RAVENS HOLD RIBBON CUTTING CEREMONY FOR NEW FIELD



The Baltimore Ravens led the way in the \$1 million stadium renovations at Poly and Mervo High schools.

On Tuesday (11/29), the Baltimore Ravens joined Living Classrooms Foundation, Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake, the City of Baltimore and the NFL/Local Initiatives Support Coalition (LISC) Grassroots Program in a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new football field at City Springs School in East Baltimore. The field will offer more than 2,000 youth every year a safe place to exercise, play team sports and receive wraparound services.

Ravens players, including **WR Lee Evans**, **DT Bryan Hall**, **RB Ricky Williams**, **QB Tyrod Taylor**, and cheerleaders hosted a Play 60 football skills clinic for 75 students following the press conference. The NFL's Play 60 campaign is designed to encourage kids to be active for at least 60 minutes a day in order to help reverse the trend of childhood obesity.

The newly renovated City Springs Football Field features a regulation-size football field that will be used for physical education activities during the school day and will provide youth with safe and supervised recreation during the critical after-school hours.

Funding for the City Springs Football Field was initiated in 2009, when the Living Classrooms Foundation received a \$100,000 grant from the Baltimore Ravens as part of the National Football League/LISC Grassroots Program. LISC identifies local, nonprofit, neighborhood-based agencies that have an interest in building or refurbishing football fields in schools and parks in underserved neighborhoods.

In support of NFL Play 60, the Ravens hosted top performing students as their Play 60 ambassadors during Thursday's game (11/24). In addition to receiving two tickets to the game, each ambassador received an Xbox Kinect and Play 60 gear which they wore during their pre-game, on-field visit.

Winning students were chosen from more than 15,000 youth who took part in various Ravens Play 60 programs (Play 60 in-school challenge, Playworks/PALA Challenge and Project ACES).
