



Throughout the month of November, the Baltimore Ravens partnered with the Maryland Food Bank (MFB) and area Safeway supermarkets to execute a month-long food and funds drive.

On Nov. 4, Baltimore Ravens staff joined local businesses, including M&T Bank and the Baltimore Orioles, for a holiday meal packing event at Guinness Open Gate Brewery to support the Maryland Food Bank. During the event, volunteers packed more than 8,600 meal boxes, each to be paired with a turkey and distributed throughout the holiday season to soup kitchens, pantries and shelters throughout Maryland.

For more than 40 years, MFB has been leading the fight against hunger in the state. The organization supports a food assistance network of more than 350 community organizations statewide that collectively provide nearly 1,450 distribution point with much-needed food for their local communities.

On Dec. 4, collection efforts will culminate as volunteers from the Maryland Food Bank and Von Paris will collect donations on RavensWalk and outside of M&T Bank Stadium gate entrances prior to kickoff.
