside = Towards the 50 Yard Line
- Outside = Away from 50 Yard Line
- **Measure** = Measure Numbers for move
- **Counts** = Beats/ Counts for each move
