RAVENS YOUTH FOOTBALL DAY AT TRAINING CAMP

On Sunday, Aug. 11, the Ravens hosted 69 youth football teams from across the Baltimore area. All teams in attendance are currently Ravens "Teams on the RISE" and were 2019 recipients of the Ravens Foundation, Inc.'s Youth Football Grant. Every year, the Ravens Foundation awards grants to local youth football programs to be used to outfit their athletes in new Under Armour jerseys and cleats. Additionally, all Ravens "Teams on the RISE" are able to participate in clinics, halftime field contests and receive tickets to games. At the conclusion of practice, head coach John Harbaugh and CB Brandon Carr addressed the crowd prior to the whole team signing autographs and interacting with everyone in attendance.



PLAY 60 GRANTS

Through its Play 60 Grant program, the Ravens Foundation, Inc., recently awarded \$100,000 to 27 nonprofit organizations around the state of Maryland. Since 2006, the Ravens Foundation has provided over \$1.3 million, supporting over 250 programs and impacting more than 30,000 Baltimore-area children. Through highlighting the importance of physical fitness and nutritional education, the foundation continues to provide more than \$500,000 in annual grant funding to local nonprofits. This year, the Ravens supported organizations such as the Irvine Nature Center, which is building a new community garden and walking path, Mt. Washington Pediatric Hospital and its fight against childhood obesity, and Baltimore Area Special Hockey, Inc., which provides youth with intellectual disabilities an opportunity to play ice hockey.

2019 RAVENS SCHOLARS

For the 10th-consecutive year, the Ravens honored five outstanding area high school seniors with \$5,000 renewable scholarships (\$20,000 over four years). Funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc, the scholarship serves local communities as a way to support youth as they pursue a secondary education. Scholars were chosen based on their academic achievement, extra-curricular participation and community service. After receiving nearly 200 applications, the scholarship committee selected the following students to receive the 2019 Ravens Scholarship: Taylor Booker-Godfrey, Destiny Brown, Travell Gardner, Flor Santos and Aneeka Niyas.
