LAKEWOOD ELEMENTARY

On Monday, Dec. 3, the Ravens and their players contributed nearly \$200,000 to Baltimore City Public Schools for efforts to upgrade the heating and air conditioning (HVAC) units at Lakewood Elementary School. Scheduled to begin running in January 2019, the HVAC installation is part of the Ravens' Social Justice Program, in which the team has pledged to match player donations that support social justice initiatives and engagement in the Baltimore community. The donation to Lakewood Elementary school marks the first funding distributed from the players' pledge through their fund. Ravens president Dick Cass, LS Morgan Cox, OLB Matthew Judon, DB/LB Anthony Levine Sr., WR Chris Moore, LB C.J. Mosley and DT Brandon Williams joined congressman Elijah Cummings, Baltimore City mayor Catherine Pugh and CEO of Baltimore City Public Schools Dr. Sonja Brookins Santelises to announce the contribution. Serving pre-K and kindergarten students, Lakewood Elementary is an early education school located in eastern Baltimore. Lakewood has an enrollment that consists of 65% of students on free and reduced lunch, and 50% of the student body is special needs.
