



# RAVENS SCHOLARS

For the 13th-consecutive year, the Baltimore Ravens selected their new class of Ravens Scholars for the 2022 season. Six scholars were chosen after displaying remarkable academic achievement, extra-curricular participation and community service. Each scholar was awarded a \$5,000 renewable scholarship (up to \$20,000 over four years to each scholar) to support their respective college educations.

The Ravens organization once again continued its partnership with CollegeBound Foundation, an independent, non-profit organization designed to work exclusively with local students, helping high schoolers achieve a post-secondary education.

Funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc., the scholarship program enables local youth to continue their education on the collegiate level. The organization has a long-standing history of service to local communities, and this fund helps support those who exhibit the same commitment. Applications were accepted from students who attended public schools in Baltimore City, Baltimore County and Carroll County, areas where the Ravens operate training facilities, maintain offices and hold youth football camps.

The Baltimore Ravens and M&T Bank announced the finalists and grand prize winner for their ninth-annual Touchdown for Teachers program, which recognizes local teachers for their leadership, dedication and commitment to education, and for outstanding service to their community.

The grand prize was awarded to Shayla Proctor, a second grade special education-academic and life skills teacher from Deep Run Elementary School (Howard County). Proctor is known for her selflessness, positivity and trustworthiness. In January of 2021, Proctor was diagnosed with Stage 3 Nasopharyngeal cancer, but is currently in remission.

Proctor received \$4,000 in grant funds, payable to her school, a school visit by CB Marlon Humphrey, Poe and Cheerleaders, a custom Ravens jersey and a virtual tech talk focused on sports and computer science, provided by M&T bank personnel. The two other finalists each received a personalized Ravens jersey and \$1,000 in grant funds, payable to their schools. All grant funds are jointly provided by M&T Bank and the Ravens.
